RE: LEE HARVEY OSWALD

At 9:00 p.m. on March 17, 1964, WILLIAM JAMES LOWERY, JR., 4520 Bridlewood, a Communist Party member at Dallas, Texas, beginning September 23, 1945, to September 23, 1963, who testified in Washington, D.C., before the Subversive Activities Control Board on the latter date, advised that he had been contacted by EARL LIVELY who had visited in New York City sometime during the first days of March, 1964. LIVELY told LOWERY that he had visited HERB PHILBRICK in New York City and had obtained information from someone connected with the Garrity Publishing Company there to the effect that NATHANIEL WEYL and his wife had said that they thought MRS. MARGUERITE OSWALD, mother of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, had been a communist at one time. LOWERY stated that WEYL, according to LIVELY, was supposedly an ex-communist who testified in the case involving ALGER HISS. NATHANIEL WEYL is the author of a book entitled "Red Star Over Cuba" which was published by Devin - Adair Publishing Company and is supposed to live somewhere in Florida. LOWERY described EARL LIVELY as an "ultra rightist" and stated that he had never heard of NATHANIEL WEYL during the time he was a member of the Communist Party in Dallas, Texas.

LOWERY said that he considers LIVELY an "ultra rightist" because he is a person who believes that no one in the United States Government can be trusted; that the communists may be taking over our country, and because he devotes considerable time to fighting communism to prevent what he thinks might be a communist take-over of this country.

Synopsis:

By letter 3/28/64, Mrs. FAYE BREEDEN, Union, Mo., stated that OSWALD talked to her and her friend, BENNO GEBERT, on the street and she would furnish additional information if contacted. Mr. and Mrs. BREEDEN advised on 3/27/64 that they and BENNO GEBERT visited New Orleans in September, 1963. While in the French section, they were approached by two men, one of whom said, "We're going to get rid of old KENNEDY, too". Mrs. BREEDEN thought this meant get rid of him by vote and she thought he gave his name to GEBERT as OSWALD. BENNO GEBERT recalled he and the BREEDENS were in New Orleans in the summer of 1963 when this incident took place, but does not recall any names being mentioned during the incident. He only thought it was OSWALD after seeing OSWALD on TV after the shooting of President KENNEDY. GEBERT is retired city employee, St. Louis, Mo.

By letter dated March 28, 1964, at Union, Missouri, Mrs. FAYE BREEDEN advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Washington, D.C., as follows:

MAUDIE FAYE BREEDEN, 317 Roosevelt Avenue, Union, Missouri, advised that she and her husband, ARTHUR BREEDEN, left Union, Missouri, on September 3, 1963, on vacation en route to New Orleans, Louisiana. They were accompanied by BENNO GEBERT, 4448 McPherson, St. Louis. They arrived at New Orleans on or about September 6, 1963, and checked into the Southland Hotel where they stayed for approximately two weeks. One day shortly after they arrived in New Orleans they were window-shopping in the French section and Mr. BREEDEN was wearing a wide-brim hat when they were approached by two men. One man continued walking but the other pointed to Mr. BREEDEN and said "That guy is from Texas, ain't he?" Mr. GEBERT answered that BREEDEN was from Missouri. Then the man stated "Oh, from old Missouri. That's where old Truman hailed from. We got to get rid of old Truman. We're going to get rid of old Kennedy, too." Mrs. BREEDEN assumed the man was referring to getting rid of him by voting.

The man's attitude irritated Mr. BREEDEN and he continued up the street for a few feet and heard no more conversation. The man then asked Mr. GEBERT what his name was and then stated his name was OSWALD. The man continued to talk to GEBERT for a few minutes but Mrs. BREEDEN was unable to recall any specific statements made.

Even though Mrs. BREEDEN had seen OSWALD on television after the assassination and heard his name numerous times, she did not connect the incident described above with the accused assassin until she and her husband visited Mr. GEBERT in St. Louis on March 9, 1964. GEBERT mentioned the above-described incident stating that they had talked to the accused assassin in New Orleans while there on vacation. Then Mrs. BREEDEN recalled very well the fact as outlined above including the name, OSWALD.

Mrs. BREEDEN is 59 years old, in poor health, and under a doctor's care for high blood pressure and overweight.

ARTHUR BREEDEN, 317 Roosevelt Avenue, Union, Missouri, advised that on September 3, 1963, he and his wife left Union, Missouri, accompanied by their friend, BENNO GEBERT, en route to New Orleans, Louisiana, for a vacation. They arrived in New Orleans three or four days later and checked into the Southland Hotel. A few days later, all three were in the French section of New Orleans when a man approached them and pointed to Mr. BREEDEN and asked if he were not from Texas. Mr. GEBERT told the man that BREEDEN was from Missouri. Then the man made some remark about HARRY TRUMAN being from Missouri. The man also made some remark about KENNEDY. His general attitude somewhat irritated Mr. BREEDEN and he walked on up the street rather than to become involved in any discussion with the fellow whom he considered to be a radical. Mrs. BREEDEN and Mr. GEBERT continued to talk with the man for a few minutes but he did not hear any other conversation.

Mr. BENNO GEBERT, 4448 McPherson, St. Louis, Missouri, advised that in the summer of 1963, dates not recalled, he and two friends, Mr. and Mrs. ARTHUR BREEDEN of Union, Missouri, were on vacation in New Orleans, Louisiana. He said that at about 8:00 p.m., while walking on a street in the French section of the city, they were passing a night club in front of which three men were standing. He did not recall the name of the night club, but thinks the street may have been Boyle or Bourbon Street. The three men were standing in front of this club, apparently talking. One of these three men approached Mr. and Mrs. BREEDEN and Mr. GEBERT at which time he stated that he assumed Mr. BREEDEN was from Texas. Mr. GEBERT said BREEDEN was wearing western style clothes and a large hat at the time. Mr. BREEDEN told this individual he was not from Texas, but was from Missouri. As Mr. GEBERT recalls, this individual then inquired as to what they thought about the current situation and stated "KENNEDY was awful to have in office" and that they "must get rid of him". Mr. GEBERT also recalls some comment made about former President TRUMAN, but cannot remember what the comment was. Mr. GEBERT said he considered the person who approached them as being a nut and attached no additional significance to it. Mr. GEBERT stated they all went on their way and left the individual who approached them without noting what he did.

Mr. GEBERT commented that he is a retired individual and regularly makes trips to New Orleans. He said he is a former employee of the City of St. Louis.

Mr. GEBERT stated that after the assassination of former President KENNEDY, he thought the individual who approached them on the street in New Orleans bore a striking resemblance to LEE HARVEY OSWALD, but he does not know in fact whether he was OSWALD. He stated no names were mentioned in connection with the above incident or if any names were mentioned, he does not now recall them.

Mrs. GUDRUN HANSEN, 7321 - 21st Avenue Northwest, Seattle, Washington, advised that she was firmly convinced that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had been a seaman aboard the "STAVANGERFJORD" during the course of a voyage on which she had been a passenger in the company of her husband, May 22, 1963, to May 30, 1963. This vessel, she stated, is operated by the Norwegian America Line (NAL), 24 State Street, New York, New York.

Mrs. HANSEN stated that she and her husband, MARTIN O. HANSEN, were tourist class passengers aboard this vessel. The trip was non-stop from New York City, May 22, 1963, until its arrival at Bergen, Norway, May 30. Mr. and Mrs. HANSEN left the ship at Bergen and rejoined the vessel at Oslo, Norway, August 2, 1963, for the return trip to the United States.

Mrs. HANSEN related that a young man who was a seaman aboard this vessel worked in the engine room, having something to do with repairs and maintenance. This man she identified as having a first name OTTAR. She said she did not know his last name and had no way to identify same. One day on the tourist class deck several days after the vessel had left New York City, OTTAR came up to her and asked her to come down to her automobile, which was in storage below decks. He said he wanted to put some cigarettes in the car for her husband. She told him no, that they already had all such items that they were permitted and she did not want to undertake any such action. Mrs. HANSEN was alone at the time that OTTAR had approached her. She stated that the conversation continued with him about an automobile accident that she had suffered in Seattle in about 1960.

Mrs. HANSEN indicated, however, that OTTAR appeared to have knowledge of this accident without her telling him. When asked how he could possibly know this, she said that he knew of it "through the union." Mrs. HANSEN said she has been a member of Local 1207, Retail Clerks Union at Seattle, and that OTTAR belonged to some union having to do with seamen on the vessel. She said she had no idea how he knew of her accident beyond "through the union."

SE 89-47 She asked him how old he was and he said he was 24 years of age. She asked him if he was married and with this, he walked away.

August 1963; Mrs. HANSEN stated that there was no question in her mind whatsoever but that every picture she has seen of LEE HARVEY OSWALD appeared to her to be an exact likeness of OTTAR, the seaman aboard this vessel. She was so certain of this that she had written to the NAL and asked for a list of the crew in order to verify this. When she did not hear from the NAL offices in New York, she contacted the Seattle agents of this company, the Overseas Shipping Company, Northern Life Tower Building, Seattle, in a further effort to secure a crew list. She had available a letter written under date of January 30, 1964, from NAL, Seattle, by the Overseas Shipping Company, and signed by one DORINE L. BOTTEN. This letter advised the company does not distribute crew lists to the public and could not help her with her request. Mrs. HANSEN related that the only reason she wanted the crew list was in an effort to identify OTTAR, so that she might have this information available in furnishing information which she believed to be of assistance in the investigation relating to LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

When asked for a physical description of OTTAR, she stated that he was 24 years of age, a white man, approximately 5'9" in height. When asked for a full description, on several occasions, she gestured towards a newspaper photograph of OSWALD, which she carried with her and said that he appeared to be exactly like OSWALD in all physical characteristics. She noted no specific identifying marks of any kind.

She related that he was a close friend of the tourist class barber on this vessel. She identified the barber as LASSE SRÖNYER ERÖMYHR, whose home address is San Heröv 8, Notodden, Norway.

Mrs. HANSEN stated that she saw OTTAR on the vessel almost every day in that he often visited with his friend the barber and was therefore on the tourist deck. OTTAR was still employed on the ship when the HANSENS debarked, May 30, 1963.

When the HANSENS rejoined the ship, August 2, 1963, at Oslo, OTTAR was no longer employed on the ship. The woman who cleaned the HANSENS' cabin advised that OTTAR had been in some trouble with the Captain of the vessel, an argument wherein the Captain wanted to pay off the ship after the stop at Oslo and OTTAR wanted to be paid off before the stop at Oslo.

In the eight days of the voyage, May 22-30, 1963, Mrs. HANSEN had chatted with OTTAR on a number of occasions on many topics, varying from unions to socialized medicine including, she said, the subject of communism. However, she had no recollection of anything specific that had been said by OTTAR.

Mrs. HANSEN stated that she and her husband had been in Anaconda, Montana, prior to coming to Seattle in 1960 and that when they left Montana, unidentified people had followed her to Seattle and made trouble for her. She was unable to specify who had followed her and described the trouble as her automobile accident.

Mrs. HANSEN stated that she is 51 years of age and was born in Norway.

She stated the first time she saw OTTAR was when she was a passenger aboard the vessel "STAVANGERFJORD" in May, 1963. The conversations she had with him were both in English and Norwegian.

Mrs. HANSEN located a letter at home from the barber FRÖMYHR dated August 28, 1963, in which he mentioned that OTTAR was then in Japan. FRÖMYHR had sought to have Mr. HANSEN sponsor his residence in the United States and had engaged in an extensive correspondence in this regard.

Mrs. HANSEN alleged that her husband likewise agreed that this OTTAR looked like OSWALD, but did not want her to "get mixed up in anything."

On March 9, 1964, Mrs. CUDRUN HANSEN again contacted the Seattle FBI Office where she furnished information to the effect that she had recently been involved in an accident claim with the King County Prosecutor's Office and because she was not able to obtain an appointment with the King County Prosecutor, she requested that the FBI set up an appointment for her. During the conversation she alleged that her life was in danger inasmuch as she had been poisoned by some weiners from a Norwegian delicatessen. In this connection she advised she went to a doctor but he had refused to treat her. In conclusion, she advised that she had no additional information concerning the individual she believed was LEE HARVEY OSWALD but admitted the possibility that this was a case of mistaken identity and she had merely remembered this individual as having resembled photographs she had seen of OSWALD in the newspapers following the assassination of President KENNEDY.

**Synopsis:** RALPH HENRY WILLIAM SMELE of Victoria, B.C., Canada admits making a phone call to Dallas Police Department March 24, 1964 using fictitious name of RALPH SIMPSON. In call he claimed to Dallas Police Department he was in Dallas November 22, 1963 and took pictures of President's car at time he was shot. On March 26, 1964 SMELE admitted to RCMP he has never been in Dallas and never had any such film. Only reason he could give for calling was that he had been watching a television program and had been drinking and decided to call.

DETAILS:At Dallas, Texas

On March 26, 1964 Dallas advised that on March 24, 1964, about 4:45 a.m., a collect call was received by the Dallas Police Department (PD) from a RALPH SIMPSON, Victoria, B.C. SIMPSON advised Dallas Police Department that he was in Dallas on November 22, 1963 and took pictures of President's car at time he was shot and believed he got Texas School Rock Depository in the background. SIMPSON described his camera as an expensive one with "wide angle scope lens". He further claimed he had not developed the film, did not know exactly what was in the photographs and that he had discussed the matter with his attorney BATTER (phonetic) and on the attorney's instructions had contacted the Dallas Police Department. SIMPSON said he would mail the undeveloped film to Sergeant PATRICK T. DEAN, Dallas Police Department, on March 25, 1964.

On the evening of March 26, 1964

[redacted] advised that he had just completed interviewing RALPH HENRY WILLIAM SMELE, 1141 Caldonia Street, regarding the above matter. SMELE admitted making the telephone call to the Dallas Police Department using the fictitious name of RALPH SIMPSON. He advised he has never been to Dallas and never had any film as referred to in the telephone call. The only reason he could give for calling was that he had been watching a television program and had been drinking and decided to call. He expressed amazement that he was identified as the caller. He stated he now realizes the seriousness of such type call and the only other explanation he could give for it was that he is "given to dreams". He advised that he is not now working, but has previously been employed in demolition work on buildings. He expressed regret for having made the telephone call.

Reference is made to Mr. Rosen's memorandum to Mr. Belmont dated 3-18-64.

The attached copy of the brochure entitled "Killing of Dallas Patrolman J. D. Tippit" containing exhibits that photographically and diagrammatically depict locations, actions and things surrounding the killing site is submitted for information.

The President's Commission has urgently requested the Bureau to have these exhibits available to them by 9:00 A.M., 3-26-64. Originally the Commission desired that this material be available on 4-1-64. These exhibits should adequately meet the needs of the Commission with respect to what happened at the Tippit killing site on November 22, 1963.
