stated that he has not seen OSBORNE or heard anything of him for over two years and does not know anything concerning the travel or activities of OSBORNE during this period. Reverend HUCHAN stated there would be no difficulty in locating OSBORNE in San Martin, Puebla, Mexico, as he was well known in that city and is associated with a non-Catholic church in that area.

Reverend HUCHAN stated OSBORNE is not a missionary, but is in some way connected with a non-Catholic church in San Martin, Puebla, Mexico. Reverend HUCHAN explained that OSBORNE maintains a home where a small number of young boys reside and that in this home he, OSBORNE, affords these young boys some religious training. Reverend HUCHAN pointed out that he does not know the name of the church with which OSBORNE is associated in San Martin and does not believe OSBORNE is active in the leadership of the church with which he is associated.

Reverend HUCHAN stated he does not know anything concerning the religious training of OSBORNE, but in conversations with OSBORNE, OSBORNE had indicated a connection with missionary work for some fifty years. Reverend HUCHAN stated that missionaries in Mexico maintain a tourist status as some Mexican law forbids religious activities on the part of foreign missionaries.

Reinterview Reverend Hluchan and develop specifics as to his knowledge of Osborne-Bowen. If Hluchan has known Osborne-Bowen for twenty-five years he should be in possession of more information concerning him than the data in enclosures to re airtel. Note that explanation as to Osborne's assumption of Bowen identity as put forth by Hluchan appears to be an oversimplification. Develop specifics re this point. What are views of Hluchan as to true reason for use of dual identity? What does Hluchan know of Bowen? Advise as to date FD 302 submitted to Bureau and Dallas re interview of Osborne-Bowen. Also advise as to results of check of records of St. Anthony Hotel, Laredo, concerning residence there of Osborne-Bowen since June, 1962. Submit new report covering interview of Hluchan in such fashion as to justify dispatching same to President's Commission. Note that your previous interviews of Hluchan have been most superficial and reporting of same has been of poor quality. Discuss this with personnel responsible therefore to insure this does not recur.

Dear Mr. Rankin:

Reference is made to your letter of February 18, 1964, requesting this Bureau to conduct appropriate investigation to resolve the allegation of Mr. Arturo Alcocer Ruiz, his wife, Dolores Ahedo De Alcocer, and their friend, Maria Luisa Leon, that they saw a woman believed by them to be a sister of Jack Ruby in the vicinity of the Presidential caravan in San Antonio, Texas, on November 21, 1963, and again on television at the time a man apparently connected with Oswald's Beckley Street address was being interviewed.

For your information, we have determined that Jack L. Ruby has four sisters: Mrs. Eva L. Grant, 3929 Rawlins Street, Apartment 1, Dallas, Texas; Mrs. Marian Carroll and Mrs. Ann Volpert, both of whom reside at 1044 West Loyola Avenue, Chicago, Illinois; and Mrs. Harold Kaminsky, 6724 North Talman, Chicago, Illinois.

We interviewed Mrs. Marian Carroll, Mrs. Ann Volpert and Mrs. Harold Kaminsky in Chicago immediately following the arrest of Jack L. Ruby on the charge that he shot Lee Harvey Oswald. They advised that they had not been to Texas during the period immediately before or after the assassination of the President. We also interviewed Mrs. Eva L. Grant at her residence in Dallas on November 25, 1963. Mrs. Grant was at that time recuperating from an operation. She indicated she was in her apartment in Dallas during the immediate period prior to and following the assassination of the President and had been

visited at her apartment by her brother, Jack L. Ruby, after the assassination of the President and before Ruby was arrested for shooting Lee Harvey Oswald.

We interviewed Mrs. Rex B. Goodman, manager of the apartment house at 3929 Rawlins Street, Dallas, Texas, on December 21, 1963, at which time she furnished information concerning Mrs. Eva Grant. Mrs. Goodman also told us that Mrs. Grant was recovering from an operation at the time of the assassination of President Kennedy, and that it would have been impossible for her to have been in San Antonio, Texas, on November 21, 1963.

In connection with your request that this Bureau review the tapes of television interviews broadcast in the San Antonio, Texas, area on November 22, 1963, at 6:00 P.M., we determined from James M. Gaines, President, WOAI TV; Bob Roth, President, KONO TV; and Wayne Kearn, Manager, KENS TV that their stations were carrying live television network programs from 6:00 P.M. to 6:30 P.M. on November 22, 1963, and that tapes were not made of the programs.

No additional inquiries concerning this allegation are contemplated by this Bureau in the absence of a specific request from the Commission.

BUREAU NOTE:

We received an allegation through the Legat, Mexico from Mr. Ruiz and his party that they had been in San Antonio on November 21, 1963, and saw a very fat woman approximately fifty years of age who acted peculiar inasmuch as she stood in front of a certain store for several hours. They added that the following day on November 22, 1963, they saw what appeared to be the same fat woman on a television program which showed interview of an individual at Oswald's rooming house on Beckley Street. They further stated they subsequently saw a television program on 11-24 where Jack Ruby's sister was being interviewed and they felt she was the same fat woman seen in San Antonio and at the Beckley address on television. Obviously, the allegation has no basis and fact. This is another of the many false reports we have run down in this investigation.
