FROM ASSISTANT DIRECTORS ROSEN AND SULLIVAN, TODAY, RE INTERVIEW  
OF MELVIN BELLI. *TXAS* *caulif*

BELLI WAS INTERVIEWED TONIGHT BY ME AND SA VINCENT E. DRAIN,  
IN A HOTEL ROOM SECURED FOR THAT PURPOSE. HE INSISTED ON HIS  
FELLOW LAWYER JOE TOWAHILL <sup>TXAS</sup> BEING PRESENT. BELLI WAS ADVISED  
THAT WE HAD RECEIVED INFORMATION FROM A RELIABLE SOURCE THAT HE  
HAD STATED LEE HARVEY OSWALD WAS A SECURITY-TYPE INFORMANT OF  
THE FBI, FOR A PERIOD OF THIRTEEN WEEKS. HE WAS INFORMED THAT  
THERE WAS ABSOLUTELY NO TRUTH IN THIS AND THAT I DESIRED TO SECURE  
FROM HIM ANY AND ALL INFORMATION WHICH HE HAD IN THIS REGARD.

BELLI STATED THAT AROUND THE FIRST OF THE YEAR HE HAD SEEN AN  
ARTICLE IN THE "HOUSTON POST" BY LONNIE HUDKINS WHICH ARTICLE  
WAS A RUMOR TO THE EFFECT THAT OSWALD MIGHT HAVE BEEN AN INFORMANT  
OF THE FBI OR CIA, AND SUBSEQUENT TO THAT ARTICLE, BELLI  
SUBPOENAED HUDKINS TO APPEAR AS A WITNESS IN THE CHANGE OF VENUE  
HEARING BEFORE JUDGE JOE B. BROWN. SOMETIME DURING THAT PERIOD,

HE HEARD ANOTHER RUMOR AROUND THE COURT HOUSE TO THE EFFECT THAT OSWALD MIGHT HAVE BEEN AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI. BELLI RELATED THAT HE QUESTIONED HUDKINS DURING THE VENUE HEARING AS HE FELT THAT THE PROSECUTION MIGHT TRY TO USE HIM AT A LATER DATE. JUDGE BROWN, IN THE VENUE HEARING, REFUSED TO PERMIT HUDKINS TO ANSWER HIS QUESTIONS AFTER OBJECTIONS OF THE PROSECUTION. BELLI STATED THAT HE THOUGHT AT THE TIME AND STILL DOES THINK THAT THESE RUMORS ORIGINATED WITH WILLIAM/ALEXANDER, ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY, WHO HAD TRIED TO PLANT OTHER RUMORS ON HIM AND THAT IT WAS BELLI-S FEELING THAT ALEXANDER THOUGHT BELLI MIGHT FALL FOR THIS TRAP. BELLI STATED THAT HE PLACED NO CREDENCE WHATSOEVER IN THE RUMOR THAT OSWALD WAS AN INFORMANT AND EVEN IF THERE WAS ANY CREDENCE TO SUCH, HE DID NOT THINK THAT SUCH INFORMATION HAD ANY PLACE IN THE JACK RUBY TRIAL. HE POINTED OUT THAT IF HE BROUGHT THIS UP IN THE TRIAL, HE WOULD CERTAINLY HAVE TO PROVE IT AND HE WOULD NEVER THINK OF DOING SO WITHOUT SEEING IF IT WERE TRUE, FROM THE FBI.

BELLI STATED THAT HE HAD TALKED TO NUMEROUS REPORTERS AND NEWS MEDIA DURING THE PAST SEVERAL WEEKS AND HE COULD NOT RECALL

TO WHOM ALL HE HAD TALKED HOWEVER HE DID RECALL TO THE BEST OF HIS MEMORY THAT APPROXIMATELY THREE WEEKS AGO SOMEONE ASKED HIM IF HE HAD HEARD THE RUMOR THAT OSWALD HAD BEEN AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI AND HE BELIEVES THAT THE PERSON ASKING THIS QUESTION WAS A REPORTER. TO THE BEST OF BELLI-S MEMORY, HE STATED HE TOLD THIS PERSON THAT HE HAD HEARD THE RUMOR AROUND THE COURT HOUSE. HE DOES NOT RECALL EXACTLY WHAT HE SAID BUT HE IS CERTAIN HE NEVER SAID ANYTHING TO THE EFFECT THAT OSWALD HAD BEEN AN INFORMANT BELLI WAS EMPHATICALLY ADVISED THAT LEE HARVEY OSWALD HAD NEVER BEEN AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI. HE AGAIN REITERATED THAT HE DOES NOT THINK, AND NEVER DID PLACE ANY CREDENCE IN THIS RUMOR THAT OSWALD WAS AN INFORMANT.

BELLI WAS ALSO ADVISED THAT WE RECEIVED INFORMATION THAT HE HAD ALSO STATED THAT JACK LEON RUBY HAD BEEN AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI FOR A PERIOD OF EIGHT WEEKS. BOTH HE AND TONAHILL STATED THAT THEY HAD AT NO TIME EVER HEARD ANYONE STATE THAT RUBY WAS AN INFORMANT OR INFER THAT HE WAS AN INFORMANT. BELLI INSISTED THAT HE BE PERMITTED TO CALL HIS OTHER CO-COUNSEL,

TO THE ROOM, ~~PHILLIP~~ BURLESON AND ASK HIM IF HE HAD EVER HEARD THIS RUMOR. BURLESON, UPON BEING ASKED THE SAME QUESTION AS TO WHETHER OR NOT HE HAD EVER HEARD OF RUBY BEING AN INFORMANT OR RUMOR TO THAT EFFECT, ADVISED THAT HE HAD NEVER HEARD ANY RUMOR FROM ANYONE TO THAT EFFECT. BELLI, TONAHILL AND BURLESON ALL STATED THAT THEY HAD NEVER TOLD ANYONE OR INFERRED TO ANYONE THAT RUBY WAS AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI. BELLI STATED THAT HE BELIEVED HE AND HIS CO-COUNSEL WOULD HAVE KNOWN IF RUBY HAD BEEN AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI, SINCE THEY HAD QUESTIONED RUBY IN DETAIL ABOUT HIS ENTIRE LIFE AND HE IS CERTAIN RUBY WOULD HAVE TOLD THEM IF HE HAD BEEN AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI. HE STATED RUBY HAD NEVER MENTIONED IN ANY MANNER WHATSOEVER, CO-OPERATING WITH THE FBI.

UPON CONCLUSION, BELLI STATED THAT HE WAS GETTING "DAMN TIRED" OF ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY WILLIAM ALEXANDER PLANTING RUMORS WHICH ALEXANDER THOUGHT BELLI MIGHT FALL FOR AND IT WAS HIS OPINION THAT ALEXANDER WAS PROBABLY THE SOURCE CONCERNING THE RUMOR THAT OSWALD WAS AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI.

HE DECLARED HE DID NOT DO THIS OUT OF MALICE OR BAD FAITH, OR WITH INTENT TO MISLEAD ANYONE, BUT DID NOT REGARD ANYTHING HE SAID AS EVIDENCE, OR SERIOUS, UNTIL CHALLENGED TWO TWENTY SEVEN, LAST REGARDING THE VARIANCE IN HIS STATEMENTS, AND HE WAS ASHAMED TO ADMIT TO THE IRRESPONSIBLE NAMING OF HIS SOURCES.

HE STATED HE DID NOT GO TO MEXICO TO INVESTIGATE ANYTHING, BUT TO ATTEND THE INTERNATIONAL PRESS CONFERENCE ALREADY DESCRIBED. CONSEQUENTLY, HE DID NOT LISTEN CLOSELY, AND TOOK NO NOTES ON WHAT WAS SAID REGARDING THE OSWALD VISIT TO MEXICO. OF EIGHTEEN OR TWENTY NEWSMEN PRESENT IN THE OFFICES OF QUOTE EXCELIO<sup>S</sup> UNQUOTE, HE BELIEVED ALL WERE MEXICAN EXCEPT DOCTOR BORRELL NAVARRO, AND THIS WAS THE ONLY NAME KNOWN TO HIM. HE ADMITTED HE HAD UNDOUBTEDLY ATTRIBUTED MORE TO DOCTOR BORRELL NAVARRO THAN HE SHOULD HAVE IN HIS INTERVIEW WITH SPECIAL AGENT O'CONNOR. HE STATED ALL THE NEWSMEN WERE EXPRESSING

OPINIONS, THEORIES, ASKING QUESTIONS, AND OFFERING THEIR OWN POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS, REGARDING OSWALD'S CONTACTS IN MEXICO.

DIAZ VERNON STATED HE CANNOT HONESTLY SEPARATE, AS TO SOURCE, WHAT HE HEARD FROM EIGHTEEN OR TWENTY NEWSMEN, READ IN THE MEXICO CITY NEWSPAPERS, AND HEARD FROM DOCTOR BORRELL NAVARRO, BUT HE DID REAFFIRM THAT BORRELL NAVARRO DISCUSSED THE VISIT OF OSWALD TO THE CUBAN CONSULATE IN MEXICO CITY, AND THE FACT THAT SILVIA DURAN WAS PICKED UP AND INTERROGATED BY THE MEXICAN POLICE.

DIAZ VERNON WAS OBVIOUSLY EXTREMELY DISTRESSED AND EMBARRASSED. HE WRITES FOR SEVERAL NEWSPAPERS, INCLUDING QUOTE "AHORA" UNQUOTE OF NEW YORK, AND STATED HE HAD WRITTEN NOTHING CONCERNING INSTANT MATTER BECAUSE HE KNEW HE COULD NOT BE SURE OF HIS FACTS AND SOURCES. HE REGRETTED HIS IRRESPONSIBLE STATEMENTS HAD CAUSED INCONVENIENCE TO THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION AND THE PRESIDENTIAL COMMISSION, AND DECLINED TO TAKE POLY-

By letter dated 2/8/64 to the Director from Mr. U. Alexis Johnson, Deputy Under Secretary of State, he inquired if the Bureau had any objection to State furnishing copies of telegrams to the Warren Commission investigating the assassination of President Kennedy. He specifically referred to 10 telegrams sent to the Secretary of State from the U. S. Ambassador to Mexico copies of which were in the Bureau's possession. By letter dated 2/12/64 we advised State that the Bureau had no objection, however, it was up to State Department to determine if these telegrams should be sent to the Commission.

On 2/28/64, Mr. Joseph W. Scott, Deputy Director, Bureau of Intelligence and Research, State, advised that there are two additional telegrams (Bureau has copies) from the U. S. Ambassador to Mexico which were received through Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) channels. CIA would normally send them to the Commission. Mr. Scott said that CIA has now advised State that they are leaving the dissemination of these telegrams up to State. Mr. Scott wanted the Bureau to know that State is sending these two additional telegrams to the Warren Commission together with the 10 telegrams mentioned in their communication to the Bureau dated 2/8/64. Mr. Scott said that inasmuch as all 12 of these telegrams are in this same category, they will forward them to the Commission within the next day or two inasmuch as they feel the Commission should have the full benefit of all material available in this matter.

The Honorable Richard M. Nixon, former Vice President of the United States, was contacted on February 28, 1964 by an Assistant Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. *Bl...*

Mr. Nixon advised that the only time he was in Dallas, Texas during 1963 was two days prior to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. He vaguely thought there was some invitation extended during the early part of 1963, probably in April, for him to come to Dallas, but that it never materialized, nor did he give any consideration to going there. Mr. Nixon could not even recall the circumstances surrounding the invitation, but did observe that conceivably there could have been some publicity indicating that he had been invited to come to Dallas. Mr. Nixon said that if anything more concrete comes to his mind or after his secretary checks his records which would indicate the circumstances surrounding this, he would immediately notify the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He did say positively that he had no intention of visiting Dallas during April 1963.

William A. McKenzie, born Columbus, Georgia, March 13, 1923; admitted to bar, 1949, Texas. Preparatory education, Texas A. & M. College (B.S., 1946); legal education, Southern Methodist University (LL.B., 1949). Fraternity: Phi Alpha Delta. Assistant District Attorney, Dallas County, Texas, 1949-1950. Member: Dallas and American Bar Associations; State Bar of Texas. (Captain, U.S.A.R., 1942-1946).

A check of Bureau files has disclosed no derogatory information identifiable with Mr. McKenzie.

SAC J. Gordon Shanklin of the Dallas Office has advised that Mr. McKenzie is a highly respected lawyer in the Bar circles in Dallas and appears sincere in attempting to elicit the truth from Marina and Robert Oswald. According to SAC Shanklin, Mr. McKenzie has indicated a desire to cooperate completely with the FBI and the President's Commission in the assassination matter. Mr. McKenzie has informed our Dallas Office that he does not desire to represent Robert Lee Oswald or Marina Oswald if they started lying to him and he has impressed that fact upon them. We have informed the Commission of such statement by Mr. McKenzie.

The following investigation was conducted by SA CARL F. FREEMAN on 3/3/64, at Las Vegas, Nevada.

It is noted that Mercury, Nevada, is not a city or town with family dwellings but is an atomic testing site under the control of Atomic Energy Commission.

UDELL BUNCE, Security Supervisor of Atomic Energy Commission and the Mercury Test Site, advised that their badge, name check, and request for clearance files failed to reveal any identifiable information with the last name of ROMANIUK or any similar name.

Mr. BUNCE further advised there are numerous prime contractors and innumerable subcontractors at Mercury, Nevada, and he has no information concerning any businesses or shops having closed or who contemplate closing at the test site.

LYNN HAGEL, Clark County Sheriff's Office, and CARMEN THOMPSON, Las Vegas Police Department, both advised that a check of their files failed to reveal any information under the name ROMANIUK.

ISAACS claims he is not acquainted with any individuals named HOFFMAN or HAUCHTMAN or ROMANIUK. He could furnish no information regarding descriptions of individuals as set out in re tel.

States he does not own an automobile and he could furnish no information regarding discussion of a '58 Dodge or possibly Mercury car as described in re tel.

He had never heard of the Townhouse at Kellogg and Broadway in Kansas City, Missouri, and he has no intention of ever visiting Kansas City. According to him, he has never been to the Winnipeg International Airport.

ISAACS could furnish no information whatsoever in an effort to resolve identities and conversations in re tel.

It is noted MARTIN ISAACS was previously interviewed by SA JAMES O. INGRAM which is set forth in report of SA JOHN JAMES O'FLAHERTY at NY, pages 4 and 5, dated 12/17/63. ISAACS, in his official capacity, assisted OSWALD and family in 1962 at the request of the US State Department to relocate in Texas. This was upon the arrival of OSWALD and family in NYC from Russia. He pointed out then, and again on 3/4/64, he had no other contact or communication with OSWALD from their official contact in early 1962.

ReSA letterhead memoranda 2/21/64 and 2/24/64 concerning Fred Dalton Lindsay and Charlotte teletypes 2/21/64 and 2/24/64 on same matter. Referenced letterhead memorandum of 2/21/64 reported that Lindsay stated, when first interviewed, that four months before the assassination he had informed Father Mullins of a plan to assassinate President Kennedy. Referenced letterhead memorandum of 2/24/64 reported Lindsay as advising his first story was completely untrue. Charlotte teletype of 2/21/64 reporting the interview with Father Edward E. Mullins, Greenville, South Carolina, substantiates that Lindsay never discussed President Kennedy with Mullins. Charlotte should submit results of this interview with Mullins in letterhead memorandum form suitable for dissemination to the Commission as evidence that Lindsay's first story was untrue. Charlotte should also include in letterhead memorandum results of interview with Reverend Theodore Hafner and fact that Lindsay did not discuss President Kennedy with him so as to complete picture of Lindsay's contacts with clergymen in Greenville, South Carolina. If these clergymen furnished their information in confidence, they should be recontacted and advised of the need to furnish this information to the Commission and requested to consent to this.

San Antonio teletype of 2/22/64 set forth that information regarding Lindsay came to San Antonio's attention through Reverend James Joseph who is mentioned in referenced letterhead memorandum of 2/24/64. Likewise, the Bureau believes a more complete picture of this episode can be furnished the Commission if the results of the interview with Reverend Joseph are also set forth in letterhead memorandum. Reverend Joseph. Inasmuch as Reverend Joseph requested that his identity be protected, San Antonio should recontact him. Explain to him that Lindsay in interview admitted talking with him. Advise him that, since Lindsay mentioned him, the results of the interview with him should be furnished the Commission so as to complete the record on this matter and request his permission to report the interview with him to the Commission using his name. Furnish results of interview with Joseph in letterhead memorandum form suitable for dissemination.

Both Charlotte and San Antonio note that per current instructions the Bureau property stamp is not to be included on any letterhead memoranda which will go to the Commission. Handle expeditiously.

NOTE:

Lindsay first told the story containing information he allegedly had about the assassination, but later said it was completely untrue. Charlotte's interview with Father Mullins substantiates to a certain extent that Lindsay was not telling the truth when first interviewed and this information from Father Mullins should be submitted in form suitable for dissemination to the Commission. Likewise, the information from the other clergymen indicates the mental instability of Lindsay and, it is believed, should also be furnished the Commission. We will submit all the information concerning Lindsay to the Commission at one time, when the requested letterhead memoranda are received.

On 2/26/64, SA JOHN EDWARD DAILEY obtained the following information from LESLIE HOLLANDSWORTH, #71 Parsons Road, Room #29, U. S. Naval Ordnance Test Station, China Lake, California, employed as a cook at the Commissioned Officers Mess.

BUSTER D. MITCHELL, Charleston, West Virginia, is a relative of his, and he had a conversation in a bar with MITCHELL during November, 1963. This conversation concerned integration and the attendant problems in the southern states, and he recalls during this conversation he said that "there would be hell to pay" in the South before integration was completed, referring to the possibility of more race riots such as had occurred in the past.

He denied he made a statement that "you are going to hear something soon that is really going to shock the country," or that he later wrote MITCHELL a letter telling him not to repeat this statement. He said that MITCHELL, in conversation after the assassination, with a deputy U. S. Marshal who is a cousin of his, apparently told him that HOLLANDSWORTH had made a statement about what would happen in the future, and in this way it was repeated to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
