Analysis of the disease and general anamnesis

Attila with complaints about suppuration from the right ear and weakening in hearing. The ears have ached since childhood. At the age of 10-12 an eurytomy of the left ear was performed. The right ear periodically became inflamed. Was under observation of a laryngologist. During the last 10 days the suppuration from the ear increased. He called on a laryngologist and was sent to the laryngol. hospital for treatment.

He does not mention any previous diseases (one word missing) and denies having had any venereal diseases.

DONALD JACKSON, Reporter, "Life" magazine, advised that he did not personally interview ALLEN FELDE in connection with an article he wrote in the 2/21/64, issue of "Life" wherein FELDE, a Marine Corps associate of OSWALD, remarked on the latter's behavior while in the U. S. Marine Corps.

DETAILS:

On June 23, 1964, Mr. DONALD JACKSON, Reporter for "Life" magazine, was interviewed at his parents' residence where he is temporarily staying at 532 Maple, San Mateo, California, and furnished the information set forth below to SAs DOUGLAS G. ALLEN and JOHN P. MC HUGH:

JACKSON stated that he was the author of an article regarding LEE HARVEY OSWALD which appeared in "Life" magazine in its edition of February 21, 1964, indicating that OSWALD attended boot training and advanced infantry training with one ALLEN FELDE in 1956 in the U. S. Marine Corps at Camp Pendleton, California.

In the above-mentioned article, according to JACKSON, certain remarks regarding OSWALD's behavior in the Marine Corps were attributed to FELDE.

JACKSON advised that while he personally interviewed many individuals who are quoted in instant article, he did not personally interview ALLEN FELDE in connection with the article's preparation. He advised that his best recollection at the present time is that he secured the material regarding FELDE from an "Associated Press" story date lined Milwaukee, Wisconsin, which appeared in the "New York Times" three or four weeks following the assassination of JOHN F. KENNEDY.

Synopsis:

CLEARY F'PIERE, Assistant Professor, Language Department, The College of Steubenville, Steubenville, Ohio, was employed by Travelers Aid Society at New York City during 1959-1960. In 1962 he was employed at Elizabeth City State College, Elizabeth City, North Carolina, and visited the Travelers Aid Society (TAS) office, New York City, in June, 1962, exact date not recalled. While there he was asked by Mrs. EDNA NORMAN, TAS Supervisor, to assist her, as no one else was available. F'PIERE then took subject and subject's wife and child by taxicab from TAS office to Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) office in downtown New York City, waited for them, and then returned them by taxicab to TAS office. F'PIERE was with OSWALDs from about 1:00 PM to about 4:30 PM on that day, which was day of OSWALD's arrival by ship from Russia. Mrs. OSWALD did not speak English. F'PIERE did most of talking with OSWALD, asking OSWALD when he married Russian girl and how he got out of Russia. OSWALD told him he had to stay in Russia two years before being allowed to leave with wife, and was in U. S. to remain permanently. He asked OSWALD how he was able to travel to Russia, and OSWALD told him he went there from place where discharged from U. S. Army in Europe, but didn't say where he was stationed.

OSWALD during the conversation with F'PIERE, did not mention he had served as guard at the American Embassy in Russia or that he had been kidnaped by Communist agents. F'PIERE doesn't know NERIN' E. GUN and is not familiar with GUN's book, "The Red Roses of Dallas."

DETAILS

On June 19, 1964, the New York Office advised that JAMES JOSOFF, Public Relations Director, Travelers Aid Society, New York City, furnished information that CLEARY F'PIERE, a former TASS employee who had contact with OSWALD, recently accepted a teaching position at a college in Steubenville, Ohio, identity of college not known, after employment as a teacher at Elizabeth City State College, Elizabeth City, North Carolina.

The following investigation was conducted by SA EMIL E. HOPKINS on June 19, 1964, at Steubenville, Ohio:

Mr. **CLEARY F'PIERE**, Assistant Professor, Language Department, The College of Steubenville, Steubenville, Ohio, advised as follows:

In 1962 he was employed as a Professor at Elizabeth City State College, Elizabeth City, North Carolina. He had previously been employed from 1959 to September, 1960, by the Travelers Aid Society (TAS) at New York, New York. In June, 1962, exact date not recalled, he was visiting New York City and stopped at the TAS headquarters, 204 East 39th Street, New York City, to visit with employees. While there, at about 1:00 PM, Mrs. **EDNA 'NORMAN**, Supervisor, TAS, asked if he would assist her since no one else was available to help. She asked him to take a man, his wife, and their baby from the TAS office to the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) office, which is located in downtown New York City. This man was **LEE HARVEY OSWALD**.

Mr. **F'PIERE** recalled that **OSWALD's** wife could not speak English, speaking only Russian. **F'PIERE** spent more time with **OSWALD** than did anyone else at the TAS, since he was with **OSWALD** and **OSWALD's** wife and child from about 1:00 PM until about 4:30 PM on the day **OSWALD** arrived in New York City by ship from Russia. During this contact he engaged in conversation with **OSWALD**.

Mr. **F'PIERE**, with **OSWALD**, Mrs. **OSWALD**, and their child, went from the TAS office to INS by taxicab, and, after **OSWALD** completed his business at INS, **F'PIERE** brought them back to the TAS office by taxicab. **F'PIERE** stated that his conversation with **OSWALD** was primarily of a philosophical nature and that he, **F'PIERE**, did most of the talking. He asked **OSWALD** why he married a Russian girl, and **OSWALD** answered by asking why **F'PIERE** had married his wife. He asked **OSWALD** how he was able to marry a Russian girl and get out of Russia, since he had heard

that Russians were not allowed to leave Russia. OSWALD told him that he had to stay in Russia for about two years before he was allowed to bring his wife out of the country. OSWALD also told him he was returning to the U. S. to remain here permanently.

Mr. F'PIERE asked OSWALD how he was able, as a citizen of the U. S., to travel to Russia, stating that he understood the U. S. Government did not allow such travel. OSWALD told him that he was serving in the U. S. Army in Europe and received his discharge while in Europe; that he had traveled to Russia from the location where he was stationed in Europe after his discharge, but OSWALD did not say where in Europe he was stationed.

Mr. F'PIERE stated that at no time during the conversation did OSWALD mention that he had served as a guard at the American Embassy in Russia, or that he had been kidnaped by Communist agents. He asked OSWALD how he could, after having been raised in the U. S., believe in the ideologies of Communism. He recalled that in answer to this question OSWALD said that on arriving in the U. S. he had to worry about such things as taxi fare and high rent, whereas while in Russia he did not have to pay high rent, etc. F'PIERE pointed out to OSWALD that the theories of Communism sounded good on paper, but were not workable in practice, but OSWALD indicated he felt they were workable.

Mr. F'PIERE stated it seemed to him that OSWALD did not know what to think and was "lost," that is, did not know in what direction he was headed in life.

Mr. F'PIERE said he had recognized OSWALD's picture after OSWALD's arrest for the assassination of President KENNEDY and felt somewhat guilty because he had assisted OSWALD in a small way on OSWALD's return to the U. S., that is, had taken OSWALD to the INS office in New York City.

Mr. F'PIERE does not know what transpired at INS after he took OSWALD there. He recalled that a man who had the features of a native of the Philippine Islands, and whose name he does not recall, if he ever knew it, took OSWALD into an office at INS, F'PIERE remaining in the waiting room area of INS until OSWALD returned.

Mr. F'PIERE reiterated that OSWALD never mentioned having served as a guard at the U. S. Embassy in Russia and never said anything about having been kidnaped by Communist agents. F'PIERE does not know NERIN E. GUN and is not familiar with his book, "The Red Roses of Dallas."

Dear Mr. Rankin:

There are enclosed two copies of a Department of State, Office of Security, report in the Lee Harvey Oswald case dated June 9, 1964, at Caracas, Venezuela, dealing in part with reinterview of Mr. and Mrs. Juan M. De Cuba. The De Cubas were fellow passengers of Oswald on the buses of the Transportes del Norte line from Mexico City, Mexico, to Laredo, Texas, on October 2 and 3, 1963. The De Cubas were reinterviewed at our request.

The enclosed report also makes reference to the Muracciole sisters, formerly of Caracas, Venezuela, who are said to presently reside in Mexico City, Mexico.

In light of recent developments which have established that Oswald departed from Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, on October 3, 1963, by Transportes del Norte bus and as the Muracciole sisters departed from Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, on October 3, 1963, by air en route to Caracas, Venezuela, we do not intend to conduct further inquiry to locate and interview them.

Reference is made to our letter dated June 23, 1964 advising that we were checking the Dallas newspapers from October 1, 1963, to November 22, 1963, to ascertain if there was an article in a Dallas newspaper which indicated that Mr. Richard M. Nixon planned a trip to Dallas during such period.

We have determined that the "Dallas Times-Herald" for November 21, 1963, and the "Dallas Morning News" for November 22, 1963, both carried articles indicating Mr. Nixon was in Dallas on November 21, 1963, for business reasons. Two copies of each of these articles are enclosed for the information of the Commission.

We have now reviewed all the Dallas newspapers for the period January 1, 1963, to November 22, 1963, except for the period May 15, 1963, to October 1, 1963, when Oswald was not a resident of the Dallas area. We have located no articles indicating Mr. Nixon planned a trip to Dallas during the afore-mentioned period except for the two articles mentioned above.

This concludes our inquiries in this particular matter.

NOTE: Marina Oswald has indicated Oswald planned to attack Mr. Nixon approximately 2 weeks after General Walker incident which occurred 4-10-63. We previously reviewed all Dallas newspapers from 4-63 to 5-15-63 and found no record of a planned trip to Dallas by Mr. Nixon. The Commission on 6-19-64 indicated Rosemary Woods, Secretary to Mr. Nixon, reportedly possessed a clipping which indicated Mr. Nixon planned a trip to Dallas in 10-63. We contacted Mr. Nixon's office and ascertained that Miss Woods did not have the article in question but she believed such article did appear in a Dallas newspaper. We checked Dallas newspapers for the period October and November 1-22, 1963 as described herein. The only trip to Dallas planned by Mr. Nixon appears to be the November 21-22 trip which we have previously noted and so advised the Commission.

RE EFFORTS TO LOCATE PAULA RUSIONI

Enclosed are two portions of Transportes del Norte (TDN) ticket No. 9511, covering travel from Mexico, D. F., to Monterrey, N. L. (Nuevo Leon), and from Monterrey, N. L., to Laredo, Texas. According to TDN records, these tickets were utilized by PAULA RUSIONI to travel on TDN bus No. 332 which departed Mexico City at 8:30 a.m. on 10/2/63 and arrived at Monterrey at about 9:30 p.m., the same date. Travel from Monterrey to Laredo was performed on TDN bus No. 373 which departed Monterrey shortly thereafter and arrived at Laredo about 2:00 a.m., 10/3/63.

Reference is made to Buairtel to San Antonio 5/20/64 and to San Antonio airtel to the Bureau 5/26/64.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JOSEPH S. LEO at Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico:

On 6/1/64 RAMON TREVINO QUEZADA, General Manager, Transportes del Norte Bus Line, Heroes Poniente No. 271, Monterrey, advised as follows:

The name PAULA RUSIONI does not appear on any of the passenger lists maintained by that bus line at Monterrey. He was not acquainted with any person so named.

The Greyhound Bus Lines office at Laredo, Texas, regularly issues Transportes del Norte bus tickets to persons purchasing tickets in Laredo for travel to Mexico. It does not issue Greyhound tickets for such travel. Through an agreement between the two companies, Greyhound Bus Lines receives a ten per cent commission on each Transportes del Norte ticket sold by it.

Ordinarily, the Greyhound office at Laredo, Texas, is the only one authorized to issue Transportes del Norte tickets, whether a Greyhound ticket was previously involved or not. However, on special occasions the Greyhound office at San Antonio, Texas, may issue Transportes del Norte tickets to members of an excursion group proceeding from that city to Mexico. Special arrangements must be made with Transportes del Norte in such instances.

When arrangements for travel to Mexico are made at Greyhound Bus Lines offices in other parts of the United States, that company issues its own (Greyhound) ticket. When the passenger arrives in Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, Mexico, the pertinent portion of his ticket is exchanged for a Transportes del Norte ticket authorizing travel on that bus line in Mexico. Subsequently, Transportes del Norte notifies Greyhound of the exchange and it is remunerated by Greyhound to the extent that the passenger traveled on that bus line in Mexico.

The same procedure is followed at Transportes del Norte offices in Mexico when it issues its own tickets to purchasers there for travel in the United States. The pertinent portion of the Transportes del Norte ticket is exchanged at the United States border for a Greyhound ticket, and Transportes del Norte later reimburses Greyhound to the extent the passenger traveled on that bus line in the United States.

Ticket No. 39532, believed to have been purchased by PAULA RUSIONI, was a Transportes del Norte ticket sold at the Greyhound Bus Lines office at Laredo, Texas, on 9/10/63. According to PEDRO MOLINA P., Manager, Transportes del Norte office at Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, Mexico, that ticket was a two-portion ticket authorizing travel from Laredo, Texas, to Mexico, D. F., and from Mexico, D. F., to Laredo, Texas. The proper ticket for such travel should have been a four-portion ticket authorizing travel from Laredo, Texas, to Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico; Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, to Mexico, D. F.; Mexico, D. F., to Monterrey, Nuevo Leon; Monterrey, Nuevo Leon,

to Laredo, Texas. When the ticket agent at the Transportes del Norte office in Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, noticed ticket No. 39532 had been issued in only two portions, he took it from the passenger and exchanged it for Transportes del Norte ticket No. 9511, which was of the proper four-portion type, on 9/11/63.

The above is all the information furnished by Mr. RAMON TREVINO QUEZADA, who had previously furnished tickets of all passengers utilizing bus No. 332 from Mexico City to Monterrey and bus No. 373 from Monterrey to Nuevo Laredo and Laredo.

With regard to the tickets utilized by PAULA RUSIONI and transmitted herewith as enclosures, it is noted that each ticket bears the printed word "canje" (exchange). The front side of each ticket, immediately below the destination, bears the word "regreso" (return). It is noted that on the front side of each ticket in the space designated for the price there appears the number 39532. As the Bureau has been previously advised, TDN officials advise that this is the number of the ticket for which ticket No. 9511 was exchanged.

On the Mexico, D. F. - Monterrey, N. L., portion of the ticket it is indicated that the holder of the ticket occupied seat 7. The TDN manifest for this portion of the trip indicates that PAULA RUSIONI was assigned this seat.

Both portions of the ticket on the reverse side bear the words "redondo, N. Laredo-Mexico" (round trip, N. Laredo-Mexico). The Mexico, D. F. - Monterrey, N. L., portion on the reverse side has the words "tercer cupon" (third coupon) and the Monterrey, N. L. - Laredo, Texas, portion bears the words "cuarto cupon" (fourth coupon). This would indicate that the above-mentioned explanation of Mr. TREVINO QUEZADA is the correct one in that apparently a four-portion ticket was issued to cover travel from Laredo, Texas, to Mexico City and return to Laredo.

It is also noted that both portions of the ticket on the reverse side bear partial rubber stamp impressions which appear to read "Transportes del Norte, Sep 11 63, N. Laredo, Tamps." This would apparently indicate that TDN ticket No. 9511 was issued by the TDN office in Nuevo Laredo rather than by the Greyhound office in Laredo even though San Antonio airtel of 5/26/64 indicates that Greyhound records in Laredo reflect that TDN ticket bearing No. 9511 was issued by Greyhound in Laredo as a one-way ticket to Mexico City on 12/7/63.

Inasmuch as the purpose of this inquiry is to develop leads enabling us to locate and interview PAULA RUSIONI, the above information has not been set forth suitable for dissemination. Investigation to date in Mexico has failed to result in the obtaining of any information which would lead to the location of RUSIONI. This in itself seems most unusual in that if she were a non-Mexican citizen and actually departed Mexico at Nuevo Laredo on 10/3/63 her name should appear on the forms FM-11 covering departure at Nuevo Laredo on that date. The same should be true even though she were a Mexican citizen; however, the Bureau is aware of the fact that forms FM-11 are not as closely maintained by the Mexican Immigration authorities on Mexican citizens departing and entering Mexico. A double check has been made in that central records of INS have been checked and no information was found indicating that she entered the United States as a non-U.S. citizen.

REQUEST OF BUREAU

The Bureau is requested to forward the two portions of the TDN ticket No. 9511 to the San Antonio Office for the purpose of possibly assisting that office in conducting investigation at Laredo and Nuevo Laredo. When investigation has been completed, it is requested that the two portions of the ticket be returned by the San Antonio Office to the Bureau for forwarding to the Mexico City Office inasmuch as TDN officials in Monterrey have requested the return of the tickets after they have served their purpose.

If it has not already been done, it is suggested that the name of PAULA RUSIONI be checked in the files of the Identification Division in an effort to obtain background and identifying information concerning her.
