

Dallas police sergeant P. F. Dean was standing by the crowd and which was to have taken Harvey Oswald to the county jail when he had shot. Dean said he heard someone shout they are bringing him out. I focused my attention on the floor where they were bringing him out. I didn't see the gun, but I heard the shot and saw the smoke from the gun. Police officers surrounding Oswald prevented me from seeing much else. Jack Ruby, Oswald's assassin, came from the north entrance (in the back entrance) from the ramp. There were many police officers and press representatives in the area. Ruby jumped out from the crowd as Oswald passed and fired one shot point blank at Oswald. Following the shot I ran from the crowd and to the spot of the shooting to assist in the arrest. When I got there officers had Ruby on the ground and were handcuffing him. I went then to Oswald. He was lying on the ground, motionless and gasping for breath -- a bullet hole in his left side. Officers removed Ruby and Oswald was put in an ambulance, still motionless, and taken to Parkland hospital. (Oswald was taken to emergency room 2, next to the one Kennedy was in)
