

- (a) of our faith in materialism that our scientists are our priests,
(b) of our faith in secular humanism that our psychiatrists are our priests, and
(c) of our faith in Almighty God that our Catholic priests are our Priests (i.e. author's partisan view - It would be a Rabbi or Minister for those of other faiths).

Truths may be drawn from this terrible event that will show forth the glory of God and contribute to the possibility of drawing more souls to Him. As the natural life of John Kennedy ebbed away, despite the frantic efforts of our magnificent medical doctors and the facilities they have, the faiths of Materialism and Secular Humanism and its ministers, the scientists and psychiatrists, stood by helpless and despairing. One faith, that in Almighty God, demonstrated that it lives even through such terrible events in Glory and Majesty and provides to its adherents the spiritual power of the Love of God which has overcome death.

At the end of this analysis, it is necessary to mention once again that as a person who has left the living Oswald will never be able to be tried for this crime. It is the duty of a Christian to wish the mercy of our Lord on the soul of the man Lee Oswald and leave to Almighty God His judgement.

The only justification that can be presented for undertaking such an analysis is that the confusion most people experience due to the main suspect's untimely death, ignorance of motives and the utmost seriousness of the act perpetrated as of now lend themselves, with a realistic knowledge of human weakness, to unscrupulous individuals using this situation to make unfounded charges against second parties and in turn leading to general, unproductive investigative work.

We received a letter dated 11-5-64 from the above individual in which Gorman states that he feels that he and the Director both "have the same approach in evaluating character." He states that he reached this conclusion from reading "Persons in Hiding." Gorman also indicated a desire to meet with the Director "in the near future" to discuss with the Director the enclosed two articles written by him which deal with a study of the Greeks and a study of Lee Harvey Oswald.

Bufiles indicate that Gorman is a [redacted] In September the Department furnished us with a fifteen-page letter written to former Attorney General Kennedy. This was sent to the Los Angeles Office since Gorman resides in the Long Beach area. The Los Angeles Office did not interview him because of his "obvious instability and unreliability."

The Director, of course, will not want to take time to meet this person, and if he should visit the Bureau, he should be referred to an Agent in the Crime Records Division. Since we do not have his return address, no acknowledgement is being made of this letter.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Gorman be referred to an Agent in the Crime Records Division if he should visit the Bureau and request to see the Director.

Mrs. HUNTER recontacted Dallas Office on 11/11/64, requesting to speak to SA RICHARD J. BURNETT. Contact made with Mrs. HUNTER telephonically by SA BURNETT on morning of 11/12/64, at which time it was apparent Mrs. HUNTER is still upset over reference to her in Commission's report and was apparently blaming the FBI. Arrangements were made to personally contact Mrs. HUNTER, 11/12/64, at her home in Irving, Texas.

Mrs. HUNTER upon personal contact advised she was interested in obtaining name of FBI Agent who had interviewed Mrs. DOMINEY (This is still the way HUNTER spells the surname of DORIS DOMINEY). She was asked why she wanted the Agent's name and she replied that she was considering instituting a suit against DOMINEY and needed the Agent's name. Naturally, she was advised that this Agent's name could not be furnished her.

Mrs. HUNTER stated that she is still greatly upset over the information published in the Commission's report regarding her. She stated that she could not understand why the FBI and the Commission had taken the word of Mrs. DOMINEY regarding her, HUNTER, without

checking out DOMINEY's personal reputation. She continued stating that Mrs. DOMINEY is a person of poor reputation, has had numerous traffic tickets, has been arrested and even shot once while committing a burglary while a youth in Jacksonville, Texas. Mrs. HUNTER was reminded that she had not previously furnished this information regarding Mrs. DOMINEY at the time of her interview on August 11, 1964.

It was minutely explained to Mrs. HUNTER that the Commission's report was prepared by the President's Commission and not by the FBI, and that the FBI had nothing to do with just what the Commission chose to print in its report. She was advised that the Bureau's investigation in this matter was conducted at the request of the Attorney General and the President of the United States and at the direction of the President, the results of the FBI investigation were furnished to the President's Commission on the Assassination of President KENNEDY.

Mrs. HUNTER, while a little upset at the beginning of the interview, was most cordial at the end and stated that she had no complaint with the FBI, but was still mad at the Commission. She asked if she should write the Commission directly regarding her personal feelings in instant matter. She was advised that that was a decision she would have to make on her own and that the FBI could make no suggestions either way in this regard.

Mrs. HUNTER added that she would try "through some friends in Houston" to determine the name of the Agent who interviewed Mrs. DOMINEY.

Mrs. HUNTER is referred to on pages 317-318 of the Commission's report.

A copy of this communication is being furnished the Houston Office for information purposes.

No further action is being taken in this matter by the Dallas Office.

Oswald was receiving "Time" magazine at Post Office Box 2915 in Dallas. When he moved to New Orleans in May, 1963, certain of his periodicals were placed in Box 2915 which was then being rented by a Mr. Gonzalo Ancira. Ancira apparently did not turn this "Time" magazine over to Postal authorities but instead gave it to Miss Frances Blanton who worked in Ancira's office. This occurred approximately the latter part of June, 1963. Following the assassination, Miss Blanton, in going over old magazines at her residence, came upon this magazine addressed to Oswald. She brought it to the attention of Dallas Office and the magazine was forwarded to the Bureau, where it is being held as evidence (105-82555-3500). Miss Blanton now wishes this magazine be returned to her. We have contacted Postal authorities in Dallas and Washington, D. C., who stated they have no objection to this issue of "Time" magazine being returned to Miss Blanton. Upon advice from the President's Commission, we will afford proper disposition to the magazine.

Re Bureau airtel dated 10/20/64 in the matter regarding the return of an issue of "Time" magazine dated June 21, 1963, to Miss FRANCES BLANTON who had originally given this magazine to the FBI for information purposes.

On 10/26/64, instant matter was explained to Postal Inspector R. W. THOMAS, Dallas, Texas, at which time he advised that GONZALEZ ANCIIRA, the holder of Post Office Box # 2915, Dallas, Texas, after OSWALD, was technically in violation of the postal statutes for not having returned instant "Time" magazine to the postal window for forwarding to OSWALD when he found it in his mailbox. However, Inspector THOMAS noted that this is not an uncommon event when it comes to magazines even though the publisher desires that such magazines be returned to them when not delivered to the addresses.

Inspector THOMAS noted that the Federal law in this particular regard is primarily for the protection of valuables, such as checks, stocks, etc., and is seldom if ever invoked when it comes to the question of the mere forwarding of a magazine.

Inspector THOMAS stated that in view of the fact that the addressee, OSWALD in this instance, is deceased and he had apparently never made a complaint about not having received the issue of "Time" magazine in question, then he could see no objection in returning the magazine to Miss BLANTON.

However, Inspector THOMAS stated that if the FBI still did not feel that his personal opinion in this regard is sufficient authority to return the magazine directly to Miss BLANTON, then he suggested that the Bureau might want to discuss the matter further with higher Postal Authorities in Washington, D. C.

In view of the above information, the "Time" magazine in question will be returned to Miss BLANTON by the Dallas Office when the President's Commission decides it need not be retained further as permanent evidence in this investigation, UACB.

By letter dated 11-2-64, the President's Commission suggested additional investigation concerning the precise sources of the description of the assassin that was given out by the Dallas Police Department at 12:45 p. m., on 11-22-63.

Commission also suggested the Bureau endeavor to determine if the local officers searching the sixth floor of the Texas School Book Depository Building, on 11-22-63, were ever specifically notified that shots had come from that floor and specifically the window pointed out by one Howard Brennan, who may also be the individual who furnished the description that was given out on the police broadcast as mentioned above. The Commission commented that they desired information why it was some 40 minutes after the shooting occurred that shells and cartons were discovered at the window from which the shots came rather than during the immediate search of the area following the shooting.

By letter to the Commission dated 11-2-64, we pointed out that results of investigation the Bureau had conducted, which had been made available on 1-14-64, to the President's Commission, covered the precise sources of the description of the suspected assassin, which was broadcast by the Dallas Police Department. It was pointed out that the police department did not have data available to pinpoint the identity of the person who furnished the description that had been put out at 12:45 p. m., on 11-22-63. It was also pointed out to the Commission that at the time of the assassination the police that were on hand were performing various duties and that it appeared that a detailed search had not gotten underway immediately at the Texas School Book Depository Building and consequently the shells were not found for approximately 40 minutes after the shooting occurred.

Mr. Albert Goldberg of the President's Commission called today and stated that he fully appreciated the investigation that had been conducted by the Bureau in the early stages and information which had been previously transmitted to the Commission. He advised that the President's Commission had never questioned the information that the

Bureau had submitted and at the time did not feel a necessity existed for attempting to delve any deeper into this situation; it being noted that the Bureau's investigation appeared to exhaust the possibilities that were available.

Mr. Goldberg stated that since the release of the report of the President's Commission, there have been a number of articles written and some correspondence wherein issue was being made concerning the two points referred to and that based on this he had discussed the problem with Mr. Rankin and Mr. Rankin felt that it would be to the advantage of the Commission, even though it was too late for the report, and to the Bureau's advantage to show that an additional check was made concerning these items. He was interested in whether or not we were able to develop any positive information. He advised that for this reason he would like to send another letter to the Bureau again requesting this investigation and would furnish additional information showing what the request was based on in order that the Bureau would have full facts and would see the justification for additional effort being made in running out these two items.

ACTION:

Upon receipt of the letter from the President's Commission it will be carefully reviewed, and if justified based on the information made available, instructions will be issued the Dallas Office in an effort to develop the information requested.

He stated that "GDM" as mentioned in the notebook was GEORGE DE MOHRENSCHILDT, whom he had learned knew OSWALD well. He said he had spoken with DE MOHRENSCHILDT at Haiti and that he had also talked with SAMUEL BALLEEN about the assassination.

He stated that none of the writing in the notebook had any special significance, but were merely notes jotted down concerning his observations and conversations with various people. He stated that he had no information which had not been published in the Warren Report. He further stated that he had been trying to come up with a "scoop" for NBC, but that he had been unsuccessful in learning anything new. He stated that the Warren Commission Report came out with everything he had managed to learn by his own investigation and he knew of nothing which would shed any additional light on the matter.

Mr. MC MILLAN indicated a desire to have his notebook and since it has no apparent evidentiary value, it was therefore returned to him.

At the conclusion of interview, Mr. MC MILLAN expressed a desire to have instant conversation transcribed, stating that he had had his words misconstrued in the past in such conversations, and he wished to prevent recurrences. He was advised of the confidential nature of Bureau files and he stated that he would discuss this matter without a transcription providing he need not discuss specific conversations he had with people such as BALLEEN and DE MOHRENSCHILDT. He stated he did not wish to compromise them or NBC.

Mr. MC MILLAN later in the day telephonically contacted the Augusta, Ga. RA and advised that he had telephoned NBC after being interviewed. He stated NBC had instructed him to co-operate fully in this matter and that if any additional information was desired, he would so co-operate. He reiterated, however, that he had no new information to provide.

Mr. MC MILLAN was thanked for his courtesy and advised that the information he had furnished would be provided to our Dallas Office, who would determine whether it would be desirable to further discuss the matter with him.

For your information, the President's Commission advised by letter dated 11/16/64 that it has requested of the Attorney General an opinion concerning the right of the Government to retain in its permanent possession certain of the items of physical evidence related to the assassination of President Kennedy. As soon as this point has been resolved by the President's Commission, your office will be notified as to what items may be returned to the various owners of evidence, including Robert Oswald. You are aware, of course, that Marina Oswald has also expressed an interest in having all items of evidence that belonged to Marina and/or Lee Harvey Oswald returned to her after the Government has no further need for such items of evidence. Inasmuch as a number of the items of evidence that were turned over to your office by Robert Oswald actually fall within the category of data belonging to Marina or Lee Harvey Oswald, you should contact Robert Oswald and discuss this matter with him. You should specifically determine if Robert Oswald has no objection to this Bureau returning to Marina all items that belonged to Marina or Lee Harvey Oswald, even though a number of such items of evidence were actually turned over to the Bureau by Robert Oswald. If Robert Oswald has no objection to such items of evidence being returned directly to Marina Oswald, you should obtain from him a brief signed statement wherein he indicates he has no objection to such data being turned over directly to Marina Oswald, when such items are disposed of by the U. S. Government.

In the event Robert Oswald insists that those items of evidence belonging to Marina and/or Robert Oswald which were turned over to this Bureau by Robert Oswald be returned directly to him, so advise the Bureau in order that this matter can be taken up with the Attorney General for an opinion.

NOTE:

During the investigation of Oswald, we have obtained considerable material that belonged to Marina and Lee Harvey Oswald. Some of this material was turned over to the FBI by the Dallas Police Department following its search of Oswald's residence in Dallas and in the Ruth Paine home. We also obtained considerable effects of Marina and Lee Harvey Oswald which were not initially seized by the Dallas Police Department from Robert Oswald. Dallas Office has been informed that both Robert and Marina Oswald have requested certain possessions of Marina and Lee Harvey Oswald be returned to them. Robert specifically requested that the material that he turned over to the Bureau be returned to him. Much of this material was obtained from the Ruth Paine residence by Robert Oswald after the assassination when Marina Oswald no longer resided there. Inasmuch as Robert and Marina Oswald have expressed an interest in many of the same items of evidence, desirable we attempt to clarify Robert's request for such data inasmuch as it appears the material in question belongs to Marina as the effects of her husband's estate.

On August 13, 1964, at the specific request of the President's Commission investigating the assassination of the late President John F. Kennedy, a Special Agent from our Houston Office interviewed Mrs. Doris M. Dominey, 8133 Locksley, Houston, Texas. This interview was primarily for the purpose of verifying statements made by Mrs. J. T. (Gertrude) Hunter, 141 South Hastings, Irving, Texas, in a deposition to a staff member of the President's Commission.

Mrs. Dominey's sister is married to Mrs. Hunter's brother. The information furnished by Mrs. Dominey is inconsistent in some respects with the information furnished by Mrs. Hunter. In addition, Mrs. Dominey volunteered information concerning Mrs. Hunter which she described as "personality traits." This information included the observations that Mrs. Hunter has a strange obsession for attempting to inject herself into any big event which comes to her attention, that Mrs. Hunter is likely to claim some personal knowledge of any major crime which receives much publicity and that the "entire family" was aware of the "tall tales" told by Mrs. Hunter and normally the family paid no attention to her. The results of our investigation in this matter, including the above gratuitous observations of Mrs. Dominey, were furnished to the President's Commission by letter dated August 19, 1964. SUBJECT: OSWALD CASE

Shortly after noon today Joseph Cella, an Attorney in the Criminal Division of the Department, called SA Dwight J. Dalbey and said he has a problem that has come up in the Oswald case. Mrs. Oswald is demanding as her property both the gun which Oswald used to assassinate the President and the slugs taken from the President's body. Cella said he will take the position that as a matter of property law the slugs were abandoned at the time the gun was fired and no longer constitute the private property of Oswald or his heirs. There is a problem, however, as to the gun. It is not in violation of either the National Firearms Act or the Federal Firearms Act. Cella wanted to know whether the FBI had any experience which might lead him to the answer in this case.

SA Dalbey told Cella that we have no information which would be of assistance to him. The question of the right of a murderer in a Federal case, or his heirs to the return of the murder weapon privately owned and not in violation of any Federal statute, and where there is no trial in which the judge could be asked for a ruling, has not been raised to this Bureau so far as we know.

Re Dallas airtel to Bureau, 11/4/64, and Bureau airtel to Dallas, 11/10/64, relating to a pillowcase, a bedspread and two bedsheets belonging to Mrs. A. C. JOHNSON.

On 11/13/64, H. W. HILL, Property Clerk, Dallas Police Department, advised his department had no additional property not previously listed on the Police Department inventory or furnished to the FBI at Dallas. He had no recollection regarding a bedspread or bedsheets being among the property seized at 1026 North Beckley Street, Dallas.

On 11/13/64, Detectives W. E. POTTS, B. L. SENKEL and F. M. TURNER, Homicide Bureau, Dallas Police Department, all advised they do not recall taking a bedspread or bedsheets from OSWALD's room at 1026 North Beckley at the time it was searched by them. TURNER and POTTS recall using a pillowcase to carry items seized in search.

For information of the Bureau, H. M. MOORE, Detective, Homicide Bureau, Dallas Police Department, who was the fourth individual performing search of OSWALD's room mentioned above, presently on vacation and not available prior to week-end of November 21, 1964.

UACB, MOORE will not be contacted due to negative information received from other Detectives taking part in the search.

Reurairtels 11/4/64 and 11/16/64 setting forth results of your contacts with Mrs. A. C. Johnson regarding property she claims was taken from her residence by the Dallas Police Department during its search following the assassination.

For your information, Bufiles indicate that only a pillowcase was made available to the FBI by the Dallas Police Department as having come from Mrs. Johnson's residence. For your added information, the President's Commission has advised the Bureau that it has contacted the Attorney General for an opinion concerning the right of the Government to retain in its permanent possession certain of the items of physical evidence related to the assassination of President Kennedy.

You should immediately contact Mrs. Johnson and inform her of your contacts with the Dallas Police Department concerning the bedspread and bedsheets which she claims are missing from her residence and which she believes were taken by the Dallas Police Department during its search of Oswald's room. You should also inform Mrs. Johnson that as soon as advice is received by the Bureau from the President's Commission regarding disposition of the pillowcase which belongs to her, she will be immediately advised.

On 11/3/64, Mrs. A. C. JOHNSON, 1026 North Beckley, Dallas, Texas, telephonically advised that when the Dallas Police Department had been to her place to search for the belongings of OSWALD, they had picked up a bedspread, green or pink Hobnail type, a pillowcase and two sheets, large size. She advised since the Warren Report had been published, she would now like to obtain her property.

On 11/4/64, after examining the inventory of all items obtained during this investigation, it was noted no bedspread or sheets were included in the inventory as having been obtained from 1026 North Beckley or any other source. It was noted a pillowcase was obtained from this address and this item is listed as A22.

On 11/4/64, Mrs. JOHNSON was advised the inventory of items obtained by the Dallas Police Department at 1026 North Beckley did not contain any bedspread or sheets, however, did list one pillowcase.

Mrs. JOHNSON was advised her request would be furnished to FBI Headquarters for referral to the appropriate authorities. It was noted at this time Mrs. JOHNSON commented that she was not positive the two sheets were taken; however, the bedspread was missing.

NOTE:

Mrs. Johnson owns the rooming house at 1026 North Beckley where Oswald resided at the time of the assassination. Dallas Police Department made search of Oswald's room and obtained considerable material which eventually was turned over to FBI for retention. Mrs. Johnson claims a bedspread, a pillowcase, and two bedsheets were taken from her rooming house as part of search concerning Oswald. Our records reflect that only the pillowcase was taken and is part of the evidence maintained by FBI Laboratory. After contact of Dallas Police Department, we will take this matter up with the Commission for disposition of the pillowcase and possibly other effects of Mrs. Johnson.

Reference is made to your letter of November 10, 1964, and the enclosure thereto consisting of a copy of a letter to the President of the United States from [redacted]. In his letter to the President, [redacted] stated he had been interviewed by both the FBI and the United States Secret Service but had not been called upon by the Warren Commission to give his direct and full testimony.

For your information, [redacted] was interviewed by this Bureau on November 27, 1963, concerning his knowledge of Lee Harvey Oswald. Results of our interview with [redacted] were furnished to the President's Commission in the report of Special Agent Warren C. DeBrueys dated December 2, 1963, at Dallas, Texas, in the matter entitled "Lee Harvey Oswald, IS - RUSSIA - CUBA," pages 705 and 706. [redacted] identity was not set out in the report of Special Agent DeBrueys, but instead [redacted] was referred to as Confidential Informant NO T-5. For your added information, [redacted] identity was not revealed in Special Agent DeBrueys' report because of his specific request that his identity not be revealed. He made this request because his father was at the time imprisoned in Cuba and his mother was then residing in Cuba.

NOTE:

[redacted] is an anti-Castro Cuban refugee residing in [redacted]. Following Oswald's arrest by the New Orleans Police Department, August 9, 1963, when he was distributing pro-Cuban material, [redacted] on August 16, 1963, contacted Oswald in an effort to penetrate Oswald's Fair Play for Cuba Committee organization. [redacted] was unsuccessful in such mission. Results of [redacted] interview by the New Orleans Office were furnished to the Commission in the report of SA DeBrueys mentioned herein but his identify was protected by a T symbol at his specific request. By letter 11/10/64 the President's Commission forwarded to the Bureau a copy of a letter [redacted] directed to the President of the United States. In this letter [redacted] signed his name, indicated he had been interviewed by the FBI and Secret Service, and wondered why he had not been called upon by the Warren Commission to give his direct and full testimony. We do not know why [redacted] has apparently changed his mind and identified himself in his letter to the President. He probably feels affronted that he did not get publicity in the Warren Commission report. Desirable we inform the Commission that we did interview [redacted] during our investigation and set forth the reason why his name was not identified to the Commission.
