RE: LEE HARVEY OSWALD

ALBERT E. JENNER, JR.

Bureau files reveal the following concerning Albert E. Jenner, Jr., a member of the Commission's staff. He was born in Chicago, Illinois, in 1907, educated at the University of Illinois and admitted to the Illinois Bar in 1930. No investigation has been conducted by this Bureau concerning him. He has served as a Special Assistant Attorney General of the State of Illinois since 1956, and is a member of the U. S. Supreme Court Advisory Committee on Federal Civil Rules.

An informant who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that one Albert E. Jenner, Jr., of Chicago, was a member of the National Lawyers Guild in 1940, which guild had been cited as a communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities in its report issued 3/29/44.

It would not appear that permitting us to present this information to Mr. Rankin would result in his being treated any differently by the Commission in the future in view of his comments to Mr. Rankin concerning Chief Justice Warren and his statement concerning the "New York Times" article before the Commission.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That the attached communication be sent to Dallas instructing re-interview of Attorney McKenzie to seek his permission to disseminate the information furnished by him to the Commission.

MR. WADE WAS CONTACTED BY ME, AND IT WAS POINTED OUT TO HIM THAT WE KEEP GETTING INDICATIONS THAT HIS ASSISTANT, WILLIAM ALEXANDER, IS THE SOURCE OF THE RUMORS THAT OSWALD WAS AN FBI INFORMANT. IT WAS POINTED OUT TO HIM THAT ALEXANDER HAS BEEN INTERVIEWED AND DENIED HAVING ANY INFORMATION IN THIS REGARD. IT WAS ALSO POINTED OUT THAT IF ALEXANDER DOES HAVE ANY INFORMATION WE WANT HIM TO PUT IT ON THE LINE OR STOP TALKING. WADE SAID HE FELT THAT ANY INFORMATION ALONG THIS LINE WAS THE OLD RUMOR, AS HE HAS TOLD ALEXANDER TO STOP TALKING AND THAT HE (WADE) IS AT PRESENT THE ONLY ONE ON HIS STAFF SUPPOSED TO TALK TO THE PRESS. HE VOLUNTEERED THAT HE HAD HEARD NOTHING REGARDING THIS RUMOR AROUND THE COURTHOUSE IN RECENT WEEKS. HE STATED THAT THIS RUMOR OF OSWALD BEING AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI OR CIA HAD NO PLACE IN THE TRIAL OF RUBY, AND THAT IT WOULD NOT BE BROUGHT UP BY HIM. HE STATED HE WOULD AGAIN TELL ALEXANDER TO BE QUIET AND MAKE NO FURTHER REMARKS IN THIS REGARD.

Reurairtel 2/13/64 requesting Bureau advise the identity of source of the information regarding interview with Leighton Colin Hinkson and whether such information should be included in details of next Dallas report.

For your information the source of the information concerning Leighton is the Office of Security, Department of State. Bureau has taken up with the State Department the classification of data it furnished concerning Hinkson, and State Department has found it necessary to contact its source in British Honduras to resolve this matter. As soon as advice is received from the State Department, Bureau will furnish appropriate instructions as to whether such data should be included in a Dallas report prepared for dissemination to the Commission.

NOTE:

Our investigation of Oswald, aimed at identifying people who may have had contact with him, disclosed that one Leighton Colin Hinkson had been in Nuevo Laredo during October, 1963. Through State Department channels we had Hinkson interviewed at which time he denied any knowledge of contact with Oswald. State Department furnished results of its interview by letter dated 2/10/64 classified "Secret." We are checking with State to determine whether State can be identified as the source of the interview of Hinkson and whether results on such interview can be declassified so the entire report containing such interview of Hinkson will not have to be classified "Secret." Bartlett is following this matter closely with State Department.

Reurtels 3/3 and 4/64 dealing with information furnished by [redacted] Counterintelligence Agent, OSI, Air Force, Wright - Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio.

For your information, the allegation that Lee Harvey Oswald was receiving money orders from unknown source has previously come up in this investigation and has been given coverage by the press. It is imperative that all possible steps be taken to pin this allegation down.

You should immediately recontact [redacted] and impress upon him the importance of the Oswald investigation and emphatically request that he divulge to your office the identity of his source reporting Oswald received money on a regular basis through use of money orders issued by the Miami Deposit Bank, Yellow Springs, Ohio. Thereafter, upon receipt of the identity of such source from [redacted], your office should immediately contact [redacted] source and pin the source down as to his basis for such allegations. Thereafter, all logical investigation possible should be conducted by your office to fully resolve this matter.

In the event [redacted] refuses to divulge to your office the identity of his source, you should immediately advise the Bureau and submit your recommendations as to whether Bureau should take this matter up at headquarters level with OSI.

Oswald has also used the aliases Leslie Oswald, Aliksei Oswald, A. Hidell, A. J. Hidell, Alek J. Hidell, Alek James Hidell and O. H. Lee. Specifically advise the Bureau whether you checked money orders against such aliases in your review of the Miami Deposit Bank money orders. If not, this should be done immediately.

Handle immediately and submit results of your investigation in this matter in report form suitable for dissemination.

NOTE:

Cincinnati reported by teletype 3/4/64 that [redacted] had advised Cincinnati, same date, that a source he desired not to divulge informed him subject received money on regular basis from unknown source through money orders issued by Miami Deposit Bank. By teletype 3/4/64 Cincinnati reported results of recontact of [redacted] who stated he was unable to furnish additional information but of opinion money orders issued during past year. Cincinnati made contact with bank officials and reviewed all money orders issued at Miami Deposit Bank from 1/30/60 to 1/20/64 and found none payable to Oswald.

Re Bureau letter to Dallas January 10, 1964.

Enclosed is the sling used on the rifle in the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY.

*Dallas, TEXAS*  
On January 23, 1964, WILLIAM R. MC EWAN, Branch Manager, United-Car Fastener Corporation, 1066 West Mockingbird Lane, was shown the enclosed sling and he was unable to furnish any additional information as to who manufactured this sling or for what purpose this sling may have been used for.

He stated, however, that his company had manufactured the "Pull The Dot" fasteners which bear the stamp "United-Car" on the reverse side. He said that these were military fasteners with their number AN 227-68B and were manufactured for the Army and Navy. Mr. MC EWAN stated that it was quite possible that the sling was some type of military equipment possibly used by either the U. S. Army or U. S. Navy. He suggested that this sling be displayed to several officers of the U. S. Army and the U. S. Navy in an effort to identify what this sling was used for.

In view of the above, the FBI Laboratory may desire to contact several officers from the U. S. Army and U. S. Navy, Washington, D. C., in an effort to identify this sling.

U. S. Embassy in Mexico has furnished Legat with letter directed to President Lyndon B. Johnson dated 12-2-63 by Pedro Gutierrez Valencia, a department store credit investigator and former assistant prison director in Mexico.

Gutierrez allegedly saw an individual now believed by him to have been Lee Harvey Oswald while conducting credit inquiry at Cuban Embassy in Mexico around the first of October, 1963. Oswald reportedly was engaged in a heated discussion with an unidentified Cuban believed to have been employed by the Cuban Embassy, during which the names Castro and Kennedy were overheard. While walking through courtyard to gate, Cuban allegedly was counting American money which he gave to Oswald as both entered Renault auto and drove away. The discussion was in the English language, however, Gutierrez admittedly speaks or understands very little English.

Investigation to date has failed to establish exact date of above, identity of Cuban involved nor corroborate or disprove allegation. Gutierrez has identified newspaper photo of Oswald appearing in a Mexican newspaper, however, could not identify a recent photo of Oswald passing out Fair Play for Cuba Committee literature in New Orleans when displayed with other photos. Gutierrez states, however, he reportedly followed Oswald and the Cuban at two-yard intervals throughout courtyard.

By cablegram 2-12-64 Legat, Mexico, was instructed to intensify efforts to definitely resolve above allegation, including (1) display of photo to Gutierrez of former Cuban Consul General Eusebio Azcue with whom we know Oswald had heated discussion at Cuban Embassy in Mexico; (2) display of photo, eliminating background, of unidentified white male, possibly American, taken by CIA in Mexico which bears resemblance to Oswald to determine whether possible identical with individual believed by Gutierrez to have been Oswald. CIA clearance being obtained for this. (3) conduct additional
