The following pertains to the activities of captioned organization during 1963 in Puerto Rico:

Contact with confidential sources during 1963, who have furnished reliable information in the past, has revealed there was no known activity on the part of the captioned organization in Puerto Rico during that period.

On March 23, 1964, a confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, revealed that captioned organization had appointed two individuals to represent them in Puerto Rico. They are Manuel Martinez, 587 Pereira Leal, and Jesus Martinez, 402 Apeninos, both in Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico. These individuals were not known to be connected with this organization during 1963.

Synopsis: On 5/1/64, WILSON appeared before USDC Judge ABRAHAM LINCOLN MAROVITZ, Northern District of Illinois, Chicago, at which time, based on psychiatric report furnished by Medical Center for federal persons, Springfield, Missouri. Judge MAROVITZ ordered that WILSON was competent, at this time, to understand the nature of the proceedings against him and to assist his counsel in his defense. On 5/5/64, WILSON appeared before USC, Chicago, at which time charges against WILSON were dismissed at government request. WILSON will return to Venice, California to reside with relatives and is prepared to undertake psychiatric treatment as out patient at Agnews State Hospital, San Jose, California.

DETAILS: AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

On May 1, 1964, WILSON appeared before United States District Court Judge ABRAHAM LINCOLN MAROVITZ, Northern District of Illinois, at Chicago, Illinois. Based on the psychiatric report furnished by the Medical Center for federal persons at Springfield, Missouri, Judge MAROVITZ entered an order stating that WILSON was, at this time, competent to understand the nature of the proceedings against him and to assist his counsel in his own defense.

Judge MAROVITZ at this time was advised by Assistant United States Attorney JAMES B. SLOAN that the United States Government planned to dismiss the charges against WILSON.

At the request of United States Attorney EDWARD V. HANRAHAN, a meeting was held in the Judge's chambers with WILSON, Assistant United States Attorney SLOAN, Judge MAROVITZ and WILSON's attorney RAYMOND SMITH.

During this meeting it was determined that 1. WILSON planned to leave for Venice, California, as soon as possible, where he planned to reside with his father, LLOYD A. LONG, at 1926 Pen Mar Avenue, Venice, California. 2. WILSON would undertake psychiatric treatment as an out patient at the Agnews State Hospital, San Jose, California. LLOYD A. LONG, in a written communication had advised of his willingness and desire to have WILSON reside with him in his home. LONG in addition, furnished funds sufficient for the purchase of an air line ticket for WILSON from Chicago to California.

Another communication, brought forth information from Dr. WALTER RAPPAPORT, Superintendent and Medical Director Agnews State Hospital, San Jose, California, to the effect that WILSON would be accepted as an out patient and would receive psychiatric treatment at that institution.

On May 1, 1964, at 2:00 PM, WILSON appeared before United States Commissioner C. S. BENTLEY PIKE, Chicago, at

which time his hearing was continued to May 5, 1964.

On May 5, 1964, at the request of Assistant United States Attorney JAMES B. SLOAN, a complaint charging WILSON with threats to President JOHNSON was dismissed in the interest of justice.

On May 5, 1964, at 3:00 PM, ALLOYD JOHN WILSON appeared at the offices of the FBI, Chicago, where he requested the return of certain personal effects which had been in his possession on December 19, 1963. WILSON was advised that the FBI did not have possession of these effects and that all property belonging to him had been turned over to the Chicago Police Department at the time of WILSON's arrest by the Police Department on December 19, 1963. WILSON was afforded transportation to Chicago Police Department Headquarters, 1121 South State Street, Chicago, Illinois, in order that he might claim his effects believed to be held at that location.

Synopsis: On 1/9/64, U. S. District Judge ABRAHAM L. MAROVITZ ordered psychiatric examination of subject WILSON to be conducted by WILLIAM H. HAINES, M.D., Director of Behavior Clinic, Criminal Court of Circuit Court of Cook County. HAINES found subject able to understand nature of proceedings and capable of assisting in his own defense. On 1/16/64, Judge MAROVITZ directed Assistant U. S. Attorney JAMES B. SLOAN, Chicago, to prepare order reflecting psychiatric evaluation that subject was competent to stand trial. On 1/17/64, after reading psychiatric report in full, Judge MAROVITZ directed that subject be furnished complete psychiatric examination at Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, Springfield, Missouri. Psychiatric examination at Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, Springfield, Missouri, reflects subject able to understand charges against him and to assist counsel in his defense. Neuropsychiatric staff examination of WILSON at Medical Center for Federal Prisoners set forth.

DETAILS: AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

On January 17, 1964, SA JOSEPH NOONAN, Secret Service, Chicago, Illinois, advised as follows:

On January 3, 1964, LLOYD JOHN WILSON appeared before Judge HARRY CAMERFORD, Branch 42A, Municipal Court, Chicago, Illinois. Judge CAMERFORD dismissed the local charge of disorderly conduct against WILSON in favor of the federal charge of threatening President LYNDON B. JOHNSON. On this same date, WILSON was taken before United States Commissioner C. S. BENTLEY PIKE, Chicago, at which time his attorney, RAYMOND SMITH, requested a hearing. WILSON was held in custody in lieu of \$25,000 bond, and the date for his hearing was set as January 10, 1964. =

On January 9, 1964, Assistant United States Attorney JAMES B. SLOAN, Chicago, appeared before United States District Court Judge ABRAHAM L. MAROVITZ to request a sanity hearing for WILSON. Judge MAROVITZ directed that WILSON be given a psychiatric examination by WILLIAM H. HAINES, M.D., Director of Behavior Clinic for the Criminal Court of the Circuit Court of Cook County. Judge MAROVITZ set January 16, 1964 as the date when this psychiatric examination report would be submitted.

On January 16, 1964, Judge MAROVITZ received the report of Dr. HAINES. Dr. HAINES, in his report, set forth that he did not have the benefit of any prior psychiatric examinations of WILSON and was unacquainted with the background of this subject. Dr. HAINES further made clear that his examination of WILSON was confined specifically to two questions: 1) Is WILSON able to understand the nature of the legal proceedings and the charge placed against him? and 2) Could WILSON properly assist in his own defense and cooperate with his counsel? Dr. HAINES' report reflects

that his examination indicated to him that WILSON is capable of: 1) Understanding the nature of the proceedings, and 2) To properly assist in his own defense and cooperate with his counsel.

Based on this report, Judge MAROVITZ directed Assistant United States Attorney SLOAN to prepare an order reflecting the results of the above examination.

On January 17, 1964, before Assistant United States Attorney SLOAN had completed the drafting of the order mentioned above, Judge MAROVITZ took the opportunity to read in its entirety the psychiatric report on WILSON both from Dr. HAINES and also reports of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and a [REDACTED] an associate of [REDACTED] According to Assistant United States Attorney SLOAN, these reports contain [REDACTED] opinion that WILSON's mental status is [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] This report was dated December 20, 1963 and was a result of a psychiatric examination ordered by the Municipal Court of Chicago following the subject's arrest on December 19, 1963. Attached to the same report was a supplemental wherein [REDACTED] an associate of [REDACTED] reflected that following his examination of WILSON on December 21, 1963 he diagnosed WILSON as [REDACTED]

On this same date, Judge MAROVITZ ordered that WILSON be transported forthwith to the Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, Springfield, Missouri, at which location he was to undergo a psychiatric examination to determine his ability to stand trial. Judge MAROVITZ indicated at the time of this order that Dr. HAINES' report had made it clear that Dr. HAINES had no background information on WILSON at the time of his examination, and he therefore felt that

Dr. HAINES' examination did not sufficiently settle the subject's mental condition in order that the Court could make a judicial decision as to WILSON's sanity.

On April 8, 1964, Assistant United States Attorney JAMES B. SLOAN advised SA DENNIS W. SHANAHAN that he had received no information to date concerning the subject's mental examination at Springfield, Missouri. He advised that no further legal developments would occur until such time as the psychiatric examination was completed.

AT SPRINGFIELD, MISSOURI

On January 31, 1964, MELVIN LEMONS, Secretary to the Warden, Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, advised SA JAMES A. MITCHELL that WILSON had been received at this institution on January 25, 1964. Mr. LEMONS advised that it is normally 90 days before any determination of mental competency is made. WILSON's classification date was scheduled for March 25, 1964. Mr. LEMONS noted that the Honorable Judge A. L. MAROVITZ, Northern District of Illinois, Chicago, Illinois, had requested that WILSON's psychiatric examination be completed within 15 days or such reasonable time thereafter in order to give the subject a thorough mental examination.

On January 27, 1964, the Medical Center directed a letter to Judge MAROVITZ in which they requested a 90 day extension in order to complete their examination of WILSON.

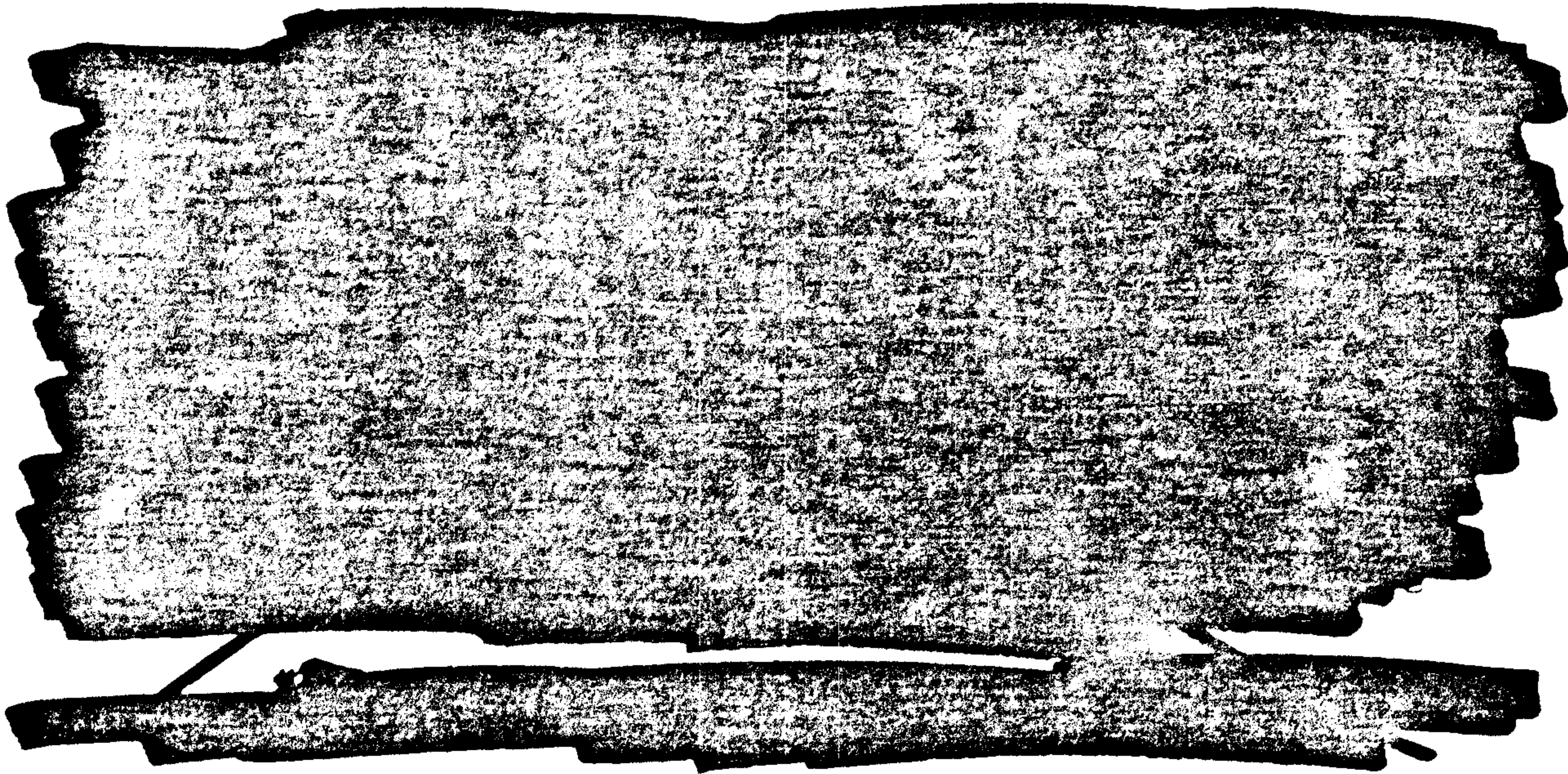
Mr. BILL TAPPANA, Record Clerk, Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, Springfield, Missouri, made available their file number O-677-H, pertaining to LLOYD JOHN WILSON. WILSON is described as:

Race	White
Sex	Male
Age	18

He was committed to the Medical Center under Section 4244 of Title 18, U. S. Code, and received at the prison on January 25, 1964. He is charged with making a threat to kill the President of the United States, LYNDON B. JOHNSON, in violation of Section 871, Title 18, U. S. Code.

Since January 31, 1964, WILSON has been working in the laundry and has been housed in A-1, which is the close confinement unit.

On March 10, 1964, [redacted] made the following rough draft notes, not in final form, for a Psychiatric Report, which in summary are as follows:

NOTE CONTINUED:

This has been completely disproven and the Commission so advised by letter of reference. Wilson in Chicago also made verbal threats against President Johnson and Secret Service arrested him. The Federal Court, Chicago, held him for psychiatric examination locally and later ordered him to the Medical Center for Federal Prisoners at Springfield for further study. He was found competent to stand trial; however, the Secret Service charges against him in Chicago were dismissed on May 5, 1964, and he has been paroled to relatives in Venice, California. He is to undertake psychiatric treatment as out patient in San Jose, California. There is no further interest in Wilson from the Oswald aspect.

NOTE FOR CIVIL RIGHTS SECTION:

Wilson has history of mental disturbances and has repeatedly indicated desire to associate himself with George Lincoln Rockwell's American Nazi Party. In view of threats against President Johnson, his claimed association with Oswald and his penchant to sympathize with American Nazi Party, it is suggested Civil Rights Section review the Lloyd John Wilson file (157-1024) to see if further investigation from Racial Matter aspect (American Nazi Party activity) is warranted. Secret Service is aware of developments to date.

Re Bureau telephone call from Inspector JAMES R. MALLEY, 6/5/64, regarding U.P.I. news release concerning Dallas auto salesman who had stated one of three bullets fired during the assassination went wild, crashed into a curb and apparently hit him; and, Dallas teletype 6/5/64, revealing that Dallas would obtain copy of photograph from KRLD-TV where a mark appeared on a curb and was in close proximity to the place where auto salesman claimed he was standing.

Enclosed for the Bureau are two 8 X 10 photographs taken from two frames of a 16 millimeter movie film with one photograph depicting a mark on the top edge of the curb and the other photograph depicting the Texas School Book Depository Building located at 411 Elm Street in the background.

On June 11, 1964, JAMES UNDERWOOD, newsman, KRLD-TV, made available the above two photographs taken by him on the morning of November 23, 1963. UNDERWOOD stated that immediately after the assassination of President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY on November 22, 1963, he remained in the area of the Texas School Book Depository Building taking movie film for his employer. He advised that a deputy sheriff, whose name he does not recall, pointed out a spot on the south curb of Main Street near the triple underpass which could have possibly been made by a bullet striking the curb.

UNDERWOOD stated that he returned to this area on November 23, 1963, and took 16 millimeter movie film of the mark and then took movie film, standing on the spot looking toward the sixth floor window located in the southeast corner of the Texas School Book Depository Building, for a reference point. UNDERWOOD stated that at that time he did not know if the mark on the curb would be pertinent so he filed the film for possible future use. UNDERWOOD stated that the object which struck the curb did not break the concrete nor leave a permanent mark. He advised that the exact location could possibly be located through using the reference photograph with a wide angle lens.

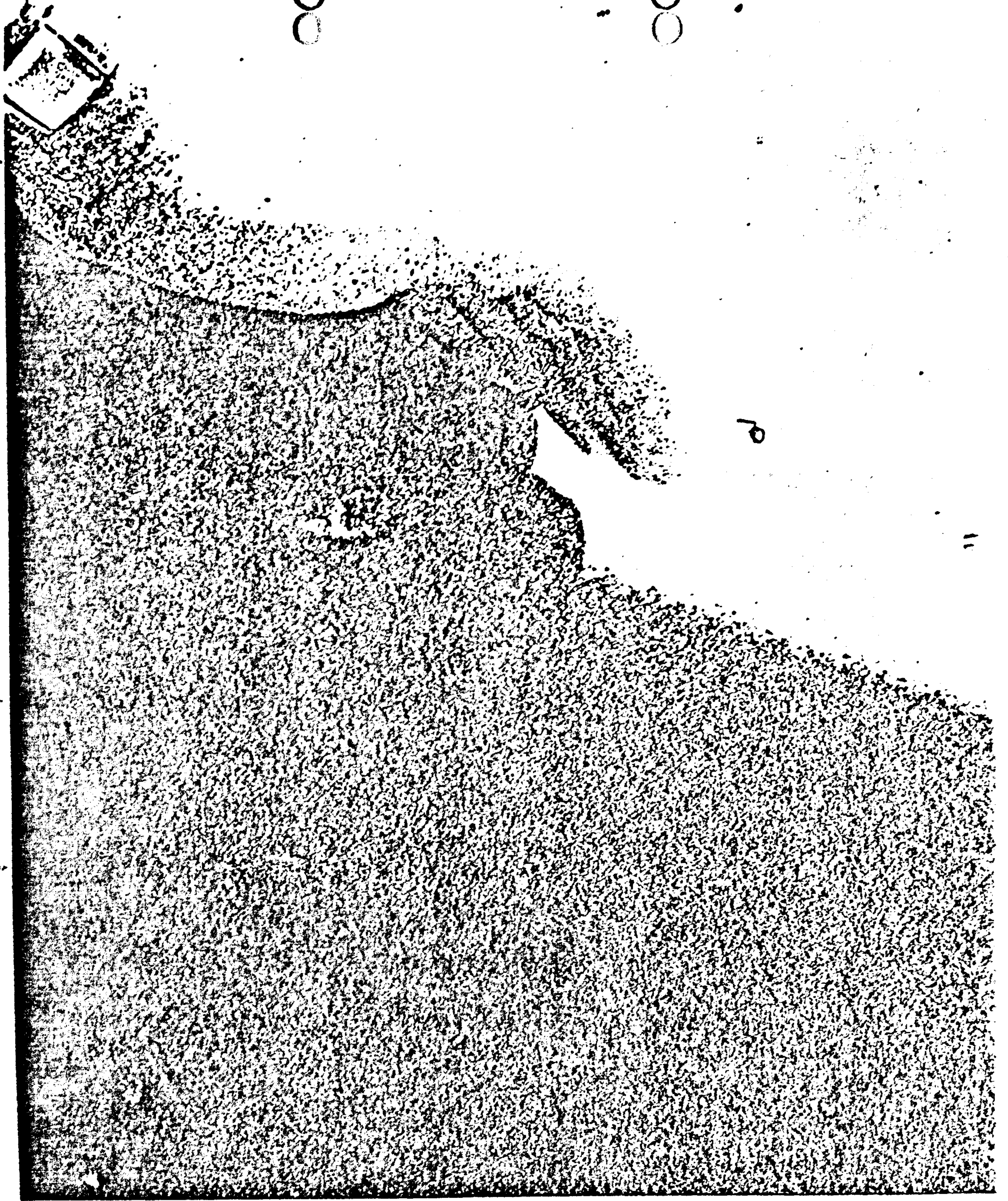
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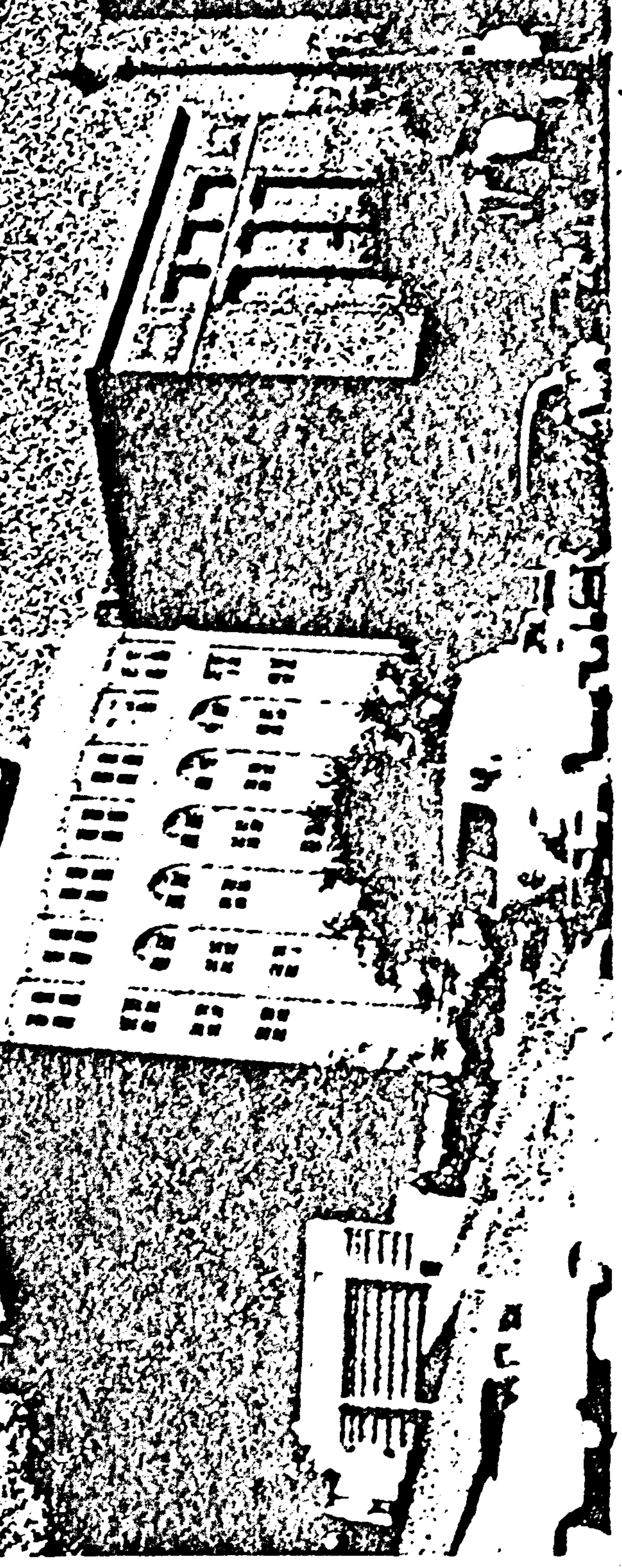

A United Press International (UPI) release on June 5, 1964, relates to a Dallas auto salesman who had stated that one of the three bullets fired during the assassination went wild, crashed into a curb and fragments apparently hit him. This individual is probably identical with Mr. Jim Tague, who was interviewed by our Dallas Office on December 14, 1963, and the result of that interview appears on page 31 of the report of Special Agent Robert P. Gemberling dated December 25, 1963. A copy of this report has previously been furnished to your office.

Our Dallas Office has furnished two photographs obtained from James Underwood, newsman with KRLD-TV, Dallas, Texas. Mr. Underwood has advised that immediately after the assassination of President Kennedy on November 22, 1963, he remained in the area of the Texas School Book Depository Building taking motion picture film. He stated that a deputy sheriff, whose name he does not recall, pointed out a spot on the south curb of Main Street near the triple underpass which could have possibly been made by a bullet striking the curb. He stated that he returned to this area on November 23, 1963, and took 16 millimeter motion pictures of the mark and then took pictures in the direction of the sixth floor window located in the southeast corner of the Texas School Book Depository Building while

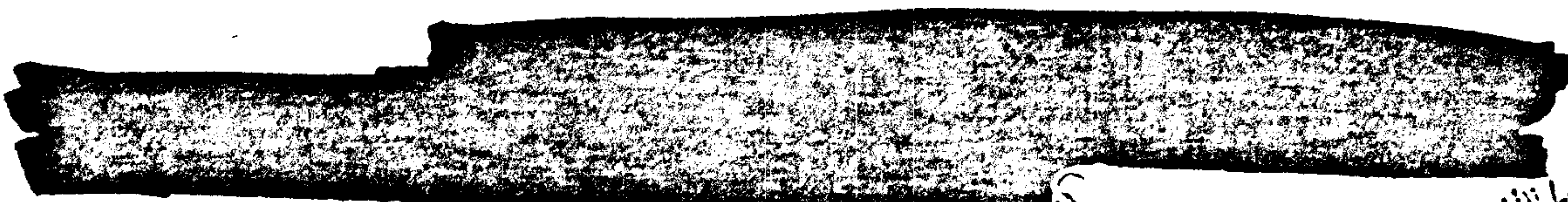

With the investigation concerning this book which has been conducted through 6/16/64, Bureau notes the following factors which may give rise to additional questions from the President's Commission:

When Steve Snyers of Universal Book Binding Company found book in 4/64, he observed the card in the book had notation to effect the book had been charged out to the binding company in 1/64, probably January 20, 1964. This appears inconsistent with Librarian Wallace's comments that upon examining the book when it was returned to him in 4/64, he determined from book pocket card that it had never been checked out. Also note Wallace states that book pocket card was placed in book by library after its initial return from the binding company (after binding) and that his office maintains no permanent records on binding transactions. If such be the case, it is not clear how library could have fixed charge-out date to binding company on pocket card after it was initially returned from bindery.

Also note that Wallace previously stated he was fairly certain book had been initially returned from bindery prior to 11/63, and that he now states the book was purchased in 1/62 and was received in library as paperback in 6/62. If remarks of Snyers are correct, this book was not sent to bindery for processing to be placed on library shelf for some 19 months until late 1/64.

Finally, note that according to Snyers, while books being bound are not described by title on work sheet, their length in inches is set forth thereon.

In view of foregoing and in order to thoroughly run out question of when book was placed on library shelf, following inquiry is to be conducted. Review with Librarian Wallace the procedure utilized in recording date when library books are sent to bindery and ascertain if date sent to bindery would be placed on the pocket card after returned therefrom. Ascertain if Wallace can recall such date on pocket card of book in question. Ascertain if it is possible that library could receive book in 6/62 and not dispatch it to bindery for placing on library shelf until 1/64. Ascertain if length of book in question matches length of any other books listed on work sheet in question. If other questions arise during conduct of investigation requested herein, resolve them as Bureau does not want Commission to find it necessary to request additional investigation concerning this incident. Submit explanation of Special Agent E. Cleon Glaze and your recommendations immediately.

NOTE:

This incident, which is likely a college prank, involves some handwritten entries in a book in a college library signed Lee Harvey Oswald. The book was found in early 4/64 on a San Antonio street by Snyers, the bindery employee and facts were telephonically reported to San Antonio on 4/7/64. Matter was assigned to SA Glaze that date, as he did not contact complainant until 4/28/64 by which time the book had been returned to the library; and the librarian destroyed the portions of the book on which the writings appeared. Hence, we cannot eliminate by handwriting. The question now to be definitely resolved is when the book was initially returned to the library by the binding company. To clearly establish the date it was returned by the binding company (we believe this occurred in 3/64) suggested inquiry is necessary. SA Glaze is presently assigned to Pittsburgh and that office by 6/26/64 airtel furnished his explanation to San Antonio where SAC is to analyze and add his recommendations. If we can establish book was initially returned from bindery after 11/22/63, we can eliminate this as a prank for portion of the writings appeared on a page placed in book by the bindery.

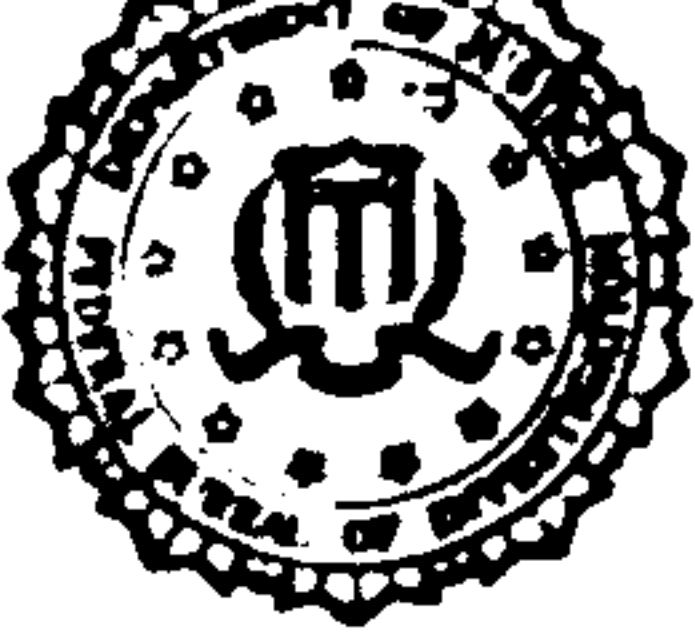

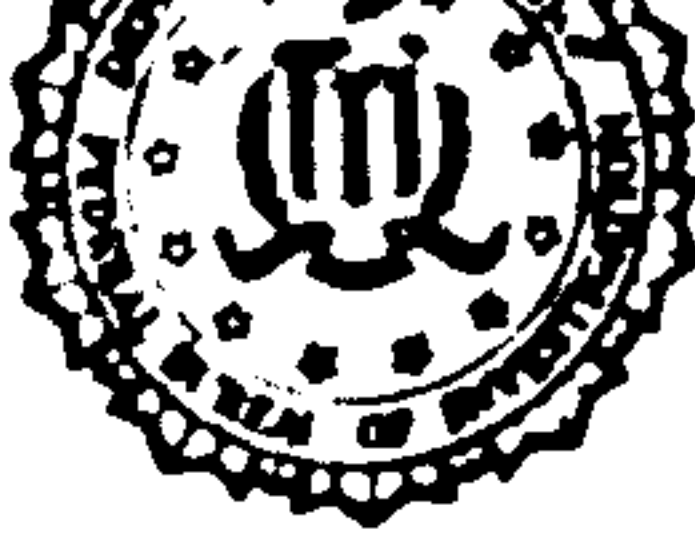

Contacts made during the year 1963 with Cuban sources in New Orleans who are usually cognizant of foreign organizational-type political activities in the New Orleans area failed to indicate the existence in New Orleans during the year 1963 of a chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). Contact with these same sources in 1963 also failed to indicate the existence of significant activity on the part of subject organization in New Orleans with, of course, the exception of the overt and publicized efforts of Lee Harvey Oswald as set forth below.

On August 9, 1963, Lee Harvey Oswald was arrested by officers of the New Orleans Police Department, New Orleans, Louisiana, on a charge of "Disturbing the Peace." His arrest resulted from an altercation he had on that date with three anti-Castro Cubans who had objected to Oswald's distribution of FPCC literature on Canal Street on August 9, 1963.

Oswald was reported to have distributed other FPCC literature on the street in New Orleans on August 16, 1963. He was reported to have appeared in a debate against two anti-Castro individuals on a local radio station in New Orleans on August 21, 1963.

The nonexistence of a chapter of subject organization in New Orleans in 1963 is confirmed by an excerpt taken from a letter written by V. T. Lee, National Director of the FPCC, dated May 28, 1963, at New York, and directed to Lee Harvey Oswald in New Orleans. This excerpt is quoted below:

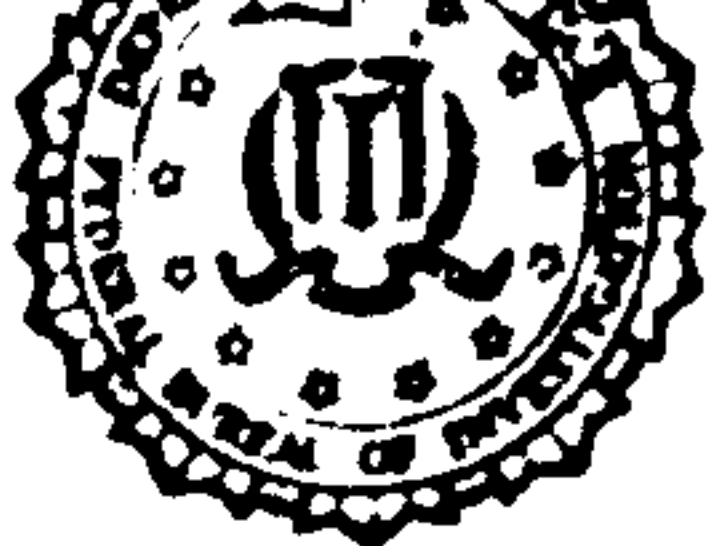

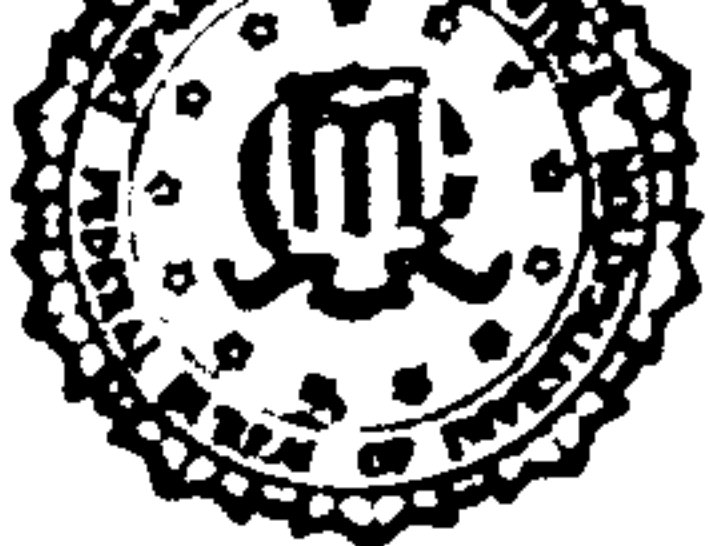

Luis Bretos, 3115 Elysian Fields Avenue, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised on April 20, 1964, that he is a Cuban national and is the delegate of Alpha 66 in New Orleans. He added that Alpha 66 works in close cooperation with the organizations known as the Second National Front of Escambray (SNFE) and the Movimiento Revolucionario del Pueblo (Revolutionary Movement of the People). He stated that these are separate and distinct organizations, and that he is the delegate of all three listed organizations in New Orleans, headquarters of all three being located in Miami, Florida. He listed as the objective of subject organization the following: The collection of contributions and donations to acquire funds to wage war against Fidel Castro. He explained that all funds collected in New Orleans are sent to headquarters in Miami, Florida.

A source reported on May 8, 1964, that a public meeting sponsored by subject organization was held in New Orleans on April 29, 1964. One of the speakers at this meeting was Antonio Veciana of SNFE Headquarters in Miami. The source quoted Veciana as stating that the purpose of the meeting was to request medical supplies, food, moral support and money. Veciana allegedly stated that no request was being made for arms, as they already had arms outside of the United States.

A source close to Luis Bretos contacted in 1963 on a continuing basis reported the existence in New Orleans in 1963 of a delegate of subject organization and identified the delegate as Luis Bretos.

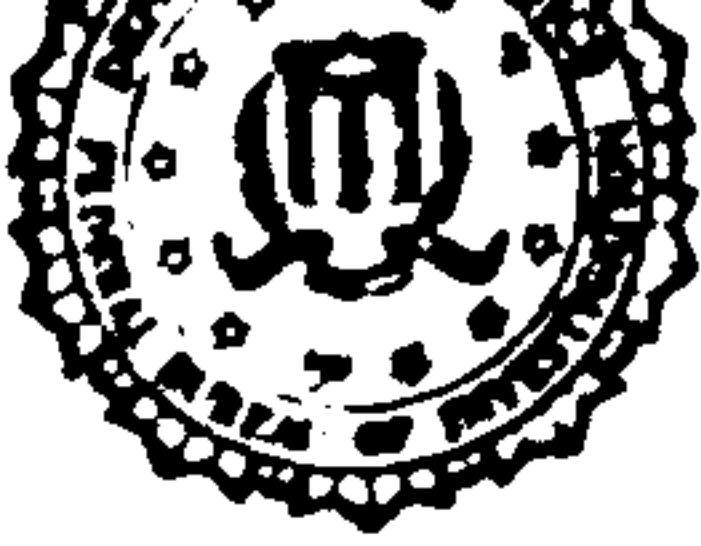
Another source close to Luis Bretos reported in September and October, 1963, that Bretos' activity was very limited from the standpoint of collecting funds for subject organization destined to be sent to its headquarters in Miami.

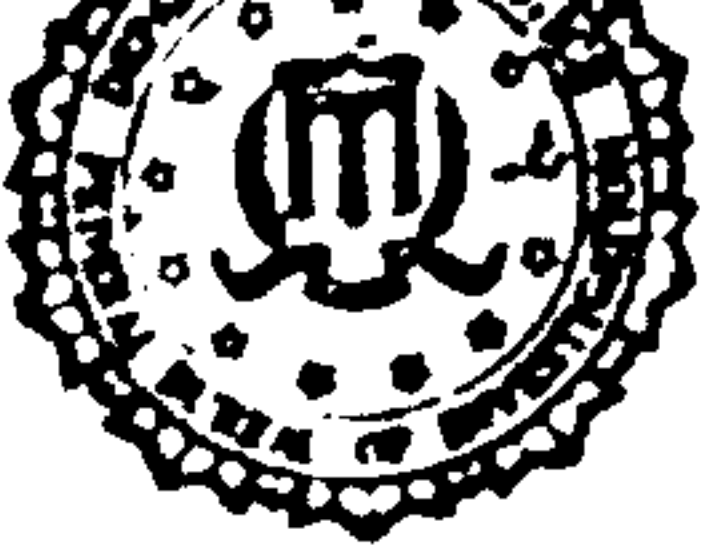

Carlos Jose Bringuier advised on August 6, 1962, that at that time he had recently been named delegate at New Orleans, Louisiana, of the Directorio Revolucionario Estudiantil (DRE), which name is translated to English as Student Revolutionary Directorate. He also advised that he was the only member of the DRE in New Orleans. He advised that the headquarters of DRE are located in Miami, Florida. The records of Immigration and Naturalization Service at New Orleans reflect Bringuier's full name as used in Spanish-speaking countries as Carlos Jose del Sagrado Corazon Bringuier Exposito. He presently resides at 501 Adele Street, Apartment F, in New Orleans.

A source reported in 1963 that the only activity of the DRE at New Orleans was carried on by Carlos Bringuier, the delegate of the DRE in New Orleans. This source stated that Bringuier's activities on behalf of the subject organization usually involved comments by Bringuier to further the anti-Castro cause, which comments usually find their way into some branch of the news media.

Another source who is a leader in anti-Castro activities in the New Orleans area advised on May 28, 1963, that the DRE has to his knowledge no members in New Orleans but is represented in New Orleans by a single delegate, namely Carlos Bringuier. This source described subject organization in New Orleans as a propaganda-type organization whose headquarters are located in Miami, Florida.

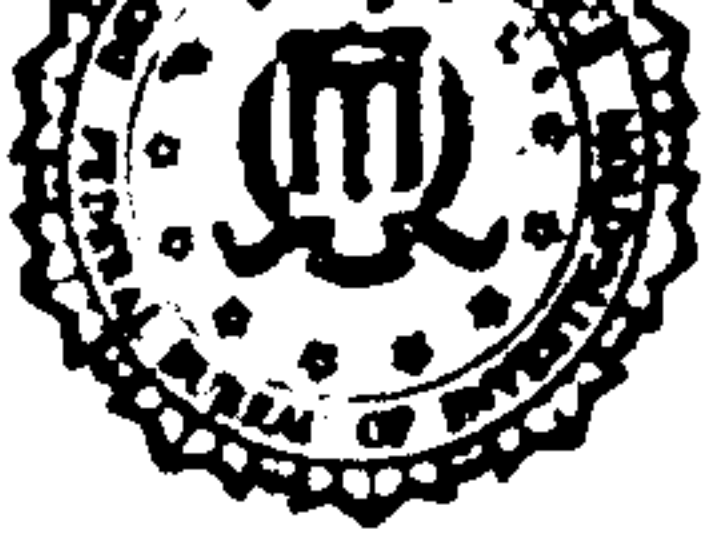
On June 2, 1964, both of the above sources, each of whom has a close contact with Carlos Bringuier, reiterated individually that to their knowledge subject organization is represented in New Orleans solely by Carlos Bringuier. They

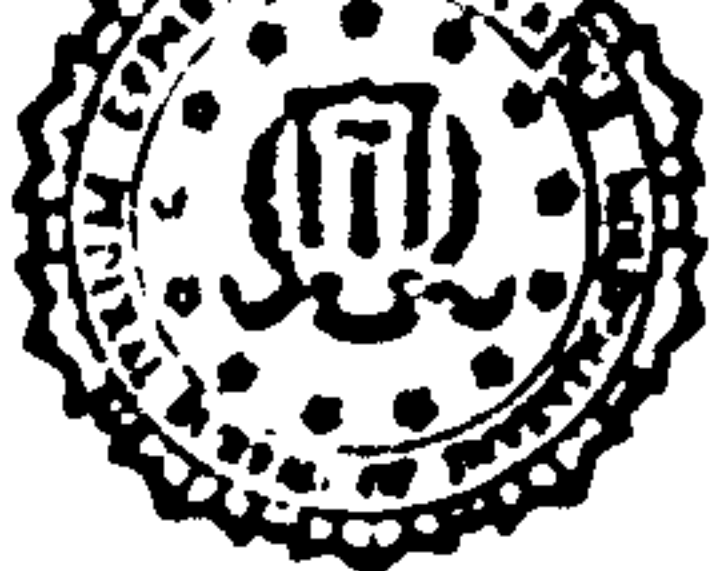
