Synopsis: BUSTER D. MITCHELL, R. D. 5, Box 621, Charleston, W. Va., was reinterviewed on 1/23/64, and advised he had not talked to LESLIE HOLLANDSWORTH since 11/63, but that he had received a letter from HOLLANDSWORTH 12/63, from China Lake, California. Criminal Identification Bureau, West Virginia State Police, reflects arrests of HOLLANDSWORTH on 3/9/33, for armed robbery and 3/28/43, as a fugitive from justice.

DETAILS:

On January 23, 1964, BUSTER D. MITCHELL, R. D. 5, Box 621, Charleston, W. Va., advised SA LEON ROSS GRABEN that he has had no personal contact with LESLIE HOLLANDSWORTH since he was last interviewed on November 26, 1963. MITCHELL stated he had received a letter from HOLLANDSWORTH dated December 15, 1963, from China Lake, California, in which HOLLANDSWORTH advised MITCHELL not to mention to anyone what he had told MITCHELL when they met in Charleston on November 18 or 19, 1963. MITCHELL stated he assumed HOLLANDSWORTH was referring to his statement to MITCHELL that "You are going to hear something soon that is really going to shock the country." MITCHELL advised that HOLLANDSWORTH mentioned he would be in Los Angeles after the first of the year. HOLLANDSWORTH made no mention as to his activity at China Lake or what he would be doing in Los Angeles.

MITCHELL stated that HOLLANDSWORTH's father, W. C. HOLLANDSWORTH, who was last known to live in Beckley, W. Va., died a number of years ago, and it was MITCHELL's understanding that HOLLANDSWORTH's mother had since remarried and her whereabouts are not known to MITCHELL.

On January 23, 1964, Mrs. VIRGINIA JARRETT, Criminal Identification Bureau, West Virginia State Police, Charleston, W. Va., advised SA GRABEN that her records reflect that one LESLIE CHESTER HOLLANDSWORTH, also known as ROY ELMER and BOB ELMER, white, male, born 1907, Raleigh County, W. Va., 5' 9", 150 lbs., blue eyes, black hair, light complexion, wife KATE, was arrested by the West Virginia State Police on March 9, 1933, at Gauley Bridge, W. Va., for armed robbery, and on March 28, 1943, by the Maryland State Police as a fugitive from justice. She said her files contained no further records for HOLLANDSWORTH.

Records of Harborside Terminal, Jersey City, New Jersey, show 520 Cartons of 38 E 91 I 6.5 caliber rifles stored 10/26/60. No record when specific carton number 3376 delivery was made.

DETAILS:

Date March 13, 19641

FREDERICK PETERSON Harborside Terminal, Incorporated, Exchange Place, Jersey City, New Jersey, advised from records that Adams Consolidated was charged with the bonded storage beginning October 26, 1960, for 520 cartons of 38 X 911 6.5 caliber rifles. A warehouse receipt dated November 9, 1960, sets forth that these rifles were in bonded storage and bore bond number 52737, and lot number 91594. Total weight was 45,856 pounds.

On August 29, 1962, 170 cartons of these rifles were delivered to FRED RUPP as set out on delivery order number 89138, account of Adams Consolidated, 404 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York.

On October 4, 1962, 90 cartons of these rifles were delivered to RUPP as set forth on delivery order 14473, account of Adams Consolidated.

On October 16, 1962, 70 cartons of rifles were delivered to RUPP as indicated on delivery order number 03480, Adams Consolidated account.

FRED RUPP took delivery of 64 cases of rifles on October 24, 1962, as indicated on delivery order A01460, account of Adams Consolidated.

Delivery order number A00642 shows delivery to RUPP on October 31, 1962, of 40 cases of rifles, Adams Consolidated account.

Mr. PETERSON stated that there are 86 cases of rifles remaining in the warehouse, according to his records, and there are 10 rifles in each case.

Mr. PETERSON made available the Harborside Terminal records of the warehouse receipt and the delivery orders mentioned above. He stated that these documents were the only ones he had which showed receipt and delivery of the rifles and that except for delivery order number 89138 the numbers of the cartons were not set out. He added, therefore, that his records failed to contain the exact date that carton number 3376 was delivered to RUPP, since that number was not specifically set forth on delivery order number 89138.

WILLIAM GLEN LOPEZ was interviewed at his place of business, Cass-Shelby Shell Service Station, 2450 Cass, Detroit, Michigan. He advised as follows:

He is employed at this place as a service station attendant and he resides at 846 Cherry Street, Detroit. He further identified himself by display of Michigan Driver's permit which contained in part the following pertinent information:

He traveled to Mexico with his brother, **LAWRENCE A. LOPEZ**, a United States Post Office employee, also from Detroit. They traveled from Detroit to Laredo, Texas by means of a Greyhound Bus. Arrival at Laredo was at about 11:30 p.m. on September 10, 1963. There, after an hour or two, at the same bus terminal, they boarded a Mexican bus "Transport of the North" and proceeded into Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, from which place they departed at about 2:30 a.m. on September 11, 1963. Their travel there was to Monterrey, Mexico, and then Mexico City, from which place they proceeded to Morelia and also Santa Annamaya, Mexico, where they vacationed with relatives.

Their return trip to Nuevo Laredo was by "Transport of the North" bus. The bus to this point from Mexico City contained no other American passengers. Neither **WILLIAM LOPEZ** nor his brother got off the bus at this point and did not get off until they arrived at customs in Laredo, Texas. The time of arrival in Laredo was about 3:00 p.m. on October 3, 1963. After approximately 2 hours in Laredo, they boarded a

A review on March 17, 1964, of the Naval service records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center for ~~DECLEN PHILLIP FORD~~, serial number 735 63 70, indicated he enlisted in the U. S. Naval Reserve on December 7, 1942, and served in an inactive status until June 12, 1943, at which time he entered on active duty in the U. S. Navy at Los Angeles, California. He served on active duty until March 12, 1945, and was honorably discharged as an aviation cadet at the U. S. Naval Receiving Barracks, Lido Beach, Long Island, New York, on the approved recommendation of a Report of Medical Survey because of Asthma.

His military occupation was shown as Aviation Cadet and civilian occupation as Student. He had no foreign service. Naval records failed to reflect any awards, citations, or decorations.

His character and efficiency ratings ranged from good to excellent and there is no record of any courts-martial or absence without official leave.

DONALD H. JANSON, News Correspondent, The New York Times, recalled that he prepared an article which appeared in the 11/30/63 edition of The New York Times containing a paragraph or two pertaining to LEE HARVEY OSWALD purchasing clothing in Laredo, Texas, on 9/26/63, which he was unable to later verify and, therefore, submitted a correction to his New York Office which he is sure appeared in the next day's edition.

DETAILS:

AT KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI


On March 3, 1964, DONALD H. JANSON, News Correspondent, The New York Times, Kansas City Power and Light Building, advised that he has no written record, but recalls that while he was in Dallas covering the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, he wrote an article concerning the activities of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, which appeared in the late city edition, November 30, 1963, of The New York Times. This article contained a paragraph or two which told of OSWALD being in Laredo, Texas, on September 26, 1963, where he purchased clothing.

Mr. JANSON further advised that this article was prepared late in the day and the portion concerning OSWALD's activities in Laredo was taken from an Associated Press article which had appeared in an evening edition of a Dallas, Texas, paper. He had attempted to verify this story by calling

Laredo, but since it was late in the day, his story was sent to his New York City Office without verification. The next day, he did talk to the manager or a spokesman for the department store mentioned in the Associated Press article by long-distance telephone. He cannot recall the name of the department store, but he believes it to be a prominent store. He also contacted Mrs. MICHAEL PAYNE, where OSWALD had lived during the September 26, 1963, period. JANSON advised that he was unable from either source to confirm the story that OSWALD had purchased clothing from a department store in Laredo; therefore, he submitted in his next article a correction to the previous day's reporting of the Laredo incident. Mr. JANSON was certain that the article, as he submitted it, appeared in the next day's edition following the original article. Teyg

Investigation disclosed two people from Corpus Christi, Texas and one person from Alice, Texas reportedly entered Texas from Nuevo Laredo, Mexico on 10/3/63. Mrs. ORALIA GARCIA MARTINEZ AYALA and Mrs. MARY LUISA DE GUERRERO GARCIA, residents of Corpus Christi, and Mrs. MARIA LUISA CRUZ de LOPEZ of Alice, who entered the United States on above date at Laredo, Texas, advised on interview they could not identify photograph of OSWALD as person they saw while in Mexico or in returning to Texas.

DETAILS:

Results of previous investigation have indicated LEE HARVEY OSWALD travelled to Mexico by bus, leaving the United States at Laredo, Texas on September 26, 1963, and returning to the United States at Nuevo Laredo on October 3, 1963. Investigation is being conducted to locate and interview any persons who may have travelled with OSWALD or may have seen him in Mexico.

Previous investigation identified the following individuals as non-Mexican citizens who departed Mexico at Nuevo Laredo as tourists on October 3, 1963:

Mrs. ORALIA GARCIA MARTINEZ AYALA, holder of form FM -8 tourist card who entered Mexico on September 28, 1963 to travel to Monterrey. She was described as a female, American citizen, 22 years of age, married, housewife, proceeding from Corpus Christi, Texas.

Mrs. MARY LUISA DE GUERRERO GARCIA, holder of type FM-8 tourist card, who entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on September 28, 1963 en route Monterrey. She was described as a female, American citizen, 35 years of age, married, housewife, proceeding from Corpus Christi, Texas.

MARIA LUISA CRUZ de LOPEZ, holder of type FM-5 tourist card, who entered Mexico on September 14, 1963 at Nuevo Laredo by automobile en route Mexico City, D.F. She was described as a female, American citizen, 40 years of age, married, housewife, residing at 505 Tito Street, Alice, Texas.

AT CORPUS CHRISTI, TEXAS:

On March 13, 1964, Mrs. ORALIA AYALA, 3753 Argus Courts, Corpus Christi, Texas, advised that her complete name is ORALIA GARCIA MARTINEZ AYALA. She said she does not know the whereabouts of her former husband. She is the mother of a four year old daughter named PATRICIA, who is unable to walk because of spastic paralysis.

Mrs. AYALA said she has much difficulty in speaking and understanding the English language.

She recalls that she made a pleasure trip to Mexico sometime during either September or October, 1963, but she can not recall the exact dates. She was accompanied by her daughter, PATRICIA, and a sister, MARY LUISA DE GUERRERO GARCIA, known in Corpus Christi as Mrs. MANUEL GUERRERO, 1033 West Point Road. She said they traveled by commercial bus. She said she is unable to advise the exact time she crossed the border returning to the United States, but believes it was about the middle of the afternoon.

She was exhibited a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and said she had never seen him or known him or talked to him to her knowledge.

On March 13, 1964, Mrs. MANUEL GUERRERO, 1033 West Point Road, said she also goes by the name of MARY LUISA DE GUERRERO GARCIA. She said she has much difficulty in speaking and understanding the English language. She is a sister to Mrs. ORALIA AYALA of Corpus Christi.

She recalls she made a pleasure trip to Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico with Mrs. AYALA and PATRICIA AYALA sometime during either September or October, 1963, but she is unable to affix the exact time or date she entered or left Mexico. She made this trip by commercial bus and is of the opinion that she crossed the border and re-entered the United States on a Sunday at about 4:00 PM.

She was exhibited a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and said that she has never known him, seen him, or conversed with him to her knowledge.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROSS D. WOLCOTT:

AT ALICE, TEXAS:

On March 16, 1964, Mrs. MARIA LUISA CRUZ de LOPEZ, 505 Tito Street, Alice, Texas, advised she is presently unemployed, but was formerly employed as a maid at Belaire Motel, Highway 231, Alice, Texas. She stated she is married to PEDRO LOPEZ, who resides at 505 Tito Street, Alice, Texas, and who is employed as a section laborer by Missouri Pacific Railroad Company.

She stated on or about September 14, 1963, she and her husband travelled to Morelia, Michoacan, Mexico, by car. She obtained a travel permit for a maximum of 180 day stay in Mexico. Her husband is a Mexican citizen and therefore did not need to obtain such a permit. She stated after visiting in Morelia, they spent about two or three days in Mexico City, and then returned home. They arrived at Nuevo Laredo, Mexico about 1:30 or 2:00 PM. They stopped in the office of the Immigration service on the Mexican side at Nuevo Laredo, and obtained their car title papers, which had been left at the time of entry into Mexico. Altogether, they spent about ten minutes at the office before they were cleared to proceed. During this time, she did not notice any Anglo persons in the room, and saw many Latin American persons.

Mrs. LOPEZ viewed a photograph of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, and stated she recognized his picture only because she had seen his likeness on television. She stated she did not see this subject nor did her husband see this subject at any time during their trip to Mexico, and neither she nor her husband has ever seen this subject to their knowledge.

Synopsis:

In February, 1964, Wolper Productions, Hollywood, California, furnished photo of audience reportedly assembled at Houston, Texas, in September, 1960, when (then) Senator JOHN F. KENNEDY appeared before group of ministers. Los Angeles source noted person in photo resembled Subject LEE HARVEY OSWALD. Investigation at Houston, Texas, on 3/16/64 identified person in question as Rev. JAMES W. GUNN, Presbyterian minister who was present at above political meeting and identified his photo in this group. Houston ministers who attended meeting stated attendance by invitation only to ministers and members of press.

DETAILS: AT HOLLYWOOD, CALIFORNIA:

On February 13, 1964, DAVID WOLPER, Wolper Productions, 8720 Sunset Boulevard, advised that his company produces television programs and had produced one program entitled "Making of the President, 1960." WOLPER explained this film concerned the late President JOHN F. KENNEDY and contained film clips of (then) Senator KENNEDY's appearance in Houston, Texas, in September, 1960, before an organization WOLPER identified as the Texas Ministerial Council.

WOLPER advised that he and several members of his staff had recently reviewed this documentary film and a number of individuals on his staff were convinced that one of the spectators sitting in the front row in the large

group of people was LEE HARVEY OSWALD. WOLPER stated "it was either Oswald or somebody who sure looked like him." WOLPER furnished a copy of an enlarged still photograph made from a 16 mm movie frame which contained a photograph of the person WOLPER thought to be OSWALD. This person was identified by a small arrow made in ink on the face of the photograph. (Photo of Oswald from 1963 - 2465)

AT HOUSTON, TEXAS:

On March 16, 1964, Reverend WILLIAM A. BAINÉ, Pastor, Bellaire Presbyterian Church, 5100 Bellaire Boulevard, advised that the meeting referred to above was actually sponsored and arranged by an organization known as the Ministerial Association of Greater Houston, which consists of most of the ministers in the Houston, Texas, area, and the membership includes Protestant, Catholic and Jewish ministers. In September, 1960, Reverend HERBERT MEZA was Assistant Minister of the Bellaire Presbyterian Church and also served as Vice President and Program Chairman of the Ministerial Association of Greater Houston. Reverend MEZA was largely responsible for organizing the program in September, 1960, when the late President KENNEDY made his famous appearance before the Houston group. Reverend BAINÉ pointed out that many political commentators felt that President KENNEDY's appearance before this group was one of the most significant events of the presidential campaign of that year. Reverend BAINÉ stated there were several hundred ministers invited to this meeting, and a committee was present at the door to see that all persons present were either ministers or members of the press.

The photograph referred to above, previously made available by DAVID WOLPER of Hollywood, California, was exhibited to Reverend BAINÉ who stated he believed the individual marked by an arrow was undoubtedly Reverend JAMES W. GUNN who was then serving as Presbyterian Minister to students at the University of Houston, Houston, Texas. Reverend BAINÉ stated he could positively identify the individual sitting directly behind the man in question as Reverend JOE OWEN, pastor of Saint Luke's Presbyterian Church, Houston, Texas. Reverend BAINÉ telephoned Reverend OWEN, who advised him he recalled the above meeting well, that he sat near the front of the auditorium to the left of the speaker's rostrum and that Reverend JAMES W. GUNN was sitting in front of him.

On March 16, 1964, Reverend JAMES W. GUNN, 6265 South Main Street, advised that in September, 1960, he was serving as Presbyterian Minister to students and Director of Campus Christian Life at the University of Houston. Reverend GUNN stated he could recall well his attendance at the meeting of the Houston ministers at the Rice Hotel in September, 1960, when (then) Senator JOHN F. KENNEDY made his famous appearance during the presidential political campaign of that year. The above-mentioned photograph of a portion of this audience was exhibited to Reverend GUNN who immediately identified the photograph marked by an arrow as being that of himself. Reverend GUNN also identified the person sitting behind him as Reverend JOE OWEN, mentioned above. Reverend GUNN pointed out there were several hundred persons present, including a number of visiting ministers who appeared at the last minute from Corpus Christi, Texas. Reverend GUNN was unable to identify the individual appearing in this photograph on his immediate left but stated he felt sure this man was an ordained minister inasmuch as this meeting was open only to ministers and members of the press. Reverend GUNN further advised that the motion pictures and/or television tapes which were made on the evening in question were exhibited on several occasions to nation-wide audiences and a number of his old friends in various parts of the United States had subsequently written him to say they had seen him in this audience. Reverend GUNN acknowledged that his physical appearance is somewhat like that of LEE HARVEY OSWALD but stated he had never seen OSWALD and felt positive OSWALD could not have been present at the meeting in question.

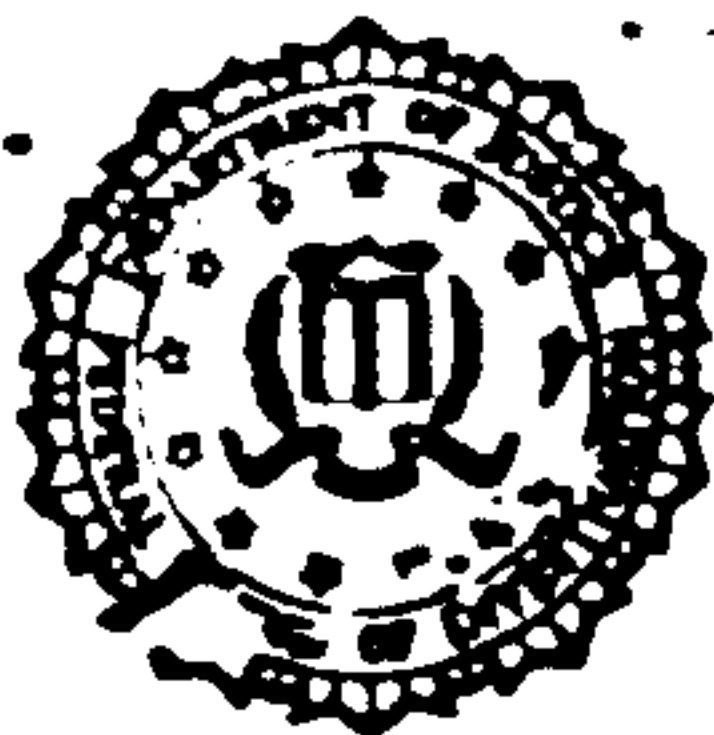

At 9:00 p.m. on March 17, 1964, WILLIAM JAMES LOWERY, JR., 4520 Bridlewood, a Communist Party member at Dallas, Texas, beginning September 23, 1945, to September 23, 1963, who testified in Washington, D.C., before the Subversive Activities Board on the latter date, advised that he had been contacted by EARL LIVELY, who had visited in New York City sometime during the first days of March, 1964. LIVELY told LOWERY that he had visited HERB PHILBRICK in New York City and had obtained information from someone connected with the Garrity Publishing Company there to the effect that NATHANIEL WEYL and his wife had said that they thought MRS. MARGUERITE OSWALD, mother of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, had been a communist at one time. LOWERY stated that WEYL, according to LIVELY, was supposedly an ex-communist who testified in the case involving ALGER HISS. NATHANIEL WEYL is the author of a book entitled "Red Star Over Cuba" which was published by Devin - Adair Publishing Company, and is supposed to live somewhere in Florida. LOWERY described EARL LIVELY as an "untra rightist" and stated that he had never heard of NATHANIEL WEYL during the time he was a member of the Communist Party in Dallas, Texas.

PORTER from [redacted] an established source of this office, who is [redacted] Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters was checked by IC FREDERICK E. BECKER, the Retail Merchants Credit Association by IC GERALD A. BOSWELL, Los Angeles Police Department and Sheriff's Office by IC PAUL H. CHAMBERLAIN, JR. Investigation at Ventura, California, was conducted by SAA JOHN J. SCHMITZ.

The files of the Los Angeles Office reflect that DECLAN P. FORD had a brother, JOSEPH BRANDON FORD, who was the subject of an applicant investigation for Central Intelligence Group in 1947, BuFile 118-2319. Inasmuch as the Bureau was the Office of Origin, Los Angeles is not in possession of the results of the entire investigation. Los Angeles is also not knowledgeable as to whether JOSEPH BRANDON FORD was employed by CIA. For the above reason, Los Angeles is not incorporating into the LHM information obtained during the applicant investigation of JOSEPH BRANDON FORD.

A review of the records in the office of the Registrar at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA) on March 13, 1964, reflected the following information:

Declan Phillip Ford was born March 10, 1923, in Los Angeles, California. His father was William Joseph Ford. His mother's name was not listed; however, she was born in Ireland. At the time Ford filed application for admission to UCLA in 1942, he was residing at 333 Cumberland Road, Glendale, California.

Ford attended Hoover High School in Glendale from September, 1937, to June, 1940; Glendale Junior College from September, 1940 to June, 1942. He entered UCLA in the summer of 1942. He was in the United States Navy sometime during 1942 and 1948 as he had a Navy address in 1944. His campus address, while attending UCLA, was the Delta Tau Delta Fraternity, 649 Gayley Avenue, Los Angeles. He was graduated from UCLA on September 11, 1948, obtaining an A.B. Degree in Geology.

On March 4, 1946, Ford requested a transcript of his records be sent to the Veterans Administration, Los Angeles. In June, 1953, Ford requested a transcript be sent to him at 2718 Dawson Avenue, Ventura, California. In May, 1963, Ford requested a transcript be sent to him at 14059 Brookcrest, Dallas 30, Texas.

On March 16, 1963, the Los Angeles County Registrar of Voters, the Los Angeles Retail Merchants Credit Association, the Los Angeles Police Department, and the Los Angeles Sheriff's Office records were checked and no information was obtained concerning Declan Phillip Ford.

On March 16, 1964, the records of the Credit Bureau of Ventura, California, were reviewed. They reflect Declan Phillip Ford first came to the attention of the Credit Bureau

of Ventura in August, 1951. At that time he was residing at 26 North Fir, Ventura, and was employed by the Continental Oil Company as a geologist. The Credit Bureau last heard of Ford in July, 1953, when they received a request for background information from the Land Title Insurance Company, Post Office Box 410, North Hollywood, California. This was in connection with an application by Ford for a G.I. loan to purchase property at 2718 Dawson Avenue, Ventura.

The files of the Ventura Credit Bureau reflect Ford was born March 10, 1923, and in addition to attending Hoover High School in Glendale and Glendale Junior College, he also attended UCLA until 1942. He served in the United States Navy and was discharged March 12, 1945. He was employed until 1946 by the Western Geophysical Company. He returned to UCLA and obtained a degree in geology in 1948. He was employed for approximately one and one-half years by the Associated Oil Company of Bakersfield and later by the Continental Oil Company. His marital status was shown as single and no relatives were listed.

A check of the records of the Ventura Police Department and the Ventura Sheriff's Office on March 16, 1964, reflected no information on Ford.

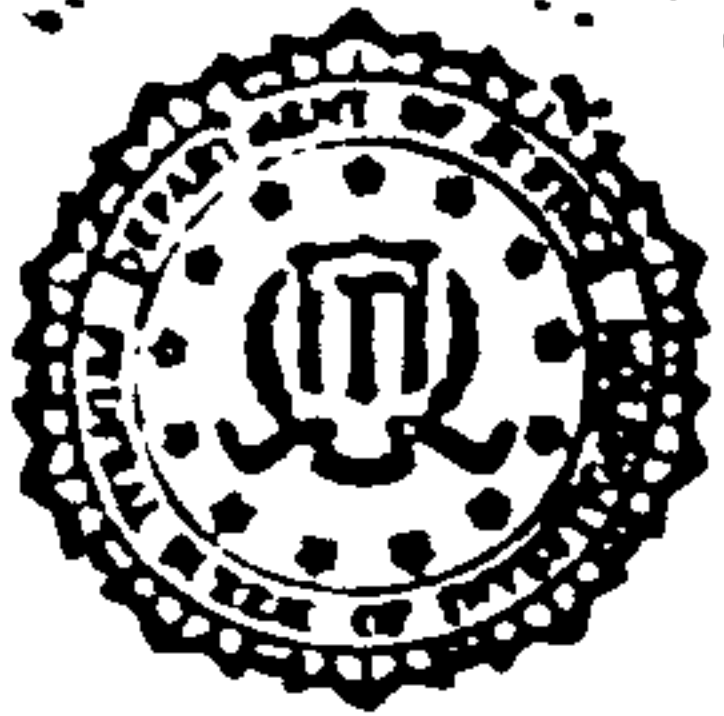

On March 20, 1964, Mrs. MAMIE A. MILLER, 817 Gregory Street, Greensboro, North Carolina, advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that she made a trip to Mexico in early September 1963 and remained approximately one month. She could not recall the exact dates of her entry into Mexico or her return but stated she believes she left Mexico during the first week of October 1963. Mrs. MILLER stated that her deceased husband was a former railroad employee, thereby entitling her to travel free of charge on a pass on trains, and accordingly she occasionally takes pleasure trips. She stated that on this trip to Mexico she had taken a Pullman at San Antonio, Texas, and did not leave her compartment except to go to the dining car during the entire trip to Mexico City. She stated she went to Guadalajara, where she stayed in a health resort and had then taken a Pullman back to San Antonio, Texas, crossing the border into the United States at Nuevo Laredo, Mexico. She stated that on her return trip she again left her compartment only to go to the dining car and that Immigration authorities came onto the train near the United States-Mexico border to check her. She stated for this reason she had not seen anyone at the time she crossed the border coming back into the United States with the exception of those individuals in the immediate area of the railroad car she was on and individuals she might have seen in the dining car.

Mrs. MILLER advised that she is seventy-nine years of age, a citizen of the United States, and that she has resided in Greensboro, North Carolina, for the past forty years. She stated that she has seen numerous photographs of OSWALD in the local newspapers and has no recollection whatsoever of having seen him in connection with her trip to Mexico.

LESLIE HOLLANDSWORTH furnished the following information:

His permanent mailing address is 933½ Elden Avenue, Los Angeles. His temporary address is 71 Parsons Road, Room #29, U.S. Naval Ordnance Test Station (NOTS), China Lake, California. He is currently employed as a cook at the Commissioned Officers' Mess, at NOTS.

BUSTER D. MITCHELL, Charleston, West Virginia, is a relative of HOLLANDSWORTH. They had a conversation in a bar during November, 1963, in Charleston. Their conversation dealt with integration and the attendant problems in the Southern States. HOLLANDSWORTH recalls that during the conversation, he said that "There would be hell to pay" in the South before integration was completed. He also referred to the possibility of more race riots, such as had occurred in the past.

HOLLANDSWORTH denied that he made the statement: "You are going to hear something soon that is really going to shock the country." HOLLANDSWORTH denied that he later wrote a letter to MITCHELL, telling him not to repeat the statement. He said that MITCHELL, after the assassination of President KENNEDY, had a conversation with a Deputy U.S. Marshal, who was a cousin of his, and apparently MITCHELL told the Marshal that HOLLANDSWORTH had made a statement about what would happen in the future, and in this way, it was repeated to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

HOLLANDSWORTH advised that he did not know JACK RUBY or LEE HARVEY OSWALD, and that he has no information concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY.

Mr. ^{new} Milton Eisingberg of the Presidential Commission Staff visited the Identification Division 3-23-64. The writer and the Supervisor of the Latent Fingerprint Section, Mr. Sebastian F. Latona, reviewed with him the latent fingerprint work in this case. Mr. Eisingberg indicated that testimony would be required before the Commission on April 1st or 2nd and he would like charts of the two latent impressions found on the paper wrapper: charts of the lift of the one latent from the gun barrel and charts of the three latent impressions from the cardboard cartons. He would like these charts to be completed by Friday, March 27, 1964, so that he might review them in detail with Mr. Latona who made the original examinations.

Mr. Eisingberg further explained that the Commission had decided that in matters involving expert testimony two independent experts would be asked for their opinion. In this case the Commission has selected the New York City Police Department as the second expert agency to testify in latent fingerprint matters. He inquired what arrangements could be made to have the material furnished the New York City Police Department. Mr. Eisingberg was advised that since this additional testimony should be completely independent the best means would be to furnish photographs of the latent impressions and known fingerprint and palm prints of Oswald for transmittal to which ever department he intended to contact concerning their views. Mr. Eisingberg agreed that this arrangement would be satisfactory.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That we proceed with preparing requested charts and make available Mr. Latona for testimony at the Commission's request.
