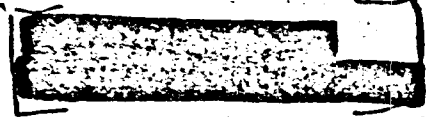

MARINA CONTACTED DECLAN AND KATHERINE FORD EARLY MORNING TO ADVISE NEWSPAPERMAN FROM DALLAS TIMES HERALD WAS AT HER RESIDENCE. SHE SAID SHE PERMITTED HIM TO ENTER AS SHE THOUGHT SHE RECOGNIZED HIM AS BEING FROM POLICE OR FBI. MRS. FORD TOLD MARINA TO TELL THE REPORTER THAT SHE CANNOT TALK TO HIM AND ASK HIM TO LEAVE. DECLAN FORD SPOKE TO THE REPORTER, WHO GAVE HIS NAME AS DARWIN PAYNE. FORD TOLD HIM THAT MARINA CAN'T TALK AND SUGGESTED HE CALL WILLIAM A. MC KENZIE AND ARRANGE FOR INTERVIEW. FORD THEN TOLD MARINA TO TELL HIM TO LEAVE OR THAT SHE WILL CALL POLICE. LATER MARINA ADVISED REPORTER LEFT AND MRS. FORD AGAIN WARNED MARINA NOT TO OPEN THE DOOR TO ANYONE.

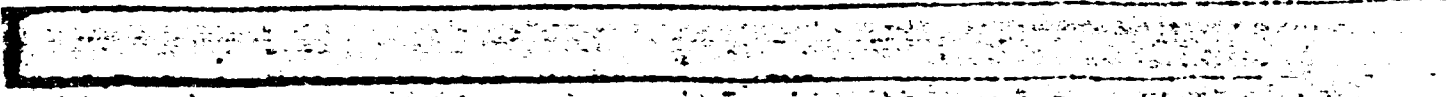

MC KENZIE CONTACTED MARINA AND ADVISED THAT THE TIMES HERALD REPORTER WANTS AN INTERVIEW WITH HER BUT HE DOES NOT THINK THEY SHOULD GIVE ANOTHER INTERVIEW AT THIS TIME. MARINA AGREED. LATER ON MARCH SEVEN MARINA CONTACTED MRS. FORD AND TOLD HER THAT A WOMAN NEIGHBOR HAD OFFERED TO TAKE HER TO SHOPPING CENTER FOR FOOD. MRS. FORD SAID SHE WOULD BE OVER TO SEE MARINA THAT NIGHT. MARINA ALSO MENTIONED THAT THE NEIGHBOR INVITED HER TO DINNER FOR SIX P.M. ON MARCH SEVEN.

ROBERT OSWALD CONTACTED MARINA AND SAID HE WOULD BE OVER TO SEE HER ABOUT ONE THIRTY OR TWO P.M. ON MARCH EIGHT. MARINA TOLD ROBERT THAT MRS. SMITH, HER NEIGHBOR, INVITED HER TO DINNER.

ON MARCH SEVEN, NINETEEN SIXTY-FOUR, AGENTS OBSERVED MARINA VISITING AT SIX THREE NINE BELT LINE ROAD, APPARENTLY FOR ABOVE-MENTIONED DINNER ENGAGEMENT. INVESTIGATION BEING CONDUCTED TO IDENTIFY SMITHS, MRS. FORD VISITED MARINA LATER ON MARCH SEVEN.

For the information of the Newark Division, subject is carried on RI-A of the NYO. He is an Attorney-at-Law with offices in Room 1001, 654 Madison Ave., NYC, and resides at 164 W. 79th St., NYC.

LANE may be characterized as follows:

The "New York Herald Tribune" newspaper dated 1/15/64, page 7, column 1, contained an article entitled "Oswald's Mother Hires Lane". This article stated that on 1/14/64, Mrs. MARGUERITE C. OSWALD, mother of accused assassin LEE HARVEY OSWALD announced she had hired MARK LANE to represent her slain son before the Warren Commission investigating the murder of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. According to this article, Mrs. OSWALD stated she had been in contact with LANE during his stay in Fort Worth, Texas, the previous weekend. It was also pointed out that LANE had accepted the case although Mrs. OSWALD stated she had no funds with which to pay him.

On 6/10/63, [redacted] (conceal-reliable in the past) advised that at a meeting of the NYCAHUAC held 5/28/63, at 74 5th Ave., NYC, MARK LANE was elected to the position of Vice-Chairman of the organization.

Newark will provide coverage of subject's appearance at Upsala College, East Orange, New Jersey, on 4/2/64, pursuant to instructions contained in reButel, 2/26/64.

Newark will also furnish the NYO with any information that may be received concerning future speaking plans of LANE.

Two copies of this communication are being furnished to the Dallas Division for information in view of their interest in this matter.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

This morning Mr. Jones Harris, who resides at 242 East 43d Street, New York, N.Y., appeared at the Commission with his attorney, Arnold R. Krakower, Esq., of 19 E. 53d Street, New York, N.Y. They brought with them several items of photographic material, including the enclosed 13 photographs. Mr. Harris tells us that 12 of them are reproductions of a portion of the 13th picture by either a micro or macro method of photography.

As you will see, the blow-ups of the individual in the doorway do bear some resemblance to Lee Harvey Oswald as he is depicted in other available photographs.

For your information, the photographer who made these blow-ups for Mr. Harris is Bernard Hoffman, located on the fourth floor of 76 Madison Avenue, New York, N.Y.

Mr. Harris advises us that a print used in connection with the publication of substantially the same picture in an issue of the Saturday Evening Post following the assassination is the photographic base most suitable for a beginning point in this type work. However, his claim is he was unable to obtain it and therefore used the enclosed.

The foregoing is being brought to your attention for whatever use you deem appropriate in connection with your identification of the individual depicted in the picture, who is immediately adjacent to the doorway of the Texas School Book Depository Building, and which you have already undertaken.


On an entirely different subject, and in connection with the matter you have previously investigated and reported at page 7 of your Bureau memorandum, dated December 13, 1963, entitled "Hoaxes, False Reports, & Irresponsible Reporting," Mr. Harris advises that Robert L. Deschon, a Milwaukee newspaper reporter who writes for the MILWAUKEE JOURNAL, was the source of a rumor which had come to his attention, through another, in substance alleging that Oswald's name appeared on a guest register maintained at an establishment called the "Fox and Hounds" located at the northern end of Lake Hubert in the vicinity of Milwaukee. Harris further advises that inquiry by him, among others, leads him to believe that the restaurant is owned by one or more of four brothers named Fazio who reportedly have underworld-type connections.

Harris further advises that upon learning this information he began corresponding with Deschon and is still doing so, and accordingly, prefers not to be identified as having disclosed Deschon's name. Harris claims that Deschon is convinced that there is something to the rumor because of the reaction on the part of the restaurant's personnel among whom he has conducted inquiry.

This material is being furnished to you for your additional information and for your use in conducting an interview of Deschon, if you agree one should be conducted.

Thank you for your continuing cooperation in the work of this Commission.

2. Composite photograph of Mr. Billy Nolan Lovelady consisting of three photographs taken by an Agent of our Dallas, Texas, Office on February 29, 1964.
3. Communication dated February 20, 1964, at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, concerning the interview of Mr. Robert L. Dishon.

The photograph transmitted with your letter of February 24, 1964, depicted the Presidential limousine as it passed the Texas School Book Depository Building and an individual reportedly bearing a resemblance to Lee Harvey Oswald is observed in the doorway of the building. The number "(DN2)" as well as the legend "DALLAS, TEX., NOV. 22-- KENNEDY SHOT IN DALLAS" appears on this photograph. You will note on page one of the enclosed communication dated March 3, 1964, reference is made to the Associated Press enlarging a photograph similarly designated "(DN2)". The enclosed composite photographs of Mr. Lovelady are furnished for your assistance.

The photograph and partial enlargements submitted by you are being retained for possible future use.

Dear Mr. Rankin:

On March 2, 1964, a confidential source who has furnished reliable information in the past advised that he was in contact with Marina Oswald on that date. According to this source, Marina Oswald stated that her attorney, Mr. William A. McKenzie, had told her that James Martin wanted to tell the President's Commission "what happened in Washington" but that Chief Justice Warren did not want to hear about it stating that such incident did not pertain to the case before the Commission and Martin was requested by Chief Justice Warren to remain silent about it. Marina did not further elaborate to our source and it is, of course, not known whether this information is accurate.

ReNYairtel 3-5-64 with enclosed letterhead memorandum setting forth results of interview of Wade Manning.

Miami should immediately reinterview John Martino concerning allegation of Manning. Nathaniel and Sylvia Seyl should likewise be exhaustively interviewed. The above individuals are well known to the Miami Office. Definitively pin down each allegation in this matter and set forth any additional leads warranted to resolve the truth or falseness of the information.

With regard to information set forth in paragraph three on page two of reairtel, New York should incorporate this in a letterhead memorandum suitable for dissemination to the President's Commission. Since this apparently has no relation to the Manning allegation, it should have been in a separate communication. In view of the possible significance of this information, it will be necessary that it be completely resolved.

Bufiles disclose the landlady, named Roberts referred to on page two, paragraph three, of reairtel is possibly identical with Larlene Roberts, housekeeper at 1526 North Beckley, Dallas, Texas. Roberts has been interviewed previously in connection with captioned matter. If not already handled, Roberts should be reinterviewed for any information indicating Bernard Weisman, one of the signers of the anti-President advertisement which appeared in a Dallas newspaper, may have resided at her rooming house at the same time Leo Harvey Oswald resided at the above address. If so, ascertain relationship, if any, between the two.

MR. WILLIAM A. MC KENZIE, ATTORNEY FOR MARINA AND ROBERT OSWALD, ADVISED MARCH FIVE THAT INFORMATION CONTAINED IN DALLAS AIRTEL FEB TWENTYEIGHT LAST WAS FOR THE BUREAU'S INFORMATION ONLY. MR. MC KENZIE EMPHASIZED THAT UNDER NO CONDITIONS WOULD HE BE WILLING TO HAVE INFORMATION OF THIS NATURE DISSEMINATED IN VIEW OF THE FACT HE FEARED IT WOULD PLACE HIM IN EMBARRASSING POSITION AT A LATER DATE SHOULD HE REAPPEAR AT THE COMMISSION WITH EITHER OF HIS CLIENTS. HE STATES THAT HE HAS A STRONG FEELING, BUT NO POSITIVE INFORMATION, THAT EITHER ONE OR BOTH OF HIS CLIENTS MAY BE RECALLED. HE STATED THAT THE ONLY REASON HE FURNISHED THIS INFO IN THE FIRST PLACE WAS THAT HE HAS SUCH A HIGH REGARD FOR THE DIRECTOR AND THE BUREAU, AND WANTED THEM TO KNOW IT. HE ADVISED THAT THE COMMISSION IS WELL AWARE

MARCH FIVE [REDACTED] FURNISHED FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

MARINA CONTACTED KATHERINE FORD, ADVISED SHE RECEIVED ANOTHER LETTER FROM LEVINE (POSSIBLY ISAAC DON^T LEVINE). SHE DESCRIBED LETTER AS COPY, STATING ORIGINAL HAD BEEN SENT TO DECLAN FORD. MRS. FORD SAID MC KENZIE SUGGESTED MARINA NOT PERMIT LEVINE INTO THE HOUSE. MARINA SAID SHE WOULD HAVE TO LET HIM IN BUT WOULD SAY HIS VISITS WERE UNDESIRABLE. MARINA INDICATED SHE WILL IMMEDIATELY CALL MRS. FORD SHOULD LEVINE APPEAR AND IS DEPENDING ON MRS. FORD TO HELP HER GET RID OF LEVINE.

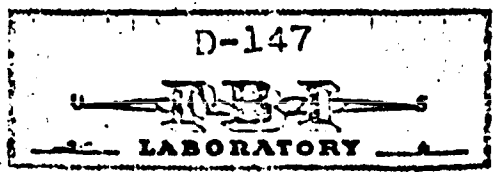

IF THE MODE OF TRAVEL IS MARKED ON ALL OF THESE TOURIST CARDS PAREN AND THEREAFTER COPIED ON TO THE FM-ELEVEN EMPAREN THIS WOULD SUPPORT THE CONTENTION THAT OSWALD'S MODE OF TRAVEL UPON DEPARTURE WAS UNKNOWN AND THE ENTRY QUOTE AUTO UNQUOTE ON THE FM-ELEVEN WAS INCORRECT. OF COURSE, IF THESE TOURIST CARDS ALSO DO NOT SHOW THE MODE OF TRAVEL UPON DEPARTURE AND THIS IS ONLY SHOWN ON THE FM-ELEVEN, IT IS POSSIBLE THE PERSON PREPARING THE FM-ELEVEN RECEIVES THE INFORMATION AS TO THE MODE OF TRAVEL UPON DEPARTURE FROM SOME OTHER SOURCE THAN THE TOURIST CARDS AND YOU WILL HAVE TO DETERMINE THIS.

AS YOU KNOW IT HAS NOT BEEN ESTABLISHED HOW OSWALD LEFT MEXICO ON OCTOBER THREE, ONE NINE SIX THREE. UNTIL WE CAN PROVE OSWALD WAS ON A BUS, THE POSSIBILITY WILL ALWAYS EXIST THAT HE LEFT BY AUTOMOBILE AS INDICATED IN MEXICAN IMMIGRATION RECORDS. NO EXPLANATION HAS BEEN GIVEN AS TO WHY RECORDS SHOW HE DEPARTED BY AUTOMOBILE. TO SAY THE RECORDS ARE ERRONEOUS IN THE ABSENCE OF PROOF OF SOME OTHER MODE OF TRANSPORTATION IS NOT TO ANSWER AN IMPORTANT QUESTION IN THIS CASE. NO EFFORT MUST BE SPARED TO CLEAR THIS MATTER UP. ANALYZE IT CAREFULLY AND HANDLE IT THOROUGHLY AND PROMPTLY.

REGARDING THE FIRST TWO FULL PARAGRAPHS ON PAGE THREE OF REFERENCED AIRTEL AND THE LAST PARAGRAPH OF REFERENCED MEMORANDUM, THE BUREAU HAS NO OBJECTION TO YOUR HANDLING THE EXPLANATION IN THE LAST PARAGRAPH OF THE MEMORANDUM AS YOU HAVE DONE PROVIDED THAT IN OMITTING MENTION OF THE CUBAN TRAVEL CASES YOU HAVE NOT OMITTED ANYTHING SPECIFICALLY DEALING WITH THE OSWALD CASE, BUT RATHER EXAMPLES OF ERRORS APPEARING ON FORMS FM-ELEVEN. ADVISE. YOUR ATTENTION IS CALLED TO THE FACT THAT THE BUREAU PROPERTY STAMP IS NOT TO APPEAR ON LETTERHEAD MEMORANDA FOR DISSEMINATION TO THE COMMISSION. IN RECHECKING THE TOURIST CARDS TO DETERMINE IF THEY ARE MARKED WITH REGARD TO MODE OF TRAVEL UPON DEPARTURE, YOU SHOULD PAY PARTICULAR ATTENTION TO THOSE TRAVEL CARDS HANDLED BY CHAPA, THE MAN WHO HANDLED OSWALD'S CARD AT THE TIME OF HIS DEPARTURE, AND DETERMINE IF CHAPA INDICATED ON THESE CARDS THE MODE OF TRAVEL.
