On 9/12/66, Congressman DON FUQUA of Florida advised SAs JAMES F. MORRISSEY and WILLIAM R. CARTER as follows:

In July 1966, while visiting in Florida, he was contacted by JENNINGS MURRHREE, Green Cove Springs, Florida, Sheriff of Clay County, Fla. MURRHREE told FUQUA he wanted the latter to meet someone; that the info this person had was not material to be discussed over the phone. FUQUA said he was subsequently introduced to WILLIAM H. COOPER, whom he said is also known as JOE COOPER. FUQUA said COOPER related the following theory regarding the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY.

COOPER believed that the assassination was the result of a conspiracy involving HERMAN G. ENGELHARDT, J. RUSSELL DOIRON, BRYAN CLEMMONS and JAMES WINFREE. FUQUA said he believed COOPER also mentioned a fifth person whose name he could not immediately recall. Plans for the assassination, according to COOPER's account, were formulated during a trip of the USS Shangri-La, CVA-38, during August of 1963. COOPER had established (Enclosure 1)

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that these individuals were reportedly aboard the ship during August 1963. Because of the fact they were aboard the ship and in line with his belief assassination plans were formulated there, COOPER thought the U.S. Navy was also involved. COOPER did not mean at the level of CNO, but someone with rank, somebody of the General WALKER bent of mind that this country was being led down a ruinous blind alley by President KENNEDY, and hence supplied the forum for such purpose.

COOPER said the group then chose LEE HARVEY OSWALD as the means to assassinate President KENNEDY. OSWALD had come to their attention through unknown mutual friends who were not communists. COOPER felt OSWALD was aboard the ship at the time, probably under an assumed name. The conspirators brainwashed OSWALD into performing the act.

COOPER felt that the action of the group was the result of their sharing a strong reactionary feeling in the U.S. against President KENNEDY and his policies. He felt their action and the resulting death of President KENNEDY paralleled to some extent the atmosphere and action resulting in the death of Senator HUEY LONG of Louisiana. According to FUQUA, COOPER mentioned that OSWALD had reportedly checked out a book on assassination of Mr. LONG.

Then, according to COOPER, before OSWALD could "squeal," he was killed through connections between BRYAN CLEMMONS, Sheriff BILL DECKER of Dallas and JACK RUBY. FUQUA was not clear as to the details in this respect.

FUQUA then related that COOPER has since sent him much correspondence attempting to support his belief. This has not accomplished this as yet, but had pointed out certain unrecalled coincidences that raised the question in FUQUA's mind that COOPER should be interviewed in depth to determine if there was anything definite to his contentions.

FUQUA said COOPER resides at 620 Wiltz Drive, Baton Rouge, La.

FUQUA made available enclosures 2 to 5 as being biographical data supplied by COOPER on the individuals involved.

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On 9/13/66, Congressman FUQUA telephonically contacted SA MORRISSEY and stated he had received additional material from COOPER that date. FUQUA advised SA MORRISSEY subsequently on the same date that he believed COOPER was or is an FBI informant, that he may also have been a KKK informant for the FBI. FUQUA also stated that he believed the fifth individual involved in the conspiracy, according to COOPER, is E. G. PARTIN, a business agent for the teamsters union. From info believed supplied by COOPER, PARTIN may have ties to Cuban Premier FIDEL CASTRO and may have been involved in a past apparent threat to Senator ROBERT KENNEDY. FUQUA had no details in this last respect.

On 9/14/66, copies of material included in the above enclosures were furnished by Congressman FUQUA's office to SA MORRISSEY. It was indicated that additional material was expected and the Congressman wished SA MORRISSEY to handle same. Subsequent contacts with FUQUA's office, as requested, failed to reveal any additional correspondence.

On 9/27/66, Congressman FUQUA telephonically advised SA MORRISSEY that he had received another letter from COOPER. A copy of same was obtained from FUQUA's office on 9/30/66 and is enclosure 17. FUQUA was unable to keep two requested appointments for any additional info in this matter due to prior schedule commitments.

In the attached material, originals are included. FUQUA thought that some of the material would be illegible if further reproduced, hence furnished his copies. He requested the Bureau retain same in case he needed it in the future.

FUQUA indicated the facilities of his office would be available at any time in this matter. He felt COOPER may have come to him under the impression that the OSWALD case was a closed matter and his theory go unheeded. FUQUA was advised of the Bureau's continuing interest in this matter.

In view of the extensive investigation in this matter, any leads such as interview of COOPER are left to the discretion of the Bureau after appropriate analysis.

WFO indices are negative re COOPER.

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Because of reported status of COOPER as possible Bureau informant, no LHM is being submitted in this matter. In the event that COOPER is interviewed, or additional investigation conducted, it is requested that above info be included in any dissemination.

FUQUA felt COOPER appeared rational and sincere. FUQUA also mentioned that he had inquired of the Bureau regarding COOPER in the past and was orally advised that he had furnished reliable info in the past. FUQUA, however, did not indicate, he believed, the purpose of his inquiry concerning COOPER. FUQUA stated that he understood that COOPER once opposed CLEMMONS in an election in some location. FUQUA did not have the details on this but suggested COOPER's loss in such election may have some bearing on this matter in action against CLEMMONS. Of this, however, he was not sure and it was only conjecture on his part.

An extra copy is designated for the Bureau for administrative handling.

On May 17th, 1954, the Supreme Court handed down its historical decision that segregation in public schools unconstitutional. This was a source of joy for those who believed in human decency and democracy. It was thought to be almost a second Emancipation Proclamation by enlightened but Jim Crowed Americans.

Yes, it seemed that at last the United States had determined to become a civilized nation. It seemed that the forces of racist savagery were on the decline. It seemed that the best of humanity in the USA would prevail. It seemed that the government of the USA had, at last, decided to honor its obligation to enforce the 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. Nothing could be further from the truth. The Supreme Court decision was nothing more than the legalization of the Afroamerican's right to struggle for racial equality. It was nothing more than a call for the Afroamerican to wrest from his oppressor the rights the racist U.S. Government reserves for its white citizens.

What kind of government is it that proclaims the right of equality for its citizens, then turns around to beg and pray for this sacred right? What kind of government is it that pretends to support the right of its citizens to live as human beings while at the same time gives aid and comfort to their savage oppressors? What kind of government is it that will ask its black people to die in the steaming jungles of foreign lands for the so-called preservation of Christian democracy while frustrating their efforts of liberation at home? Such a government, that pretends to be the leader of a so-called FREE WORLD, is a disgrace and an affront to civilized man throughout the world.

One hundred years after the Emancipation Proclamation and nine years after the Supreme Court Decision of May 17th, Afroamericans of Birmingham and racist Dixie are experiencing the wrath of slave masters equaled only to those of South Africa. In Birmingham, more babies six-year-old are being led to the colorful police dogs. They are being run down by the powerful streams of water hoses like wheat before a threshing machine. Mothers are being battered to the ground by vicious, club-wielding thug cops swinging on them like desperadoes fighting fire. Afroamericans are being jailed and beaten for refusing to allow these police dogs to feast freely on their human flesh. The world has not seen such raw and naked savagery since the era when Christians were thrown into lion pits.

What is the position of the U.S. Government in Dixie, USA? Yes, the same U.S. Government that has appointed itself to safeguard the universal rights of man and to make the world safe for democracy... What is its position of defending the rights...

of black people within the confines of its own borders? What is the position of Slick John Kennedy, who flew down to Florida to welcome selected Cuban prisoners of war who had ruthlessly murdered women and children? Yes, Slick John had only praise for these things!

Mrs. Kennedy said that she hopes that her children will grow up to be as courageous as these thing murderers who were sponsored by Kennedy to rain death and destruction on Cuban mothers and babies. Mr. and Mrs. Kennedy were all for these cold blooded murderers. So much so, that they are considered as representing the ideal example for their children to follow. Would not Mr. and Mrs. Kennedy recommend the courage of the 6-year-old black children of Birmingham as examples for their children to follow? Isn't the best example for American children to follow set by those who most courageously fight for human rights? Is it not the height of stupidity when little girls, 6-years-old, will risk being devoured by vicious police dogs rather than to submit to slavery? It seems that all the world is ready to fight with the devil while the righteous men walk practically alone.

When Slick John Kennedy speaks of making the world safe for democracy, does he mean to make it safe for the savage thing whites to practice mayhem and genocide against dark people, the way they are doing in Birmingham and throughout the United States?

Let our people not be fooled by the deceptive actions of Slick John in Birmingham. This labor pretends to be sending troops to maintain the peace. Yes, maintain the peace at whose expense? Peace on Slick John's terms also means the retention of the status quo. Slick John Kennedy's backstage negotiations mean very promises and empty words without deeds. The Afroamerican does not need promises, he needs action and deeds. Was not the Emancipation Proclamation a promise? Was not the 1854 Supreme Court Decision a promise? Is not the 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution a promise? Aren't all the white man's treaties with the Indians promises? Must our people be reminded of the history of all these lies and broken promises?

The fact of the matter is that Kennedy didn't bother to go south to raise an eyebrow while brutal racist cops were treating Negroes worse than dogs. He was as silent as a nunny's nunny when little girls were being tortured and deceived by racist cops and their fellow dogs. Homes and churches were bombed. Pregnant women were kicked in their pregnant stomachs as they were beaten to the ground by heathen cops. School girls were blasted with shot guns. Afroamericans were murdered while trying to vote. Black soldiers were murdered in uniform by white savages and Slick John remained as motionless as a heap of dung! And what prompted your man Slick John to get off his lazy and send troops to Birmingham? The fact of the matter is that Slick John is a racist dog and

he just couldn't stand to see white heads being trampled in Birmingham. Yes, he moved to save his noble white blood.

Kennedy's Birmingham action proves that the Abolitionists cannot expect any action from the federal government until violence becomes a two way proposition. If our people don't start defending themselves our race is going to be starved and wiped out of existence in the USA. And don't let us think for once that this cannot happen! Don't let us think that Mr. Charlie is too much of a Christian to stoop so low! Let us not think that he loves us too much to exterminate us. That was the mistake of 6 million Jews in Germany. If we defend ourselves, if we throw his cities into turmoil, he cannot exterminate 20 million people. He would commit suicide in the process. It is better to die than to live as starving Ahman-faced dogs.

The razors and eye cans that we used to use on each other, let's put them to good use now. Use them on the brutal dogs, including those with two legs. Those eye bombs will work wonders on dogs. When he is hit, he can neither bite nor shoot. The whole civilized world is on our side. We must not slack up now. Let our people turn out in fierce numbers for FREEDOM. This is our great opportunity, it is NOW OR NEVER!

Birmingham is just the beginning. We must be willing to suffer jail, we must be willing to suffer death and we must be willing to kill for freedom! This is the way the United States was born and this is the way our freedom shall be born. Strife is not without pain and blood, neither is freedom! With a thunderous voice, let our battle cry be heard around the world. FREEDOM! FREEDOM! FREEDOM NOW OR DEATH!!!

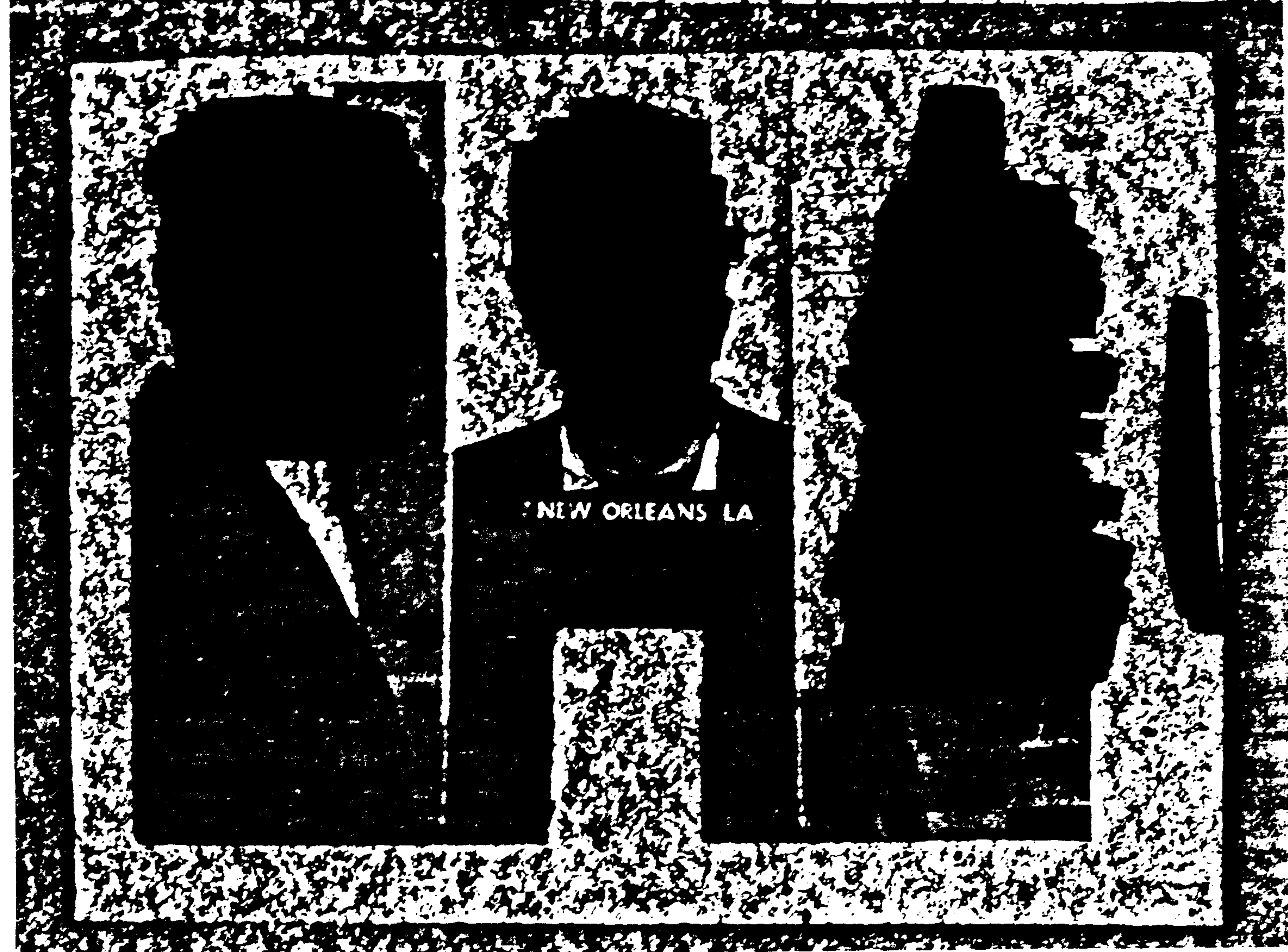

...ation of the President. Oswald sent an order to a mail-order house in Chicago for the Italian carbine that was used to kill Mr. Kennedy.

He ordered the gun under the assumed name of Hudell, giving it a return address a post-office box in Dallas.

When arrested, Oswald had an identification card in his billfold with the same name and post-office box number as it.

On May 9, 1963, the Oswald family, then expecting a second child, rented a one-bedroom apartment on Magazine Street in New Orleans.

The landlady said Oswald plastered the porch with pro-Castro propaganda on two occasions. Her husband said that Oswald apparently had a job for a few weeks, then appeared to quit work and spent his time reading armfuls of books brought home from the public library.

On June 24, Oswald applied for a new passport at the U. S. Passport Office in New Orleans.

On his application he said that he was a photographer and that he wanted to take a trip abroad for three months to a year, leaving between October and December. He listed as his proposed itinerary England, France, Germany, the Soviet Union, Finland, Italy and Poland.

Such a trip would have cost many thousands of dollars. At this time, to all appearances, Oswald was broke and living on unemployment compensation.

The passport was issued on June 25, which indicates Oswald must have replied "no" to questions as to whether he had been a member of a Communist organization or ever sought foreign nationality.

This raises another of the questions that investigators will pursue: Why was Oswald's application not given a more thorough check, in view of his past? Was any interest taken, officially, in the former defector's plans?

A few days later, in July, Oswald introduced himself to a Cuban-Carlos Bringuier—representing an anti-Castro student group. He told this man he wanted to fight Communism and that, as an ex-Marine, he could help train exiles for an invasion of Cuba.

Mr. Bringuier, suspicious, put him down. A few days later he brought Oswald on Canal Street and had him passing out pro-Castro flyers. They got into an argument and went to court, where Oswald paid a \$10 fine for disturbing the peace.

On August 21, Oswald showed up at an interview on a New Orleans radio sta-

tion, saying he was secretary of the New Orleans chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee, and a Marxist, but not a Communist.

Just about that time, Oswald shipped his family away from their apartment on Magazine Street, owing 15 days' rent.

South of the Border. On September 17, Oswald went to the Mexican consulate in New Orleans and obtained a tourist card for Mexico.

On September 23, Mrs. Ruth Paine of Irving, Texas, a suburb of Dallas, drove to New Orleans and brought Mrs. Oswald and her child back to Mrs. Paine's home in Irving. She had met the Oswalds in Dallas in February and formed a friendship with them, partly out of an interest in Russia and its language.

Mrs. Paine said that Oswald told them at this time that he was going to Houston to see a friend about a job.

Actually, by September 26, Oswald was on his way to Mexico City. Also on September 26 the Dallas newspapers carried the announcement that President Kennedy planned to visit the city on a coming tour of the south.

Exactly where Oswald went, whom he saw, what he did in Mexico are still subjects of investigation.

On September 27, Oswald showed up at the Cuban consulate in Mexico City and applied for a visa to Havana. Cubans say he was told it would take at least 10 days to clear it. They report he left in a huff. The next day he appeared at the Soviet consulate. Told that his application for a visa would have to go to Moscow and might take three months, he showed great anger and left.

This is what has been officially reported. The complete details of what secret police of both the U. S. and Mexico were able to find on Oswald's movements, if anything, may never be told.

It is noted that there are those in the Mexican Government who would prefer not to have their country involved in any way with the assassination or its planning, and who might therefore try to cover up any possible connection between it and Oswald's Mexican trip.

The money problem. Oswald showed up again in Dallas on October 5. He came to the Paines' home and told them he was broke except for unemployment compensation he was drawing.

This is another point where the question arises: How did Oswald finance his frequent trips, including his stay in Mexico unless he was being supplied with money by someone?

About this, according to Mrs. Paine, a neighbor mentioned that there

was a job opening at the Texas School Book Depository in Dallas.

Oswald applied, and was hired on October 15 as a warehouseman at \$1.25 an hour. He was required to give no character references because, his supervisor said, "Since he was only an extra, we felt we didn't need recommendations." On his application Oswald stated he had been a Marine but left out the facts that he had in underwear, in charge and had sought to obtain American citizenship. The depository supervisor said Mrs. Paine described Oswald as "a fine young man."

The day before he was hired, Oswald had registered at a rooming house on North Beckley Street in Dallas under the name of O. H. Lee. The house is in an inverted. The house is in a quiet residential working-class neighborhood. He had a small room, paying \$8 a week.

On October 20, Oswald's second child was born.

A portion ignored. It was about this time, on October 24, that United Nations Ambassador Adlai Stevenson came to Dallas to address a United Nations Day rally. He was roughed up, spit upon and jeered.

Mr. Stevenson says that, fearing for the President's safety, he called the White House after this trip and urged that the President's Dallas visit be canceled. But three days later, Mr. Stevenson reports, he called back and requested that his advice be withdrawn.

Nevertheless, his warning was one of many steps that, in retrospect, should have resulted in extra precautions for the President's safety, in the opinion of many people. Yet apparently no special steps were taken in regard to Dallas people with suspicious backgrounds, such as Oswald's.

Both the Secret Service and the FBI have offices in Dallas. Mrs. Paine is quoted as saying that officers from both organizations queried her about Oswald in the autumn of 1963, shortly before the assassination, but this has been officially denied in Dallas.

All through November, up to November 21, the eve of the assassination, Oswald worked quietly at his job, and spent his week-ends with his family at the Paine home in Irving.

Dallas police say that the exact parade route to be used by the President on his Dallas trip was not determined until a few days in advance, so that Oswald had only a day or two of advance information on that score.

When he went to work at the depository, he could not have known how per-

Pace quickening at IH

International House will send distinguished group around world in August

At International House, New Orleans, desk tops are covered with maps and the air is full of talk about "missions." Though the strategists poring over the maps have the intensity of fighter pilots at briefing sessions, the missions are part of the 20-year-old organization's activities for "the promotion of world peace, trade and understanding."

Upcoming in August is International House's 50th mission, 64 persons strong, headed for Paris, Rome, Cairo, Karachi, Calcutta, Bangkok, Hong Kong, Tokyo, and Honolulu. This month-long tour—involving 100—is described as the largest globe-trotting group of its kind—is the first around-the-world trade mission organized by International House. Previous missions have gone to every Latin American country, most European nations, the Far East and lands of the Soviet bloc.

Leaving with the blessings of Louisiana Senators Allen J. Ellender and Russell B. Long, the 50th mission will work to promote broader two-way trade relations and mutual understanding. To pave the way for the mission, George W. Healy, Jr., chairman of IH's international relations committee, called in Washington

on the ambassadors of India, Pakistan, Thailand, and the United Arab Republic, and IH Managing Director Paul A. Fabry this month is attending a series of official functions, business meetings and press conferences in the cities to be visited. French, Italian, British, and Japanese consuls general in New Orleans are cooperating in setting up the official part of the mission's program in Paris, Rome, Hong Kong, and Tokyo. U.S. commercial officers will be working closely in each country with mission members as they tour port facilities, meet with chambers of commerce and ministers of trade, and visit financial and manufacturing establishments.

TV coverage

Reporters and cameramen for National Educational Television (NET) will accompany the mission as International House's President Henry Zac Carter and First Vice President T. Sterling Dunn lead the group around the world. NET's 68 stations throughout the United States and WYES in New Orleans are expected to present programs on life and trade in the ports to be visited.

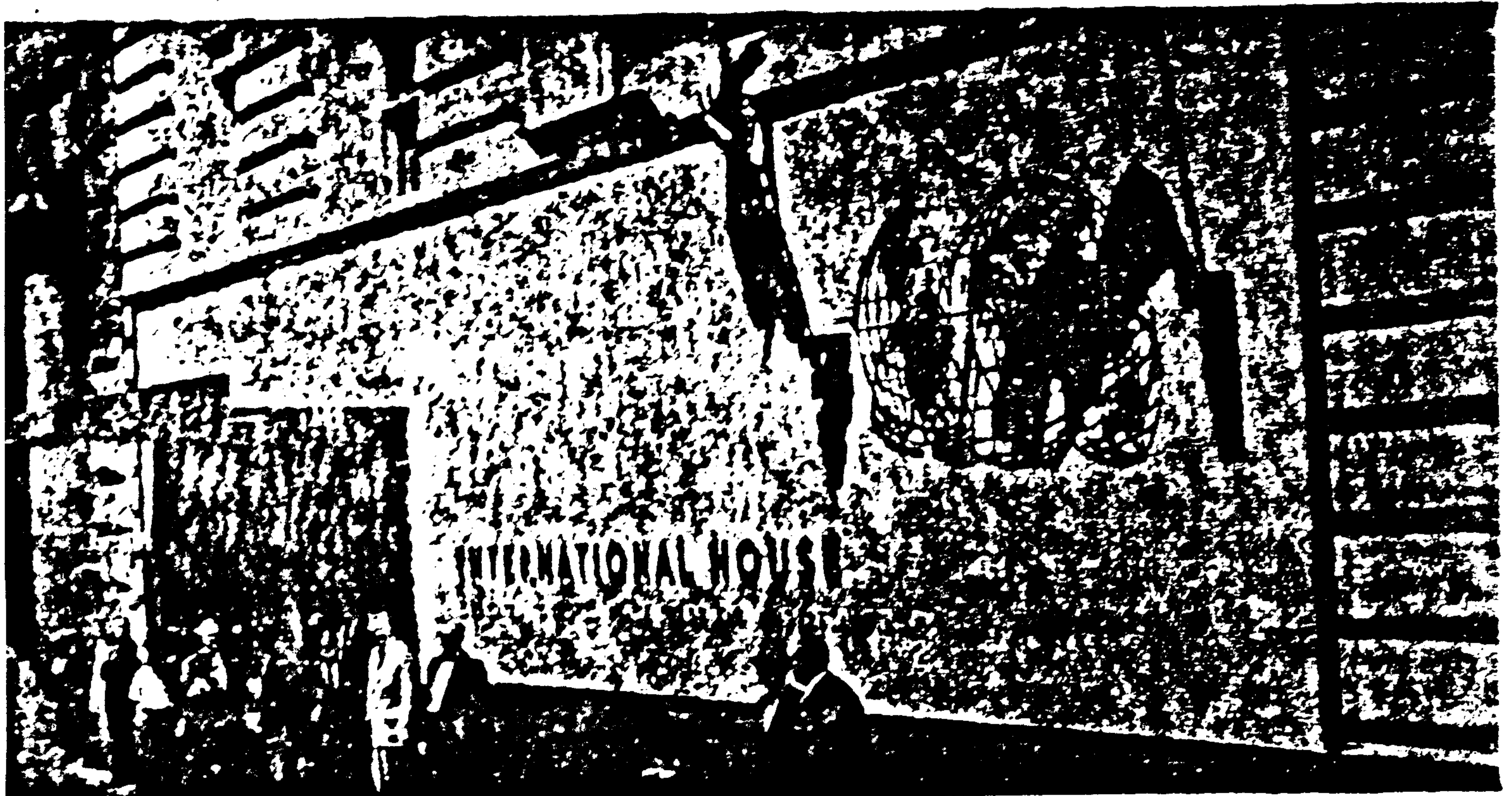

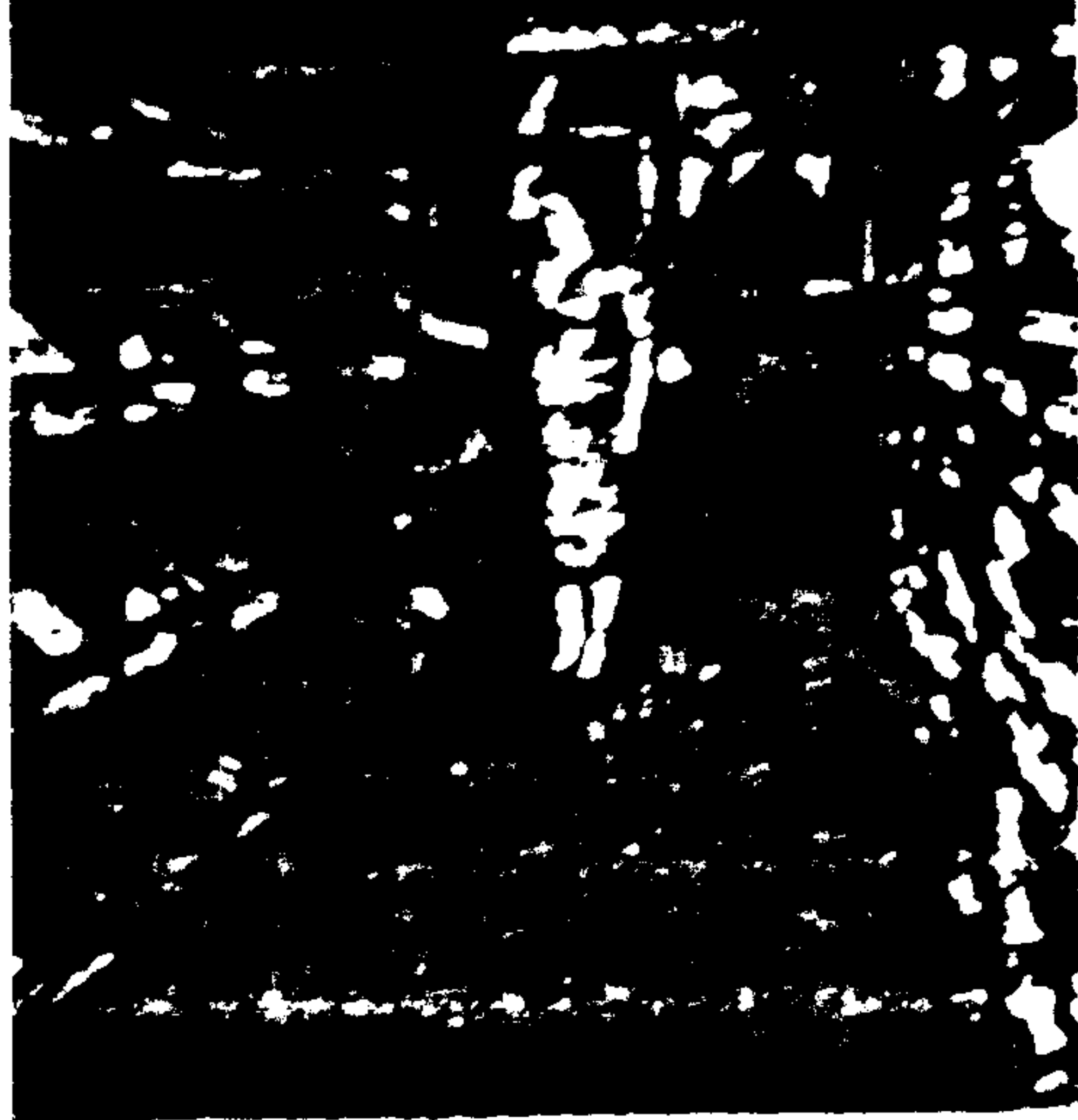
of trade and chamber of commerce leaders, as well as professors, attorneys, doctors and scientists will participate in the 20-day, 8-country, pay-your-own-way mission. About 20 industries and 10 business organizations are represented, and International House aims in particular to facilitate new entries by U.S. firms on the international trading scene.

Mission leaders Carter and Dunn are, respectively, president of Avondale Shipyards, Inc., and group manager of Sears, Roebuck & Co. Among other mission members are executives of Ayers Materials Co., Gulf States Screw Products, Pan-American Life Insurance Co., Jung Realty Co., Equitable Equipment Co., R. E. Neumann, Inc., Prager, Inc., New Orleans Engraving and Electrotypes Co., Eagle Asbestos and Packing Co., National American Bank, Sinclair Insurance Co., Zetz 7-Up Bottling Co., Sachs Electric, Inc., and Southern Towing Co.

Contributions

In a 20th-anniversary tribute, Congressman Hale Boggs, a founder and the first executive secretary of International House, cited the trade and cultural missions and certain other important contributions of the organization, including: annual Pan American press seminars,

scholarships granted by the IH-administered Cordell Hull Foundation to deserving Latin American students, tourist promotion to and from various parts of the world, periodicals and directories complementing Government cultural and trade work, international exhibits of U.S. and foreign artists, foreign-language instruction, and educational television programs.

Representative Boggs described the World Trade Development Department as "the backbone of the daily operations of International House," and credited it with bringing world buyers and sellers together, establishing more than 350,000 overseas contacts for U.S. businessmen, and building up extensive trade information files by country and commodity. Timely material and trade leads, he noted, are published regularly in the IH newsletter, *Trade Winds*, with its column, *Trading Post*, listing hundreds of commodities for export and import. He stated:

"The work of the World Trade Department is enhanced through its close contact with American and foreign chambers of commerce, U.S. Government foreign service posts, foreign government representatives living in the United States, and trade promotional organizations around the world. The department also studies the results of other American city missions to foreign countries for the purpose of trade, travel, and cultural promotion, and participates in many annual international trade conferences."

Membership, facilities

Some 2,500 business and civic leaders of the United States and other countries are grouped together in International House, and IH services and facilities—including the Thomas F. Cunningham trade reference library—are offered free to anyone, anywhere. Housed in the imposing 11-story building on Gravier Street

rooms: International Relations, World Trade Development, Cunningham Reference Library, and Publicity.

Facilities include foreign language classrooms, an assembly room for film showings and large meetings, a main dining room seating 225 people, private dining rooms, lounges and bars.

The purpose, as Rep. Boggs put it, is to provide an "international clubhouse" for world leaders in economic and cultural exchange. The founders of IH regard it as "a living symbol, in stone and steel and concrete, of our desire to be good neighbors and good-trading partners with all the world." Setting its actions to its words, the organization serves the world community on many fronts. Among recent good deeds: the sending of 2,200 masks for protection against volcanic dust fallout to Costa Rica's Ministry of Public Health; playing host to officers and men of the Swedish training ship, *Alvsnabben*, when it put in at New Orleans; active participation by IH leaders in the work of Radio Free Europe; and aid to ROCAP—the Regional Office for Central America and Panama—in getting up their joint exhibit at the New York World's Fair.

The late President John F. Kennedy recognized "the extraordinary achievements of International House," saying: "I am particularly pleased to see a private organization of this kind working with the several branches of government for the general improvement of our relations with the world community." And former President Dwight D. Eisenhower observed that International House's "spirit and program . . . are a splendid example to cities across the country." Comparable institutions have, in fact, been set up in a number of other cities.

Questions, answers

Queries from all over the world are handled by the multilingual staff of the Thomas F. Cunningham Reference Library at IH headquarters. Among the more than 11,000 volumes in this depository of specialized information on world commerce are trade directories and reference books from all over; statistics published by the United Nations, central banks of many countries, and foreign government offices; periodicals dating back 20 years, and some 450 current periodicals which the library receives.

One of the most effective forms of direct contact with other countries is provided by *Noticias*, the weekly newsletter in Spanish which is distributed to Latin American newspapers by the IH publicity department. The department puts out a steady stream of information on international affairs, trade, shipping, and the advantages of the Port of New Orleans. "VIP," the monthly half-hour

over New Orleans' educational TV station, WYER, reaches out to new audiences in the gospel of international unity and better trade relations.

With IH's comprehensive organization and ceaseless activities laying the groundwork, the 64-member 50th mission will land at world airports not as a party of strangers, but as the specially selected emissaries of a familiar institution. The mission will also continue the first large group to use the one-plane New Orleans-Europe service recently inaugurated by Delta Airlines and Pan American World Airways. A follow-up mission is scheduled to leave New Orleans October 16—representing the overflow caused by plane and hotel-space limitations on the current mission.

It's not just a matter of "seeing the world." Managing Director Paul Fabry, reducing the purposes of International House to simplest terms, puts it aptly: "Friends always do business easier than strangers, and strangers can, and do, become friends through understanding and trade."
