On March 11, 1964, Michael and Ruth Paine, 2515 West 5th Street, Irving, Texas, advised they have no knowledge of Lee Harvey Oswald or Marina Oswald owning two thick books on American or United States History. They do not recall any books fitting this description ever having been in possession of, or having been mentioned by, either Marina or Lee Harvey Oswald.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

On March 13, 1964, Robert Oswald, 1009 Sierra, Denton, Texas, furnished to Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation Volumes I and II of "The Outline of History" by H. G. Wells published by Garden City Books, Garden City, New York. These books have a red and blue cover and the edges of the pages on one side of each book are red in color.

On March 13, 1964, Mrs. Marina Oswald, 629 Belt Line Road, Richardson, Texas, was exhibited Volumes I and II of "The Outline of History" by H. G. Wells, and she identified these two volumes as being the "two thick books on the history of the United States" which were carefully read by Lee Harvey Oswald while they were residing on Elsbeth Street in Dallas, Texas.

RE: Possible target practice in the vicinity of Love Field, Dallas, Texas

On March 11, 1964, Mr. V. C. Snider, Schedule Engineer, Dallas Transit Company, Interurban Building, Dallas, Texas, advised the Love Field bus originates at Rockford and Westmoreland Streets (south Oak Cliff section of Dallas) and terminates at the Love Field terminal (northwest section of Dallas). Mr. Snider stated the closest point the Love Field bus would come to 6th Street and Beckley Avenue intersection would be the intersection of Beckley Avenue and West Commerce Street, about one and three-fourth miles from the 6th Street and Beckley Avenue intersection. He stated there has been no change in this bus route in several years and the route for the Love Field bus would have been the same during March and April, 1963, as it is now.

Mr. Snider stated the Love Field bus from its origin on Rockford and Westmoreland Streets proceeds on Westmoreland to Davis Street, thence to Westmount, to Fort Worth Avenue, to Colorado Street, to Plymouth Street, to Fort Worth Avenue, to West Commerce Street, to Harwood Street, to McKinney Street, to Bowen Street, to Cedar Springs, and then to Love Field airport terminal. Mr. Snider stated the bus returns to south Oak Cliff using this same route.

Mr. Snider advised that if a person took either a Belmont or Skillman bus, the only inbound buses operating on Beckley Avenue, at approximately 6:00 p.m. at 6th and Beckley, this person would have arrived at the Beckley Avenue and West Commerce Street intersection in approximately five to seven minutes. He stated from this intersection the Love Field bus would take 34 minutes to reach the Love Field terminal. He advised that chances were this person would have had to wait approximately 15 to 20 minutes for the Love Field bus as its schedule showed it crossed this intersection at about 6:25 p.m.

Mr. Snider stated there were no buses operating on Zangs Blvd.

On March 12, 1964, Mr. Michael Scott, Forecaster, U. S. Weather Bureau, Love Field, Dallas, Texas, advised his records show the sun set in Dallas at 6:26 p.m., March 3, 1963, and at 7:04 p.m., April 24, 1963.

Marina Oswald in previous interviews advised she and Lee Harvey Oswald had left their residence, 214 W. Neely Street, Dallas, at 6:00 p.m. on one occasion, exact date not recalled, but between March 3, 1963, and April 24, 1963, when Oswald had his rifle wrapped in a raincoat. According to Marina, they walked to Elsbeth Street where they turned left and walked two blocks and turned right and walked two blocks and crossed the street where Oswald boarded a bus believed to be the "Love Field" bus. Marina stated Oswald returned home about 9:00 p.m. and told her he had practiced with the rifle.

On March 11, 1964, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation began at 214 W. Neely Street and followed the directions given by Marina and determined the point where Oswald allegedly caught the bus to be the intersection of Beckley Avenue and 6th Street. By crossing Beckley Avenue, this would mean Oswald would have taken an inbound bus. From this point, the Special Agent proceeded via automobile on Beckley Avenue to the intersection of West Commerce Street, a distance of 1.5 miles. It was noted from the intersection of Greenbriar Lane and Beckley Avenue, a distance

of 0.7 of a mile, Beckley Avenue runs at a slight angle to the west levee of the Trinity river; also, that the West Commerce Street and Beckley Street intersection is directly over this levee. The crest of the levee is accessible by foot at any point along this area and there is a gravel roadway on top of the levee. The levee is approximately 35 feet high. Proceeding on West Commerce Street to the east levee, a distance of about 500 yards, it was observed that the area known locally as "Trinity river bottom" is clear and uninhabited and that the Trinity river flows in a relatively small channel about equidistant between the east and west levees. This area of Trinity river bottom could be used for rifle firing with either of the levees as an abutment.

The Special Agent proceeded on West Commerce Street through the downtown business district to Harwood Street thence to Cedar Springs Street and the Love Field terminal. This route and area immediately adjacent thereto was observed to be made up of business and residential buildings and there did not appear to be any area suitable where a person might fire a rifle. Likewise, there were no gun shops observed on the route traveled by the Love Field bus from West Commerce and Beckley Avenue to the Love Field terminal.

It is pointed out that if Oswald left his residence at 6:00 p.m., he would have had the maximum of 64 minutes in which to practice fire his rifle prior to sunset based on information furnished by the U. S. Weather Bureau.

Examination of maps of the city of Dallas show the Trinity river flows from the northwest section of Dallas to the southeast section of Dallas in the proximity of Love Field and separates Oswald's former residence from downtown Dallas. It is noted that levees bound the river from a point west of Love Field to a point east of Oswald's former residence.

On March 11, 1964, Mr. John Thomas ~~Hasen~~, owner ~~of~~ ~~Hasen's~~ Gun Shop, 7402 Harry Hines Blvd., Dallas, Texas, advised he handled 6.5 ammunition and had acquired this ammunition from John Brinegar, owner of The Gun Shop, telephone CH 7-2600.

The photograph of Lee Harvey Oswald was exhibited to Mr. Masen and he advised he was unable to identify this individual as being a person to whom he had previously sold 6.5 ammunition.

Mr. Masen stated people in the gun repair business in the vicinity of Love Field, Dallas, normally use the Trinity river bottom as a place to test fire rifles. He advised the river levee is sufficiently high to provide ample safety. Mr. Masen stated he frequently used the Trinity river bottom to test fire guns. He described this place as being approximately two miles west of his gun shop. Mr. Masen stated the only other gun shop located in the vicinity of Love Field was the gun shop owned by John Brinegar.

On March 12, 1964, Mr. John H. Brinegar, owner, ^{Dallas, Texas} The Gun Shop, 11448 Harry Hines Blvd., telephone CH 7-2600, Dallas, Texas, advised he has been a gunsmith for the past 30 years. He stated at the end of World War II, "GI's" began bringing Italian Carcano 6.5 rifles back to the United States. He advised that subsequently New York gun dealers began importing this rifle from Italy by "boat loads" and, as a consequence, this rifle has had wide distribution. Mr. Brinegar stated this rifle was a very cheap rifle and could have been purchased for \$3.00 each in lots of 25. Mr. Brinegar advised that likewise 6.5 ammunition manufactured by the Western Cartridge Company also had wide distribution throughout the United States and could be purchased through any number of wholesale dealers.

Mr. Brinegar advised that in his personal opinion the scope on the rifle used by Lee Harvey Oswald would have been mounted by the factory. He explained that in mounting the scope the bolt would have to be altered. This expense plus the expense of drilling the necessary holes for the scope mounting would amount to not less than \$15.00 and it would be impractical to spend this amount on a ".300 gun."

Mr. Brinegar advised that people test firing rifles as a rule would either do so at a gun club or would use the Trinity river bottom. He explained that the levee on either side of the river, about 35 feet high, provides a suitable abutment.

The photograph of Lee Harvey Oswald was exhibited to Mr. Brinegar and he stated he was not able to identify this individual as being a person to whom he had previously sold 6.5 ammunition.

Additional information is recorded on pages 442-443, 446-448, the last paragraph on page 471, and page 473 of the report of Special Agent Robert P. Gemberling, Dallas, dated March 10, 1964.

RE: Sheet of yellow tablet paper bearing Russian and English handwriting (D-42) (Q42)

On March 11, 1964, George Bouhe, 4740 Homer Street, Dallas, Texas, furnished two pages of handwriting in the Russian language. The Russian words were read to Bouhe as he wrote and these words are as they appear in Russian on Inventory Item D-24 (Federal Bureau of Investigation Laboratory Number Q-42).

Following the furnishing of this handwriting, Bouhe was shown a photograph of D-24, which is a yellow, legal-size sheet of paper with Russian writing and English writing interlineated. Bouhe readily identified the Russian writing as his. He stated this sheet was an English lesson which he had composed for Marina Oswald. He said he had composed the Russian writing and then given the page to Marina, who was to interlineate the English equivalents through the use of a Russian-English dictionary. He stated Marina had written the English writing appearing on the page and he had thereafter corrected it and returned it to Marina.

RE: 15 power telescope (Item 375), and hunting knife with 4-5 inch blade (B5)

The Laboratory of the Federal Bureau of Investigation examined Evidence Item 375 and found it to bear identifying information "15X Telescope Wollensak U.S.A." It also examined Evidence Item B5, which appears to be a hunting knife of extremely poor quality, and the only identifying information found is the stamped notation "Imperial Prov. R. I. USA."

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

On March 11, 1964, Michael Paine, 2515 West 5th Street, Irving, Texas, examined a photograph of a telescope, such photograph being designated as Item No. 375, and identified the telescope as one belonging to him.

He also examined photographs of a knife and sheath, designated as Item B5, and stated he does not recognize this knife as being his property. He does not recall having seen the knife previously and he does not know to whom this knife belongs.

On March 11, 1964, Mrs. Ruth Paine, 2515 West 5th Street, Irving, Texas, examined photographs of a hunting knife and sheath designated as Item B5. She stated she does not recall ever having seen this knife and does not know to whom it belongs.

ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT
JOHN F. KENNEDY N-22-63 DALLAS TEXAS
LEE HARVEY OSWALD

On March 12, 1964, Eugene Leslie Roberts, also known as Gene Roberts, residence 8527 West 7 Mile Road, Detroit, Michigan, telephone 342-4038, news reporter for the "Detroit Free Press", telephone 222-6600, was interviewed at the Dallas County Courthouse by Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Roberts advised he arrived in Dallas on February 13, 1964, to cover the trial of Jack L. Ruby, representing the "Detroit Free Press" and some other newspapers in the Knight chain. He stated that a photograph of Lee Harvey Oswald with a rifle in his hand appeared in the February 17, 1964, issue of the "Detroit Free Press" and that this newspaper actually "hit the street" on February 16, 1964.

Roberts advised that shortly after the edition of the newspaper came out with the photograph included, Newsweek Magazine contacted him in an effort to obtain a copy of the photograph. He stated he contacted the managing editor Frank Angelo and assistant manager, Derrick Daniels, who instructed him to refer any inquiries regarding the photograph to them. He said he understood Life Magazine had called the newspaper and that it was anticipated by the editors at the time that other newspapers and magazines would likely contact them. It was not speculated by him that the Federal Bureau of Investigation would be making inquiries.

Roberts advised that on the basis of his instructions he would not furnish information to agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation as to the source of the photograph in question; that he would advise his superiors by telephone on that date of the request of the agents for the identity of his source; and that should they give authority to him, he would then consider whether he desired to furnish the requested information. He stated he feels at this time that should he give favorable consideration to identifying his source, he would desire various "assurances" as to use which would be made of the information. He said he would voluntarily contact the

Enclosed for information is a clipping from the March 17, 1964, edition of the Hamburg, Germany, newspaper, "Die Welt," which is an article under the by-line of Herbert von Borch, described as the Washington correspondent for "Die Welt." The article is entitled, "The 'Facts' of Thomas Buchanan." It deals with an analysis of an article which Buchanan is said to have written for the French newspaper, "L'Express" and is critical of Buchanan's main thesis that Lee Harvey Oswald was not the murderer of President Kennedy, but only an accomplice. It disagrees with Buchanan's alleged "facts" and his reasoning.

Also enclosed is a clipping from the March 19, 1964, issue of "Die Welt" which is a letter from Buchanan to the editor, referring to the Von Borch column. In this, Buchanan says that Von Borch did not have available all the facts which Buchanan has and notes that he, Buchanan, had conferred following his trip to Dallas on March 9, 1964, with Mr. Nicholas de B. Katzenbach of the Department of Justice and with Mr. Howard P. Willens, described as liaison man between the Department of Justice and the Warren Commission. He states that all of his information had been made available to the Warren Commission, and the part of his conferences about which he may be able to write would appear in his series of articles.

Buchanan indicates in his letter that his series is appearing in Germany, Italy, Belgium, Sweden, Denmark, Finland, Norway, Spain, Greece, and Switzerland, in addition to France.

The Paris office has advised that it is covering the articles by Buchanan, who apparently resides in Paris. We will be alert for pertinent reaction in the German press to his series.

Ed Guthman called at 4:00 p. m., ^{John F.} 3-30-64. Jackie Kennedy has invited the captioned individual, a professor at Wesleyan University, to do a book regarding the pertinent six days concerning the President's assassination. The book will start on the night of the Judicial Reception 11-20-63 at the White House and will conclude with the burial of the President. Guthman explained that Mrs. Kennedy desired Manchester to write the book because he did an excellent job in 1962 on "The Profile of President Kennedy." Guthman also explained that Mrs. Kennedy believed that so many people were coming out with books that were so inaccurate that she thought it would be a good idea for Manchester to tell her story of the assassination events. The book will reportedly be published in 1968.

Guthman stated that Manchester and Mrs. Kennedy were most anxious that the Director meet Manchester and briefly tell him of the information the Director received from Dallas concerning the fact that the President had been shot and about the Director's immediate notification of the Attorney General. The Director was, of course, the first one to call the Attorney General and tell him that his brother had been killed.

During the course of discussion of neutron activation analyses between Mr. Melvin Eisenberg of your staff and Special Agent John F. Gallagher of this Bureau on March 16, 1964, Mr. Eisenberg requested the following information:

1. What are some items in common usage which contain barium? Some items that may include barium are: grease, ceramics, glass, paint, printing ink, paper, rubber, plastics, leather, cloth, pyrotechnics, oilcloth and linoleum, storage batteries, matches and cosmetics.

2. What are some items in common usage which contain antimony? Some items that may include antimony are: matches, type metal, lead alloys, paints and lacquers, pigments for oil and water colors, flameproof textiles, storage batteries, pyrotechnics, rubber, pharmaceutical preparations and calico.

3. What are some items in common usage which contain both barium and antimony? Barium and antimony may be found in the following items: printed paper and cloth, paint, storage batteries, rubber and matches, pyrotechnics and possibly other items.

Would neutron activation analyses show if a bullet passed through the hole in the front of President Kennedy's shirt near the collar button area and also if a bullet passed through the material of his tie? Neutron activation is a sensitive analytical technique to determine elements present in a substance. During the course of the spectrographic examinations previously conducted of the fabric surrounding the hole in the front of the shirt, including the tie, no copper was found in excess of that present elsewhere in undamaged areas of the shirt and tie. Therefore, no copper was found which could be attributed to projectile fragments.

It is not felt that the increased sensitivity of neutron activation analyses would contribute substantially to the understanding of the origin of this hole and frayed area.

In the attached letter from J. Lee Rankin he makes reference to Bureau letter of 3-2-64. We are unable to locate letter of that date. It is believed Mr. Rankin was referring to Bureau's letter of 3-9-64 which reported info from a confidential source that Marina Oswald was told by her attorney that James Martin wanted to tell the Commission "what happened in Washington" but that Chief Justice Warren did not want to hear about it. According to Mr. Rankin, it appears this never occurred. It would appear that no useful purpose would be served by calling the Commission's attention to the incorrect date of 3-2-64.

This is in reply to your letter of March 2, 1964, which has reference to Mr. James Martin's testimony before this Commission. Since the information which you have received is inaccurate in several important respects, I wish to clarify the incident which may have led to your informant's report.

As you know, the Commission has been investigating fully the incident involving Marina Oswald and James Martin which occurred after the Secret Service removed its surveillance on Friday, February 7, 1964. It was decided that the Commission would request sworn statements of every person having knowledge of this incident.

Mr. Martin was asked whether he would prepare such a statement and he indicated a willingness to do so. The question of his testifying before the Commission on this matter was never discussed in view of his willingness to submit a statement.

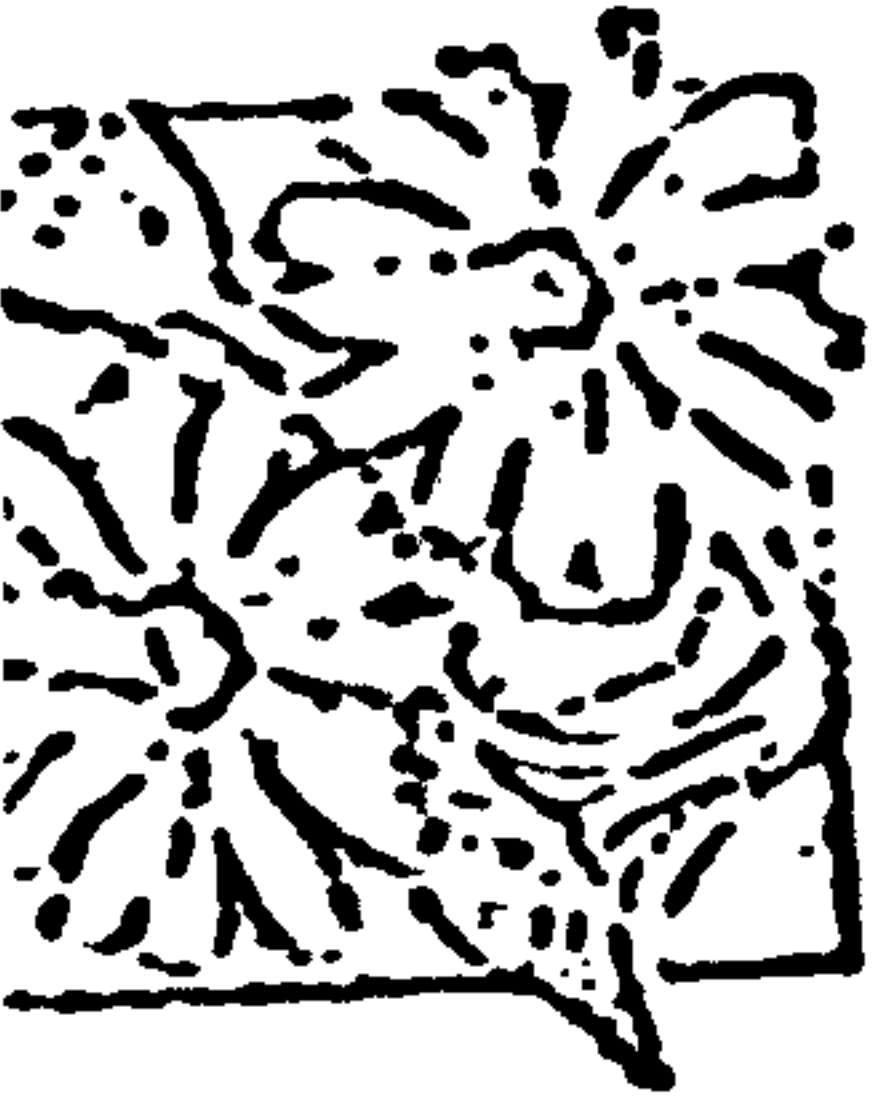
