REBUREAU TEL CALL FROM SEC CHIEF WM. A. BRANIGAN, ONE THIRTYFIVE PM JUNE TEN, ADVISING THE PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION, BY LETTER JUNE NINE, HAD ADVISED AS FOLLOWS:

"THE COMMISSION WOULD APPRECIATE YOUR INTERVIEWING MR. RATHER TO DETERMINE IF HE DID SEE OSWALD IN THE CAROUSEL CLUB AND THE CIRCUMSTANCE UNDER WHICH SUCH STATEMENT ALLEGED BY KRLD WAS MADE BY HIM.

"AS PROVIDED TO THE COMMISSION, RATHER'S ALLEGED STATEMENT IS QUOTED ON KRLD AUDIO TAPE, REEL FORTYTHREE B, NOV TWENTYFOUR, SIXTYTHREE

DALLAS WAS INSTRUCTED TO ARRANGE TO INTERVIEW RATHER AND COMPLETELY RESOLVE ANY INVESTIGATION INDICATED BY SUCH INTERVIEW.

The plat map was prepared to a scale of 1" equals 10' representing a portion of Dealey Plaza bounded on the north by the Texas School Book Depository and railroad property, on the east by Houston Street, on the south by the Main Street roadway and on the west by the Triple Underpass. Indicated on this plat are street lights, storm basin, trees, concrete pergola and reflecting pool, road signs, curb and traffic lane markings and the 6th floor window in the southeast corner of the Texas School Book Depository, fixed points on the roadway established through observations made from the 6th floor window and from the Zapruder, Nix and Muchmore camera positions, instrument fixes made by the surveyor from a point 39" directly above each of the marked points on the roadway (39" above sea level is the point of bullet entry), tabulations indicate angles and sight distances from each point on the roadway sighted in on the rifle in the 6th floor window and also from the top handrail of the Triple Underpass directly above the window on the Elm Street roadway.

Enlarged copy of tabulation which appears on the surveyor's plat showing elevations, angles, sighting distances and measurements from fixed points along the roadway to the rifle in the 6th floor window and the top of the handrail of the Triple Underpass.

The hearings which included a showing of the movies pertaining to the assassination of President Kennedy continued without recess from 2:00 p. m. until approximately 7:00 p. m. The members of the Commission indicated that the testimony heard was indeed interesting and most helpful to them in better understanding the many "probables" that surround the shooting sequence.

Testimony of Special Agent Shaneyfelt and Special Agent Frazier is being handled in separate memoranda to Assistant Director Conrad.

By letter 6/3/64 the Commission requested that an Agent contact Mr. Burt W. Griffin of the Commission staff so that arrangements could be made to make time computations and obtain blow-ups of a few frames from movie films in the possession of the Commission. These frames show the shooting of Oswald and a clock in the Dallas Police Department Jail Office shortly after the shooting. The Commission is interested in this time study to pinpoint as accurately as possible the time of the shooting of Oswald by Ruby.

ASK HER ABOUT THE ALLEGATIONS RE WHAT COGAR HAD TOLD HER AND WHAT SHE KNOWS OF HIM. DID HE IN FACT TELL HER THAT HE, COGAR, WAS IN DALLAS SHORTLY BEFORE THE ASSASSINATION? DID HE TELL HER THAT HE, COGAR, HAD QUOTE TAKEN TARGET PRACTICE THERE? UNQUOTE. WHAT DID SHE UNDERSTAND COGAR TO MEAN BY THIS? DID SHE SEE A RIFLE WITH A TELESCOPIC SIGHT IN COGAR'S POSSESSION.

HAS SHE SEEN A CONCEALED COMPARTMENT IN COGAR'S SOFA CONTAINING MAGAZINES ABOUT RUSSIA AND PICTURES OF KHRUSHCHEV?

DESPITE THE FACT THAT COGAR IS PROBABLY A MENTAL CASE AS INDICATED BY NINA YEAGER, YOU SHOULD HAVE QUESTIONED HER ABOUT THESE ITEMS. REINTERVIEW HER ALONG THESE LINES.

IN VIEW OF INADEQUACY OF INTERVIEW WITH NINA YEAGER, REREP IS NOT BEING DISSEMINATED TO THE PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION. IMMEDIATELY CONDUCT THE INVESTIGATION OUTLINED ABOVE AND SUBMIT AMENDED PAGES TO REREP SO THAT THIS PHASE OF THE INVESTIGATION MAY BE PROMPTLY FURNISHED TO THE COMMISSION. DALLAS ADVISED BY MAIL.

NOTE: By separate memo it is being recommended that Lettie Jane Cogar be interviewed. PG set forth lead in rerep to interview Dana Cogar but did not specifically state that would question him re his alleged statements about his sister. PG interview of Nina Yeager is inadequate since her in-laws specified 4 specific allegations as indicated in the teletype re Cogar and PG did not apparently ask Mrs. Nina Yeager about any of them. Despite the fact that Nina Yeager described Cogar as a "mental case" she should be asked about the allegations re Cogar.

# No Está Detenido Por el FBI el Supuesto Agente de Fidel Castro

Funcionario del Servicio Secreto Hace Declaraciones a DIARIO LAS AMERICAS. — Habla uno de los Dirigentes del Demócrata-Cristiano. — Detalles de la Denuncia

El FBI anunció a DIARIO LAS AMERICAS en la mañana del martes que el supuesto espiá castrista Fernando Fernández Bárcena, "no estaba detenido por el Buró Federal de Investigaciones".

Esta declaración de la importante agencia investigativa de los Estados Unidos ofrece un nuevo ángulo a la denuncia que dió a la publicidad ayer el dirigente del Movimiento Demócrata Cristiano, Laureano Batista Falla, quien según dijo había entregado al FBI al descubierta agente comunista.

## "HACIENDO INVESTIGACIONES"

A otras preguntas el funcionario del Buró Federal de Investigaciones que recibió al reportero expuso que "se estaban haciendo las investigacio-

nes pertinentes" sobre los hechos denunciados por el Movimiento Demócrata Cristiano.

Interrogado sobre las afirmaciones que al periodista le hiciera ayer el señor Laureano Batista Falla, expresando que el FBI le había informado que "no era delito que agentes castristas espieran a los grupos de exilados cubanos porque solo es delito espionar contra este país y no contra exilados que violan las leyes de neutralidad norteamericanas", el funcionario del FBI con una breve sonrisa, dijo casi sin mover un músculo facial:

"No tenemos nada que comentar sobre eso. Esas son afirmaciones estrictamente personales del Sr. Batista Falla. Agregó con énfasis el funcionario: "Nosotros investigamos a todo el que lesione la seguridad de los Estados Unidos. To-

do el que actúe como agente extranjero es acuciosamente investigado por el Buró Federal de Investigaciones. Los agentes castristas están incluidos plenamente en estas investigaciones. Pero para arrestar a algún acusado de estos delitos tenemos que tener las pruebas necesarias al respecto."

Por su parte, el Sr. Laureano Batista Falla interrogado sobre la liberación del supuesto espía castrista, expresó:

"Dimos suficientes pruebas al FBI para su detención. Pero entre otras cosas se lo entregamos a dicha oficina gubernamental por temor a que los exilados cubanos atentaran contra la vida de Fernando Fernández Bárcena."

Hasta el momento se desconoce el paradero del confeso agente castrista, que en ningún momento fue presentado a la prensa como debió haberse hecho por el Movimiento Demócrata Cristiano.

#### HABLA DIEGO VALERO

Diego Valero, acusado por Fernando Fernández Bárcena, como jefe de la red de espionaje de Castro en Nassau, ha manifestado que no se explica a que se puede deber esta acusación. Valero que trabaja en una compañía inglesa de Nassau tan pronto se enteró de las declaraciones en que se le mencionaba como agente de Castro voló a Miami, para aclarar su situación con los cuerpos de investigación de Estados Unidos.

Diego Valero expresó: "Conoci a Fernández Bárcena hace algunos años, pero no me explico a que se puede deber su acusación contra mi persona. Cuando llegó a Miami estubo en mi casa y lo ayudé en todo cuanto pude." El sábado último cuando estubo en Miami, me visitó en el hotel y aunque me dijo que estaba desencantado de la lucha contra Castro, no tuvo ningún indicio de que fuera a tomar esta determinación. Tampoco, por supuesto, que estuviera al servicio de Castro.

Realmente, agrega Valero, aunque sostenía correspondencia con él como con otros amigos, nunca conocí estas actividades a las que ahora dice en la entrevista que he escuchado haber realizado. Le repito que no me explico esta acusación y si no fuera por el tiempo que me hace perder al venir aquí a Miami para aclararlo todo, la cosa sería para reírme desde ahora hasta el fin de la semana. Creo que la Justicia y la Verdad siempre resplandecen y por eso he pedido a los cuerpos federales de Estados Unidos y me he puesto a disposición de ellos a ese objeto que realicen todas las investigaciones que consideren pertinentes".

#### LA DENUNCIA

MIAMI, sept. 3 (UPI) — La Oficina Federal de Investigaciones interrogaba hoy a un "confeso espía" comunista cubano, que afirma que las actividades subversivas y de espionaje en toda América son dirigidas por los embajadores cubanos en las Naciones Unidas y en Brasil.

Fernando Fernández, joven periodista exiliado, hizo una completa "confesión" de sus presuntas actividades de espionaje en una grabación que entregó al Movimiento Demócrata Cristiano, que dirige Laureano Batista (no está emparentado con el ex-dictador Fulgencio Batista).

En la declaración grabada, Fernández dice que las llamadas fuerzas de Liberación Nacional que actúan en Venezuela, "reciben armas desde México y Cuba, que hacen el transbordo en alta mar".

Añade que la red de la subversión y espionaje se extiende desde los Estados Unidos, hasta las islas Bahamas y el distante Cono Sur sudamericano, y que los dirigentes de la red son "el embajador Carlos Lechuga, anteriormente en México y ahora jefe de la delegación cubana en

las Naciones Unidas, y el recientemente designado embajador en Brasil, Raúl Roa Kouri, hijo del ministro de Relaciones Exteriores de Cuba". Señala que el estratégico "Cono Sur" tiene como dirigente también a un periodista "José Rodríguez Méndez, agregado cultural en la embajada de Cuba en Brasil" y que en las Bahamas "reside el jefe inmediato superior de la red en Miami, nombrado Diego Valero".

Una tarea específica encomendada a Fernández, según de clara, es la de investigar las actividades de los cubanos exilados en Centroamérica. Su objetivo primordial era seguir las actividades de Manuel Artime, uno de los jefes de la malograda invasión de Bahía de Cochinos, y a quien se relaciona con el llamado "Plan Centroamericano".

El Movimiento Demócrata Cristiano en el exilio presentó una carta, que dice fue enviada por Fernández, antes de su detención, al entonces embajador cubano en México, Lechuga en que decía:

"Estoy circunstancialmente infiltrado en un grupo comando que se prepara llevar a cabo una gran operación contra Cuba. Tengo informes detallados sobre el plan militar. El ataque es inminente y parte de Centroamérica..."

Fernández dijo que firmaba esta correspondencia "confidencial" con el seudónimo de Henry Prieto y advirtió que "es vital que, desde ahora, hasta el día 8 de agosto, se mantengan alerta".

Dijo que llegó a los Estados Unidos el 11 de enero de 1961, pero que comenzó a trabajar concretamente en la Red de Espionaje y Subversión desde hace un año, más o menos. El reclutamiento se hizo en Kansas City, Missouri.

En México, añadió, los lugartenientes de Lechuga eran un venezolano, "nombrado Hendel Cruzal, que se ocupa del abastecimiento de la terrorista agrupación comunista llamada Frente de Liberación Nacional." El otro es Sevaldo Anaya, un mexicano."

Señaló que "desde México se envían armas y dinero para los terroristas venezolanos. Las armas se transportan en embarcaciones pesqueras cubanas hasta un punto en alta mar, donde se hace contactos con otras venezolanas y de otras nacionalidades para introducir las clandestinamente en ese país."

Dijo que la consigna de Fidel Castro para los terroristas venezolanos es "una metralleta debajo de cada chaqueta. El agente directo de Castro en Venezuela, es un cubano de apellido Canales."

Manifestó que las embajadas cubanas en México y Brasil, tienen a su cargo, entre otras la expedición de pasaportes y documentos de identificación falsos. Desde esos centros se distribuye el dinero. La Red penetra profundamente en el cono sur, donde el periodista José Rodríguez Méndez, agregado cultural en la Embajada en Brasil, dirige todas las actividades de subversión y espionaje."

La oficina en Miami de la FBI rehusó informar sobre el interrogatorio de Fernández.

# Aboga Fernando Fernández por la Coexistencia con el Régimen Comunista de Fidel Castro

El periodista cubano Fernando Fernández, acusado como espía por el movimiento de exiliados cubanos Demócrata Cristiano, repudió la confesión, tomada en cinta magnética, de sus actividades a favor del régimen comunista de Castro, y alegó que se la habían extraído bajo amenazas y tortura, según declaró a "The Miami Herald".

Fernández aseguró a las autoridades de Miami, que los miembros del Movimiento Demócrata Cristiano lo habían torturado apretándole una cuerda alrededor del cuello y colocándole una pistola en la cabeza para obligarlo a confesar que era un agente castrista.

Los miembros del Movimiento, insisten, sin embargo, que la confesión aludida fue voluntaria por lo que fue llevado al FBI hace cuatro días, y presentado junto con la cinta magnética que registra la confesión aludida Laureano Batista, líder de la organización anticomunista que obtuvo la confesión, declaró que la misma era voluntaria y que no había existido coerción alguna.

Fernández apareció voluntariamente ante los funcionarios de la Sección de Inteligencia de la Policía de Miami, y les aseguró que había sido golpeado y "torturado" a punta de pistola durante doce horas. Pidió que se plantearan acusaciones de secuestro, asalto y maltrato, contra sus supuestos torturadores.

El propio Fernández se clasificó, en lo que se refiere a la política, al decir que "no es antiamericano, ni es anticastrista" y que está en favor de la "coexistencia pacífica con Cuba", a pesar de que llegó a Miami como refugiado en 1961.

Dijo, además, que quería retornar a Cuba para aguantar y sufrir allí con sus padres, su hermana y su tía.

Afirmó que la confesión en cuestión era falsa y que se le había amenazado de muerte si no la ofrecía en esos términos, por lo que las autoridades, des-

pués de escuchar sus acusaciones decidieron elevarlas a la oficina del Fiscal, por si debía iniciarse actuación judicial.

Arthur E. Hutton, auxiliar del Fiscal, dijo el miércoles que había informado a los oficiales de la Inteligencia, que escucharía a Fernández, y luego investigaría para conocer si existió alguna violación de la ley.

Los miembros del Demócrata Cristiano, dicen que Fernández los acompañó a las oficinas del FBI por su propia voluntad. Fer-

nández quedó en libertad el martes.

Los agentes del FBI y los funcionarios de la Inteligencia de Miami, no afirmaron nunca que la confesión fuera verdadera, u obtenida bajo presión, pero sí que se tratará de investigar si el Movimiento tomó la ley en sus propias manos para lograr una confesión.

Batista, afirmó en cuanto a este asunto, que no pensaban continuar con la controversia, pues cumplieron con su deber de entregar a Fernández a la autoridad para que la ley siga su curso.

## DENUNCIA

En una información que publica el Miami News sobre el caso del supuesto espía castrista, se dice que Fernando Fernández, manifestó a la policía de Miami, que sólo había confesado haber realizado trabajo de espionaje para Castro después de 12 horas de ser atormentado por los líderes exiliados del Movimiento Demócrata Cristiano, con una pistola calibre 45 apuntando a su cabeza.

De acuerdo con su vaga exposición, Fernando José Fernández Barcena de 34 años, trató de obstaculizar los planes de los grupos de acción entre los exiliados, para evitar una "masacre".

"Los exiliados no llegarán a ninguna parte en su lucha contra Castro porque no tienen condiciones" resumió Fernández.

Fernández dijo a la policía que durante su alegada ordalía de 12 horas, estuvo sujeto a tortura "física y mental" y finalmente inventó una historia "falaz y exagerada" que fue su "confesión".

Ahora, dijo, "estoy desorientado, y no sé que hacer. Yo quiero volver a Cuba porque yo creo que Fidel permanecerá en el Poder y yo quiero sufrir junto con mi gente".

En la confesión registrada en cinta magnética, que fue entregada al FBI, Fernández decía que se había infiltrado en la CIA tanto como entre los grupos de exiliados y que estaba al borde de ser enviado a Cuba como agente de esa agencia americana.

En su explicación de ayer admitió haber escrito una carta al Embajador Carlos Lechuga, en México, alertándolo de los propuestos planes de ataque de los exiliados.

Dijo además que se había sentido "lleno de ansiedad" cuando levantó sospechas al infiltrarse en el grupo.

HARBERDING was out of city 6/10/64 and could not be located for interview.

Chief of Police Earle Justus of Cahokia advises HARBERDING has resided there 10 or 15 years and claimed to have done undercover work for Narcotics or some other Federal Bureau; that he likes to "play policeman" and recently reported that someone followed his car and "cut him off" on the highway; that a few months ago he gave Chief Justus his version of the Kennedy assassination, stating it was planned and OSWALD was hired to do the job. He said insofar as he knows HARBERDING has no criminal record but is unstable and has had many jobs; that he believes HARBERDING is now working for some furniture company out of Chicago but may have quit that job. No record St. Louis or East St. Louis Police Depts. except for traffic violations in St. Louis.

The JOHN CARR referred to is probably JOHN CARR who owns Coral Court Tourist Cabins, St. Louis County, Missouri, which is where CARL AUSTIN HALL and SANDRA O'DAY spent the night of 10/5/53 prior to moving into Town House, St. Louis, Mo., where HALL was arrested 10/6/53. CARR, who is well known to St. Louis Office,

formerly operated notorious houses of prostitution in St. Louis and is now a wealthy man. He was traveling in the Far East in early part of 1964, visiting Hong Kong, Tokyo and Honolulu, but has probably returned to St. Louis. Many rumors were circulated in 1953 to effect that the missing ransom money disappeared while HALL was at Coral Court; however, investigation indicated HALL had all the ransom money when he moved into the Town House and that SHOULDERS and COSTELLO divided the ransom money in COSTELLO's rathskeller after HALL was arrested during the night of 10/6/53.

On 6/4/64, the SAC received a telephone call from a man who refused to give his name but stated he was an undercover agent for the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). This individual stated that he had knowledge of \$400,000 which was allegedly illegally in the possession of some unnamed racketeer. He further stated that he knew an attorney by the name of RUSSO who is now with the U. S. Department of Justice, but who previously had worked as an attorney for IRS. He stated that Mr. RUSSO had been contacted in regard to this \$400,000 item and had told him to get in touch with the FBI. He was invited to the office but stated he was under surveillance by unnamed individuals and as a result, he would not come to the Federal Building for interview. I stated that I would have him contacted immediately by Agents in this office if he would state his location. At that point, he advised that before he would do anything about arranging a meeting place for interview purposes, he wanted to talk to Mr. RUSSO again, and with that he hung up the phone. He has not contacted this office since that date.

Results of examination:

An examination was made of the cartridge cases, C6, C7 and C38 and the cartridge, C8, for loading, chambering, extraction and/or ejection marks for the purpose of determining if these specimens had been loaded into and extracted from Oswald's rifle, C14, more than once.

Marks were found on the C6 cartridge case indicating that it has been loaded into and extracted from a weapon at least three times. One set of marks was identified as having been made by the magazine follower of the C14 rifle. It is pointed out that the extractor and ejector marks on C6 as well as on C7, C8 and C38 did not possess sufficient characteristics for identifying the weapon which produced them. There are also three sets of marks on the base of this cartridge case which were not found on C7, C8, C38 or any of the numerous tests obtained from the C14 rifle. It was not possible to determine what produced these marks.

Marks were found on the C7 cartridge case indicating that it has been loaded into and extracted from a weapon at least twice. One set of marks was identified as having been produced by the chamber of the C14 rifle and one set of marks was identified as having been produced by contact with the bolt of C14; however, it was not possible to determine whether the two sets of marks which were identified were produced by one or two loading operations in the C14 rifle.

Two sets of marks were found on the C8 cartridge (found in the C14 rifle) which were identified as having been produced by the magazine follower of the C14 rifle. Another set of follower marks was found on C8. The fragmentary nature of this set of marks could possibly account for the fact that these marks were not identified with the C14 rifle.

Marks were found on the C38 cartridge case indicating that it had been loaded into and extracted from a weapon at least twice. One set of marks was identified as having been produced by the magazine follower of the C14 rifle and one set of marks was identified as having been produced by the chamber of C14; however, it was not possible to determine whether the two sets of marks which were identified were produced by one or two loading operations in the C14 rifle.

The results of the above examinations do not preclude the possibility that these items could have been loaded into and extracted from a weapon one or more times when insufficient force was used to produce marks. It is pointed out that if two or more cartridges are loaded into the clip of C14, only the bottom cartridge will be marked by the magazine follower.

Special Agents (SA) John Lester Quigley, James Patrick Hosty, Jr., and former SA John W. Fain testified before the President's Commission on 5/5/64 in connection with their knowledge and handling of the Lee Harvey Oswald investigation.

On 5/8/64 the President's Commission furnished the Bureau with a transcript of testimony covering Agents Quigley and Hosty and Mr. Fain. The testimony was reviewed at Seat of Government and certain minor errors were detected in the testimony, such as misspelled words, erroneous punctuation and the like. These errors were brought to the attention of the President's Commission by Inspector J. R. Malley on 5/14/64. SAs Quigley and Hosty and former SA Fain have personally not examined the transcripts of their testimony before the President's Commission. Each had left Washington, D. C., and returned to their home residence prior to the date the transcripts were furnished to the Bureau. In view of the Commission's desire to have individuals who testified before the Commission review their transcript to insure their accuracy, it appears it is desirable that copies of the transcripts of SAs Quigley and Hosty and Mr. Fain be forwarded to them in order that they can review them. This will insure that the Commission will have an accurate record of exactly what each of these men had testified to and will give each of these men an opportunity to review the testimony that will be made a permanent part of the Commission's records relating to each.

ACTION:

Attached for approval is an airtel to the Dallas, New Orleans and Houston Offices forwarding a copy of the transcript of SA Hosty, SA Quigley and Mr. Fain, respectively, for their perusal and comments. We are instructing that any changes deemed necessary be furnished the Bureau immediately in order that consideration can be given to discussing such changes with the President's Commission.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

"Life" Magazine of February 21, 1964, sets forth an article entitled "The Evolution of an Assassin." In this article, on page 69 of the "Life" Magazine, there are reflected the results of an interview with Mrs. CLYDE LIVINGSTON, a former teacher of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, at the Ridglea West Elementary School. On the same page of this article there is also reflected an interview with RICHARD GARRETT, described as a former classmate of LEE HARVEY OSWALD in elementary school.

On June 4, 1964, Mrs. CLYDE I. LIVINGSTON, 7304 Pensacola, Fort Worth, Texas, furnished the following information:

During the period of 1949 through 1951, she was a teacher at the Ridglea West Elementary School in Fort Worth, Texas. She was the home room teacher for the fourth grade during the school year of 1949-1950. During this time, LEE HARVEY OSWALD was a student in the fourth grade and was in her home room. She also taught music to the fifth grade during the term of 1950-1951, and believes she did teach music to LEE HARVEY OSWALD while he was in the fifth grade, but she does not recall anything concerning OSWALD while he was in the fifth grade.

At the beginning of the school term in September 1949, LEE HARVEY OSWALD entered this school with a group of all new students as this was the first year this elementary school was in operation. He was a quiet and rather shy type of student, did not know any of the other students, and it took him a long time to get acquainted with the other students. She also recalled that LEE HARVEY OSWALD was a very poor student in the beginning of the fourth grade as he could not read and his spelling

was very poor. Mrs. LIVINGSTON spent a great deal of her spare time in helping LEE HARVEY OSWALD with his spelling. He did not mind the extra work and his attitude was good in learning to spell. He became a fairly good student while in the fourth grade and never gave her any trouble. At times he was very quiet and was not an aggressive type in making friends with the other students in the school.

At Christmas of 1949, LEE HARVEY OSWALD gave Mrs. LIVINGSTON a puppy as a Christmas present. After that, he would drop by the home of Mrs. LIVINGSTON to see this puppy, and talk with Mrs. LIVINGSTON and her family. He usually stayed for only a short period of time. She recalled that LEE HARVEY OSWALD appeared to be a lonely type of boy, and that his mother was employed while he was in the fourth grade of this school. He remarked one day that he had to fix his own lunch, and she asked him if there were anyone at home to help him prepare his lunch or his meals. He told her there was no one at home and he could open a can of soup as well as anyone else. She stated to the best of her knowledge she never saw Mrs. OSWALD at this school and did not meet any other members of the family, although she knew LEE did have two brothers. She stated LEE HARVEY OSWALD never gave her any serious trouble while he was a student in her room.

On June 5, 1964, RICHARD WARREN GARRETT, 4928 Penrose, Fort Worth, Texas, furnished the following information:

GARRETT attended Ridglea West Elementary School during the fourth, fifth and sixth grades. He recalled being in a room at this school with LEE HARVEY OSWALD, but he does not recall whether it was in the fourth or fifth grade. He stated they were about ten or eleven years of age. During this school year, he played with LEE HARVEY OSWALD a great deal at the school and sometimes they would walk home from school and play together. He only knew OSWALD during the fall and spring semesters of this one school year. LEE HARVEY OSWALD was easy to get along with at that time, and he considered him a perfectly normal boy. He recalls on one occasion they did have a disagreement on some matter and he believed they had a short fight, but he does not
