There were received twenty-seven photocopy pages of Lee Harvey Oswald's diary for latent print examination. Fifteen pages were obtained from the District Attorney's (DA) Office, Dallas, Texas, and twelve pages were obtained from Life Magazine, New York City.

A total of seven latent palm prints and twenty-two latent fingerprints were developed. One latent fingerprint developed on one of the pages obtained from the DA's Office, Dallas, Texas, has been identified as the left thumbprint of William Frank Alexander, Assistant DA, Dallas Texas. The remaining latent fingerprints not identified with Alexander, or Henry Wade, the DA. No palm prints here for Alexander or Wade.

Laboratory is furnishing these results along with its findings to the President's Commission, Dallas, and New York.

Re leak of Oswald diary in "The Dallas Morning News," June 27 and 28, 1964, and publication in July 10, 1964, issue of "Life" magazine.

PURPOSE

That the attached letter to the President's Commission, enclosing three memoranda and a Dallas report concerning the leak of Oswald's diary, be forwarded to the President's Commission. It is noted additional comments have been included in the letter made by John F. Dowd, General Counsel for "Life" magazine, concerning Representative Ford, which were not incorporated in the July 15, 1964, New York letterhead memorandum. These comments were included in view of the anticipated interview of Representative Ford of the President's Commission by Mr. DeLoach.

BACKGROUND

As a result of letters dated June 30 and July 10, 1964, from the President's Commission, we initiated investigation into the matter concerning the leak of Oswald's diary in "The Dallas Morning News" and "Life" magazine.

Extensive investigation has been conducted by our Dallas, New York and Houston Offices in this matter. Regarding the publication of Oswald's diary in "Life" magazine, we have now determined arrangements for the publication were handled through Paula Aynesworth, who is the wife of Hugh Aynesworth reporter for "The Dallas Morning News" and who published Oswald's diary on June 27 and 28, 1964. Paula Aynesworth received \$2500 for this information from "Life" magazine.

Memorandum to Mr. Belmont
RE: LEE HARVEY OSWALD, AKA.

To date those who have been interviewed have denied or failed to reveal the source from whom they received the information. However, there are strong indications the information came from the Dallas County Attorney's Office. William F. Alexander, Assistant District Attorney, Dallas County, Texas, alleged Representative Ford of the President's Commission leaked the information. He has also made allegations that Representative Ford had contacts with "Life" magazine regarding this matter.

"Life" magazine has been cooperative in furnishing us copies of the diary they received. In addition, John F. Dowd, General Counsel for "Life" magazine furnished additional information regarding Representative Ford's contact with Mr. James Thompson, Editor of "Life" magazine. Although Representative Ford's contacts with "Life" were verified, they certainly do not substantiate allegations Representative Ford furnished "Life" magazine information regarding the Oswald diary. Therefore, it appears pertinent that these facts should be made available to the President's Commission and that Mr. DeLoach should be aware of this information when he conducts his interview with Representative Ford.

The Laboratory is conducting an appropriate examination of the documents received. Results of examination will be furnished to the Commission.

ACTION

If approved, the attached letter, enclosing three memoranda and the Dallas report, be furnished to the President's Commission and Mr. DeLoach for his assistance in the forthcoming interview with Representative Ford.

With regard to the testimony of Bureau personnel before the President's Commission, arrangements were made for this testimony to be obtained and for same to be reviewed by the individual who had testified. Following this review it was taken up with the staff attorney who had handled the individual questioning of the Bureau representative before the hearing of the President's Commission. It is noted that Mr. Melvin Eisenberg, one of the staff attorneys, was in New York for a period of time and that testimony of a number of Bureau Laboratory personnel was turned over to Mr. Howard M. Willens along with comments concerning the suggested changes in the testimony.

Mr. Willens called Malley on July 23, 1964, and advised that in those instances where the changes involved were material and actually affected outcome of testimony, such changes were made. He stated that in other instances where the changes were minor in nature and did not affect the materiality of the testimony, because of the pressure of getting the report out such changes were not made in every instance.

ON PAGE TWO OF YOUR AIRTEL YOU REPORTED THAT LIEUTENANT ALLEMAN FURNISHED COPIES OF PAMPHLETS AND A COPY OF PATROLMAN RAY'S REPORT REGARDING AN INCIDENT WHERE AN UNIDENTIFIED INDIVIDUAL WAS DISTRIBUTING PAMPHLETS IN THE VICINITY OF THE DUMAINE STREET WHARF, NEW ORLEANS, DURING JUNE, ONE NINE SIX THREE. YOU INDICATED PAMPHLETS IN QUESTION AND COPY OF PATROLMAN RAY'S REPORT WERE SET FORTH IN ATTACHED PAGES TO YOUR LETTERHEAD MEMORANDUM. SUCH DATA NOT RECEIVED BY BUREAU AND SHOULD BE FURNISHED TO BUREAU IMMEDIATELY BY YOUR OFFICE. IN ADDITION, YOU SHOULD RECONTACT LIEUTENANT ALLEMAN AND ASCERTAIN IF THE ORIGINALS OF THE PAMPHLETS IN QUESTION CAN BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE BUREAU FOR LABORATORY EXAMINATION TO DETERMINE IF SUCH PAMPHLETS CONTAIN FINGERPRINTS OF OSWALD. EXPLAIN TO LIEUTENANT ALLEMAN THAT SUCH EXAMINATION WILL RESULT IN CONSIDERABLE DISCOLORATION TO THE PAMPHLETS CONCERNED. IF LIEUTENANT ALLEMAN IS COOPERATIVE IN THIS MATTER, YOU SHOULD FORWARD

NOTE:

In his personal effects Oswald made notation that he had distributed Fair Play for Cuba pamphlets in the vicinity of the U.S. fleet in New Orleans. At request of the President's Commission we conducted inquiries in the vicinity where the U.S. fleet is harbored and located 2 individuals who recalled an unknown man distributing such type of Cuban pamphlets in the vicinity of the U.S. fleet in 6-63. A New Orleans patrolman contacted such unidentified individual and requested he stop distributing such pamphlets in that area. The patrolman in question states he believes the individual whom he contacted in 6-63 is identical to Oswald, whose pictures he has noted on TV and in the newspapers. New Orleans apparently obtained copies of pamphlets in question and a copy of the patrolman's report but did not forward such data to the Bureau, but did make reference in its LHM describing such activity that the report and pamphlets involved were set forth in attached pages.
