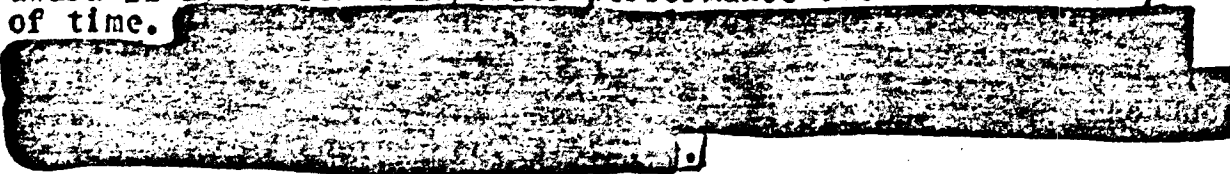

By memorandum 3-3-64 it was recommended that Liaison work out immediate arrangements with State Department to have a Bureau Agent travel to Haiti for the purpose of interviewing the subject concerning his statement that he had been told by an FBI Agent that Lee Harvey Oswald was completely harmless. Dallas Office was instructed to submit their recommendations as to the Agent who should handle the interview.

ASAC Kyle Clark, Dallas, called 3-4-64 and advised that in response to the Bureau's inquiry, they were of the opinion that SA W. James Wood was best qualified to handle the interview of De Mohrenschildt in Haiti. According to Clark, SA Wood is completely familiar with the background of the captioned investigation and he is a mature Agent with considerable experience on security work.

A review of the personnel file of SA W. James Wood reflects that he first entered on duty as a stenographer in May, 1941. He became a Special Agent 3-15-48 and has since served in several field offices and resident agencies. He was assigned to the Los Angeles Office commencing 3-2-53 where his services were almost continuously used on security-type cases. During his career he has been censured on three occasions, commended on five occasions and most recently received a cash award 11-23-62 for a superior performance over an extended period of time.



Dallas Office previously noted that the Agent handling the interview should be familiar with a prior interview of the subject which was conducted in February, 1945. This was called

Marina Oswald was concerned over such proposition and asked Mr. McKenzie whether the money would come from donations. Mr. McKenzie advised her that it would.
