Synopsis:

BRICH LINTROP, Z #72988D1, born 11/4/04, Estonia, interviewed aboard SS AMERICAN FLYER, Norfolk, Va. He claims that about four days after assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY he was in Constantinople, Turkey, as a crew member aboard the SS THUNDERBIRD. He met unidentified Turkish Army officer. Officer told him there were rumors in Turkey that Madame NHU of South Vietnam may have been responsible for assassination; that an unidentified monk from South Vietnam had the money for the assassins; but that the monk had disappeared with the money. LINTROP felt that this information was a poor rumor. LINTROP claims had never met LEE HARVEY OSWALD or JACK RUBY and knows nothing about them other than what he has read in newspapers and magazines.

DETAILS:

On September 14, 1964, the United States Secret Service advised the Jacksonville Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that JOSEPH STALLINGS, a Florida Auxiliary Patrolman, had contacted them and furnished them information concerning the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY.

On September 16, 1964, Mr. JOSEPH STALLINGS advised that he was on duty on September 8, 1964, with Trooper A. J. FORSYTHE. He was approached by a person who later identified himself as (first name unknown) LINTROP. LINTROP had been drinking and was carrying a beer with him but did

not appear to be intoxicated. LINTROP requested transportation to his ship, the SS AMERICAN FLYER, and back to the Seminole Hotel in Jacksonville.

STALLINGS advised that while en route LINTROP asked them if they knew anything about the assassination of President KENNEDY. LINTROP stated that he knew OSWALD, JACK RUBY, and also the "money man." LINTROP would not divulge the name of the "money man" but stated he lived in Pakistan. LINTROP indicated these three were involved in the assassination of President KENNEDY. STALLINGS stated that they returned LINTROP to the Seminole Hotel and had not seen him since.

Inquiry by the New York City Division of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at the United States Lines, New York, New York, revealed that ERICH LINTROP, Seaman Number Z-72988D1, is an able-bodied seaman aboard the SS AMERICAN FLYER. It was determined that the SS AMERICAN FLYER would be in Norfolk, Virginia, on September 18, 1964, en route to Europe.

Date 9/22/64

ERICH LINTROP, able-bodied seaman, was interviewed aboard the SS AMERICAN FLYER, United States Lines, Norfolk, Virginia. He furnished the following information:

About four days after the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY he was in Constantinople, Turkey, as a crew member aboard the SS THUNDERBIRD. He was in a restaurant, name not recalled, where he engaged in conversation with an unidentified Turkish Army officer, who spoke English well. They talked about the assassination. The officer told him that there were rumors in Turkey that Madame NHU of South Vietnam may have been responsible for the assassination; that an unidentified monk from South Vietnam had the money for the assassins; but that the monk had disappeared with the money. The officer thought it odd that Madame NHU had abruptly terminated her visit to the United States and had gone to Italy. The officer furnished no further information in that regard.

LINTROP stated that he accepted the information from this officer as a poor rumor and thought little more about it. LINTROP and the officer conversed for approximately twenty minutes.

LINTROP stated that the Turkish Army officer possibly had the rank of Lieutenant, was in uniform, was aged about twenty-six, of slight build, 5 feet 6 inches in height, and weighed about 130 pounds. The officer mentioned that he had attended a university.

LINTROP further advised that on or about September 8, 1964, he was in Jacksonville, Florida, as a crew member aboard the SS AMERICAN FLYER. He was in the bar of the Seminole Hotel where he was doing considerable drinking. When he realized that he had no more money he left the hotel and attempted to hail a taxi to return to the ship but was unable to locate a taxi because of the hurricane. He accepted a ride from two men dressed in civilian clothes, whom he could not further identify. These men volunteered to take him to his ship. At the ship he obtained more money, and the men then drove him back to the hotel where he continued his drinking.

LINTROP stated that he could not recall the substance of his conversation with the men but said he may have mentioned something about the assassination, although he is not certain. He said that if he did discuss the assassination, he may have told the men about his conversation with the Turkish Army officer. LINTROP stated that he was somewhat intoxicated at the time and could not adequately remember details of his conversation. LINTROP stated that he had never met LEE HARVEY OSWALD or JACK RUBY and knows nothing about them other than what he has read in newspapers and magazines.

He further stated that he is not in possession of any factual information concerning the assassination which he feels would be of assistance to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The additional page 45A reflects the results of the search of the area referred to by Mr. HARTMAN and his wife on pages 42-45 of the report of SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING with a metal detector, which search failed to locate any bullet or fragment of a bullet. The two items found with the use of the metal detector as reflected on this additional page 45A, are being retained at Dallas, UACB.

The Bureau, New Orleans and San Antonio are requested to change the date of the report of SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING from 9/9/64, to 9/19/64, and to insert as the last period date, 9/18/64.

It is deemed advisable to date this report 9/19/64, inasmuch as a report in the assassination case has been submitted under date of 9/18/64. These corrections are necessary in view of the insertion of additional page 45A reflecting investigation on 9/18/64.



1Date September 18, 1964

With the use of a Detectron, Model 27, metal detector, Special Agents NAT A. PINKSTON and ROBERT M. BARRETT searched a three hundred square foot area, which area was located at the culvert on the South side of Elm Street in Dealey Plaza. This area was located based on a description of a gouged-out hole in the grass as furnished by Mr. and Mrs. WAYNE E. HARTMAN of Irving, Texas, on August 6, 1964. This gouged-out hole had been observed by the HARTMANS on November 22, 1963, subsequent to the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. The HARTMANS had pinpointed the area where they had observed this gouged-out hole from Photographs Seven and Eight from the photography exhibits appearing in the report of Special Agent ROBERT P. GEMBERLING dated November 30, 1963. The area searched was a half-circle area, using the culvert as the center. Found through the use of the metal detector were one bottle cap and one aluminum plug, measuring one inch long and one-half inch wide. No fragments or other evidence was found in the area observed.

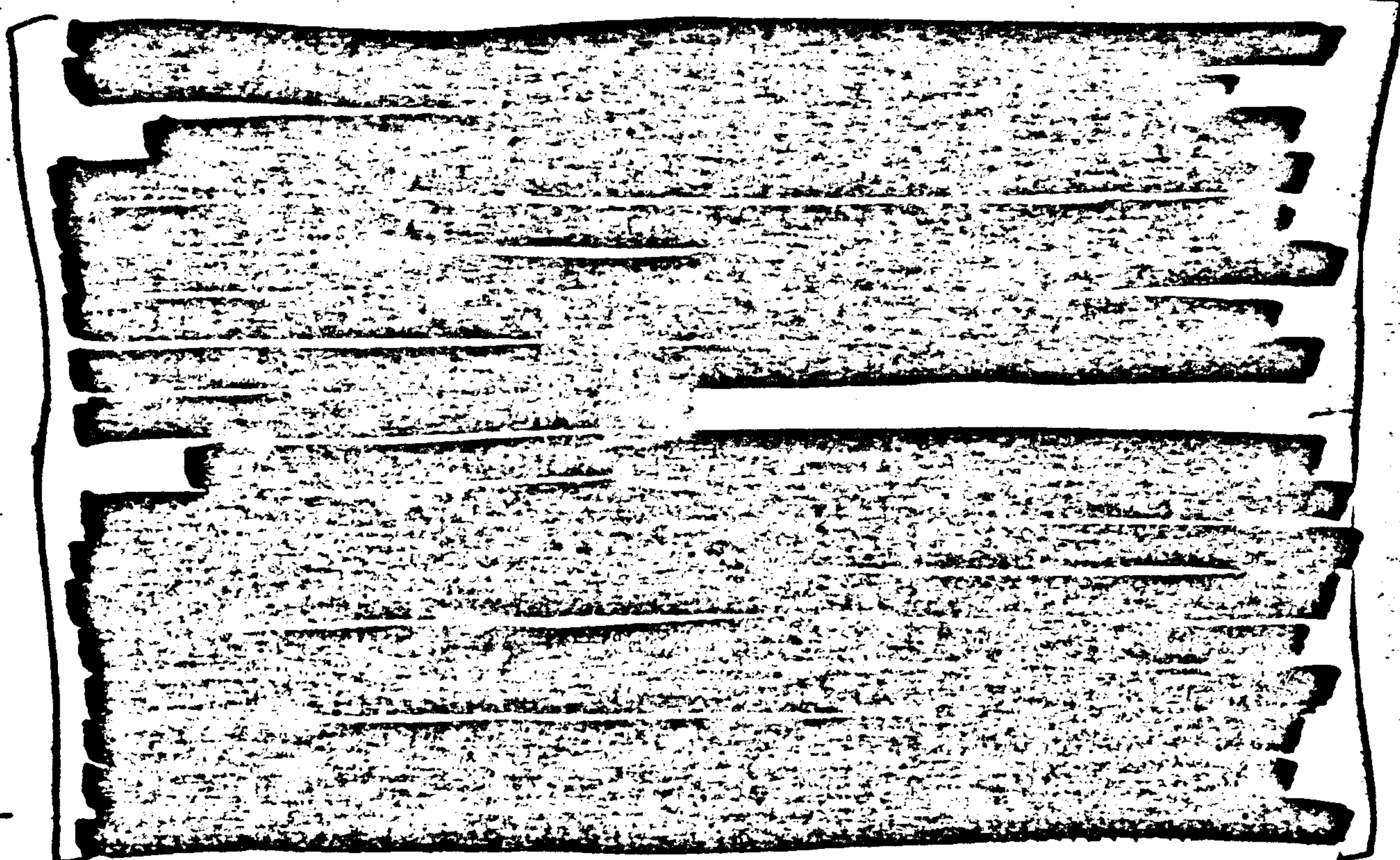

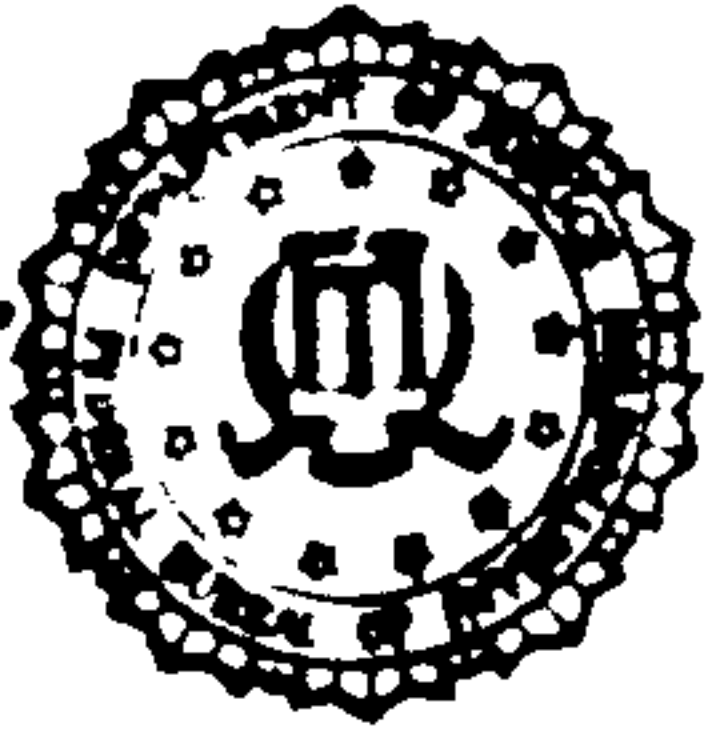

RUTH PAINE was interviewed at her residence, 2515 West Fifth Street, Irving, Texas. She was questioned concerning her contact with WALTER NEUNSON, who reportedly had offered MARINA OSWALD a place to stay at his home. She said she recalled WALTER NEUNSON had called her on the telephone from New Jersey to extend to MARINA through her an invitation that MARINA could come to live at his home with his family. She stated she considered NEUNSON's offer to be very generous and that she thought it might have been good for MARINA to live in a large Eastern community where there would be more Russian-speaking persons. She said she had written a letter to MARINA not too long after the assassination to tell MARINA of the offer of NEUNSON, as well as financial offers from other persons. She said she cannot recall now whether she returned NEUNSON's call or if he called her a second time. She said she recalled NEUNSON said MARINA had met his son, EDWARD. She did not discuss this point further with NEUNSON and cannot add anything in this regard. She did not receive an answer from MARINA with regard to her letter telling of NEUNSON's offer. She said she had had no prior contact with NEUNSON and had not been in contact with him since the two occasions noted above.

Mrs. PAINE advised the notations on the back of one of the envelopes containing a letter written by her to MARINA OSWALD, which notations are "Maria Martin AD 9-56-42 Marina Kataya Ford", are not her notations. She said she recognized the name "Kataya Ford" as the name of MARINA's friend, Mrs. DECLAN FORD, whom she, Mrs. PAINE, also knows. She does not know anything about the name "Maria Martin" or the telephone number "AD 9-56-42". She presumes the name "Marina" refers to MARINA OSWALD.

MARINA OSWALD was interviewed at a cabin in which she was staying with PRISCILLA JOHNSON, her collaborator on a book. During this interview, Mr. DECLAN FORD, adviser to MARINA, was present. PRISCILLA JOHNSON was not present.

MARINA was questioned concerning Exhibit D-248, which is comprised of two letters in the Russian language directed to MARINA by RUTH PAINE; D-245, a letter in the Russian language directed to the OSWALDs from PAVEL GOLOVACHEV; D-247, a handwritten letter in the Russian language to the OSWALDs from "OLYA" and "KOLYA"; and D-246 and D-247, which are letters to MARINA from GALINA KHONTULEVA.

MARINA said she recalls receiving the letter from RUTH PAINE, which furnished information that a Mr. WALTER NEUNSON had offered a place to live to her. She stated she did not know this Mr. NEUNSON and had never written him nor talked to him on the telephone, nor had she received any letters from NEUNSON. She said she had not answered RUTH PAINE's letter concerning NEUNSON. She advised she recalls that RUTH PAINE said NEUNSON told her that MARINA had met NEUNSON's son, EDWARD. MARINA said she could not recall this "EDWARD".

Concerning a person named "EDWARD" whom she had known in Russia, MARINA stated she recalled one young man named "EDWARD" whom she met in Leningrad, Russia, on Russian Revolution Day, November 7 or 8, 1960. She said on this occasion, she was with a young man acquaintance, OLEG TARUSIN, and they were in attendance at a dance at one of the buildings of Leningrad University. She was introduced to this young man, whose name was "EDWARD", and she danced with him. The next day she recalls she visited the apartment

of this "EDWARD" with her friend, OLEG TARUSIN. There was no one else in the apartment on that occasion except the three of them to the best of MARINA's knowledge. She said she cannot recall this "EDWARD's" last name or anything else about him except his appearance. She said "EDWARD" was dressed well in clothes which appeared to be other than Russian in origin. She said he was handsome and had a thin appearance. His eyes were dark and he had dark blond hair. She did not see him again after these two occasions.

MARINA stated she could think of no other person named "EDWARD", who might possibly be identical with the son of WALTER NEUNSON named "EDWARD".

MARINA said the writing on the reverse side of one of the envelopes, which contained one of the above-mentioned RUTH PAINE letters, which writing is "Maria Martin. AD 3-56-42 Marina Kataya Ford", were notes made by either her or JAMES HERBERT MARTIN. She said she would have to examine the handwriting to determine who prepared it. She said the name "Maria Martin" referred to her, MARINA, as this was the name under which she had a joint account with JAMES HERBERT MARTIN of moneys which had been donated to her. She said the telephone number AD 9-5642 is the telephone number of her friend and adviser, DECLAN FORD. It will be noted that this telephone number presently is that of DECLAN FORD. She said the name "Marina" pertains to her and the name "Kataya Ford" refers to her friend, Mrs. DECLAN FORD.

MARINA said she has not received any correspondence from PAVEL GOLOVACHEV subsequent to the assassination. The only correspondence she has received from Russia since the assassination have been the two letters from GALINA KHONTULEVA.

She said the person mentioned in Exhibit D-247 - VALERIK VINOKUROV - was a friend of hers in Russia. She said VINOKUROV is a young man about her age who lives in Minsk with his parents. His father is Vice President of the Academy of Science of Belorussia, in Minsk. She does not know his father's name. VINOKUROV was one of the group of friends with whom MARINA associated in Minsk just prior to the time she was married. She stated VINOKUROV was attending the Polytechnical Institute in Minsk at the time she knew him.

She stated that "LYALYA", who is mentioned in the letter labeled Exhibit D-247, is identical with LARISSA PETROVANA PETRUSEVICH, who is another of her friends in Minsk. MARINA considered PETRUSEVICH to be one of her best girl friends.

MARINA advised that she has copies of Exhibits D-246 and D-244, which are the letters from KHONTULEVA noted above.



PURPOSE:

To advise status of investigation requested by the President's Commission letter September 10, 1964, for Commission members and staff and Sol A. Dann and Melvin Belli, former Ruby attorneys, to be interviewed regarding leak of Oswald's diary, Ruby's polygraph examination and Ruby's interview with Chief Justice Warren and the Commission.

BACKGROUND:

We have previously conducted extensive investigation regarding the three leaks with exception of investigation within the Commission itself. Results were furnished to the Commission with the advice that investigation at Commission itself would not be conducted in the absence of a specific request. The Commission has now requested investigation within the Commission regarding the three leaks by letter dated September 10, 1964. Washington Field Office (WFO) was instructed to conduct requested inquiries.

WFO has advised investigation to date discloses a complete lack of organization within the Commission concerning handling of records. There was found to be no document control whatever and no accountability for documents whether classified or not. It was also determined out of 62 persons employed by the Commission 32 are no longer employed or living in the Washington, D. C. area. Efforts are being made to locate these individuals for interviews by field offices covering their present location.

With respect to the leak to Dorothy Kilgallen and the "New York Journal American" of the transcript of Ruby's interview, it has been determined an unknown number of copies of this document were made from the original upon receipt at the Commission. Only five copies are known to have a confidential stamp on page 103, which is the stenographer's

certification. The published transcript in Kilgallen's column also contains a confidential stamp indicating the possibility that one of these five copies was the source of the leak. The five copies bearing the "confidential" notation were distributed within the Commission to:

1. Norman Redlich, Legal Consultant
2. Senator Richard E. Russell, Commission member
3. Burt W. Griffin, Legal Consultant
4. Retained for use of Commission staff
5. Congressman Gerald R. Ford, Commission member

Kilgallen, during a previous interview, advised she would not reveal the source from whom she received copies of the transcript. However, she did not indicate she would not be of assistance. She mentioned she made copies of the Ruby transcript and also had Photostat copies made. She also mentioned she did not tell the newspaper the source of her information. It is recommended efforts be made to obtain from Kilgallen the copy of the transcript she has in her possession. Also, that the "New York Journal American" be contacted and attempt to obtain the photograph used to reproduce page 103 of the transcript and to determine if the newspaper has a copy of the transcript Kilgallen used in preparing her article. If these documents are obtained, they will be compared with the questioned five copies.

The Commission also furnished one copy of the transcript to Ruby's attorney, Joe Tonahill. An effort will be made to obtain his copy to determine if it bears the confidential stamp and merits comparison.

ACTION:

By teletype attached, New York and Dallas are being instructed to obtain the material from Dorothy Kilgallen, "New York Journal American" and Joe Tonahill.

The five confidential transcripts and original transcript obtained from the President's Commission have been furnished to the Laboratory for examination.

As a result of a letter dated 9/10/64, immediate investigation was initiated concerning this matter. This is an intensive investigation requiring numerous interviews regarding the various leaks. WFO's investigation to date discloses a complete lack of organization within the Commission concerning handling of records, and there was found to be no document control and no accountability for documents whether classified or not. It has been determined there were 62 people employed by the Commission, the majority of whom have now been interviewed. Copies of Ruby's testimony before Chief Justice Warren has been obtained from the Commission. This was the document which appeared in the "New York Journal American" under the by-line of Dorothy Kilgallen. We are currently endeavoring to obtain from the "New York Journal American" and Dorothy Kilgallen any copies of the transcript of Ruby's testimony so that these documents can be compared with the transcripts now in the possession of the Laboratory obtained from The President's Commission. The results of this examination will be furnished to the President's Commission. It is noted that the memoranda enclosed comprise 248 pages. The two memoranda dated 9/21/64, Washington, D. C. captioned "Lee Harvey Oswald" and "Jack L. Ruby - Lee Harvey Oswald" have been reviewed by Mr. Belmont, Mr. Malley and appropriate supervisors. The Bureau's attention is called to the fact that by Bureau airtel to Dallas, 9/1/64, Dallas was instructed to prepare a list of all property seized during the investigation belonging to LEE HARVEY OSWALD and MARINA OSWALD. Such a list is being prepared which is necessitating considerable review of correspondence and files and will be submitted as soon as completed.

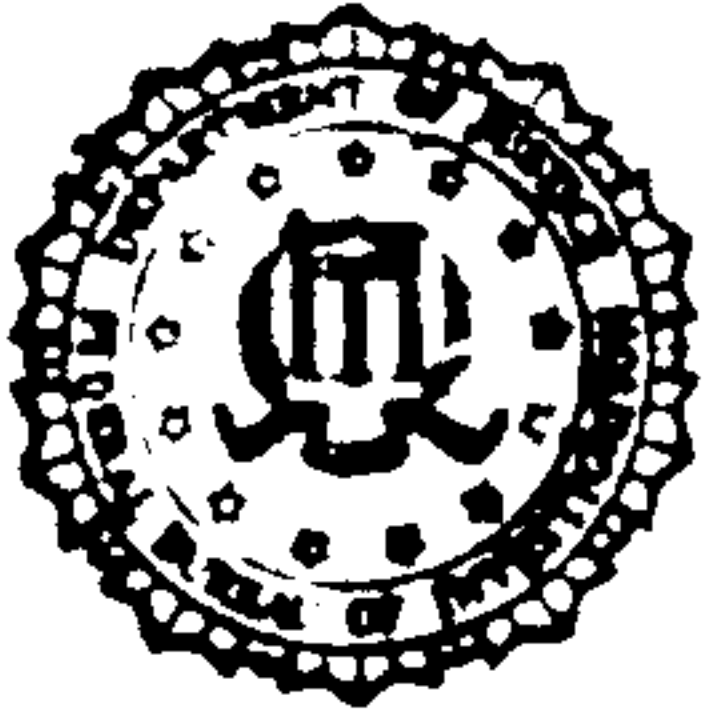
