MOS CLAIMS THAT WHEN HE MET DEAN ANDREWS AND ON A COUPLE OF VISITS TO ANDREWS' OFFICE, ANDREWS TOLD HIM THAT HE (ANDREWS) WAS THE HEAD MAN OF SOME CHETNIK OPERATION IN NEW ORLEANS.

MOS ALSO CLAIMS THAT APPROXIMATELY ONE MONTH AGO, DEAN ANDREWS CONTACTED HIM ON THE STREET IN NEW ORLEANS AND MADE AN OFFER OF TWENTYFIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS TO HIM TO "KNOCK OFF" DISTRICT ATTORNEY JIM GARRISON.

INS REPRESENTATIVES STATE MOS ALSO ALLEGES THAT EMMETT C. DINNOT RECEIVED LETTER FROM LEE HARVEY OSWALD PRIOR TO THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY IN WHICH OSWALD ASKED DINNOT TO FIND A PLACE FOR HIM TO LIVE SAYING THAT HIS WORK IN DALLAS, TEXAS WAS ALMOST COMPLETED. MOS

Information copies of this communication are being furnished these Offices in view of the fact that it is alleged the so-called journalists mentioned in this LHM frequently visit the border areas in Texas.

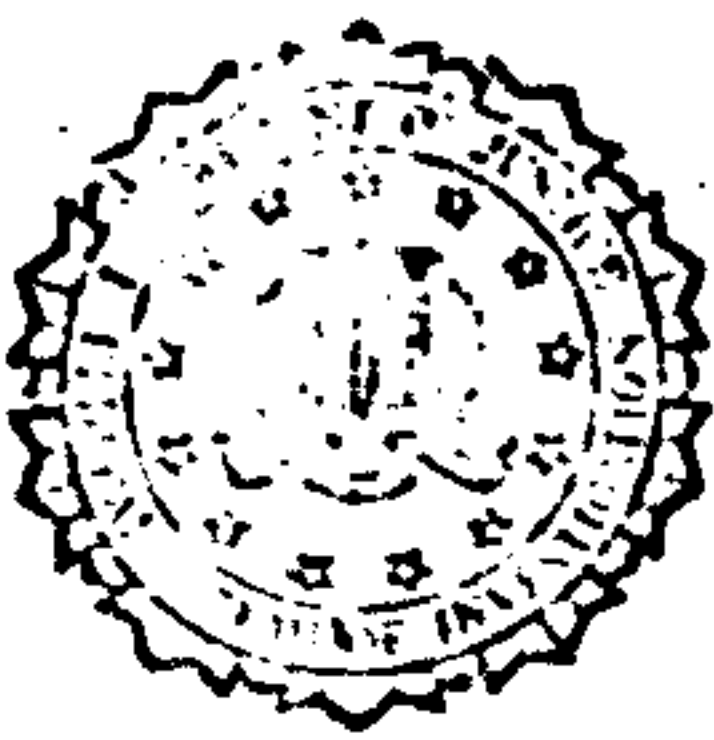

An undated letter was received by the Austin, Texas, Police Department, and thereafter turned over to the Federal Bureau of Investigation on December 23, 1966.

An examination of this letter indicates that it was typed on a flimsy paper, using both sides of the paper. The letter was written in poor English and contained many mis-spelled words. The typing is faint, making it impossible to understand the full meaning of the contents. It bore the caption in Spanish "Defensa Civil del Estado de Nuevo Leon," and was addressed to the Chief of Police in the town. The envelope in which it was contained was postmarked at Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas. The letter bore a typewritten signature which appears to be FRANCISCO L. BARRAGAN, Director of "Mas Noticias," Calle Colon 108, Monterrey, Nuevo Leon.

It should be noted that "Mas Noticias" is a daily Monterrey newspaper which is located at Calle Colon 108, Monterrey, Nuevo Leon. Set out below is a summary of pertinent information contained in that part of the letter which can be understood:

MEXICAN JOURNALISTS

Spies and Bolsheviks from the Kremlin and from the Republic of Cuba are being watched in Mexico. Three of these spies are operating in your county, (apparently meaning Texas). Their names are DONACIANO PADILLA ARVIZU, FERNANDO JUAREZ JIMENEZ and CARLOS DIAS RODRIGUEZ, who is the Director of the newspaper "Temple." FERNANDO JUAREZ JIMENEZ is the Director of the "Reportero," and PADILLA is a representative of "Todo" and other newspapers. These men are not true newspapermen, but are really frauds and cheats who use trickiness in order to outwit businessmen in various cities along the border of the Rio Bravo (Rio Grande River). They work in connection with Mr. ERNESTO GARCIA, who is Director of the "Laredo Post" in Laredo, Texas. Their boss in Monterrey is CARLOS HUERTA, a Cuban citizen who has offices at 620 Zaragoza Street S.W., Office #110. He is the Director of the newspaper "Lente Politico," and is the Director of a communist cell of newspapermen, which is a part of the Communist Party of Mexico. He receives orders from Communist Cuba.

These men travel to the United States, principally to the State of Texas, where they have connections with the communists of the State of Texas. They claim that they are newspapermen, but they are really Cuban communist spies. They sell advertising to businesses along the border, but actually cheat the businessmen through trickery. I know this because they go to a certain bar in Monterrey and have been heard to say that they were in Dallas, Texas, with OSWALDO, the killer of KENNEDY, when the homicide occurred. They all claim they sell advertisement, but they are really spying for the Cuban government.

Here in Monterrey we know that CARLOS HUERTA is not Mexican, but is Cuban. Maybe he bought his Mexican identification papers. PADILLA was born in El Paso, Texas, and is not Mexican. They live here in Monterrey. In another letter we shall give other names of spies like ARTURO SILVA, PORFIRIO ARIZPE MORENO, ALFREDO TREVINO GONZALEZ, TOMAS JORGE RUIZ, HUMBERTO GARCIA RUIZ, RAUL COUDA LOPEZ, CATARINO JUAREZ, ANTONIO FRIAS MUNOZ and HUMBERTO FRIAS MUNOZ, and also the Director of "La Voz de Monterrey." All of these people have the same office on

Zaragoza Sur. They work like spies for the Cuban government and use trickery against American businessmen.

We trust you will take a personal interest in the above matter in the interests of the American businessmen in the different cities in the State of Texas along the Mexican-U.S. border, and in the interests of Mexican-U.S. friendship.

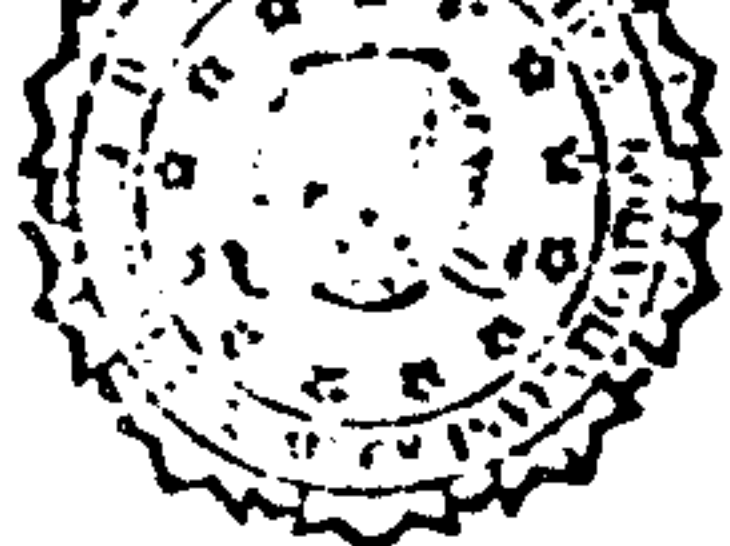

As a result of his request to be contacted by a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, John George Appel was interviewed at the Salt Lake County Jail, Salt Lake City, Utah, on May 5, 1967, by Special Agents Charles J. Shepherd and William J. Geiermann.

Appel said he is serving [REDACTED]

He claimed he had not slept for three days.

Appel said he has served [REDACTED]

He was released from the Louisiana State Prison during October, 1963. About a week after his release, which would be the last week in October or the first week in November, 1963, he went to Thompson's Restaurant in New Orleans, Louisiana, to make a contact to get narcotics. He said Thompson's is a known hangout for narcotics addicts. While there Appel was contacted by a girl named Shirley, last name unknown, who was previously unknown to him. Shirley was an addict and introduced him to two other addicts named Lee and Larry, who were also in the restaurant. They both spoke Spanish and were "sinister" looking. Appel showed Shirley how to forge a prescription, and she left for about half an hour. During this time Appel conversed briefly with Lee and Larry. He said he had never seen these individuals before but that Lee claimed to know him. When Shirley returned, she had three bottles containing narcotics. She gave one

each to Lee and Larry, and he and Shirley took the third bottle and left the restaurant. They went in Shirley's car to a place near the waterfront in New Orleans, where they each took a shot. Later in the day when they parted company, Shirley indicated she wanted to meet Appel again; however, they never did get together.

At the time of the assassination of President Kennedy several weeks later, Appel realized the photographs in the newspapers of Lee Harvey Oswald were identical with the Lee he had met in Thompson's Restaurant. He insisted there is no question in his mind about this.

Appel said that during the time they were in Thompson's Restaurant, he, Lee, Larry and Shirley were all under the influence of narcotics.

Subsequently Appel was again [redacted] and served time in jail. Thereafter he went to California for a few days and came to Salt Lake City in February, 1966. He has been in Salt Lake City since that time but declined to discuss his activities.

In December, 1966, Appel was with his girl friend, whom he identified only as Mary Jane. When they came back to Appel's apartment, there was a note on the door indicating something to the effect that "What are you doing with this square chick? (Signed) Someone who loves you very much." He did not know at that time who had written the note; however, later in the day as he was writing a prescription, it dawned on him that the handwriting on the note was the same as the handwriting on the prescription filled out by Shirley in New Orleans over three years before.

The following day Appel and Mary Jane were eating in a restaurant when a woman, identified by Appel as Shirley, came in, sat down nearby and stared at Appel. Appel and Mary Jane left immediately. Later that same day Appel was arrested and has been in custody since that time.

Shortly after his [arrest] Appel spent thirty to forty days in the Utah State Hospital at Provo, Utah. During that time he read an article in a magazine written by someone named Epstein, in which there was some indication that there was more than one assassin of President Kennedy. Appel immediately "felt in his bones" that Larry, whom he had seen with Oswald in New Orleans a month before the President's death, was also an assassin. Appel said he had no further evidence in support of this contention but that the feeling was so strong he felt compelled to tell someone about it.

Appel stated that about two weeks ago he was taken into court for another appearance, and as he left the courtroom, he observed Shirley and Larry in the corridor. They made no sign of recognizing him. He said it is his feeling, however, they have followed him to Salt Lake City, because he observed Larry with Lee Harvey Oswald a month before the assassination.

Appel stated he is well known in New Orleans to police and to narcotics addicts. He said he is also acquainted with District Attorney James Garrison and that it is his intention to contact Garrison in the near future and relate the above information to him.

In Mark Lane's recent book several facts, or what Lane claims to be facts are stated.

On pages 311-312 of the paperback edition (second printing) I take this quote in regard to Oswald being employed by a government agency.

The Commission made the decision to ask the Texas Attorney General, District Attorney Wade, and any other Dallas officials who had knowledge of the allegations to come at once to Washington and secretly present what they had heard. There should be absolutely no publicity. (This is a quote from Congressman Ford's book Portrait of the Assassin, 13-14, as in Lane's book)

The Texas officials slipped into the nation's capital with complete anonymity. They met with Lee Rankin, and other members of the staff and told what they knew. The information was that Lee Oswald was actually hired by the FBI; that he was assigned the undercover-agent number 179; that he was on the FBI payroll at two hundred dollars a month starting in September 1962 and that he was still on the payroll the day he was apprehended in the Texas Theatre after having gunned down Officer J.D. Tippit! The officials returned to Dallas after their visit on Friday, January 24. Their presence in Washington was unknown to the press or the public.

Further, in Lane's book, page 314---

(talking about going to you in connection with Oswald, and the FBI.)

REC 51 / 105  
The Chief Justice then expressed the opinion that the sources of information should be questioned at the outset. (ftnte 25-Pot. of the Assn.) He noted that 'Lee (Rankin), on the other hand, felt it would be the better part of the cooperation to go over and see Mr. Hoover'. (Ftnte 26, ibid 25) Hoover could be asked, the Chief Justice said, 'if he can supply us with information to establish these facts (in the other quote) are not true'. (Ftnte 27. ibid 25)

The purpose of the proposed investigation had been outlined by Rankin: it was intended to assure the public that Oswald had not been affiliated with the Government. (Ftnte. 28-NY Times 1/12/64) Unlike Rankin however,

the Commissioners who spoke at the meeting evinced a desire to initiate a serious inquiry into the charges. (Footnote 29- Port. of the Assn.-25) -- yet the investigation they proposed and specifically authorized never took place.

A friend of mine told me that in a recent issue of Playboy magazine, there was an interview with Lane. I looked at this interview. In it Lane tells Playboy that he has a signed letter from J. Edgar Hoover stating that Oswald had badge number 179, and was employed by the FBI.

Would you please kindly answer my following questions:

1. Taking my first quote-is this true?
2. Was L. H. Oswald ever hired by the FBI, or is it classified at this time?
3. (a.) Was Lee H. Oswald, or someone fitting his description in any way an undercover agent (b.) with badge number 179, or is it classified?
4. (a.) Was Lee Harvey Oswald ever on the FBI payroll (b.) Was his starting salary \$200. a month, or is it classified at this time?
5. For how long was Lee Harvey Oswald on the FBI payroll, or employed by the FBI, or is it classified?
6. (a) Did you ever write Mark Lane a letter (b.) to do with Lee Harvey Oswald (c) that stated something to the effect that Lee Harvey Oswald was employed by the FBI at some time?
7. Was Lee Harvey Oswald ever employed by the FBI?
8. Was a man identified as someone else than Lee Harvey Oswald, but fitting Lee Harvey Oswald's description in any respect, employed by the FBI?
9. To whom did undercover badge number 179 belong to from September 1962 to the time of Oswald's death?
10. Did Oswald ever have in his possession badge number 179, or any other number? (Lee Harvey Oswald)
11. Do you honestly think that (a) Oswald killed Kennedy (b) alone (c) Was there a plot?

If there is any question in the group that is impossible for you to answer, I would appreciate your telling me, by return mail those questions which cannot be answered (with a reason) and please answer those that can be answered.

During late afternoon of 5/4/67, Mr. ROBERT STEVEN, the Administrative Assistant to the Ambassador, brought Mr. BERNARD DIEDERICH to my office. Mr. DIEDERICH is the representative in Mexico of Time-Life magazine.

Mr. DIEDERICH explained that his bureau chief at Time-Life headquarters had been pushing him on a lead previously sent down to him relative to a picture which had appeared in a previous issue of Esquire magazine in an article relating to the OSWALD case. That picture was a reproduction of one which had appeared in the Warren Report and the sub-caption was to the effect that "this was not OSWALD." The Esquire article, with which the Bureau is undoubtedly familiar, stated that this picture had been furnished to the FBI in Dallas by CIA on the day of President KENNEDY's assassination. The Time-Life bureau chief had instructed DIEDERICH to ascertain in Mexico the facts concerning this photo.

Mr. STEVEN explained that Mr. DIEDERICH felt that to satisfy his bureau chief he should make inquiries concerning this matter with the Embassy and Mr. STEVEN, therefore, brought him to my office.

At 10:37 a. m. on April 6, 1967, Carlos Quiroga, 3134 Derby Place, New Orleans, Louisiana, appeared at the office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and furnished the following information:

Carlos Briuguier, an active anti-Castro Cuban, has been told by Alberto Fowler, investigator for District Attorney James Garrison, that Garrison plans to serve a subpoena on the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), in order to make that organization produce a photograph which was supposedly taken by them of Lee Harvey Oswald and a companion entering the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City. Fowler states that the individual accompanying Oswald is an agent of the CIA.

On April 22, 1967, Quiroga was interviewed by Hugh Aynesworth, correspondent of Newsweek Magazine. Quiroga told Aynesworth everything he knew concerning the Garrison investigation and in turn Aynesworth advised him that the attorney of Alvin Beaubouef, former associate of David W. Ferrie who is one of the figures in the Garrison investigation, has a tape recording of an investigator of Garrison's office offering a \$3,000 bribe to Beaubouef to change his testimony regarding Garrison's investigation. Garrison is reportedly aware that this tape recording exists and is now blackmailing Beaubouef with a photograph which shows he and David Ferrie engaged in sexual activities. Aynesworth indicated that an article critical of Garrison's inquiry will shortly appear in Newsweek.

On April 29, 1967, Quiroga met with Walter J. Sheridan, correspondent for the National Broadcasting Company (NBC). Sheridan indicated to Quiroga that he was aware of the existence of the aforementioned tape recording and they had attempted to acquire it from Beaubouef's attorney but the price wanted for it was too high. Sheridan stated that NBC plans a television program regarding the Garrison investigation.

Quiroga indicated that both of the above correspondents were directed to him by Sergio Arcacha Smith, a key figure in the Garrison probe and former Cuban exile leader in New Orleans. Quiroga advised them, as he had advised District Attorney Garrison's office when given a lie detector test, that he, in the past, has in no way been affiliated with the CIA or the FBI.

Quiroga advised that when the investigation by District Attorney Garrison first began he thought that Garrison might actually have something, but it is now his belief that Garrison's investigation is a witch hunt. Initially in the investigation, Quiroga made available to Garrison an album which he, Quiroga, and his wife had compiled regarding the, "Crusade to Free Cuba," in the New Orleans area. Since that time, names appearing in this album have continually appeared in the Garrison investigation.

Quiroga indicated that the, "Crusade to Free Cuba," was organized in New Orleans to raise funds among Cuban exiles and American citizens to fight against the Castro Government.

Bringuier advised Quiroga that Alberto Fowler had told him that Garrison wanted to have lunch with him in the coming week, but this may now be called off because Bringuier has filed a law suit against Garrison and Author Jack Wiesberg. Bringuier reportedly has photographs which he recently took of Jack Wiesberg, and a Garrison investigator, taking photographs of Bringuier's bar, "La Habana," on Ecatur Street in New Orleans.

Jack Wiesberg is the author  
of Whitewash.

Quiroga stated that he and his wife will travel to Texas in the next week, during which he will visit Arcacha Smith. Quiroga plans to question Arcacha Smith concerning his knowledge of munitions thefts from bunkers in the New Orleans area.

The purpose of this memorandum is to summarize information furnished to our New Orleans Office on May 6 and 7, 1967, by Gordon D. Novel. Novel is the individual who was involved in a burglary of ammunition at Houma, Louisiana, and who now is residing in Ohio. New Orleans District Attorney Garrison is attempting to have Novel returned to New Orleans for questioning.

Novel claims that Andrew Blackmon, a former close associate of David William Ferrie, allegedly was present at a meeting in Ferrie's apartment when Novel, Sergio A. Smith, Ferrie and others planned the burglary at Houma, Louisiana. Novel states Blackmon very likely will be Garrison's star witness in the latter's attempt to prove a conspiracy in the death of President Kennedy.

Novel believes New Orleans District Attorney Garrison is directly responsible for the death of David Ferrie. Novel claims he saw Garrison leave Ferrie's apartment at approximately 5:30 a.m. February 22, 1967, the day Ferrie was found dead.

Novel also claims that Garrison believes a laundry truck owned by Louis Rabel, a New Orleans resident, was involved in transporting Sergio Smith, David Ferrie, Novel and several others to Houma, Louisiana, to commit the burglary. Bureau files indicate Rabel probably identical with an individual who was head of the Cuban Revolutionary Council in New Orleans, Louisiana, which was an anti-Castro organization with headquarters in Miami.

Novel claims Garrison reportedly has in his possession various letters to substantiate his conspiracy. These letters consist of: 1. Letter from Clay Shaw to David Ferrie; 2. Letter from David Ferrie to Jack Ruby; 3. Letter from Jack Ruby to Lee Harvey Oswald; 4. Letter from former Attorney General Robert Kennedy to David Ferrie supposedly thanking Ferrie for the latter's anti-Castro activities. Novel added that in the near future New Orleans District Attorney Garrison will accuse the FBI of possessing originals of the four letters listed above. This is false. We know of no such letters.

Novel claims Garrison plans to ask FBI Agent presently under subpoena (Special Agent Regis Kennedy of the New Orleans Office) two questions: 1. "Was David Ferrie a communist acting under an anti-communist cover?" 2. "Did an FBI Agent to your knowledge have a meeting with Gordon Novel on February 20, this year?"

In connection with the two questions listed above, our files contain no information indicating Ferrie was a communist. He was very active in anti-Castro activities in New Orleans. Regarding question number two, Novel did contact our New Orleans Office on February 20, 1967, and volunteered information to Special Agents J. Peter Chase and Max M. Marr. The data volunteered by Novel concerned his participation with Ferrie, Sergio Smith and others in [robbing an ammunition] bunker at Houma, Louisiana.

Novel also states Garrison is interested in locating a William Wayne Dalzell who allegedly was contacted by Special Agent Regis Kennedy of our New Orleans Office and a Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) employee by the name of Logan. Our files disclose Dalzell was active in anti-Castro activities in New Orleans in 1961. Our files reveal that in January, 1963, Dalzell was hospitalized at a Louisiana State mental hospital. New Orleans Office advised that Special Agent Regis Kennedy has interviewed Dalzell in the past concerning Cuban matters. He has not been interviewed by Special Agent Kennedy or any other Agent of the New Orleans Office concerning the assassination of President Kennedy. Dalzell's present whereabouts are unknown. Special Agent Kennedy does not know a CIA agent by the name of Logan.

OBSERVATIONS:

Novel's reliability is highly questionable. He has frequently made charges which have been found to have no basis in fact. He reportedly claimed ties with CIA which CIA denied. It seems incredible that if Novel saw Garrison leave Ferrie's apartment at 5:30 a.m. on the day Ferrie was found dead that he would not have come forward with this information up till now. He has contacted our FBI Offices several times since February 22, 1967, and did not volunteer such data.

ACTION:

The data furnished by Novel will be summarized in a letterhead memorandum and disseminated to the Department, Secret Service and CIA.

You will also note that the information reported on this page is available only through issuance of a subpoena duces tecum directed to J. B. Wadsworth, District Manager, Western Union, Carondelet Street, New Orleans, Louisiana.

In addition to the information set forth above, please be advised that Special Agent Kennedy has investigated both pro-Castro and anti-Castro activity in the New Orleans area for several years. Results of such investigation, unless related to inquiries regarding the assassination of President Kennedy, were not furnished to the Warren Commission nor is such data contained in the files of the National Archives.

Also, since December, 1966, Special Agent Kennedy has received information volunteered to him by a number of individuals concerning the investigation of the assassination being conducted by New Orleans District Attorney James C. Garrison. Included among these individuals are Jack S. Martin, Dr. Carlos Bringuier, Bob Cusman and several established sources of our New Orleans Office. All pertinent data furnished by these individuals has been furnished to the Department. It, of course, is not contained in Warren Commission records at the National Archives nor is it available to the public.

Gordon Dwane Novel, fugitive witness in District Attorney James Garrison's investigation into the assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy, telephonically contacted the New Orleans Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) on May 7, 1967, and advised that in the near future, District Attorney James Garrison will accuse the FBI of possessing originals of five letters; namely, letter from Clay Shaw to David Ferrie; letter from Lee Harvey Oswald to Clay Shaw; letter from David Ferrie to Jack Ruby; letter from Jack Ruby to Lee Harvey Oswald, and letter from former Attorney General Robert Kennedy to David Ferrie.

Novel further informed that District Attorney Garrison is in possession of the typewriter owned by David Ferrie in 1963 and is also in possession of the typewriters of Clay Shaw, both personal and business. According to Novel, the business typewriter was the one reportedly used by Shaw's secretary, (first name unknown) Hug.

Novel advised that District Attorney Garrison plans to ask the FBI Agents who have been subpoenaed the following two questions: (1) "Was David Ferrie a communist acting under an anti-communist cover?" (2) "Did an FBI Agent, to your knowledge, have a meeting with Gordon Novel on February 20, this year?"

Novel further advised that District Attorney Garrison's Chief Investigator William Gurchich has a close relative presently residing in Russia who was instrumental in designing the Russian Mig Aircraft.
