Lieutenant Colonel WILEY E. HAVERTY, U.S. Marine Corps, Retired, 32376 Stonington Road, South Laguna Beach, California, furnished the following information:

HAVERTY was the Commanding Officer of the Marine Air Control Squadron 9 (MACS 9) El Toro, California, from November 1, 1959, to January 10, 1960, at which time he was succeeded in command by Lieutenant Colonel REX C. DENNY.

HAVERTY does not recall LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He stated that he did not initiate any investigation of OSWALD and he has no recollection of any interviews or of any investigation which was conducted of LEE HARVEY OSWALD after OSWALD had left the Marine Corps in September, 1959, and had gone immediately to the Soviet Union.

MAURICE ADRIAN HOLDER, 335 Watson Street, Fort Walton Beach, Florida, employed as Assistant Manager, Hardware Department, Sears and Roebuck, Fort Walton Beach, advised that he was the Administrative Officer of Marine Air Control Squad 9 (MACS9), at Santa Ana, California, from sometime in April, 1959 until the end of December, 1959. HOLDER stated that he received his transfer in December, effective January 6, 1960, and departed Santa Ana the latter part of December, 1959. HOLDER stated that he was definitely the Administrative Officer of MACS9 in September, 1959, when LEE HARVEY OSWALD received a General Discharge due, as he now recalls, to a claim of family dependents.

HOLDER stated he has absolutely no recollection of any investigation being conducted regarding OSWALD or any written statements being taken either before OSWALD's discharge or thereafter while he, HOLDER, was still assigned as Administrative Officer of MACS9. HOLDER stated he is positive that there was no court martial proceedings or administrative board regarding OSWALD during the time he was Administrative Officer.

HOLDER stated that Major REX C. DENNY, JR. was the Commanding Officer of MACS9, Santa Ana, California, in September, 1959, when OSWALD received his discharge, and that Major DENNY was still the Commanding Officer at the time he, HOLDER, left Santa Ana on transfer the end of December, 1959. HOLDER stated that he cannot recall a Lieutenant Colonel ORLANDO S. TOSDAL and is certain that Lieutenant Colonel TOSDAL was never the Commanding Officer of MACS9 while he, HOLDER, was assigned to this unit.

HOLDER stated he had no knowledge that OSWALD had gone to Russia following his discharge from the Marine Corps and is certain he had not received such knowledge prior to the time he left Santa Ana the end of December, 1959. HOLDER opined that there could have been an investigation regarding OSWALD after he, HOLDER, left Santa Ana, since he was certain there had been no such investigation prior to his transfer.

Dr. CONTE stated the author of the letter had previously furnished him valuable information. Dr. CONTE, when contacted March 18, 1964, offered to attempt to contact the letter writer in an effort to obtain further details relating to "DUGLAS" and the latter's alleged involvement in the assassination.

On April 17, 1964, Dr. LUIS CONTE AGUERO, 4365 Southwest 2nd Street, Miami, Florida, was reinterviewed for the purpose of arranging contact by him with the letter writer in Cuba, in order that the basis for and additional details of the allegation involving "DUGLAS" could be obtained.

Upon giving further study to the letter containing the allegation concerning "DUGLAS", Dr. CONTE advised that the meaning he obtained from the letter was not that "DUGLAS" assassinated President KENNEDY and that OSWALD and JACK RUBY knew nothing about it, but rather, that "DUGLAS" and OSWALD together committed the assassination and that RUBY was not a figure in the assassination.

Dr. CONTE stated that while the grammar of the letter and its lack of punctuation permitted the original translation that a Mexican named "DUGLAS" was responsible for the assassination and that OSWALD and RUBY knew nothing about it, his understanding of the Cuban vernacular made it clear to him that the translation should be as follows:

"President KENNEDY was killed by a Mexican of the surname 'DUGLAS' and by him who was killed on the day they were taking him to the jail (OSWALD). According to the way FIDEL talked to the Canadians, he (RUBY) who killed one (OSWALD) of the assassins of KENNEDY, knows nothing about the assassination."

Dr. CONTE said in his opinion it could not be concluded from the contents of the letter that the Canadians and the Panamanian mentioned as planning the deaths of President ROBERTO CHIARI of Panama and President ADOLFO LOPEZ MATEOS of Mexico were connected with the assassination of President KENNEDY.

Dr. CONTE stated he will attempt to contact the writer of the letter on his nightly radio program broadcast under the name of "Centinelas de Libertad" (Sentinels of Liberty) over Station WRUL, New York City. He advised that this program is broadcast over the facilities of WRUL under the auspices of Radio Americas from 9:00 to 9:30 P.M., Monday through Saturday. The program can be heard at 1160 kilocycles on the standard broadcast band and in the 49 meter band on short wave. He said his method of obtaining the attention of the letter writer in Cuba will be by use of the letter's code name "X DEL FRAC", which code name the letter writer had furnished in a previous letter to Dr. CONTE. He said he would request the letter writer to furnish additional details relative to the last letter he had written which is the one pertaining to "DUGLAS". He said he would make this radio request on several successive nights. He said that in view of the delays experienced in receiving mail from Cuba, it could not be expected that an answer would be received from the letter writer until possibly a month later. Dr. CONTE stated he would immediately contact the Miami Office of the FBI should he receive a letter in this matter.

SUBJECT: THE PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION

My memorandum of 4-22-64, set forth details concerning the discussion by Malley with J. Lee Rankin wherein Mr. Rankin was advised of the official position of Secret Service Chief Rowley indicating that Oswald would not have been placed under surveillance based on the information that was known concerning Oswald.

On April 24, 1964, while Malley was talking to Mr. Rankin, he inquired whether SAC Robert L. Bouck of the Protective Research Section, Secret Service, had testified before the Commission. Mr. Rankin stated he had testified on April 23, 1964. Rankin did not volunteer any information and was asked whether or not he had stated the position of Secret Service as had been given to the Bureau by Mr. Rowley.

Mr. Rankin stated he would classify Bouck's testimony before the Commission as a "push." He stated that Bouck's testimony before the Commission was heard by Commissioners McCloy, Dulles and Congressman Ford and that he, Rankin, was not present during all of the testimony. Bouck stated that Secret Service had never requested the FBI or any Government agency in writing to furnish any particular type of information to Secret Service. Bouck stated it was sort of an unwritten understanding that all Government agencies would furnish to Secret Service that information which they felt would be beneficial to Secret Service and that it was sort of an unwritten understanding that this type of information would deal with any information where violence was indicated. Bouck, when questioned as to whether Oswald would have been under surveillance on November 22, 1963, in Dallas if information then available had been known to Secret Service, indicated that some action probably would have been taken. Rankin stated the three Commission members present did not "buy" the testimony of Bouck on this point and

definitely felt that Bouck was being evasive and was attempting to look after his own position in Secret Service. Rankin stated the three Commission members gave Bouck a very hard time concerning his testimony. He stated Bouck attempted to say that under certain conditions certain action would have been taken, but when pinned down by the Commission, he became extremely evasive.

Mr. Rankin stated that he does not feel that Bouck furnished to the Commission the official position of Secret Service as indicated by Mr. Rowley and that the Commission definitely feels Bouck's testimony was evasive.

Mr. Rankin advised that at this time he did not know whether further testimony would be taken concerning this matter.

STANLEY ROSS, Editor, "El Tiempo", NYC, on 4/24/64, advised he recalled statements made by him on the Barry Gray Show with PAUL D. BETHEL, Citizens Committee for a Free Cuba, Incorporated, which took place on 2/6/64.

Concerning the statements made by STANLEY ROSS during the course of the program with BARRY GRAY and PAUL BETHEL, ROSS furnished the following information:

He is of the opinion that FIDEL CASTRO is either directly or indirectly responsible for the assassination of President KENNEDY because on or about 11/25/63, one PASCUAL ENRIQUE RUEDOLO GONGORA, Cuban, was detained by INS in New York and through arrangements with the Spanish Consulate in New York, was deported to Spain. ROSS said he had heard of the arrest of RUEDOLO GONGORA and contacted his friend, Mr. GARCIA BANON, the Spanish Consul, who confirmed that RUEDOLO GONGORA had been detained by INS and at the request of unidentified U.S. officials, Spain agreed to accept RUEDOLO GONGORA for return to Cuba. During interview with RUEDOLO GONGORA, the Spanish Consul told ROSS that RUEDOLO GONGORA said that he was one of five or six groups sent to the United States to assassinate

President KENNEDY at the directions of FIDEL CASTRO. RUEDOLO GONGORA was reported to have said that FIDEL CASTRO was fearful that President KENNEDY was trying to assassinate him, and stated that the US had been involved in previous assassinations, such as the assassinations of the husband and brother-in-law, of Madame NHU of Vietnam.

ROSS advised that through his correspondent in Cuba, one ENRIQUE CERVANTES he learned that Cuba would not accept RUEDOLO GONGORA from Spain as Cuba did not want to get involved in the investigation concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY.

Concerning information relative to JACK RUBY being in Cuba subsequent to the break between the US and Cuba, ROSS said he got his information from ROLANDO MASFERRER who had obtained it from Dr. CARLOS MARQUEZ STERLING, who had gotten it in a letter from Cuba. Referenced New York airtel, 4/21/64, set forth information relative to the NYO attempting to locate and interview the original source identified by MARQUEZ STERLING as EVIDIO PEREIRA.

For information of the Bureau, RUEDOLO GONGORA is subject of NY file 105-64311. RUEDOLO GONGORA was deported to Madrid, Spain, on 11/28/63, but was returned to NY and custody of INS on 2/24/64, when Cuba refused to accept him from Spain.

The NYO will review records of INS and determine present location of RUEDOLO GONGORA.

The above information, together with additional facts, will be submitted to the Bureau in a form suitable for dissemination.

Miss M. C. Regan, New York City, directed letter to wife of AG Robert F. Kennedy stating she heard Mr. Paul D. Bethel on radio broadcast, NYC, indicating feeling that assassination of President Kennedy was plot of communists and found it strange that this angle was being played down. He indicated willingness to furnish this and other information to anyone interested. Investigation revealed some statements contributed to Bethel were made by Barry Gray. Stanley Ross, Editor, "El Tiempo," NYC, also appeared on above program. On 4/24/64 Ross furnished information concerning statements made on the program and advised he personally is of the opinion that Fidel Castro is either directly or indirectly responsible for assassination of President Kennedy as Ruedolo Congora, Cuban, had been detained by INS in NYC and deported to Spain and that Spanish Consul, NYC, had told Ross that

CONTINUANCE OF NOTE:

Ruedolo Congora had stated he was one of five or six groups sent to U. S. to assassinate President Kennedy at direction of Castro. Previous investigation concerning Ruedolo Congora revealed he had sent letter to AG Robert Kennedy 10/21/63 of a rambling, critical nature stating "I am tired of asking for my deportation by your brother, the President," and closed by saying "Thank you for my deportation." Investigation further revealed he had previously claimed palpitations of the heart, headaches, a blood condition and a past history of psychiatric care in Cuba as well as arrest on narcotics charge. He also claimed treatment for a venereal disease. INS records also revealed translation of numerous obscene letters criticizing U. S. and expressing a desire to return to Cuba. He was also arrested 10/25/61, NYC, for felonious assault (knife). Ruedolo Congora was deported from U. S. 11/28/63 for Havana, Cuba, via Madrid, Spain, however, was returned to New York in custody of INS 2/24/64 when Cuba refused to accept him from Spain. Investigation, NYC, continuing, however, above action should be immediately taken.

Re Dallas airtel to Bureau, 4/23/64, and letterhead memorandum of Dallas dated 4/21/64, regarding contacts with laundries with respect to laundry mark "90 030", appearing in gray jacket designated K42 (C60).

Review of Dallas file also reveals Laboratory examination made of specimens Q453 through Q474 (C227 through C248), and that white cotton dry cleaner's tags have been sewed to the bottom left shirt tail of specimen Q469 and to the left side pocket of specimen Q465. The numerals "03230" appear on both tags as well as some additional markings which appear to be in Russian. In this respect it is pointed out the Marine Corps Serial Number of OSWALD was "1653230", and it is believed some branches of the military service at one time used the last three or four digits of a serial number preceded by the first initial of the last name as a means of identifying the owner of a particular piece of clothing when cleaned or laundered by or on a military establishment.

The Laboratory is requested to make a re-examination of the laundry marks or cleaning marks mentioned above, making a comparison to determine whether or not such marks could have originated from the same source.

When they were in Moscow, they met Mrs. MARIE HYDE, who presently resides at 401 East Front Street, Port Angeles, Washington. They met at either the National Hotel or the Metropole Hotel, Moscow. Mrs. HYDE indicated that she had flown to Moscow and was desirous of leaving Russia by automobile so that she could see more of the country. KRAMER and NAMAN invited her to accompany them on their tour through Russia by automobile. Mrs. KRAMER advised that Mrs. HYDE's address is current inasmuch as she has been in correspondence with her since returning to this country and was last in touch with her in December, 1963, at the above address.

Mrs. KRAMER consulted her travel notes and advised that the three of them arrived in Minsk, USSR, on August 10, 1961. She recalls visiting the Central Square in Minsk the afternoon that they arrived in that city. Under the circumstances it is impossible for us to take the children traveling, living at hotels and attempting to arrange for their schooling. For these reasons I think you will understand better why I wish to have the boys return to the home. They are more than willing to go since it was their home for the past few years. I would rather they stay there than in some strange boarding school. I must ask you if you will please present these

circumstances with the view of securing a good  
and good result upon them. Consider their  
decision so that the boys may have a  
permanent place of abode in preference  
to moving them from school to school.

A case was submitted by Pastor Nau from Redeemer Church involving a boy 10 years of age, 1 boy 3 years and another 2 years. The mother was married to a Mr. Picot, later married to a Mr. Oswald who has also died. While she has some money left from insurance policies finds it necessary to seek employment and would like to have the children placed in the home. Pastor Nau was informed we could do nothing about the boy 2 years old, but something might be done about the other two children. Matter placed in the hands of the committee with full power to act.

HAUPT CASE: Mr. & Mrs. Haupt requested permission to take their niece 8 years old with them for the Christmas holidays. The mother has given permission. They would like to take the child permanently and Pastor Honold requested they take legal adoption proceedings. The mother is now willing to agree to such proceedings. Another plan was suggested. Foster home arrangements whereby we would release the child to Mr. & Mrs. Haupt and still retain guardianship over her. The mother is willing to agree to such an arrangement, which would have to be worked through the Louisiana Juvenile Court. On motion made seconded and passed the matter left in the hands of the committee with full power to act.

The report was then adopted as a whole.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Superintendent reported no change in the enrollment since last report. Fifty children on roll, forty nine in the home and Leonard King at Austin. Superintendent also advised that all children has been placed in different homes Thanksgiving Day. The Film of the home had been shown in Passcagoula and while the attendance was not very good the collection amounted to \$20.50. Pastor Honold suggested we try and get the parents and relatives of the children to take them from the home during the Christmas Holiday after the Christmas Eve celebration. The matter was left to the discretion of the Superintendent.
