- Mr. Werner Geisler, Comptroller, Leslie Welding Company, Incorporated, 11241 West Melrose Street, Franklin Park, Illinois, advised the original payroll checks received by Oswald were obtained by the Secret Service in November, 1963, and have not been returned to the Company. It was necessary to contact the Secret Service and make copies from their copies of these checks, as the originals could not be located. If these items are not sufficiently legible, you may desire to make inquiry of the Secret Service in this matter.

(2) Records of Jaggars-Chiles-Stovall, Incorporated, Dallas, Texas

- a. Twenty-six checks issued to Lee Oswald
 - b. Employment identification questionnaire
 - c. Form B-3 (163)
 - d. 1962 U. S. Individual Income Tax Return Form 1040A
 - e. Employee's Withholding Exemption Certificate Form W-4 (Revised July, 1960) dated October 12, 1962
 - f. Time records showing dates and hours worked
- In reviewing these records the following is noted.
1. The card following the card dated December 4 (Tuesday), 1962, is dated November 5 (Wednesday), 1962. This is an apparent bookkeeping error as this card should have been dated December 5 (Wednesday), 1962, as a card dated November 5, 1962, which was a Monday, is accounted for.

2. The card dated January 4 (Monday), 1963, that precedes card dated February 5 (Tuesday), 1963, is also an apparent error as this card should have been dated February 4, 1963, as January 4, 1963, previously accounted for, was a Friday.
3. The record following 2-11 (Monday), 1963, is dated 12-2 (Tuesday), 1963. This would indicate the numbers 2-12 were transposed, it being noted Oswald did not work on December 2, 1962.
4. It is further noted two cards are dated March 25 (Monday), 1963, and March 25 (Tuesday), 1963. This is also considered a bookkeeping error in that the card dated March 25 (Tuesday), 1963, should have been dated March 26, 1963, as there is no card for this date.

(3) Records of the Texas School Book Depository, Dallas, Texas

- a. Regarding method of payment it is noted the Texas School Book Depository does not utilize a time clock or device to record times of arrival and departure. Employees are paid in cash and are not required to sign receipts.
- b. Application for employment dated October 15, 1963
- c. Employee's Withholding Exemption Certificate Form W-4 dated October 16, 1963
- d. Payroll record sheets indicating days and hours worked by employees including Oswald.
It is noted the record covering the week ending November 22, 1963, lists Lee Harvey Oswald's name as Leslie Oswald. Mr. H. S. Aiken, who is in charge of the payroll records, has advised that carrying the first name of Oswald as Leslie was purely an error on his part when he recorded Oswald's name on the payroll records and that his name should have been listed as Lee Oswald.

(4) William B. Reilly and Company, Incorporated, New Orleans, Louisiana

(5) Eleven state warrants for unemployment compensation totaling \$369, issued by the State Comptroller of Public Accounts, Austin, Texas. It will be noted that the number of copies designated for the various domestic field offices is not uniform. Copies were designated on the basis of the number of leads for each field office, and for this reason there is a variation in the number of copies. It is suggested that the Bureau furnish the corresponding number of copies of the letterhead memorandum to each field office listed, a sufficient number of copies of the letterhead memorandum having been furnished for this purpose.

Extra copies are being forwarded to the Bureau for transmittal to Legal Attaches at Rio de Janeiro, Brazil; Ottawa, Canada, and Paris, France, in connection with request of Bureau for these Legal Attaches and for investigation requested at Lima, Peru, and in Panama.

REQUEST OF BUREAU

If not previously done, the Bureau is requested to prepare and furnish offices receiving leads herewith with sufficient copies of the best available photograph or photographs of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. In view of fact that some offices have numerous leads, it is suggested that, if necessary, the same number of copies of the photographs be provided to coincide with the number of copies of this airtel and enclosures designated for each office.

The Bureau is requested to determine the desirability and best method of conducting investigation in the foreign countries listed hereinunder in connection with the persons

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identified by forms FM-5 and FM-8. If it is determined that coverage is feasible, it is suggested that photographs be provided to the agency handling same with the request that the individual in each instance be located, shown a photograph of OSWALD and interviewed concerning his knowledge of the latter's activities, travel in Mexico and departure from Mexico, with particular attention to his probable destination at the time he entered Mexico on September 26, 1963.

AT PAITILLA, REPUBLIC OF PANAMA

With respect to FM-5 numbered 373, will locate, interview and display photograph of OSWALD to SARA MARQUELA YANIS DE CHAMPSAUR who was issued FM-5 No. 4212610 at Panama, Republic of Panama, on August 14, 1963, and who furnished her residence as Calle 93, Paitilla, Panama. ||

AT PANAMA CITY, REPUBLIC OF PANAMA

With respect to FM-5 numbered 396 and FM-5 numbered 398, will locate, interview and display photograph of OSWALD to VIOLA MARIA YANIS DE VIGGIANO, who was issued Mexican FM-5 No. 4212612 at Panama, Republic of Panama, on August 14, 1963, and who furnished her address as Calle Gerardo Ortega No. 5 (apparently Panama City, Panama, as no other city or town was listed), as well as FLOR DE MARIA SUCRE DE YANIS, who was issued FM-5 No. 4212611 at Panama, Republic of Panama, and who furnished her address as Calle 83 No. 9 (possibly Panama City, Panama). ||

AT LIMA, PERU

With respect to FM-5 numbered 395, will locate, interview and display photograph of OSWALD to TEODORO OSCAR TREVINO who was issued FM-5 No. 4329956 and who furnished his residence as Lima, Peru.

Consideration may be given to first having the results of lead set out for Washington Field Office to check American Passport No. C-002627, issued to OSCAR TREVINO in 1962, before handling the lead for Lima, Peru.

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AT BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA

With respect to FM-5 numbered 380, will request Legal Attache, U. S. Embassy at Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, to locate, interview and display photograph of OSWALD to LUISA MAGUER who was issued FM-5 No. 4158246 on September 24, 1963, at San Antonio, Texas, and who furnished her residence address as Av. San Martin 6195, Buenos Aires, Argentina.

AT TORONTO, CANADA

With respect to FM-5 numbered 381, will request Legal Attache, U. S. Embassy, Ottawa, Canada, to locate, interview and display photograph of OSWALD to Miss J. M. HENDRICKSE who was issued FM-5 No. 4359974 on August 19, 1963, and who furnished here residence as 25 Lampport Avenue, Toronto.

AT MONTREAL, CANADA

With respect to FM-8 numbered 808, will request Legal Attache, U. S. Embassy, Ottawa, Canada, to locate, interview and display photograph of OSWALD to MAURICE OUELLET who was issued FM-8 No. 32060/196 on September 19, 1963, at Montreal, Canada, and presented Canadian Passport No. 5-101459.

AT METZ, FRANCE

With respect to FM-8 numbered 820, will request Legal Attache, U. S. Embassy at Paris, France, to locate, interview and display photograph of OSWALD to GEORGE ALBERT SPINNER who was issued FM-8 No. 626362 on September 26, 1963, and who stated that he was an American citizen and a student proceeding from Metz, France.

Consideration may be given to first having the results of lead set out for Washington Field Office to check American Passport No. 556/62 dated March 7, 1962, and issued to SPINNER.

ALL OFFICES RECEIVING LEADS:

All offices who had leads set out in referenced San Antonio airtel dated 12/3/63 who did not locate and interview the person listed should review the additional information in the attached letterhead memorandum and attempt, with the additional information, to locate and interview the

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individual as instructed.

All offices with leads designated herein are requested to locate, fully identify and interview each individual listed in the enclosure in connection with the forms FM-5 and FM-8 recorded for each, which provide available information therefrom concerning background data and residence addresses in each territory. In connection with the interviews, photos of OSWALD should be displayed and complete information obtained concerning the individual's knowledge of OSWALD and his activities in Mexico, with particular emphasis on his entry into Mexico on September 26, 1963, and his destination at that time. In the event any of these individuals have been located and interviewed previously, the corresponding lead herein should be disregarded.

BALTIMORE DIVISION

Will conduct the investigation requested above in connection with information which appears in the enclosure with respect to FM-8 numbered 812 and FM-8 numbered 813.

DALLAS DIVISION

Will conduct the investigation requested above in connection with the information which appears in the enclosure with respect to FM-5 numbered 387 and FM-8 numbered 824.

HOUSTON DIVISION

Will conduct the investigation requested above in connection with the information which appears in the enclosure with respect to FM-8's numbered 809 and 835.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

A confidential source abroad who is thoroughly familiar with the workings of the Mexican Ministry of Gobernacion (Interior) has furnished the following information concerning the procedures utilized by the Mexican Immigration Service in connection with the entry and departure of non-Mexican citizens into and out of Mexico. It is to be noted that the Mexican Immigration Service is a part of the Mexican Ministry of Gobernacion.

Tourists usually enter Mexico on a Mexican tourist card. There are two types of such cards, one being called the FM-8 which is valid for a stay in the country of only fifteen days and one called the FM-5 which has a validity for 180 days' stay in Mexico. Both types of tourist cards are issued in duplicate. Both types are issued at Mexican Consulates throughout the world and can also be obtained from the Mexican Immigration Service at border ports of entry.

At the time of entry into Mexico the traveler surrenders the duplicate portion of the tourist card and both the duplicate and the original, which remains in possession of the traveler, are stamped with a rubber stamp which shows the name of the Mexican representative handling the entry, the date of the entry and the name of the port of entry.

When the traveler leaves Mexico he surrenders the original portion of the tourist card and it is stamped with a rubber stamp which carries the name of the Mexican representative, the date of the departure and the name of port of departure.

Each Mexican port of entry is required on a continuing basis to prepare a form called Form FM-11. This form is a recapitulation which covers non-Mexican citizens entering and departing Mexico as tourists. Entries and departures are maintained on separate lists of FM-11. The FM-11 for both entries and departures is prepared each "quincena" (fifteen-day period). Entries and departures are set up on the FM-11 in chronological order and thereafter, within each date, the names of the tourists are listed in alphabetical order. Basic information appearing on the FM-11 is taken from the tourist card presented by the traveler. At the time the FM-11 is prepared a number is placed on the tourist card, these numbers being in sequence according to the alphabetical order of the names within each date and thereafter by date. By way of example, the first traveler in alphabetical order entering at a port of entry on the first day of the month or a "quincena" is assigned number one. Thereafter all travelers entering that port on that date are assigned numbers in sequence according to alphabetical order. This sequence continues on the second day of the month and throughout the remaining days of the "quincena."

Investigation in instant case has disclosed that subject OSWALD entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo, State of Tamaulipas, on September 26, 1963. OSWALD's entry into Mexico was handled by Mexican Immigration Service employee HELIO TUJEXI MAYDON at Nuevo Laredo and his departure from Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on October 3, 1963, was handled by Mexican Immigration Service employee ALBERTO ARZAMENDI CHAPA.

This source made available for examination the forms FM-5 and FM-8 for all non-Mexican citizens entering Mexico at Nuevo Laredo as tourists on September 26, 1963, as well as the copies of forms FM-11 containing the recapitulation of the entries to Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on this date.

From the tourist cards (FM-5 and FM-8) and the copies of the form FM-11 the following summary of information concerning each person who entered Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on September 26, 1963, has been obtained. The number appearing before each name is the number which appears on the form FM-11. Presented birth certificate as proof of citizenship. Entry handled by ANTONIO RAMON GUAJARDO.

833. JUAN VALDEZ, FM-8 No. 626136, issued by Mexican Immigration Office, Nuevo Laredo, September 26, 1963. Final destination at time of entry given as Monterrey, N. L., but mode of travel not indicated. Described as female American citizen, 38 years of age, married, occupation not indicated, proceeding from Laredo, Texas. Presented birth certificate as proof of citizenship. Accompanied by children HECTOR, ARTURO and ROSALINDA, seven, six and four years of age. Entry handled by HELIO TUEXI MAYDON.

834. MARIA ELSA VALDEZ, FM-8 No. 624672, issued by Mexican Immigration Office, Nuevo Laredo, September 26, 1963. Entry was by autobus with final destination of Monterrey, N. L. Described as female American citizen, 15 years of age, single, student, proceeding from Carrizo S. (believed Carrizo Springs), Texas. Presented Naturalization Certificate No. 67356 as proof of citizenship. Notation on instant form to effect this individual was traveling with her parents who were documented separately. Entry handled by ANTONIO RAMON GUAJARDO.

835. CLIVIA VILLARREAL, FM-8 No. 626237, issued by Mexican Immigration Office, Nuevo Laredo, September 26, 1963. Entry was by autobus with final destination of Monterrey, N. L. Described as female American citizen, 62 years of age, married, housewife, proceeding from Victoria, Texas. Presented birth certificate as proof of citizenship. Entry handled by ALBERTO ARZAMENDI CHAPA.

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It should be noted that in connection with cases involving travel of other Americans, it has been found not unusual for errors to be committed in connection with the entry shown on the form FM-11 for travelers entering Mexico. As pointed out above, the original of the tourist card is surrendered by the traveler at the time of departure from Mexico. This original shows the place of issuance of the tourist card and the principal error that has been noted is showing final destination as the place where the tourist card was originally issued. In other cases final destination is shown as the point from which the person was proceeding at the time he entered Mexico. Several specific cases have occurred in which airline passenger manifests clearly showed a final destination different from the place where the tourist card was issued; nevertheless, the form FM-11 showed a final destination of this latter place.

Synopsis:

Records of Houston, Texas, Post Office reflect Star Route mail truck which departed Austin, Texas, 10:00 PM on 9/23/63 arrived Houston, Texas, 2:40 AM, 9/24/63. Mail Superintendent stated this mail "invariably" proceeds to New Orleans on Southern Pacific train number 2, scheduled to arrive New Orleans 5:30 PM daily, unless train number 2 is reported more than one hour behind schedule. Records reflect train number 2 arrived Houston, Texas, 8:50 AM, 9/24/63 (ahead of schedule), departed Houston 9:46 AM (21 minutes behind schedule) and arrived New Orleans, Louisiana, 6:00 PM, 9/24/63. Mail Superintendent at Houston advised above facts considered conclusive evidence mail departing Austin 10:00 PM, 9/23/63, arrived New Orleans 6:00 PM, 9/24/63.

DETAILS: AT HOUSTON, TEXAS:

Previous investigation disclosed unemployment check for LEE HARVEY OSWALD was placed in regular mail at Austin, Texas, on September 23, 1963, and would normally have left Austin at 10:00 PM on September 23, 1963, by Central Freight Lines truck via Star Route number 48703-T en route Houston, Texas. Investigation at Austin disclosed the above mail truck would normally arrive at Houston on or before 4:00 AM and mail received from Austin would be transferred to train number 2 which would transport it from Houston to New Orleans, with a

scheduled arrival at New Orleans at 5:30 PM, September 24, 1963. Investigation reported below was conducted to determine if these mail routing procedures were followed on September 23 - 24, 1963.

On March 23, 1964, JACOB LUTZI, JR., General Superintendent of Mails, U. S. Post Office, Houston, Texas, confirmed the general procedures of routing mail as outlined above. Mr. LUTZI checked permanent records maintained by his office and reported that the regular mail received from Austin on September 24, 1963, although scheduled to arrive at 4:00 AM by Star Route truck, actually arrived at 2:40 AM. LUTZI stated this was not unusual inasmuch as this mail truck was invariably early arriving at Houston and subsequent to September 23, 1963, the schedule was actually changed to show its arrival at 3:00 AM each date.

With respect to mail arriving from Austin by the above route, LUTZI and HENRY A. TATSCH, Assistant Superintendent of Mails, reported that this mail would "invariably" proceed from Houston to New Orleans via Southern Pacific train number 2 scheduled to depart Houston at 9:25 AM and to arrive at New Orleans at 5:30 PM. LUTZI stated on very rare occasions information would be received that Southern Pacific train number 2, which originates in California, was to be one hour or more late in arriving at Houston, and on those rare occasions the mail for New Orleans would be transported by truck to the Union Station in Houston and placed aboard train number 50 which travels via Baton Rouge, Louisiana, to New Orleans. Train Number 50 is scheduled to leave Houston at 9:05 AM and to arrive at New Orleans at 6:35 PM. LUTZI stated the latter procedure is very seldom utilized and regular mail is otherwise always transported by Southern Pacific train number 2, regular mail never being dispatched to New Orleans by air or by any other mode of transportation. LUTZI checked other records on file in his office and reported that on September 24, 1963, Southern Pacific train number 2 from California actually arrived at Houston at 8:50 AM, being five minutes ahead of schedule. His records indicated this train left Houston at 9:45 AM on September 24, 1963, en route New Orleans, this departure being twenty minutes later than the scheduled departure at 9:25 AM. These records indicated the reason for this slight delay was "loading mail."

LUTZI stated that the above shipment of mail from Austin invariably arrives several hours before the departure of train number 2 for New Orleans and no difficulty is

experienced in processing this mail and having it ready for the train to New Orleans. LUTZI pointed out that other shipments of mail are received throughout the early morning from various points and it is possible to process mail received at the Houston Post Office as late as 7:30 AM and still dispatch it for New Orleans on the 9:25 AM train. LUTZI stated that the above facts constitute "conclusive evidence" to him that all mail for New Orleans received from Austin by the Star Route truck which arrived at Houston at 2:40 AM on September 24, 1963, left Houston at 9:45 AM on September 24, 1963, on Southern Pacific train number 2 for New Orleans.

On March 23, 1964, H. J. ADAMS, Superintendent of Transportation, Southern Pacific Company, Houston, Texas, checked permanent records on file in his division and advised these records indicated that Southern Pacific train number 2 arrived at Houston, Texas, from California at 8:50 AM on September 24, 1963, and departed Houston at 9:46 AM on September 24, 1963, en route New Orleans. ADAMS stated these records further show that this train actually arrived at New Orleans at 6:00 PM on September 24, 1963, this being thirty minutes later than the scheduled arrival time. ADAMS stated the above train number 2 would have proceeded to the New Orleans Union Passenger Station, and he would estimate it would take approximately thirty minutes to one hour for mail transported on this train to be unloaded and transferred to the New Orleans Post Office.
