Mr. HERALD advised that Mrs. WHITWORTH stated OSWALD had remained in the store for approximately twenty minutes and that when he and his wife left they entered a 1955 blue sedan, possibly a Ford, which automobile was parked directly in front of the window of the store. He stated that Mrs. WHITWORTH said that OSWALD did not bring any weapon in the store and that she did not see him with any weapon of any kind at that time. He stated that Mrs. WHITWORTH advised them she had seen OSWALD on television and his pictures in the newspapers, and she was certain that he was the person who had been in her store.

Mr. HERALD stated that Mrs. WHITWORTH advised them that there was another woman in the store at the time the OSWALDs were in there. He advised that he and Miss CAMPBELL, upon leaving the store, telephonically contacted this other woman, and she told them basically the same story that Mrs. WHITWORTH had told them. Mr. HERALD further advised that Mrs. WHITWORTH had referred OSWALD to a local sporting goods store in Irving.

 EVARISTO GILBERTO RODRIGUEZ, 1239 Chartres Street, was interviewed at his residence, at which time he was referred to his previous interview with Special Agents of the FBI on May 12, 1964. On May 12, 1964 RODRIGUEZ had related that, as best he could recall, it was in September, 1963 at approximately 3:30 a.m. or 4:00 a.m., day of the week not recalled, that two white males entered the Habana Bar and sat at a table opposite the center of the bar. At that time RODRIGUEZ had stated that based on photographs he had seen of LEE HARVEY OSWALD after the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY he was then able to state that one of these two men was, in his opinion, LEE HARVEY OSWALD. On May 12, 1964 RODRIGUEZ described the man who accompanied the person he believed to be OSWALD as age about 32, a little taller than OSWALD (about 5'7") and perhaps a little heavier, with a medium build and muscular biceps.

On July 30, 1964 RODRIGUEZ was shown the photographs of six white males, including a photo depicted in the President's Commission Exhibit #237. RODRIGUEZ was asked if the persons depicted in any of these photographs was identical with the person who had accompanied LEE HARVEY OSWALD to the Habana Bar as described by RODRIGUEZ on May 12, 1964. RODRIGUEZ viewed each one of the six photographs slowly and carefully and then stated that none of these photographs was identical with the person who had accompanied OSWALD to the Habana Bar on the occasion described by him on May 12, 1964. He then said he did not recognize the persons depicted in these six photographs as persons he had ever seen before. RODRIGUEZ was then asked if any of the persons depicted in these six photographs in any way bore any resemblance to the man who had allegedly accompanied LEE HARVEY OSWALD to the Habana Bar as described by RODRIGUEZ on May 12, 1964. He then, again, reviewed all six of these photographs and then remarked that the person depicted in one of the photographs (which is identical to President's Commission #237) has shoulders that resemble those of the man whom RODRIGUEZ had seen with LEE HARVEY OSWALD in the Habana Bar as described by RODRIGUEZ on May 12, 1964. However, RODRIGUEZ stated that the person depicted in that photo (identical with the President's Commission Exhibit #237) did not resemble the man RODRIGUEZ had seen with OSWALD in the Habana Bar in any other way except for the way his hair receded on the sides of his head.

RODRIGUEZ reiterated then that the person depicted in the photo which is identical to the President's Commission Exhibit #237 was not identical with the man RODRIGUEZ had seen with LEE HARVEY OSWALD in the Habana Bar.

In response to inquiry, RODRIGUEZ explained that on the occasion when LEE HARVEY OSWALD was seen by RODRIGUEZ in the Habana Bar with another man, RODRIGUEZ did not clearly see the face of the man that had accompanied LEE HARVEY OSWALD to the Habana Bar. RODRIGUEZ added that he recalls the physical build of the man who accompanied OSWALD to the Habana Bar better than his face. However, RODRIGUEZ was positive that the man depicted in the photograph which is identical to the President's Commission Exhibit #237, was not identical to the man that RODRIGUEZ had observed with LEE HARVEY OSWALD in the Habana Bar as described by RODRIGUEZ to Special Agents of the FBI on May 12, 1964.

Mrs. ANNETTE WRIGHT, Home Counselor, St. Thomas Street Housing Authority, 909 Felicity Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised there is no building designated IA or an apartment designated IA in the St. Thomas project. She advised that the fifth block of the project on St. Mary Street is actually located in the 600 numbered block of St. Mary Street. She stated she would make a thorough search and review of tenants' records for all buildings located on St. Mary Street to determine if any units were let during the pertinent period to a B. Mrs. ANNE WRIGHT, Home Counselor, St. Thomas Street Housing Authority, 909 Felicite Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised a thorough search and review of records of tenants located in buildings on St. Mary Street for the year 1963, revealed no information indicating any unit had been let to a B. ARIBO, LEE HARVEY OSWALD, or RUBY. Further, she said the names of these individuals were not contained on any of the tenants' records as guests or observers.

Mrs. WRIGHT said as Home Counselor she makes visits to each tenant throughout the project, and she has received no information of any kind that OSWALD or RUBY having been in the project or having stayed in the project. She said in this regard that she was certain had there been any "look-alikes" in the area that word of it would have reached her or some member of her staff.

Mrs. WRIGHT said the name E. ARIBO is totally unfamiliar to her and that it is not contained in records of the project as a past or present tenant or employee.

Mrs. WRIGHT said she is familiar with pictures of OSWALD and RUBY as they appeared in the newspapers and on television and she is unable to recall anyone in the project during the pertinent period who bore a resemblance to either individual.

Mrs. WRIGHT advised that at the present time there are no tenants now residing on St. Mary Street who were located there during June and July, 1963.

SUBJECT: PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION
REQUEST FOR VISUAL AIDS

Additional visual aids have been requested by the Commission's staff after their deadline for exhibits was met last Friday, 9-11-64.

Mr. Wesley J. Liebeler, who is writing the chapter which deals with Oswald's motives, selected certain photographs of Oswald which he desires to be arranged into five visual aids. According to Liebeler, it is intended that these photographs reveal the defiant expression on Oswald's face after his arrest. One interesting outcome according to Liebeler was the refusal of Messrs. Rankin, Willens and Redlich to authorize the use of a photograph showing Oswald handcuffed with clenched fist upraised for the reason that the appearance of the photograph in the report would bring up the question of the "Communist salute." (see attached). Liebeler felt the photograph should be used to show Oswald's general attitude of defiance to the circumstances of his arrest because it was germane to Oswald's motives. However, he understands that the Commission's policy with reference to the use of visual aids was the exhibits should have a material significance to the text and not be used merely for illustrations that do not in any way assist the reader to understand the text.

Mr. David Slawson of the Commission's staff, who is handling the chapter covering Oswald's foreign conspiracy, requested three additional exhibits depicting Oswald while in U.S.S.R.

The last of the material needed to complete this request was received from Liebeler at 11:00 a.m., 9-15-64. Mr. Willens advised that he had cut off all requests for additional charts by his staff

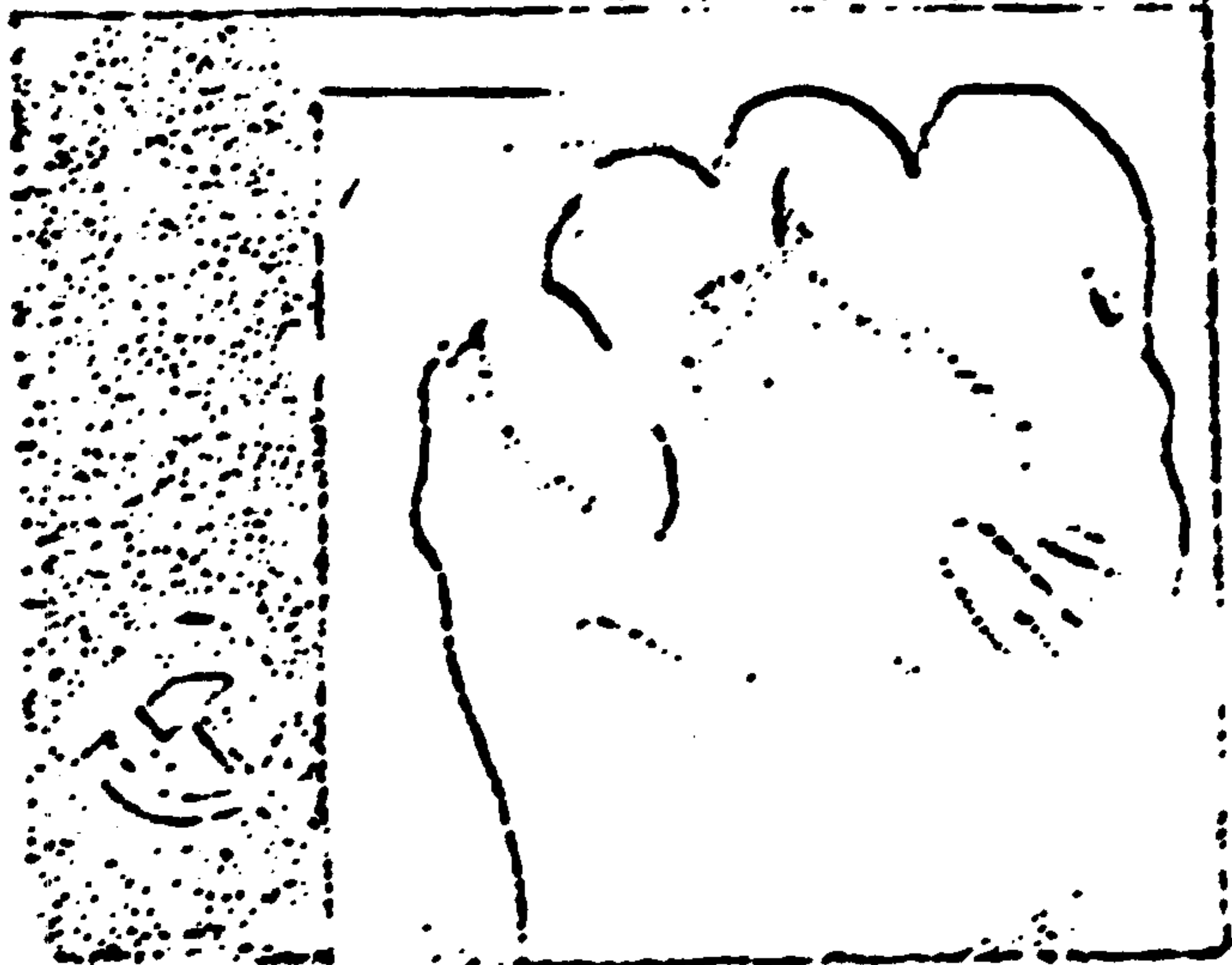

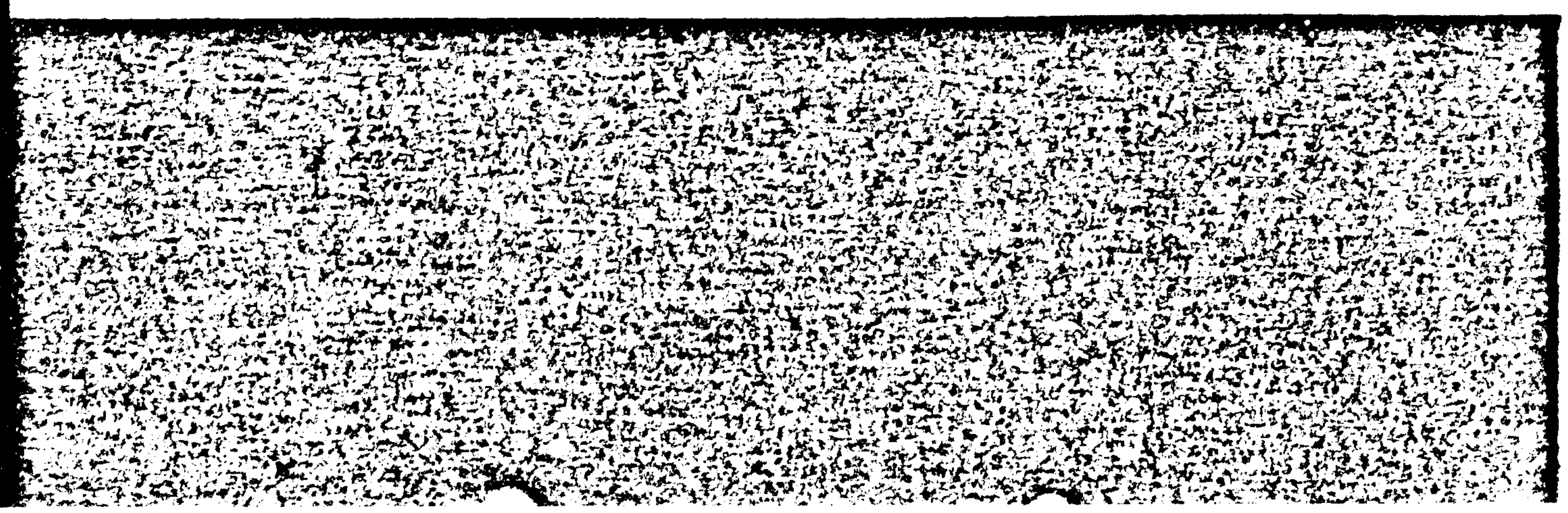

On September 11, 1964, the President's Commission verbally requested a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation headquarters, Washington, D. C., to have Mr. Roy S. Truly, Warehouse Superintendent, Texas School Book Depository, Dallas, Texas, interviewed to determine the following:

- (1) Weight of each of the "Second Rolling Reader" cartons when they are loaded with the "Second Rolling Reader" books.
- (2) The approximate weights of the other two cartons with their contents, that were located at the 6th floor window and which were among the four cartons described as Exhibit C-40.
- (3) If there were any cartons on the 6th floor which could not be handled by one male individual.

There is attached the results of interview with Mr. Roy S. Truly on September 11, 1964 containing the requested information.

Mr. ROY S. TRULY, Warehouse Superintendent, Texas School Book Depository, advised that the approximate weight of each of the "Second Rolling Reader" cartons when they are loaded with "Second Rolling Reader" books is eight pounds.

He advised that the approximate weights of the two cartons with their contents that were located at the sixth floor window of the Texas School Book Depository and which were among the four cartons previously identified as Exhibit C-40, would be 55 pounds each.

Mr. TRULY advised that there were no cartons on the sixth floor of the Texas School Book Depository on November 22, 1963, which could not have been handled by one male individual.
