

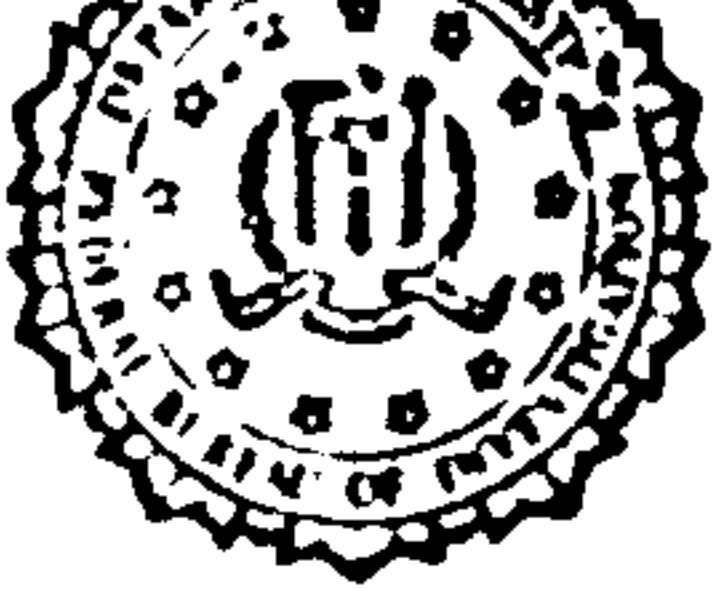

All sources set forth herein have furnished reliable information unless otherwise indicated.

The "National Guardian" issue of October 3, 1964, Page 10, Columns four and five, contained an advertisement which noted that on October 19, 1964, a debate would be held at the Manhattan Center, Eighth Avenue and 34th Street, New York City, between "Melvin Belli, Jack Ruby's Trial Lawyer and Mark Lane Retained to Represent Lee Oswald at Warren Commission". The title of this debate was listed as "Was Oswald the Lone Assassin?" The ad noted that tickets were available only at the office of the Citizens' Committee of Inquiry (CCI), 156 Fifth Avenue, New York City and all checks for tickets were to be made payable to the CCI. Ticket prices were listed as from \$2.50 to \$5.00 for orchestra seats and \$1.50 for balcony seats.

The "National Guardian" is characterized in Appendix attached hereto.

On October 19, 1964, the first, second and third confidential sources attended the Mark Lane - Melvin Belli debate sponsored by the CCI which was held at Manhattan Center, Eighth Avenue and 34th Street, New York City, on that date.

These sources stated the debate was conducted before a "sold out house" of several thousand people. Lane and Belli were allowed up to 40 minutes each to present their arguments and were subsequently permitted a 15 minute rebuttal period each.

These sources stated Lane spoke first and, for the most part, reiterated his long-held views on the circumstances surrounding the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in Dallas Texas on November 22, 1963. Lane charged that the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Secret Service and the Dallas Police Department have concealed evidence concerning the assassination from the American public. He also charged that many items of evidence in the case were ignored by the authorities in their desire to prove that no conspiracy was involved and that Lee Harvey Oswald was the lone killer of President Kennedy. Lane reviewed various questions which he alleged had not been answered by the investigation of the Warren Commission such as the actual number of shots fired, the "peculiar" circumstances surrounding the medical evaluation of the President's wounds, the "tampering" of the photograph of Lee Harvey Oswald which appeared in various magazines including "Life" and "Newsweek" and the "change" of the rifle involved from a German Mauser, caliber 7.65 millimeter to an Italian military carbine, caliber 6.5 millimeter. Lane alleged that these and many other questions had never been answered by any of the governmental authorities involved in the investigation.

These sources advised that during his speech Lane strongly implied that Lee Harvey Oswald was innocent of the slaying of President Kennedy.

These sources stated that Melvin Belli replied to the points raised by Lane by confining his remarks to the findings of the Warren Commission which, he stated, not only proved Oswald was guilty, but also that he was the lone assassin. He stated he was glad Lane had not made any definite claim of a conspiracy on the part of the FBI or the Secret Service in the investigation of the assassination. Belli pointed out all judgment as to Oswald's guilt must be based on available physical evidence such as the palm print found on the rifle. The nature of this evidence, he stated, must be the basis of any conclusion concerning the guilt of Oswald and a conclusion must not be reached based on rumors or conjecture.

These sources stated that Mr. Belli spoke in favor of the Warren report and stated that in a democracy such as the United States, the citizen must have faith in his governmental institutions like the FBI and the Secret Service. He stated that in his opinion, the findings of the Warren Commission report left no doubt whatsoever as to the guilt of Lee Harvey Oswald. In this connection, Mr. Belli stated that the widely circulated report that there had been a meeting prior to the assassination between Dallas Police Officer J.D. Tippit and Jack Ruby, was completely false. He stated numerous rumors and misstatements appeared after the assassination due to the general shock and confusion surrounding the situation in Dallas at that time.

These sources stated that in rebuttal, Mark Lane repeated much of his original statement and charged again that the Warren report did not contain all the facts in the assassination and had been written with no other purpose than to prove Oswald was the lone assassin. He again accused the FBI, the Secret Service and the Dallas Police Department of concealing, ignoring or changing evidence which tended to support the theory that Oswald could not have acted alone. Lane told the audience that he could not claim any conspiracy on the part of

government agencies because he had no solid evidence on which to base such a claim. He pointed out, however, that if he ever obtains such evidence, he will be "careful" to make it public not in the United States, but in some place like Paris, France or even Zanzibar.

These sources stated the meeting was concluded with a short question and answer period in which both Lane and Belli took part.

"NATIONAL GUARDIAN"

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of December 1, 1961, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the "National Guardian":

"National Guardian

- "1. 'established by the American Labor Party in 1947 as a "progressive" weekly * * *. Although it denies having any affiliation with the Communist Party, it has manifested itself from the beginning as a virtual official propaganda arm of Soviet Russia.' (Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, Trial by Treason: The National Committee to Secure Justice for the ROSENBERGS and MORTON SOBELL, August 25, 1956, p. 12.)"

The Director stated the Warren Commission had completely distorted the FBI's investigation of Oswald; that Oswald had not given any indication of being a violent type of individual, nor did we have any record of violence on his part until after the assassination. He was a "loner." He had gone to Russia, had defected, and had worked in a factory in Russia. Mr. Hoover said he personally thought it was wrong to grant Oswald a visa to return to this country and to allow him full citizenship rights when he did return.

He stated that none of Oswald's actions showed he was a threat to the President or that he was dangerous. The FBI did not know of his psychiatric treatment in New York until after the assassination. He stated that on the day of the assassination the police went into the building where Oswald worked, accompanied by a building employee. They encountered Oswald, at which time the building employee identified Oswald as an employee of the building with no further explanation.

The next question was whether the FBI was still investigating the Kennedy assassination. Mr. Hoover stated, "Yes--as long as any additional evidence is received."

The next question dealt with whether there was any foreign intrigue connected with Oswald. Mr. Hoover stated there was no indication of any foreign conspiracy either by Castro or the Soviets.

A reporter then asked about Oswald's requesting an interview with an FBI Agent at the time he distributed leaflets in New Orleans. Mr. Hoover stated Oswald had already been interviewed by FBI Agents as he was interviewed 3 days after he arrived back in the United States. The Director again made very clear the fact that Oswald was a man of nonviolence, according to our files.

For record purpose, I returned to the "briefing" at this point and resumed taking notes. The question was raised as to the Director's opinion regarding placing Secret Service under FBI jurisdiction. The Director replied that he was unalterably opposed to such a plan. He stated that Chief Jim Rowley is a good man, a former Special Agent, with whom we have excellent cooperation. He added, however, that Secret Service is hopelessly undermanned and in need of equipment. The Director summed up by stating we have enough problems of our own without taking on Secret Service's problems.

A reporter inquired as to the Director's opinion as to whether the Nation's press was out of line in coverage of the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald by Jack Ruby. The Director replied that with respect to the entire assassination matter there had been extreme unwarranted criticism of the press. He stated that the FBI never has any difficulty in working with the press. He explained that our policy was "no comment" until a case is solved. The Director added that, of course, the Dallas police should not have allowed the press in the basement of the building when Oswald was being removed.

A reporter inquired as to whether the FBI specifically warned the Dallas police that Jack Ruby planned to kill Lee Harvey Oswald. The Director stated that we had twice warned the Dallas police that information had been furnished the FBI that an attempt would be made against Oswald's life, however, Jack Ruby's name had not been given to the FBI.

A reporter asked the Director to explain the complete lack of alertness on the part of the Dallas police in guarding Oswald. The Director replied, off the record, that there is a lot of "ham" in all of us, however, the Dallas police were certainly "hamming it up" for the television cameras when they brought Oswald through the basement of the building. The Director explained that we had very strict rules in the FBI concerning the handling of prisoners and concerning the conduct of our investigations.

A reporter stated that the Warren Commission had criticized the FBI because the FBI had taken an unduly restrictive view of its authority in preventing intelligence. The reporter inquired as to whether the Director agreed with this criticism. The Director emphatically replied that the criticism by the Warren Commission was unwarranted, untrue, and a classic example of Monday morning quarterbacking. The Director again reiterated that the FBI had not known of any violence whatsoever in Oswald's background. As a result there had been no need or necessity to furnish Oswald's name to the Secret Service or to the Dallas police.

Enclosed herewith are the original and six copies of a LHM dated and captioned as above reflecting subject's recent return to the United States from Canada.

The pretext on 11/18/64, was conducted by SA JOHN L. YOUNG telephonically to the office of the Citizens' Committee of Inquiry (CCI), 156 5th Ave., NYC, under the guise of an individual desiring to contribute to the work of LANZ. During this pretext a person who identified himself as ROY GRAND (ID) at the CCI stated that upon his return from Canada, LANZ cancelled all speaking engagements in the NY area in order to appear in Los Angeles and San Francisco, California, in "approximately 8 or 9 days" (possibly during the week of 11/23/64). GRAND further stated that LANZ in mid or late December, 1964, will travel to Europe at which time he will definitely visit Denmark and possibly France.

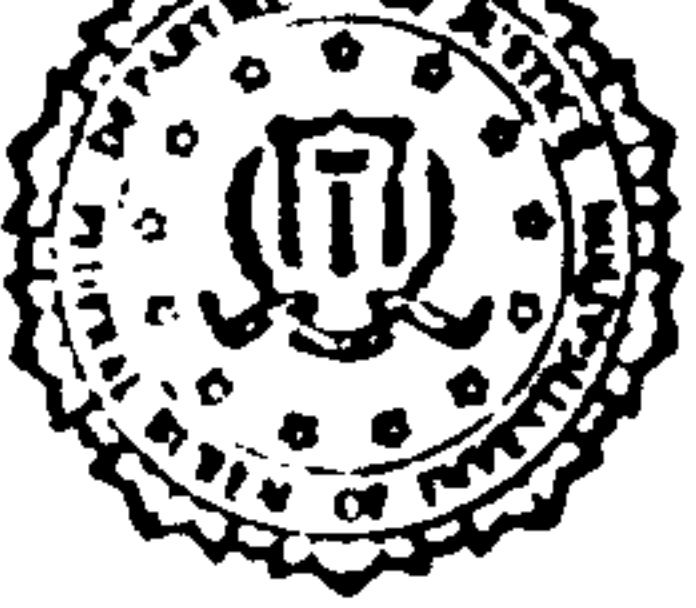
It was also learned that LANE is still working on his book on the assassination of President KENNEDY but the date of publication is yet unknown.

GRAND also stated that at the present time there were branches of the CCI functioning in England and Denmark.

LIM re LANE's planned travel to Europe in December, 1964, will be submitted by the NYO in the near future.

Copies of this communication are being furnished to the Los Angeles and San Francisco Divisions in view of subject's scheduled appearances there.

In view of the dissolution of the Warren Commission and the completion of the Warren report as well as the repetitious nature of LANE's "lectures" on the assassination, the NYO is not requesting coverage of LANE's appearances in Los Angeles and San Francisco, UACB.

Mark Lane is the New York attorney who has been making false allegations regarding the assassination and who has been highly critical of the FBI and the Warren Commission. We have been covering the talks and speeches of Lane in accordance with a Commission request on February 25, 1964. Inasmuch as the Commission has indicated it no longer is interested in results of our investigation and has stated its responsibilities, except for closing out its operations, are being terminated, we will no longer disseminate data to the Commission regarding Lane. It is noted in recent months that Lane is presenting no new substantive information but is merely rehashing old false allegations.

On November 22, 1964, subject, a seaman aboard Motor Tanker "Vestri," Norwegian Registry, and docked at Wilmington, North Carolina, furnished NEWMAN P. GUY, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Wilmington, North Carolina, a letter written by subject in Spanish addressed to ROBERT F. KENNEDY, Attorney General, Washington, D. C.

Subject was interviewed by Mr. GUY and a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on November 22, 1964, and stated that the letter contained information to the effect that he was a cell mate of Colonel RUDOLPH IVANOVICH ABEL, convicted Russian spy in the Federal Penitentiary, Atlanta, Georgia, in 1961, and assisted in smuggling a letter out of Atlanta Penitentiary from ABEL which was directed to LEE HARVEY OSWALD in Mexico. Subject stated that he has information of value connecting OSWALD to ABEL but will reveal this information only upon condition he is given a United States passport for purpose of visiting sick brother in Spain. He stated that he is a Spanish citizen and was arrested in New Orleans, Louisiana, in 1959 for falsely claiming United States citizenship under the name of CHARLES FERRELLS.

Subject stated that he was convicted in United States District Court, New Orleans, regarding the falsely claiming United States

citizenship and sentenced to thirty months in prison and sent to Tallahassee, Florida, to serve his prison term. He stated he escaped from Federal Prison, Tallahassee, Florida, in December 1960, apprehended February 19, 1961, in New Orleans, and sentenced to thirty months additional sentence for this escape and then sent to Atlanta Penitentiary, Atlanta, Georgia, to serve his time in May 1961.

He states that in June 1962 he was released from penitentiary for deportation and was deported in October 1962 at New York to Spain.

Subject advised that he was convicted in Spain of illegal traffic in guns from Italy to Spain and sentenced to thirty years in prison. He escaped from Madrid, Spain, Prison in January 1963 and stowed away on a ship sailing from Spain to France. He signed on Motor Tanker "Vestri" at Le Havre October 30, 1964, and this ship is scheduled to sail from Wilmington, North Carolina, on the afternoon of November 23, 1964, bound for Venezuela.

Subject reiterated during interview that he would furnish no additional information under any circumstances unless he could get a United States passport in order that he could have a thirty day visit with his brother in Spain, stating that with the passport he would have immunity from arrest as an escapee.

On November 22, 1964, Mr. GUY stated that he had telephonically contacted Immigration and Naturalization Service, New Orleans, Louisiana, and determined that they have lengthy file on subject.

The following information has been received at the Bureau from a representative of the U. S. Senate, Committee on the Judiciary:

Virginia Goldstein (nee Robards) was found dead in her home by Chester A. Pichard, reportedly a State Department employee. According to newspaper accounts, her death resulted from a gunshot wound and was reported to be a suicide.

An informant of unknown reliability has alleged that [REDACTED]

Mrs. Goldstein had acquired certain confidential information, details of which were unknown to the informant. It was indicated, however, that this information concerned Lee Harvey Oswald and the assassination of the late President Kennedy.

Mrs. Goldstein's husband is reportedly connected with the Navy Department and was also alleged to be a long-time patient in New York Hospital, New York City.

The following background information was furnished concerning Virginia Goldstein:

She was allegedly born in Missouri, July 25, 1927, and entered the employment of the U. S. Government as a clerk-stenographer, Social Security Administration, in 1944. She allegedly resigned in 1945 and was re-employed as a secretary in the U. S. Foreign Service. It was indicated that she had served in Egypt, France, India, and Morocco, and that she was re-assigned to the State Department in September of 1959, where she remained until June, 1963. Bufiles contain no identifiable information concerning Chester A. Pichard.

Bufiles do indicate that in March, 1964, the Metropolitan Police Department, Washington, D. C., requested a latent fingerprint examination and a ballistics examination from the FBI Laboratory in connection with the death of Virginia Roberts Goldstein. The report from the Washington Metropolitan Police Department indicated that her death occurred on March 10, 1964, and that her home address was 902 Hughes Mew, Northwest. No latent fingerprints of value were developed during the course of the laboratory examination requested by the Metropolitan Police Department and the ballistics examination indicated that Virginia Goldstein had been shot with a .38 Special Smith and Wesson revolver, Serial Number 9275.

The only additional information left in Bufiles concerning Virginia Goldstein appears in a report from the Department of State which was prepared in 1953, involving an investigation under Executive Order 10450 concerning Joan Jackson Leffingwell. The State Department report indicated that Joan Jackson Leffingwell formerly resided in Paris and was a roommate of Virginia Goldstein, a secretary in the Office of the Naval Attache, American Embassy, Paris, France.

WFO is requested to establish the circumstances surrounding the death of Virginia Goldstein. Background investigation should also be obtained concerning Chester A. Pichard and the files of the WFO should be checked for any information concerning him.

Submit the results of your inquiries promptly to the Bureau in form suitable for dissemination together with your recommendations as to whether further investigation regarding Pichard appears warranted.

NOTE:

Information appearing in this communication was made available to the Bureau on November 18, 1964, in the form of a memorandum from Jay Sourwine, of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee. Since the allegations involve possible information relating to the Oswald case, it is believed that this matter should be checked out and the results furnished to the Department of State.

The following investigation supplements that contained on pages 65 through 68 of the report of Special Agent ROBERT P. GEMBERLING, Dallas, dated October 8, 1964, in instant case.

Date November 12, 19641

CARL FREUND, reporter, "The Dallas Morning News", Dallas, Texas, was interviewed at his place of employment.

FREUND advised that he recalls a telephone call from an individual named ALDREDGE a day or two after the release of the report of the President's Commission on the Assassination of President KENNEDY, during which the caller mentioned to him something about a bullet mark in the cement sidewalk on Elm Street in the immediate vicinity of the assassination site.

FREUND stated that the caller, who sounded to FREUND like a "mental case", was upset over the fact that the President's Commission had not covered this matter in its report.

FREUND stated that ALDREDGE just rambled on and on, and he just kept agreeing with whatever ALDREDGE was saying. FREUND stated that while some reporters will tell such a caller that they are too busy to talk to the caller, he has normally followed the policy of just listening to such a caller and agreeing with them, thus finding it much easier to get such a caller off the line.

FREUND stated that he believes that the President's Commission report was thorough and correct in its findings.

He further stated that he does recall on the afternoon of the day of the assassination some unidentified Deputy Sheriff had pointed out to him a chip in the sidewalk on Elm Street in the immediate vicinity of the assassination, which was thought at the time to possibly be a bullet scar. FREUND noted that apparently a bystander and witness of the assassination had said that he had been possibly hit near the eye by a flying piece of debris, possibly cement, from a ricochet bullet. FREUND does not know if this was ever proven to be so or not.

EUGENE P. ALDREDGE, 9304 Lenel, Dallas, Texas, was interviewed at his place of residence.

ALDREDGE advised that he is a disabled war veteran and noted that he is presently in ill health and soon is to undergo two operations.

ALDREDGE stated that earlier in 1964, he had taken a visiting relative to downtown Dallas to view the scene of the assassination of President KENNEDY. While looking around the general area, he had noticed what appeared to him to be a "bullet" mark in the cement sidewalk on Elm Street in the immediate location of where President KENNEDY had been shot.

ALDREDGE described this location as the north side of the sidewalk on Elm Street, "nine paces" east from a light pole, approximately four feet from the street curbing and in the middle of a large cement square block. He stated that the sidewalk is two squares wide between the park curbing and the street curbing. The "bullet" mark he was referring to is in the first square from the street. He further noted that the location is beyond the western end of the multifloor section of the Texas School Book Depository building.

ALDREDGE stated that he is in complete disagreement with the findings of the President's Commission as he believes that the Commission started out its investigation with the sole purpose in mind of proving that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had killed the President and that OSWALD alone was responsible for the President's death.

ALDREDGE stated that the whole investigation was a cover up for "the Soviet", who he personally feels was involved in the killing of President KENNEDY.

ALDREDGE stated that the "bullet" mark in the sidewalk proves his point. He stated that the "bullet" mark is in such a position that it had to have resulted from a shot from the western end of the Texas School Book Depository building, proving

to him that someone was in the other end of that building shooting at the President besides OSWALD in the east end of the building. He stated that this also proves that Texas Governor CONNALLY was not hit by the same bullet as President KENNEDY.

ALDREDGE stated that upon reading in the newspaper about the findings of the President's Commission, he telephoned CARL FREUND, a newspaper reporter with "The Dallas Morning News", and discussed this "bullet" scar matter with him. He stated that FREUND agreed with him at the time, "even though he might not say now that he had agreed with me".

ALDREDGE stated that the only other person he had discussed this matter with was an FBI Agent in Dallas who he telephoned several days after the President's Commission report was released.

He advised that several days later he had returned to the scene of the assassination and personally re-examined the "bullet" mark. He was greatly surprised to find that the "bullet" mark in the sidewalk had been covered over with some type of a plastic material. He described the patch job as a "sloppy" one in that the repairer had not even bothered to dig up the surrounding area and replace same with new cement.

ALDREDGE stated that this proves to him that the FBI has been "infiltrated by the Soviets", as the only persons he had spoken to about this matter was FREUND and the FBI Agent.

He stated that he believes that the hole was patched up to cover for the Soviets.

ALDREDGE stated that either on the day of or the day following the assassination, he had seen a local television program on which the television reporter was pointing to a "bullet" mark in the sidewalk on Elm Street. He stated that he has heard that the President's Commission confiscated the television film in order to cover up for the Soviets.

Date November 12, 19641

A small, partially filled gutted area, was inspected in the sidewalk on Elm Street, west of the intersection of Elm and Houston Streets, Dallas, Texas. This small scar in the sidewalk is approximately four inches long and one-half inch wide. It is located approximately four feet from the street curbing in the first large cement square block some thirty-three feet or nine paces east of the second lamppost from the corner of Elm and Houston Streets.

It was noted that some unknown type of material now partially covers this hole, but does not cover any of the surrounding area.

A small amount of this foreign matter was scraped up for examination purposes.

This same mark was previously checked on September 30, 1964, at which time it contained no filling or debris.
