Dear Mr. Hoover:

I submit for your consideration, herewith, a proposal which I feel would be of considerable help to your Bureau as a part of the total evaluation of persons under suspicion or surveillance as actual or potential criminals and security risks..

I am a graphologist, and graphology is an accurate, scientific method of analyzing a person's character and personality traits through a study of his handwriting. I had occasion to do an analysis of Lee Oswald's handwriting from a photostatic copy of his letter to the Secretary of the Navy published in a magazine sometime after the assassination of President Kennedy. A copy of my analysis and its findings is enclosed, though I wish to add that reports to your Bureau would be of an entirely different and more concise nature, as this particular one was designed for another specific purpose. I have done a great many analyses of persons unknown to me and have, in every case, astounded them with the accuracy of my knowledge of their personal qualities as revealed by graphology.

It is my conviction that such analysis of character and personality as I do on a graphological basis, and with no other knowledge of the individual involved, would be of immeasurable value in the total picture of that individual - with regard especially to his capabilities for violence for deceit, for his potential talkativeness about his activities if the method of interrogation and suggestion were used instead of that. I firmly believe, for example, if my analysis of Lee Oswald had been a part of your files, with its indication of his capacity for violence, he would have been removed from the Dallas Trade Mart prior to President Kennedy's motorcade past it. But I am inclined to agree with your office that, based on his behaviour and activities only up to that time, how would one feel there were grounds to detain him as a potential security risk.

I believe I could help in security measures in this fashion. I believe I could help you concentrate on one subject as against another where both are suspected of the same thing, as a result of the revelation of his potential. And I believe I can help show whether or not one method of questioning would prove more fruitful than another (as, fear vs. sympathy), depending on the individual's emotional traits.

Try me with a half dozen handwriting samples - and include one or two persons above suspicion of anything - including an F.B.I. man, if you wish, as long as it is their natural handwriting.

There are two things that handwriting analysis cannot do accurately. It cannot tell the age nor the sex of the writer. Briefly, this is because some men write with a feminine hand, and vice-versa, and some older people write with a younger hand than seem half their age.

At the end of this letter I will acquaint you with my personal background which I am sure you will find to be worthy of your complete confidence, but at this point, let me submit my proposition.

I would like to establish a working relationship with the F.B.I. whereby I would analyze the handwriting samples of any individuals you would be interested in forwarding me (via clear photostat would be satisfactory). I would not need to know the names of these individuals, nor your reasons for sending them to me. A code number could be used in lieu of names. Samples consisting of a minimum of a paragraph would do. You could send them either directly to me via registered mail, or you could send them to the F.B.I. Agent in West Palm Beach, Fla. and I could pick them up from him and return them to him, as it is only a 14 mile drive from here.

I would give you a complete breakdown of the individual's character and personality traits, or I would answer specific questions you might ask me regarding his honesty, stability, secretiveness vs. talkativeness, resentment, jealousy, capacity for violence, brutality, and others.

I would rather not know the background of the particular problem, that any potential influence of knowledge of the circumstance would not present to color my analysis.

I would do this work on a fee basis if there were only a scattered number of them over a period of time. But I would be happy to be kept busy on a full time basis at a salary commensurate with a professional status government employee, less certain amounts for living at home; or a contractual basis as an independent contractor. This latter might be more satisfactory under the circumstances.

On this latter point, I must say that, being semi-retired, I would want to do this work from home here, as I am most content here as is my wife, and we would not wish to consider a move. Actually, in my opinion it is an advantage to the project itself, as I would be far removed from influences on the scene which could conceivably color one's thinking in spite of oneself. Here, in calm and placid surroundings one's power of concentration are unobscured by outside matters and official attitudes, and the work could proceed apace in an untrammelled manner.

Now for some information about myself. I am 51 years old, married, have a married daughter and grandchild. I lived in Providence, Rhode Island from birth to 1920 where I graduated from Brown University in 1930 with


A.B. Degree at the age of 20. I attended Brown University Graduate School in 1934, and wrote my Master's Thesis on: "Changes In the Content and Rique Of The Poetry Of Archibald MacLeish " in 1938, receiving my M.A. Degree that year. This Thesis is in the Harris Collection of American Poetry and Criticism in the John Hay Library at Brown. I think it is worthy of note in connection with my natural bent for analysis that in an English Course Examination in my Senior year I correctly identified 13 out of 15 passages of writing that I had never seen before as being written by 13 authors whose other works we had studied. The next highest student named all correctly and also received a mark of "A".

From 1935 until 1959 I was Ass't Treasurer and vice-President, then President & Treasurer of Ferrier Land Company in Providence, a suburban development concern, except for a period during World War II (1945) when I was in cryptography work for the (then) Army Security Agency in Arlington, Virginia. I was, of course, screened and cleared at that time by the FBI and the Army and Navy Intelligence. So, you can see, I am used to being trusted with confidential and top secret information. In 1959 I moved to Delray Beach, Florida where I now reside. I have been elected vice-President, then President, and then Treasurer of the Nautical Aire Co-op Apartment Bldg. in which I reside. Until 1955 I owned and operated Post House, a wholesale firm which distributed Hawaiian imports to gift and specialty shops from Maine to Florida. I sold this in 1955. In 1952 I wrote and published a book entitled: "The Garden of Quivéra". It is a philosophical novella which symbolizes man's search for truth and beauty. It receives some fine reviews in Southeast Florida papers. (Copy on request).

I will be glad to furnish a list of references at any time. But as a starter, you might contact Mr. Spencer B. In the opinion of this graphologist the handwriting of Lee Harvey Oswald is a textbook example of that of a man who would stop at nothing - not even murder - to accomplish his aim. Whether that aim is to right a real or imagined wrong, or to achieve some form of fulfillment of a twisted or frustrated ego, for him the end justifies the means - any means.

It has been said that it is regrettable that Oswald's presence in Dallas was not known, so that he could have been watched or even detained during President Kennedy's visit there. It is also regrettable that the science of graphology, which is in growing use in personnel departments in industry and in the professions in the evaluation of character, personality traits, and aptitudes, has not achieved greater status among law-enforcement agencies. If it had, individuals like Lee Oswald would have been under much closer surveillance. For, regardless of whether the message itself in his letter (shown here) to (then) Secretary of the Navy Connally could or could not be judged as threatening (" I will use all means " etc.), the analysis of the handwriting itself is unmistakable. The writer of that letter was capable of the worst of crimes. If a graphologist had had the opportunity to see that letter in the files when it was first received, he would have warned the proper authorities that this was the handwriting of a dangerous individual, one who could react with a violent, overt act under conditions of real or imagined provocation.

There are many thousands of threatening letters written to public and private individuals by so-called " cranks ", many - doubtlessly most - of whom are incapable of following through with an overt act of any consequence. But this one had the earmarks of a violent nature.

Let us examine the letter for the tell-tale signs. The most obvious feature of this writing is its heavy, muddy, uneven pressure present in

every line. Note the thick, filled-in, blotchy letters in word after word, - the result of uneven surges of heavy bearing down on the pen. Constant heaviness of pressure itself merely indicates intensity of emotions, but muddy, unevenly pressured writing indicates a coarse, glutinous, sensuous, and vicious individual who seeks his own satisfaction without regard to the feelings or rights of others. This kind of writing appears quite frequently among criminals. It is rare in the handwriting that one sees in everyday life. When a graphologist does come across such writing he knows at once the sort of character he is studying. He is not surprised by it if he is doing work for law-enforcement agencies or in prisons. But if he comes across a sample in his work with industry or with private individual analyses, he pays special heed.

Let us look now at three ending strokes: that of the next to last word in the second line of the body of the letter, the word "you"; then the word "Paris" in the 7th line; and the word "certain" in the 9th line. These are all thick, clublike endings. And, in handwriting analysis, this indicates brutality. There is another meaning to the strong, vertical direction of that ending of "Paris", also, as well as the unusual second upstroke of the "y" in "family" in line 20, and this is the indication of a possible fanatic.

Look now at the fish-hook endings in the words "Ft. Worth" (line 5 "this" (line 11); and "California" (line 14). These show great tenacity and fixedness of purpose. This is not an evil trait, of course, (Abraham Lincoln's writing, for example, showed this), but when found in a nature such as this, it is clearer evidence as to what lengths and with what determination he would go to accomplish his ends. The majority of the remaining words have no ending strokes at all or are clipped short. This is a sign of basic selfishness.

Let us now look at the angle of inclination, or slant of the writing. You will see that the predominant slant is somewhat to the right

But note how the basic forward angle of inclination changes time and again to a vertical one, as shown by many of the small "b's" and "d's" and even to a backward slant as, for example, in the first two letters of the word: "answers" in line 8; the first "e" in the word "reported" (line 9); the "d" stem in the word "had" (line 12); the word "men" (line 13); and the first two letters of "and" (line 26), to name but a few. This changeable slant demonstrates psychic instability, and when you also find three other factors that demonstrate so clearly the same thing, you have an unsettled state of mind in continual conflict - a deeply moody and emotionally disturbed psychopathic individual. These three additional factors are 1.) the continual change of slope of entire lines (compare line one with line two; lines six, eight, and nine, to name a few); 2.) the inability to keep the words of each line on an even base line. One of the clearest examples is line 26, but practically all lines qualify. Place a ruler along the base lines and see the unevenness. 3.) the ever changing size of the small letters. Take the single line 9. Note the two sizes of the "o" in Moscow; the size of the "e" in "criticized", "certain", "facets", and "American"; the "c" in "Moscow" "criticized", "certain" and "American". You can go through each line with the same result.

There are other supplemental characteristics, too. Occasional very tall "d" stems point to vanity; small, inverted loops on initial strokes, as the "T" in "El Toro" indicating jealousy; and a number of long, inflexible initial strokes such as those at the start of many of the small "t's" at the beginning of a word show resentment.


Many of these latter characteristics, of course, appear in many handwritings in some degree and are not in themselves criminal tendencies. But the muddy, uneven, heavy-pressured writing is typical of the criminal. And so, too, are the thick, club-like ending strokes indicating brutality. And when are added to these the traits of jealousy,

resentment, vanity, moodiness, and the like, criminal potential is activated and compounded by these motivations, while in the non-criminal individual these traits make him in varying degrees merely a difficult, disagreeable, or obnoxious person to have around.

There is another trait that Oswald had which makes his murder by Jack Ruby the more disastrous. Notice that, while many of his small letter "a's" and "o's" are closed at the top indicating secretiveness as is borne out by much of his behaviour, there are also many (about 38 of them open at the top which means talkativeness at other times.

What significance does this have ? It indicates that, in all likelihood, Oswald eventually would have talked about the crime ! It is doubtful if he would have been able to keep from talking about it. The Chief of Police of Dallas, on the morning of Oswald's murder by Ruby, said that Oswald was becoming " more co-operative ". You may recall, also, that Oswald, during his attempted get-away, was reported to have mentioned to other passengers on the bus - shortly after boarding it - that the President had just been shot. This remark in no way strengthened his security. On the contrary, - since the other passengers were presumably unaware that such a thing had happened, such a statement could only serve, if anything, to increase his jeopardy ! Why, then, did he say it ? Only because he had a streak of both vanity and talkativeness, and had to say something about it.

Those open letters bear this out, and, in the opinion of this analyst, he would definitely have shed considerable light on it. We may never know whether Oswald was part of a conspiracy or whether he played a lone hand. If he was part of a conspiracy, were his masterminds aware of his potential talkativeness, and was Ruby assigned to silence him.?

I wish to call your attention to a case about which you may have personal knowledge since you are a resident of Fort Worth as I am.

In November 1959 an event was well publicized in the Fort Worth newspapers concerning a person who had gone to the Soviet Union to reside for a short time, (much in the same way E. Hemingway resided in Paris.)

This person in answers to questions put to him by reporters in Moscow criticized certain facets of American life. The story was blown up into another "turncoat" sensation, with the result that the Navy Department gave this person a belated dishonourable discharge, although he had received an honourable discharge after three years service on Sept. 11, 1959 at El Toro, Marine Corps Base in California.

These are the basic facts of my case.

I have and always had the full sanction of the U.S. Embassy, Moscow U.S.S.R. and hence the U.S. government. In as much as I am returning to the U.S.A. in this year with the aid of the U.S. Embassy (bring with me my family (since I married in the U.S.S.R.)) I shall employ all means to right this gross mistake or injustice to a honi-fied U.S. citizen and ex-service man. The U.S. government has no charges or complaints against me. I ask you to look into this case and take the necessary steps to repair the damage done to me and my family. For information I would direct you to consult the American Embassy, Chikovski St. 19/21, Moscow, U.S.S.R.

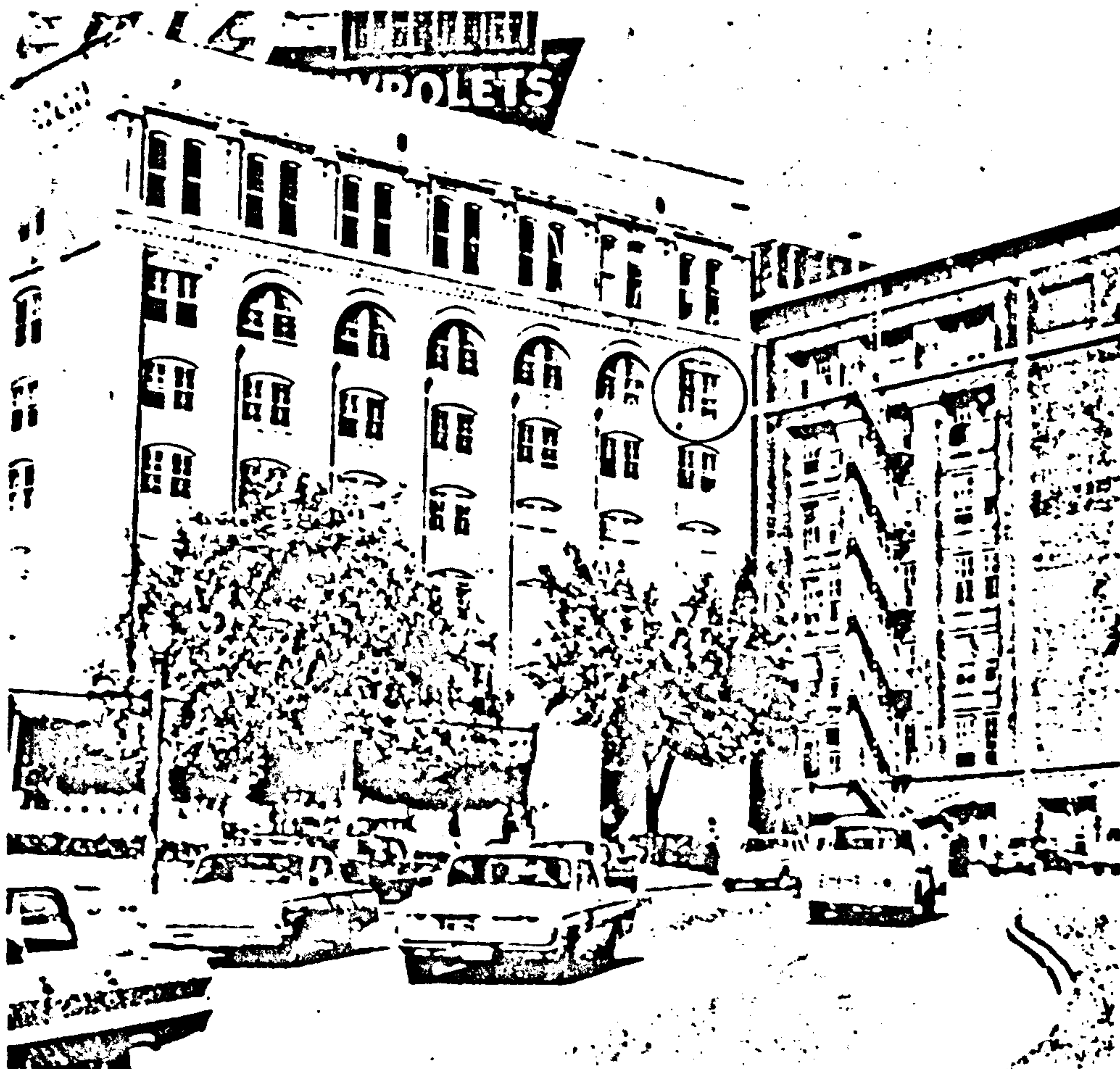
Sniper had this view as he fired from the 6th floor of the Dallas book storage building. Rifle, with 4-power scope mounted on it, was found near open window.

information relating to the probable source of the leak of RUBY's testimony which was published verbatim in the "New York Journal American" newspaper under the by-line of DOROTHY KILGALLEN. With regard to leaks involving the various OSWALD items, as well as the leak pertaining to the polygraph examination afforded JACK L. RUBY, investigation conducted by the Bureau substantially has indicated those leaks in all probability occurred in Dallas.

Inquiry 9/18/64 by WFO disclosed Miss LUCILLE ANN ROBINSON, a former employee of the staff of the President's Commission had moved from 5000 Dixon Street, S.E., Washington, D. C., on 8/29/64 leaving a forwarding address of Friends Bible College, Haviland, Kansas. Info obtained by WFO was to the effect that prior to her employment by the Commission Miss ROBINSON worked for Department of Agriculture. The dates of her employment by the Commission are not known.

KANSAS CITY

AT HAVILAND, KANSAS. Will interview LUCILLE ANN ROBINSON, former stenographer employed by the President's Commission on the Assassination of President KENNEDY. She should be specifically questioned as to any knowledge she may have relating to the possible source or sources of leaks of information to the news media of the material relating to OSWALD, namely the OSWALD diary, the photograph of a letter from CP USA to OSWALD, the photograph of his discharge from the U. S. Marine Corps and the photograph of his international certificate of vaccination. These matters are set out in detail in Buairtel 9/14/64 and should be reported in LHM form, incorporating her information on form 302.

Miss ROBINSON also should be interviewed with regard to the leak of material relating to RUBY, namely the RUBY testimony before Chief Justice WARREN and the polygraph examination of RUBY. Miss ROBINSON's knowledge of these materials also should be recorded in an LHM using form 302. Six copies of each 302 should be forwarded to Bureau and single copies to Dallas for info.

ReWFOairtel 9/17/64 which is enclosed points out pertinent points of investigation at the Commission with regard to the transcript of the interview of RUBY 6/7/64 at Dallas. If Miss ROBINSON has any knowledge concerning the making of reproduced copies of the RUBY testimony or any other similar documents at the Commission during her employment there full details of same should be obtained.

Bureau instructs this investigation be handled immediately and results submitted expeditiously.

Further, it is possible Truly might endeavor to capitalize on any such letter from the Director by seeking publicity to exaggerate the part he played in this investigation. In view of the above, it is not recommended a letter of appreciation be sent to Truly.

Your attention is directed to the information in the enclosures concerning allegations made by Alberto de Jesus Santalo-Fuertes that Oswald met Cuban Premier Fidel Castro in Mexico, that Oswald and Ruby were "connected" and that one million dollars had been offered for the assassination of Castro.

Santalo-Fuertes should be thoroughly interviewed for complete details concerning his allegations and for the identities of the sources of his information. Bureau has determined through

The information from the Department of Defense concerning the allegations made by Santalo-Fuertes was referred to us by the President's Commission. The Agents reports concerning the investigation done by the Army in December, 1963, and January, 1964, regarding Santalo-Fuertes were received from the Department of the Army on 9-29-64. The allegations made by Santalo-Fuertes should be run out. He is a Cuban refugee who entered the Army on 7-11-63. We do not know why he was discharged before the end of his two-year "hitch" but the enclosures include an application for release from active duty to join the anti-Castro forces in Central America. The enclosed Army reports advise he never cause any trouble in the Army but there is no evaluation of his reliability.

Mrs. CORA D. HAZLEWOOD, Crosbyton, Texas, states she saw on television the rifle being fired from the Texas School Book Depository (TSBD) window by man having OSWALD's build and complexion. Supplemental listing of exhibits by item number and description prepared. Investigation establishes clip found in Mannlicher-Carcano rifle, Serial Number C2766, was empty at time it was found. Lt. JOHN CARL DAY, Crime Laboratory, Dallas Police Department, furnished details concerning his lifting of latent palm print from assassination weapon, which was identified as that of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, but states did not photograph such print because of instructions received from Chief of Police to immediately turn rifle over to FBI. Weights of each of the four cardboard cartons comprising Exhibit C40 determined, as well as fact that no cartons on sixth floor of TSBD on 11/22/63, which could not have been handled by one individual. All identifiable latent fingerprints and palm prints found on four cardboard cartons, Exhibit C40, identified with the exception of one palm print concerning which investigation still being conducted. EUGENE P. ALDREDGE alleges OSWALD had help in the assassination because there was what appeared to be bullet mark on sidewalk on Elm Street about even with west end of TSBD. Results of FBI Laboratory examinations of additional items of property obtained reflect one bus ticket stub No. 13688, issued by Transportes del Norte (Exhibit D237) was originally connected to the two stubs (Exhibit D202) and that "Lee H. Oswald" signatures appearing on three of the six United States of America Parcel Post Customs Declaration tags (Exhibit D249) were written by

Concerning alleged contact by LEE HARVEY OSWALD to purchase automobile at Downtown Lincoln-Mercury, Dallas, Texas, in November, 1963, ALBERT GUY BOGARD states he prepared customer's purchase sheet; but, inasmuch as individual believed to be OSWALD declined to sign a purchase order, he, BOGARD, tore up the purchase sheet and threw it away. States individual did not show him any identification. Additional investigation conducted concerning allegation by CLIFTON M. SHASTEEN that individual believed to be OSWALD was in his barbershop at Irving, Texas, on several occasions prior to assassination. FLOYD GUY DAVIS and Mrs. VIRGINIA PASE DAVIS, who operate Sports Drome Rifle Range, Dallas, Texas, have available only records reflecting identities of individuals who used such range from 10/26/63 to 11/3/63. Mrs. GARLAND G. (LUCILLE) SLACK states she was at Sports Drome Rifle Range with her husband on 11/17/63 and that she did not see OSWALD or anyone resembling him. She stated she believes her husband is confused as to the date he saw individual he thought was OSWALD. Investigation established that BERNARD WEISSMAN, who was alleged to have been at the Carousel Club, Dallas, Texas, at a two-hour meeting with Dallas Police Officer J. D. TIPPET and JACK RUBY, was working on night of 11/14/63 as a carpet salesman for Carpet Engineers of Texas, Dallas, Texas. Signed statements obtained from ROY S. TRULY, TSED, and Patrolman MARRION L. BAKER, Dallas Police Department, who observed OSWALD alone in lunchroom on second floor of TSED immediately after assassination. Allegation that ERICH LINTROP knew OSWALD, JACK RUBY and the "money man", who were involved in the assassination, not substantiated by investigation. Additional investigation conducted to identify and locate "JERRY TOLLIVER" in connection with allegation by JAMES ALFORD MARKHAM that he (MARKHAM) met OSWALD prior to assassination, with negative results. Extensive investigation conducted concerning allegation by SYLVIA ODIO that she observed OSWALD in company of two Cuban or Mexican men sometime in late September or early October, 1963, including investigation concerning reputation of ODIO for veracity.

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By communication dated September 25, 1964, the Philadelphia Office advised that on September 24, 1964, a Mrs. HARRIS, 810 Bristol Pike, Croydon, Pennsylvania, telephonically contacted the Philadelphia Office and advised that recently she had been in Texas and while there visited a Mrs. CORA HAZLEWOOD, Crosbyton, Texas. According to Mrs. HARRIS, Mrs. HAZLEWOOD related the story that she had been watching the parade of President KENNEDY on television when he visited Dallas, Texas. Mrs. HAZLEWOOD, according to Mrs. HARRIS, stated that just before President KENNEDY was shot she saw what appeared to be a broomstick come out of the window of a building. Mrs. HAZLEWOOD reportedly later learned this was the building from which the fatal shots were fired. Mrs. HARRIS stated that according to Mrs. HAZLEWOOD, the broomstick appeared, withdrew, reappeared, and then the shots were fired that killed the President.

CORA D. HAZLEWOOD, 114 South Durham, furnished the following information:

She advised she is 68 years of age and spends a great deal of time viewing television programs due to the fact that she is badly crippled by arthritis.

She stated that at approximately 12:30 p.m. on the afternoon of November 22, 1963, she was watching President KENNEDY's parade through Dallas, Texas, on Channel 13. She advised that as the President's car drew even with the Texas School Book Depository, she heard Mrs. KENNEDY say to the President, "You may think that they do not love you here, but look how they are cheering you." She further advised that the President then turned to Mrs. KENNEDY and with a smile said, "Yes".

She advised that approximately two minutes before this exchange of words between the President and his wife, she had seen a gun barrel protruding from the sixth floor window of the Texas School Book Depository. She stated that she knew this was a rifle barrel because she could see the sights on the rifle. She stated that the rifle followed the President's car until it was about even with the Texas School Book Depository. After hearing the exchange of words between the President and his wife, she glanced up at the window where she had seen the rifle and saw three puffs of smoke. She then looked at the President and saw him slumping down in the seat. She further advised that she then looked at the window from which the rifle was protruding and saw someone drawing the rifle back inside. She stated that then a man looked out the window. She further advised she was unable to say definitely that the man she saw was LEE HARVEY OSWALD but that the man she saw certainly had OSWALD's build and complexion. She further stated that the man in the window had wild-looking eyes and appeared to be frightened.

Mrs. CORA HAZLEWOOD further stated that she was certain that JACK RUBY had murdered OSWALD to keep him from talking about their association. She stated that she believes RUBY was behind President KENNEDY's murder; however, she has no proof or evidence to support her belief.

She further stated that although she is badly crippled, she would be willing to travel any distance to aid in the investigation into the assassination of President KENNEDY.

It should be noted that the investigation into the assassination of President KENNEDY revealed that the conversation referred to by Mrs. HAZLEWOOD as being between the President and Mrs. KENNEDY actually was a conversation between Mrs. JOHN CONNALLY and the President and which actual conversation was not recorded on any television program. The reported conversation did receive news dissemination in various news media. There was no information developed that any of the conversation taking place in the Presidential car immediately before or after the shooting was recorded.

It should be further noted that all known available film depicting activities at the Texas School Book Depository immediately before and after the assassination have been thoroughly reviewed during the course of this investigation.
