Dear Mr. Ruby,

I have just finished watching a special three-hour television program, "1963 - A Television Album" and "After 30 Days - A Salute to JFK." It was during these programs that I experienced the compelling urge to write to you. For exactly what purpose, even I am not certain. But I had to write and I hope you will understand.

Many people condemn you for what you've done, and say that justice was not rightly administered. Others claim you were connected to Oswald, and shot him to "shut him up." I am sure you are fully aware of all the accusations and charges which have been flung upon you, so it would be foolish of me to elaborate on this point. Likewise, I am sure you realize that there are many, many people including myself, who believe in you and who can understand



your actions.

When you replied to a question, "I loved my President, I honestly believed you. I think that if I would have had the same opportunity to get near to the man who killed my President, and if I had a gun in my possession, I would have taken the same action you did. It is also common knowledge that at your trial, you will plead not guilty by reason of temporary insanity. It is an insanity which everyone experiences when grieved. It is a normal human reaction to want to take the life of the person whom you know killed someone who was dear to you, as Mr. Kennedy was to me, and, I'm sure, to you too. It is a typical feeling after a tremendous injustice has been committed, which everyone has experienced at one time or another. I don't believe you should



afraid of the consequences. For a man like Lee Oswald, who caused so much grief and heartache to millions of people and especially to Mrs. Kennedy and little Caroline and John-John, to die so quickly without experiencing much pain seemed an unbearable reality at first. He should have been made to experience the mental anguish that would have accompanied the knowledge that he was going to be executed. (And the irony of it all is that now Lee Oswald will go down in history as the "accused" assassin of President Kennedy. But what is done cannot be undone.

It is now only three days till Christmas. To be sure this will be the saddest Christmas many of us have ever had.

I want to wish you good luck in your upcoming trial and in the future. I will remember you in my prayers.

# COLLECTION LAUNCHED BY BOY'S CURIOSITY

William Olson's collection of historical documents and artifacts started with a boy's curiosity.

As an 8-year-old in Fairmont, Minn., Olson picked up a stone one day.

His scoutmaster told him it was an Indian arrowhead. From that time on, all stones were suspect, and Olson left none unturned in amassing a collection of arrowheads and other Indian relics.

He didn't stop there. Soon his friends and relatives were calling him "the junk dealer," as he gladly took anything old they had. "They poked fun at my bulging attic and basement," Olson recalls.

### Lincoln Rail

Among the rubbish some treasures emerged. A section of a fence rail split by Lincoln, a spike from Old Ironsides, a mastodon tooth, the skull of an ancient mound builder, an army discharge signed by George Washington and signatures of every United States president.

Today Olson has the last laugh on those who called his accumulation "junk". His one-man museum is in demand as an exhibit. He also lectures to high school audiences. His appearances are booked through the University of Minnesota Program Service, a division of the De-

make his high school appearances. Recently he visited Centennial High School, Circle Pines, and Simley High School, Inver Grove.

### Castro Sent Flag

How does he get some of his unusual exhibits, such as Castro's autographed battle flag, for example? Simple — he wrote the Cuban dictator and asked for it.

He has various documents bearing signatures of 18 of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, as well as those of British Kings George II, III and IV; plus Queen Victoria and Napoleon Bonaparte. Letters to Olson from all of the United States astronauts appear beside one from their Russian counterpart, Titov.

President Kennedy's assassination stirred interest in a memento of an earlier tragedy—the flag which flew over the Pan American Exposition in Buffalo, N.Y., the day President McKinley was shot in 1901.

### Word Gets Around

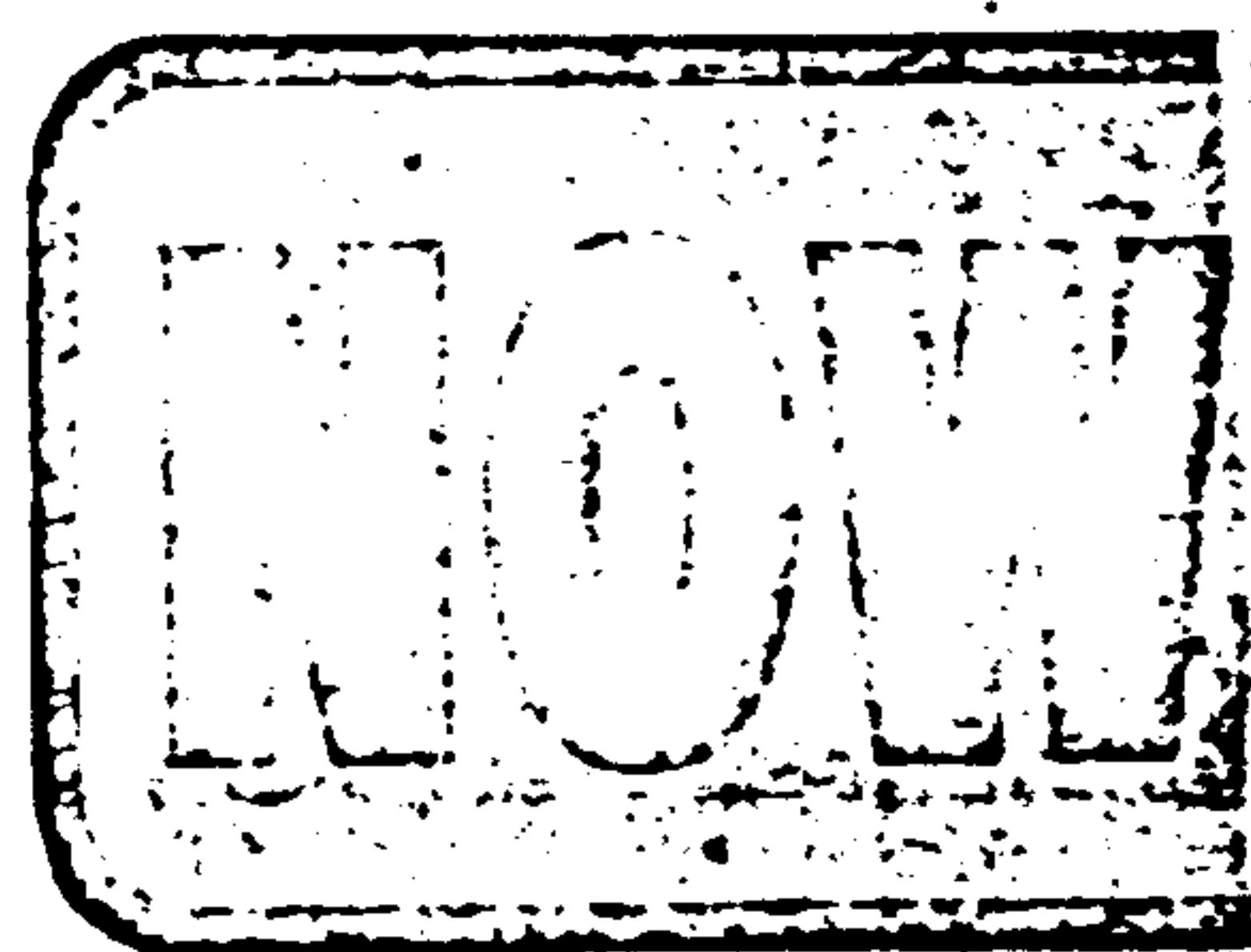
Olson admits he doesn't have to look very hard any more.

# Dog Mixup Solved; Sam Is Flown Home

Washington, Dec. 27 (UPI) — Sam, the misplaced Dachshund, traveling as a diplomatic pooch, returned here from Africa today and like the rest of his mixed-up experiences caught everyone by surprise.

A change of flight plans saw Sam arriving by trans-Atlantic plane from Conakry, Guinea, 2 hours and 20 minutes earlier than expected.

With no one on hand to meet him, Sam was carted unceremoniously from the plane in a red plaid dog cage and kept in an air line office until his master, Maxwell C. Moulton, arrived.

### Wags His Tail

Moulton, along with more newsmen and photographers than normally greet arriving dogs, turned up late. The confusion came about when the Dachshund was shipped by an earlier plane from Conakry to New York to Washington.

When Sam waddled out of the cage, he was greeted by a warm pat and a snuggling by Moulton. Overcome by it all, the dog wiggled and wagged his tail.

Sam got his unplanned trip to Africa last Friday when he

was taken at a dog hospital for Eric, a Dachshund owned by James Loeb, American ambassador to Guinea.

There were some bristling moments when Loeb insisted that it was Eric who had been shipped, not Sam. When the identity was cleared up, the state department went to work to get Sam back home.

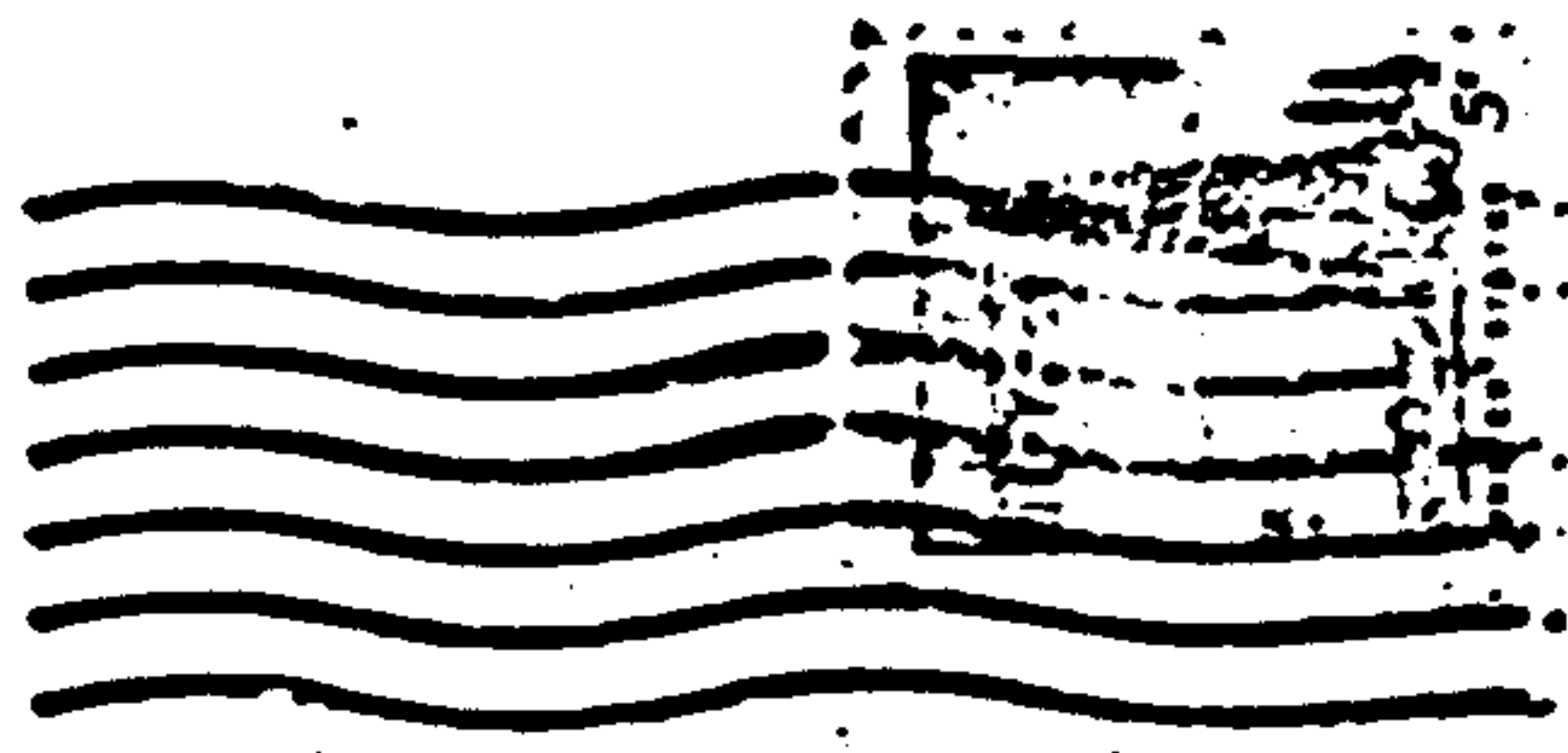
A department official, Philip A. Heller, was on hand at the airport today to oversee the happy ending to the tale of two Dachshunds. He told newsmen the department "was very happy that this problem has been happily resolved."

### "Story Is Closed"

"If we could solve all of the national problems this way, we would certainly be satisfied," he observed with a grin.

Moulton said that as far as he was concerned "the story is closed." "Sam seems to be in fine shape and I'm just glad that he's back."

Asked if he was sure that Sam was Sam and not Eric, he replied "I'm positive." He said that altho the brown Dachshund looked chipper, his next trip would be to the vet for a quick checkup.

## A DOG'S A DOG AND THEREBY HANGS A TALE

Washington, Dec. 24 (UPI)—James Loeb, United States ambassador to Guinea, said today that Sam the dachshund will stay in Africa until he has proof positive that Sam is really who he claims to be, and not Eric, who Loeb thinks he is.

Confused? So is Loeb, and so are Sam and Eric.

The "tale of two dachshunds" began Friday when Sam was shipped to Africa because he looked like Eric, and Eric was given to Sam's owner, who refused to accept him. Understand?

### It Hinges on Wife's Verdict

Well, now the argument stretches over two continents in a triangle involving Loeb, Maxwell C. Moulton, who claims he is Sam's owner, and a confused state department.

In a cablegram today from Conakry, Guinea, Loeb told Moulton: "Will not, repeat, not, send dog until Mrs. Loeb has seen and accepted dog you have." Mrs. Loeb is in Washington.

Said Moulton: "This man is extremely unreasonable." Moulton said he told the state department that "there would seem to be some possibility of a charge such as dognapping."

### Swear Eric's in U. S.

Undersecretary of State for African affairs, G. Mennen Williams, tried to act as a peace negotiator but got snapped at for his trouble. Said Moulton: He had nothing but "words of appeasement. . . . I've heard nothing but words for days."

The state department said Mrs. Loeb has sent a cable to her husband, asking him to return the dog. But Moulton has received no word that Sam is on his way home.

Meanwhile, back at the dog hospital in Washington, six doctors have sworn that Eric is there, and the dog Loeb has is Sam, who only stopped by the hospital to get pills for a nervous condition and had no plans

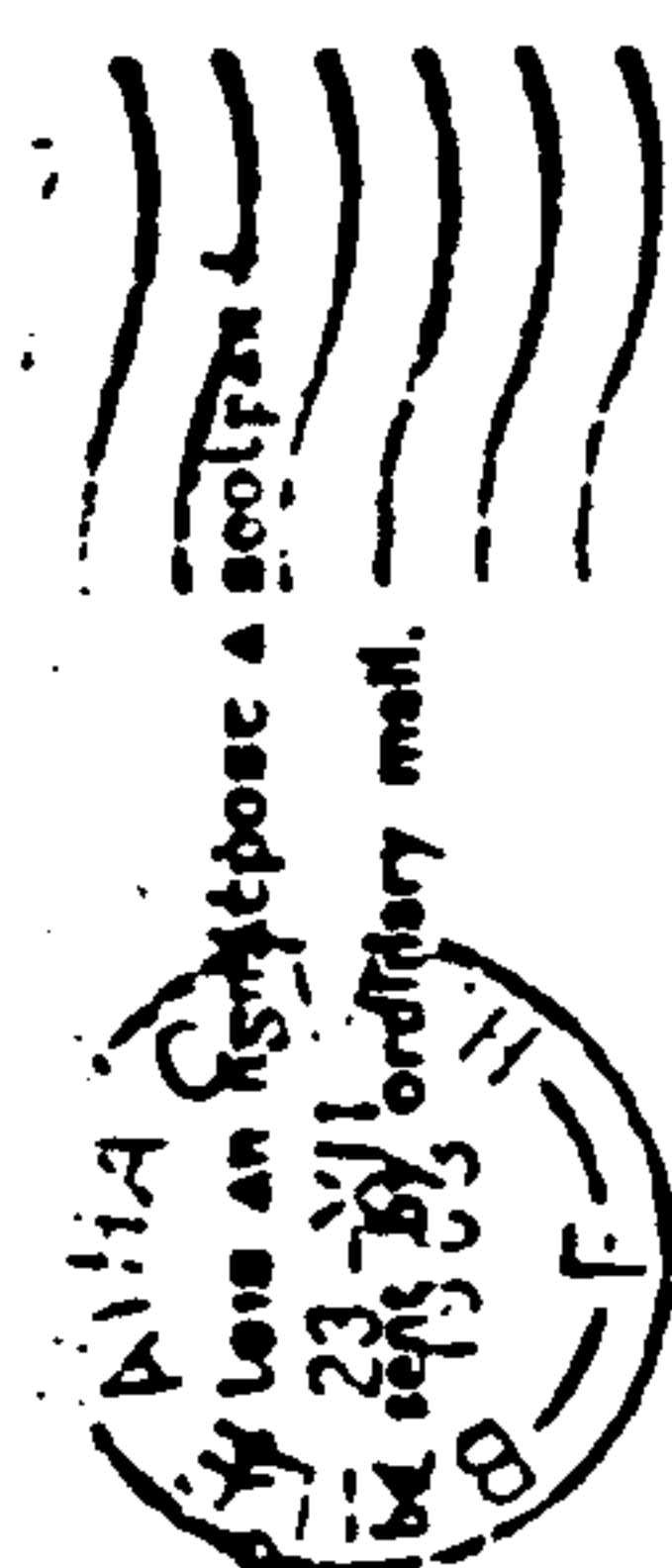

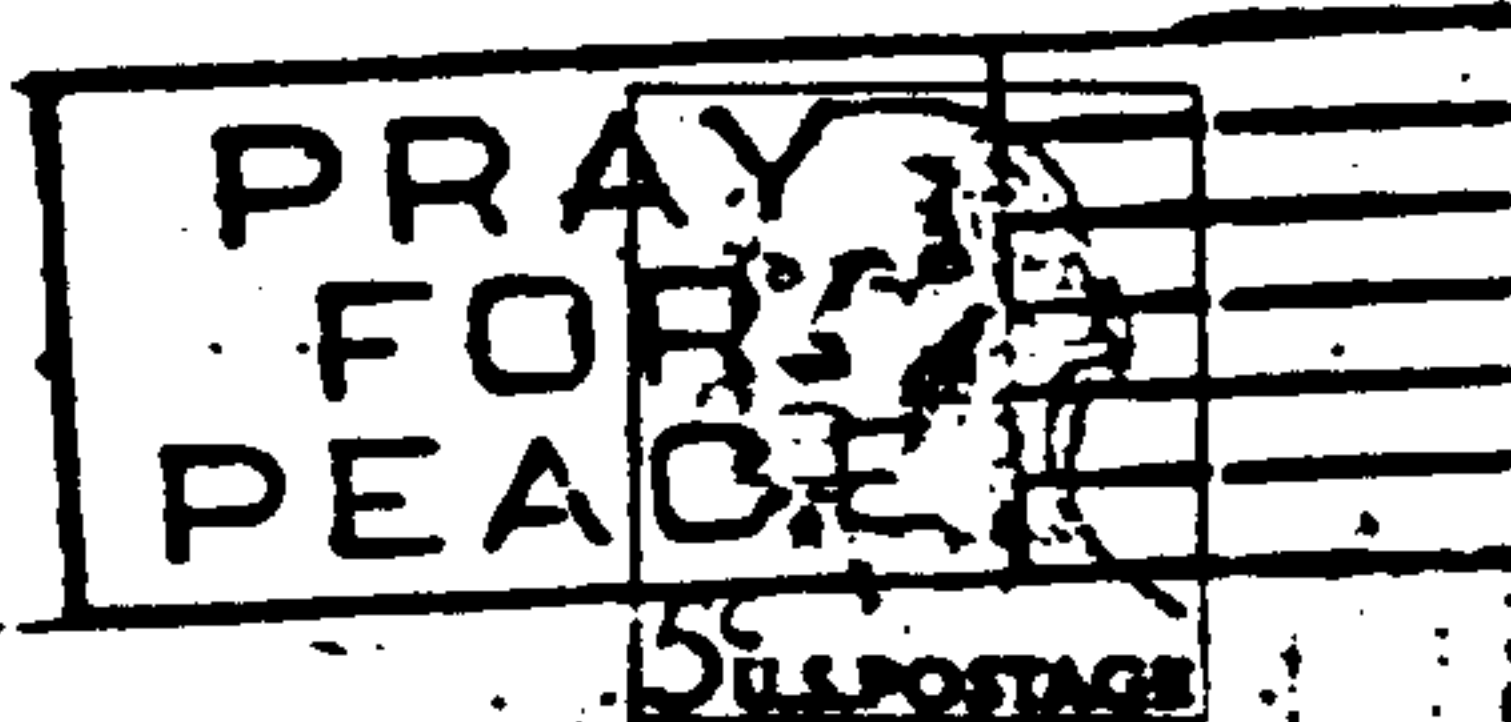
Dear Mr. Ruby,

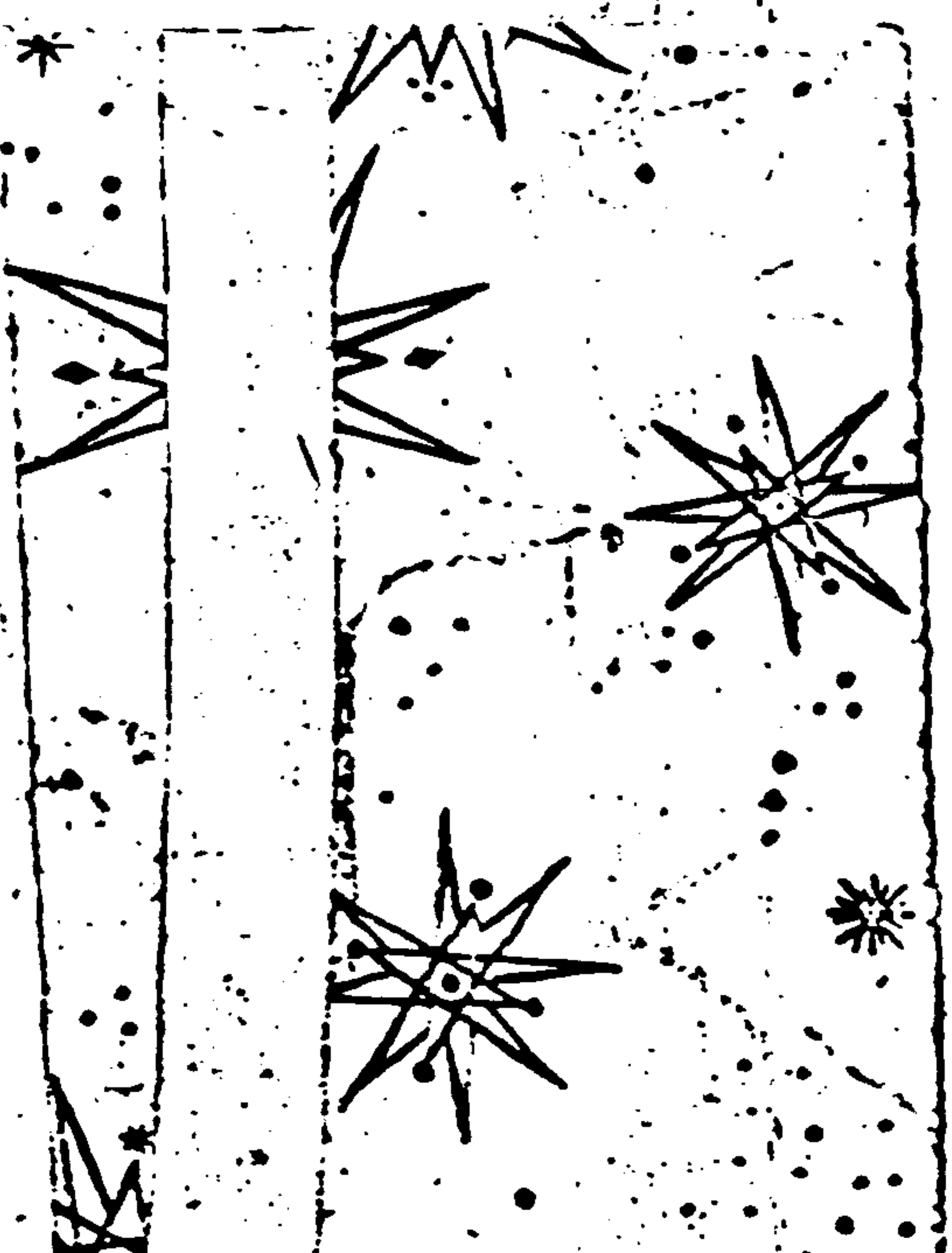

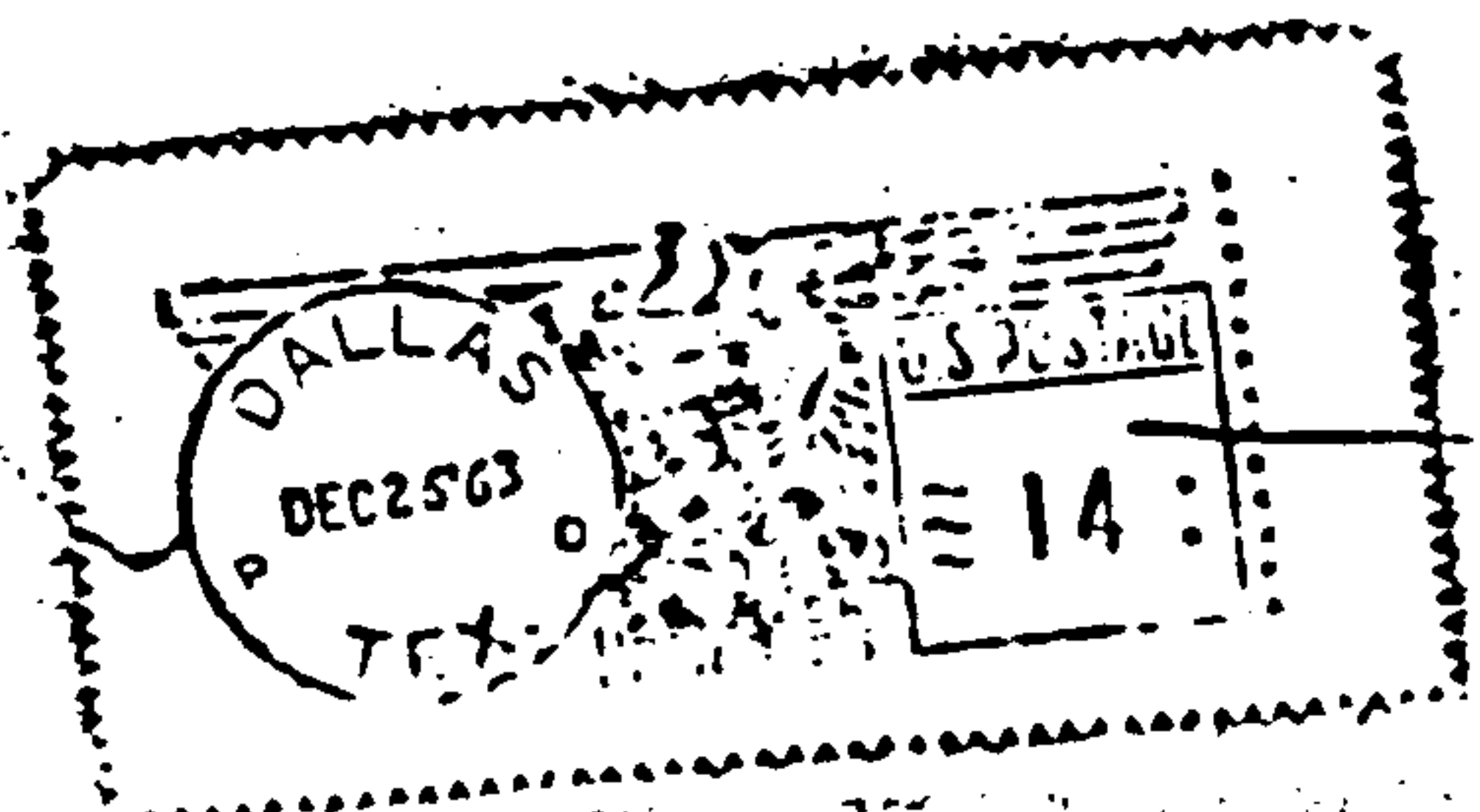

I am not writing to you to pass judgement upon you for the crime you have committed. I am writing and sending you this Testament in hope that you will ask God, through the Lord Jesus Christ, to forgive you for taking another man's life.
