RUBY PERSONALLY. STATES IN NINETEEN FORTY EIGHT, WHEN HE
AND MARLISE WELTON BROUGHT LOAD OF CASH FROM MEXICO TO
DALLAS, TEXAS. WELTON CONTACTED PAUL JONES IN AN EFFORT
TO LOCATE CASH. STATED JONES TOOK HIM AND WELTON TO
AN UNKNOWN HOTEL, WHERE JONES INTRODUCED AN INDIVIDUAL WHOM
HE BELIEVES POSSIBLY IDENTICAL TO RUBY AS JACK RUBINSTEIN.
STATED JONES AND RUBINSTEIN WENT BACK INTO HOTEL, STAYED
THROUGH THE NIGHT AND LEFT. AS THEY WERE ABOUT TO
ADVERTISE AND SAID WELTON HE WILL HAVE TO GO TO CHICAGO TO
DETERMINE IF THE STUFF BELONGS, AND A FURTHER REFERENCE WAS
MADE TO INDIVIDUAL BELIEVED TO BE RUBINSTEIN.

Captain ROBERT CROWDER, Texas Rangers, Dallas, Texas, telephonically advised this date that he had received information from a highly confidential source to the effect that on the morning of November 24, 1963, a party using phone number FE 1-3748, Dallas (listed to STEWART T. PALMER, 2728 West Davis) was supposed to have intercepted a coded message from OSWALD, who was then in the Dallas City Jail, to be delivered to RUBENSTEIN. CROWDER advised that the owner of the phone (probably PALMER) made a phone call at 8 p.m. that date from the FE 1 number above to phone number 878-9419, Las Vegas, and asked for WILLIAM DONNELLY. He told DONNELLY he had this coded message and the only thing he could make out of it was "Don't send me a letter tomorrow, it would look funny in Chicago."

Although CROWDER did not say so, it would appear that his source had overheard this telephone conversation.

This incident may refer to the same incident in which THOMAS STEWART PALMER, 2728 West Davis, voluntarily furnished the Bureau on November 24, 1963 (see interview with PALMER located in Hitts file no. 4). PALMER is branch manager of the American Guild Variety Artists, Inc. PALMER did not indicate to Bureau Agents that he had discussed this matter with WILLIAM DONNELLY in Las Vegas. It is possible that CROWDER's source overheard portions of this conversation and put his own interpretation on the source of the message.

Enclosed herewith are 50 copies of each FD-302 reflecting interviews with EMMETT STEVE WALKER and GEORGE WENDELANDT on 12/4/63 at Locust Grove, Oklahoma.

On 11/28/63, W. W. WALKER, Chief of Police, Muskogee, Oklahoma, advised that V. W. WALKER, a former resident of Muskogee, told him on 11/27/63 that one of his (WALKER'S) acquaintances, whose name is unknown, told him since President KENNEDY'S assassination, he had gotten to know JACK RUBENSTEIN a number of years ago in the state of Texas. RUBENSTEIN was reported to have then had two places of business (unidentified) and possibly different places and also had two partners who were reported to have disappeared mysteriously during that period.

WALKER said he has known EMMETT WALKER for many years and he was acquainted with the (unidentified) person who is also being described in the report as operating a business out of Locust Grove, Oklahoma, which he operates as a hotel. WALKER had indicated that he had referred to as having previously known EMMETT WALKER in Locust Grove, Oklahoma vicinity. He said WALKER was of the area for that through the year 1962. He had known him possibly at Locust Grove, Texas, and had not been in Dallas, Texas.

Mr. GIOVANNI "SAM" URRATA, owner and operator, Brennan's Restaurant, 1870 Orpheum Avenue, Metairie, Louisiana, informed that over the Thanksgiving Holiday he was in Dubuque, Iowa, visiting with his son, SAM URRATA, JR., who is a first year student at the Wartburg Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa. While discussing the death of President JOHN F. KENNEDY he, Mr. URRATA, pointed out to his son and also to a Mrs. DENNIS HEATH, a reporter for the Dubuque, Iowa, Telegraph Herald Newspaper, that he thought that the photographs of both JACK RUBY and LEE HARVEY OSWALD were familiar to him and stated that he believed that one or both of these individuals had been in his restaurant on possibly several occasions during the summer of 1963.

He stated that it is possible that he was mistaken and further he could not state definitely one way or the other as to whether the two individuals he thought might be identical with OSWALD and RUBY were in his place together. He stated that in view of the volume of customers he has in his restaurant which is located in the vicinity of the New Orleans Yacht Basin that he very well could have been mistaken, but did feel there was a familiarity about the photographs of both individuals.

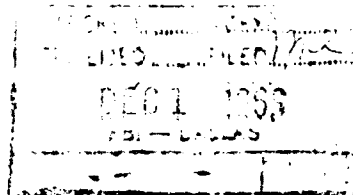
