JAY (NMI) BISHOV, Attorney, 6060 North Ridge, business address 5152 North Clark, Chicago, Illinois, advised he visited Havana, Cuba for three or four days about the first of September, as it was the Labor Day weekend in 1950. BISHOV stated he was with two other companions, a JACK MARCUS and SHERWIN BRAUN, both of Chicago, Illinois.

BISHOV stated that the second or third night in Havana, Cuba, he, BRAUN and MARCUS were standing near a crap table or roulette wheel at the Tropicana night club when a man approached and introduced himself by a name which BISHOV believed was JACK RUBY. RUBY asked where the three men were from and when BISHOV stated he was from the West Side of Chicago, Illinois, RUBY stated that he was also from that section of Chicago, Illinois, but had moved to Dallas, Texas some years before. BISHOV stated RUBY did not specify any particular street names or individuals with whom he had been acquainted in Chicago, Illinois.

BISHOV stated JACK RUBY extended an invitation to the three men to visit him at one of his night clubs in Dallas, Texas. BISHOV stated he was under the impression RUBY owned more than one night club in Dallas, Texas and indicated that these clubs were somewhat plush.

BISHOV stated RUBY appeared to know his way around the Tropicana night club, Havana, Cuba and may have been familiar with some of the employees. BISHOV stated the conversation lasted only about ten minutes and nothing other than the above casual comments were made. BISHOV stated no radical political type statements were made nor was there any indication RUBY belonged to any particular organizations. BISHOV stated he did not know how long RUBY had been in Havana, Cuba, where he was staying nor when he was supposed to return to the United States.

BISHOV stated he was not sure of the name nor of the picture appearing in the daily newspaper, that it was identical to the JACK RUBY he met in Cuba but described this individual as a white male American, of average build, 5'7" - 6', 165 - 200 pounds, dark hair, with a "Jewish appearance", and was in his mid or late forties. BISHOV stated RUBY was an extrovert and loud talker but appeared to be friendly.

Records of Validation and Denial of Validation for travel to Cuba checked re subject with negative results. Check was made of records of Swiss Protection Passports issued to American citizens who were in Cuba and desired to return to the United States, but no record of subject could be located.

Mr. DONALD J. SIMON, Records Management Research, State Department, advised SA HASER the post files sent to Washington, D. C., from American Embassy at Havana, Cuba, contain no indices but he and his staff had checked all logical boxes of these records re subject with negative results.

Miss CARROLL also advised that there was no record of LEE HARVEY OSWALD in the records for Validation and Denial of Validation for travel to Cuba and no record of him in the files concerning Swiss Protection Passports, issued to American citizens desiring to return to United States since January, 1961.

On November 24, 1963, information was received that JACK RUBY had been a guest of the Sheraton Lincoln Hotel, Houston, Texas, three days prior to the arrival of Governor CONNALLY, date not specified.

The following investigation was conducted by SA LEVERETTE A. BAKER on November 25, 1963:

Folio No. 54280 reflects registration on May 9, 1963, for JACK RUBY, 1312 $\frac{1}{2}$ Commerce, Dallas, Texas, for "Day Use" only of Room 2608, and charges for unidentifiable local telephone calls. This is the only registration for RUBY located and employees of the hotel acquainted with RUBY state this was his only visit at hotel.

AL DEAN, Sheraton Lincoln, recalls JACK RUBY and stated RUBY's purpose for visit was to contact CANDY BARR, notorious stripper, to give her a dog. DEAN also stated JACK RUBY made a practice of "hustling" bell hops in hotels to get customer referrals to his clubs.

FRANK SMARK, Bell Captain, Sheraton Lincoln, formerly of Dallas, advised he was acquainted with name JACK RUBY in Dallas and had met him one time many months ago in Houston when he was guest of Sheraton Lincoln Hotel, but denies any knowledge of acquaintances or associates. He denied RUBY made a practice of "hustling" bell hops for customer referrals. He recalls RUBY's trip to Houston in May, 1963, was for the purpose of giving CANDY BARR a dog.

Records of the Sheraton Lincoln Hotel reflect Governor CONNALLY was a guest of the hotel on November 21-22, 1963; however, he was not a guest of the hotel at any time during May, 1963.

Mr. AL DEAN, Sheraton-Lincoln Hotel, advised that folio number 54280 reflects on May 9, 1963 one JACK RUBY, 1312½ Commerce, Dallas, Texas, had registered and obtained room number 2608 for "day use" only and charges to this account were for the room and for unidentifiable local telephone calls.

Mr. DEAN advised this is the only registration for RUBY located.

Mr. DEAN advised that Governor CONNALLY of Texas was a guest of the hotel on November 21-22, 1963, however, he was not a guest of the hotel at any time during May, 1963.

Mr. DEAN stated that JACK RUBY had said the purpose of his visit in May, 1963 was to contact CANDY BARR, a notorious stripper, to give her a dog. He also stated that JACK RUBY made the practice of "hustling" bell hops in hotels to get customer referrals for his clubs.

Mr. DEAN has no further information or knowledge concerning JACK RUBY.

SMART denied any knowledge of acquaintances or associates of JACK RUBY and denied that RUBY made the practice of "hustling" bell hops for customer referrals. He recalls RUBY's trip to Houston in May, 1963 was for the purpose of giving CANDY BARR, a notorious stripper, a dog.

SMART stated that this occasion, in May, 1963, was the only time that he has ever seen JACK RUBY at the hotel, Sheraton-Lincoln.

LEON CORNMAN, Branch Manager, American Guild of Variety Artists (AGVA), 1107 Maison Blanch Building, New Orleans, advised that he recalled that he was contacted by a white male who identified himself as JACK RUBY, operator of the Carousel, Dallas, Texas. At this time of contact which was while on Bourbon Street, RUBY was alone and advised CORNMAN that he, RUBY was interested in obtaining the services of JADA (JEANETTE CONFORTO) who was then working at the Sho Bar on Bourbon Street. CORNMAN advised he does not specifically recall the date of contact but it was just three to five days prior to her terminating her contract with the Sho Bar and he has no way to specifically identify this date. He advised that JACK RUBY was alone at this time and he received no information as to his mode of travel to and from New Orleans or where he may have been staying at the time he was in New Orleans. RUBY indicated that in addition to being interested in hiring JADA, he was also interested in any of the show girls who may want to go to work for him in the Carousel in Dallas, Texas.

During this contact JACK RUBY presented one of his business cards for the Carousel which listed the address of the Carousel as corner of Field and Commerce, with telephone number RI 7-2362. On the reverse side of this card RUBY wrote his name in ink "JACK RUBY" with notation "WH 1-5601 home". CORNMAN advised he believed this was the home telephone of RUBY in Dallas, Texas.

Mr. CORNMAN advised he has had no further contact with RUBY nor is he able to identify any of the club owners or entertainers with whom RUBY may have had contact while in New Orleans. CORNMAN suggested that since he understands that JADA did go to work for JACK RUBY a short while after leaving the Sho Bar, he believed the date of contract with the Carousel could be obtained from the Branch Manager of the AGVA, TOM PALMER, 1500 Jackson Street, Room 510, Inter-Urban Building, Dallas, Texas, telephone number RI 2-8292. He believes that this contact would probably be able to give the approximate date that JACK RUBY was in the New Orleans area.

PAUL CASCIO, Manager of the Blue Angel Club, 231 Bourbon Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised Special Agents JAMES E. SCHMIDT, JR., and FRANK A. SASS, JR., that approximately six months ago an individual identifying himself as JACK RUBY, owner of the Carousel Lounge, Dallas, Texas, came to the Hotsy Totsy Bar, located at 232 Bourbon Street, where he was working as a bartender. RUBY introduced himself and claimed to be inquiring in New Orleans as to the amount of money paid to "strippers" on Bourbon Street in New Orleans. After getting a general idea of the amount of money being paid these girls and after being referred to "JADA", a dancing girl at the 500 Club on Bourbon Street, he apparently made some contact and tried to contact this "stripper".

CASCIO had no knowledge of any further contact that RUBY had with anyone in any of the other clubs on Bourbon Street.

He stated that he saw RUBY on only one occasion in the evening and at that time he was alone and no conversation ensued other than that concerning strippers.

MORICI advised that he does not remember ever having seen JACK RUBY from the Carousel Lounge, Dallas, Texas, in the Sho-Bar. He had heard, however, that RUBY had come into the bar and talked to the individual who at that time was night manager, NICK GRAFFAGNINI, regarding the possibility of hiring JADA for his club in Dallas. MORICI was shown a photograph of RUBY and again stated that he had never seen the man.

HOWARD said he did not speak to RUBY, but he did see him talking to NICK GRAFFAGNINI who at that time was night manager. He said after RUBY had gone he had asked GRAFFAGNINI who the fellow was and GRAFFAGNINI had shown him a card which stated the fellow was JACK RUBY from the Carousel Lounge, Dallas, Texas. NICK GRAFFAGNINI, 3562 Vincennes, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised that JACK RUBY came into the Sho-Bar a few days before JEANETTE CONFORTO (JADA) completed her engagement and wanted to know how he could go about hiring JADA for a club he had in Dallas, Texas. GRAFFAGNINI said he told him he did not handle the hiring or signing of contracts with the entertainers and he sent him to the 500 Club on Bourbon Street. He said at the time RUBY spoke to him he was alone and he had never seen him before, nor has he seen him since. GRAFFAGNINI said RUBY gave him a card with his name on it and the name Carousel Lounge, Dallas, Texas also on it. GRAFFAGNINI said he did not speak further to RUBY and he has no idea where RUBY may have stayed while in New Orleans, nor does he know how RUBY came to New Orleans and returned to Dallas.

CARACI recalled that one night, probably in June, he and NICK CARNO, his partner, were in his office when his night manager, CLEEVE DUGAS, came into the office and said there was a man who ran the Carousel Club in Dallas out in front who wanted to talk to CARACI about hiring some dancers. He told DUGAS to tell this man that he knew of no dancers available other than CONFORTO. He told DUGAS to tell this person to go to the Sho-Bar and talk to CONFORTO. CARACI stated that neither he nor CARNO met this individual and he had concluded that this individual actually was RUBY since he has read in the newspapers and heard on television that RUBY operated the Carousel Club. CARACI said he did not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD and had never heard of him before the assassination of the President.

CLEEVE DUGAS, Night Manager, 500 Club, Bourbon Street, New Orleans, stated JANET M. CONFORTO is identical to JADA, a well known stripper formerly of Bourbon Street, New Orleans and who departed the New Orleans area approximately six months ago. On the PM of November 24, 1963, he saw a television program from Dallas during which JADA appeared and was described as working for JACK LEON RUBY at the Carousel Lounge in Dallas.

DUGAS stated JADA used to work for him and in about August of 1962 JACK LEON RUBY had been in New Orleans two different times over about a three week period, making business inquiries concerning strippers to utilize at his Carousel Club. At that time he had inquired about hiring JADA.

DUGAS said that while RUBY was in New Orleans it was apparently a business trip and he knew of no difficulties RUBY might have had. He said he is familiar with photographs of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and at no time while RUBY was in New Orleans did he see OSWALD and RUBY together.

DUGAS stated that the only other place RUBY inquired of him was an inquiry as to whether strippers might be available at a cheaper price in Phenix, Alabama.

She stated that on November 14, 1963 at about 1:00 PM a man came into the motel and said he was on his way to Dallas, Texas. He did not indicate from where he had come. This man told Mrs. BURGESS he was an old friend of PETE GUARISCO and he had not seen him in years. Mrs. BURGESS said she remembered the date because she told the man that Mr. GUARISCO was at a luncheon in the Hub Club in Morgan City. She said she was busy and did not recall the man's name. He appeared to be very friendly and asked about the growth of Morgan City. She described the man as dark complexioned, age 50, height 5'8", weight 200 lbs., color of hair unknown, but temples of his head were bald.

Mrs. BURGESS said she saw the picture of JACK RUBY on the television and in the newspaper. She felt that this man who appeared at the motel on November 14, 1963 was JACK RUBY.

PHILLIP P. MILLER, 1122 Apartment D, Central Park Place, advised he is the owner of Phil's Delicatessens, located at 3531 Oaklawn, Dallas, Texas, and at 1111 Central Expressway, Dallas, Texas. Mr. MILLER advised he has known JACK RUBY for approximately eleven years, as RUBY has been a good customer during that period of time and has frequented his business establishments. He advised he has never had any social relationships with JACK RUBY, but from all of his observations of Mr. RUBY when RUBY happened to be in one of his places of business, RUBY seemed to be a very fine person. He advised Mr. RUBY was a regular church-goer and a member of the Shearith Israel Synagogue on Douglas Street, Dallas. He advised he has never observed Mr. RUBY in the company of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, and he, MILLER, has never met OSWALD.

Mr. MILLER advised he does not know any of the political beliefs of JACK RUBY and could furnish no information as to background or associates other than the above.

Mr. MILLER advised he was not in his Oak Lawn Store on the night of November 22, 1963, but had been at his Oak Lawn Store on the night of November 21, 1963, at which time JACK RUBY was in the store. He said he did not talk with RUBY and as best he could recall, RUBY was by himself or possibly with his sister, EVA GRANT. He advised he could not say for sure, however, because he was very busy at the time and recalls only the fact that RUBY was in the store for a few moments.

At 2:07 PM, CURT HANS ~~LECHER~~, Continental Apartments, Apartment 308, who is a waiter at the Dallas Cabana, under Bell Captain RAUL ORTIZ, stated JACK RUBENSTEIN, also known to him as JACK RUBY, was at the Bon Vivant Room, Dallas Cabana, on the night of November 21, 1963, at about midnight following the floor show. He stated RUBENSTEIN was in the process of being introduced to Mr. MARTIN, MARTINI or MARTILIS, who was a guest at the hotel when he became irritated about the fact he had not received a message regarding a telephone call earlier in the night while he was in the Bon Vivant Room.

LECHER stated he did not know the association between RUBENSTEIN and the person to whom he was being introduced; however, he felt that in view of the developments concerning the shooting of the President and the Governor of Texas by LEE HARVEY OSWALD that he immediately contacted ORTIZ, as he felt RUBENSTEIN and OSWALD may be associated and that information he was furnishing may be of some value to the FBI, particularly since he had learned from a television newscast that RUBENSTEIN had just shot OSWALD.

HUGH AINSWORTH, Reporter, Dallas Morning News, called and said he has known JACK LEON RUBY for a long time and RUBY had been observed by him around the Dallas Morning News building about noon, November 22, 1963. Also, RUBY was seen there by other employees of the newspaper but was missed for a period of about 20 to 25 minutes and AINSWORTH had no information as to where RUBY had gone during this interval of time, nor did other employees.

Shortly after having been missed, people began to come to the office of the newspaper announcing the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY, and RUBY appeared shortly thereafter and feigned surprise at this announcement and gave some show of emotion over the news that had been received.

AINSWORTH advised in view of the fact the Dallas Morning News building is removed only about four blocks from the point where the Presidential Motorcade passed, he could not understand why if RUBY had a love and devotion to the President as he claims he has, he had not walked this short distance for the purpose of seeing the President pass by.

MARGUERITE VEA RIEGLER, in care of Smith Hall, SMU, Dallas, Texas, advised that on Friday night, November 22, 1963, she was at Phil's Delicatessen, 3531 Oak Lawn, Dallas, Texas, in the company of RITA SILVERMAN, a friend, BILL NICHOLS, DENNIS MARTIN and BOB SINDELOR (phonetic), sophomores at SMU. She advised that they went to Phil's Delicatessen at approximately 10:30 p.m. to have a coke and as they were sitting at their table a man walked up to the table and took their newspaper. The man opened the newspaper, began looking at it and very rudely asked if he might look at their paper to which they replied, "Yes". She advised he looked at the amusement section of the newspaper and immediately went to a telephone located approximately 25 to 30 feet from where they were sitting and dialed a number. She advised none of the group paid any attention, and she could not state whether or not he actually talked on the telephone but that approximately ten minutes later he returned to their table and again asked if he might look at the paper. Miss RIEGLER stated permission was again given and he repeated his former action and about ten minutes later again returned to the table this time somewhat embarrassed and pointed out to them in the paper advertisements for the Carousel and Vegas Clubs. He asked them if they knew of these clubs and stated that he was the owner of the clubs. He made conversation concerning some musicians who had played at the clubs and then proceeded to make a third telephone call. She said that after he finished the third telephone call he returned to the table to talk with one of the boys in the group about musicians who had played at the club. As he left the table he turned to the front page of the paper which was covered with news and photographs concerning the shooting of President KENNEDY and made the remark, "Wasn't that a horrible thing". Miss RIEGLER advised that on Sunday when the news concerning the murder of LEE HARVEY OSWALD was broadcast on television she immediately recognized the photograph of JACK RUBY as being the person who had been at Phil's Delicatessen on Friday night and talked with her and her company. She said while he was at the delicatessen RUBY was alone but appeared to be very familiar with the store and with the persons working in the store. She described him as appearing as though he were at home.

Miss RIEGLER advised she could furnish no information concerning the telephone calls or attempted telephone calls made by RUBY.

Detective ~~RICHARD E. SIMS~~, Homicide & Robbery Bureau, Dallas Police Department, residence, 8483 Sweetwater Drive, Dallas, Texas, was contacted for the purpose of verifying a telephone call JACK RUBY claimed to have been made to Detective SIMS during the evening of November 22, 1963.

Detective SIMS recalled answering the telephone in the Homicide & Robbery Bureau, Dallas Police Department, during the evening of November 22, 1963, on one occasion, when the person calling said, "This is JACK RUBY. I know you are busy. I've got some sandwiches for you." SIMS said he told RUBY the Homicide & Robbery Bureau Officers had already eaten (in relays) and that the sandwiches would not be needed. He recalled he thanked RUBY and that RUBY said, "Alright."

SIMS said he did not recall RUBY mentioning anything about Radio Station KUIF, Dallas, during the conversation, and he (SIMS) did not know what disposition RUBY made of the sandwiches. SIMS advised, however, he gained the definite impression during the course of the telephone conversation that RUBY had already bought the sandwiches and had them with him at the time he made the call to the Homicide & Robbery Bureau. He further related that RUBY gave no information as to his whereabouts at the time he made the above telephone call.

SIMS advised it is his best recollection the above telephone conversation with RUBY occurred sometime between 9:00 PM and 10:30 PM, November 22, 1963. He said it is also his definite recollection this call was made sometime prior to taking LEE HARVEY OSWALD to an assembly room in the Dallas Police Department Headquarters for a "show-up," attended by Dallas County District Attorney HENRY WADE, law enforcement officers, and representatives of the press, radio and television media. SIMS said he helped escort OSWALD to the assembly room where the above "show-up" was held; however, he does not recall seeing RUBY during the time he was escorting OSWALD to the assembly room. He said, in fact, he does not recall seeing RUBY in or about the premises of the Dallas Police Department at any time Friday night, November 22, 1963. SIMS volunteered, however, it would have been quite possible for RUBY to be somewhere around the Dallas Police Department Friday night, November 22, 1963, without his, SIMS, having seen RUBY.

SIMS volunteered he knows RUBY by sight, and has known him

 His residence is 1424 Plowman Street, Dallas, Texas, telephone number Whitehall 6-1590. He is employed as a disc jockey at KLIF radio station, 2104 Jackson Street, Dallas. McCURDY advised there are four telephone lines leading into the radio station at night. One, Riverside 7-6000, called the contest line. It is well known to the public although not listed. Number two and three lines, Riverside 7-9039 and Riverside 7-9030, are known as hot lines and known only to station personnel and news in the area. Number four, Riverside 7-9319 is known as "Jock line" and known to the disc jockeys and all personnel of the station relative of station employees and a few select friends of station employees.

McCURDY advised when a call comes in over Riverside 7-9319, there is a large white light flashes over the console or control board, this being in the disc jockeys room.

He advised that on the morning of November 23, 1963 at about 1:00 A.M. this jock line rang and McCURDY answered. The caller said, "Are you RUSS", believed to have reference to RUSSELL MOIRE (RUSS KNIGHT), another disc jockey who works from 7:00 P.M. to 12:00 midnight. McCURDY advised he informed the caller of his identity and the caller identified himself saying, "This is JACK RUBY and I have some sandwiches and drinks for the guys at the station". McCURDY stated he told RUBY to wait at the front door at the foot of the stairs which is kept locked. McCURDY advised that some 15 or 20 minutes later, he ran down stairs and opened the front door and RUBY was waiting with sandwiches and drinks. He advised RUBY accompanied him upstairs to the control room and news room. He advised the sandwiches and drinks were taken into the news room which adjoins the disc jockey room or control room, operated by McCURDY.

RUSSELL MOORE (RUSS KNIGHT), disc jockey, who works the 7:00 P.M. to midnight shift and had just gone off duty; First Name Unknown PAPPAS, newsman for WNEW, Radio, New York City, New York.

McCURDY advised he talked to RUBY less than five minutes during which time RUBY expressed how sorry he was that the President got killed and said "I'm going to close up until Monday because of all this". McCURDY advised RUBY stated "I had rather lose \$12,000 to \$15,000 than not be able to live with myself later on".

McCURDY advised that this ended his conversation with RUBY, that he re-entered the disc jockey room. McCURDY advised that RUBY seemed to be slightly upset and stood looking at the floor, however, did not seem to be extremely emotional. He advised RUBY was dressed in a business suit and wearing a hat. He noted nothing unusual about his body that would indicate he was wearing a gun and he saw no gun.

McCURDY advised RUBY visited and talked with the other individuals in the news room but he has no idea as to their conversation. He advised RUBY was at the station for about one or one and one-half hours. McCURDY believed that RUBY's express purpose was to bring them something to eat. He advised, however, RUBY has never, to his knowledge, been at the station before nor since. He advised he had met RUBY one time before, some weeks ago at RUBY's club. So far as McCURDY known, RUBY is not a personal friend of anyone at the station.

McCURDY advised he had no idea how RUBY obtained the telephone number at the station as none of the above mentioned numbers are listed in the telephone directory. He advised that the listed or public telephone number of the station is Riverside 7-9311.

GLEN DUNCAN, News Announcer, **KLIF**, Dallas, Texas, advised he was on duty the evening of November 22, and early morning of November 23, 1963, and recalls receiving two telephone calls from **JACK RUBY** sometime during the early morning of November 23, 1963, probably between 1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. He stated **RUBY** said he was going to bring some sandwiches over to the station and inquired as to whether they wanted to interview **HENRY WADE**, District Attorney Dallas concerning the **OSWALD** case and indicated he would endeavor to locate **WADE** and put him in touch with **DUNCAN**. He stated **RUBY** indicated he was at the Police Station and apparently **HENRY WADE** was there also. He stated in the second telephone call **RUBY** put **WADE** on the phone and **DUNCAN** taped an interview with **WADE**. He stated shortly after these calls, **RUBY** came to the station with sandwiches and soft drinks. He stated he had never met **RUBY** before and would describe his condition as being animated about **OSWALD** being charged with the assassination of the President and the fact that the evidence was shaping up. He stated he knows nothing about the background, associates or activities of **RUBY**.

DUNCAN stated it is his understanding that when **RUBY** first called on the early morning of November 23, 1963, he had obtained the telephone number which is a semi-private line from **DANNY McCURDY**, Aka., Danny Patrick, who was on duty at the radio station at the phone number listed in the Dallas Telephone Directory for **KLIF**.

DUNCAN stated **RUBY** did not ask for or receive a press pass from him or from Station **KLIF** to his knowledge.

RUSSELL LEE MOORE, Aka., Russ Knight, the man with the "weird beard", disc jockey, KLIF Radio Station, Dallas, Texas, residence 2715 Barnes Bridge Road, telephone DA 10467, advised that he has been acquainted with JACK RUBY for a year and a half in connection with the handling of RUBY's radio advertising of the Carousel Club. He stated he does not know RUBY and knows of no associates other than GEORGE SENATOR, whom he met on one occasion and presumes he works with RUBY at the Carousel Club.

MOORE stated he was on duty on the late evening of November 22, 1963 and early morning hours of November 23, 1963, at the radio station KLIF and GLEN DUNCAN told him he received a telephone call from JACK RUBY who asked him if he was interested in an interview with District Attorney HENRY WADE and indicated that he was calling from the Police Department and would endeavor to locate WADE for DUNCAN. MOORE stated that he immediately departed for the Police Department in an effort to contact HENRY WADE and upon arrival to the Police Department, learned that WADE had already made a statement to the press and had supposedly left. MOORE stated that RUBY walked up to him in the Police Department and told him WADE was in the basement of the Police Department and directed him to WADE. MOORE stated he talked to WADE momentarily and when he got through, RUBY was gone. He stated that he returned to the radio station at approximately 1:45 a.m., November 23, 1963, and RUBY was there and had brought sandwiches and soft drinks to the station. He stated he does not recall specifically what RUBY had to say, but recalls he was grieving for the KENNEDY family. He stated he recalls that RUBY handed him a speech and said, "read this and see what you think about it." He stated he still has this speech which is dated June 19, 1963, put out by "Life Line", by H. L. HUNT, entitled, "Heroism."

MOORE said that this was the last time he saw RUBY and that he has no information concerning the whereabouts of RUBY at the time of the assassination of the President and knows nothing about any trips RUBY has made out of the city of Dallas.

MOORE stated RUBY did not ask for or receive a press pass from him or from Station KLIF to his knowledge.

BROWN advised that, between 1:30 and 2:00 PM, JACK RUBY came into the garage, at which time he did not appear to be upset. He stated RUBY made a local telephone call and he overheard RUBY inform the other party to the conversation as to the whereabouts of Chief of Police CURRY, Dallas Police Department.

BROWN stated that RUBY later called and informed that two men would be by the garage asking for him. He requested that BROWN inform them that he would not be open that night. BROWN stated that one man came by later and asked for RUBY and he told him what RUBY had said. He described this man as a white male, 35 to 40 years of age, short, sandy hair, heavy build, and stated he does not recall ever having seen him before.

BROWN further advised that CLAUDE HALLMARK, General Manager, Nichol Parking Garage, was present at the time RUBY placed the above telephone call to an unknown individual and informed this individual as to the whereabouts of Chief of Police CURRY.

WILLIAMS advised that he is presently unemployed; that he met JACK RUBY during the middle of November, 1963, when he came to Dallas from Dale City, Florida. He advised that his wife answered an "ad" in the paper for exotic dancers and was given a job by RUBY.

He advised that he last saw RUBY on November 21, 1963; however, talked with him on the phone on November 23, 1963. RUBY asked him, "Don't you think it is a tragic news event and I should close the club?" RUBY was referring to the death of President KENNEDY.

CHANEY advised he is acquainted with JACK RUBY, the owner and operator of several clubs in the Dallas area. He advised that on the day after the assassination of President KENNEDY, which would have been Saturday, November 23, 1963, he was called to return to duty shortly after noon and dispatched to the area of the assassination scene to assist in controlling the crowd of spectators.

CHANEY stated that, at approximately 3:30 PM, JACK RUBY came by the scene of the assassination on foot and stopped and talked with him. RUBY seemed to be solemn and made comments as to the tragedy of what had happened to the President. He remained about four or five minutes, then walked off in the direction of town. CHANEY advised that a few moments later RUBY pulled up to where he was standing, at which time RUBY was driving his 1960 white Oldsmobile. RUBY asked him if two men who were standing in the area several hundred feet away were not Captain FRITZ and Chief CURRY, of the Dallas Police Department. CHANEY said he looked at the men to which RUBY referred and said they were, to which RUBY replied, "Good, I just told reporters up the street that they were down here." With this RUBY drove off and he did not see RUBY again that day.

STANLEY F. KAUFMAN, 1520 Mercantile Securities Building, advised that he has known JACK RUBY since 1954 and has represented him in several civil matters pertaining to ~~the~~ night night club business in Dallas.

KAUFMAN stated he knows nothing about RUBY's activities while in Chicago prior to coming to Dallas, but knows that for the past nine or ten years he has attended the same synagogue as he attends and he considers RUBY one of the most active Jewish bachelors in the synagogue.

KAUFMAN stated he knows of no trips that RUBY has made, with the exception of a vacation trip to Cuba some years back prior to the time CASTRO took over, at which time he went down to visit some acquaintance, name not now recalled, who worked in a casino there, as well as a trip to Chicago some years back in connection with the death of his father. He stated he does not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD and never heard OSWALD mentioned by RUBY. KAUFMAN stated he heard over TV that RUBY had asked for three attorneys and that his name was mentioned, but he has received no contact from RUBY since his arrest and, since he does not handle criminal cases, he would not represent RUBY in connection with this pending charge against RUBY. He stated RUBY has never had a bank account to his knowledge and has always paid for his services in cash. He stated he knows of only two persons who might be able to furnish pertinent information concerning RUBY, one RALPH PAUL, of Dallas, who has or had some business connection with RUBY, and ALICE NICHOLS, a girl friend or former girl friend of RUBY, who resides at 8707 Redondo.

KAUFMAN stated that on the morning of November 23, 1963, RUBY called him, appeared to be very upset, and asked him if he had read the article placed in the Dallas News by a BERNARD WEISSMAN. KAUFMAN stated that he told RUBY he had seen it and RUBY asked, "Did you notice that this ad was bordered in black, which makes it look like a death tip?" KAUFMAN stated that RUBY wanted to know who WEISSMAN was and how he could get in touch with him and if Mr. FREEDMAN, of the Anti-Defamation League, could furnish him any information as to the whereabouts of BERNARD WEISSMAN. He stated RUBY also told him that he had tried to locate this WEISSMAN through the Post Office Department, but was

THOMAS J. O'GRADY, 939 Bluewood Drive, Dallas, who is employed as a guard at the General Motors Parts Division, 10788 Harry Hines Boulevard, Dallas, furnished the following information:

He formerly worked as a patrolman for the Dallas Police Department from about 1946 to 1950. During this period, while patrolling on South Ervay Street, he became acquainted with JACK RUBY, who was at that time, operating the Silver Spur on South Ervay. Mr. O'GRADY left Dallas in 1950 and did not return until about 1955. About 1956, he first ran into RUBY again at the Vegas Club. He began working for RUBY on Saturday nights at the Vegas Club as a bouncer and continued working in this capacity until about 1958 or 1959. Since 1959, he has seen RUBY only on infrequent occasions. He would occasionally go to the Carousel Club with a group of people on a party and he was always welcomed in a friendly manner by RUBY. He recalled that about two years ago, he worked for RUBY on only one night at the Carousel Club, at the time of the Oklahoma - Texas football game. He did not visit RUBY socially and did not call upon him. They had no discussions about political matters and so far as he knew, RUBY was not intently interested in political matters. He did not seem to be more than a normal admirer of President KENNEDY. There was never any indication that he was affiliated with any particular political party or group of persons interested in political activities.

O'GRADY advised he had no knowledge of trips that RUBY may have made away from Dallas, except for two trips to Chicago to visit his ailing father, and to subsequently attend his father's funeral.

O'GRADY advised to his knowledge, he had no affiliation with gambling or booking interests in Dallas or elsewhere.

He had no knowledge of the identities of persons who may have been affiliated with RUBY in the operation of various clubs in Dallas.

O'GRADY advised RUBY's closest friend appeared to be

At approximately 8:30 PM, on November 23, 1963, RUBY telephoned O'GRADY and talked to him for approximately five minutes. He did not seem unusually agitated or emotional during these conversations and at no time mentioned the name of OSWALD. He seemed to be particularly interested in two points, first, he told O'GRADY that he was closing the Carousel Club since he did not believe there should be any revelry in the City of Dallas because of the assassination of the President. He complained because some of his competitors were keeping their places of business open, and secondly, he complained about a poster on a building in Dallas, which was critical of Chief Justice WARREN. O'GRADY said that it was unusual for RUBY to call him by telephone and the only reason he believes RUBY called him was that O'GRADY came originally from Boston and is of the Catholic faith, and also, that he has always been able to exert a calming influence on RUBY when the latter became agitated. He advised that RUBY is very hot tempered and would occasionally shout at people when he became angry, however, on the occasion of his telephone call, he did not seem to be agitated and gave absolutely no indication that he intended to do physical harm to OSWALD.

Mr. O'GRADY advised that he had never seen OSWALD in person and had no information indicating a prior connection between RUBY and OSWALD.

An arrest report, #63-30069, which furnishes the details of the "Simple Assault" arrest of JACK LEON RUBY on February 12, 1963. This report reveals a charge of simple assault made against RUBY and describes the offense as follows:

"This subject involved in fight with complainant for no apparent reason. Subject hit complainant in face several times with fists".

The disturbance described above occurred in the Burgundy Room of the Adolphus Hotel at Commerce and Akard Streets in downtown Dallas. RUBY was alleged to have assaulted DON TABON of 8546 Forest Hill in Dallas. It is noted one witness was recorded in the arrest report, namely, N. T. STINSON of 7717 North Hill in Richardson, Texas. The arresting officer was identified as J. B. TONEY, badge number 778. Disposition of this case is not recorded on the arrest report. *Texas* *M.T. Stinson*

A Homicide Report made out by Detective J. R. LEAVELL of the Homicide Bureau, Dallas Police Department, under offense #F86056, which sets forth the details of the shooting to death of LEE HARVEY OSWALD by JACK RUBY. These details are set forth below:

"Deceased was in custody being handcuffed to Detective J. R. LEAVELLE's left wrist with Detective L. C. GRAVES holding to deceased's left arm. Deceased was marched out of the jail office into the basement to be placed in a waiting automobile for transfer to the County Jail. Deceased had been charged with the Murder of Police Officer J. D. Tippit and President John F. Kennedy. As deceased and Detectives approached the car, a white male dashed from the throng of newspaper reporters and television cameramen and fired one time with a 38 caliber revolver striking the deceased in the left side. Deceased taken to Parkland Hospital where he was undergoing emergency operation at the time he expired. Judge McBride ordered Post Mortem. Suspect was arrested at the scene".
