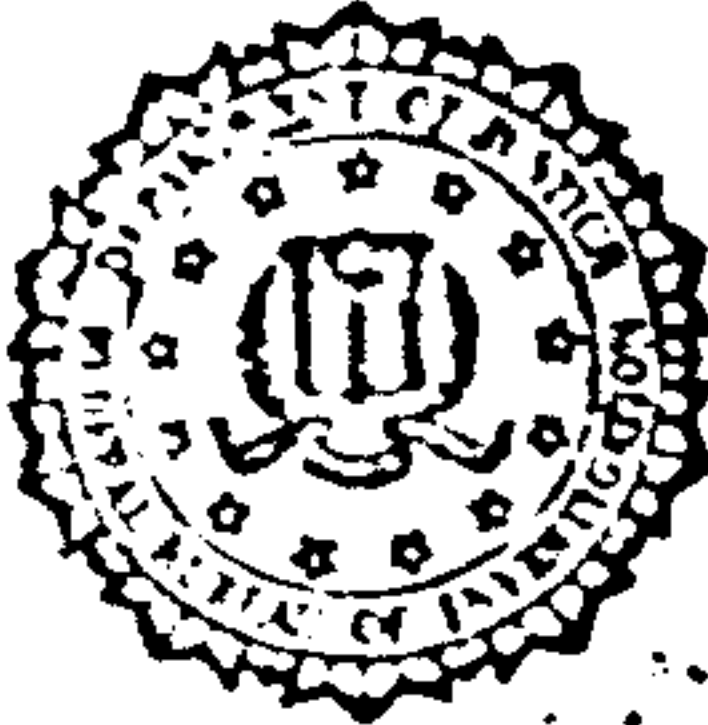

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

Mrs. Fred C. (Ruby) Groth, 762 Depot Street, Manawa, Wisconsin, who is employed as a teacher at St. Paul's Lutheran School, was contacted at her home on April 6, 1964, by SA James H. Brewster.

Mrs. Groth stated that she and her husband were connected with the Evangelical Lutheran Bethlehem Orphan Asylum, New Orleans, Louisiana, from 1936 to 1945. She stated that from 1940 to 1945 she was matron of the orphanage and that as matron she was charged with the supervision of the girls (cleanliness, food, and work done by the girls) at the orphanage. She stated that she had little association with the boys and had no responsibility in their sleeping quarters or in caring for them physically. She stated this would have been the responsibility of Miss Ida Stolte.

Mrs. Groth denied having any recollection of Lee Harvey Oswald, Robert Lee Oswald, Jr., John Edward Pic, or their mother.

Mr. Fred C. Groth, 762 Depot Street, Manawa, Wisconsin, who is employed as a teacher and as principal of St. Paul's Lutheran School, Manawa, Wisconsin, was contacted at his home on April 6, 1964, by Special Agent James H. Brewster.

Mr. Groth stated that he was employed as a teacher at the Evangelical Lutheran Bethlehem Orphan Asylum, New Orleans, Louisiana, from 1936 to 1940 and that he was superintendent of this school from 1940 to 1945.

Mr. Groth stated that as superintendent, he was the executive officer of the school, and he was concerned with the administrative work of running the school and that he had little contact with the children. He noted that the period that Lee Harvey Oswald, Robert Lee Oswald, Jr., and John Edward Pic would have been at the orphanage would have been during World War II and this was a hectic time. He stated the orphanage was understaffed and the orphanage became almost a day school for working people who wanted a place to leave their children.

Mr. Groth stated that Reverend Henry L. Honold, pastor, Christ Lutheran Church, New Orleans, Louisiana, was in charge of admitting and releasing children at the school, and that he, Mr. Groth, did not have to interview the parents of the children. He noted that the decision to admit or release the child was made by the official board on recommendation of Reverend Honold. He also stated that Reverend Honold was in charge of the religious activities at the orphanage. *Evangelical Lutheran Bethlehem Orphan Asylum*

Mr. Groth stated that as he recalls the staff of the orphanage during the 1942-44 period would have been as follows:

- Matron - Mrs. Fred C. Groth *X*
- Upper Grades Teacher - Edward Koschmann *from New Orleans*
- Lower Grades Teacher - Miss Anna Wegener, who still lives in New Orleans, Louisiana
- Maintenance Man - Mr. Reyseck
- Laundress - Mrs. E. Burroughs
- Cook - Name not recalled
- Child Supervisor - Miss Ida Stolte

He stated Miss Stolte was last known to be at the Bethesda Lutheran Home, Watertown, Wisconsin.

Mr. Groth stated that he has no recollection of Lee Harvey Oswald, Robert Lee Oswald, Jr. or John Edward Pic, or their mother.

A copy of an application blank, dated December 26, 1942, showing that Lee Oswald, age 3, was admitted to the orphanage on that date was displayed to Mr. Groth. He stated he apparently signed the application, upon receipt of custody of Lee Oswald, but he has absolutely no recollection of the incident and he noted that it is very possible that he did not see Mrs. Oswald at the time and that Reverend Hoald delivered the boy to the orphanage.

A copy of an application of John Edward Pic and Robert Oswald, dated December 23, 1944, was displayed to Mr. Groth. He noted that his signature appears on the application as superintendent, but that he has no recollection of handling the application.

A copy of an application of admittance of Robert Edward Oswald, Jr., dated January 3, 1942, was displayed to Mr. Groth, who stated that his signature appears on that application but that he has no recollection of handling the application.

A copy of the schedule of payments made by Mrs. L. Oswald, mother, dated for the year 1942, showing payments from January through October, was displayed to Mr. Groth. He stated he believes he would have made entries on the schedule but that he has no recollection of having done so or of how the money was received.

Mr. Groth stated that shortly after President John F. Kennedy was assassinated, he received a long-distance telephone call from New Orleans, Louisiana from a newspaper, inquiring about his recollection of the Oswald and Pic family and that he stated at that time he had no recollection of the family in any way. He stated that in his 35 years as a teacher, he has found the troublemakers and the outstanding students are recalled, but that he simply has no recollection of the Oswald and Pic boys and no recollection concerning Mrs. Oswald. He stated that he and his wife have previously discussed the Oswald and Pic boys and that neither of them can recall the boys.

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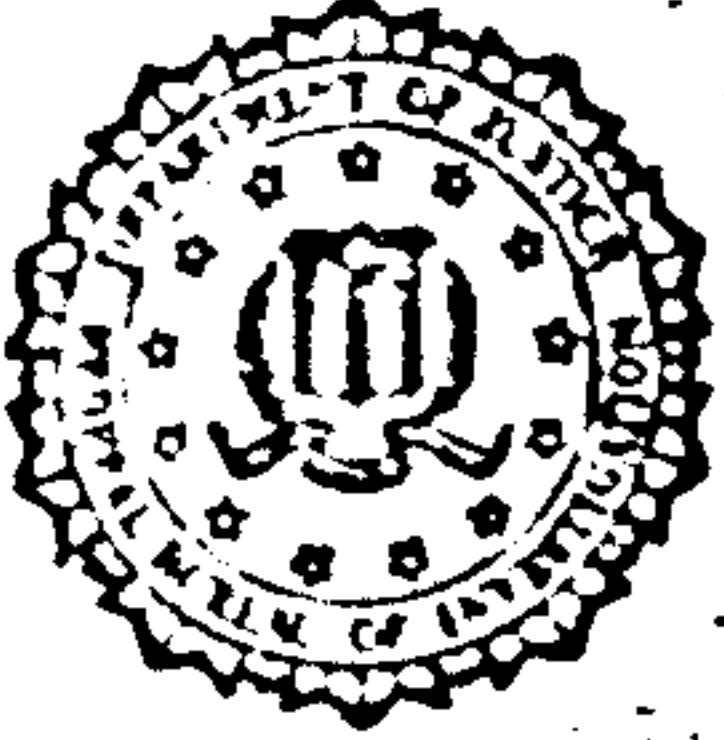

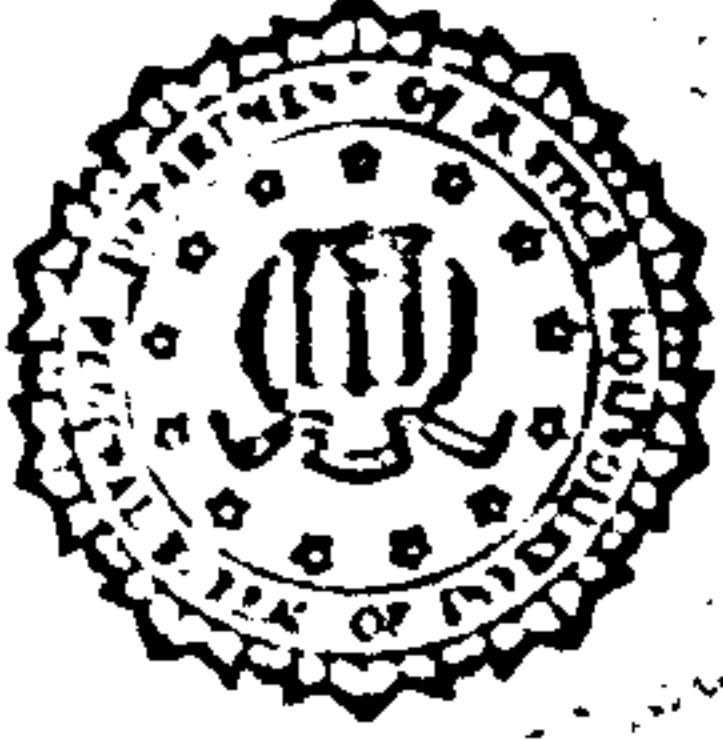

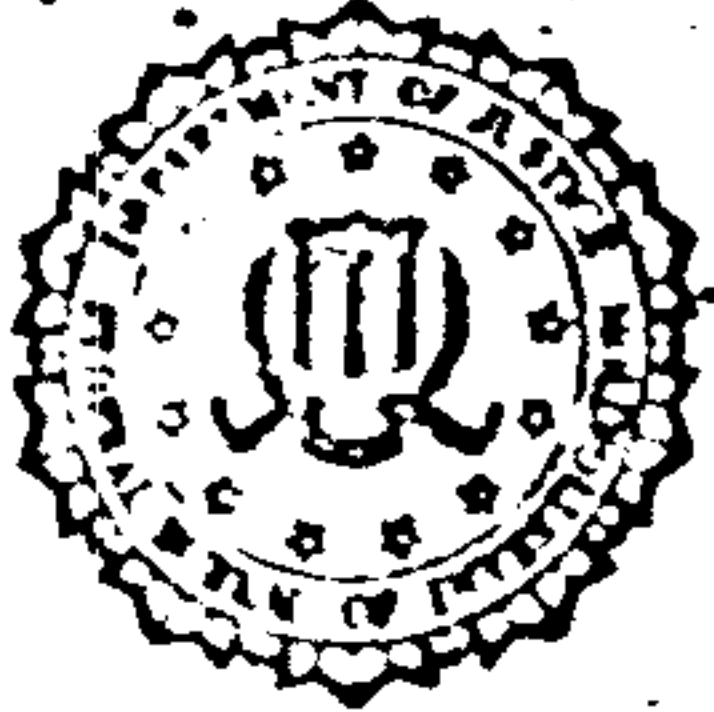

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

Miss ANNA WEGENER, 1721 Congress, New Orleans, Louisiana, on April 10, 1964 advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that she was employed at the Evangelical Lutheran Bethlehem Children's Home from 1929 to 1946. She said she was a teacher in grades 1, 2 and 3 at the home.

Miss WEGENER advised that she had no recollection of LEE HARVEY OSWALD as he was too young to be in her classes at the home. She did say, however, that she recalled a three-year-old boy at the home during 1943, who was a cute little curly, blond-haired boy. She said she has wondered ever since she had learned that OSWALD was at the home whether this boy was in fact LEE HARVEY OSWALD. She said this particular little boy was a "nice" little boy. She could make no other comments about him as her recollection of him was so vague.

Miss WEGENER advised she did not have JOHN PIC or ROBERT LEE OSWALD, JR. in her classes, but she said she recalled JOHN PIC. She said he was in the classroom next to hers. WEGENER said that PIC was a troublesome boy but could not recall anything specific in regard to his behavior. She said all she could recall about him was the fact he gave his teacher trouble in class. She advised she could recall nothing about ROBERT LEE OSWALD, JR. and the name was not familiar to her at all.

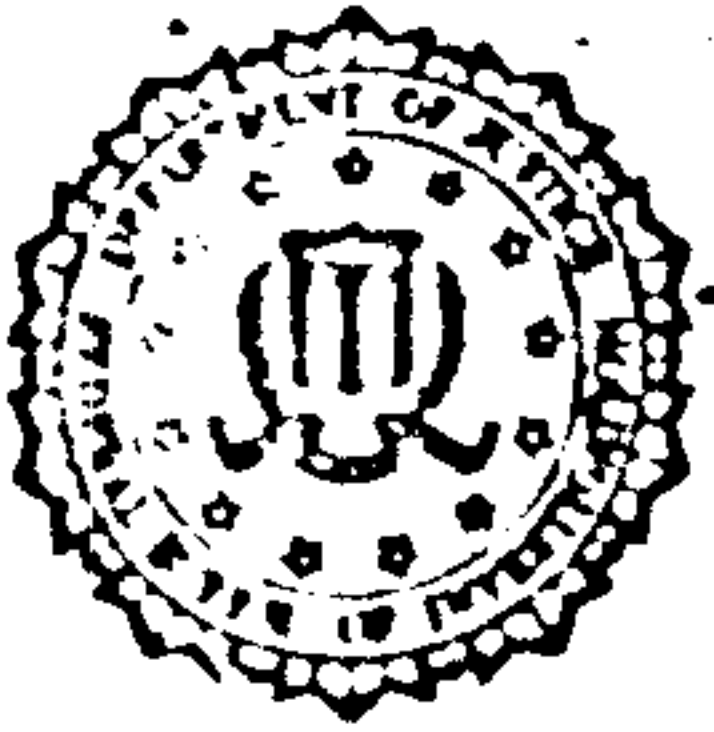
WEGENER advised that the total attendance at the home during the early 1940's was approximately 90 children. She said that with this number of children at the home, unless there was something outstanding, good or bad, she felt she would not recall a particular child. She said she presumed that the OSWALDS and PIC were neither exceptionally good or bad or else her recollection of them would be more specific.

WEGENER advised that to the best of her knowledge she had never met Mrs. OSWALD.

In connection with other research and inquiries being conducted at the National Archives, [redacted] located the above-described magazine, which, on pages eight and nine, includes an article in Spanish entitled "Los Pasos de OSWALD en Mexico" ("The Footsteps of OSWALD in Mexico"), and photographs of the Hotel Del Comercio, the Transportes Frontera bus terminal, and the owner of the restaurant where OSWALD is reported to have taken some meals. Commission Representative DAVID W. YSLAWSON expressed an interest in carrying a copy of the magazine with him, and it was furnished to him for that purpose.

*Mexico D.C. President's*

As is typical of much of the news and magazine reporting in Mexico, the information appearing in the article is in considerable variance with the information which has resulted from Bureau investigation in this matter.

CORRECT NAME OF MEXICAN IMMIGRATION  
CHIEF AT NUEVO LAREDO, MEXICO

As the Bureau was advised in reference cable, Inspector JOSE MARIO DEL VALLE was contacted by SA JOSEPH B. GARCIA and advised that the correct name of the Chief of the Mexican Immigration station at Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, Mexico, is GILBERTO CAZARES GARZA. He acknowledged that his use of the name "GILBERTO CAZARES PEREZ" in his report of investigation concerning OSWALD (a translation of which was submitted to the Bureau by letterhead memorandum dated 3/16/64) had been a mental lapse on his part.

Suspense in Dallas

Will Ruby Follow Oswald in His Tragic Destiny?

A "Fort Worth Press" reporter accosted Oswald's mother and asked her if she previously had any apprehensions that an attempt might be made on the life of her son. Mrs. Marguerite Oswald replied that she did. She went on to state that 12 hours before her son was killed a policeman showed her a photograph of Jack Ruby and asked her to identify him. In this fashion, it has been successfully established that the Dallas police knew that Rubistein (sic) intended to dispose of the killer of the President.

*Texas*

In a statement to the press, the Chief of the Dallas Police, Jesse Curry, had to admit that on November 24, at 7 o'clock in the morning, he received a telephone call. It was a warning that Oswald would be killed. Glen King, Assistant to Chief Curry, confirmed that at 2:15 in the morning he had likewise spoken with an unknown party who told him that the alleged assassin of the President was going to be killed.

*Police Dept*

According to the "Dallas Morning News," the local police were certain that Oswald would not "arrive at the county jail alive."

*Texas*

Oswald's assassin, Jack Ruby, owed more than \$20,000 to the United States Treasury, and at the time he committed his crime "he was in a rather difficult financial situation," as the investigators put it. However, upon his arrest Ruby had \$2,000 on his person and another \$10,000 at home which was found in a shoe box.

The "Star Telegram" of Fort Worth stated that the head jailer at the Dallas jail is worried that Jack Rubistein may be poisoned before his trial as the assassin of Lee Harvey Oswald.

In view of the manifest inefficiency of the Dallas police, there are many people who think that Ruby may follow Oswald's fate by coming to a violent end at the hands of other people who are interested in sealing his lips.

(Translation of Captions:)

Jack Ruby may be poisoned to stop him from talking too much - The Chief of the Dallas Police, Jesse Curry, had to admit that he knew, as of 7 o'clock in the morning, that the presumed assassin of the President might be killed. However, he did nothing to prevent it.

Several hours before this happened, the Dallas police were warned against a possible attempt on the life of Lee Oswald. (This caption refers to both photos on page 11)

Oswald's Steps in Mexico

The buses entering the city from other parts of the Republic fan out into the streets in search of their terminals. Buenavista is a street where a large number of terminals for out-of-town buses are located. On one of its terminal buildings, on the eastern side of the street, a large sign blinks its neon red and blue lights at night and reads: "Border Transports. Mexico, Tampico, Monterrey, Matamoros and Laredo. Short Route. Ask for Information."

The waiting room is wide and dark. At one end there is a counter where people leave and pick up their baggage, where tickets are checked and where a list of the passengers arriving in the city on each trip is prepared. One of these passengers was Lee Oswald.

*Frontier Bus Terminal Mexico City Mexico*  
The employee who works the night shift starts his work at 4:00 p.m. His name is Lucio Lopez. He gave an evasive answer: "I do not know anything; I can hardly remember. Who could have anticipated? Here, ask the boss. He is the one who prepared the list. He saw him better than I did." However, he admitted: "It was the last week of September."

Efforts were being made to take a close look at the Mexicans who saw President Kennedy's assassin *Frontier* who, himself, was in turn assassinated.

*employee Bus Terminal*  
Mr. Gilberto Lozano Guizar had a better recollection of the American who arrived in Mexico on September 26 of last year, in the afternoon, and who, throughout the trip from Laredo to the capital, occupied seat #4 next to the window.

"We know that he was the man because not many 'gringos' are in the habit of travelling on this line. Whenever there is one of them, we ask him to write his name on the passengers' list in order to avoid misspellings on our part. Oswald wrote his name. His full name. Later, we found out that he had not written his ticket number. Perhaps he did not understand us when we asked him to. In reality, he was a 'gringo' like many others. He was poorly dressed. He was wearing a sport shirt; no dress shirt, no coat; a single bag and nothing else. The way he looked suggested a rather withdrawn man. This is all I recall. He did not speak. He said nothing."

In our efforts to follow the steps Oswald took in Mexico, we left the terminal and went to Calles de Cerrada de Bernardino de Sahagun. It is a long and narrow street. A four-story building covered with red ceramic tile is the Hotel of Commerce. That is where Oswald stayed.

*Mexico City, Mexico*  
Sebastian Perez Hernandez, the reception clerk, receives the guests and assigns their rooms.

"I remember he was given room No. 18. It has a bathroom. I never spoke to him. I saw him come down the steps whenever he went out. I remember because no 'gringos' ever come to this hotel. It was a novelty to see him go out and return. He spent a few days, perhaps six or seven. A man who spoke to him on one occasion is my boss, Mr. Garcia. It seems that also the nightman spoke to him. He appeared to be a normal person; poor perhaps, but normal."

At the small restaurant where Oswald had some of his meals, the lady in charge, Mrs. Dolores Ramirez viuda de Barreiro, told us:

*Mexico City, Mexico*  
"Yes, of course. He had four meals here. He did not speak Spanish well and the first time we were not able to understand what he wanted. We served him what was there. As soon as the rice arrived, he asked for his check. After that, we knew. He only ate soup, rice and bread. He drank water. He ate like a hungry man. When we offered him the next course and brought it to him he said no with his head. Perhaps he did not have enough money."

It looks as though Oswald was, indeed, short of money while in Mexico: in eight days he spent a total of 329 pesos.

Translation of Captions:

- This is the bus terminal where Oswald arrived in Mexico last September.

- The alleged killer of the President stayed a few days at a modest hotel near Alvarado Bridge in his quest for a Cuban visa.

- At "The Hope Restaurant" he ate modestly. Oswald sat at the first table and ate inexpensive food. Dolores Ramirez viuda de Barreiro waited on him.

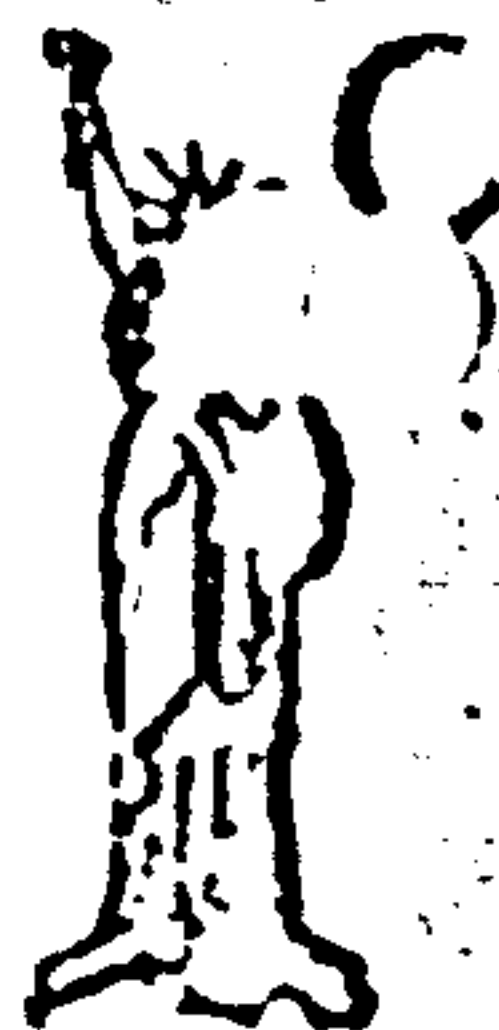
- Lucio Lopez sold him the return ticket to Nuevo Laredo eight days after his arrival here.

- Gilberto Lozano Guizar remembers that Oswald bought ticket No. 4 at the counter.

- Sebastian Perez never thought that Oswald might be a dangerous man. If anything, he thought that he was rather poor.

Your attention is directed to my letter dated February 20, 1964, and its enclosure, a memorandum so dated, and captioned "Lee Harvey Oswald." This set out the results of our interrogation of Marina Oswald concerning the incident involving her and James Herbert Martin. Marina Oswald indicated in that interview that she had dinner on February 7, 1964, with Martin and her daughter, June, and spent the evening with Martin.

Mr. Jacobs is being interviewed to determine if Marina Oswald ever did actually have dinner with Mr. and Mrs. Jacobs. You will be furnished the results of this interview upon receipt.

Inasmuch as Mr. and Mrs. Jacobs have visited Russia, you may wish to contact the Central Intelligence Agency for further information concerning them.

MARK LANE

At approximately 8:00 P.M. on April 24, 1964, Mark Lane spoke to a group of approximately two hundred people, mostly students at Felgar Hall, on the campus of Oklahoma University at Norman, Oklahoma. His appearance was sponsored by a campus organization known as "Students for a Democratic Society." This organization is recognized by Oklahoma University as a campus organization.

Lane stated in his speech that he is firmly convinced of the innocence of Lee Harvey Oswald, both as the alleged assassin of the late John F. Kennedy, President of the United States, and as the murderer of a Dallas police officer. According to Lane, all evidence indicates that the shots which killed the President had to come from the front, which would be from the vicinity of a railroad overpass ahead of the Presidential Limousine rather than from the rear. He noted that the Texas School Book Depository was located at the rear of the Presidential Limousine.

Lane accused the Dallas Police Department, U.S. Secret Service and the Federal Bureau of Investigation of manufacturing evidence to show the guilt of Lee Harvey Oswald. He accused these same organizations of suppressing all evidence which might tend to indicate the innocence of Oswald.

The "New York Herald Tribune" newspaper dated January 15, 1964, page 7, column 1, contained an article entitled "Oswald's Mother hires Lane." This article stated that on January 14, 1964, Mrs. Marguerite C. Oswald, mother of accused assassin Lee Harvey Oswald announced she had hired Mark

Lane to represent her slain son before the Warren Commission investigating the murder of President John F. Kennedy. According to this article, Mrs. Oswald stated she had been in contact with Lane during his stay in Fort Worth, Texas, the previous weekend. It was also pointed out that Lane had accepted the case although Mrs. Oswald stated she had no funds with which to pay him.

The April 2, 1964 issue of the "New York Times," page 37, column 5, contained an article captioned "Mother of Oswald Ends Tie with Lane." The article indicated Mrs. Marguerite Oswald said she had dismissed Mark Lane, her New York lawyer, and that he should stop any "organized campaign" on behalf of her son through his "Citizens Committee of Inquiry."

OC T-1 on June 10, 1963, advised that at a meeting of the New York Council to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee held May 28, 1963, at 74 Fifth Avenue, New York City, Mark Lane was elected to the position of Vice Chairman of the organization.

On March 9, 1961, a source advised that the New York Council to Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee (NYCAUAC), 150 West 34th Street, New York City, New York, was formed at a meeting held in New York City on November 17, 1960. This organization was founded principally through the efforts of Frank Wilkinson, Field Representative of the National Committee To Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee (NCAUAC).

A second source advised on September 17, 1952, that Frank Wilkinson was a Communist Party member as of September, 1952.

A third source furnished on September 14, 1961, a copy of resolutions of the New York Council to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee

MARK LANE

(NYCAUAC) which were adopted by the NYCAUAC. One such resolution affirmed the intention to continue to work for the abolition of the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) and to continue its efforts to broaden the participation in this fight. Another resolution accepted as a modus vivendi the suggestion of the Field Representative of the "National Committee to Abolish the HCUA" (NCAUAC) namely that local abolition committees may identify and co-ordinate their efforts as closely as they desire with NCAUAC, still maintaining their autonomy for as flexible and independent a program as possible.

Various sources have advised during March, 1962, that Communist Party (CP) members in the New York City area have been solicited to support activities of the NYCAUAC during attendance at CP club meetings.

On May 6, 1963, the first source advised that the NYCAUAC continues to function from its office at 150 West 34th Street, New York City, New York.

Concerning the National Committee to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee, it will be noted the "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" issued December 1, 1961, by the Committee on Un-American Activities, U. S. House of Representatives, page 115, contains the following citation regarding the National Committee to Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee (NCAUAC).

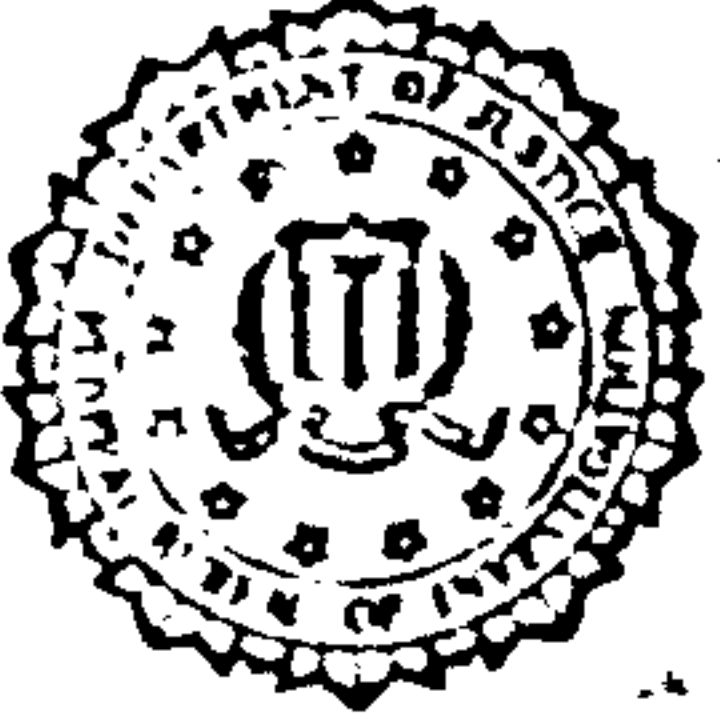

A careful review of Oswald's file reveals that Allen Felde, Donald Goodwin and Peter Cassisi, former Marine Corps associates of Oswald, have never been interviewed. These men are mentioned in "Life" magazine article about Oswald, 2-21-64 issue, pages 72 and 74A. Cassisi is identified as Bronxville, New York, policeman. Although numerous former Marine Corps associates of Oswald have already furnished information about his life and activities in the Marine Corps, the Bureau believes these three men should also be interviewed since their names have appeared in the public press.

New York locate and interview Cassisi for all information he possesses about Oswald. Find out how well he knew Oswald. Where were they assigned together? What was Oswald's work in Marine Corps when Cassisi knew him? Who was Oswald's closest friend at that time? How did Oswald spend his off-duty hours? Question Cassisi thoroughly for his recollections of Oswald.

St. Louis review files at Military Records Center for Felde and Goodwin and determine their last known addresses. Set forth leads for appropriate offices to interview them along same lines as set out in paragraph above.

Results of interviews should be submitted in report form.

NOTE: Piece of wood was obtained from the window ledge on the sixth floor of the Texas School Book Depository Building where it is believed Oswald fired his rifle at President Kennedy. This wood was processed for latent fingerprints with negative results. The receipt of this piece of wood as well as the report of the examination has been previously furnished to the Commission when the above reports were disseminated. The general appearance of the wood does not indicate whether it is actually part of the window sill or just an extraneous piece of wood that happened to be in this particular location when found. When the results of this inquiry are received, the Commission will be immediately advised.
