At approximately 1:15 p.m., today, the above-captioned woman called the FBI and asked to talk with the Director. The call was transferred to me. Mrs. Oswald was in a highly hysterical frame of mind and started to shout at me that she was being transferred from one person to the other and that she had information to give to Mr. Hoover. I told her I would take the information. She said she wasn't going to pay for the telephone call for it would be a large bill and she indicated she had considerable to say. She told me she did not want to give this information to our local office in Texas but rather wanted me to call back so that the FBI would pay for the call and gave me the telephone number 7-7677 in Fort Worth, Texas.* When I asked her for the address from which she was calling, she hung up in a state of anger.

I see no reason to call this woman or to have our Dallas Office go out and see her again. We have already sent Agents to talk to her on the grounds she had information to give but what she had was a product of her unsettled mind and was nothing of any value whatsoever.

Dallas has been advised of this telephone call and told not to take any action at this time. Dallas in return stated that Mrs. Oswald had called the office about an hour ago and that an Agent was already en route to talk to her and to take whatever information she had to give.

Mr. Norman Redlich of The President's Commission called SA Lyndal L. Shaneyfelt this morning and advised him that he had set Tuesday, September 1, 1964, at 9:00 a.m., as the time to take a deposition from him regarding various examinations that he had made since last testifying before the Commission. Mr. Redlich stated that he would send a confirmatory letter to the Bureau regarding this testimony. He pointed out that he would like testimony on the following matters:

The identification of a photograph made of the alley (made in the back of General Walker's house) that was obtained from Oswald's possessions with the Duo-Reflex camera obtained from Oswald's possessions. (Bulet to Commission 6/9/64). *See Oswald*

The identification of the papers held by Oswald in the photograph in which he is holding two papers and a rifle as being the March 24, 1963, issue of "The Worker" and the March 11, 1963, issue of "The Militant." (Bulet to Commission 6/29/64).

The examination of a photograph made by Mr. Phil Willis that purports to show the photograph of the President's limousine at the instant the first shot was fired. (Bulet to Commission 6/29/64).

Examination of the retouching on the original Life Magazine photograph of Oswald holding the rifle that was used by them to prepare the cover for the 2/21/64 issue. (Bulet to Commission 7/22/64).

Re Cleveland letter to Bureau dated 6/24/64.

Enclosed for the Bureau are eight copies of a letterhead memorandum concerning an interview with captioned individual on August 26, 1964.

The information is being submitted in the form of a letterhead memorandum since the Bureau may desire to disseminate the information especially since it makes reference to the possible murder of Senator BARRY GOLDWATER.

The Bureau will recall that ZEMAITIS has been a "pest" to the Cleveland Office for some time and has furnished many wild stories which are the pure figment of his imagination and are completely unrealistic. The Cleveland Division has, on numerous occasions, attempted to tactfully discourage ZEMAITIS from calling and visiting the Cleveland Office, but to date this has been unsuccessful as is evident from the information set forth in the attached letterhead memorandum. The Cleveland Division will, however, continue its efforts to discourage ZEMAITIS making contact with the Bureau.

His latest request was that the information set forth in the attached letterhead memorandum is of such a vital nature that he wanted to personally furnish it to the Director.

INFORMATION CONCERNING

JONAS ZEMAITIS, 11389 Deborah Drive, Cleveland, Ohio, appeared at the Cleveland Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on August 26, 1964, and stated that he had a number of things he wished to discuss. He said he had learned all information from his contacts with the Anti-Communist Lithuanian Underground; but as he has done in the past, ZEMAITIS refused to identify any individuals with whom he is in contact, refusing to state how and when his contacts are made.

He said the item with number one priority is that instructions have been issued from Moscow that Senator BARRY GOLDWATER is to be killed before the 1964 Presidential Elections. ZEMAITIS had no information as to how this is to be done or who is to actually murder Senator GOLDWATER. He went on to say that if it is impossible to murder Senator GOLDWATER before the elections, a number of riots are to be started all over the United States shortly after the election, and these riots will be far more destructive than anything that has taken place in the United States heretofore. ZEMAITIS had no further information regarding this alleged plot against the life of Senator GOLDWATER.

ZEMAITIS then stated that CYRUS KATON, the well-known Cleveland industrialist, is to provide money for Communists operating all around the world. He did not know whether KATON is spending his own money or is using money being furnished him by the Soviet government. He went on to point out that KATON has a group of prostitutes working throughout the United States to gather information which KATON personally transmits to the Soviet Union. He stated that the prostitutes are operating in areas where defense plants and military bases are located. ZEMAITIS was unable to name anyone participating in this activity and had no information as to how these persons are being recruited to work for KATON. He also mentioned groups are being organized to commit sabotage in all important industries in the United States in the event of war.

According to ZEMAITIS, the People's Republic of China and the Soviet Union have reached an agreement whereby Australia will be taken over by the Chinese without any interference from the Soviet government, and the USSR will take over all of Africa without any interference from the Red Chinese government.

With respect to LEE HARVEY OSWALD, ZEMAITIS stated OSWALD had been told by his Soviet superiors that the government would be overthrown at the time he assassinated President KENNEDY. He said that JACK RUBY is a part of the CYRUS EATON apparatus operating in the United States; and when it was discovered OSWALD had been arrested, orders were given in Moscow for RUBY to go away with OSWALD. RUBY was told the people in the United States would sympathize with his action of murdering OSWALD and great throngs would congregate at the jail to demand his release. He said the Soviet government was under the impression the American people would rise up in indignation over OSWALD killing the President and for this reason would come to RUBY's rescue.

ZEMAITIS said the Soviet government desires that President LYNDON JOHNSON be re-elected because they know he can be bought with "money."

In an interview with the Special Agent in Charge of the FBI on May 9, 1960, ZEMAITIS was highly critical of the United States for allowing an airplane used on a spy mission to be shot down by the Russians.

On February 28, 1962, ZEMAITIS appeared at the Cleveland Office of the FBI and advised that Astronaut JOHN GLENN is HITLER in disguise.

ZEMAITIS has been in contact with officials of the United States government including representatives of the Central Intelligence Agency, Department of Defense, White House, and the FBI in Washington, D. C. He has made statements to representatives of the FBI that JACQUELINE KENNEDY is a Communist and gave permission for her husband to be assassinated.

SUBJECT: LEE HARVEY OSWALD
INTERNAL SECURITY - RUSSIA - CUBA

This deals with the latest (8/24/64) rantings of Oswald's mother, Marguerite Oswald. The details which follow in chronological sequence clearly show the deterioration of Mrs. Oswald's mental processes.

At 12:10 p.m., 8/24/64, she called the Dallas Office and asked to speak to Special Agent in Charge Shanklin. When advised he was not then available, she said that perhaps she should contact "Herbert Hoover." She said she had nothing to do with the assassination, but that in her view everyone else was under suspicion. She inferred she had information which might involve an FBI Agent. She refused to discuss this over the telephone but indicated a willingness to be interviewed by Agents from Fort Worth. At 1:15 p.m., by referral from the Director's office, she spoke telephonically with Assistant Director W. C. Sullivan. She said she desired to furnish information and Mr. Sullivan told her he would accept it. She said she was not going to pay for the telephone call as she had considerable to say and it would be costly. She asked to be called back and furnished an indistinct telephone number. When asked for the address from which she was calling, she angrily hung up. She did not furnish any information to Mr. Sullivan.

At 2:23 p.m., 8/24/64, she called Washington Field Office and spoke to Special Agent (SA) Robert P. Finzel. She claimed she received an anonymous call earlier in the day, the caller advising her that the hotel bill of Hugh Aynesworth of "The Dallas Morning News" was being paid by the FBI. She said she then anonymously telephoned Aynesworth, who greeted her as "Lu" (phonetic). She claimed to have asked Aynesworth how he would like another FBI scoop to which he replied, "Oh, it is you Mrs. Hosty." From this she asserted that Agent Hosty or his wife is furnishing information to Aynesworth. She further alleged that she learned from an informant, whom she refused to identify, that former Agent John Fain of Dallas paid Oswald's fine when he was arrested in New Orleans in 8/63.

On the afternoon of 8/24/64 she was contacted at her home by Dallas Agents. She refused to be interviewed stating she gave the information in her possession to Mr. Sullivan in Washington. She said she "decided to go to the top"; that she would not give the information to "ordinary Agents" and that she did not want "to get involved." She volunteered that she had some "gossip" to pass along and related that while taping a television program in New York on 8/7/64 on which she appeared (a panel show) with Les Crane, moderator, and Melvin Belli, Ruby's former lawyer, she "outsmarted" Belli on five occasions and the audience "absolutely loved it." She said she learned after this program that Belli conferred with Ruby in his cell which she did not think was proper as Belli no longer represented Ruby.

OBSERVATIONS:

Mrs. Oswald's actions on 8/24/64 are ludicrous and her assertions are patently ridiculous. From them and from other wild allegations she has made in the past, it is clear to see that she is deteriorating mentally. It is of interest to note that Agent Hosty's wife is Janet Ethel, nee Perry. The records of Municipal Court in New Orleans show that Oswald, after his arrest in 8/63, on 8/12/63 elected to pay a fine of \$10 rather than serve ten days in jail. Moreover, former SA Fain has appeared before the Commission and offered sworn testimony concerning the nature and extent of his association with Oswald.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the President's Commission be advised of Mrs. Oswald's most recent rantings and that no further action be taken. Attached for approval is a letter to the President's Commission with a copy to Dallas for information purposes.

Enclosed for recipient offices are one copy each of self-explanatory letter from the Commission dated 8/23/64 and the enclosures thereto. Bureau regards the enclosures to Commission's letter to total six items rather than four indicated in incoming.

Note that all of the communications referred to in the first paragraph of page one of incoming are communications in the Oswald case, except document described as report of Special Agent (SA) Clements dated 12/14/63 at Dallas which is, in fact, Agent Clements' report in the Ruby case. Bureau sees no association between information on referenced page of Agent Clements' report in the Ruby case to the allegation of Sylvia Odio and the Commission will be advised of this. The 3/13/64 report of SA Heitman referred to in second paragraph of page two of incoming is the Dallas report of that date in the Osvaldo Aurelio Pino Pino matter, Dallas file 105-1579.

Indicated offices carefully review enclosed material and immediately institute inquiry as requested in incoming.

Dallas is to interview Guillermo Othon and Osvaldo Pino Pino. In connection with Commission's request that investigation be conducted to determine who it was Sylvia Odio saw in late 9/63, Dallas interview a representative number of the leaders in the Dallas area of the "Jure" and "Dre" organizations. If any information is available concerning the identity of pro-Castro individuals in the Dallas area who attempted to infiltrate anti-Castro groups, interview such individuals.

In connection with requested inquiry concerning the sale of Continental Trailways bus tickets from Dallas to Laredo or points beyond on 9/24 - 25/63 if the Continental Company no longer maintains records of this nature, simply so state. Note that from numerous factors which have been developed in this investigation, it appears highly improbable, if not impossible, for Oswald to have been at the Odio apartment in Dallas on nights of 9/24 through 26/63. In view of this and in light of Sylvia Odio's mental and nervous condition, Bureau believes that the most productive method of disproving her allegation lies in investigation to develop further specifics concerning her mental status and to establish her reputation for veracity. Note that Mrs. C. L. Connell, the source of the information concerning the claims of Sylvia Odio, advised that on 11/23/63 Odio indicated she was aware Oswald had made talks to small groups of Cuban refugees in Dallas and that she personally considered him brilliant and clever and that he captivated groups to whom he spoke. Further that Odio claimed a call had been made in recent months by a Cuban associate of hers to an unknown source in New Orleans concerning Oswald and that in turn the New Orleans source reported that Oswald was a "double agent" attempting to infiltrate the Dallas Cuban refugee group and that he should not be trusted.

When appearing before the Commission Sylvia Odio denied making any comments to Mrs. Connell concerning Oswald's appearance before Cuban refugee groups in Dallas. She further denied indicating to Connell that she considered Oswald clever and that he captivated groups to whom he spoke. It does not appear that the Commission questioned her concerning her reported comments to Mrs. Connell concerning check with the New Orleans source.

Dallas is to reinterview Sylvia Odio concerning these points. Question her specifically if she made such representations to Mrs. Connell. During interview develop background data including such information as the identity and whereabouts of her former husband, and her other relatives in the U. S. It is desired that her former husband be interviewed to develop specifics concerning Sylvia Odio's mental stability and her reputation for veracity. Dallas, where considered appropriate, set forth leads for interview of other relatives of Odio for same purpose. Dallas note that according to enclosures to incoming Odio fainted at her place of work on the day of the assassination and was taken to a hospital in Irving, Texas. Conduct inquiry pertinent to this incident. Dallas conduct inquiry at Odio's places of employment in the Dallas area to determine her general reputation.

New Orleans conduct inquiry at inexpensive hotels in the areas indicated in incoming to determine if you can place Oswald in New Orleans on the night of 9/24/63. In this connection check at all YECAs in New Orleans. New Orleans note that according to Father McChann, (page 7, Secret Service letter 5/5/64) Sylvia Odio's uncle is a Dr. Augustine Guitart, a physics professor at Xavier University in New Orleans who was frequently in telephonic contact with Odio. Contact Dr. Guitart to develop data re Odio's background, her mental condition and her reputation for veracity. No action is desired by New Orleans concerning Evaristo Gilberto Rodriguez referred to in first paragraph, page two of incoming, as investigation concerning his allegations has been reported and furnished to Commission.

Miami contact headquarters "Jure" in effort to locate and interview Manuel Ray. If Ray is presently located in Puerto Rico, set forth lead to San Juan to interview him concerning his knowledge of Sylvia Odio.

Dallas note that page three of Secret Service, Miami, 4/24/64 report (document 1426) shows receipt of informant information to the effect that police of Puerto Rico made inquiries about Sylvia Odio, however, basis of inquiries were unknown. Note that Odio admitted suffering from a mental condition in Puerto Rico and there is some information that she may have deserted her husband and children there. When sufficient background concerning Odio, her residence and acquaintances in Puerto Rico has been obtained, Dallas set forth lead to San Juan to handle appropriate inquiry.

Noting request in first paragraph on page four of incoming, leads in this matter are to be sent by teletype and Bureau is to be currently informed of all developments, including completion of negative inquiries, by teletype summary. Deadline for completion of inquiry and submission of letterheads is 9/11/64.

NOTE:

Odio, who admittedly is suffering from nervous-mental condition and has been under care of psychiatrist, claims that Oswald visited her in company of two Cubans at her apartment in Dallas on night 9/26 or 27/63. She says that unidentified Cuban who accompanied Oswald told her telephonically following day that Oswald spoke of necessity to kill the President. Oswald was in NO until sometime during the day of 9/25/63 for he obtained an unemployment check from the mail which was not deposited in his box prior to 5 a.m. 9/25/63 and he cashed it at a store in NO which did not open until 8 a.m. that day. 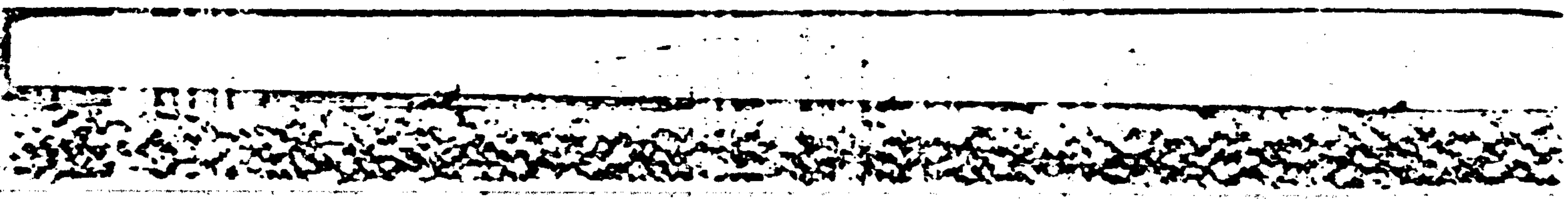

NOTE: Miss Miller by letter 12-4-63, posed several questions concerning the assassination and made substantially the same allegations as in her 7-27-64, letter. She claims to have met an individual in Louisville on 9-7-63, who she feels was Oswald. Louisville was instructed to interview Miller inasmuch as the whereabouts of Oswald during September, 1963, are not positively known although it is suspected he was in New Orleans during this month. Louisville interviewed her on 8-7-64, and she maintains on the night of 9-7-63, she and a friend Harold Caddell met three young men, one of whom resembled Oswald, and to whom Caddell spoke to possibly in the Russian language. She claims this man was carrying a case, and she feels it could have held the assassination rifle.

The Bureau may desire to submit enclosed Mexico City map or copy thereof, to Legat, Mexico, for his examination and identification of markings.

It will be observed the enclosed LHM relates that Mr. LIEBELER called MARINA OSWALD at her home in Richardson, Texas, on the evening of August 26, 1964. MARINA has said LIEBELER asked her several questions, including: (1) Did LEE HARVEY OSWALD regularly read newspapers during the OSWALDs' residence at New Orleans; (2) several questions concerning the unemployment checks received by OSWALD; and (3) whether OSWALD went to Mexico the day following MARINA's departure from New Orleans for Texas, or did he stay in New Orleans and leave on a later date.

It will further be observed that MARINA OSWALD has stated PRISCILLA JOHNSON, writer, who is collaborating with MARINA on a book, is presently the house guest of MARINA.

MARINA further advised that visiting in her home at the time of LIEBELER's call was Miss JOAN CONNALLY, Secretary to WILLIAM MC KENZIE, a Dallas attorney who has performed legal work for MARINA OSWALD. On August 27, 1964, James Wesley Liebeler of the President's Commission, advised the Federal Bureau of Investigation headquarters, Washington, D. C., that in a telephone conversation on the previous evening Marina Oswald had told him she had located a bus ticket stub issued by the Mexican Bus Line, Transportes del Norte. Mr. Liebeler requested that Marina Oswald be interviewed concerning this bus ticket stub and that such bus ticket stub be obtained.

MARINA OSWALD was interviewed at her residence, 629 Belt Line Road, Richardson, Texas. Mr. DECLAN FORD, an advisor of MARINA OSWALD, was present during this interview.

MARINA advised that on the evening of August 26, 1964, Mr. JAMES WESLEY LIEBELER, a representative of the President's Commission, telephonically contacted MARINA at her residence to inquire of her concerning several matters in the investigation of the assassination, including an inquiry as to whether LEE HARVEY OSWALD had left New Orleans for Mexico the day following the departure of MARINA from New Orleans to Texas, or if OSWALD had stayed on in New Orleans for a while before his departure for Mexico. MARINA said that when Mr. LIEBELER asked this question it recalled to her that she had, on about August 17 or 18, 1964, found among some personal effects belonging to her, a stub of a Mexican bus ticket. She said she told Mr. LIEBELER about this ticket and that she had found it in a paperback pamphlet which OSWALD had brought back from Mexico. MARINA said these items, as well as the other items described below, had been discovered by her in a small brown suitcase which contained old magazines, personal letters, personal photographs of her children, greeting cards and books. This suitcase and its contents had been in MARINA's possession at the PAINE house at the time of the assassination. Following the assassination, these items were delivered to her. She does not recall now exactly when she acquired them or from whom.

MARINA made available these pertinent items which are described as follows:

(1) A paper stub of a bus ticket issued by Transportes del Norte showing travel from Mexico, D. F. to Laredo, Texas. The price shown is \$93.75 (Mx-Pesos). The stub number is 13688. A block stamp bearing this legend appears on the back of the stub, "Transportes del Norte, Set. 30, 1963, Mexico D.F., J. Gascon". The date shown is September 30, 1963. MARINA stated she found this stub inside the paperback pamphlet entitled "This Week - Esta Semana" which is described immediately below.

(2) A paperback pamphlet entitled "This Week - Esta Semana", for the week September 28 - October 4, 1963, which is

written in the English and the Spanish languages. This book is a well-known tourist and entertainment guide for the Republic of Mexico and is published on a weekly basis. MARINA exhibited handwriting which appears on page 38 of this pamphlet. Some of this handwriting is in English and there is some Russian handwriting. MARINA identified the handwriting as that of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. She also pointed out markings made by a pen on pages 29, 31, 50, 54 and 78, but she could not identify these markings as having been made by LEE HARVEY OSWALD or any other person.

(3) A book with cover torn off entitled "Learning Russian", published by Foreign Languages Publishing House, Moscow. Author is NINA POTAPOVA. On page 12 of this book the Russian alphabet is printed and part of the alphabet is torn out. MARINA remarked that she had been exhibited by a representative of the President's Commission pieces of paper on which had been pasted printed letters cut from some book or magazine. She said therefore this item might be of interest in the investigation. She identified this book as a book used by OSWALD in his study of the Russian language.

(4) A guide map of Mexico City, folded, published by Editorial Flecha, printed in Mexico, D. F., which contains a large map of Mexico City on which appear three enclosed circle markings. There also appears on the back a smaller map which contains three circle markings, as well as a line drawn along streets in Mexico City. In the index opposite this smaller map, several locations are checked. MARINA identified this map as being the property of OSWALD. She said he probably obtained it in Mexico on his trip there.

(5) A paperback pamphlet entitled FIESTA BRAVA, published by Pemex Travel Club, Mexico, D. F., which describes the bullfight. MARINA stated this was also the property of OSWALD and was probably obtained by him in Mexico on his trip there and brought back by him to Dallas.

(6) A library pass in the name of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, dated April, 1962, written in the Russian language. This pass was used by OSWALD to obtain books in public libraries in Russia.

MARINA stated she had probably seen these pamphlets and book on several occasions, but did not think them of particular pertinence in this investigation. She said she did not know that the bus ticket stub was contained in one of the pamphlets.

Miss Josephine Miller, Drift, Kentucky, was advised on August 19, 1964, that it may not be possible to conceal her identity from Howard Caddell in view of the nature of the inquiry and the circumstances of this matter. She said the main reason she did not want her name mentioned is that she would be fearful of retaliation by Caddell if he is in any manner connected with an international organization which effectively eliminated President Kennedy. She recalled Caddell recently mentioned in a letter he had had a nervous breakdown. She now believes, after studied thought, that Caddell may be ready for or has had a mental breakdown. She reiterated she firmly believes the man she saw in Louisville, Kentucky, in September, 1963, was Lee Harvey Oswald or his double.

Mr. Howard Andrew Caddell, Room #5, Stearns Hotel, Stearns, Kentucky, advised as follows:

He was born at Wallins Creek, Kentucky, on June 27, 1927. He was in the U. S. Navy from August 13, 1944, to April 2, 1946, at which time he received an honorable discharge. He graduated from Berea College, Berea, Kentucky, in 1952. He was married to the former Ursula Boehm, who was born in Germany but is a citizen of the United States. He met his wife at Berea, Kentucky, where she resided and where she attended school. She came to the United States in 1939. He and his wife are divorced and she resides at 715 Emery, Longmont, Colorado.

He has been employed in the past as a school teacher. During the year of 1962-1963, he was employed by the Department of Education in Florida and instructed inmates at the State Prison, Raiford, Florida. While working at Raiford, he maintained a residence at 5032 Redstone Drive, Jacksonville, Florida. He was experiencing domestic trouble in the spring and summer of 1963 and departed Florida.

In the summer of 1963, he went to Prestonsburg, Kentucky, to see Jack and Nancy Hodges, who are friends. He attended college with Jack Hodges. At the time he arrived in Prestonsburg, he was hard pressed financially and received assistance from his friends. He obtained employment while in Prestonsburg with the Forcum and Lannon Company, home office at Dyersburg, Tennessee. This firm is in the construction business and had a contract on a sewer project at Prestonsburg. He had duties of a field office manager for this firm at Prestonsburg. He was in Prestonsburg for some three or four months' time and resided at the Blue Sky Motel.

While in Prestonsburg, he did a "little scouting" for State Police Trooper Don Gunbel. He furnished this Trooper with information concerning the illegal sale of liquor in Prestonsburg. He has never been employed by the U. S. Government, other than his service in the U. S. Navy. He has never been employed by the State of Kentucky.

While in college he had two years study of the German language, but is unable to carry on a conversation in the language. He knows a few words of Spanish and French, but is unable to carry on a conversation in either language.

He does not know anyone by the name of Harvey. The only person he could recall by either the first or last name of Harvey was the baseball player Harvey Haddix. He did meet Sam Marsh in Prestonsburg; Marsh was working there for the Lite Cast Products Company, Louisville, Kentucky. The Lite Cast Company had a construction job at the Jenny-Willey State Park. The last time he heard from Marsh, he (Marsh) was employed by West Broadway Motors, Louisville, Kentucky, as a salesman. He believes Marsh is from the State of Washington or Oregon.

In the fall of 1963, Caddell went to Louisville, Kentucky, where he was employed as a teacher at Shawnee Junior High School. He taught there for the school year of 1963-1964. He will teach school at the Stearns Elementary School, Stearns, Kentucky, the school year of 1964-1965.

Caddell advised he did not recall he had ever informed anyone he was employed by the C.I.A. or the Central Intelligence Agency. He did say he used intoxicants at times but did not ever drink to the point where he would not recall remarks he made. He advised he had never informed anyone he had been employed in any position where he had duties of guarding or protecting the President of the United States. He further advised he had never made any remark indicating he had been in the "Bay of Pigs Invasion" or that he had taken part in any attempted invasion of Cuba. He did not know anyone presently living in Cuba; he had attended Berea College with one or two students who were from Cuba. He did not "bump" anyone while walking along the streets of Louisville; he only weighed 110 pounds and he considered he would be at a disadvantage in starting trouble. He was unable to speak Russian. He did not recall ever talking with three men on the streets of Louisville he described as "pickpockets".

Caddell knew Hugo Miller during the time he attended Berea College and Miller lives in the vicinity of Prestonsburg and teaches at McDowell, Kentucky. Hugo Miller has a sister, Josephine Miller, and while working in Prestonsburg, he became acquainted with this individual. He did often date Josephine Miller while in Prestonsburg.

Josephine Miller owns rental property in Prestonsburg and also received income from coal interests. There were occasions when Josephine Miller did visit him at his motel. Josephine Miller "did get the idea" Caddell was planning to marry her and Caddell jokingly would remark that when she sold her property and was able to take care of him in the manner he was accustomed to living, he would marry her.

Caddell denied he ever informed Josephine Miller he was employed by the C.I.A. or ever had duties of

protecting the President. He denied he ever informed her he took part in the Bay of Pigs invasion in Cuba. Caddell does have some scars on his face and body which he received when a child. He denied he informed Miss Miller he was employed on a "secret dope investigation" in Floyd County.

He stated the reason he departed Prestonsburg was to accept employment as a teacher in a school in Louisville; he did not inform Miss Miller he had been placed there by a "higher authority". Miss Miller did make a trip to Louisville in September of 1963, at which time Caddell, saw her. Miss Miller made the trip to Louisville with Mr. and Mrs. Paul Hayes. Mr. Hayes is an attorney in Prestonsburg and is active in politics. Mrs. Hayes and Miss Miller made the trip to "keep an eye on Mrs. Hayes". At the time Miss Miller was in Louisville, she and Caddell did make a visit to some bar where they had a few drinks. He recalls as they were leaving the bar, they did stop and talk with three young men for a few moments time. As he recalled, one of the men did have a musical instrument case in his hand and these three men were playing at some local bar. He did not talk with these men in any foreign language nor did he inform Miss Miller they were "pickpockets". He had never seen these men before. He did not "bump" people while he and Miss Miller were walking along the streets in Louisville; he may have turned his shoulder when walking through a crowd.

Caddell advised Miss Miller was known to drink intoxicants and on occasions would reach the point where she was intoxicated. Miss Miller is the type person who feels she "has to carry her family"; that is, assist the family. Miss Miller often writes letters to the editors of various publications. Caddell advised he believed Miss Miller was "demented" if she had stated he informed her he had been employed by the C.I.A., had duties of protecting the President, had a part in the invasion of Cuba, or spoke with the three young men in Louisville in a foreign language.

Caddell did call Miss Miller on the telephone at times when he would play a new record where she could hear it; he has held the telephone where she could hear the radio. There have been times when Miss Miller would call

him at 3:00 A.M. and would talk for an hour's time; he estimated he had never talked with her longer than twenty or thirty minutes when he would make the call.

Caddell stated he did not know anyone who resembled Lee Harvey Oswald. While in the U. S. Navy, he served his entire time in the United States. He had been in Canada for a short time on one occasion but has visited no other foreign country.

Caddell advised it was correct he had made some remark he did not want people to know he was in Louisville; this being due to the fact he does not want to be contacted by his former wife's creditors. He further stated since he had furnished information concerning illegal liquor sales in Prestonsburg, he did not think it would be safe for him to visit there.

BASIS FOR INQUIRY

The following investigation was conducted in an effort to locate one PAULA RUSIONI who reportedly traveled on Transportes del Norte bus from Mexico City, Mexico, to Laredo, Texas, on October 2-3, 1963. According to the records of Transportes del Norte (TDN), portions of TDN Ticket Number 9511 cover travel from Mexico City to Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico, and from Monterrey to Laredo, Texas. TDN records reflect these tickets were utilized by PAULA RUSIONI to travel on TDN Bus Number 332, which departed Mexico City at 8:30 a.m. on October 2, 1963, and arrived at Monterrey at about 9:30 p.m. the same date. Travel from Monterrey to Laredo was performed on TDN Bus Number 373, which departed Monterrey shortly thereafter and arrived at Laredo at about 2:00 a.m., October 3, 1963.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

Mr. HARRY SMITH, Manager, Greyhound Bus Lines, Laredo, Texas, advised on July 17, 1964, after viewing Transportes del Norte ticket stubs numbered 9511 that he was in agreement that the tickets numbered 9511 were reissues of Ticket Number 39532, and that the purpose of the reissuance of these tickets was that there should have been four portions of the ticket rather than just two tickets. Mr. SMITH stated that there should have been a ticket for Laredo, Texas, to Monterrey, Monterrey to Mexico City, Mexico City to Monterrey, and Monterrey to Laredo, Texas, in order to complete the round trip ticket.

In this regard it is to be noted that HARRY SMITH, on May 13, 1964, advised that TDN Ticket Number 39532 was sold at Laredo, Texas, on September 10, 1963, and was a round trip ticket to Mexico; however, SMITH was not certain if this ticket was to Mexico City or some other destination in Mexico.

Reference is made to the telephone call of Mr. Norman Redlich of your staff on July 22, 1964, requesting the preparation of visual aids depicting the whereabouts of Lee Harvey Oswald after the assassination and the location of eyewitnesses who saw Oswald in the vicinity of the Tippit killing.

Enclosed are four glossy prints each of the following visual aids which were prepared from information selected by the Commission from documented records:

1. Whereabouts of Lee Harvey Oswald between 12:33 P. M. and 1:50 P. M. on November 22, 1963. The distances indicated are based upon speedometer readings recorded by Inspector Leo J. Gauthier while tracing the described route in his automobile on August 17, 1964.

NOTE: The Commission's request in this matter was followed continuously resulting in conferences held with Redlich on July 23, 1964 (Memo, Gauthier to Callahan 7-24-64). A preliminary chart was submitted to Redlich on 7-28-64 at which time he decided to hold this matter in abeyance until such time as the Commission could furnish additional information. This matter was again discussed with Redlich on 8-12-64 and on 8-26-64. He approved the preliminary charts.
