At 5:30 PM today LYNN BROWN, Mayor of Irving, Texas, telephonically contacted this office to advise of the receipt of a letter at his office addressed to one GIDEON W. MILAM, c/o mayor's office, Irving, Texas. BROWN, who stated he receives many bills and other city business addressed to someone besides himself, opened the letter. The letter was from one BILL DOBKINS, 415 S. Main St., Monahans, Texas, who stated that he would take the place of MELVIN BELLI on any proposed trip to "a small town in Russia" because he too believed there was no justice in Texas. BROWN stated the letter went on to describe DOBKINS, his military service, and general outlook.

BROWN advised that upon asking about the Irving City Hall he found the above mentioned Milam is the organizer of a group in Irving whose function it is to raise enough money for a one-way trip to Russia to be given to BELLI.

BROWN STATED HE COULD be contacted at either his home phone BL 3-8052 or office phone BL 3-0954.

Following the verdict of guilty in the RUBY trial on 3/14/64 and assessment of the death penalty, MELVIN BELLI of San Francisco, Chief Defense Attorney, made numerous intemperate statements to news media while in the courtroom and later in criticism of the court, District Attorney's Office, the jury, the city of Dallas, etc. BELLI made some comparison to the quality of justice meted out to the defendant with that in Russia and expressed some preference to a "small town in Russia" over Dallas. Press articles thereafter indicated certain individuals were soliciting contributions to provide BELLI with a one-way ticket to Russia.

On 3/20/64, LYNN BROWN, Mayor of Irving, Texas, advised SPC FOREST L. LUCY he had inadvertently opened a letter received at his office addressed to GIDEON W. MILAM from one BILL DOBKINS, 415 S. Main Street, Monahans, Texas. MILAM was identified as the organizer of the group in Irving to raise money for the ticket to Russia for BELLI.

It was stated DOBKINS in his letter said he would take the place of BELLI on any proposed trip to a "small town in Russia" because he too believed there was no justice in Texas. It was said the letter went on to describe DOBKINS, his military service, and general outlook.

No inquiry is requested but it is suggested you may desire to index the name of DOBKINS in your office.

Dear Sir:

I hope that this letter is privileged enough to reach your hands.

I read quite recently about the verdict returned by the jury of your city in the trial against Mr. Ruby and, of course, I am familiar with the commentaries which have followed this event.

Allow me, dear Mr. Attorney, to tell you the truth in sincerity and without reticence: This verdict satisfies no one, with the exception perhaps of the enemies of the United States of America and, therefore, of the free world. Your (?) position as a servant, as it were, of the majority of the American citizens is rather partial and it is a fact that none of us seems to be able to accept this tragedy which entailed so many shocking developments. However, in spite of everything, I will try to set forth by means of these few lines the logical and juridical reality which must emanate from this case.

Mr. Ruby, a mentally mature person, did not act as a result of an emotional shock. This is apparent not only from the age of the accused, but also from the premeditation with which he acted. How else could one explain the various attempts Ruby made to enter the enclosed area where the President's assassin was? How else could one explain that the fellow dared to enter the place which was supposedly

guarded and which was inaccessible to any person who had no right to be there (save for reasons of work) and much the less to an armed person? Indeed, it would be much more difficult to explain why a person of the age and record of Mr. Ruby suffered such an emotional derangement as to commit the crime he committed without a second thought about the consequences.

Dear Mr. Attorney, I have no intention of going over the history of the events, but I would like to ask the following:

First - Is it indeed possible that Lee H. Oswald plotted the assassination of the President all by himself? Could Oswald who, because of his record, appears to have been a person of negligible intelligence, perpetrate and mastermind the assassination of President Kennedy?

Second - Is it indeed credible that Mr. Ruby lost his self-control like a teenager to the extent of doing what he did?

The truth is that we are confronted with one of the most despicable events of our age; one, in which the law enforcement authorities of the United States of America acted in a manner which is, at least, negligent and apathetic. Are they afraid by any chance to fully unravel the President's assassination and the assassination of his assassin? Which influential political personages are being protected? Are you, Mr. Attorney, a bought man? Or else, have you not been free to act in this case?

In his first speech as the President of your nation, President Kennedy said: "Ask not what your country can do for you; ask what you can do for your country." Is your country unable to do the least that can be expected of it? Is it unable to remove the stain from its honor? Or is this one more case of the honor having been sacrificed on the altar of comfort? Or, should I call it cowardice?

In short, the verdict as it has been returned satisfies no one because there can be only two verdicts in this trial.

Either it is found that Ruby is a mentally deranged person and acted by himself; and, under these circumstances, he cannot be sentenced to death. Or, one gets to the bottom of this matter and strips the mask from the people who have masterminded these two assassinations without fear of the consequences which may follow.

However, the only verdict which cannot be returned is one which sentences Jack Ruby, and only him, to death.

On 4/2/64, Mr. ROBERT DAVIS of the Texas Attorney General's Office, assisting ELBERT JENNER, Attorney of the President's Commission, called and stated that they had questioned Mr. W. S. BIGGIO, Detective from the Criminal Intelligence Div of the Dallas Police Dept., and he had mentioned that the PD had received information that a man by the name of W. R. CHESHER of 5935 Lupton Street, Dallas, had heard some unknown mechanic on an unknown date in the coffee shop drive in at 5060 West Lovers Lane, Dallas, state that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had on some unknown date brought in JACK RUBY's car for repairs. In questioning BIGGIO, it was brought out that CHESHER is now deceased; that the coffee shop is now closed, but that apparently another officer, FRANCIS A. HELLINGHAUSEN had talked to CHESHER and possibly talked to a couple of CHESHER's employers at the BOB HARDY Real Estate Company, 6340 East Mockingbird Lane. These persons were believed to be W. E. WHITE, JR., Manager, and JOHN P. SCHMITZIUS. BIGGIO was not too definite, but indicated that he had probably referred the matter up through the Chief's office to be referred to the FBI. DAVIS wanted to know if we had run this matter out.

A check of our indices fails to reflect receipt of any information regarding this specific matter from the PD or anywhere else.

On 4/3/64, SA VINCENT E. DRAIN discussed at length with Deputy Chief M. W. STEVENSON of the Criminal Identification Bureau of the Dallas PD as to whether or not any of the above information had been disseminated to this office. Chief STEVENSON stated that he had talked with Deputy BIGGIO concerning this information and found that it was a very indefinite and innocuous lead, which apparently had no substance to begin with. According to STEVENSON, he could find no record in the files of the Dallas PD where such had been referred to the FBI, because of the very fact that there wasn't any fact or basis which would be of substance which would warrant sending this information to

CLEMENTS, 11/30/63, Dallas, pages 725-731, examination by Buagents on 11/24/63, of items removed from person of RUBY by Dallas PD, and pages 733-751, examination by Buagents of items removed by Police Department from automobile of RUBY.

The following investigation was conducted 4/3/64, in an effort to determine present whereabouts of items in question:

HARMON HILL, Dallas PD Property Room, advised all items taken from RUBY except ring and watch have been heretofore turned over to District Attorney's Office. Captain J. W. FRITZ, Homicide Bureau, Dallas PD, stated his belief all items in possession of District Attorney. Representatives of Dallas County SO, stated none of RUBY property in their possession.

District Attorney HENRY WADE advised certain items turned over to his office by Dallas PD, but he does not believe all turned over, as they have been unable to locate certain items known to have existed. Stated he would under no circumstances release to Commission originals of any items he may have or may be found elsewhere, as he may have to retry case. Stated would be agreeable to Commission making copies. Stated all items in their custody in office of Assistant District Attorney WILLIAM F. ALEXANDER.

ALEXANDER stated his belief all items taken from RUBY not turned over to them, as he cannot locate some items. Stated doubts any items in his possession in their original state, as "they have been pawed over by so many agencies.
