### LEE HARVEY OSWALD INTERNAL SECURITY - R - CUBA

Re: Mrs. Katherine N. Sherwood

It will be recalled that Mrs. Katherine N. Sherwood, 6022 Trowbridge Road, Rosecroft, Maryland, advised Special Agents (SAs) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on June 19, 1964, that she is a horse trainer and as such was at Waterford Park, West Virginia, on November 22, 1963; that several days prior to November 22, 1963, she met a groom there; that on November 22, 1963, after President John F. Kennedy had been assassinated, the groom told her he had known the President would be assassinated. Further, he told her the person who killed the President would not live to come to trial if, in fact, he was ever caught.

She also indicated that the groom implied he had been a member of some type of Army intelligence unit and was masquerading as a groom to protect his life because of information he possessed. She also described a three-man conspiracy reported by the groom "to take over the world;" that President Kennedy, a member of the conspiracy, incurred the displeasure of the other two conspirators and as a result a plot was formed to assassinate him, such plot being carried out by Oswald.

On June 25, 1964, Russell E. Sherwood, Jr., Electronics Engineer, Federal Communications Commission, Washington, D. C., home address of 6022 Trowbridge Road, Rosecroft, Maryland, was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI at his place of employment.

After identifying Katherine N. Sherwood of the same address as his mother, he was apprised of her June 19, 1964, remarks to SAs of the FBI, and asked if he possessed any information bearing on the reliability of his mother's information.

At the outset of the interview, he stated that he had received a phone call from his mother at 1:00 p.m. that day in which she advised him that she had been interviewed by FBI Agents on June 19, 1964. He said she had not told him of her interview previously but said to him she had told his wife who had apparently failed to mention the fact to him.

good one, who also owned a horse which she had raced in the past. In connection with trainer and owner activity she had been at the Waterford Park track in Newell, West Virginia, from June to December in 1963. Just prior to Christmas, 1963, she returned to live with him and his family at the Trowbridge Road address in the same insolvent financial condition as she left to go there.

Since her arrival she had related to him on four or five occasions a story of the prediction of a man whom she had met at the track at Waterford Park. This prediction was that Lee Harvey Oswald would never come to trial. As be recalled his mother's story, this prediction was made subsequent to the President's assassination, and prior to the death of Oswald; that it was based not upon any previously obtained independent knowledge of this individual, but rather was merely a prediction based on that person's analysis of the tenor of the times, that is, that the violent reaction of people in Dallas to such a terrible act as the assassination, suggested that Oswald might never live to come to trial. He felt that this prediction was probably more like the opinion of many people at the time of the assassination or was similar to those of the news columnist, Drew Pearson, on the theory that if one makes enough predictions, one of them is bound to come true.

Concerning the individual, Sherwood stated that he did not recall his mother's mentioning his past or present employment. He recalled only that his mother mentioned this individual was an American Indian and was a member of the Cabala, which Sherwood described as a Jewish secret organization similar to Free Masonry.

### LEE HARVEY OSWALD

Sherwood stated that his recollection of his mother's comments in this respect was sketchy and vague. He said he recalled she mentioned something about a "master plan," but he did not recall its purpose or details of it. He stated that his mother in the past has forgotten details of events or added items which she did not know as fact but felt she was like most people in this respect. He said his mother is susceptible to stories of this kind.

Sherwood said that he has no other information bearing on the reliability of his mother's remarks. To him, it was merely a good story to listen to, but as far as any factual truth therein relating to the assassination, it would be a "million-to-one shot." He said he could not imagine any normal person claiming to have a connection past or present with Central Intelligence Agency or an intelligence unit acting in the manner described by his mother. He stated he considered it unfortunate that investigative time had to be expended to check the credibility of a story such as that related by his mother.

He suggested that his wife be contacted; that perhaps she might be able to offer some information or perspective relating to his mother's remarks.

On June 27, 1964, Mrs. BERNICE SHERWOOD, 6022 Trow-bridge Road, Rosecroft, Oxon Hill, Maryland, mailing address Washington 22, D.C., advised that she has known her mother-in-law, Mrs. KATHERINE SHERWOOD, age 58, for approximately twenty years, during which time KATHERINE has been "horse or track happy." She further related that she has never had any reason to doubt the reliability of her mother-in-law's statements but realizes that she mixes with a crowd of race track followers representing that she mixes with a crowd of race track followers representing all types of personalities and characters. At the present time KATHERINE SHERWOOD owns a horse which is being boarded somewhere in the vicinity of Waterford Park Race Track, located near Newell, West Virginia.

Mrs. SHERWOOD related that she and her mother-in-law are not too close and that she has never been a good listener with respect to the latter's conversations, and in fact, most of the conversations she overhears are conversations between Mrs. KATHERINE SHERWOOD and other individuals or group conversation.

Mrs. KATHERINE SHERWOOD left Waterford Park Race Track in December, 1963, and came to live with her son, RUSSELL, at the Oxon Hill, Maryland, address. Sometime in January or February, 1964, while KATHERINE was running as a candidate for the GOLDWATER Delegation to the Maryland Republican Convention, people were gathered for a meeting, location not recalled, which could have been held at her residence. During the meeting, the topic of Communism arose, and Mrs. KATHERINE SHERWOOD related the following incident to this group:

While at Waterford Park Race Track, she had made the acquaintance of a groom whom she used to transport to and from

the race track and the nearby town of Newell, West Virginia. On the Friday that the President was assassinated, and on first hearing this news, and before LEE OSWALD had been killed, this groom made a statement in front of a group of horse trainers and entry personnel that the assassin would never live to be tried. This groom had also stated that the assassination was a pre-planned conspiracy. On the Sunday following the President's assassination when LEE OSWALD had been killed, most of the same people who had heard the groom's statement were amazed that it had been correct.

Mrs. BERNICE SHERWOOD stated that this was the first time that she had ever heard her mother-in-law relate this story and after the meeting which in her opinion was attended by some highly excitable people, she asked her mother-in-law why she placed so much significance in the reliability of the groom's statement, whereupon KATHERINE informed her that the groom seemed to be well educated, was neat in appearance, and he had told her that during World War II he had been with an intelligence unit. He had also told her that she should not be seen with him and that she should not continue to drive him into town since he was being watched. According to KATHERINE SHERWOOD, the groom apparently left the Waterford Park Race Track area soon after the assassination and prior to her leaving for Oxon Hill, Maryland, in December, 1963.

Mrs. BERNICE SHERWOOD stated that she does not recall her mother-in-law ever saying that the groom had remarked that he knew so much about people in highly placed positions that would damage their character, that such was a threat to his own safety. When questioned she related that she has never heard KATHERINE make statements that JOHN F. KENNEDY and others were part of a conspiracy to take over the world.

On terminating the interview, Mrs. SHERWOOD stated that she could not understand why so much emphasis and concern was being attached to the reported statement made by the groom since undoubtedly a number of people all over the country had made similar statements at the time that word was received of the assassination of the President.



He specifically made reference to page 677 of report of SA Robert P. Gemberling dated 12-23-63 in the Oswald case. Mr. Redlich noted that on this page we show under the heading Washington, D. C., Soviet Embassy Office 1125 16th Street, N. W., Secretary to Ambassador, National 8-8549.

I telephonically contacted Mr. Redlich and called his attention to the Washington, D. C., Telephone Directory which shows on page 490 a listing of the Soviet Embassy and directly underneath shows the office located at 1125 16th Street, N. W., and a listing for the secretary to the Ambassador as NA 8-8549.

Mr. Redlich made reference to a further notation in Oswald's notebook under Soviet Embassy showing an office at 1706 18th Street, N. W., Telephone number Adams 2-3092. In the Washington, D. C., Telephone Directory there is a listing for a residence at 1700 18th Street, N. W., and a telephone number AD 2-3092. At this same location there are separate trunk line listings for the Commercial Division, the Information Office, the "USSR" Magazine, and two other Soviet offices.

Mr. Redlich made reference to page 694 of SA Gemberling's report. Under the heading Washington, D. C., there was an address of 1125 16th Street, N. W. - National 8-7550 and 1706 18th Street, N. W. - Adams 2-3092. I noted to Mr. Redlich that the Telephone Directory shows NA 8-7550 as a trunk line for the Soviet Embassy. WAB: hrt

No one really believes, anymore, that the commission intends to reveal the truth, as they say "in our lifetime". Though why one couldn't imagine. This delay gives Europeans a chance to make wrong guesses. Many abroad do not even know Oswald was a Communist:

PLEASE collect all the facts, and leave them somewhere, for posterity. This is very important.

Mrs. KATHERINE N. SHERWOOD, 6022 Trowbridge Road, Rosecroft, Maryland, advised agents of this Bureau on June 19, 1964, that she is a horse trainer and as such was at Waterford Park, West Virginia, on November 22, 1963.

Several days prior to November 22, 1963, she met a groom who was tending horses next to her stable. She became friendly with this person and provided him with transportation and dinners on several occasions.

On November 22, 1963, after President JOHN F. KENNEDY had been assassinated, the groom told her he had known the President would be assassinated. Further, he told her the person who killed the President would not live to come to trial if, in fact, he was ever caught.

SHERWOOD stated the groom, whose name she could not recall, implied he had been a member of some type of Army intelligence unit for a number of years and was masquerading as a groom to protect his life because he had information in his head of such paramount importance that it would damage the reputation of persons in high authority in America. She said he told her his life would be nothing if he had not committed to paper and subsequently hid the paper, to be opened only in the event of his death, the information he possessed. The groom never mentioned that he had been connected with CIA.

SHERWOOD advised the man did a lot of talking and she at first considered him to be a "nut", however, after the death of LEE HARVEY OSWALD she said she was convinced the man had been truthful.

SHERWOOD stated this man told her President JOHN F. KENNEDY was a member of a three-man conspiracy "to take over the world". She said this conspiracy had been in

existence for several hundred years and advised the other members of the group were BERNARD BARUCH and JOHN EDGAR HOOVER. She said that President KENNEDY incurred the displeasure of the other two conspirators and as a result a plot was formed to assassinate him, such plot being carried out by OSWALD.

Mrs. SHERWOOD stated she had never discussed the information she furnished to Bureau agents telephonically with anyone. She said she recently ran as Republican representative to the Republican State Convention on a "GOLDWATER Slate" but denied using the aforementioned information during her campaign. She advised Bureau agents she herself was not "nuts" although people might think so.

SHERWOOD is described as a white female, date of birth August 1, 1905, Chicago, Illinois, Height 5'2", weight 114 lbs., brown eyes, gray hair, divorced for the past 32 years, resides with son, RUSSELL, at 6022 Trowbridge Road, Rosecroft, Maryland. She presently is an unemployed horse trainer.

By letter 6/8/64 the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) advised that one of its employees was contacted by Mrs. Kathryn N. Sherwood who indicated she was one of the delegates on the Republican ballot and was supporting Senator Barry Goldwater. During the conversation Mrs. Sherwood told the CIA employee that prior to the assassination of President Kennedy she met an individual in West Virginia who claimed to be a former CIA courier. Mrs. Sherwood stated this alleged CIA courier told her President Kennedy would be assassinated and the assassin, in turn, would be killed. According to Mrs. Sherwood, this person "just disappeared from sight" following the assassination of President Kennedy. Mrs. Sherwood also stated this individual told her a number of things relative to people in high places in the United States Government which were quite shocking and which worried her very much.

Baltimore Office identified Mrs. Sherwood as an unemployed horse trainer who resides at Rosecroft, Maryland. She was interviewed by FBI 6/19/64 and claimed she met a groom of horses in West Virginia several days prior to the assassination of President Kennedy and that such groom implied he had been a member of some type of Army intelligence unit for a number of years and was masquerading as a groom to protect his life because he possessed important information which would damage the reputation of persons in high authority in America. In Mrs. Sherwood also stated this groom told her President Kennedy, along with Bernard Baruch and John Edgar Hoover, made up a three-man conspiracy "to take over the world"; further that President Kennedy incurred the displeasure of the other two conspirators and as a result a plot was formed to assassinate him, such plot being carried out by Oswald.

Mrs. Sherwood stated she had first considered this groom to be a "nut" but after the death of Lee Harvey Oswald she is convinced the man had been truthful. She also stated that she herself was not "nuts" although people might think so.

Memorandum to Mr. Sullivan Re: LEE HARVEY OSWALD 105-82555

The Baltimore Agents who interviewed Mrs. Sherwood stated they got the definite impression Mrs. Sherwood was inventing the information as described above. They immediately advised Mrs. Sherwood of the grave consequences which could result from such unfounded remarks and duly impressed upon her the seriousness of making such unwarranted statements in the future.

## OBSERVATIONS:

It appears that Mrs. Sherwood suffers from some sort of mental illness. In view of her scurrilous statements, desirable Baltimore conduct additional discreet checks to determine if Mrs. Sherwood has a reputation for mental illness. She is residing with a son and it appears likely interview of him plus other discreet checks by Baltimore Agents can resolve this matter. Mrs. Sherwood is 60 years of age and was divorced 32 years ago.

# ACTION:

Attached is an airtel to the Baltimore Office instructing that Mrs. Sherwood's son, Russell Sherwood, be immediately interviewed and be apprised of his mother's remarks. Thereafter, Mr. Sherwood should be asked for his comments on these allegations and any other information he can furnish which would have a bearing on this matter. We are also instructing Baltimore that in the event its interview with Russell Sherwood does not resolve this particular inquiry, it should conduct other discreet checks to fully develop the reputation and mental stability of Mrs. Sherwood.



DETAILS UPI release dated 6-5-64, relates the "Dallas Times Herald" on 6-5-64, reported an unnamed auto salesman had advised : one of the three bullets fired during the assassination apparently hit a curb and he was either hit on the cheek by aricochet or piece of concrete curb. The UPI release indicates the salesman asked that his identity be concealed and reports the salesman was by a concrete abutment near the triple overpass adjacent to the Presidential Motorcade at the time of the assassination. The auto salesman indicated he heard three reports which he believed to be shots and on the second shot he felt a sting on his cheek. He maintained in the following confusion he forgot about it until a policeman told him his face was "bloody" The salesman states he went back to where he had been standing and saw a fresh crease mark on the curb. This incident according to the salesman was reported to a Dallas detective and later to the FBI, who were more concerned "about whether I knew Jack Ruby." The release concludes that the Isalesman has not been contacted by the Commission. BACKGROUND This individual is probably identical with Mr. Jim Tague salesman for the Chuck Hutton Company, Dallas, who was interviewed by our Dallas Office on 12-14-63. appear on page 31 in the report of SA Robert P. Gemberling dated 12-23-63, captioned as above. This report has been furnished to the Commission.

Tague during interview furnished substantially the same information as reported in the UPI release except it appears he has become more dramatic and has exaggerated the incident in an effort to obtain personal publicity or for other unknown reasons. For example, his interview indicates Tague reported about "two drops of blood" resulted from this incident; however, the UPI release now indicates his face was "bloody." Tague denied knowing Oswald but stated he had been in Ruby's club on a few occasions and knew Ruby by sight; however, denied knowing anything about Ruby's associations.

Based on information developed recently, it is possible that one of the shots fired by Oswald did go wild; however, efforts to locate the portion of curb where a possible shot might have hit has been negative.

## ACTION

Since this interview has been reported to the Commission and the UPI release contains substantially the same information developed by our investigation, no further action is recommended.
