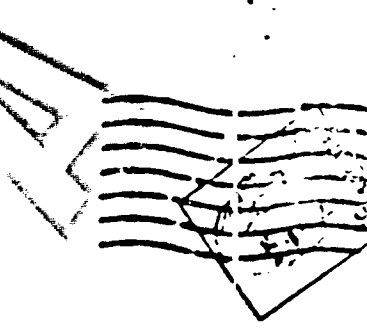

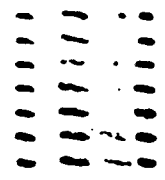

Information contained in the above anonymous letter has been furnished to the Attorney General, the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy, and the U. S. Secret Service.

The Department has advised that the above anonymous letter constitutes a violation of the Federal Extortion Statutes inasmuch as the threats contained in the letter arise from a racial situation, original and one copy of a clearing report is to be promptly submitted to the Bureau by Tampa, office of origin.

The original of the anonymous letter and the envelope in which it was contained have been retained at the Bureau for appropriate laboratory examination. Results of these examinations will be furnished to the Tampa Office and should be included in Tampa report.

Tampa at St. Petersburg, Florida, will contact local authorities for any suspects in this matter and will contact any other logical investigation in an attempt to identify the unknown subject.

New York will promptly contact the NAACP Headquarters and attempt to locate and interview Roy Wilkins for any information he may be able to furnish concerning this matter. Atlanta will also attempt to locate and interview Martin Luther King for any information he may be able to furnish in connection with this matter.

All offices expedite. Copies of the letter and envelope are enclosed for each office.

The Chicago FBI office received a letter mailed to the Chicago office by the Deerfield Electric Company, 700 Waukegan, Deerfield, Illinois, which had been received by that company. The Deerfield Electric Company subsequently submitted it to the FBI office for informational purposes.

The letter appeared to be a printed type letter bearing the heading Independent Voters Organization with the address 6340 South Lowe, telephone number HUDSON 3-2615, Chicago, Illinois - 60621. This letter had typed in the date December 12, 1933, and also typed in was "Deerfield Electric Co. 700 Waukegan, Deerfield, Illinois." On the upper right hand side there was typed the following: "Note: All proceeds from this ad drive will go to the defense fund for Jack Ruby."

The printed portion of the letter was advising the recipients of the letter that the Independent Voters Organization was offering a special introductory offer for new advertisers in the Business Directory which is published semi-annually. The letter pointed out that the booklet was delivered into the homes of approximately 30,000 registered voters in a highly concentrated area, mostly occupied by home owners. Approximately 80% of the homes are very old and still in their original state, and a house survey disclosed that most of the homes had faulty wiring, antique kitchens and baths, high ceilings, leaky windows and, in general, had other repair needs. The area described in the letter which receives the booklet is from 32nd Street to 33rd Street and from Morgan Avenue to the Dan Ryan Expressway. The letter subsequently set forth a price list for advertising in the Business Directory ranging from one full page, 3x9, for \$50.00 to 1/3 of a page for \$10.00. The letter was signed in ink with the signature of ARNOLD KRAUSE with the title of Director of Advertising.

On December 31, 1933, SA MICHAEL G. SIMON contacted Mrs. JEAN W. JONES, nee CARPENTER, who stated that she knew nothing regarding the Independent Voters Organization or ARNOLD KRAUSE but suggested that the agent contact her husband, S. F. JONES.

MRS. ANN PRIEST, Director, John Robert Powers Modeling School, 538 Texas National Bank Building, Houston, Texas, upon interview furnished the following information:

She and her former dancing partner, FRANK DE VERA, formerly operated a dance studio in Dallas, Texas, called The De Vera Dance Studio. It was located very near the Las Vegas Club, which was operated by JACK RUBY. MRS. PRIEST and DE VERA occasionally went to the Las Vegas Club. DE VERA, who knew RUBY personally, introduced MRS. PRIEST to RUBY and this occurred in 1954. On a few occasions about that time, when MRS. PRIEST and DE VERA were at the Las Vegas Club, RUBY would ask them to dance more or less as an informal dancing exhibition. MRS. PRIEST only knew RUBY in this casual manner although apparently RUBY and DE VERA were rather well acquainted.

MRS. PRIEST stated she last heard that FRANK DE VERA was associated with Encyclopedia Britannica and was living either in Little Rock, Arkansas, or Memphis, Tennessee. She indicated that this was perhaps a year or two ago that she last heard concerning DE VERA.

MRS. PRIEST stated she never met or heard of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and accordingly did not know of any association or connection between OSWALD and RUBY.

HENRY WADE, Dallas County District Attorney, was contacted and interviewed by SAs VINCENT E. DRAIN and W. HARLAN BROWN. WADE stated WAGGONER CARR, Texas Attorney General, had no authority to speak for him. WADE stated he had made it known that he needs all available information concerning JACK RUBY and circumstances surrounding his shooting of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, as well as associates and background of RUBY.

WADE advised he had never stated that he was handicapped because he does not have certain written statements in possession of the FBI. WADE related that the Dallas Police Department had conducted very little investigation concerning RUBY and his background and had spent most of the time submitting an investigative report defending themselves because of the shooting of OSWALD by RUBY.

WADE advised his purpose in getting the information from the FBI was the fact that if RUBY should take the stand he would like to cross-examine him concerning his background and incidents RUBY may have been involved in which WADE could use in cross-examination. Also WADE related that he would cross-examine any character witnesses that might appear for RUBY.

WADE was asked to state specifically and categorically where he was handicapped in any way by lack of access to material in possession of the Federal Government at which time WADE advised that he was not in a position to do so because he did not have any knowledge as to what the background information collected by the Federal Government consisted of, but felt that the Federal Government had gone into RUBY's background and associates. WADE stated without reviewing such statements taken by the Federal Government, oral or written, he would have no way of knowing what these statements contained.

"Dear Mr. Shanklin:

"As you are aware, we have a bond hearing on Jack Ruby set on January 20 and the trial for the murder of Lee Oswald set for February 3 in Criminal District Court No. 3 of Dallas County, Texas. In that trial all of the information we can gather with reference to the background of Jack Ruby from the time he was born up to the present, the names of all his business or social associates together with what they might have said concerning him or his mental capacity will be very important. I feel that you have some of this information or all of it in your present files. I would appreciate your obtaining the following:

1. Copies of all interviews had by your agents concerning Jack Ruby or any of his associates.
2. The names of any persons in any way connected with Ruby together with their statements made concerning him.
3. Any physical evidence that you might have in the Ruby case.

4. Any summary you might have of the whole activities of Ruby during and at the time of this murder.
5. Any statements that you might have tending to show any connection between Oswald and Ruby.
6. Any statements that you might have dealing with whether or not Ruby belonged or had belonged to any subversive groups.
7. Copies of the interviews had by your agents at the City Hall and also the Dallas County Jail and what Ruby told them.

None of this information will be released to the press, radio or television, nor to anyone else outside of this office, and will be used exclusively in the trial of this case for the purposes of cross-examining the defendant should he testify and also cross-examining the character witnesses, and should any of these witnesses wherein you have a statement from them testify, if they vary from the statements made to your agent, they will be used for the purpose of cross-examining this witness. I hope that this can be arranged as soon as possible since we will have to read and digest these prior to the trial on February 3.

The typewriting on Q1 and Q2 was not identified with any of the material in the Anonymous Letter File. Appropriate photographs will be added to this file.

The typewriting on Q1 and Q2 was prepared on a machine equipped with a foreign style of type spaced ten letters per inch. The foreign style of type is known as Ransmeyer and is manufactured in West Germany and the manufacturer is alleged to be the world's largest, exclusive manufacturer of typewriter type. The manufacturer supplies several American typewriter companies in addition to the major European typewriter companies. Some of the machines using this particular style of type are: Woodstock, Antares, Halda, Olivetti, Orga, Remington, B. C. Allen, Smith-Corona.

The physical characteristics of the paper of Q1 and Q2 have been recorded for future reference. No watermarks, indented writings, or other significant features were noted which would indicate the source of the paper used.

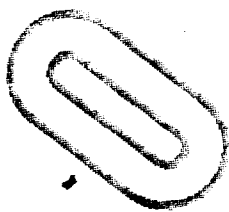

Mrs. Zula Watson, also a neighbor of the Fraziers and Jack Ruby's, recognized him as the man who had lived near Elm Grove for a time. Last week Milam King, Jr. purchased an amateur snapshot of the scene of President Kennedy's assassination taken just two minutes before he was shot. Tishie King showed the picture to Harry Chensault who identified one of the spectators in the picture as Jack Ruby. Mrs. Myrtle identified the woman with the picture as the Mrs. Ruby who patronized her beauty

The Chicago Friends of the National Guardian sponsored a "Report to Chicago" on "What Happened In Dallas" by MARK LANE, attorney, of New York, who is representing OSWALD, - on Thursday evening, February 13, 1964, at the Midland Hotel, 105 West Adams Street, Chicago, Illinois, at 8 P.M.

The admission was \$1.00 and about 350 people attended. PEARL HART was the chairman and complimented the National Guardian for its progressiveness. She introduced Mr. ANYA DIMEO (a labor leader) who also credited the Guardian for its good work. She then introduced an attorney, a Negro, whose name was not caught, and who made an appeal for funds (it was later learned that about \$360.00 was collected).

The main speaker was then introduced. He spoke very well and presented facts and affidavits. Mr. LANE told the following:

Immediately after the shooting, the reports given via television were that three shots had been fired - one before the bend, one after the turn past the Book building, and the third a little further on. Also that the first shot had entered the President's neck, by the Adams Apple, and down into the lung; the second and third shots after the turn having struck the Governor and the President's head. Also, the first news given out by the doctors was that the bullet having entered the front of the President's throat, travelled down to the lung - a definitely plain course, which they could readily recognize as they saw many bullet wounds - so they put a tube down from the front into the lung, to try to assist the breathing - but, of course, to no avail.

However, after the Governor's wife told that she had said aloud to the President, after the turn, and facing him, so that he was looking straight ahead, and could not have possibly been struck from the Book building which was in back of him - the later news given out was that the bullet had entered the back of his head and exited through his windpipe. The doctors were instructed on their "miss"

by the Washington doctors who made the autopsy, and later they too changed their story to the reporters - that the bullet came out of the windpipe, not "into" it. When asked by reporters why the change in their diagnosis, they said "there was more to it than could be said."

The four men who were from the Dallas newspaper, waiting alongside the roadway, past the Book building, but before the overpass, claimed they believed the shots came from the overpass. These men were not interviewed publically nor was their testimony taken into public account or revealed.

The chicken bones found in the building in question on the 6th floor were discovered to be about two days old - thereby making it seem that OSWALD had taken chicken bones only for his vigil.

Also why had he only \$18.00 on his person and had left \$150.00 in his dresser drawer at home; and why had he run home to get a jacket when it was announced by Mrs. KENNEDY that it was so "hot" on the ride; and why had he bought a cheap rifle if he had so much money available, when it was told by the gun sellers as well as others examining the rifle, that the gun was very poorly made and could not be trusted to work well - especially to hit the target three times so exactly. He could have purchased a much better and surer gun right close to home for the same money.

Also, very shortly after the shooting, it was immediately broadcast that the weapon used was a German Mauser. It was repeated over and over again. When shown to OSWALD's wife, for identification, she said it looked like it, but was definitely a different color. However, later when they brought her the carbine, an entirely different gun, she readily recognized it.

Also, how could they hold her for nine weeks, when it was illegal to have held her even 24 hours; and a wife cannot testify against her husband. When the mother, wife and two children were first held by the authorities, and the wife was asked over and over again questions,

the mother was very outspoken and said she insisted upon her daughter-in-law having representation, and for her not to talk any more. The representation given to Mrs. OSWALD, junior, finally, was of the choosing of the authorities. The mother was discussed as "the old lady is giving us trouble" when they did not know she heard. She was forcibly detained by two FBI men when she tried to leave at one time.

When Mr. LANE asked if the wife had been "brainwashed," the answer was "only Chinese Communists brainwash people."

Through illustration on a blackboard, Mr. LANE showed how, during the transfer of OSWALD, it was a "put up" job for RUBY to get in and kill OSWALD - how an ambulance was waiting "to rush him to the hospital in case he was still alive" - how two guards were taken away from their stations by a superior (although they protested it was their duty to stand guard, but were bluntly told to come away, "or else"), and then RUBY rushed in from the left and shot OSWALD - how the Friday before, when OSWALD was being questioned in the outer jail, the District Attorney, over a microphone, was called "HENRY" by the person holding the microphone whom he called "JACK" (RUBY), etc.

Mr. LANE was not permitted to see the widow of OSWALD, nor would he be shown certain records. Certain ones he caught a glimpse of, and they felt he should not see, were hidden and he was told they could not let him see them.

He explained that the District Attorney is a former FBI man and that the Commission who were investigating consisted of very biased men. He said that the Chief Justice has expressed "we probably will never know the facts during our lifetime" and then later said he had spoken in jest. From many facts hidden, as well as contorted, Mr. LANE said that there would be a great lack of prestige toward the Chief Justice, who formerly was held in such high esteem, which would be deplorable.

When Mr. LANE was asked about a certain remark he had made to MARGARET OSWALD when she wanted him to represent her, he explained that he told her he would represent her son, if she wanted him to, but he could not represent both him and her. She agreed. However, she calls him daily, or more, and asks him advice on certain points, and he gives it to her.

He told about the bullet hole in the front of the windshield, and how it was not accessible to him (and others) but how it finally wound up in Detroit, where it was refinished and repaired.

When asked what his ideas were concerning who might have done the deed, he said he had not opinions, but that no one seemed to be following the legally prescribed course of investigate the line - if not OSWALD, then who?

He said why would OSWALD, after the shooting, casually walk down four flights of stairs in the Book Building to the second floor, drink a coke from the coke machine (while the building was being surrounded by FBI men) and then after one of his superiors had convinced a law man who had stopped to question OSWALD, that OSWALD was a worker in the building; and why should OSWALD have taken the rifle wrapped full length, when he could have broke it down into an inconspicuous package; and how did he get out without being seen; and why would he run half a mile in the opposite direction to get a bus to go past the Book building; and why did the bus driver place him in the bus before the time of the shooting; and why did he get off the bus and take a taxi driven by a man (whose name was given out by the FBI) and after checking, the transportation company definitely stated they had no such person on their lists in their employ.

When Mr. LANE was asked by the audience what would happen if the authorities would take away his affidavits from him and possibly stop him some way, he replied that other men in various places had the real documents, he had only copies; and if something happened to him, they probably could more capably take over from where he left off.

When asked if he believed OSWALD might have been in the employ of the CIA, he said he did not feel he was.

When asked if he had any opinion as to who shot the policeman, he replied that he certainly did, but would not discuss it until after RUBY's trial.

He said the true meaning of our democracy was being completely outraged in this matter, and it was frightening how facts and deeds were entirely distorted and untrue. He said he intended to do his utmost to bring the truth out into the open.

He said Dallas is by far a greater city of violence and corruption than Chicago. In view of this, and because of the fact that some time ago Mr. and Mrs. L. B. JOHNSON were spat upon in that city; and in view of the fact that ADLAI STEVENSON had been struck and reviled there, why wasn't there stricter surveillance that day by the FBI, and where was the chief law officer of that city on that day (he was not in town).

The meeting adjourned about 10:30 PM.

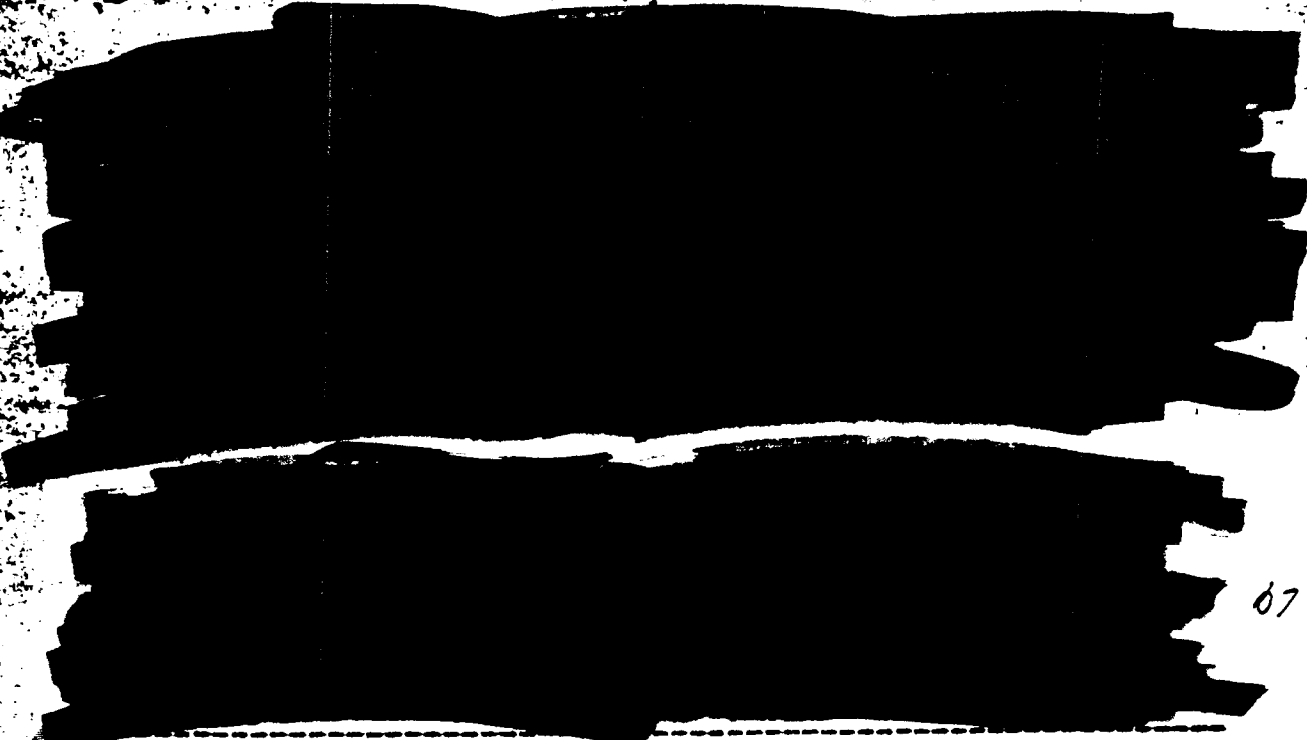

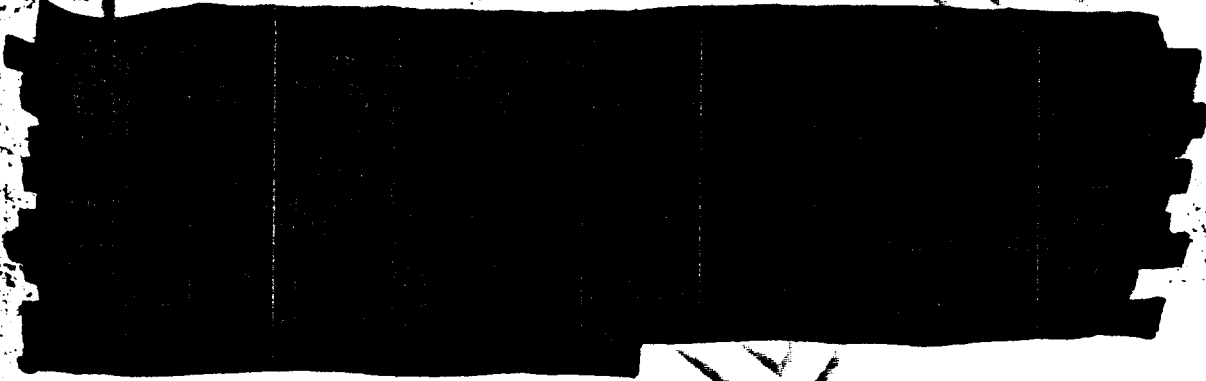

HARVEY stated that, as a result of his differences with the BIRCH women, these women have stated on more than one occasion that they would "get even" with HARVEY and would do anything to get him in trouble.

HARVEY stated that he does not recall ever making a statement to anyone to the effect that he contemplated getting a gun and shooting LEE HARVEY OSWALD, and added that he could not have made such a statement while intoxicated inasmuch as he does not drink. He added that he may have made a statement expressing the opinion that if JACK RUBY were released from jail on bond he might be shot or otherwise killed just as OSWALD was killed. He added that if he did make such a statement it was not to convey the impression that he himself had any notion of harming RUBY but merely expressing the opinion or fear that if RUBY were released, someone might kill him.

Mr. HARVEY advised that he does not know JACK RUBY and never knew LEE HARVEY OSWALD; further, that he knows of no information indicating a connection between OSWALD and RUBY or the assassination of President KENNEDY and the shooting of OSWALD by RUBY.

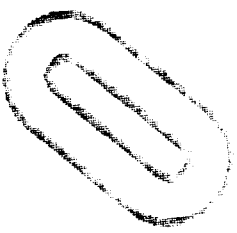

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM L. BYRNE, JR.:

On December 3, 1963, TOM BRYNER, "New York Times," Los Angeles, advised he lent ROBERT STUART, aka., BUDDY KING, \$75 about two months ago. STUART, at the time, indicated he was going to quit entertaining and was to handle public relations for other entertainers in the San Francisco area. The money was delivered to STUART for BRYNER by VERN ROBINSON, 2588 Mission Place, Room 233, San Francisco, telephone Mission 7-9158. BRYNER stated ROBINSON will know the hotel where STUART was staying at the time. BRYNER advised that STUART is married to, or living with, a girl from the Oakland area. The girl formerly worked for, and is known to, AL NEAL, Manager, "Dallas Times Herald."

The Las Vegas Office subsequently advised that STUART had been located at Reno, Nevada.

Mrs. FLORENCE ROBERTSON,

Mrs. FLORENCE ROBERTSON, 3216 West 113th Street, Inglewood, California, advised SA L. HOYT McGUIRE on December 7, 1963, that she and her husband, while on vacation in Texas, stopped at a small truck stop restaurant for breakfast about November 19, 1963. She initially described this restaurant at a location between Dallas, Texas, and Texarkana, Texas. While eating there she overheard a conversation between two or three men and a waitress concerning the intended visit of former President JOHN F. KENNEDY to Dallas, Texas. The waitress made a remark questioning whether the president "would get through Dallas." One of the men reportedly stated something to the effect that he did not think the President "would make it" and that RUBY was going to get him. She believed one of the men made some remark that the FBI would take care of him, apparently, in the mind of Mrs. ROBERTSON, referring to whoever might be after President KENNEDY. She reported this information for any value to the FBI. Mrs. ROBERTSON advised SA GEORGE A. PAINE, JR. telephonically on December 12, 1963, that after looking at various maps and discussing the trip with her husband that the truck stop restaurant mentioned was believed to be about 26 miles east of Greenville, Texas, just west of Sulphur Springs. She recalled being near highway construction in the area of the truck stop restaurant near the east end of Highway 67 Expressway. She said the maps reflect the area of the truck stop restaurant was probably near Brashear, Texas.

LEO ZAKARIN,
REPORTEDLY APPROACHED
BY JACK RUBY CONCERNING
NIGHT CLUB VENTURE

Dallas advised Los Angeles on December 12, 1963, that Mrs. HARRY B. HAMMOND, Dallas, stated in the late 1950s, or early 1960s, LEO ZAKARIN, a former brother-in-law of her husband, was approached by RUBY in an effort to interest ZAKARIN in a night club venture with RUBY. ZAKARIN reportedly resided at 1818 Whitney (Whidley), Hollywood 28, California, where he was believed employed as a clerk at an unknown hotel.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JAMES E. ETHRIDGE:

On December 12, 1963, MELVIN DAVIDSON, owner of apartments, 1818 Whidley, Hollywood, California, advised LEO ZAKARIN resided in apartment 106 from June 16, 1963, until December 3, 1963, advising he was returning to New York. DAVIDSON could furnish no further information regarding ZAKARIN. No forwarding address was left by ZAKARIN.

Dallas advised Los Angeles on December 16, 1963, that Mrs. HAMMOND advised that LEO ZAKARIN's daughter, Mrs. BILL STEPHAN, 626 Chevy Chase, Glendale, California, could provide a current address for ZAKARIN, and that ZAKARIN's former wife, MARGIE, was presently visiting with Mrs. STEPHAN and may know ZAKARIN's location.

The following investigation was conducted by SA JESSE V. McNULTY:

On December 16, 1963, Mrs. WILLIAM STEPHAN advised her father, LEO ZAKARIN, left this area about 10 days ago. He is seeking employment and staying at Algiers Hotel, Miami Beach, Florida. He is looking for an apartment, but his whereabouts would be known to management this hotel.

HUEY J. McQUILLAN,

Dallas advised Los Angeles on December 20, 1963, that HUEY J. McQUILLAN was believed to be a member of RUBY's night club at Dallas, Texas, and requested investigation to locate and interview McQUILLAN.

The following investigation was conducted by Special Agents W. E. WHITE and JOHN C. O'NEILL:

On December 20, 1963, the records of the Retail Merchants Credit Association, Los Angeles, failed to reflect any reference to the name of McQUILLAN at Los Angeles, California.

A record was located for HUGH J. McQUILLAN, wife, JESSIE, residing at 211 South California, Burbank, California, as of August 1962.

Investigation in the neighborhood of the South California address determined McQUILLAN and his wife separated several months ago. His wife was pregnant and was believed to be in Dallas, Texas, with her parents, name and address unknown. McQUILLAN reportedly had been fired from his last employment for drinking of intoxicants about October 1963 and was believed to have gone to Dallas, Texas, two weeks earlier. McQUILLAN was formerly employed in 1962 by Siegals Liquor Store, Dallas, Texas.

FRED OTASH, PRIVATE INVESTIGATOR,

On March 3, 1964, an individual who requested his identity not be divulged, but who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that FRED OTASH reportedly is in Dallas, Texas, assisting Attorney MELVIN BELLI in defense of JACK RUBY, who is on trial in State Court at Dallas charged with murder of LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

OTASH is a former Los Angeles police officer, who resigned under pressure to leave the Department a number of years ago. Since then, he has been licensed as a private investigator in Los Angeles, and has been involved in numerous sensational court cases. He was convicted in State Court for conspiring to fix a horse race, and his investigator's license has been in jeopardy.

Prior contacts with OTASH by the Los Angeles Office ascertained he was unreliable, not trustworthy, and considered not to be a reliable individual to contact. OTASH was also known to utilize sound technicians to conduct investigations for him and he can be expected to undertake endeavors requiring an almost abandonment of caution.
