Miss PAMELA LILLIAN MUMFORD furnished the following information:

She continues to be employed as a legal stenographer at Dillavou and Cox, Attorneys, 611 Wilshire Boulevard, Room 700, Los Angeles. She resides at the Jacqueline Apartments, 153 North New Hampshire Avenue, Apartment No. 212. *Los Angeles*

Miss PATRICIA WINSTON, who was her former roommate and with whom she was traveling around the world, departed Los Angeles on January 21, 1964, and is presently residing with her parents in Flat 4, #8 Wood Street, Manly, Sidney, -Australia. *Los Angeles*

Three photographs of ALBERT OSBORNE, also known as JOHN HOWARD BOWEN, were displayed to Miss MUMFORD. The first photograph was taken in October, 1963, in connection with his passport application and shows his head and shoulders. He is wearing a white shirt. The second and third photographs were taken on February 8, 1964, and he is wearing a dark suit, white shirt, and striped tie, and is holding a pipe in his right hand. These are stand-up, full face and profile photos. *Los Angeles*

Upon viewing these photographs, Miss MUMFORD advised that she was positive that this individual was identical to the man whom she had seen and who sat next to LEE HARVEY OSWALD on the bus which had come from Nuevo Laredo, and which she and Miss WINSTON had boarded at Monterey, Mexico, on September 26, 1963, and which arrived in Mexico City on September 27, 1963. During the time that Miss MUMFORD was on the bus, OSWALD sat next to this man, whom she had previously described as "the Englishman".

AURICE CARLSON, PRESIDENT, RELIANCE LIFE AND ACCIDENT INSURANCE CO, DALLAS, TEX, A CLOSE FRIEND OF RICHARD NIXON, ADVISED TODAY THAT NIXON WAS INVITED TO DALLAS IN APRIL NINETEEN SIXTYTHREE TO THE SOUTH-EAST DALLAS CHAMBER OF COMMERCE TO RECEIVE THE GOOD AMERICAN AWARD. AT LAST MINUTE NIXON UNABLE TO ATTEND. CARLSON DOES NOT KNOW IF PRESS COVERAGE OF THIS CONTEMPLATED VISIT GIVEN IN DALLAS NEWSPAPERS.

CARLSON STATED NIXON DID COME TO DALLAS ON NOV. TWENTYONE, SIXTYTHREE, ARRIVING BY PRIVATE PLANE WITH THE PRESIDENT OF PEPSI COLA CO.

SHOULD BE NOTED THAT ON OCCASION OF NIXON'S ACTUAL VISIT MARINA AND LEE HARVEY NOT RESIDING TOGETHER AND MARINA ALLEGEDLY DID NOT KNOW HIS RESIDENCE AT THE TIME. FURTHER NOTED IN APRIL SIXTYTHREE MARINA AND LEE HARVEY RESIDING AT TWO ONE FOUR WEST NEELEY ST, DALLAS, AND THAT LEE HARVEY OBTAINED RIFLE SUBSEQUENT TO MARCH TWENTY, SIXTYTHREE.

Enclosed herewith for the Bureau are two photostat copies each of verbatim copies of Mexican Immigration records, Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, reflecting entry of OSWALD into Mexico on 9/26/63 and his departure from Mexico on 10/3/63. These copies were furnished to SA ROBERT L. CHAPMAN on 2/19/64 by HARVEY CASH, American Consul, Nuevo Laredo, Mexico.

CASH stated that Assistant Chief of Mexican Immigration at Nuevo Laredo, ARNOLDO TIJERINA, typed the information concerning OSWALD from the Mexican Immigration records onto the 3x5 cards that CASH still has and CASH was present when TIJERINA typed this information on these 3x5 cards.

CASH further noted that the information furnished SA CHAPMAN on 11/24/63 on OSWALD's entry into Mexico on 9/26/63 and his departure on 10/3/63 was furnished from these 3x5 cards obtained as set out above from TIJERINA.

On February 18, 1964, Mr. WILLIAM A. MC KENZIE, Attorney at Law, 631 Fidelity Union Life Building, Dallas, Texas, contacted SA VINCENT E. DRAIN and stated he wished to furnish a copy of a letter which had been prepared in his office, signed by ROBERT L. OSWALD and a copy of a letter prepared in his office signed by MARINA OSWALD, which letters were directed to Mr. MC KENZIE. These letters stated in part that MARINA OSWALD and ROBERT L. OSWALD were giving full and unequivocal authority to MC KENZIE as their attorney to release, give and tell the Federal Bureau of Investigation any and all evidence on all matters relating to or which might be uncovered or told to him (MC KENZIE) in connection with the assassination of President KENNEDY. Mr. MC KENZIE stated that he did not desire to represent ROBERT L. OSWALD and MARINA OSWALD if they started lying to him and that he had impressed this fact upon them. He further related that he was not going to be in receipt of any information which dealt with facts surrounding the assassination of the President of the United States, or anything connected with it unless it could be immediately made available to the FBI and that he wanted both of these clients to realize this.

Mr. MC KENZIE is a highly respected lawyer in Dallas and it is believed he is sincere in his efforts to elicit the truth from his clients. Copies of the two above described letters are being retained in the Dallas file.

Dallas files further reflect that on May 18, 1959, [REDACTED] advised SA VINCENT E. DRAIN one PEGGY ANN STONE, aka., Peggy Fisher had been staying at the Stoneleigh Hotel, Dallas. WHITE had informed that STONE had been travelling with an individual MERTON HAMILTON and that during the course of STONE's stay in Dallas, she had been frequently in company of one CARL SCHAFER identified by FBI as a "shyster" oil man with offices at 710 Fidelity Union Building, Dallas, Texas.

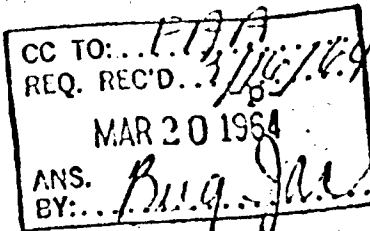

The following letter dated January 4, 1964 was received from Mr. LAWRENCE LOUGHLIN, Administrative Assistant, office of Senator EDWARD M. KENNEDY, Federal Building, Boston, Massachusetts, which letter was included in a large group of letters of condolence which had been set aside in Senator KENNEDY's office as possibly being from emotionally and mentally disturbed persons. The letter was received in the Senator's office on an unknown date although it was postmarked January 11, 1964 at Klamath Falls, Oregon.

"Jan_ 4, 1964

"Dear Sir:

"I can give you a lead to the persons who aided Oswald in the assassination of your son. Last summer, about July 15, in a conversation with two lesbian, marxist females named [Ona Jane Murphy] and [Rose Dorfer] I was told by them the name of the assassin, the date of the assassination, the type of rifle to be used, the rifle bore in millimeters, the fact that he had shot at Walker, the fact that the Faines had been helping him and that he would shoot at Connally. Also - that the assassination involved "a law protecting adult, consenting, homosexuals."

"Had I been certain that they were serious I might have warned you ---- although I was not an admirer of your sons socialistic, pro-negro behavior I feel that killing your son was a pointless, ineffectual move.

"The reason that I'm writing this letter is that those homosexuals (Oswald, [Dorfer, Murphy] are in my opinion, seriously insane. - there are probably more marxist queers in their gang. Also, they [Dorfer & Murphy] showed great enthusiasm for shooting then Vice President Johnson. I am certain that [Dorfer and Murphy] could provide you with leads to names of persons who aided Oswald financially and otherwise. Remember, they told me about Oswalds plan over four months before November 22nd. ---- in detail.

"If you want further, detailed, information, my address is - [David C. Glass, Camp 9, Beatty, Oregon.] [Dorfer and Murphy] are partially semitic, lesbian, and married (They

"said they were married, anyway).

On January 12, 1964 [DAVID CONRAD GLASS] residing
[at Logging Camp No. 9, Weyerhaeuser Lumber Co.] in Lake County,
Oregon upon interview furnished the following information:

In 1954, he was residing in Lakeview, Oregon, and
was separated from his wife. He met a girl named [JANE WARD]
in a local bar and began dating her. This continued until
February, 1956, when she broke off the relationship. In the
spring of 1957, she began appearing to him in dreams and
engaged him in what he termed "small talk." These dreams
occurred infrequently after he had had a few drinks the night
before. He considered these occurrences dreams until about
a year later. At that time he was employed by United Air
Lines as a mechanic in the International Airport at San
Francisco. He recalled that [JANE WARD] appeared to him in a
dream and asked him if he thought MARILYN MONROE would commit
suicide. He made a prediction then that she would commit
suicide about August 5, 1962. The next day a fellow employee
named [RAY ANDREWS] repeated to him word for word the conver-
sation about MARILYN MONROE in his dream the night before.
He said he had no explanation for this other than the fact
that it did occur. He said he also had no explanation as to
why MARILYN MONROE committed suicide about the time he pre-
dicted.

From 1957 to 1959, he thinks he had about twelve
dreams in which he had a conversation with [JANE WARD] and the
conversation in the dreams was repeated to him by [ANDREWS] word
for word the next day. About 1959, [JANE] began talking with
him about KENNEDY in the dreams. She insisted that KENNEDY was a

relative of his and also that KENNEDY was a friend of Queen ELIZABETH. She would question him about whether he thought that KENNEDY would live through his first term as President and he would reply that he did not think so. He quit United Air Lines in June, 1959, and got a job in [Medford] Oregon, for [Skeeters Logging Company] and during the summer of 1959, he also completed his training for a commercial pilot's license at the [Medford] Airport. In early 1960, he went to work for Lockheed Missiles in Sunnyvale, California. He had a limited security clearance and at this time he had another dream in which [JANE WARD] asked him everything he knew about restricted activities at Lockheed. He said the next day he telephoned [JANE] at her sister's place in Palo Alto, California, and she admitted that she talked to him in his dreams. He resigned from Lockheed in June, 1960. He then became employed by Weyerhaeuser at [Klamath Falls] Oregon. The dreams continued infrequently and in one dream she told him she was now residing in Albuquerque, New Mexico, at [506 Sycamore S.E.] As a memory aid to remember the address, she told him to think of the Heinz Company, [57 Varieties] subtract 1 and put a 0 in the middle. She also gave him a song title with the name of a tree but told him he should substitute [Sycamore]. In the spring of 1963, she appeared to him in a dream and asked him what was going to happen to WALKER. He said she referred to General WALKER in Texas. He replied that he did not know but thought nothing would happen to him. She also asked him what was going to happen to KENNEDY and he predicted that KENNEDY was going to get shot. She insisted that KENNEDY was his relative and stated again that he was a friend of the Queen.

In April, 1963, in a dream, [JANE] first mentioned OSWALD and asked him if he knew OSWALD.

In June, 1963, Weyerhaeuser shut down so he went to [JANE'S] mother, [MORA WARD] who verified the address [JANE] had given him in a dream and Mrs. [WARD] told him [JANE] was living there with her husband [GENE MURPHY]. He said he thought he would go and visit her so he drove to Albuquerque, arriving there on June 18, 1963, and went to see [JANE]. He talked with her a few times in a park near her residence. He said she had intended to get a divorce but told him she had patched things up with her husband. During the time he was in Albuquerque, he stayed at a rooming house at 602 Arno Street. He returned to Lakeview but on July 9, 1963, he flew his plane, a Piper Cub, to Albuquerque, and again stayed at the Arno Street address. He saw [JANE] again and she told him her marriage was okay and she did not want to see him any more. He accused her of appearing to him in his dreams and she denied it and he said he was going to punch her in the nose and she still denied it and he hit her in the eye and gave her a black eye. Right after this he hid out in some shrubbery near a church but when the police did not find him, he went

to his roominghouse. In the meantime, he had got a job in the service department of Montgomery Ward Company.

On July 16, 1963, two deputy sheriffs came there and arrested him on an assault charge. He said they were driving a green "bathtub" Nash, 1952 or 1953 model. It was not a police car although the deputies were in uniform. They took him to Central Street in Albuquerque, to the office of a justice of the peace named ROSE DORFER. JANE was at the office. There he was placed under oath and was required to furnish a peace bond to keep the peace and pay \$32, after which he was released.

On December 10, 1963, at Camp No. 9, Weyerhaeuser Lumber Company, he had just finished reading an account of the assassination of President KENNEDY and the surrounding events when it suddenly occurred to him that these matters had been mentioned at the hearing before justice of the peace in Albuquerque on July 16, 1963. Between July 16, 1963 and December 10, 1963, it had not occurred to him that anything had been said at the hearing other than matters connected with the assault charge, but after reading of these matters in the magazines, he suddenly began to remember that both the justice of the peace and JANE WARD had talked to him and during a long conversation they had talked about KENNEDY being a socialist, pro-Negro and a civil rightist. At that time JANE had admitted that she had appeared to him in his dreams and talked with him. They asked him to make a prediction about how long President KENNEDY would live and it appeared to him that nothing would happen to KENNEDY if he made no prediction, so to please the women, he told them that KENNEDY would die between November 15 and December 15, 1963. The justice of the peace said that was right and JANE nodded okay. They asked him about OSWALD so he said OSWALD would kill KENNEDY and that he had about a thirty caliber rifle with a four power scope. They asked him what OSWALD looked like and he said that he had short and kinky hair and was about 5'10". They asked him to predict the details of the assassination and he told them that KENNEDY would be shot twice in the head. They also mentioned CONNALLY, the governor, and wanted him to predict that CONNALLY would be killed, but he said that CONNALLY would be shot and not killed and he would not predict that CONNALLY would be killed. They then asked him about RUBY and he said that RUBY was the short form of the Jewish name RUBENSTEIN and that RUBY would kill OSWALD two or three days after the assassination.

GLASS repeated that he remembered none of the above

conversations until December 10, 1963, when he had read the account of the assassination in a news magazine, and after that time, as he was working in the woods, he would begin to recall different bits of conversation as set forth above.

[GLASS] said that since July, 1963, he has had no conversations with [JANE] in his dreams and does not expect any more since it appears that he will never see her again.

He said that when these dreams first started, he thought they were just dreams, but after other people seemed to know about them, they appeared real although he has no explanation for what has happened.

The following description of [GLASS] was obtained observation and interview:

ARREST RECORD

States has received several traffic citations but has never been arrested other than for assault in Albuquerque as set forth above.

On January 27, 1964 Mrs. [ROSE DOERFER] was interviewed at her office at 302½ Central Southwest, Albuquerque, New Mexico, where she is a justice of the peace.

She advised that approximately one year ago, [JANE MURPHY] was referred to her officially by the District Attorney's Office in Albuquerque. [JANE MURPHY] complained that she had been struck by [DAVID C. GLASS] and also reported him as a nuisance. She thereafter held an informal hearing in the presence of both [JANE MURPHY] and [GLASS] after which time it was recommended that [GLASS] post a six-month peace bond with local bondsman [MAX BACA]. She could not recall the amount of the peace bond; however, immediately thereafter she determined that [GLASS] never made a downpayment on the bond and he left town after quitting his job. Therefore, the peace bond was dropped. She said she has not seen him since the original hearing before her.

Concerning the events which led to his appearance there, Mrs. [DOERFER] stated that she vaguely recalls that [GLASS] was apparently a brilliant scientist at one time who worked for Lockheed Aircraft Company in California. She stated, however, that when she was in contact with him he was mentally unbalanced and definitely needed psychiatric care. She also was of the belief that [JANE MURPHY] had at some time in the past dated [GLASS] but only on an extremely casual basis. Prior to the time that he was reported to her, Mrs. [DOERFER] stated [GLASS] would sit in the public park across the street from [MURPHY]'s residence and stare at [MURPHY]'s apartment for hours on end both during the day and the night. On one occasion he went across to her apartment and smashed the screen door. [MURPHY] became frightened and told [GLASS] that she would talk to him in the park where there were a

lot of people around in view of the fact that she felt it would be safer there. When they got over to the park, he struck her and knocked her into a bench.

Mrs. [DOERFER] stated that [GLASS] seriously claimed that [MURPHY] would come to him through his keyhole no matter where he was and make love to him. He also claimed that [MURPHY] would come to him in his dreams and do the same thing. [GLASS] also claimed that [JANE MURPHY] put "stuff" in his Coca Cola and after drinking the Coca Cola, it would make him do things he was not supposed to do. [GLASS] also accused [MURPHY] of being a communist whereupon she accused him of being crazy. [GLASS] also accused [MURPHY] of asking him to come to Albuquerque in order to kill her husband for her.

Mrs. [DOERFER] also stated that the matter was resolved when [JANE MURPHY] told him that she would not come to him in his dreams anymore or come through his keyhole and would leave his body entirely alone. Mrs. [DOERFER] stated that she strongly urged [GLASS] to submit to a psychiatric examination to which he agreed. She thereafter made an appointment for him with a Dr. MILLER at the Bernalillo County Indian Hospital in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Mrs. [DOERFER] does not recall specifically but believes that [GLASS] appeared for several of these appointments and thereafter quit his job at Montgomery Ward and Company and departed from Albuquerque. She said she has not seen [MURPHY] or [GLASS] since the above hearing. She reiterated the fact that he was definitely in need of psychiatric treatment. She also advised she has no information concerning the assassination of the late President KENNEDY other than what she has learned through regular news media. She said she never heard of LEE HARVEY OSWALD or JACK RUBY prior to that time and could furnish no information concerning them or any possible relationship between the two. She advised that she doubts if any record exists concerning the hearing and stated that if one did exist it would be extremely difficult to locate it at this time in view of the fact that they have instituted a new records system and the old records are not filed in any particular order.

On February 15, 1964 [GLASS] contacted the Albuquerque FBI office and made reference to the previous information he had furnished to the Portland Division of the FBI on January 12, 1964. He also inquired if the United States Attorney General had received his letter, inquired as to whether the matter had been handled and if any arrests had been made. After leaving the Albuquerque FBI office, [GLASS] contacted the Albuquerque PD with the same information previously furnished to the FBI.

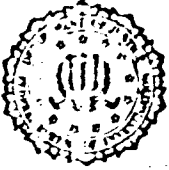
GLASS was photographed and fingerprinted at the Albuquerque PD but was not held, and advised them that he was en route to Dallas, Texas to testify at the JACK RUBY trial. He stated he was going on his own as no attorneys had contacted him. He was driving a 1960 Oldsmobile two-door, beige, with Oregon license No. 2Q7887.

On February 16, 1964 at 8:55 a.m. Lt. JACK REVILL, Special Service Bureau, Dallas PD, was advised that GLASS had allegedly indicated he was en route to Dallas to attend the JACK RUBY trial. On February 17, 1964 Detective DON STRINGFELLOW, Special Services Bureau, Dallas PD, was furnished descriptive information concerning GLASS.

On February 17, 1964 at 8:44 a.m., FORREST V. SORRELLS, Agent in Charge, U. S. Secret Service, Dallas, Texas, was furnished the information that GLASS had allegedly stated he was going to attend the JACK RUBY trial together with background information concerning him.

At approximately 9 a.m. on February 17, 1964 Deputy Sheriff MC COY was also furnished the foregoing information.

At approximately 12:25 p.m. February 17, 1964 Sheriff BILL DECKER, Dallas County Sheriff's Office, telephonically advised that DAVID CONRAD GLASS had just been arrested and lodged in his county jail. He stated GLASS had been arrested in the vicinity of the courtroom where the JACK L. RUBY trial was in session and he was armed at the time of his arrest with a 32 caliber revolver.

The following letter dated January 4, 1964 was received from Mr. LAWRENCE LOUGHLIN, Administrative Assistant, office of Senator EDWARD M. KENNEDY, Federal Building, Boston, Massachusetts, which letter was included in a large group of letters of condolence which had been set aside in Senator KENNEDY's office as possibly being from emotionally and mentally disturbed persons. The letter was received in the Senator's office on an unknown date although it was postmarked January 11, 1964 at Klamath Falls, Oregon.

"Jan_ 4, 1964

"Dear Sir:

"I can give you a lead to the persons who aided Oswald in the assassination of your son. Last summer, about July 15, in a conversation with two lesbian, marxist females named [Ona Jane Murphy] and [Rose Dorfer] I was told by them the name of the assassin, the date of the assassination, the type of rifle to be used, the rifle bore in millimeters, the fact that he had shot at Walker, the fact that the Paines had been helping him and that he would shoot at Connally. Also - that the assassination involved "a law protecting adult, consenting, homosexuals."

"Had I been certain that they were serious I might have warned you ---- although I was not an admirer of your sons socialistic, pro-negro behavior I feel that killing your son was a pointless, ineffectual move.

"The reason that I'm writing this letter is that those homosexuals (Oswald, [Dorfer, Murphy] are in my opinion, seriously insane. - there are probably more marxist queers in their gang. Also, they [Dorfer & Murphy] showed great enthusiasm for shooting then Vice President Johnson. I am certain that [Dorfer and Murphy] could provide you with leads to names of persons who aided Oswald financially and otherwise. Remember, they told me about Oswalds plan over four months before November 22nd. ---- in detail.

"If you want further, detailed, information, my address is - [David C. Glass, Camp 9, Beatty] Oregon. [Dorfer and Murphy] are partially semitic, lesbian, and married (They

Marina Oswald was interviewed on February 24, 1964. She stated that approximately two weeks after the General Walker incident and while they resided on Neeley Street in Dallas, Oswald, some time between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m., dressed himself in a suit and tie and put a pistol underneath his jacket. (The General Walker incident occurred on April 10, 1963.) She said Oswald was unemployed at this time. She said she inquired where he was going, to which Oswald replied approximately "Nixon is coming and I'm going to take a look."

Mrs. Oswald said that at the time she realized she had to act fast, whereupon she walked into the bathroom and told Oswald to come into the bathroom with her, which he did. She said she then quickly jumped outside the door, closing it as she left the bathroom. She said she forcibly held the bathroom door shut holding on to the knob and bracing her feet against the wall. She said Oswald attempted to get out of the bathroom and was yelling, "Open the door." She said she forcibly held the door shut for about three minutes. In this respect she said that she cannot at this time accurately recall the length of time she forcibly held the bathroom door closed. She said she told Oswald it was difficult for her to hold the door and commented to him that something might happen to the baby. She said that she was pregnant at this time.

She said she told Oswald he was not going to shoot at anyone else and that if he wanted to come out of the bathroom, he would have to walk across her body. She said she reminded Oswald of his promise to her after the Walker incident that he would not try to do anything else like that. She recalled she said something like, "How can you deceive me after you gave me your word?" She said she told Oswald she would open the door if he would give his word to remain in the bathroom and not go anywhere and if he would undress and give her his clothing and pistol. Mrs. Oswald said that her husband agreed to this and she opened the bathroom door after holding it, as stated, for approximately three minutes.

Oswald then took off his outer garments, including his shoes, and gave them and his pistol to her. She said that she put the pistol under the mattress and that she does not know whether or not the pistol was loaded. Later that day Oswald took the pistol from under the mattress and put it on the shelf where he usually kept it.

Mrs. Oswald said that the bathroom door at their Necley Street residence opened toward the inside and there was no lock on the outside of the door, although she believes there was a lock on the inside. She said that she feels that she kept Oswald in the house on the occasion in question by persuasion and that this was one of the times he did something that she wanted him to do.

Mrs. Oswald commented that Oswald remained in the bathroom approximately three hours. She said he asked her for a book and that he spent the time in the bathroom reading with the door shut. She recalled that at about 4 p.m. she told Oswald he could come out of the bathroom if he desired, and he did so. He thereafter sat in the living room in his shorts reading. She said that he did not leave the house that day.

Mrs. Oswald said that at the time she did not know who Richard M. Nixon was and she did not recall Oswald ever mentioning Mr. Nixon's name prior to the occasion in question. She said she knows at this time that Mr. Nixon once ran for the presidency, but she said she still knows very little about him. She maintained that she and Oswald did not talk about this incident or about Mr. Nixon after the incident and, in fact, did not discuss the matter during the time Oswald was sitting in the bathroom or after he came out of the bathroom.

Mrs. Oswald said that she told Mr. and Mrs. James H. Martin about the Nixon incident approximately three to four weeks after she moved into the Martin residence and, thereafter, she repeated it to Robert Oswald. She stated she cannot recall whether she told Robert Oswald about the Nixon incident in the presence of the Martins or whether she spoke to him about it alone.

Mrs. Oswald was again asked if she could remember anything which might have indicated to her that Oswald was to do anything unusual on November 22, 1963. She said that she could not remember anything which would indicate this and that the news of her husband's arrest had come as a "thunderclap" to her.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

Mrs. Oswald stated that while she and her husband resided in New Orleans on Magazine Street toward the end of August or early in September, 1963, for a period of about two weeks, Oswald was making plans to hijack an airplane and force the pilot to take him to Cuba. She said he subsequently revised his plans to the extent that he included her as part of his planning. She said he told her that he was to sit at the front of the airplane with a pistol and that she was to sit at the back of the plane with a pistol. They were to be accompanied by their daughter June and were to attempt to force the crew to fly the plane to Cuba. Mrs. Oswald stated that she refused to have anything to do with the plan and told Oswald, "Only a crazy man would think this up." She said Oswald told her he would buy a lightweight pistol for her and that he wanted her to at least learn how to hold it. She said she refused to do this. She said her husband told her that he had seen some lightweight pistols, but that she told him not to purchase one as she would not participate in the scheme.

She said she recalled that Oswald, during the period of time when he was planning to hijack the airplane, studied a world map and figured out distances to various places. She said he told her it would be necessary to hijack a plane with sufficient gas to get them to Cuba. She recalled that Oswald wrote out timetables of airlines on a piece of paper. She does not know what happened to the map or to the paper on which he wrote the timetables. During this period she stated that Oswald began to take physical exercise to increase his physical strength.

She said that when she refused to take part in the scheme to hijack an airplane, she counseled Oswald to attempt to enter Cuba legally. Thereafter, her husband began planning to go to Mexico alone for the purpose of obtaining permission to enter Cuba.

Concerning James H. Martin, Mrs. Oswald stated that Martin told her while she was in residence at his home that he had undergone an operation and could not father children.
