Rerep SA James T. O'Connor dated 4-21-64 at Miami, Florida, in captioned matter. This report contained a security classification of "Secret."

For the information of each of the recipients offices, the President's Commission requested that the Bureau declassify SA O'Connor's report of 4-21-64 in order that such report might be made a part of the Commission's report that will be made available to the public. Inasmuch as the report was classified "Secret" because of information furnished by the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), the Bureau contacted CIA in Washington, D. C., and received clearance to use a modified statement from MM T-1 as set forth on page seven of SA O'Connor's report. With this modification, the report of SA O'Connor became unclassified.

Enclosed for the Dallas and Miami Offices are two copies each of amended pages one and seven of SA O'Connor's report which should be inserted in the copies of such report in possession of each office. One copy of each of the amended pages is enclosed for the Washington Field Office to be inserted in its copy of SA O'Connor's report.

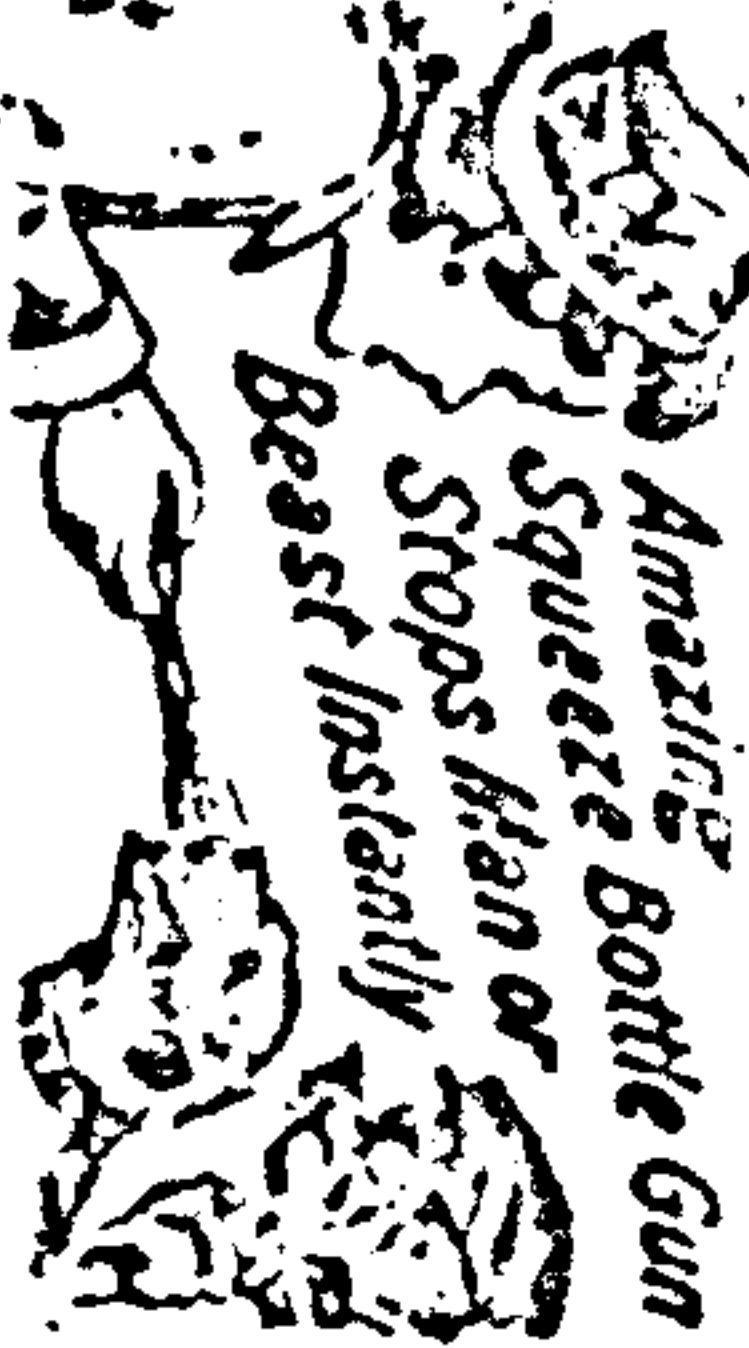

He said later: "While I was dreaming that night, I saw a vision. It told me to wake up and start talking. I did and to my amazement I could hear my-self speak."

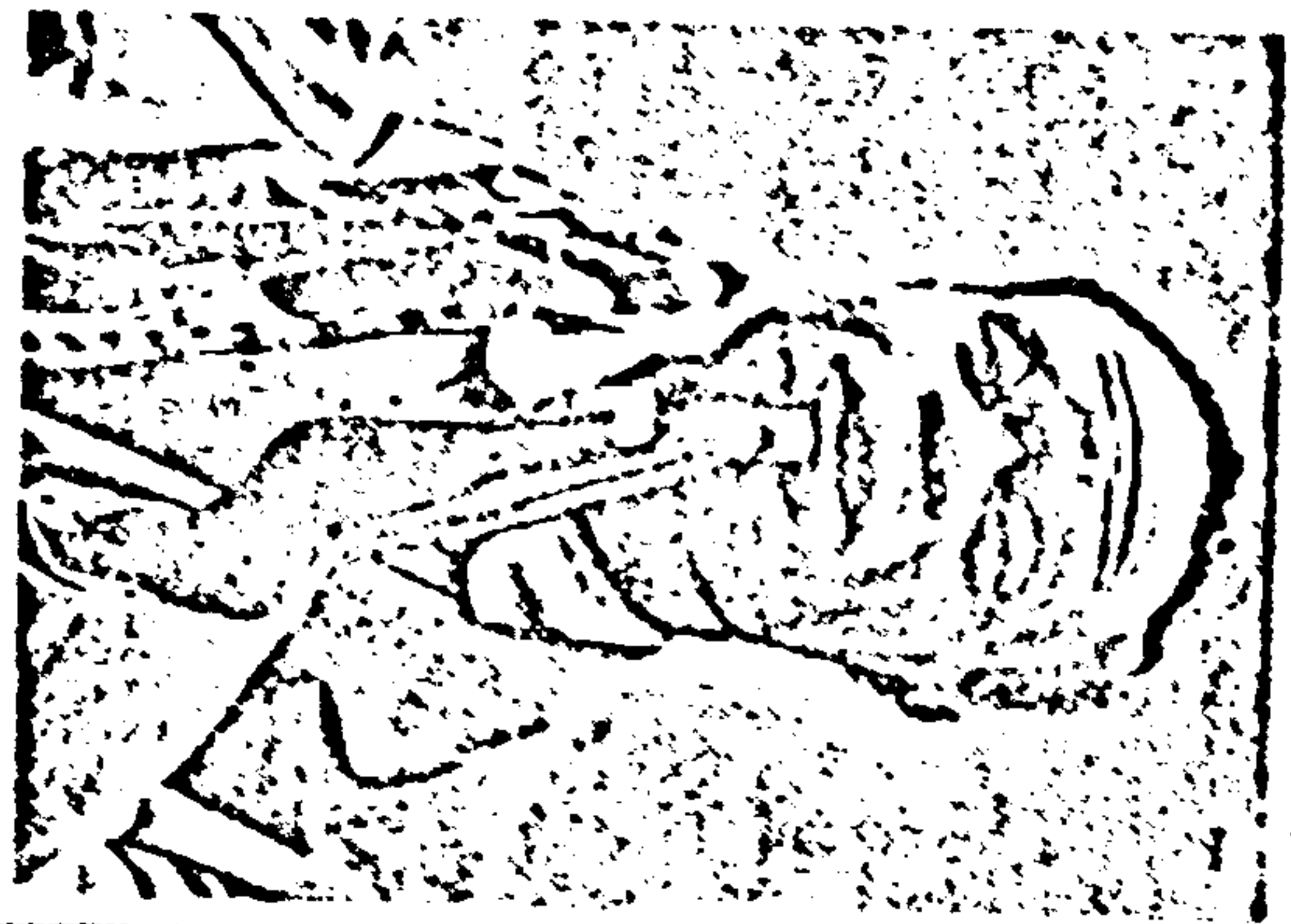

Foster Does 'Reforms' Juvenile Delinquents - By Teaching Them

It seemed grand the way kindly Lindell, Jay Schneider loved to help youngsters. He was a foster father to troubled boys.

The boys were paroled to his home by juvenile authorities, and in nearly three years had cared for quite a lot of them. And during the Christmas seasons Schneider, 53, went out and worked as a Santa Claus.

All in all, authorities were mighty pleased with the way Schneider operated — until they suddenly found out about another operation he was conducting in his foster home.

He was teaching the boys how to steal! And he was taking most of the loot for himself.

Since early in 1961, Schneider had been taking into his home in Lakeside, Calif., where he lives, his wife and two children. The boys, who in trouble with the law, were sent to him by the California Youth Authority. He was paid \$20 a month for taking care of each of them. Between then and October 1963 he cared for 12 boys, generally having about four at a time in the home.

Schneider had been injured in a tractor accident in a garden in April 1961 and had no steady employment since then. He worked at odd jobs and supplemented his income by "reforming" the foster boys.

For the three Christmas seasons of 1961 to

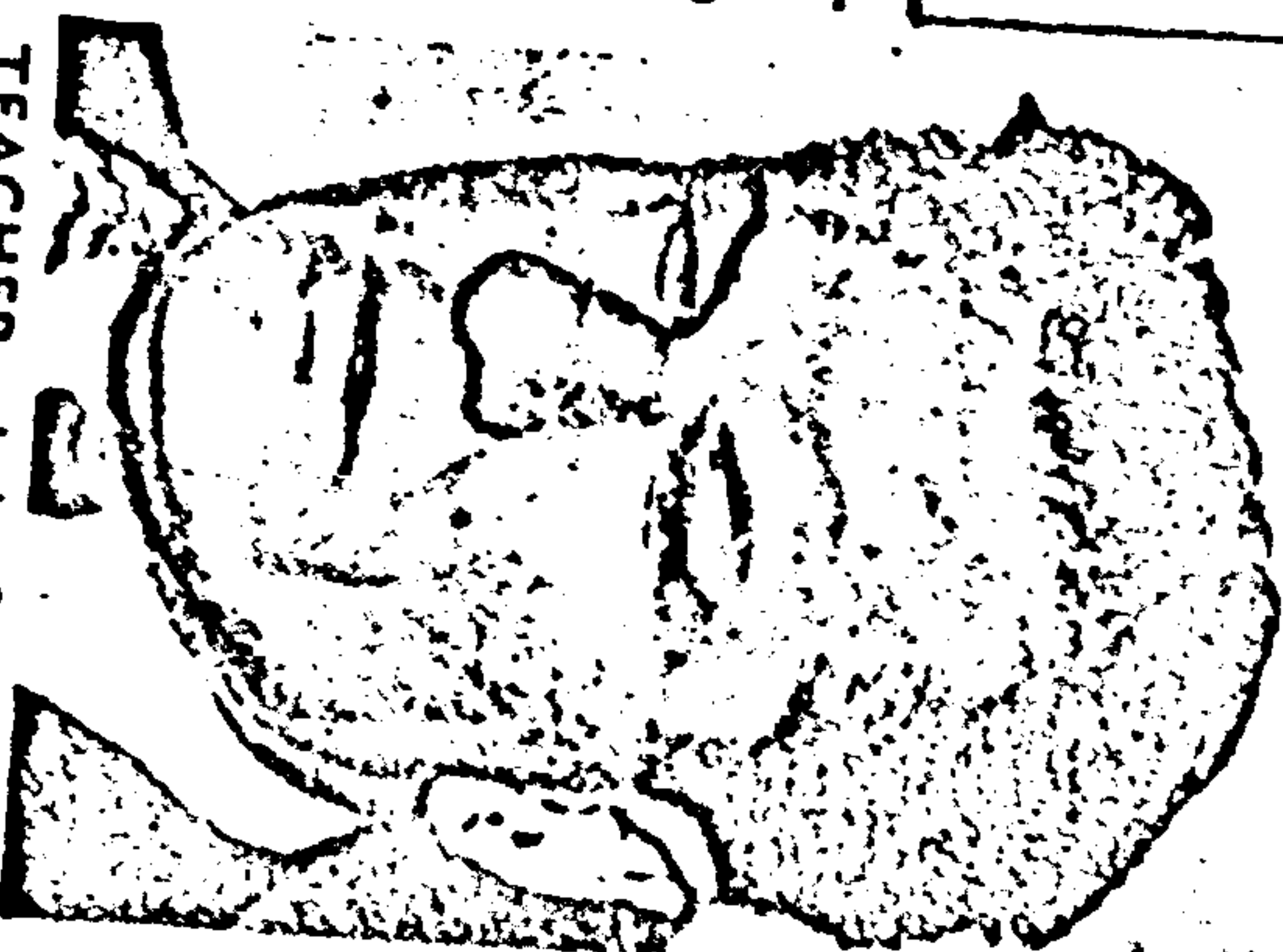
1963 he also worked as a Santa Claus for a businessmen's group.

The Youth Authority never had any reason to doubt its faith in Schneider until last fall when a 16-year-old boy in his home went to police and told them that Schneider had him and other boys steal things for him.

The boy said that on several occasions he had stolen bags of feed at a nearby ranch and dumped them over a fence to the waiting Schneider.

Deputy District Attorney Russell Hill said: "One of the boys was caught with food taken from a neighbor's refrigerator. Schneider told him: 'Go back and get the rest of it.'"

Three other boys told of stealing feed, drill bits, horse reins, radio tubes and a TV set under Schneider's instructions. One of the boys said Schneider took him to a TV shop, parked his car, all truck at a side entrance and then told the boy that he would go in the front door and talk to the owner to divert his attention while the boy slipped in the side door and stole a television set.

And that's how they did it, the boy said. Another boy told how Schneider instructed him on how to steal a briefcase from the back of a parked auto. When they got home after stealing the briefcase, they opened it and found a checkbook from a business firm.

The boy said Schneider showed him how to make out a forged check. The boy made one out for \$125 and cashed it in a store. Later, he made out two more and cashed them.

The boys all said they gave Schneider the loot from their thefts and that he kept most of it, merely giving them a little spending money.

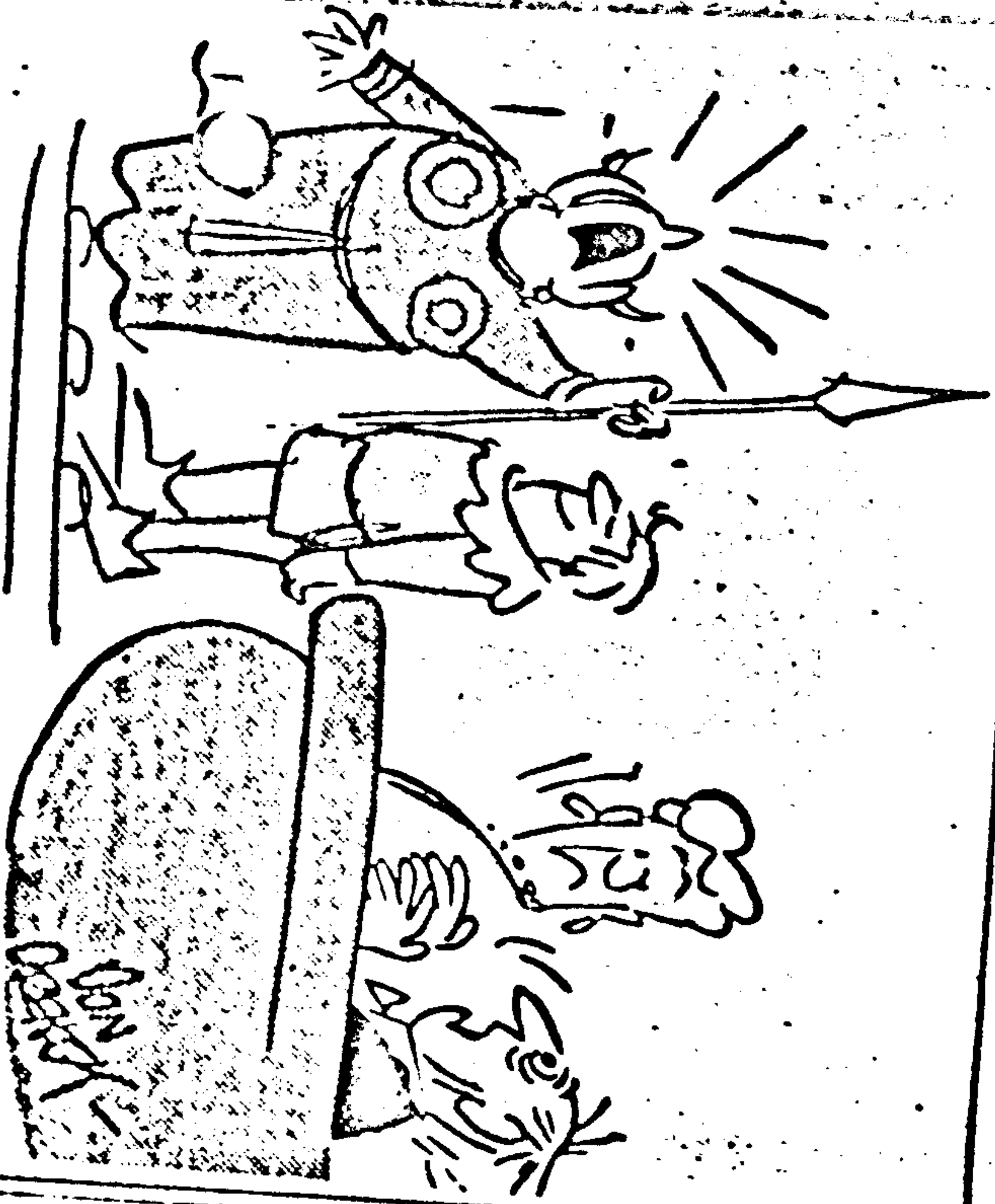
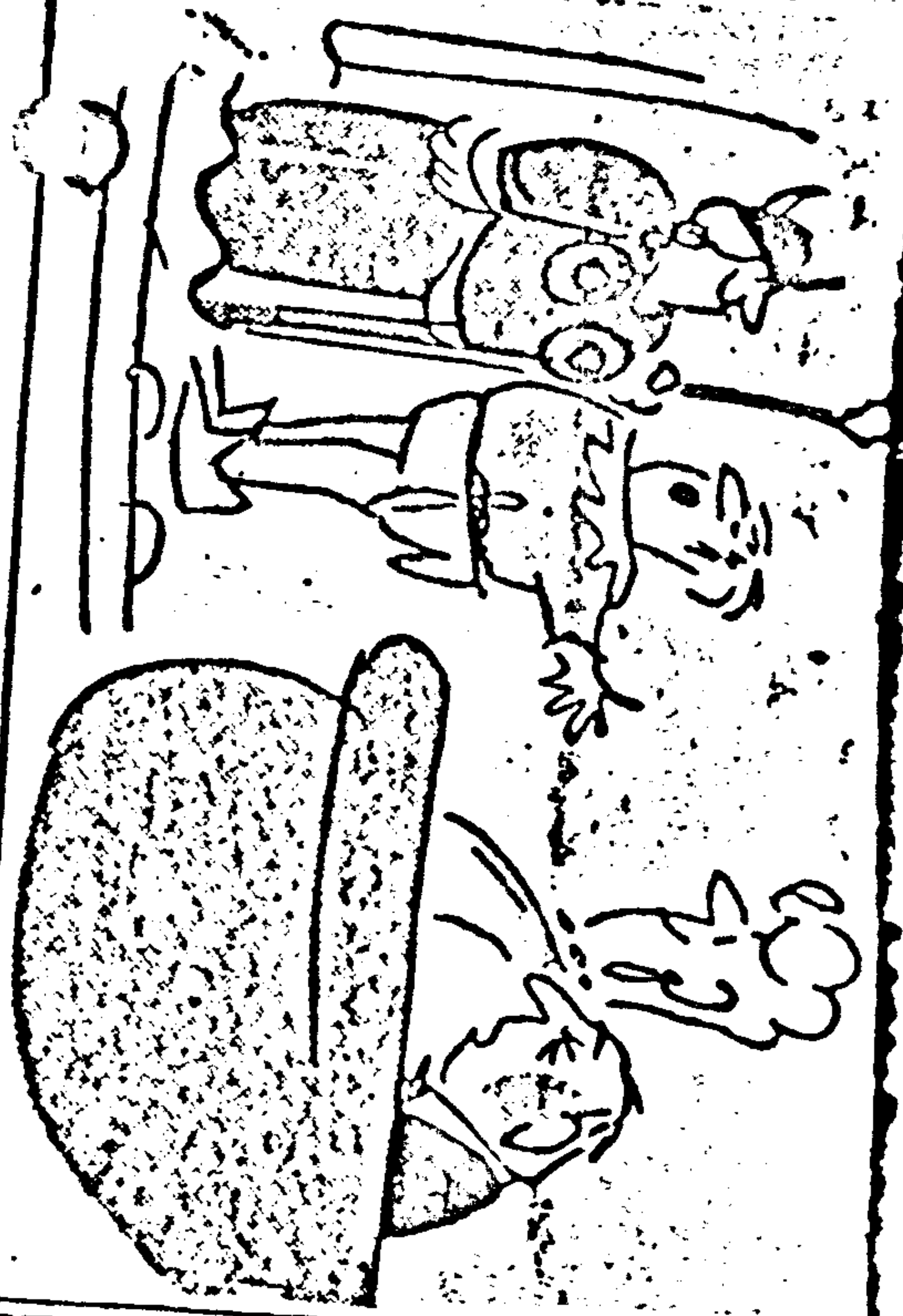
Following an investigation, police went to Schneider's home and arrested him. Last March 26, Schneider pleaded guilty to receiving stolen property.

Judge William P. Mahedy delayed sentence pending a probation report on Schneider.

When it came, the probation officer's report said: "In him was placed a special trust, that of assisting in the rehabilitation of youths who needed the guidance of a person of integrity."

Schneider set an example of a person clever and scheming at helping himself. He profited by the weaknesses of his youthful followers."

Last April 30 Schneider was sentenced to a year in jail.

She began to get threatening phone calls against her life and the lives of her two children.

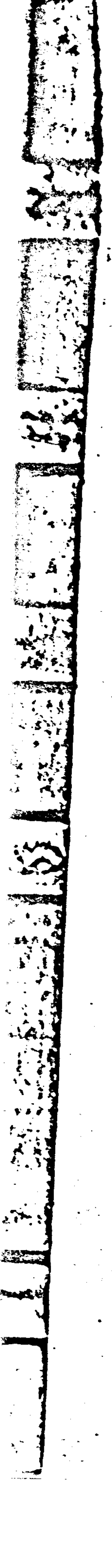
One day last June, she went to see Homicide Detective J.E. Hendrix and cried as she told him that the anonymous calls frightened her.

"She told me she was going to move to try to get away from the threats," Detective

Hendrix said later.

Mrs. Oglesby carried out her plan. June 22 was moving day. Then tragedy struck.

Mrs. Oglesby grabbed for something that had come loose and was falling off the truck — but in reaching for it, she toppled off the moving van. The young mother hit the street headfirst and was killed.

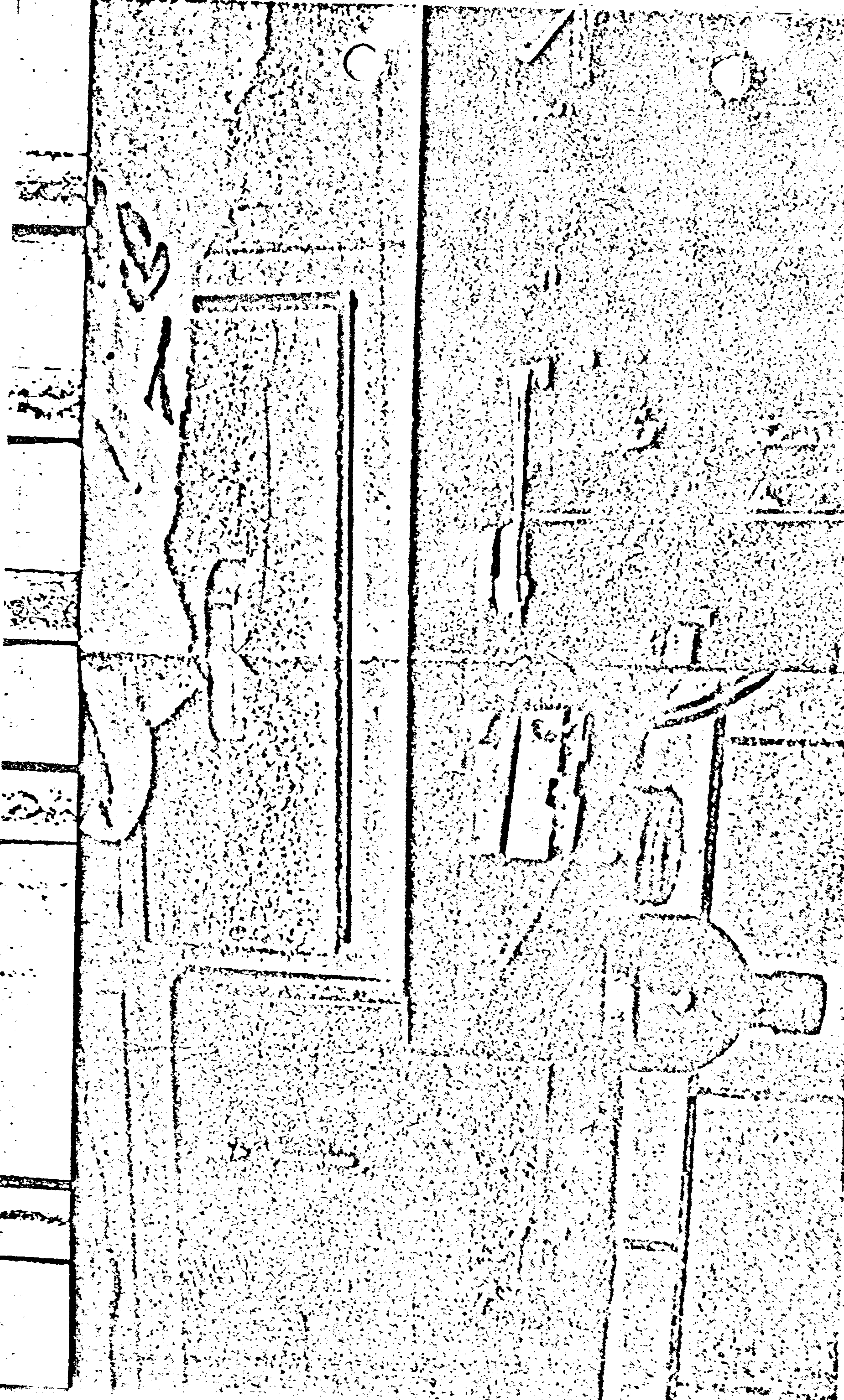


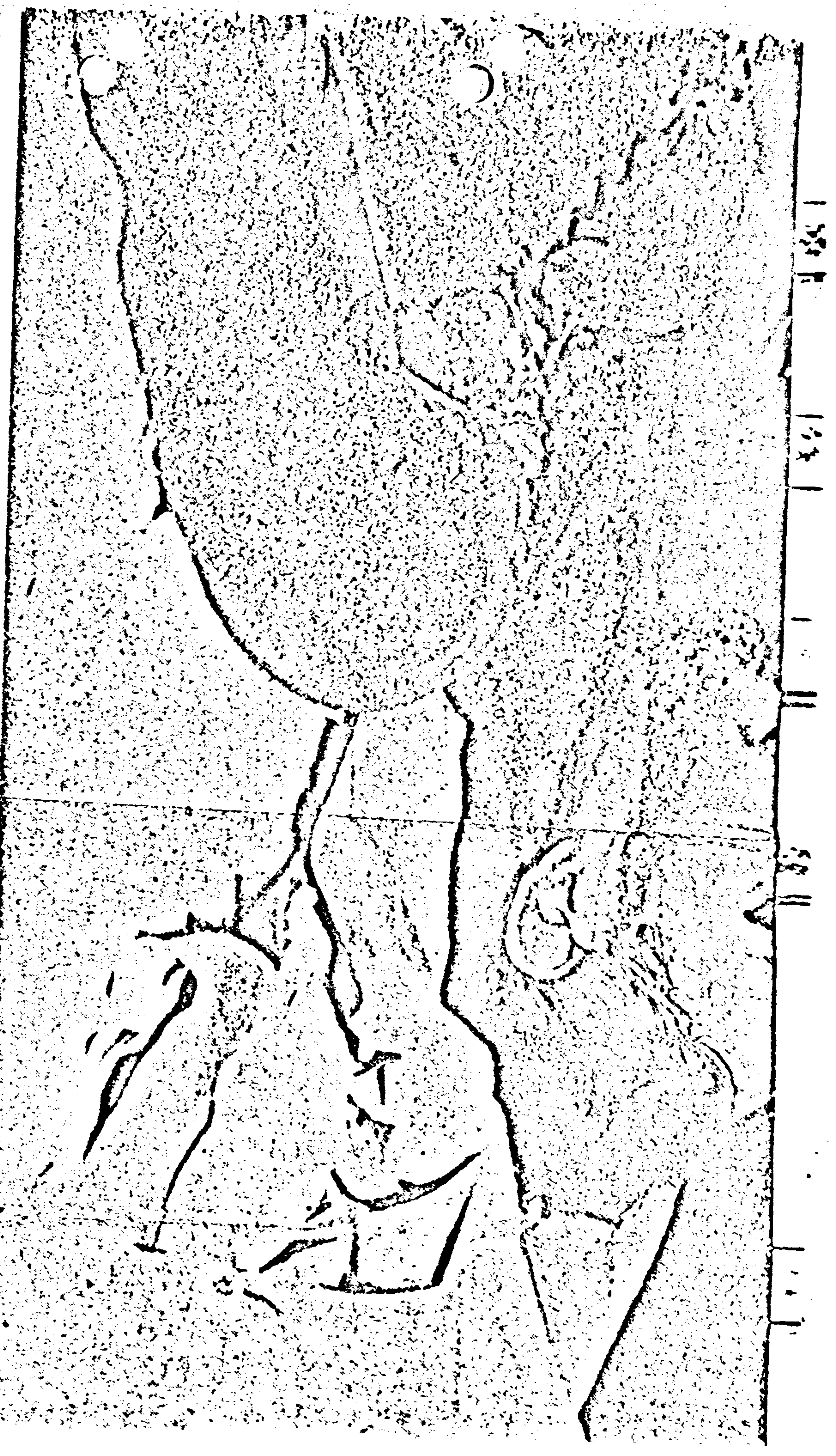

On September 3, 1964, Miss VELIA URIBE, Manager, American Automobile Association, Laredo, Texas, advised that she has been receiving the pamphlet, "This Week - Esta Semana," on a weekly basis for at least the past 20 years for distribution to tourists traveling to Mexico.

She advised that this pamphlet is published in Mexico City and is mailed directly from there to travel agencies, travel clubs, hotels, and motels.

On September 7, 1964, Miss VELIA URIBE, American Automobile Association, Laredo, advised she does not have a current copy of the publication, "This Week - Esta Semana."

She does not pay too much attention to dates of this publication; however, she usually receives her copies from Mexico City on Mondays. In order to keep them current on a weekly basis, they are printed about four days earlier than for the dates for which they are printed.

She is of the opinion that it is entirely possible that a person going into Mexico on September 26, 1963, could have obtained in Laredo, Texas, or Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, a copy of the pamphlet, "This Week - Esta Semana," issued for the week of September 28 - October 4, 1963, as that publication would have already been received in Laredo and in Nuevo Laredo.

She added that her supply of this publication is distributed very rapidly when received.

On September 3, 1964, FRANCISCO SALIDO, Manager, El Fico Hotel, Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, advised that this hotel has been in operation for three years, and during this time he has received the pamphlet, "This Week - Esta Semana," on a weekly basis for distribution to tourists going into Mexico.

On October 2, 1964, HERADIO HIHOJOSA, Manager, Turismo de Laredo (State Tourist Office), Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, advised that his office was established for the benefit of tourists going into the interior of Mexico. He advised that he receives the pamphlet, "This Week - Esta Semana," from Mexico City for at least five

On September 7, 1964, JOHN W. LIGON, Manager, El Fico Hotel, Laredo, Texas, advised that he receives the pamphlet, "This Week - Esta Semana," from Mexico City on a weekly basis.

He advised that this is not to say that for the past year he has received a pamphlet every week, as there have been times when he did not receive it for a particular week. He explained that this was probably the fault of the Circulation Department in Mexico City.

The latest copy he has is for the week of August 22 - August 29, 1964. This is his personal copy, and he has no other supply of this pamphlet. Generally, he receives the

pamphlet about four days before the printed dates for any particular week. For example, he received the copy for the week of August 22-August 28, 1964, mentioned above, on about August 18, 1964.

It is of the opinion that it is entirely possible that a person going into Mexico on September 26, 1963, could have obtained at Laredo, Texas, or Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, a copy of the pamphlet, "This Week - Esta Semana," issued for the week of September 28-October 4, 1963, as that publication would have already been received in Laredo and Nuevo Laredo.

He added that his supply of this pamphlet is distributed very rapidly when it is received.

"This Week - Esta Semana" is a weekly publication which bears a date period from a Saturday to the following Friday. The magazine is presently in its thirtieth year of publication and is published at Calle Ramon Alcazar No. 6, Mexico City, D. F.

The editor of this magazine is ENA H. Viuda de (widow of) PIPIL RIVERA. The pamphlet contains valuable and interesting information for tourists.

It is to be noted that this magazine can be subscribed to outside of the country at the cost of \$6.00 for a subscription of 12 weeks; however, the magazine is free inside the Republic of Mexico.

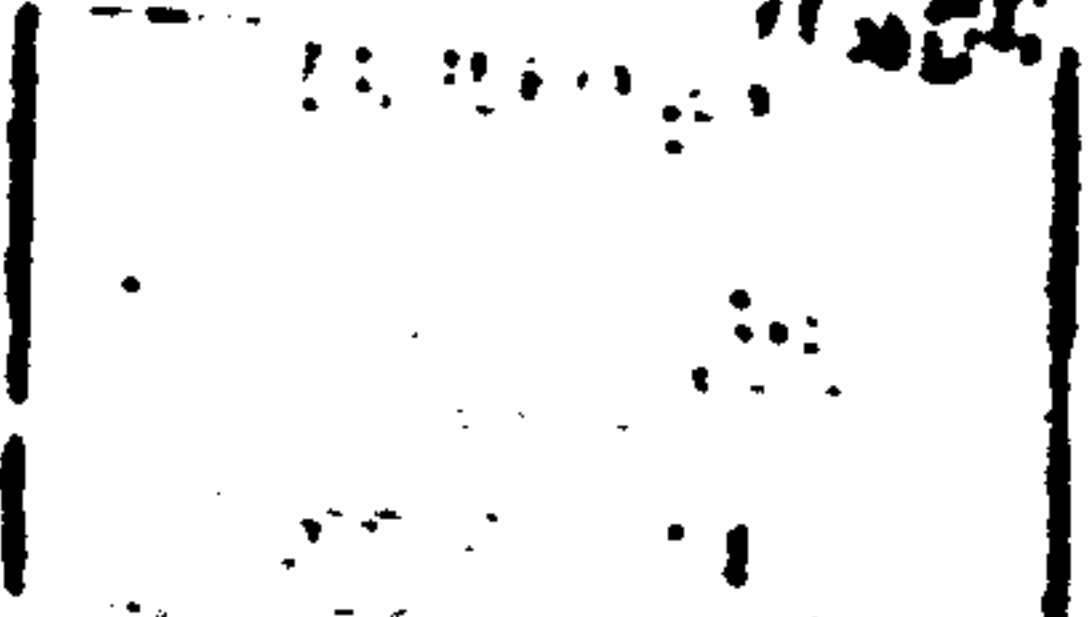

Dear Mr. Hoover:

The Commission would appreciate your Bureau providing us with a letter indicating the extent of the ballistics examinations which you have conducted to determine whether shell casings found at various locations in the vicinity of Dallas, Texas, were fired from the Mannlicher-Carcano rifle, serial number C2766, used to assassinate President Kennedy, and the results of all such tests.

In particular, several reports prepared by your Bureau and submitted to the Commission have indicated that shell casings have been turned over to you for analysis. Such reports appear in the report of Special Agent Robert P. Gemberling dated December 10, 1963, at page 269, and in the Gemberling report dated December 23, 1963 at pages 95, 98, 101, 104, and 117. In the Gemberling report of December 10 at page 355 there appears a partial report of the laboratory tests conducted as of the date of that report; however, although this report indicates that the 6.5 mm Mannlicher-Carcano cartridge cases that were tested came from the Sports Drome Rifle Range, it does not indicate the report in which you informed us that your Bureau had received possession of these cartridge cases.

We would thus appreciate receiving a letter which will allow us to follow forward from any given report indicating that cartridge cases had been turned over to your Bureau to the conclusion that those particular cartridge cases were or were not fired from the Mannlicher-Carcano rifle C2766. If the records which your laboratory maintains are such that you are prepared to state that none of the cartridge cases examined by your laboratory, other than the three found on the sixth floor of the Texas School Book

On September 13, 1964, Mrs. J. T. (Gertrude) Hunter, 141 South Hastings, Irving, Texas, telephone BLackburn 3-2938, telephonically advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that she had been telephonically contacted on Saturday night, September 12, 1964, by an individual who identified himself as Peter Davis with the National Broadcasting Company (NBC), who stated he was staying at the Sheraton-Dallas Hotel, Dallas, Texas.

Mrs. Hunter stated that Peter Davis had indicated he had already talked with Mrs. Edith Whitworth and desired to interview Mrs. Hunter concerning the information that had been attributed to Mrs. Whitworth and Mrs. Hunter about Lee Harvey Oswald having allegedly appeared at the Furniture Mart in Irving, Texas, operated by Mrs. Whitworth.

Mrs. Hunter stated she was under the impression that Mrs. Whitworth is just seeking publicity and that she (Mrs. Hunter) does not desire any publicity and feels she has furnished all information in her possession to the proper authorities. She stated she was not interested in being interviewed by Peter Davis.

Mrs. Hunter was advised by the Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that she was under no obligation to talk to anyone and that if it was her wish not to be interviewed by Mr. Davis, she should so advise him but that such decision would have to be her own.

SYNOPSIS

Dr. Vincent P. Guinn is Technical Director of the Activation Analysis Program of General Atomic Division of General Dynamics Corporation. He and his staff have applied neutron activation analysis to the examination of powder residues. Dr. Guinn is a "high pressure salesman" with a sound scientific background. If he has been correctly quoted recently, he has been associating the work done by the FBI Laboratory and the Oak Ridge National Laboratory (ORNL) on the paraffin casts of Oswald with his own endeavors. These examinations were conducted with the Director's approval through liaison with the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC). Press releases attributable to Guinn infer that he is knowledgeable of the results of the examinations conducted on the Oswald casts. Guinn did not participate in these examinations. He has not been advised of the results.

Dr. Spofford G. English, Assistant General Manager for Research and Development, AEC, was contacted on September 18, 1964, by Special Agent John F. Gallagher, of the Laboratory, concerning this matter and expressed the Bureau's concern over the erroneous statements attributed to Dr. Guinn. Dr. English also expressed AEC's concern. Since Dr. Guinn is an AEC contractor, Dr. English advised he would have Mr. E. Eugene Fowler, Acting Director of the Isotopes Division, AEC, contact Dr. Guinn as soon as practical and advise him that both the FBI and the AEC are concerned over the releases attributed to him relating to the assassination of 105-82555-4969 President Kennedy. Guinn will be asked to cease commenting on this sensitive subject. Dr. English will advise the Bureau concerning the contact of Fowler with Dr. Guinn. 24 1964

DETAILS

Dr. Vincent P. Guinn is Technical Director of the Activation Analysis Program of General Atomic Division of General Dynamics Corporation at San Diego, California. Through Atomic Energy Commission's contracts, money has been given to Dr. Guinn's group for the purpose of studying the application of neutron activation analysis to items of forensic interests. In particular, Dr. Guinn's group devoted their efforts to the identification of primer residues on the body of a person who had discharged firearms. Dr. Guinn has an international reputation in the field of neutron activation analysis. At the United Nations Conference in Geneva, Switzerland, relating to peaceful applications of atomic energy, he delivered a speech on September 1, 1964. He was also a guest lecturer during August of this year at the NATO International Conference on activation analysis in Glasgow, Scotland. It is believed he is currently touring Europe. Dr. Guinn recently received the American Nuclear Society's 1964 Award for "particularly meritorious contribution" of "a unique and proven tool to assist the law, clear the innocent and convict the guilty."

Dr. Guinn is a typical "high pressure salesman" with a sound scientific background who is actively promoting the sales of his company's nuclear reactors and services.

On April 23, 1962, Dr. Vincent P. Guinn visited the Laboratory and discussed the work of his group relative to scientific crime detection. Since that time, the Laboratory has had several contacts with him at technical conferences and he has revisited the Laboratory on several occasions. On November 23, 1963, subsequent to President Kennedy's assassination, he called the FBI Laboratory and advised he and his staff stood ready to help in the field of neutron activation analysis if necessary. He was thanked for his spirit of cooperation at this time. His services were never employed.

Recently, numerous press releases and periodicals citing the work of Guinn and his staff relating to the examinations of primer residues from firearms have associated his work with the work done on the paraffin casts from Lee Harvey Oswald. He has implied that he has been working on the problem with the FBI and is knowledgeable of the results of such examinations.

The paraffin casts from Lee Harvey Oswald were analyzed by neutron activation by FBI Laboratory personnel at ORNL. The Director's approval was obtained for such an analyses and arrangements were made through Dr. Spofford English, Assistant General Manager for Research and Development, AEC, to have these examinations performed at the ORNL Research Reactor Site. It was agreed that all matters relating to these analyses would be considered highly confidential.

In view of the erroneous statements which were reportedly released to the press by Dr. Guinn, Special Agent John F. Gallagher, of the Laboratory, contacted Dr. Spofford G. English on September 18, 1964. The Bureau's concern over these erroneous releases were explained to Dr. English. It was pointed out that Dr. Guinn was working for AEC on a contract basis. Dr. English advised that AEC was also concerned over this matter and stated that he would see to it that a Mr. E. Eugene Fowler, the Acting Director of the Isotope Division, AEC, would be requested to contact Dr. Guinn as soon as practical and advise him of the AEC's and FBI's concern over the erroneous press releases attributed to him and request that he cease commenting on these matters. Dr. English advised that Fowler is in charge of the division responsible for the contract work of Dr. Guinn. Dr. English will advise the Bureau concerning the meeting of Mr. Fowler with Dr. Guinn.

At the atomic laboratories of the General Dynamics Corp., in San Diego, Calif., Dr. Vincent P. Guina has discovered a method whereby NAA can determine far more accurately than the old paraffin test whether a suspect has fired a gun recently. In the conventional paraffin test, melted paraffin is poured onto a suspect's hands and allowed to harden, then peeled off and doused with a chemical liquid. Any nitrates on the skin stick to the paraffin and show up as blue specks in the chemical bath. The trouble is: the suspect could have picked up the nitrates not only from a gun blast but from an innocent source such as fertilizer.

NAA ignores nitrates, but detects any deposits of antimony and barium. These elements, used in the primers of all cartridges, are deposited on any person who fires a gun. Unlike nitrates, they are so rare that they do not collect on the skin of a person who has not fired a gun. Dr. Guinn's tests have already cleared several suspects.

When President Kennedy was assassinated, Dr. Guina promptly suggested to the FBI that NAA tests be run on casts obtained from Lee Harvey Oswald. The Dallas police maintained jurisdiction, however, and made conventional paraffin tests. Eventually, federal authorities obtained chunks of the paraffin used on Oswald, and highly secret NAA tests were run. The results,

which included the discovery of antimony traces, were given to the Warren Commission investigating the assassination.

The areas beyond law enforcement in which atomic identification is proving itself valuable are widely varied. The General Electric Co. relies on NAA to ferret out impurities in the silicon that goes into transistors. (One part of phosphorus in a billion parts of silicon can set up serious transistor trouble.) Several pharmaceutical firms are using NAA to balk drug counterfeiters. For some years large quantities of fraudulent drugs have been sold under the labels of reputable firms, and the practice is growing. So, certain manufacturers have started adding trace elements which do not affect the quality of their products but do show up under NAA.

The Atomic Energy Commission plans to place NAA equipment on a spacecraft, to determine what the surface of the moon is made of—before man lands there. Oceanographers are using NAA to find out more about the bottom of the sea. Dr. Edward V. Sayre, at the AEC's Brookhaven National Laboratory on Long Island, has used NAA to show, through differences in paints, whether a painting is a bona fide old master or a forgery.

Medical science has long suspected that certain trace elements play a pivotal role in disease, but most of them appear in such imperceptible amounts in the body that it has been virtually impossible to measure

New Test May Prove Lee Oswald's Guilt

By **WICH ANZONOVIC**
The guilt of Lee Harvey Oswald may be proved by a relatively un-
heard of new activation analysis
technique said to be many times
more reliable than paraffin test-
ing, now universally used in crimi-
nology.

A California scientist has in-
dicated that radioactivity tests
had been made, on casts of Os-
wald's check and that the results
had been sent to the Warren Com-
mission investigating President
Kennedy's assassination.

Dr. Vincent P. Guina, 44, head
of the activation analysis pro-
gram for General Dynamics
Corp., San Diego, Calif., made the
disclosure at a conference at
Glasgow University in Scotland.

"I cannot say what we found,
but about Oswald because it is
short until the publication of the
Warren Commission report," Dr.
Guina told United Press Inter-
national, "but I can tell you about
activation analysis and crime."

In homicide cases where a gun
is used, wax impressions of the
hand and check are often taken.
The wax like tiny fragments of
gunpowder, and chemical tests
are used on these traces of pow-
der to show if the person fired
the gun or not.

Guina said experiments have
proven that the paraffin test is
"extremely unreliable." He said
it was obvious that a better meth-
od was needed and said his com-
pany began research on activa-
tion analysis about three years
ago.

He said when it was created
Oswald's guilt could not be
proved or disproved from paraf-
fin tests as he by the Warren
Commission. He said the FBI to
investigation technique.

Guina described the experiment
in this manner:

A rifle similar to the one that

was used by the president was used. One
bullet fired the rifle on eight dif-
ferent occasions and each time
was given the paraffin test.
"Only one out of the eight ex-
periments gave a positive indica-
tion," Guina said.
Then they repeated the experi-
ment using radioactivity.

"It was positive in all eight
cases, and showed a primer on
both hands and checks," he said.

"That we took the casts of Os-
wald's check and put them in a
machine. Remember that
they already had been through
the standard tests which would
work paraffin away."

"I can say for the moment that
we found no sulfur and we found
amimony in every case," Guina
said.

Dr. Marion Mason, of the staff
of the University of Texas South-
western Medical School and the
City-County Crime Laboratory,
said local criminologists were fa-
miliar with the FBI technique but
said the method "too expensive"
for everyday use.

"It is technically capable of
being done on a sample of metal
analysis that cannot be touched
any other way," Dr. Mason said.

"But it will be 10 years be-
fore they use it here. It is very,
very expensive. It takes special-
ized equipment and highly trained
operators."

Dr. Larry Marshall of the Grad-
uate Research Center of the South-
western said the FBI would be
determined what mine is most
valuable by checking the rate of
decay of the radioactive isotopes
created when the material is sub-
jected to neutrons.

"The equipment used in this
method is very costly," Dr.
Marshall said.

He said he was sure that
the FBI would use it in crimi-
nology. "I'm certainly ex-

pecting it to be used in the future."
