Synopsis: Investigation to locate **ALBERT OSBORNE**, aka John Howard Bowen, or associates of his at Jonesboro, Tenn., negative. Rev. **FRED W. ALLEN**, Jr., Knoxville, Tenn., and Mrs. **PESSIE WHITE**, Vice President, Piegah Home Movement, Pikeville, Tenn., either know of or know **OSBORNE** as **JOHN HOWARD BOWEN**. Neither could furnish information re his current whereabouts. Rev. **ALLEN** received postcard from **BOWEN** postmarked 2/18/64 at San Antonio, Texas, listing his new address as Niza 22 Mexico, D.F. Mrs. **WHITE** reported she contributes \$35 per month to be used to support one of the Evangelists under supervision of **JOHN HOWARD BOWEN**, Niza 22 Mexico, D.F. Money sent to **BOWEN** monthly. Background info re **BOWEN** set forth.

DETAILS:

The following Baptist ministers advised on February 20, 1964, SA **ROBERT LEE MORRISON** that **ARTHUR OSBORNE** and/or **JOHN HOWARD BOWEN** is unknown to them. They said that in event they learn of this individual's being in the area they will immediately notify the FBI.

Reverend FRED B. ALLEN, Jr., 505 Oklahoma Avenue, advised he is pastor of the North Glenwood Baptist Church, Knoxville. He advised he and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. FRED B. ALLEN, Sr., 1400 North 4th Avenue, Knoxville, are long-time friends of JOHN HOWARD BOWEN, whom he described as an 84 year old missionary. Reverend ALLEN stated that BOWEN has worked as a missionary in Mexico for the past 22 years.

Reverend ALLEN advised he has not seen BOWEN for quite some time, but advised he had recently received a post card from BOWEN postmarked 2/18/64 at San Antonio, Texas. He advised this was an airmail postcard of the type purchased at U. S. Post Offices. He said the only message on the card was BOWEN'S new mailing address and that BOWEN hoped to hear from him soon. Reverend ALLEN stated the new address furnished by BOWEN was Niza 22, Mexico D.F.

Reverend ALLEN advised he had absolutely no idea as to BOWEN'S present whereabouts, but advised he would immediately notify the Knoxville FBI Office if he or his parents heard anything further from BOWEN.

Mrs. BESSIE WHITE, Vice President, Pisgah Home Movement, Pikeville, Tennessee, advised that she has known of JOHN HOWARD BOWEN for about the past four years. She stated she received information through some source, unrecalled at the present time, that BOWEN was a supervisor of a mission in Mexico, and she has been making contributions to be used to support one of the Evangelists. She said that BOWEN is a representative of the Pentacostal or Full Gospel Church and that he reportedly has several Evangelists working under him at this mission that he operates. She said that the Evangelists are reportedly Mexicans and are working throughout Mexico.

She indicated that she contributes \$35.00 per month at the present time but originally only contributed \$25.00 per month. This money is supposed to be used to support one of the Evangelists and she receives a receipt each month from the person who received the money. The money is sent to BOWEN, who, in turn, makes the money available to the Evangelist. BOWEN also furnishes a receipt indicating that he receives the money that she contributes. She stated that she makes the contribution in the form of bank drafts, which are drawn on the First National Bank of Pikeville, Pikeville, Tennessee, and these drafts are made payable to BOWEN. She said that these cancelled bank drafts, as well as the receipts, are presently in her possession. She said that she has received information that other persons were contributing to this same cause, but she did not know the identity of any of these persons. She said that BOWEN has never solicited any contributions from her; however, he did notify her that the cost of supporting one of the Evangelists had increased from \$25.00 to \$35.00 per month. She has never seen BOWEN and her only contact has been through the United States mails by letter.

She said that she knew very little about BOWEN, but he has advised her in his letters that he is originally from Knoxville, Tennessee. She does not know any thing about his background but understands that he has been in Mexico for about 18 years doing missionary work. In addition to the money sent each month, the Pisgah Home Mission occasionally sends used clothing and other articles to BOWEN to be distributed to the needy.

She said that the only name she ever knew this person by was JOHN HOWARD BOWEN and his last address was Riza 22, Mexico,

D.F., as of about two weeks previously. She said that the name of the Evangelist that she was supporting was a ZENNEN MIGUEL CRUZ, Niza 22, Mexico. She has never seen this person but does receive receipts from him indicating that he received the money which was furnished by her.

She said that the name of ALBERT OSBORNE was not familiar to her. She said the Pisgah Home Movement is an independent, non-profit and non-denominational organization established to aid and assist any needy person, and to do the work of the Lord.

On a teletype from the Dallas Office which reported the results of the interview of Marina Oswald concerning the alleged threat of Lee Harvey Oswald to shoot former Vice President Richard Nixon, the Director inquired "Approximately what date would the Nixon incident be?"

The Dallas Office ~~only~~ reported that Marina put the date at approximately two weeks after the Walker incident. Since the Walker incident occurred 4-10-63, the date of the Nixon incident would be approximately 4-24-63.

Information developed by the Dallas Office casts considerable doubt on the validity of the story related by Marina Oswald. It will be noted that Mr. Maurice Carlson, President of the Reliance Life and Accident Insurance Company, had previously indicated that former Vice President Nixon was scheduled to appear in Dallas in April, 1963, to receive an award from the chamber of commerce. On recontact Carlson in effect admits he was mistaken in furnishing his first information. A check at the newspaper morgue of the Dallas "Morning News" for the period 3-16 to 5-16-63 was negative as to any publicity concerning a visit of Vice President Nixon to Dallas. It is inconceivable that a person of the public stature of former Vice President Nixon could visit Dallas without some public notification. We have furnished the available information on the Nixon incident to the President's Commission and we will have to completely run this out until we are satisfied that we have arrived at the truth.

2 1 FEB 20 1964 Branigan to Mr. Sullivan 2/26/64 set forth request from President's Commission for recording of Mark Lane's and Marguerite Oswald's appearances and suggested coverage be limited to publicly announced meetings. ReButel instructed Buffalo arrange through reliable sources only to obtain coverage of public appearance of Lane and Oswald at Hotel Buffalo, Buffalo, New York, 2/28/64, such appearances reportedly being planned by Workers World Party. ReButel advised that management of Hotel Buffalo had canceled reservations for Lane's appearance; that American Civil Liberties Union locally has protested action and local newspapers reveals show cause order obtained 2/26/64 against Hotel in effort to reverse hotel's cancellation. Note to respond to order in court 10 a.m. 2/28/64. If hotel's action upheld in court, Workers World Party (WWP) will attempt to have Lane appear at another location. WWP blames local Police Department and FBI for cancellation and are considering future picketing of local FBI office. Buffalo advised that in view of above developments no action being taken by Buffalo at this time to obtain recording; that when court's decision rendered consideration will then be given to arranging coverage per Bureau instructions. We should make certain Buffalo is taking necessary action to insure that all possible efforts are being made to comply with Bureau instructions.

The brother Walter, aged 96, was previously interviewed in England and furnished information of value.

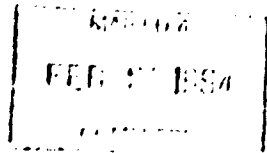

The 2/27/64 issue of the "National Guardian", page 4, contained an advertisement reading "Philadelphia - A Public Inquiry Into The Oswald Case With Mark Lane, Wednesday, March 11, 8:30 p.m., Ethical Society, 1906 Rittenhouse Sq., Donation \$1.00, Auspices; Philadelphia Friends of the National Guardian".

For the information of Buffalo and Philadelphia, MARK LANE is carried on RI-A of the NYO and is an Attorney-at-Law with offices in Room 1001, 654 Madison Ave., NYC. He resides at 164 W. 79th St., NYC.

The "New York Herald Tribune" newspaper dated 1/15/64, page 7, column 1, contained an article entitled "Oswald's Mother Hires Lane". This article stated that on 1/14/64, Mrs. MARGUERITE C. OSWALD, mother of accused assassin LEE HARVEY OSWALD announced she had hired MARK LANE to represent her slain son before the Warren Commission investigating the murder of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. According to this article, Mrs. OSWALD stated she had been in contact with LANE during his stay in Fort Worth, Texas, the previous weekend. It was also pointed out that LANE had accepted the case although Mrs. OSWALD stated she had no funds with which to pay him.

On 6/10/63, [REDACTED] (conceal-reliable in the past) advised that at a meeting of the NYCAHUAC held 5/28/63 at 74 5th Ave., NYC, MARK LANE was elected to the position of Vice-Chairman of the organization.

Buffalo is requested to furnish the NYO with any information regarding future speaking plans of LANE which might have been received from his appearance in that Division on 2/28/64, or from other sources.

The Philadelphia Division will provide coverage of subject's appearance at the Ethical Society, 1906 Rittenhouse Square, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on 3/11/64, pursuant to instructions contained in reButel, 2/26/64.

Philadelphia will also furnish the NYO with any information that may be received concerning future speaking plans of LANE.
