He left that Squadron in about June, 1959, and went to HMR 163 (Marine Light Helicopter Squadron) at the same Facility until May, 1960. He was a 1st Lt. at the time and was either Schedules Officer or Legal Officer.

He stated he was never assigned to MACS-9. He did not know OSWALD and heard no information to the effect that any personnel were interviewed concerning him or that any statements were taken from such personnel.

Capt. AYRES was not acquainted with RICHARD DENNIS CALL, NELSON DELGADO or MACK OSBORNE.

In view of the above information, it would appear that Capt. ALBERT B. AYRES might possibly not be identical with the A. G. AYERS who was supposedly assigned to H. and H.S., El Toro, as of 9/11/59.

WFO should recheck files of Marine Corps Headquarters, Washington, D. C., in an attempt to further identify the Lt. AYERS of H. and H.S. An appropriate lead should be set forth to have him interviewed.

Synopsis: Letter dated 1/31/64 from a writer in Havana, Cuba, stated the assassination of President KENNEDY was committed by a Mexican named "DUGLAS," and indicated that OSWALD and JACK RUBY knew nothing about it. This letter was directed to Dr. LUIS CONTE AGUERO, Miami, Fla., who has a nightly radio program beamed to Cuba. Dr. CONTE stated the author of the letter performs maintenance for Cuban ships and has previously furnished information regarded as valuable by Dr. CONTE.

DETAILS:

The following interview of GILBERTO W. PELIPICH and the translation of a letter received by his wife, which contained an allegation that President KENNEDY was killed by a Mexican named "DUGLAS," was set forth in a memorandum dated February 22, 1964, at Miami, Florida:

The content of that memorandum is being repeated in this report for the sake of cohesion with the supplemental investigation contained in this report.

GILBERTO W. PELIPICH SARIOL, 2940 S. W. 2nd Street, Miami, turned over to the Miami Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation a letter which he said had recently been received from Cuba by his wife, DIAMELBA. *1737*

This letter was addressed to Mrs. DIAMELBA PELIPICHE, 2940 S. W. 2nd Street, Miami 35, Fla., and reflected the return address of MANUEL GOMES, Ave. 51 #10312, Marianao, Habana. This letter appeared to be postmarked at Marianao, Cuba, on February 1, 1964. *10/1/64*

The letter itself was dated January 31, 1964, and addressed to Dr. LUIS CONTE AGUERO. (Dr. CONTE AGUERO is leader of an organization known as Sentinels of Liberty at Miami, Florida. He makes regular radio broadcasts to Cuba in which he requests the Cuban people to furnish him with information concerning activities of the CASTRO Government within Cuba by directing their letters to friends in the United States who, in turn, can send them to Dr. CONTE.)

Mr. PELIPICH stated that neither he nor his wife knows who Dr. LUIS CONTE AGUERO is, and, furthermore, they did not know the writer of the letter, MANUEL GOMES.

A translation of the letter from Spanish to English as set out hereafter reflects that the writer identifies the assassin of President KENNEDY as a Mexican named "DUGLAS" and he further predicts the death of Panamanian President ROBERTO CHIARI and Mexican President ADOLFO LOPEZ MATEOS during February or March of 1964. *11/1/64*

The English translation of the letter furnished by Mr. PELIPICH is as follows:

"Havana, January 31, 1964

"Dr. LUIS CONTE AGUIERO:

"I trust you will pardon a young Communist like myself for writing you, but I arrived a few days ago from Russia, and since I love my country, I do not like crimes like the killing of President KENNEDY and the killings planned for the President of Panama and President LOPEZ MATEO of Mexico, for which the American government will be blamed.

"In Russia, I heard talk about the death of KENNEDY a week before. When I returned to Cuba, at Havana University, there was a meeting attended by FIDEL CASTRO, the Russian Ambassador, CARLOS RAFAEL, and four people from Canada, plus one from Panama. These people are in charge of the attacks which are planned against the President of Panama and LOPEZ MATEO. You should see the quantity of arms being sent these days for those nations. For Santo Domingo, they have 'San Cristobas' and machineguns, American made. In packing, I and a friend of mine put ten machineguns in the Russian shipment. They took them out and then they closed all the crates. Each box is marked 'Gift of the Agrarian Reform.'

"President KENNEDY was killed by a Mexican named DUGLAS. The man who was killed while being transferred to another jail, and the man who killed him, according to FIDEL and the Canadians, knew nothing about KENNEDY's death. The four people from Canada are headed by a woman. They are in charge of these assassinations. One is set for February, or the next month. CHIARI is to be killed first. For her work in the KENNEDY assassination, FIDEL brought the Order of Lenin for her from Russia.

"As proof that this comes from Cuba, my friend and I are enclosing photographs taken from Cuban newspapers. This proves it was not mailed in the United States. This information should be passed on immediately."

The letter contained a news clipping of pictures of FIDEL CASTRO and other Cuban officials.

Mr. GILBERTO W. PELIPICH, residing at 2940 S. W. 2nd Street, Miami, was contacted concerning the letter his wife had received from Cuba in which the writer identified the assassin of President KENNEDY as a Mexican named "DUGLAS." (It is to be noted that this letter had been postmarked at Marianao, Cuba, on February 1, 1964, and reflected the return address of MANUEL GOMES, Ave. 51 #10312, Marianao, Havana.)

Mr. PELIPICH, who is 26 years of age, stated he had tried to figure out who may have written the letter, inasmuch as he knows no one named MANUEL GOMES. Mr. PELIPICH stated that he does not write to anyone in Cuba, including his own family, but his wife, DIAMELBA, does the writing to his family and to her own family in Cuba.

Mr. PELIPICH stated that his father, OSCAR PELIPICH, and mother, EROINA, live at Ray6 #307, Havana, Cuba. He said his father is employed on a Cuban merchant ship. He advised that he has no brothers or sisters. He said both his parents are politically opposed to the CASTRO regime, but such opposition is kept personal and latent.

Mr. PELIPICH stated the spelling in the letter from the unknown MANUEL GOMES appears to be written by one of little formal education, as many of the words are written in incorrect but phonetic spellings. He pointed out that the name "DUGLAS" would be the phonetic spelling for the given name DOUGLAS, which in itself is rare in Spanish. He said the name DOUGLAS is virtually unknown as a surname in Spanish.

DIANREBA PELIPICH, wife of GILBERTO W. PELIPICH, residing at 2940 S. W. 2nd Street, Miami, 32 years of age, advised that both her parents, INOCENTE CAMALICHE and PETRONILA live at Calle 26 #121 in the Vedado section of Havana. She said she has three sisters and two brothers also living in Cuba, and none of the family is either a member of the militia or pro-CASTRO. She said her father had owned a dredging vessel which was appropriated by the Cuban Government in 1960. She said her family in Cuba is currently supported by one brother-in-law, who is a teacher in a technical school, and a brother who works in construction.

Mrs. PELIPICH said the letter by the unknown MANUEL GOMES was not written by any member of her family, and she did not know how the writer of the letter may have obtained her name and address, unless it was obtained in some manner from her family.

 Dr. LUIS CONTE AGUIERO, residing at 4365 S. W. 2nd Street, Miami, stated he continues to broadcast nightly programs to Cuba over radio station WRUL, New York City. He stated these programs are broadcast under the name Sentinels of Liberty, of which he is the leader and director. He said that he regards Sentinels of Liberty as an organization which has many members in Cuba, and through which, although basically an "action" organization, the members furnish him with information concerning activities of the Cuban Government within Cuba. He said he requests this information be sent him by letters directed to relatives or friends in the United States who, in turn, can deliver or mail the letters to him in Miami.

Dr. CONTE was shown the letter which had been directed to DIAMELBA PELIPICH, and he said he recognized the writing and the style as that of a party from whom he had previously received information which he regarded as valuable. He stated that while he did not personally know the writer of the letter, he had learned of the writer's identity and background from one HUMBERTO HERNANDEZ, a Cuban exile at Miami to whom the writer had sent one letter for Dr. CONTE.

[Hk] Cuba.

Dr. CONTE said that the name MANUEL GOMES and the address for GOMES were not true. He stated that the author of the letter is 28 years of age, lives in Havana, and works in the maintenance of Cuban ships at Havana. This same individual has a close friend who is less educated and who writes the letters for the source, whom Dr. CONTE regards as a member of the Sentinels of Liberty.

Dr. CONTE stated he had received no information similar to that in the letter directed to DIAMELBA PELIPICH, either from the source at Havana, or from any other writer.

Dr. CONTE made available for copying a letter which had been posted on February 22, 1963, which he said was from the same source as the letter to DIANEJA PELIPICH. This letter bore the return address of PABLO VALDEZ, Calle 49 #14136, Marianao, Havana, which Dr. CONTE advised was a fictitious name and address. The letter was addressed to HUMBERTO HERNANDEZ at Miami Beach, Florida. CUBA

A translation of this letter from Spanish to English is as follows:

"Havana
February 19, 1963

"DR. LUIS CONTE AGUERO,

"This is to let you know that I had the pleasure of meeting a friend who is in the Cuban Navy, and he gave me the chills when he told me that they transported a load of arms to the high seas, where they were met by a Russian submarine. He said that they transferred it all to the submarine, and that there were cases which said Venezuela, and others which said Panama, Nicaragua, Honduras, and still others which had no destination indicated. He said that they took from the Navy Building some Venezuelans who were here in this country, and they left with the shipment. Also in the shipment were cans of Russian and Chinese meat, cans of milk and pork sausage, and some of the medicines which were sent to Cuba in exchange for the patriots. I want to tell you that I was at the University of Havana, and they are training men there to send them to Santo Domingo to make trouble there. There is a Russian who is instructing them. I was with a student who is with us, so that I could see how the FIDEL matter is getting along there, and he said that they have people in Mexico and in Brazil, and that they are about to receive arms in order to start a sabotage campaign, which is the only way that they will get ahead. Also, there is a Congolese there, who is being

"indoctrinated in order to be sent to his country to do that in the Congo. There are some Cubans who are going to leave for the North in order to make some attacks there in New York. They are already prepared and they are going to make the trip through Mexico. One of them has been up North already and he knows everything. That is all.

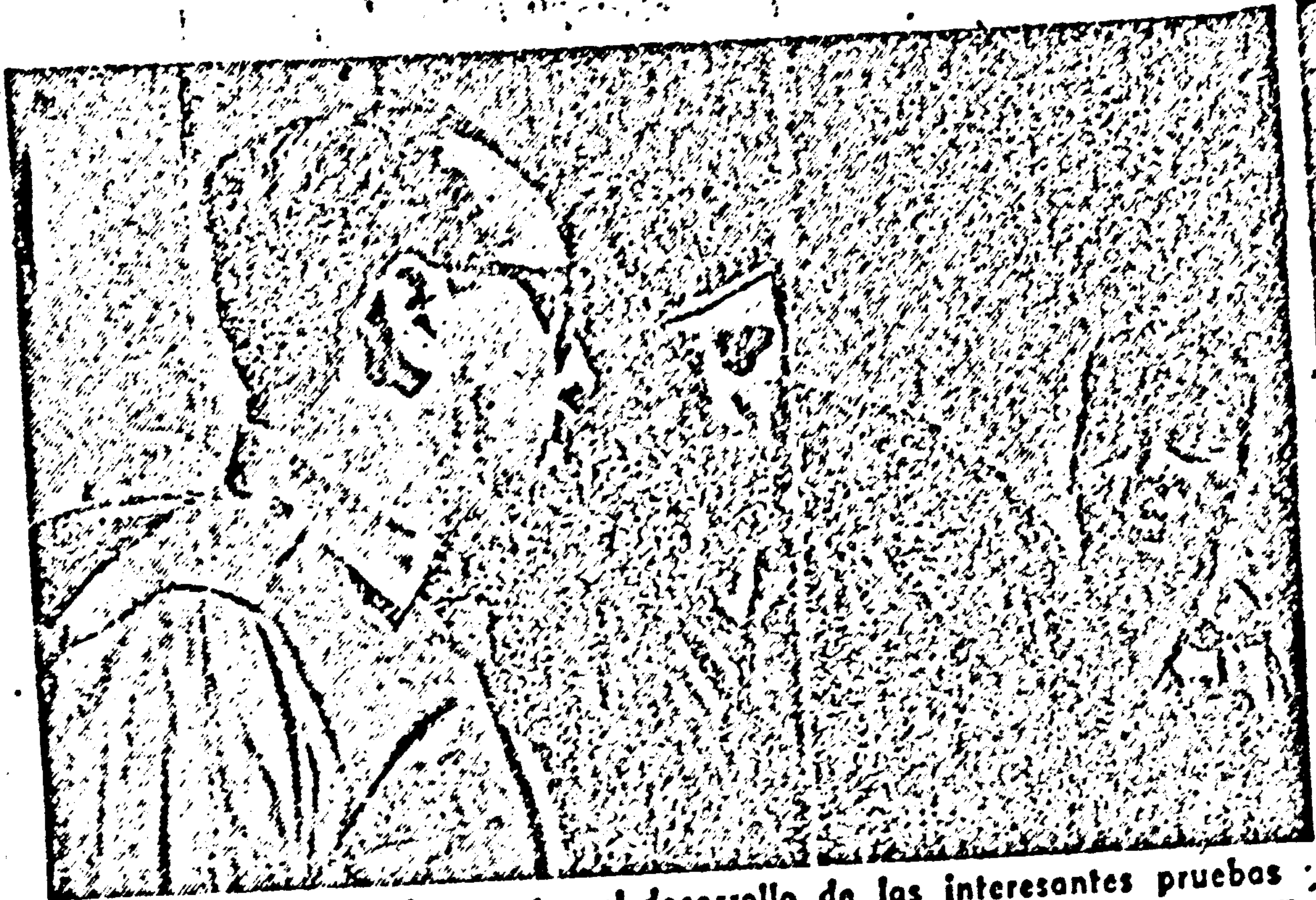

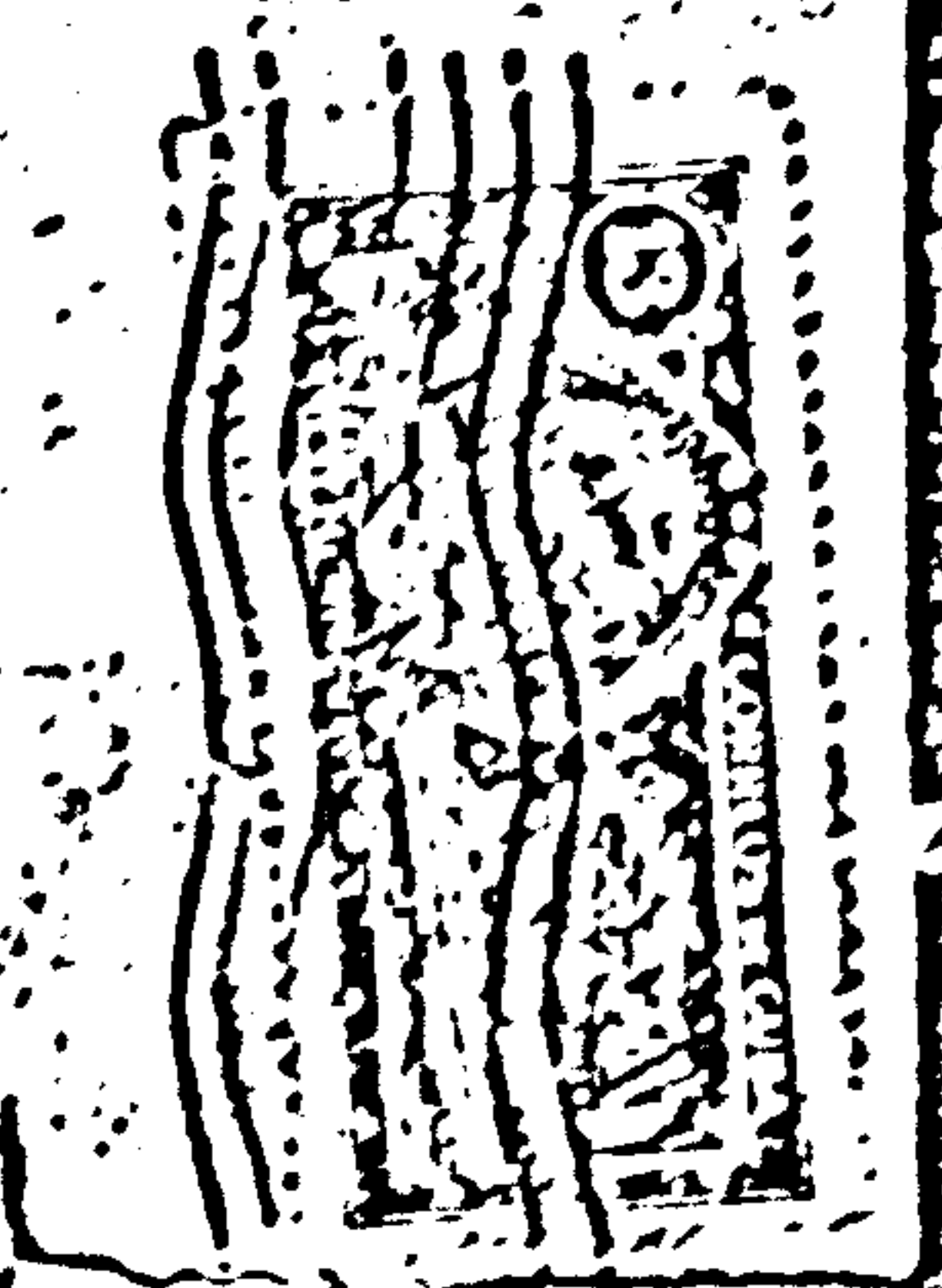

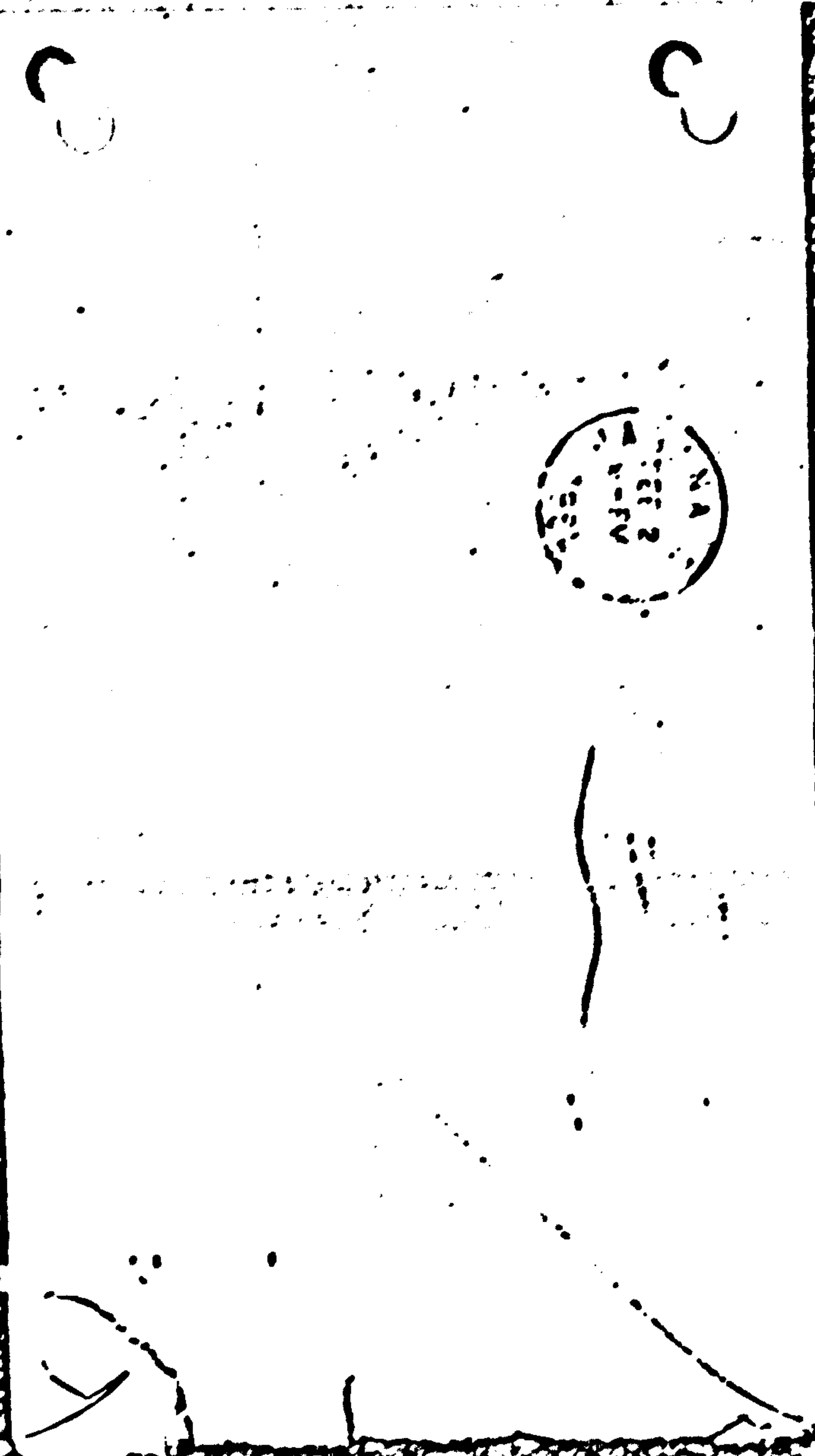

On the same day, 4/8/64, [redacted] received a telephone call from a DEIRDRE GRISWOLD, representing the Citizens Committee of Inquiry in New York. She advised [redacted] that MARK LANE was to be in Boston 4/30/64 where he would be a guest of JERRY WILLIAMS on WMEX Radio and that he would also make appearances at Brandeis and Harvard Universities. *Radio Station*

[redacted] was also advised that he may wish to contact Mr. EMERSON ALLEN at UN 8-6425 who was arranging for MARK LANE's appearance either at Harvard or at Brandeis.

[redacted] was also advised that since LANE was already committed for a live radio appearance on WMEX, it would not be possible for Station WERS to present him in person, but that they may wish to interview LANE and record the interview for future use.

[redacted] stated he contacted EMERSON ALLEN at UN 8-6425 on the same day and was told that ALLEN was arranging for the Harvard appearance of MARK LANE on 4/30/64 and that LANE was touring the country in the interests of LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

[redacted] advised that in view of the possible difficulty in arranging for an interview of LANE, and also the possibility that LANE might be considered a controversial individual, WERS had dropped the matter and would not attempt to interview him.

[redacted] further advised that on 4/14/64, he received a letter dated 4/10/64 from the "Citizens Committee of Inquiry", Room 422, 156 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York, telephone Yukon 9-6850, signed by DEIRDRE GRISWOLD, Coordinator. This letter made reference to the telephone conversation with [redacted] on 4/8/64 regarding the appearance of MARK LANE in Boston on 4/30/64. The letter stated that Mr. LANE would be happy to tape a brief interview following his afternoon address at Harvard on 4/30/64, but that if this is done, it could not be used until after 5/1/64 as Mr. LANE has an evening radio commitment for a live interview on 4/30/64.

[redacted] stated he had no other information and would not pursue this matter further.

For the information of the Bureau and New York JERRY WILLIAMS, mentioned herein, is a radio commentator employed by WMEX, Brookline Avenue, Boston, Mass. and broadcasts nightly between 10:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m. On his program, he discusses current events with his radio audience and presents various public figures from time to time. Following his talk or that of a guest, he has an arrangement whereby listeners may call and ask questions and the caller's voice may also be heard over the radio. As a result of remarks and matters discussed, WILLIAMS has become rather a controversial figure in Boston over the past several years.

For the above reasons, no direct contact is contemplated with JERRY WILLIAMS or WMEX in this matter, but attempts will be made to obtain the remarks of LANE through other sources or by monitoring his talk at the Boston Office.

It is also to be noted that EMERSON ALLEN, mentioned herein, is listed in the current Harvard College Directory as a student residing at 309 Quincy Hall, Class of 1966.

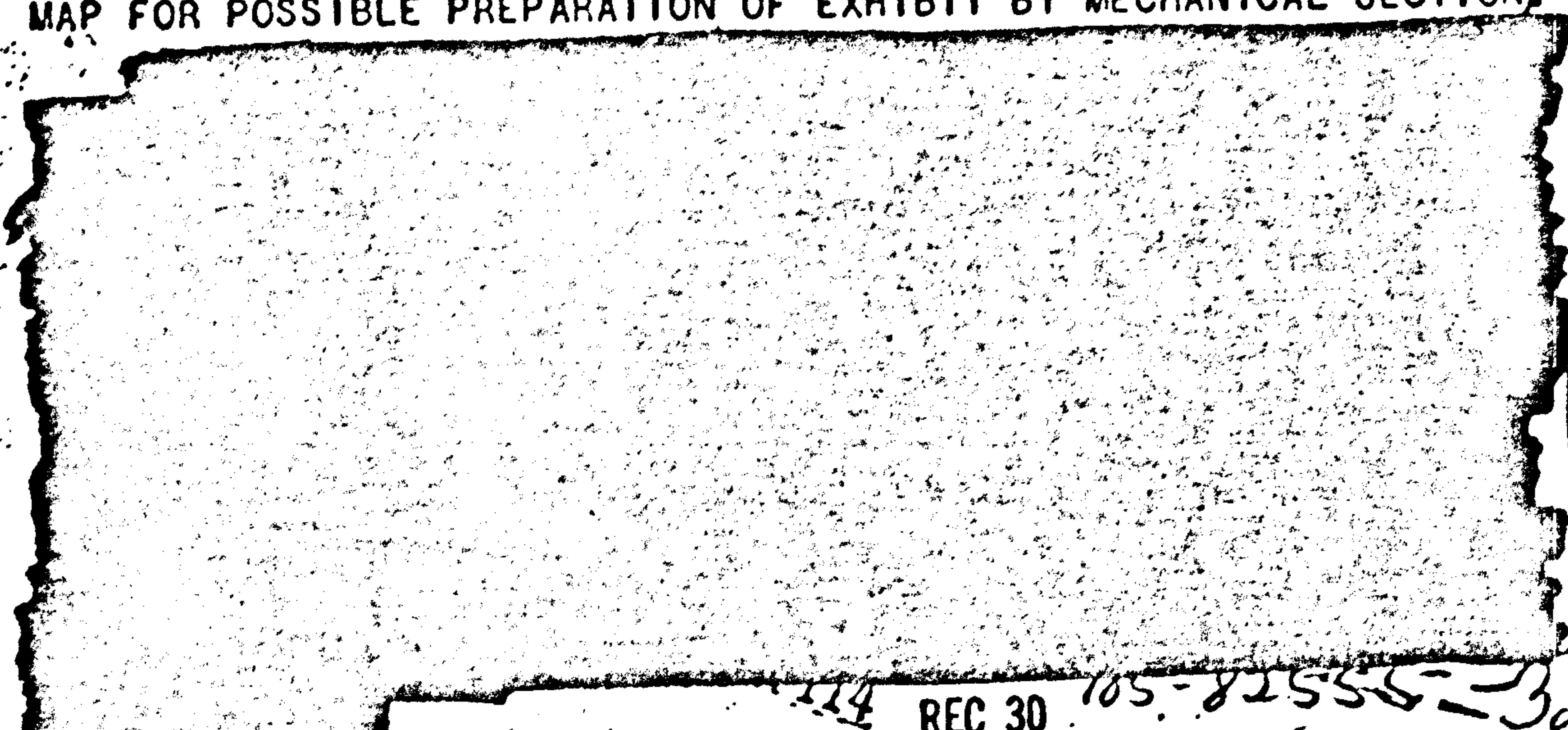

During a conversation on 4-13-64 Mr. J. Lee Rankin of the President's Commission asked Inspector Malley whether the FBI had contacted all informants for information concerning any connections that Oswald may have had with the Communist Party (CP). Mr. Rankin stated that Chief Justice Warren had raised this question to Rankin and had indicated that he would like a specific response from the FBI.

By teletype to all offices under the caption "Assassination of President John F. Kennedy" dated 11-22-63 the Bureau instructed that informants be contacted for information bearing on the assassination of President Kennedy. It is likely that many of the informants when contacted were questioned for information they could furnish regarding Oswald inasmuch as Oswald was the principal suspect and incarcerated late on 11-22-63. However, it is believed desirable at this time to contact all informants with specific reference to knowledge concerning any connections of Oswald with the CP. We have at this time throughout the field 1089 security informants and 341 potential security informants. While it will entail considerable effort, it is believed essential to make these contacts so that we may respond to the Commission's query.

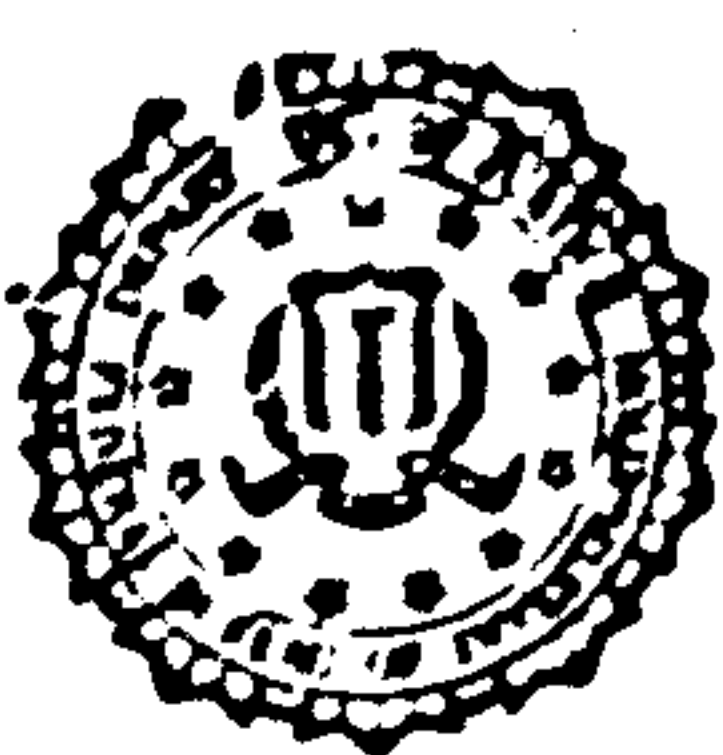

BASIS FOR INQUIRY

The information recorded below was made available by a confidential source abroad.

Licenciado (Attorney) RAFAEL HERNANDEZ OCHOA, Assistant Director of the Department of Immigration, Mexican Ministry of "Gobernacion" (Interior or Government), advised that the files of that department reflect that LEE HARVEY OSWALD departed from Mexico on October 3, 1963, at Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas. He stated that the personnel records of the Mexican Immigration Office at Nuevo Laredo reflect that on October 3, 1963, from 12:00 midnight until 8:00 AM, Immigration official ALBERTO ARZAMENDI CHAPA was in charge of the "Kilometer 26" highway checking station, where tourist cards are picked up from aliens leaving Mexico by highway travel through Nuevo Laredo. The name and date stamp of ARZAMENDI CHAPA on the original tourist card surrendered by OSWALD upon his departure from Mexico on that date was evidence of the fact that his exit from Mexico occurred during those hours.

Lic. HERNANDEZ OCHOA and the Acting Minister of Government, Lic. LUIS ECHEVERRIA, both had advised that considerable investigation had been conducted by several different agencies of the Mexican Government for the purpose of ascertaining subject's method of travel on departure and that, in view of the fact that the name "OSWALD" had been located on a passenger list for the 1:00 PM trip of the "Transportes Frontera" bus line from Mexico City to Nuevo

Laredo, Tamaulipas, on October 2, 1963, it was considered that OSWALD had traveled thereon.

Considerable investigation with respect to the passenger list mentioned above, including a check of the ticket stubs at the Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, headquarters of the company, interview of bus drivers and passengers, and numerous interviews of employees of the Mexico City terminal of the bus line, failed to confirm that OSWALD, in fact, had been a passenger on the "Transportes Frontera" bus in question.

CHECKS OF RECORDS OF OTHER BUS LINES

A second confidential source abroad provided the following information:

On March 30, 1964, officials of the "Autobuses Blancos Flecha Roja, S. A.," bus line made available passenger lists for the four scheduled trips of that company from Mexico City to Nuevo Laredo of October 2, 1963, and no information identifiable with OSWALD by any of the names he was known to have used was located on those lists. It was determined, however, that, if the time schedules of that company are maintained, none of its trips to Nuevo Laredo would arrive at the "Kilometer 26" highway checking station between midnight and 8:00 AM.

On the basis of several contacts with Mr. RICARDO MEDINA BELTRAN, Manager of the Mexico City terminal of the "Autobuses Transportes del Norte" bus line (hereinafter referred to as Transportes del Norte), information was received from him to the effect that "Secret Service agents, Presidential investigators, Federal Security agents, and others" had reviewed the passenger lists maintained by his company for its service between Mexico City and Laredo, Texas, and that he had assisted in those checks, which failed to disclose any information identifiable with OSWALD.

MEDINA explained that the passenger list actually is a card form on which reservations and ticket sales are recorded and that after the particular trip for which it was prepared has left the terminal it is cancelled to avoid further

confusion, as the reverse side of the form is utilized for a similar record at a later date. He stated that the cancelled lists are not a permanent record and are maintained only for a short period of time following their use. He stated that he had set aside the lists for early October, 1963, in the event there should be further need for them; nevertheless, he was unable to locate them. He pointed out that apparently they had been placed inadvertently in a storeroom where tires, spare parts, boxes of obsolete files and records, and other materials are maintained and that only a thorough review of all material in the storeroom would reveal whether or not the list for October 2, 1963, was still in existence. He related that his company has two direct trips daily to Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, and Laredo, Texas, and that the bus which departs from Mexico City at 8:30 AM is scheduled to arrive in Nuevo Laredo at 2:00 AM the following morning and would arrive at the "Kilometer 26" checking station at approximately 1:00 AM.

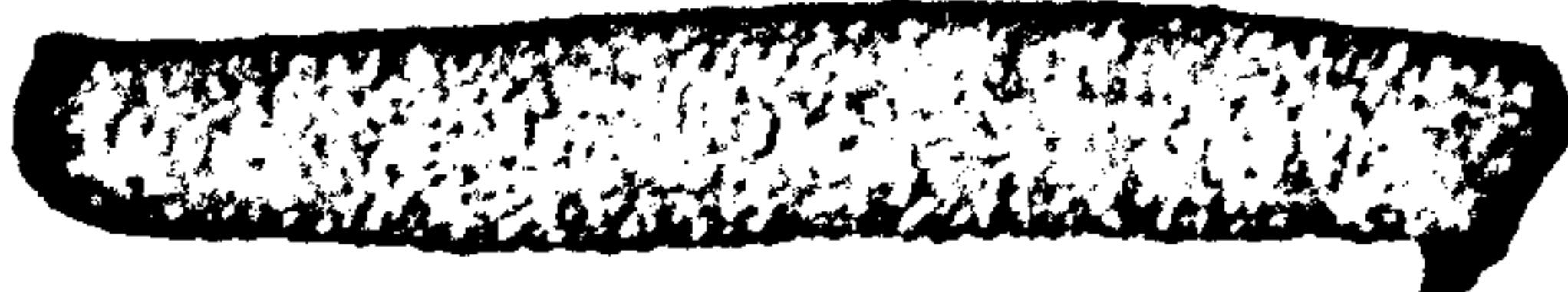

MEDINA explained that seats No. 12 and No. 15 had been reserved for another bus line or travel agencies and that the company would have no record with respect to the identities of the occupants of those seats.

On March 31, 1964, Miss ROSA MARIA OROZCO, Auditor of the "Auto Viajes Internacionales, S. A.," travel agency (International Auto Travels, Inc.), Lafragua No. 4, Mexico, D. F., advised that she had located a record of the sale by that firm of a ticket for travel on seat No. 15 of the 8:30 AM, October 2, 1963, bus of Transportes del Norte to Laredo to ANASTACIO RUIZ MEZA. She stated that the company had sold this transportation to RUIZ MEZA for travel via the Transportes del Norte bus line to Laredo and from Laredo to Chicago, Illinois, by Greyhound Line.

RECORD OF LOCATION OF
TRANSPORTATION SOLD TO H. O. LEE

A third confidential source abroad provided the information recorded hereinafter:

On April 1, 1964, MACLOVIO PORTILLO G., Superintendent of the Mexico City terminal of the bus line, "Transportes Chihuahuenses, S. A. de C. V.," (Chihuahuenses Transportation, Incorporated with Variable Capital) Bernal Diaz No. 5, Mexico, D. F., and his clerk, MARIA TERESA-CASARES, caused the records of that bus line to be searched for all tickets issued for travel on October 2, 1963, in an effort to locate the names LEE HARVEY OSWALD, O. H. LEE, ALEK JAMES HIDELE, and V. L. LEE with particular attention to ticket No. 13688.

PORTILLO advised that no information had been located which could be identified with the foregoing, explaining that tickets sold by his company during that period were in the eighty and ninety thousand series, eliminating the possibility that ticket No. 13688 might have been sold at that office.

PORTILLO suggested that the transportation concerning which inquiry was being made might have been sold at the "Agencia de Viajes, Transportes Chihuahuenses, S. A. de C. V.," (Chihuahuenses Transportation Travel Agency, Inc.) with offices at Paseo de la Reforma No. 52, Room 5. He telephoned

to that agency and was advised by a clerk, ALEJANDRINA M. DE BUTCHER, that the reservation order under No. 13688 was available at that office.

On April 1, 1963, Miss TERESA SCHAEFFER BEQUERISSE, Manager of the above-mentioned travel agency, located the reservation and purchase order No. 13688, and it was determined to be in blank, never having been utilized. She reviewed the Transportes del Norte passenger list for bus No. 332 for October 2, 1963, considering that the order number might be 12688, and this order No. 12688 was located and also found to be blank. She insisted that her office had not handled the reservation noted on the Transportes del Norte passenger list shown her for October 2, 1963. She was requested to review all reservation and purchase orders issued for October, 1963, by her office.

A review of the carbon copies of these reservation and purchase orders was made by the confidential source abroad in the presence of Miss SCHAEFFER, which revealed that reservation and purchase order No. 14618 was issued to Transportes del Norte in Mexico City for Mr. H. O. LEE for seat No. 12 from Mexico City to Laredo, Texas, on Wednesday, October 2, 1963, at 8:30 AM. This information was printed in Spanish, and the reservation was confirmed by a Mr. SAUCEDO. At the bottom of this printed order the date was indicated to be September 30, 1963, and the cost was listed as 93.75 "moneda nacional" (national money or Mexican pesos comparable to \$7.50 U.S.). Also at the bottom of this printed order was the printed notice that the "Agencia de Viajes, Transportes Chihuahuenses" is an agent for the Greyhound Bus Line.

Miss SCHAEFFER advised that former employee ROLANDO BARRIOS had signed the reservation and purchase order and apparently made the sale to Mr. H. O. LEE. She stated the original of this form was given to the purchaser in order that he could then obtain his ticket at Transportes del Norte, explaining that an original and two copies of the reservation and purchase order are made and the original is given to the purchaser, one copy is kept at her office, and the third copy is forwarded to the main office of the travel
