In connection with this report, it should be borne in mind that the Dallas Office has a separate case in connection with the shooting of LEE HARVEY OSWALD captioned, "JACK L. RUBY, aka.; LEE HARVEY OSWALD, aka. (Deceased) - VICTIM; CIVIL RIGHTS," Dallas file 44-1639, Bufile 44-24016. It is also pointed out that the Dallas Office has a separate case captioned, "ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, 11/22/63, DALLAS, TEXAS; MISCELLANEOUS - INFORMATION CONCERNING," Dallas file 89-43, Bufile 62-109060.

Communications are still being received under this Assassination caption which, upon review, are found to contain information pertaining to OSWALD or his connection with the assassination and such communications are being filed and reported in instant case captioned, "LEE HARVEY OSWALD, aka." Also, numerous communications are being received carrying the OSWALD caption, which contain no information concerning OSWALD or his connection with the assassination, and such communications are being filed and reported in the case bearing the Assassination caption. For the most part, miscellaneous allegations bearing on the assassination are being reported in Dallas file 89-43 and all others in the LEE HARVEY OSWALD case.

In some instances, inserts and FD-302's contained in instant report may reflect Dallas file number as 89-43, which was occasioned by other offices having submitted such inserts or FD-302's believing same would be reported under the Assassination caption.

The overlap in the period of this report with that of previous reports in this matter was occasioned by the fact that certain information was not included in prior reports until the investigation concerning a particular phase was completed and could all be included in one report.

No local dissemination of this report is being made to either the U. S. Attorney, the local U. S. Secret Service or any other agency. Extra copies have been made by the Dallas Office for use in the event the Bureau directs such dissemination.

Certain information contained in this report has been previously submitted by letterhead memorandum. Such information is being restated for purposes of continuity and to facilitate location of material which, by being included in a report with a comprehensive table of contents, assists materially in the location of requested information.

Synopsis:

CLOTILE WILLIAMS heard assassination shots while standing on northwest corner of Houston and Elm Streets, Dallas, Texas, but did not see anything that aroused her suspicion and did not know from where the shots came. Supplemental listing of exhibits by item number and description prepared. Additional investigation conducted concerning mark on curb on south side of Main Street near triple underpass, which it is alleged was possibly caused by bullet fired during assassination. No evidence of mark or nick on curb now visible. Photographs taken of location where mark once appeared, together with other photographs reflecting angle of such location in relation to the sixth floor window of the Texas School Book Depository (TSBD) from which assassination shots fired. Photographs also taken from inside sixth floor of TSBD southeast corner window from which assassination shots fired, showing distance between floor and window sill and height of opening in the window when window half open. Photographs taken of person approximate height of OSWALD showing relative position of window ledge and window to such person. Photographs taken at Methodist Hospital of Dallas of bone specimen allegedly from skull of President KENNEDY obtained. Additional investigation conducted with negative results concerning claim by Mrs. EDITH WHITWORTH that she directed OSWALD family to Irving Sports Shop, Irving, Texas, in early November 1963, which investigation consisted of interviews of certain parents of female babies born 10/20/63, in the Irving and Dallas, Texas, area to determine if they were the individuals

believed by Mrs. WHITWORTH to have been the OSWALD family. Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY, Dallas Police Department, states Dallas Police Officer J. D. TIPPIT did not violate radio procedure in not notifying radio dispatcher that he was stopping suspect (OSWALD) to question him. States Dallas Police Officers did not search any buildings in the vicinity of TSBD, the TSBD itself or any other buildings, and did not have anyone under surveillance on 11/22/63, as a precaution. MC ADAMS, a blind man, described as "psycho" and unreliable, alleged he had some letters written in Braille dated in July and August 1963, stating OSWALD and CHARLES WILLIAMS would kill President KENNEDY when he came to Fort Worth or Dallas, Texas. WARREN A. REYNOLDS interviewed concerning his contacts with General EDWIN A. WALKER. REYNOLDS stated he contacted WALKER because he was "scared" as result of having been shot through head after assassination, which shooting he feels is connected with fact he witnessed OSWALD running with gun from scene of shooting of Officer J. D. TIPPIT. Following discussion with WALKER on 6/24/64, WALKER sent telegram to President's Commission requesting testimony of REYNOLDS be taken. WILLIAM n.l.

MC EWAN DUFF, former employee of General EDWIN A. WALKER, interviewed concerning his allegation that JACK RUBY visited the WALKER residence in 12/62, January and February 1963, and states he is not certain individual was RUBY. JOHN J. KAYLOCK alleged he met OSWALD at Punta Gorda, Fla., 10/2/63. Previous investigation has established OSWALD was en route from Mexico City to Dallas, Texas, 10/2/63. Allegation by JESSE LEE DAVIS, JR. that he saw OSWALD in a car turn around in his driveway at Dallas on morning of 11/22/63, disproved. Investigation conducted concerning allegation that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had resorted to violence before and possibly shot another policeman somewhere as related to BOB WHITTEN, Radio Station KCRA, Sacramento, Calif., by Sergeant GERALD L. HILL, Dallas Police Department. Sergeant HILL admits making statement, "The man (OSWALD), I understand, has resorted to violence before and possibly shot another policeman somewhere." He states basis for statement was hearsay from unrecalled source at Dallas Police Department during interrogation of OSWALD following his arrest 11/22/63. Captain JOHN WILL FRITZ, Dallas Police Department, who was in charge of interrogation of OSWALD, states he is certain no such information

as indicated by statement of Sergeant HILL was known to Dallas Police Department at time of interrogation or it would have been made known to him, and that Sergeant HILL was not present during such interrogation. He states that during interrogation there were numerous law enforcement officers and representatives of various news media at Dallas Police Department, and that much speculation, many rumors and general confusion prevailed, because of magnitude of crime committed. Additional allegation of acquaintanceship between OSWALD and JACK L. RUBY made by WALTER J. EUSTACE, who will be 84 years old in November 1964. MARINA OSWALD accompanied Mr. and Mrs. DECLAN P. FORD to Texoma Lodge, Kingston, Okla., on 7/6/64, for several days vacation. Information obtained concerning OSWALD's receipt of "The Militant" and "The Worker."

I. ADDITIONAL ASSASSINATION WITNESS

On July 6, 1964, CLOTILE WILLIAMS, 4814 Mill. Place, Dallas, Texas, telephonically contacted the Dallas Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, at which time she advised Investigative Clerk ROBERT G. RENFRO that on the previous Saturday night, July 4, 1964, a white man and woman contacted her neighbor at about midnight in an attempt to locate WILLIAMS. She stated this man and woman showed her neighbor a photograph taken on the street near the site of the assassination showing WILLIAMS and a group of individuals watching the Presidential motorcade. According to WILLIAMS, this man and woman reportedly told WILLIAMS' neighbor they were from New York and wanted to talk to WILLIAMS in connection with the photograph and she presumed for any information she might have concerning the assassination of President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY.

WILLIAMS advised she did not know anything about the assassination except that she did hear the shots but did not know where they came from and could furnish no information concerning the identity of the assassin.

1Date 7/24/64

Mrs. CLOTILE WILLIAMS, 4814 Mill Place, advised she is a housewife, but was formerly employed as a presser by WILLIAM MILLER, a clothing manufacturer in the building located at 501 Elm Street, Dallas, Texas.

Mrs. WILLIAMS advised that on November 22, 1963, while employed by WILLIAM MILLER, clothing manufacturer, at 501 Elm Street, Dallas, Texas, she viewed the Presidential motorcade. She said shortly after 12:00 noon, on November 22, 1963, she took up a position on the northwest corner of Houston and Elm Streets. She said shortly after President KENNEDY's car passed this position she heard some shots. She said she does not recall the number of shots fired, but that she definitely heard shots. She said she became frightened and ran toward 501 Elm Street, Dallas, Texas, where she was employed.

Mrs. WILLIAMS stated she did not see anything that aroused her suspicion and did not know where the shots came from. She said she had no information which would assist in the investigation of the assassination of President KENNEDY.

Mrs. WILLIAMS said that on July 5, 1964, her neighbor, MILDRED JANIS, 4809 Mill Place, Dallas, Texas, advised her that on Saturday night, July 4, 1964, at about midnight, a white man and a white woman contacted Mrs. JANIS attempting to locate Mrs. WILLIAMS. Mrs. WILLIAMS stated that Mrs. JANIS informed her these people had a photograph taken on the street near the site of the assassination of President KENNEDY, and appearing in this picture was a woman who resembled her, Mrs. WILLIAMS. Mrs. WILLIAMS stated Mrs. JANIS advised this man and woman told her they were from New York and wanted to talk to Mrs. WILLIAMS in connection with the photograph.

Mrs. WILLIAMS stated she had no idea as to the identities of the people who were allegedly attempting to contact her, and had no idea how they obtained her name. She reiterated she had no information which would assist in the investigation of the assassination of President KENNEDY.

Mrs. MILDRED JANIS, 4809 Mill Place, advised she is a neighbor and a friend of Mrs. CLOTILE WILLIAMS, who resides at 4814 Mill Place, Dallas, Texas.

Mrs. JANIS advised that at about midnight on July 4, 1964, she answered a knock at her door and a white man and a woman inquired of her where they could locate Mrs. CLOTILE WILLIAMS. Mrs. JANIS said she informed them that, if Mrs. WILLIAMS was not at home, she did not know where she could be located. Mrs. JANIS stated these two people exhibited a photograph to her taken near the site of President KENNEDY's assassination and showing a group of people viewing the Presidential motorcade. Among these people, Mrs. JANIS stated, was an individual who might have been Mrs. CLOTILE WILLIAMS. She stated these people told her that they were from New York and were attempting to contact Mrs. WILLIAMS to get her opinion about the assassination. She said these people stated they had contacted other people in Dallas who had viewed the Presidential motorcade. Mrs. JANIS advised neither of these people informed her where they were employed or by whom they were employed. She stated they remained outside her door talking for a few moments and then departed.

She said she was at Love Field when she heard the news reports that President KENNEDY had been assassinated.

By letter dated July 7, 1964, the President's Commission requested additional investigation concerning an alleged mark on the curb in the vicinity of the Texas School Book Depository (TSBD), Dallas, Texas, which had been photographed by JAMES UNDERWOOD, a Newsman with KRLD-TV, Dallas, Texas. In connection with this request, the President's Commission letter made available a photograph of the curb made by TOM DILLARD of "The Dallas Morning News" which had been forwarded to the President's Commission by MARTHA JOE STROUD, Assistant United States Attorney, Dallas, Texas.

JAMES UNDERWOOD, residence, 9751 Parkford Drive, Dallas, Texas, a Newsman for KRLD-TV, Dallas, was shown two photographs. One of these photographs is of a mark on the curb on the south side of Main Street near the triple underpass and shows a hand shielding the light from this mark. The second photograph was taken looking across Main Street and up Elm Street towards the Texas School Book Depository (TSBD) Building. Mr. UNDERWOOD identified these photographs as frames taken from a 16 mm movie film, which film was taken by him on the morning of November 23, 1963. Mr. UNDERWOOD advised he had been told by a Deputy Sheriff, whose name he could not recall, that there was a mark on the curb on the south side of Main Street near the underpass, which was possibly made by a ricocheting bullet. The photograph of the hand shielding the mark on the curb was made by UNDERWOOD squatting down in the gutter to get a close-up view of the mark, and the picture of the TSBD Building was taken by placing the handle attached to the underneath side of UNDERWOOD's movie camera on the curb near the mark and pointing the camera back towards the TSBD Building, in order to get a low-level shot.

Mr. UNDERWOOD repeated what he had told Bureau Agents on June 11, 1964, that he could not be positive the mark was made by a ricocheting bullet, but appeared to him that it could have been, based on knowledge acquired by him while in the military service. He further stated it was definitely a mark on the curb and not a nick in the curb. He repeated that the concrete was not broken and that the mark appeared to have possibly been made recently, but he could not judge how much time had passed since the mark was made when he took the photographs of it.

Mr. UNDERWOOD stated that, prior to taking the photographs, he met TOM DILLARD, a Photographer for "The Dallas Morning News," near the entrance to the Dallas County Jail, and had told DILLARD about the information he had received from the Deputy Sheriff about the mark on the curb. DILLARD indicated he would possibly also take a still photograph of this mark.

TOM C. DILLARD, residence, 7022 Merrilue Lane, Dallas, Texas, a Photographer for "The Dallas Morning News," advised that on the morning of November 23, 1963, while at the Dallas County Jail entrance, he had received information from JAMES UNDERWOOD, a Newsman for KELD-TV, to the effect there was a mark on the curb on the south side of Main Street near the triple underpass. UNDERWOOD had told DILLARD that the mark was possibly made by a bullet. Later during the afternoon of November 23, 1963, DILLARD, using a Mamiyaflex 120 Camera, took a picture of a mark on the curb on the south side of Main Street about twenty feet east of the triple underpass. DILLARD stated he was of the opinion the mark very possibly could have been made by a ricocheting bullet and that it had been recently made.

Mr. DILLARD was shown a photograph of a mark on the curb with a hand holding a pencil pointing towards the mark. He identified this photograph as a copy of the one he had taken on the afternoon of November 23, 1963.

Mr. DILLARD stated he definitely recalls it was a mark on the curb, rather than a nick in the curb, and the concrete was not broken or chipped.

Special Agents ROBERT M. BARRETT and IVAN D. LEE, of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, accompanied by TOM C. DILLARD, a Photographer for "The Dallas Morning News," and JAMES UNDERWOOD, a Newsman for KRLD-TV, went to the area approximately twenty feet east of the triple underpass and on the south side of Main Street. Through the use of the same camera used by Mr. UNDERWOOD on November 23, 1963, and by aligning three reference points in a photograph of the Texas School Book Depository (TSBD) Building taken by Mr. UNDERWOOD on November 23, 1963, from this same area, it was ascertained the mark observed and photographed by Mr. UNDERWOOD and Mr. DILLARD had been at a point on the curb twenty-one feet and eleven and one-half inches east of a point where Main Street passes under the triple underpass. This same point where the mark had been observed by Mr. UNDERWOOD and Mr. DILLARD was seventy-three feet and five inches west of the first lamp post on the south side of Main Street, which lamp post is the first one located east from the triple underpass on Main Street.

The area on the curb from this point for a distance of ten feet in either direction was carefully checked and it was ascertained there was no nick in the curb in the checked area, nor was any mark observed.

Reference points in the photograph taken by Mr. UNDERWOOD used to locate this point were a lamp post located in the right of the photograph, which appears to be midway between two buildings, a lamp post located on the north side of Elm Street, which is in line with the third row of windows from the southwest corner of the TSBD Building, and which face south, and a traffic sign located on the left side of the photograph, which is to the west of the TSBD Building.

It should be noted that no nick or break in the concrete was observed, in the area checked, nor was there any mark similar to the one in the photographs taken by UNDERWOOD and DILLARD observed in the area checked either by Special Agents

On July 24, 1964, Mr. DILLARD furnished two 8" x 10" glossy prints on each of which there is a 7½" x 7 3/8" photograph. These photographs are identified on the back by the letters "A" and "B". He stated these were prints made from the entire negative, without any cropping, and were copies of two photographs he took of the mark on the curb.

From photograph "A", a blowup was made and a copy of this blowup had been previously furnished by Mr. DILLARD to an Assistant United States Attorney in Dallas. A copy of photograph "B" is differentiated from photograph "A", in that in the upper left-hand background of photograph "B", there can be seen a manhole cover.

1 Using a Bureau-owned 4" x 5" Speedgraphic camera, Special Agent IVAN D. LEE, assisted by Special Agents ROBERT M. BARRETT and C. RAY HALL, took the following described photographs:

- 1) From a point on the south side of Commerce Street and about ten feet west of the east edge of the triple underpass, a photograph was taken looking across Commerce and Main Streets and up Elm Street towards the Texas School Book Depository (TSBD) Building. In the photograph, there is a marker pointing towards a place on the curb on the south side of Main Street twenty-one feet and eleven and one-half inches east from the east edge of the triple underpass.
- 2) From a point on the south side of Commerce Street approximately thirty feet west of the east edge of the triple underpass, a photograph similar to Photograph No. 1 was taken depicting the same marker.
- 3) From a point on the south side of Commerce Street and about nine feet east of the first lamp post located east of the east edge of the underpass, a photograph was taken looking back towards the triple underpass. In this photograph, the marker described in Photograph No. 1 was also used.
- 4) From a point on the south side of Main Street and at the first lamp post located east of the triple underpass on the south side of Main Street, a photograph was taken looking west down Main Street towards the triple underpass and in which the marker described in Photograph No. 1 was used.

- 5) From a point on the north side of Main Street and at the first lamp post located east of the triple underpass on the north side of Main Street, a photograph looking south of west towards the triple underpass was taken and in which the marker described in Photograph No. 1 was used.
- 6) From the north side of Elm Street and from the first lamp post located on the north side of Elm Street and east of the triple underpass, a photograph was taken looking west of south towards the triple underpass and in which the marker described in Photograph No. 1 was used.
- 7) From a point on the north side of Elm Street in a line with the mark on the curb on the south side of Main Street (described above) and the sixth floor window in the TSBD from which the assassin fired the shots which killed President JOHN F. KENNEDY, a photograph was taken looking southwest towards the triple underpass and in which the marker described in Photograph No. 1 was used.
- 8 & 9) The camera was placed at a point twenty-one feet and eleven and one-half inches east of the triple underpass and on the curb on the south side of Main Street. It was pointed directly towards the sixth floor window in the TSBD and two photographs were taken.
- 10) The camera was placed two feet above the curb at a point twenty-one feet and eleven and one-half inches from the east edge of the triple underpass and over the curb of the south side of Main Street and a photograph was taken.

11 & 12) The camera was placed approximately six feet northeast of the curb on the south side of Main Street and focused at a point on the curb twenty-one feet and eleven and one-half inches east of the triple underpass on the south side of Main Street.

In photographs 10, 11 and 12, the ground-glass focusing was used.

13 & 14) These photographs were taken with the camera lens placed at a point twenty-one feet and eleven and one-half inches from the east edge of the triple underpass, on the south side of Main Street on the curb. The camera was pointed directly towards the sixth floor window of the TSBD and SA HALL stood in a line from this point to the sixth floor window and in the middle of Elm Street.

15 & 16 & 17) These photographs were taken by SA LEE standing on a colonnade on the north side of Elm Street and in the same position where ABRAHAM ZAPRUDER stood on November 22, 1963, and from where ZAPRUDER took 8 mm color movie films which depicted the assassination of President KENNEDY. These photographs (15, 16 & 17) were taken looking southwest across Elm Street towards the triple underpass with SA HALL standing in the middle of Elm Street at the same point described in photographs 13 and 14.

The point where SA HALL stood was measured by SA'S LEE, BARRETT and HALL as follows:

From the point previously ascertained as where the bullet struck President KENNEDY

in the head to the point where SA HALL stood in photographs 13 through 17, it is a distance of ninety feet and six inches.

From the point where SA HALL stood in photographs 13 through 17, it is thirty-four feet and ten inches to the second lamp post on the north side of Elm Street, which is the second lamp post east from the east edge of the triple underpass.

From the point where SA HALL stood as described in photographs 13 through 17, it is eighty-two feet and four inches to the first lamp post on the north side of Elm Street, which is the first lamp post east of the east edge of the triple underpass.

The President's Commission, by letter dated July 24, 1964, requested photographs be taken from inside the sixth floor of the Texas School Book Depository southeast corner window, from which the assassination shots were fired, showing "by visual demonstration" the distance between the floor and window sill as well as the height of the opening in the window when the window is half open as it was on the day of the assassination.

The letter from the President's Commission also requested a photograph of a person about 5'9" tall, showing the relative position of the window ledge and the window to a person about OSWALD's height.

On July 29, 1964, Special Agent IVAN D. LEE, assisted by Special Agent ROBERT M. BARRETT, took the following described photographs with a Bureau-owned Speedgraphic camera of the sixth floor window located in the southeast corner of the Texas School Book Depository (TSBD) Building located at 411 Elm Street, Dallas, Texas. This is the window where the shots were fired on November 22, 1963:

Photographs 1, 2 & 3 were taken from a spot north of the window looking south with a surveyor's measuring rod located near the window.

Photograph 4 depicts V. RAY BAGGETT, Bureau employee, sitting on a box near the window with the surveyor's measuring rod nearby. This photograph was also taken from a spot north of the window looking south.

Photograph 5 depicts V. RAY BAGGETT, who stands 5'8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " tall, standing next to the window with the surveyor's measuring rod nearby. This photograph was also taken from a spot north of the window looking south.

Photograph 6 depicts a view of the window from a spot west looking east with the measuring rod standing on the east side of the window.

It is noted that the surveyor's measuring rod is marked in feet and tenths of a foot.

It is also noted that since November 22, 1963, a 5/8" plywood floor has been added to the regular flooring of the sixth floor of the TSBD Building.

By letter dated July 3, 1964, the President's Commission advised that the Attorney General of the United States had received a letter from Mrs. RITA MC CARTY, 2308 Foothill Boulevard, Oakland, California. MC CARTY's letter was of such a nature that she was interested in seeing the Attorney General run for President, and furnished laudatory remarks for the Attorney General and former President KENNEDY. She stated she recently returned from Dallas, Texas, where she had been residing with an individual whose identity she did not furnish but who was allegedly a photographer at the hospital where President KENNEDY was taken following the assassination. MC CARTY indicated this individual had two snapshots of two pieces of skull found on the street following the President's assassination.

On July 9, 1964, RITA MC CARTY was interviewed, at which time she stated she recently accompanied her brother-in-law and sister-in-law to Dallas, Texas, where they stayed briefly with one PAULETTE (last name unknown), a friend of her sister-in-law, who was a photographer at the hospital where President KENNEDY was taken following the assassination. RITA MC CARTY stated she did not observe any photographs taken by this individual, but overheard PAULETTE tell her sister-in-law, Mrs. EVA MC CARTY, that she had seen photographs of pieces of skull found on the street following the President's assassination which were brought to the hospital and photographed.

On July 9, 1964, Mrs. EVA MC CARTY was interviewed at Hayward, California, at which time she identified her friend with whom she resided in Dallas as PAULETTE CAROTHERS (phonetic) and stated she is employed as a photographer at the above-mentioned Dallas hospital.

On July 10, 1964, a search of the 1964 Dallas City Directory reflected a Mrs. PAULETTE CAROTHERS, 5200 Willis, Dallas, Texas, employed as a Photograph Processor at the Methodist Hospital of Dallas.

THETFORD BOLTON BOONE, D.D., Administrator, Methodist Hospital of Dallas, 301 West Colorado Boulevard, advised that he knew nothing of any bone specimen, allegedly coming from the skull of President KENNEDY, being examined or photographed at the Methodist Hospital of Dallas. He said if this bone specimen were examined at Methodist Hospital of Dallas, it probably would have been examined by A. B. CAIRNS, M.D., Chief Pathologist at Methodist Hospital of Dallas.

He said if this particular bone specimen were photographed at Methodist Hospital of Dallas, it would have been done by one of the two employees in the Medical Photography Department, and they would be M. WAYNE BOLLETER, Chief Medical Photographer, or Mrs. PAULETTE CAROTHERS, Processor in the Medical Photography Department.
