Mrs. ESTHER JEAN EATON, also known as Mrs. EDWARD A. EATON, housewife, residing at Harrison, Michigan, with mailing address of Post Office Box 503, Harrison, Michigan, advised of the following information:

She is the aunt of CURTIS LAVERN CRAFARD, who is the son of her brother, HUGH EDWARD CRAFARD, 1219 Birch Street, Dallas, Oregon. CURTIS CRAFARD arrived at her home at approximately 10:00 AM, November 26, 1963. He remained at her home until approximately 10:30 AM, November 27, 1963. He stated at the time of his arrival that he had hitchhiked from Dallas, Texas, to Clare, Michigan, from November 23, 1963, to November 25, 1963. He claimed that he had spent the night of November 25-26, 1963, with his cousin, CLIFFORD LEROY ROBERTS at Clare, Michigan. (ROBERTS is a cousin of CRAFARD on his maternal side.) When CRAFARD left Harrison, he stated he was hitchhiking to Fife Lake, Michigan, and that he intended to spend Thanksgiving Day with his sister, Mrs. CHAUNCEY INGERSOLL, Post Office Box 53, Fife Lake.

Mrs. EATON stated that CURTIS CRAFARD refused to give an explanation concerning why he left Dallas, Texas, but he did state that he had been the private secretary to JACK RUBY at the Carousel Club, Dallas, until he left during the morning of November 23, 1963. CRAFARD stated that he "just decided to leave." He stated that he did not tell anyone in Dallas he was leaving or where he was going. Mrs. EATON stated that she got the impression from CRAFARD that he was constantly moving, possibly to keep from being questioned concerning his association with RUBY.

Mrs. EATON further advised that her daughter, GALE ANN EATON, age 17, had received a letter dated October 29, 1963, from CRAFARD, which advised that CRAFARD was "the private secretary" to JACK RUBY, owner of the Carousel Club. GALE EATON answered this letter, but no further correspondence was carried on between them.

Assistant to the Director BELMONT called at approximately 11:00 AM and advised that information had been received in Washington that there would be a special court of inquiry to be held in Dallas, which they understood was possible under Texas law. BELMONT requested HENRY WADE, District Attorney, Dallas be contacted and advise him that if a special hearing was to be held, the Bureau desired to cooperate fully with him; that any evidence that was in the Bureau's possession would be made available, and if he desired Agents would be made available to testify at such time as a hearing would be held.

After talking with WADE, BELMONT was telephonically advised that a special court of inquiry in Texas could be called by any Justice of the Peace that desires to do so; that he personally was opposed to any such court of inquiry at this time. WADE advised that he did feel that at some future date, some type of hearing should be held so that the public could be advised of all the facts concerning OSWALD's involvement in the death of the President.

WADE further advised that any hearing for the setting of bond in Texas required considerable information to be made available and in order to try and avoid such a hearing, a grand jury was to be called on the morning of Nov. 26th to hear the facts concerning JACK LEON RUBY, and unless difficulty was encountered, he expected RUBY would be indicted by the grand jury on the charge of murdering OSWALD shortly after 9:00 AM on Nov. 26th.

At 12:25 PM, I advised Mr. BELMONT of information received from AUSA B. H. TIMMINS, JR. concerning the so-called court of inquiry. TIMMINS stated that the State Attorney General, WAGGONER CARR, apparently had learned from JIM BOWIE, First District Attorney of Dallas who told him he had learned from someone in press circles that WAGGONER CARR was making an announcement in Washington this afternoon that a court of inquiry would be called under Section 886, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.

Mr. TIMMINS advised that when he was formerly connected with the State Attorney General's office, the general policy was that a court of inquiry was generally not called in criminal cases except when the District Attorney requested the Attorney General's office to call such a court of inquiry unless local law enforcement had broken down, in which event the Attorney General's office sometimes holds such a court of inquiry.

I also told BELMONT that District Attorney WADE had learned of the contemplated action of the State Attorney General and was furious over this action to be taken. I also told BELMONT that District Attorney WADE had allegedly received a call concerning this from someone in the Justice Department.

At 11:30 AM, 11/27/63, TOM FINN, News Commentator, KDKA, #1 Gateway Center, Pittsburgh, Pa., telephonically contacted the Pittsburgh Office. He advised that a person named DAVE JONES, who stated his address was Ligonier, Pa., had spoken to FINN and declined to give his street address or telephone number. JONES advised that, according to information he had recently come in possession of, RUBY and his brother had lived in Latrobe, Pa., 34 years ago, when they moved to Chicago, and that they had been residents of the First Ward in Latrobe.

JONES stated he had been in Hughes Men's Store in Latrobe recently, where he had overheard a woman talking to the manager of this store. These persons, in their conversation, stated that they could recall RUBY and his brother residing in the First Ward in Latrobe prior to moving to Chicago 34 years ago.

No inquiry relative to the possibility that RUBY resided in Pennsylvania 34 years ago is being conducted UAC Dallas.

Mrs. McADAM believes that BONNIE KELLOUGH said she was going to Dallas, Texas, but is not certain about the city.

Mrs. McADAM stated she did not know anything else about BONNIE KELLOUGH. She stated BONNIE KELLOUGH's grandmother, a Mrs. COATES, first name unknown, still resides in the other apartment of that building, but is employed during the daytime, place of employment not known to Mrs. McADAM.





If this is so, verify that the lead has been set and expedite its coverage. In addition, interview RUBY's partner, IRVING ALKANAN. In addition, verify ownership and partnership plus the length of time and dates of such partnership.

3. With regard to information furnished by RUBY concerning his activities at the Police Department and furnishing sandwiches, first offering them to the police officers and then taking sandwiches to members of KRLD station at the police station, it is desired that the KRLD employees be interviewed. In addition, the purchase of the sandwiches should be verified with the owner of the delicatessen. (SA PERRYMAN advised information concerning interview with radio personnel has already been furnished by tel during the evening 11/29/63).


