On November 29, 1963, a check of the records of the same law enforcement agencies resulted negatively in locating records under the aliases of OSWALD; that is, ALEK JAMES HIDELL, A. J. HIDELL, and O. H. LEE.

On May 6, 1964, Lieutenant CHARLES SAPP, Intelligence Unit, Miami, Florida Police Department, advised no evidence or indication that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had been in Miami, Florida, or had engaged in any demonstration or was involved in any action to which the police were called had been received or developed by his office. Lieutenant SAPP also advised that no information had come to the attention of his office that a printer in Miami may have printed pro-CASTRO literature for LEE HARVEY OSWALD or for any other individual.

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1.FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned "What Is Really Happening in Cuba," placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. Charles A. Santos-Buch identified himself and Robert Taber as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and Taber obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the afore-mentioned advertisement.

On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. However, during the past year this source observed there has been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that today their influence is negligible.

On May 20, 1963, a second source advised that the National Headquarters of the FPCC is located in Room 329 at 799 Broadway, New York City. According to this source, the position of National Office Director was created in the Fall of 1962 and was filled by Vincent "Ted" Lee, who now formulates FPCC policy. This source observed Lee has followed a course of entertaining and accepting the cooperation of many other organizations including the CP and the SWP when he has felt it would be to his personal benefit as well as the FPCC's. However, Lee has indicated to this source he has no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. Lee feels the FPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cuba and the United States and support the right of Cubans to manage their revolution without interference from other nations, but not support the Cuban revolution per se.

The CP and the SWP have been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450. 23.*

Bureau directed questioning of Miss NAMAN regarding an 8 mm color movie film made by her during her trip to Russia.

Mrs. KRAMER and Miss NAMAN were recontacted and interviewed on 4/28/64 at Solvang, California, and the results of this interview are included in this report, set forth on FD-302's.

Miss RITA NAMAN, 1596 Atterdag Road, Solvang, California, was shown an 8 x 10 color print of a photograph furnished by Mrs. MARIE LORETTA HYDE, which is a picture of the Central Square, Minsk, Russia. Appearing in this picture are Mrs. HYDE, Mrs. KRAMER, another female, a small British car bearing license AGY 815, two men, and a boy. Miss NAMAN furnished the following information concerning this picture:

She has no independent recollection of this picture, but is reasonably certain that she made the picture with Mrs. HYDE's camera since Mrs. HYDE is in the picture. She recalls that Mrs. HYDE had her take several pictures, since Mrs. HYDE wanted to be in the pictures herself.

Miss NAMAN can recall nothing specific concerning this scene. She has a vague recollection that some people were standing near the car on this particular occasion, but cannot identify them further. She has no recollection of speaking to any of these people.

Miss NAMAN recalls specifically that prior to making the tour of Minsk, she was interviewed at her hotel for 15 or 20 minutes concerning possible espionage activity, because she had given an American magazine to a Soviet citizen. She was so unnerved by this incident that she did not take her 8 mm movie camera on this particular trip. The camera was left in their hotel room with no film in it. She and Mrs. KRAMER noted, upon their return to the hotel, that someone had removed the camera from its case and had failed to replace the camera in the case properly.

Mrs. MONICA KRAMER, 1596 Atterdag Road, Solvang, California, was shown an 8 x 10 color print of a photograph furnished by Mrs. MARIE LORETTA HYDE, which is a picture of the Central Square, Minsk, Russia. Appearing in this picture are Mrs. HYDE, Mrs. KRAMER, another female, a small British car bearing license AGY 815, two men and a boy. Mrs. KRAMER advised as follows concerning this picture:

She has no independent recollection of the fact that this picture was made, and has no recollection of the men standing near the car, or that her traveling companion, Miss RITA NAMAN, may have spoken to these men.

Mrs. KRAMER recalled that Miss NAMAN did not take her 8 mm movie camera on this trip in Minsk because she was quite upset over an interview by a Russian official shortly after arriving in Minsk. The camera was purposely left in the hotel room in such a manner that they could tell if it had been moved. They had learned to do this since it was obvious that their personal belongings were being searched each time they left their room. Mrs. KRAMER recalled that when they returned to their room, they noted that the camera had been moved.

1. Re-interview ROBERT J. KAYE, 2116 E. 17th Street, Apartment 9, to clarify the discrepancies in the story told by KAYE to agents of the Phoenix Division as compared with the facts developed by the El Paso Office and set out in this report.

2. Ascertain from KAYE more complete information regarding GLORIA, MIGUEL and RAOUL (possibly RAUL), mentioned in Phoenix report dated January 20, 1964, including exact residence of GLORIA and name and exact whereabouts of small club where GLORIA was employed as an exotic dancer, and furnish same to the El Paso Office.

3. If above leads are not productive, consider setting out a lead for the Los Angeles Office to attempt to identify RAOUL (possibly RAUL), who reportedly worked at the Beverly Hilton Hotel in Hollywood for a number of years as a waiter, in order that RAOUL may be interviewed regarding his knowledge of KAYE's activities in Mexico in the fall of 1963.

EL PASO

AT JUAREZ, CHIHUAHUA, MEXICO

1. Obtain from [REDACTED] any information developed by him regarding the activities of ROBERT J. KAYE in Juarez during the fall of 1963, including KAYE's alleged contact with persons known to KAYE as GLORIA, MIGUEL and RAOUL (possibly RAUL).

2. If identified and located, interview GLORIA, MIGUEL and RAOUL for any information they may have regarding KAYE's activities in Mexico in the fall of 1963.

INFORMANTS

The individual mentioned in the body of this report as having requested that his identity not be divulged is [REDACTED] contacted on April 16, 1964 and May 11, 1964 by SA DONN K. SICKLES.

ADMINISTRATIVE

For the benefit of the Phoenix Office in connection with its re-interview of ROBERT J. KAYE, the following facts are noted, some of which appear to be in conflict with information previously furnished by KAYE as set out in referenced reports:

- 9/25/63 KAYE purchased a 1957 Ford in El Paso in exchange for a 1961 Thunderbird.
- 9/26-27/63 KAYE was registered at the YMCA in El Paso.
- 9/27/63 KAYE purchased a 1956 Oldsmobile in El Paso in exchange for the 1957 Ford.
- 9/29/63 KAYE personally talked to W.H. (BUD) CARLSON in Denver (according to CARLSON).
- 10/1/63 KAYE obtained an automobile permit for his 1956 Oldsmobile to enter Mexico, permit being obtained in Juarez.
- 10/15/63 KAYE's 1956 Oldsmobile departed from the interior of Mexico at Juarez.
- 10/23/63 KAYE sold the 1956 Oldsmobile at El Paso.
- 10/29/63 KAYE obtained a 15 day Mexican Tourist Permit in Juarez (records of Mexican Immigration contain no record to indicate KAYE ever used this permit).
- 11/24/63 KAYE was interviewed by U.S. Secret Service, El Paso.

The investigation in Juarez, Chihuahua, Mexico, was conducted by [REDACTED] except for the check

ROBERT J. KAYE sold a 1961 Thunderbird and bought a 1957 Ford in El Paso, Texas on September 25, 1963. KAYE sold the 1957 Ford and purchased a 1956 Oldsmobile in El Paso on September 27, 1963. KAYE obtained a permit from Mexican Customs, Juarez, Chihuahua, Mexico, on October 1, 1963 to take his 1956 Oldsmobile into the interior of Mexico. KAYE's 1956 Oldsmobile departed from the interior of Mexico on October 15, 1963. KAYE obtained a 15 day Mexican Tourist permit at Juarez on October 29, 1963. Records failed to indicate KAYE used this permit to travel into the interior of Mexico. Alleged acquaintances of KAYE in Juarez, namely GLORIA, MIGUEL and RAOUL, not identified.

DETAILS

AT JUAREZ, CHIHUAHUA, MEXICO

On April 6, 1964, the below listed individuals were contacted and they advised that they had no information in the files of their respective offices identifiable with ROBERT J. KAYE, also known as ROBERT KLONOWSKI, ROMAN BOBBY SOKOLOWSKI:

Detective RAMIRO URIBE, State Judicial Police, Juarez, Mexico.

On April 6, 1964, Miss CONSUELO MALDONADO, Mexican Customs Service, Juarez, was furnished the information that one ROBERT J. KAYE had in his possession as of November 24, 1963 a 15 day Mexican Tourist permit, number 662282, which was supposed to have been issued to him at Juarez on October 28, 1963. Miss MALDONADO stated that she would check the records of her office in an effort to locate additional information regarding this matter.

On April 29, 1964, Miss CONSUELO MALDONADO, mentioned above, stated that she had checked the records of her office and had been unable to locate any 15 day Mexican Tourist permit issued to ROBERT J. KAYE.

On May 8, 1964, Miss CONSUELO MALDONADO, mentioned above, was shown a copy of a 15 day Mexican Tourist permit, number 662282, issued by the Secretaria de Gobernacion of the Mexican Government at Juarez, Chihuahua, Mexico, on October 28, 1963, to ROBERT J. KAYE. KAYE's occupation was listed as mechanic. He was described as 28 years of age, single, a North American. This document contained the entrance date of October 29, 1963, and was stamped to indicate that the bearer of the document traveled by automobile. No return date was stamped on the document.

After viewing the above mentioned document, Miss MALDONADO rechecked the records of her office and ascertained that the above mentioned document was issued to KAYE on October 29, 1963. She said that travelers receive only one copy of a Mexican Tourist permit and that this copy must be turned into the Mexican Immigration authorities at Kilometer 28, south of Juarez, when the traveler returns to the border area. In addition, she pointed out that the traveler must display the Mexican Tourist permit when passing the Mexican Immigration station located at Kilometer 28, enroute to the interior of Mexico. She said that the same procedure was followed

by persons boarding an airplane at the Juarez airport for the interior of Mexico and upon returning to the Juarez airport. Likewise, documents of individuals traveling on Mexican Tourist permits are checked by the railroad authorities and bus lines upon their entry into Mexico and their return to the border area.

Miss MALDONADO indicated that it did not appear as though the above mentioned document was actually ever used by ROBERT J. KAYE. She said that she checked the records of her office and that there is no record to indicate that KAYE had turned in his Mexican Tourist permit upon his return to the border area of Mexico from the interior of Mexico. She pointed out that such entries were made regarding all persons who travel into Mexico and then subsequently return to the border area. She stated that the only way that KAYE could have maintained his Mexican Tourist permit in his possession after returning to the border area from the interior of Mexico was for the Mexican Immigration officer to inadvertently fail to pick up the document from KAYE, unless KAYE was able to illegally depart from Mexico.

Miss MALDONADO checked the records for entries and departures for the periods October 1, 1963 through October 15, 1963 and October 28, 1963 through November 15, 1963 and no record was located regarding KAYE, except for the record mentioned above. She added that the above mentioned permit issued to KAYE listed KAYE's destination in Mexico as Chihuahua, Chihuahua, Mexico.

On April 16, 1964 an individual who requested that his identity not be divulged, but who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that he was not acquainted with an exotic dancer by the name of GLORIA, who was supposed to have been employed in a small club in Juarez during the fall of 1963 and with whom KAYE had claimed contact during his stay in Juarez. This individual indicated that he would check the records of the entertainers' union in Juarez in an attempt to identify the above mentioned individual by the name of GLORIA.

On May 11, 1964 the above mentioned individual indicated that he had checked the records of the entertainers union in Juarez and ascertained that there was a group of about 20 to 25 GLORIAS listed in the records of the entertainers union. He said that he had not been able to ascertain which of these girls had had previous contact with ROBERT J. KAYE in Juarez during the fall of 1963. He said that he was making additional inquiry in order to identify the GLORIA with whom KAYE was in contact.

On May 8, 1964, JOSE DE LA LUZ ARREOLA, Mexican Customs, Juarez, made available the records of his office pertaining to foreign registered automobiles for which permission was granted by the Mexican Government to be taken into the interior of Mexico.

The above mentioned records contained the information that a permit, number 10548, was issued on October 1, 1963, between the hours of midnight and 8:00 a.m. to one ROBERT J. KAYE. This permit was issued on a 1956 Oldsmobile, motor number 596A4713, 1963 Texas license CE 6341. This record indicated that the above mentioned vehicle returned to the border area from the interior of Mexico on October 15, 1963.

In addition, a check was made of the records for the period September 1, 1963, through November 24, 1963, and no other information was located regarding ROBERT J. KAYE.

AT EL PASO, TEXAS

On May 1, 1964, Special Agent in Charge, GEORGE WEISHEIT, United States Secret Service, advised that when he talked with ROBERT J. KAYE on November 24, 1963, KAYE told him that he had obtained the Mexican Tourist permit in his possession from the Mexican Immigration authorities in Juarez. Mr. WEISHEIT said he asked KAYE how KAYE happened to retain the Mexican Tourist permit in his possession and was told by KAYE that KAYE had just failed to turn it into the Mexican Immigration authorities. KAYE indicated to Mr. WEISHEIT

that he had used the above mentioned Mexican Tourist permit in connection with his visit to Mexico City. After talking with KAYE, Mr. WEISHEIT formed the opinion that there was some question regarding KAYE's mental stability.

The following individuals were contacted on the dates noted and they advised that there was no information contained in the files of their respective offices identifiable with ROBERT J. KAYE under the various names used by KAYE:

ROY WILLEM, El Paso County Sheriff's Office, contacted May 5, 1964.

Mrs. WINIFRED FRASER, Office Manager, Traveler's Aid, contacted May 7, 1964.

WILLIAM BOEMPER, Rescue Mission, contacted on May 7, 1964.

Mr. GRANT ^VKIMBALL, YMCA, El Paso, advised that the records of his office reflect that one ROBERT J. KAYE of Denver, Colorado registered at the YMCA on September 26, 1963 and remained at the YMCA during the night of September 27, 1963. He said the record indicated that KAYE resided at 95 South Ogden Street, Denver, Colorado. Mr. KIMBALL said that there was no additional pertinent information in the files of his office regarding the individual by the name of ROBERT J. KAYE, for the period from September 15, 1963 through December 15, 1963.

Mr. ~~BILLIE C. FRAZIER~~, General Sales Manager, Used Car Division, El Paso Ford, 415 Montana, advised as follows:

The records of his office reflect that ROBERT J. KAYE, 95 South Ogden Street, Denver, Colorado, traded in a 1957 Ford, Fairlane, orange over white, 1963 Texas license CF 941, motor number D7DI224947, to El Paso Ford on September 27, 1963 and purchased at the same time from El Paso Ford a 1956 Oldsmobile 93, black, motor number 569A4713. KAYE was allowed \$295.00 on the 1957 Ford and purchased the 1956 Oldsmobile for \$495.00, paying the difference in cash.

On October 23, 1963, KAYE sold the 1956 Oldsmobile back to El Paso Ford for \$75.00. KAYE told Mr. FRAZIER that he needed the money in order to return to Denver, Colorado. In connection with the resale of the 1956 Oldsmobile to El Paso Ford, KAYE listed his name as ROBERT JOSEPH KAYE.

No one accompanied KAYE to El Paso Ford during the transactions that KAYE had with El Paso Ford in connection with the purchase and sale of the above mentioned automobiles. KAYE indicated that he was from Denver, Colorado, but was living at the YMCA in El Paso. KAYE made no mention of any friends in El Paso or Juarez and never gave any indication that he planned to visit Mexico. KAYE made no mention of any employment on his part in the El Paso-Juarez area.

The license number on the 1956 Oldsmobile was 1963 Texas license CE 7341.

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Mrs. MILDRED GLENN, Auto License Bureau, El Paso County, City-County Building, made available the records of her office, which were found to contain the following information:

1963 Texas license CF 941 was registered on January 24, 1963 to a 1957 Ford, four door, motor number D7DT224947, with Sandy's Auto Sales, 1200 E. Paisano Drive, El Paso, being listed as the registered owner of this vehicle.

On October 1, 1963 the ownership of the above mentioned vehicle was transferred from Sandy's Auto Sales to ROBERT KAYE, 415 Montana, El Paso. On December 10, 1963, the ownership of the above mentioned vehicle was transferred from ROBERT KAYE to El Paso Auto Center (El Paso Ford).

Collector's receipt D421574, dated October 1, 1963, reflects that Sandy's Auto Sales sold the 1957 Ford to ROBERT J. KAYE for \$400.00. KAYE's address was listed on the receipt as 415 Montana, the address of El Paso Ford. The collector's receipt reflects that LOUISE UPCHURCH, El Paso Ford, 415 Montana, notarized the sale of the 1957 Ford by Sandy's Auto Sales to ROBERT J. KAYE on September 30, 1963.

Mrs. MILDRED GLENN, mentioned above, stated that the transfer of title of an automobile is not necessarily recorded in the files of her office on the same date that the sale is actually made. She pointed out that the 1957 Ford may have been sold by Sandy's Auto Sales on one date and that the recording of the sale may have occurred on a subsequent date.

Mr. ISIDORE SANDOVAL, owner, Sandy's Auto Sales, 1200 E. Paisano, advised that he sold a 1957 Ford, motor number D7DE224947, to one ROBERT J. KAYE on September 25, 1963 in exchange for a 1961 Thunderbird, Colorado license plates, motor number IY71Z149498. KAYE listed his residence as 95 South Ogden Street, in Denver, Colorado.

KAYE told Mr. SANDOVAL that he had come to El Paso, Texas from Las Vegas, Nevada, where he had lost all of his money. He said that he wanted to sell the Thunderbird because he needed some money. Mr. SANDOVAL gave KAYE \$2300 for the Thunderbird and then KAYE turned around and purchased the above mentioned 1957 Ford from Sandy's Auto Sales for \$700.00.

KAYE contacted Sandy's Auto Sales a day or two prior to the actual purchase of the 1957 Ford. During that period of time, KAYE indicated to Mr. SANDOVAL that he was staying in a motel in El Paso, exact location not stated. KAYE also indicated that he was making trips to Juarez everyday. KAYE did not mention the name of any person or persons with whom he might have had contact in Juarez nor did he indicate the places that he was visiting in Juarez. He did state that he had a girl in Juarez but did not mention her name or furnish any additional information regarding her.

Several days after purchasing the 1957 Ford, KAYE returned to Sandy's Auto Sales. At that time, KAYE had an automobile which he said he had purchased from El Paso Ford. KAYE never returned to Sandy's Auto Sales after the last mentioned occasion. Mr. SANDOVAL had no further pertinent information regarding KAYE or his activities while in the El Paso area.

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On May 6, 1964, Special Agent in Charge, GEORGE WYNSHIELL, United States Secret Service, El Paso, made available a report prepared by the United States Secret Service at Denver, Colorado regarding ROBERT J. KAYE which was found to contain the following information:

KAYE's United States Immigration and Naturalization file A-6208760 reflects that he was born on December 24, 1934 in Khar'kov, Russia, having entered the United States on November 18, 1945 at Portland, Maine
Colo.

KAYE's residence in Denver was listed as 95 South Ogden, and an associate of KAYE was listed as GLENN A. JENKINS, 67 South Ogden, three doors away from the KAYE residence.

Representatives of the United States Secret Service in Denver held lengthy interviews with Mrs. GLENN A. JENKINS on November 29, 1963 and with her husband and Mr. W. H. (BOB) CARLSON on December 1-2-3, 1963, at which time the following information was developed regarding KAYE:
Colo.

GLENN A. JENKINS operated a route under the name Colorado Vending Company in Denver. JENKINS operated this route for the R.F. Jones Company, which was managed by CARLSON, mentioned above.

In June, 1963, KAYE applied for a job and went to work for JENKINS in connection with his vending route.

KAYE left Denver in August or September, 1963, in a 1959 Ford station wagon, and drove to Tulsa, Oklahoma, where he visited Mrs. BESSIE MOYEN, a reported multi-millionaire who had known KAYE's parents in Poland or Germany. Three or four days later KAYE returned to Denver with a 1961 Thunderbird, with Oklahoma license plates which he claimed to have received as a gift from Mrs. BESSIE MOYEN, along with \$5,000.

Mr. J. KAYE

KAYE's wife, Mrs. ALICE KAYE, received a letter from KAYE postmarked September 27, 1963 at El Paso, Texas which contained \$250.00, and an Allstate Insurance policy on the Thunderbird dated August 30, 1963, and a note which stated "be home soon".

KAYE was in Denver on September 29, 1963 and talked with CARLSON on that date. Shortly after October 1, 1963, KAYE left Denver and abandoned his family. Mrs. KAYE did not hear from KAYE for several weeks and then moved to Las Vegas, Nevada where she could be contacted in care of Mrs. ~~SUE~~ KLUKAS, 3815 Nellis Boulevard, Las Vegas, Nevada.

After Mrs. KAYE left Denver, the members of the JENKINS family recalled that a letter or statement was delivered to KAYE's former residence, 95 South Ogden, which apparently had been sent by an optometrist in Fort Worth, Texas. This communication was forwarded to Mrs. KAYE in Las Vegas.

No further information had come to the attention of CARLSON or Mr. and Mrs. JENKINS regarding KAYE.
