By letter dated October 16, 1961, the Administrator, Texas Liquor Control Board, was requested to <u>suspend</u> 8 & R Incorporation, the Carousel, $1312\frac{1}{2}$ formerce for an agent soliciting for alcoholic beverages for consumption on licensed premises.

By letter dated October 23, 1961, Texas Liquor Control Board advised RUBY received three days suspension beginning October 22, 1961 for above violation.

January 30, 1962, hearing for March, 1962 renevals in Judge STERRET's Court, advised RUBY had been okay for reneval.

Mr. McKEE advised that the District Attorney report for May 11. 16, 1953, revealed case number 466-B against RALPH PAUL who was Listed as as President of 5 & R Incorporation in 1961 with Liquor case dismissed.

On March 24, 1954, new beer application was filed by one CHRIS TOM SEMOS, 1630 Cedar Hill Avenue and RALPH PAUL, 2026 Wilbur, for the Mir sner Restaurant and Drive-In, 1922 Ft. Worth Avenue, Dallas, Texas.

Captain V. P. GANNAWAY, Special Services Bureau, Dallas Police Department, reviewed all records and information in the files of the Special Bervices Bureau which contained any reference to, or information about JACK RUBY, known operator of the Club Vegas, 3508 Oak Lawn, and the Carousel Club, at 1312 Commerce Street, both Dallas. GANNAWAY made this review in the presence of SAS ROBERT N. BARRETT and IVAN D. LEE and furnished the following information as a result of same.

RUBY came to Dallas in about 1947 from Chicago. He is known to have been associated with one JOE BONDS (believed now to be serving a prison sentence in the Texas State Penitentiary, Huntsville, Texas), and IRVING ALKANA, who in 1953, was residing at 2447 Northwest Highway.

RUBY used the name RARL ROBERT RUBY when he made application for a dance ball license in the Club Vegas, on July 17, 1953. At that time he gave residence address as 1719 Bouth Ervay Street. On February 11, 1954, upon making application under the name JACK RUBY, residence 1717 South Ervay, he listed as his partner as IRVING ALKANA, 5706 Belmont, Dallas. He stated the club was owned under the name "Show-Biz Interprises", which listed ALKANA as the president and treasurer and RUBY as the vice president.

On March 17, 1954, the application for the dance hall ... license carried only RUBY's name as owner and operator. It also listed the fact that RUBY had an interest in and was operating Hernando's Hideaway, 6854 Greenville Avenue, Dallas.

In the application for dance hall license dated February 29, 1956, RUBY listed his residence as 4130 Hawthorne, and stated that his full name was JACK LEON RUBY and was also known by the name JACK RUBENSTEIN. The application dated March 18, 1957, carried the same information but added that his home telephone number was LA 8-3248. . . .

Following RUBY's submission of an application in March, 1957, the Police Department conducted a record check and ascertained the following arrests for RUBY in Dallas; . . .

Captain GANNAWAY said that RUBY had subsequently been arrested on June 21, 1959, for violation of a dance hall ordnance which was dismissed and August 21, 1960, for violation of the dance hall ordnance for which RUBY was fined \$25.

Captain GANNAWAY advised that in March of each year, RUBY has made application for, and received a dance hall permit which is still in effect. These applications show that in 1958 and 1959, RUBY listed residence as 4956 Hawthorne. In 1960 and 61 and 62, RUBY listed residence as 4727 Homer, Apartment 105, telephone TA 7-9883. The application for 1961 also states that RUBY could be contacted at his business phone of LA 1-0203 and could also be contacted through RI 7-0025. RUBY is also the listed owner and operator of the Carousel Club, 1312¹/₂ Commerce Street. The application states this club owned by the S & R Corporation which lists RALPH PAUL as president and RUBY as vice president, and also SAMUKL D. RUBY, 11616 Jamestown, Dallas, as the treasurer and secretary.

In these applications for beer licenses and dance permits, RUBY has stated that as of 1955 he was residing 1719 Bouth Ervay and had been for the past two years. He claimed he had been operating as of that date, the Silver Spur at 1717 South Ervay Street for the past eight years. He listed a prior address of the YNCA, Dallas, for 15 years and was claimed to have resided at 3508 North Central Expressway for 15 years. He claimed his prior residence was in Chicago, where he was born, March 25, 1911.

He has listed as references, STANLEY M. KAUFMAN, 1320 Nercantile Securities Building, Dallas, ALICE NICHOLS, 8707 Redondo Street, Dallas, HAL COLLINS, JR., 4510 Glenleigh, and JACK RUSSELL, Musicians Union, St. Paul Street, Dallas.

Captain GANNAWAY noted that the Carousel Club was formerly known as the Soverign Club.

Captain GANNAWAY had information that in April, 1952, RUBY was working for HYMAN FADER as the manager of Bob Will's Ranch House, a dance hall (now known as The Longhorn), located at Corinth and Industrial Streets. The Police Department received information that FADER had dismissed RUDY because RUBY had "beated FADER out of several thousand dollars".

Captain GANNAWAY stated that as of November 24, 1963, RUBY was residing in the Marsalis Apartments on South Ewing Street, Apartment 207, where he had telephone WH 1-5601. RUBY's sister, EVA RUBIN, also known as EVA GRANT, resides at 3929 Rawlins, Apartment 1, where she has telephone LA 6-6258, which is listed in the name JACK RUBY.

Captain GANNAWA advised that RUBY had purchased Hernando's Hideaway from W. I. BURNS in Januay, 1955, but had no information subsequent to that time that RUBY had any interest in this tavern. Captain GANNAWAY advised that the last address known for RUBY on February 12, 1963, at which time he was arrested for simple assault and claimed has age as 41, having been born March 25, 1921. This assault occurred in the Burgundy Room at the Adolphus Hotel. The complainant was listed as DON TABON, 8546 Forest Hills, phone DA 1-2917 and a witness was listed as M. T. STINSON, 7717 Northhill, Richardson, Texas, telephone AD-5-7660. The complaint states that RUBY had a fight with a complainant and hit him several times with his fists. RUBY was found not guilty on February 27, 1963.

Captain GANNAWAY has information received from informants that RUBY is acquainted with JOE CAMPISI, JOHNNIE ROSS PATRONO and MARVIN RALPH PRESTRIDGE.

DON TABON, 8546 Forest Hills, Dallas, Texas, furnished the following information.

In early February, 1963, one night, about B:00 P.N., TABON was at the Burgandy Room at the Adolphus Hotel. He was sitting at a table with two friends, salesmen from out of town.

TABON knows JACK RUBY by sight having seen him on several occasions at various hotels in Dallas passing out cards advertising the Carousel Club. On this particular night, a short time earlier, TABON had seen JACK RUBY in the Adolphus Hotel accompanied by an "exotic blond". While in the Burgandy Room, JACK RUBY passed the table where TABON was seated and as he passed, TABON made a remark to the effect "what became of that crazy blond you had". JACK RUBY turned around and began beating TABON savagely about the head. After RUBY had beaten TABON to the floor, he immediately left the Burgandy Room. TABON was taken to the hotel office for first aid and while there, a police officer came in and TABON made out a complaint against RUBY. TABON was able to walk out of the hotel, however, the next day he found after going to a doctor that he had received serious injuries from the beating, necessitating his going to a neuro surgeon and eye surgeon.

Subsequently, this matter was brought into Corporation Court in Dallas and after TABON testified, JACK RUBY was found not guilty.

TABON recalled that on the night he was attacked by RUBY at the Burgandy Room about midnight, he received a telephone call at his home from a Detective whose first name he believed was TOMMY and this Detective suggested that he drop the complaint against RUBY since if he were found guilty on a charge of assault, he would probably be fined only about \$15.00.

TABON said he had considered a civil suit against RUBY in connection with the assault on him, however, his attorney had determined that RUBY did not have a bank account or other property and even if a judgment were obtained against him, it would not be possible to collect the judgment.

Mr. MARION T. STEENSON, 717 N. Hill, Richardson, Texas, furnished the following information:

In early February, possibly about February 15, 1963, STEENSON was in the Burgundy Room at the Adolphus Hotel, this was sometime early in the night. As he was sitting at the bar, he heard a disturbance at his back and turned around and saw two men fighting between tables adjacent to the bar. STEENSON was not acquainted with either of the men who were fighting, however, he recalled that one of the men was a short heavy set man, and this man was doing most of the "slugging" while the other individual appeared to be trying to get away. The fight lasted two or three minutes and sometime later the police contacted STEENSON and asked him for information concerning the fight. He told them at that time he was not acquainted with either of the men and did not know the cause of the fight or any other pertinent information. The man who was being beaten by the short, heavy fat man, appeared to have been badly beaten and was taken to the Adolphus. Hotel Office. There were a number of other persons in the Burgundy Room at this time, however, during the discussion following the fight, no one seem to know the reason for the fight.

STRENSON was told after he went to the hotel office that the short heavy man involved in the fight was JACK RUBY from the 'Carousel Club in Dallas. The police had indicated to STRENSON that he would be called later as a witness, however, he was never called and he assumed there had been no trial in connection with this altercation at the hotel.

STEENSON said he is not acquainted with JACK RUBY and does not recall ever having seen him except at the time the fight occurred.

JOE JACOES, Labor attorney and attorney for Local 20467 Scrap Tron and Junk Handlers Union, until five years ago, advised SA C. LEONARD TREVIRANUS on Novmeber 24, 1963 that he does not know RUBY nor does he recall his being associated with the union during late thirties or early forties.

An extensive search of the records of Chicago Police Department did not reflect any reference to JOHN MARTIN, JACK RUBY or JACK RUBENSTEIN or to murder of LEON COOK.

IRVING SCHOENWALD, former boxing promoter, 1313 West Randolph, Chicago, advised SA JOHN R. BASSETT on November 25, 1963, that HAROLD RYAN, who is believed to be working for the Illinois State Athletic Commission, is currently on a cruise and will visit Europe. He is expected to return to Chicago in December, 1963. RYAN has telephone number MErrimac 7-1254. This number is listed to NAOMI RYAN, 1704 North Melvina, Chicago. SHOENWALD did not know JACK RUBY, "SPARKY", or JACK RUBENSTEIN.

SAS PETROS A. KOTSOS and JOHN E. DALLMAN attempted on November 25, 1963, to contact RYAN through telephone number ME 7-1254 with negative results.

ART WINCH, member, Illinois State Athletic Commission, 160 North La Salle Street, Chicago, advised SA KOTSOE en November 25, 1963, that HAROLD RYAN is no longer with the commission, RYAN was an effice administrator for over ten years and was let out when the political administration of the state of Illinois changed approximately two years ago. RYAN is currently employed with the Metropolitan Sanitary District, Chicago, WINCH had no knowledge er information regarding subject RUBY.

Mr. TED LAUGHRAN, guard, Metropolitan Sanitary District, 100 East Erie, Chicago / advised SA DALLMAN on November 25, 1963, that Mr. HAROLD RYAN, secretary to Mr. MAHONEY, who is in charge of construction there, was presently on a mediterranean cruise and would not return to Chicago until about December 1, 1963.

He could furnish no additional information.

On November 25, 1963, Miss MARIE O'CONNOR, Chicago Tribune Norgue, 435 Norsh Michigan Avenue, Chicago, Madvised SA BRYCE S. PLESNER that a check of their records reflects an article stating that LEON R. COOK died on January 5, 1940. He resided at 1135 South Sacramento, and was the founder of the Iron and Junk Handlers Union; even though he held no office with said union. On December 8, 1939, COOK went to the office of the Iron and Junk Handlers Union, 3159 South Roosevelt and while talking to JOHN MARTIN, president of this Local, was shot as a result of an argument involving amount of pay given to union members. The article points out that COOK went to the hospital under his own power and gave a statement to the effect that while talking with MARTIN he had complained that the union members were not receiving adequate salaries and MARTIN became angry and pulled a gun and shot him. The article pointed out that MARTIN resided at 8023 South Wolcott, Chicago, and that after COOK's death, MARTIN and his secretary, Mrs. GLADYS WAISH, thirty-five, 409 Walnut, Hindsdale, Illineis, could not be located. The article stated that they subsequently did appear at the police station and that in the trial MARTIN maintained that he shot COOK in self defense as it was COOK who had the gun at the time he appeared at MARTIN's home en Appril December 8, 1939. Mrs. WALSH testified that she saw the two men finantuing and struggling, but could not see who had the gun or how 1924 it was fired.

This article states that much of the information about this matter was received from JACK RUBENSTEIN on December 9, 1939. RUBENSTEIN, secretary of this union, stated that he was only a collector for the union. T/l,

en January 16, 1940, union president JOHN MARTIN was freed of the charge of murdering LEON R. COOK. She stated that no other 'information is available concerning this matter.

KRASNO, Proprietor of the Highland House, a bar and restaurant, stated that he had read newspaper accounts and had seen a newspaper picture of the subject, but did not recall him. KRASNO also said that he had no recollection of ever being arrested with RUBY. He said that his last conviction relative to gambling occurred in 1933 - verified through records but he did not recall subject being arrested with him at that time or at any other time.

SWAIN, JR., Dallas Police Department, advised that shortly after the shooting dis JACK RUBY of LEE HARVEY OSWALD on November 24, 1963, he had been instructed to proceed to a parking lot located on the morthwest corner of Main and Pearl Streets where RUBY had parked his vehicle, described by SWAIN as a 1960 white, two door Oldsmobile. After arriving at the place where the vehicle was parked, SWAIN and other detectives proceeded to examine the vehicle and located the key to the trunk in the glove compartment along with identification papers for JACK BUBY as well as other items, and on opening the trunk found the ignition key and numerous other papers belonging apparently to RUBY as well as a paper sack which contained \$837.50. In addition, there were located in the trunk two pair of aluminum knuckles and various items of advertising and SWAIN advised such items were brought to the Homicide and Robbery Division of the Dallas Police Department and subsequently lodged in the property room of the Dallas Police Department under lock and key.
