On November 25, 1963, advised SA W. J. WILKINSON, JR., Farmington, H.M., that she once met JACK RUBY in an unknown hotel in Dallas, Texas, many years ago. The informant was unable to recall the hotel or other people during this contact. Informant has never met victim.

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Albuquerque, N.M., who requested his name be maintained in complete confidence, admitted formerly being a bookmaker in Chicago over fifteen years ago. He advised he is acquainted with JACK RUBY, known to him as SPAPKY RUBENSTEIN who lived in the same general area in Chicago. He did not become too well acquainted with SPARKY until they grew up and knew RUBY's father as the "neighborhood drunk."

stable. Stated SPARKY made his living primarily from "scalping" tickets to sports events in the Chicago area and at one time traveled throughout the country selling punch boards which stated was prior to the Senator Kefauver investigations. described the subject as an extremely stubborn person and a publicity hound, therefore, did not think it unusual when newspapers reported that RUBY was more upset over the death of the President than the death of his own father. He stated that he was surprised when SPARKY killed OSWALD, advising that he would think it more proper that RUBY would shoot him in the leg with a .22 in order to get publicity.

did not see SPARMY for more than twenty years until visited Dalias, Texas, about one and a half years ago. He looked up SPARMY, whose Carousel Club is across the street from the Adolphus Ectel and they talked briefly of old times.

knew of no specific connections SPARKY may have had with the Dallas Police Dept., but stated that many policemen knew him and he was well liked. Was not aware of any underworld connections which RUBY may have had and knew of no particular respond for RUBY's leaving Chicago. States SPARKY, to his knowledge, had no extremist or subversive views whatsoever and had no contact with organized criminal or hoodlum element. Supplied that he was not personally acquainted with OSWALD and knew of no connection of OSWALD and RUBY, or any connection which RUBY may have had with the Fair Play for Cuba Committee.

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on 11/25/63, advised SA STUART J. CAMERON at Albuquerque, N.M., that approximately eleven months ago he met JACK RUBY at the Carousel Club in Dallas, Texas. Informant met RUEY through ., and when the informant mentioned that he was from Albuquerque, RUBY advised that at Albuquerque was a good friend. The informant learned through that RUBY came to Dallas, Texas, from Chicago and that a "Jewish boy" had the particular section of town where the Carousel is now located "all sewed up." Informant states RUBY had a difficult time breaking into the area, but that he is now quite well off along with the "Jewish boy," who also has a joint located one block from the Carousel in an upstairs location.

mentioned to that RUBY had a "good in" with the Dallas Police Dept. The informant states this would be borne out from his observation by the fact that RUBY had a B-girl operation where drinks were pushed heavily and they had no interference from the police department. The informant knew of no specific connections with the police department and only personally engaged RUBY in conversation for five to ten minutes. Informant stated he is not aware of any Chicago underworld connections of RUBY or any subversive or extremist connections. He did not know of any relationship between the subject and the Pair Play for Cuba Committee or any association between OSWALD and RUBY.

Files of the Chicago Office reflect the following:

"Chicago Daily Tribune" of December 9, 1939, carried an article stating that JOHN MARTIN, President of the Scrap Iron and Junk Handlers Union Local 20467, AFL, had shet LEON R. COOKE, the attorney for the above union. According to former who was interviewed at that time, the informatic was then in the process of forming a rival union affiliated with time CIO and had written several letters to junk dealers in this regard which he had signed "Cook". MARTIN learned of these letters, assumed he was being double crossed by LEON COOKE, and during an argument between MARTIN and COOKE which ensued, MARTIN shot LEON COOKE. MARTIN then became a fugitive justice. 80 23 South Wollcott, CHAGO, Thurches

advised SA JOHN R. BASS_TT on November 24, 1963 that he had been a close friend of subject RUBY for many years in Chicago. This informant advised that "SPARKY" was hot tempered on occasions, but was generally of a good disposition. He stated that RUBY was an excellent fist fighter. According to this informant, RUBY, in the mid nineteen forty's, operated a "book" over a restaurant located east of Kedzie Avenue on the north side of Roosevelt Road in Chicago. Subject was a close friend of one ABE ZUCKERMAN, also known as "ZUCKIE" (phonetic).

In the middle nineteen forty's, according to the informant, ZUCKERMAN was shot and the informant believed that this occurred because ZUCKERMAN did not cut LEONARD PARTICK, one of Chicago's top hoodlums, in on the profits of his book. Shortly after this shooting, PATRICK told the subject to leave town, accusing him of operating a book without PATRICK's sanction. PATRICK warned the subject that if he did not leave Chicago, he would "get what ZUCKIE got". The subject left Chicago at this time for Dallas, Texas, where he ran a club owned by his sister. Informant advised that he has not been in touch with the subject's action in shooting OSWALD.

Movember 24, 1963, that JACK RUBY had, at one time, been close to ROSS PRIO, Chicago top hoodlum. This informant further advised that RUBY had been a close friend of one JOE SCARAMUZZO who owns a gum shop on Halsted Street near Taylor Street in Chicago.

The Chicago Division records contain no information concerning ABE ZUCKERMAN, also known as "ZUCKIE". The same records reflect that JOSEPH SCARAMUZZO is the owner of Scaramuzzo and Sons Gunshop, 831 South Halsted Street, Chicago, Illinois. It should be noted that three of the four guns used by members of the Nationalist Party of Puerto Rico in the shooting at the House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., on March 1, 1954, were purchased by one WILLIAM GALETTY, Gary, Indiana, from Scaramuzzo and Sons, 801 South Halsted Street, Chicago.

that he believed the subject was related in some manner to one HARRY TILL RUBENSTEIN. The informant advised that HARRY RUBENSTEIN had owned the Hotel Olympic on North Clark Street on Chicago's near North side, approximately fifteen years ago. HARRY RUBENSTEIN killed a man in this hotel, but by a payment of \$25,000.00 to a Chicago Police Captain, was able to fix this charge. According to this informant, HARRY APPROXIMATEIN had good connections with certain unknown criminals in the Chicago area but was not considered by the informant to be a member of the Organized Criminal Element in this city.

It should be noted that the records of the Chicago Police Department reflect one HARRY RUBENSTEIN, a hotel owner on the near North side, as having been sentenced to one year probation on a charge of manslaughter in 1946.

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advised SA JOSEPH G. SHEA on lovember 24, 1963, that the subject was related to HARRY RUBENSTEIN who formerly operated two or these bars in the Chicago loop area. According to the informant, the subject worked as a bartender for HARRY RUBENSTEIN in a bar at the Banker's Building in Chicago-X loop. The informant advised that in 1942 or 1943, JACK RUBENSTEIN attempted to enlist in the United States Navy but was rejected when he failed to pass the physical examination. The informant described JACK RUBENSTEIN as extremely patriotic but moody. This informant was unable to furnish any information concerning HARRY RUBENSTEIN's present whereabouts or activities.

on November 24, 1963, that he does not know the subject.

advised that he had contacted a person known to him, whose identity he would not reveal, who recalled the subject as a friend many years ago in the area around Independence Boulevard and Roosevelt Road in Chicago. According to this source stated that the subject was not connected with the criminal element, Chicago. This source indicated that RUBENSTEIN was good natured but on occasion was extremely hot tempered. According to this source, the subject had left Chicago in the late 1940's for Dallas, Texas, where he operated a club belonging to his sister.

According to this source, the had made an unsuccessful attempt to contact ANTHONY ACCARDO in an effort to obtain information concerning the subject.

It should be noted that ANTHONY ACCARDO is a high ranking member of Chicago's criminal element. Is known to be a close associate of many of Chicago's top echelon criminals and has, in recent years, been active in the management of several ranking prize fighters.

All other Chicago informants negative and Chicago files reflect no information pertaining to subject's involvement with Chicago criminal element.

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was contacted by SA WILLIAM F. ROEMER, on 11/25/63, but at that time had no personal knowledge of RUEY. On 11/26/63, advised that he had solicited information from politicians of the 24th Ward, the former voting residence of RUEY. PC advised that he talked to two persons who appeared to know RUEY from many years ago. They advised that RUEY was never anything but "a punk" and never had any hoodlum connections or associations. One person advised that he recalls that RUEY attempted to sneak into a prize fight in Chicago, believed to be the second DEMPSEY - TUNNEY fight, and was caught by a police officer who beat him over the head with his night stick. As a result of this beating, RUEY now has a plate in his head. Apparently this causes pressure when RUEY becomes excited and causes RUEY to act emotionally.

ADMINISTRATIVE

frequented Clover Bar mext door to Sherman Hotel, Chicago, Illinois, 1946 to 1949. He described this bar as a hangout for the hoodlum element. At that time it was operated by IRA COLITZ who was described as a personal friend of Colonel JACOB ARVEY, a well known Chicago political figure. COLITZ possibly was recently a candidate for Aldermen in Chicago and resides in penthouse apartment on Michigan Boulevard.

The informant related JACK RUBY, whom he identified from newspaper photographs, frequented the Clover Bar in about 1946 or 1947 and was an acquaintance of IRA COLITZ and possibly was a former school mate of COLITZ on the west side of Chicago. He does not know the nature of RUBY's activities in Chicago.

The informant stated that in about December, 1949, he was in Dallas, Texas, at which time RUBY was operating a night club, name unknown, with western band and western motif. The informant visited this club and chatted briefly with RUBY who requested that he convey RUBY's regards to COLITZ when the informant returned to Chicago.

The informant has not seen or heard from RUBY since 1949 and has never had any specific information concerning RUBY's back-ground or activities but has never had any reason to suspect him of being involved in subversive activities.

During that period, RUBY operated the club alone, seemed to be on the premises almost constant but was reportedly residing with mather in a suburban house. BUBY was "a loner" and appeared not to have close associates. The recalls some talk by employees or patrons indicating RUBY might be regarded as "queer". She knew of mo female associates except it was rumored at club that RUBY sometimes dated a waitress employed by him known as "SISSY" or possibly "C. C.", described as WF, about 21, short, slight build, dark hair.

Only other persons considered well acquainted with RUBY were

- 1. GEORGE (LNU), described as WM, 30-35, medium build, dark hair, "Jewish appearance", who told he was contemplating opening a dress shop in Dallas and who frequented the club and often visited RUSY in RUBY's office
- 2. GEORGE (LNU), WM, 45, medium build, grayish hair, who operated some sort of business dealing in novely and gift items, and who was also often in RUBY's office
- 3. WALLY WESTON, encee at Carousel, described as WM, 40, 5'll", slender, medium complexion, brown hair.

Of the above, believes WESTON was closest to RUBY and was believed to have worked as emcee for RUBY for indeterminate time. believes WESTON pays AGVA dues in Dallas but was in Louisville, Ky. about 2 weeks ago for a day or two at Merry-Go-Round Club. While in Dallas, he was believed married to an exotic dancer but has ex-wife and child, location not known. WESTON believed originally from Milwaukee.

claims no gambling or prostitution at Carousel to her knowledge and she knew of no close associates of RUBY among police officers. Although detectives were occasionally in club, a uniformed officer frequently came in at closing time and made sure patrons left.

with subversive groups. She never heard of LEE OSWALD until newspaper publicity of 11/22/63. She was not surprised of hearing that RUBY shot OSWALD since she knew RUBY to be impulsive, quick tempered, over sensitive and at the same time loud, and somewhat of an extrovert. She never saw him with a gun, never heard him threaten anyone, nor did she see or hear of him strike anyone although he frequently argued bitterly with WESTON over details of show.

Available gambling informants, WSTA informants, PD sources and sources familiar with the entertainment field, contacted negatively for information re RUBY, family, friends, background or associates.

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Following investigation conducted telephonically by SA CHILTON B. CREASON, Union Springs, Alabama, on 11/26/63:

Chief of Police THOMAS K. SCROGGINS and Identification Officer Sgt. PAUL BLADES, Phenix City PD, Phenix City, Ala., stated JACK LEON RUBY, aka, completely unknown to police and has no record of local arrest. Both advised Phenix City has no source of strippers since vice cleanup in 1954. Only establishment in Phenix City which now has occasional strippers is MELVIN CHADWICK, operator of Chad's Rose Room. CHADWICK informed all his "strippers" are secured through booking agency in Atanta and that RUBY is unknown to him. M. LAMAR MURPHY, Sheriff, Russell Co., and JOHN HENRY RAST, Deputy Sheriff, Phenix City, stated RUBY was unknown to that office and has no record of arrest. Both confirmed that Phenix City has no supply of "strippers".

who has wide acquaintance among former night club operators, tavern operators and gamblers in Phenix City area stated he is certain RUBY has no close connections in Phenix City and has never operated there. RUBY unknown to informant. Informant confirmed information that Phenix City has no source of "strippers".


Informants of New York Office familiar with gambling activities in New York area have no information concerning JACK LEON RUBY.

The following investigation by Tampa Office:

advised he located address book dated from 1945-48, and noted name NATE GROSSMAN, 5046 N. Troy St., Chicago, Ill. Source stated he is certain NATE GROSSMAN is identical to TINY GROSSMAN mentioned previously.

Source now recalls meeting GROSSMAN in Chicago in 1948 or 1949, and GROSSMAN told him he had spent some time in prison and in same conversation mentioned Flagstaff, Ariz. Informant has hazy recollection that GROSSMAN arrested Flagstaff for Illinois authorities and probably did time in Statesville Prison, outside Chicago.

Source now recalls GROSSMAN tended bar and lived in hotel above bar, located across the street from Croydan Hotel. Croydan located near Black Orchid Lounge, Chicago.

Same source recalls RUBY at one time ran errands for one RAY LEWIS, a furrier, State Lake Building, 190 North State St., Chicago. // LEWIS had a bookie operation on the side and resided Maryland Hotel, Rush and Delaware Streets, Chicago.

Same source also recalls RUBY loitered about a barber shop run by one AL INDES at the corner, or near the corner of Clark Street, and Lake Street, Chicago.

advised 11/25/63 he knew RUBY in Chicago by reputation as ticket scalper along Rush Street and RUBY would do anything for a buck. Source states RUBY not known to hang around racketeers but recalls one TINY GROSSMAN, a cab driver or bartender, Chicago, also a ticket scalper, was close friend of RUBY. Source's knowledge of RUBY dates from 1945 to 1948. Later, source heard GROSSMAN did time at Flagstaff, Ariz., for ticket scalping. Source also recalls one time RUBY badly beaten trying to grash a fight program, Comiskey Park. RUBY dropped out of sight in Chicago, 1948, no one missing him.

Mrs. EVA L. GRANT, sister of JACK RUBY, was interviewed at her residence, 3929 Ravlins Street, Agartment I, Dallas, Texas, on 11/25/63.

As soon as the interviewing Agents announced their identity and while they were still exhibiting their credentials and before being asked one question, GRANT started talking in a rambling manner about various events and newspaper reports and advertisement pertaining to the assassination of President KENNETY and subsequent related events. Mrs. GRANT stated she was very emotionally upset, explaining that "by nature" she is an emotional type person, which condition has been aggravated by recent major surgery and hospitalization, plus the tragic events of the last few days in connection with the death of President KENNEDY and LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

Mrs. GRANT kept talking continuously and each time Agent asked a question in an attempt to get pertinent information and conduct interview in some logical sequence, GRANT would raise her hand and start talking louder, indicating she did not want to be interrupted. She stated on three or four occasions the taking of notes by the Agents was extremely annoying to her and, after approximately an hour, in a very positive manner, she instructed that no more notes be taken. It appeared to the Agents that GRANT was making a sincere effort to cooperate, but she was in an extremely nervous and emotional state. She was interviewed in the presence of Mrs. PAULINE HALL, a close personal friend, at Mrs. GRANT's specific insistence.

The following investigation was conducted by SAS DEL D. DRAKE and JOE A. COPELAND.

AT EMORY, TEXAS

BERT MC KEOWN, Rains County Sheriff, SAM BRAZIEL, Rains County Judge, and BUSTER FLEMING, Post Master, all considered perfectly reliable and friends of the Bureau, advised November 25, 1963 that I. T. (TROY) RUCKLEY is a former Texas Ranger who served during the term of JIMMY ALLRED, Governor of the State of Texas in the 1930's. RUCKLEY was fired for some unknown reason and has been working for himself as an oil lease man in and around Emory, Texas.

RUCKLEY likes to consider himself a law enforcement officer and, if given any encouragement, will volunteer his services as an under-cover man.

It should be noted that at the time of interview of RUCKLEY, it was the opinion of the interviewing agents that RUCKLEY was and, according to Sheriff MC KEOWN, RUCKLEY is seldom seen in around Emory.

It will also be noted that RUCKLEY advised the interviewing agents that he was

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Assistant WILLIAM F. ALEXATDER sivised that District Attorney HENRY WADE had gone to Bounton, Texas.

ALEXANDER aivised he had been present when RUEY's case had been presented to the Grand Jury. He stated that Detective JIM LEAVELIE, who was on the right side of OSWALD at the time OSWALD was killed, told the Grand Jury what he knew. Detective C. M. DECRITY told what he observed from the car which was located at the end of the hallway where DECRITY was waiting.

ALEXANDER further sivised that the whole presentment did not take over three or four minutes. None of the grand processed any questions and no other evidence of any kind was presented.



CIVIL RIGHTS

JACK L. RUBY, W/M/A, born JACK RUBENSTEIN, 3/25/11, Chicago, Illinois, (not verified in vital statistics), Dallas, Texas, night club operator, fired one shot from .38 caliber revolver at close range into left side of stomach of LEE HARVEY OSWALD at approximately 11:24 AM, 11/24/63, on premises of Dallas, Texas, City Hall. OSWALD had been held without bond since his arrest, 11/22/63, charged with assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, attempted slaying of Governor JOHN CONKALLY of Texas, and murder of J. D. TIPPIT, Dallas Police Officer, all of which occurred 11/22/63. OSWALD died at Parkland Hospital, Dallas, 1:07 PM, 11/24/63, without regaining consciousness. Shooting occurred in basement area of City Hall during process of transfer of OSWALD to Dallas County Jail. Shooting witnessed by numerous police officers, newsmen, filmed on TV. RUBY seized immediately, being held in Dallas County Jail under State indictment returned 11/26/63, charging him with OSWALD's murder. Plans of Dallas PD to remove OSWALD to Dallas County Jail morning of 11/24/63, received publicity through news media, based on releases of information attributed to Dallas police officials. Anonymous calls received by Dallas FBI and Dallas County SO, early AM, 11/24/63, caller stating group would "kill the man that killed the President"; Dallas PD officials advised. Police authorities proceeded according to plan; state every effort made for appropriate safeguards, but security failed; police investigation under way. RUBY states was in highly emotional state because of President's assassination, had not known OSWALD, conspired with no one; states put loaded revolver in pocket on leaving residence morning of 11/24/63, parked car near Western Union Office, sent telegram, and walked to City Hall,

entered area restricted to police and newsmen without press card. States had not intended to shoot OSWALD when he entered pertinent area, that shooting was "compulsive act" and in "moment of insanity". Officers and newsmen interviewed by FBI disclaim knowledge RUBY was in area until shooting, and state cannot account for his evading security measures. Numerous persons, including relatives, state RUBY highly emotional; associates and employees state he is impulsive, high-tempered, has resorted to violence on several occasions without provocation, suspected of homosexuality. Mother had long history of mental illness preceding death. RUBY has claimed has steel plate in head, relatives state have no knowledge such condition exists. No connection between RUBY and OSWALD established.

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DETAILS

Investigation was instituted on receipt of information at approximately 11:24 AM, on Movember 24, 1963, that an individual, subsequently identified as JACK L. BUBY, had shot LEE HARVEY OSWALD or premises of the Dallas City Hall, which houses the Dallas Police Department.

LEE HARVEY OSWALD had been taken into custody by the Dallas Police Department on November 22, 1963. He was held in the Dallas City Jail, charged with the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, the attempted murder of Governor JOHN CONNALLY of Texas, and the murder of J. D. TIPPIT, Dallas Police Officer, all of which occurred on November 22, 1963.

Chief of Police JESSE CURRY of the Dallas, Texas, Police Department, was advised by Assistant Special Agent in Charge KYLE G. CLARK on November 24; 1963, that the President of the United States had requested that we conduct an investigation in this matter.
