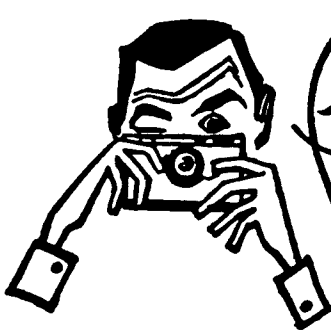
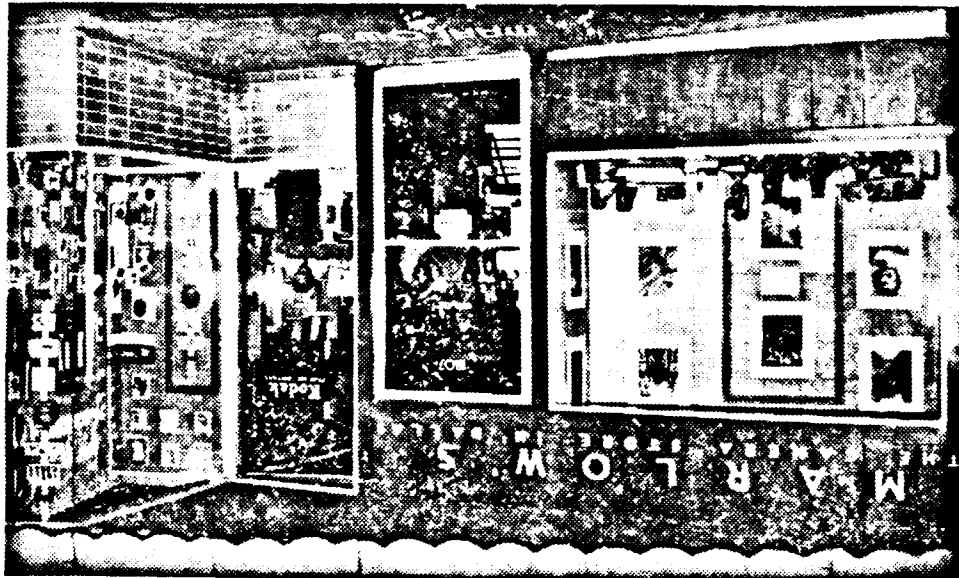

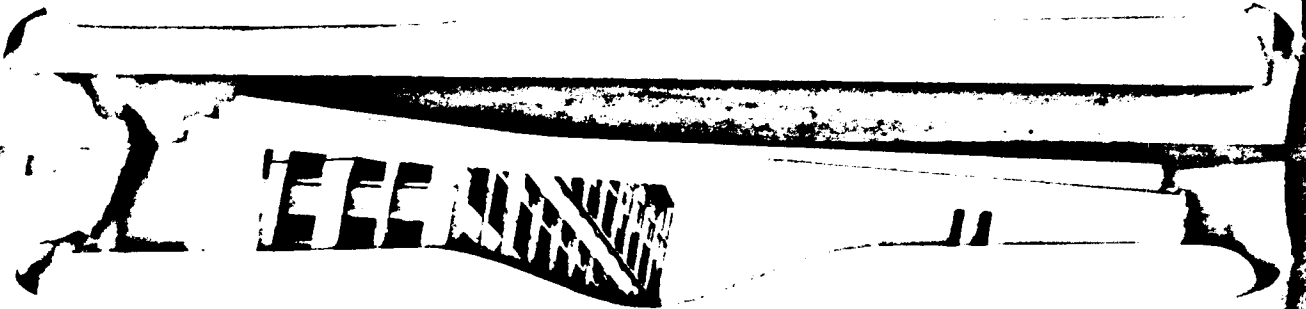
Enlargements

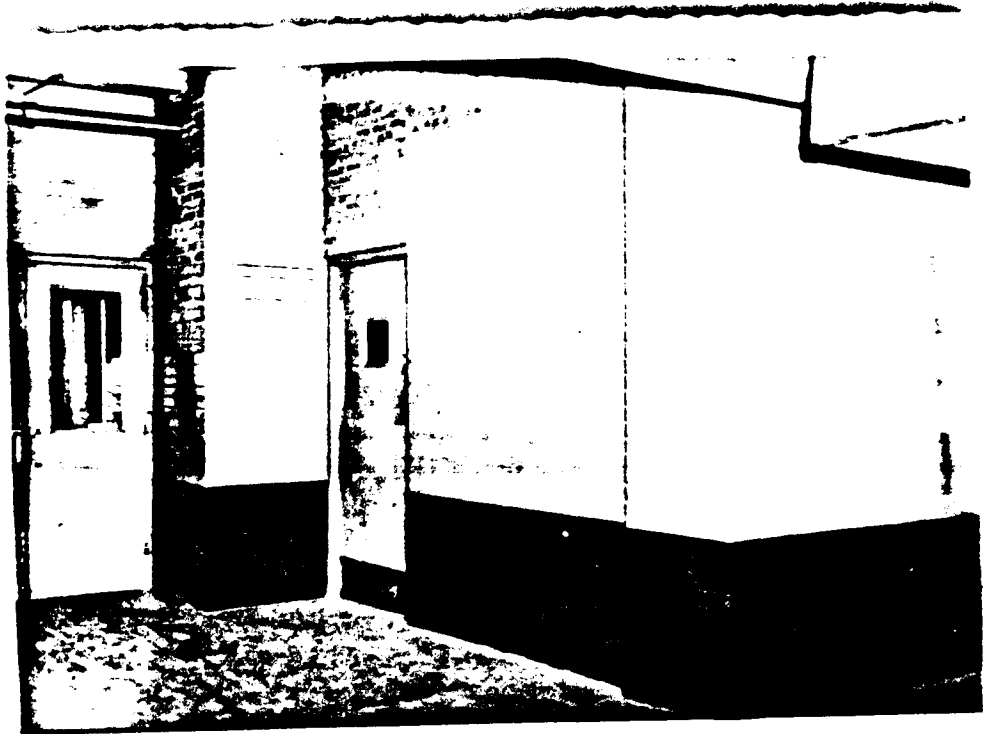

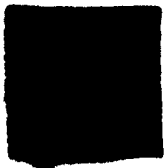
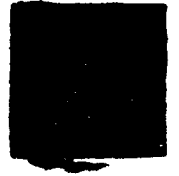
