The records reflected a Mr. JOHN TERBERT, Room #618, Willard Hotel, made a telephonic reservation at 1900 on 2/6/64 for a party of four. The party included JOHN TERBERT, J. HOBBS, MRS. HOBBS, and infant. The records indicated the four reservations were used on Braniff flight #9, leaving Dulles International Airport at 5:45 P. M. on 2/8/64, via Boeing Jet, arriving in Dallas, Texas at 7:48 P. M. on 2/8/64.

The records further reflected the notation that party of four had "open tickets" for return flight, Washington to Dallas, but had no reservations for any particular flight.

Reference WFO letterhead memo dated 2/19/64 reflected that JOHN M. THORNE, 302 W. College, Grand Praire, Texas, was assigned to Room #632 on 2/2/64 at the Willard Hotel, Washington, D. C. He moved to room #618 and on 2/7/64 moved from room #618 to room #645.

It appears from the above, that JOHN M. THORNE, who occupied room 618 at the Willard Hotel made the reservations for the indicated flight; that MARINA OSWALD, MARTIN, and THORNE departed under the above assumed names.

Dallas is requested to verify from MARINA OSWALD, her, MARTIN's and THORNE's return to Dallas on the indicated date under the assumed names, she as Mrs. HOBBS.

It is suggested that the assumption of same may have been an effort to avoid publicity at departure.

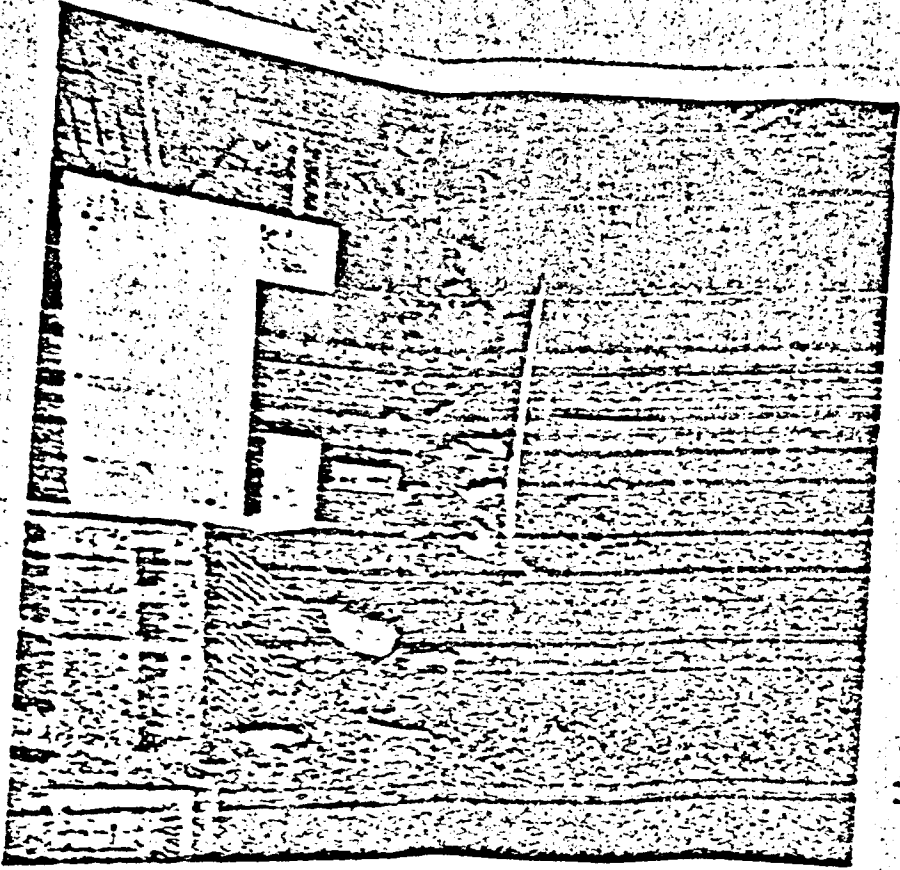
2) Plot of the 1150 of Avenue Kingland in Ocean
