REVOLVER AND TWENTYFIVE CALIBER AUTOMATIC, HE STATED BOTH GUNS UNLOADED AND LOCKED IN SUITCASE WHICH HE CARRIED ON BOARD PLANE AND PLACED ON CARRYON RACK. STATED GUNS WERE NOT ON HIS POSSESSION AND NOT READILY AVAILABLE ON PLANE.

UPON ARRIVAL DALLAS, TEXAS, HE WENT TO SOUTHLAND HOTEL AND LOADED BOTH GUNS. HE THEN LEARNED OSWALD HAD ALREADY BEEN KILLED SO HE WENT TO SEE TOM HOWARD, RUBENSTEIN-S ATTORNEY, AND OFFERED HIS ASSISTANCE. DARNALL STATED HE ACTED STRICTLY ON HIS OWN, NO CONNECTION WITH ANY GROUP OR ORGANIZATION, STATED HE HAD NO

DARNALL MADE AVAILAELE BOTH GUNS HE TOOK TO DALLAS DESCRIBED AS THIRTYEIGHT CALIBER SMITH AND WESSON AIRWEIGHT REVOLVER, SN ONE TWO EIGHT SIX SEVEN FOUR AND TWENTYFIVE CALIBER COLT AUTOMATIC, SN THREE FIVE FIVE FOUR NINE SEVEN.

IT WAS NOTED DARNALL APPEARED TO BE UNDER INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOL AND PERIODICALLY WEPT DURING INTERVIEW BY BUREAU AGENTS SUBSEQUENT TO INTERVIEW, ROBERT K. MEANS, LAW PARTNER OF DARNALL, VOLUNTARILY ADVISED DARNALL VOLUNTARILY REQUESTED ADMISSION TO VA HOSPITAL, HUNTINGTON, PM TODAY. RE: BACKGROUND

On November 27, 1963, IMER ROSS ARWOOD, 4513 Venitian Way, advised that he is a former resident of Dallas, Texas, having lived there in 1950. He stated he was employed as a sign painter at this time and painted several signs for JACK RUBY, who was then the owner of the Silver Spur Night Club; that he was also a frequent customer of the Silver Spur but knew RUBY only on the basis of a customer. He further stated that he knows nothing whatsoever about RUBY's associates, activities, or political views, and that RUBY always appeared to be a very friendly individual who was well liked. He again stated that he knew RUBY only on a casual basis and nothing about his personal life.

SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF THE PRESIDENT

A story in the "Washington Post" this morning is headlined "FBI Warned Dallas Police of Threats to Kill Oswald." The Director has inquired, "Can we find out who the 'Justice spokesman' is?" Jack Landau, who wrote this story, called my office yesterday at which time he had the entire story. The only question he asked was whether it was true the FBI had advised the Dallas Police Department. Wick, who talked with Landau, told him that Sheriff Bill Decker of Dallas had made such a statement, that Chief Curry had admitted it, that this information was carried in Dallas newspapers as well as broadcast on TV and radio early the week following the assassination. Landau said he knew that but he just wanted to confirm positively that his source was all right. He stated he had been talking to Rosenthal in the Department and other "sources" there.

In analyzing the Landau story, it appears he has rewritten much of the information already stated by police officers and has attributed it to Justice sources.

This office, of course, has adhered strictly to a "no comment" and will continue to do so in accordance with the Director's instructions.

# FBI Warned Dallas Police of Threats to Kill Oswald

A Justice Department spokesman disclosed yesterday that the FBI had twice warned the Dallas police of threats that Lee Harvey Oswald would

be killed while he was being transferred from the police station to the County jail.

The spokesman said the first warning was given at 2:15 a.m. on the Sunday of Oswald's murder and the second

was given personally to the Dallas police chief less than three hours before Jack Ruby shot Oswald in the police station hallway.

The FBI refused to comment. The Dallas police confirmed the 2:15 a.m. call but did not comment on the later call.

The Justice Department spokesman said that the FBI in Dallas had received an anonymous call at about 2

a.m. on Sunday. J. Gordon Shanklin, special agent in charge of the Dallas office, relayed the message to Washington.

Washington headquarters, the spokesman said, told Shanklin to warn the Dallas police and the sheriff.

Dallas Police Captain Glen L. King confirmed the 2:15 a.m. call.

The Justice Department spokesman said that at 10:15 a.m. Shanklin personally called Dallas Police Chief Jesse Curry and told him of the phone threat. Ruby killed Oswald one hour, five minutes later.

The Dallas police said that the FBI warning had not mentioned anybody's name.

In the face of increasing inquiries into Oswald's killing the Dallas police refused to comment yesterday on how Ruby managed to obtain entrance to the City Hall basement. Captain King said the Dallas police would make no more statements on Ruby's part.

"We are conducting an investigation to determine it," he said. "It would be germane to the trial. We have passed the information we have on to the District Attorney's office."

However, Ruby's attorney, Tom Howard, was quoted as saying that Ruby had said he just walked unchallenged past two officers guarding the basement entrance.

The FBI hopes to send to President Johnson this week its report on the shootings of President Kennedy and Oswald. It will be a narrative account in minute detail of the events surrounding the two deaths.

President Johnson will have

to decide how to make the report public, in keeping with his promise to make every detail known. It is not known now whether the President will turn the report over to the Presidential Commission headed by Chief Justice Earl Warren or wait until the Commission makes its own report.

Texas Attorney General Waggoner Carr, after meeting with the wounded Texas Gov. John Connally, said that a State Board of Inquiry into President Kennedy's murder will begin as soon as the FBI completes its investigation.

"At that time," Carr said,

"I have been told that the FBI will make its evidence and witnesses available to the Texas Court of Inquiry."

In another development, Mrs. Marguerite Oswald, 56, said yesterday in Dallas that the FBI came to her house the Saturday after the President's death and showed her a photograph of what she said was a snapshot of Jack Ruby. She said she told the agents she had never seen the man in the snapshot before.

A Justice Department spokesman said that Mrs. Oswald's statement was completely erroneous.

The spokesman said that

the FBI had no evidence to connect Ruby to Oswald. He said Mrs. Oswald had been shown a snapshot but that it was not of Ruby.

# DALY DIARY

**DIGGING IN DEEP . . .** An Italian writer and former member of the Italian counterpart to our FBI has been doing his own investigation of the Kennedy assassination. His views, at variance with published reports, are the following:

That Jack Ruby knew Lee Harvey Oswald and the Dallas policeman, J. D. Tippit; that Oswald was supposed to have been killed in the warehouse and because he got out unscathed the timetable was upset and he became a threat to the plotters' security.

That Tippit was not assigned to the police beat on which he discovered Oswald, and that Tippit's own beat was actually on the other side of town on Nov. 22; that Oswald had no fear when he was called over to the patrol car but panicked when Tippit got out of his car with a drawn gun, because Oswald then knew he had been double crossed.

That Oswald requested security in transfer from the police lockup to the city jail; that the gun scope was put on the gun at Klein's and sold as a unit; the scope was not put on by a Fort Worth gunsmith as claimed.

That meetings were held in January, February, and March by a militant group from Cuba who posed as dissatisfied exiles; that the rivalry between the FBI and secret service was well known to the Dallas police, and as a consequence they did not give either organization any pre-parade cooperation.

This Italian informant is convinced by his investigation that there was a plot and that the roots are very deep. He plans to cover the trial in February because he is convinced it is going to be mishandled in Ruby's favor.

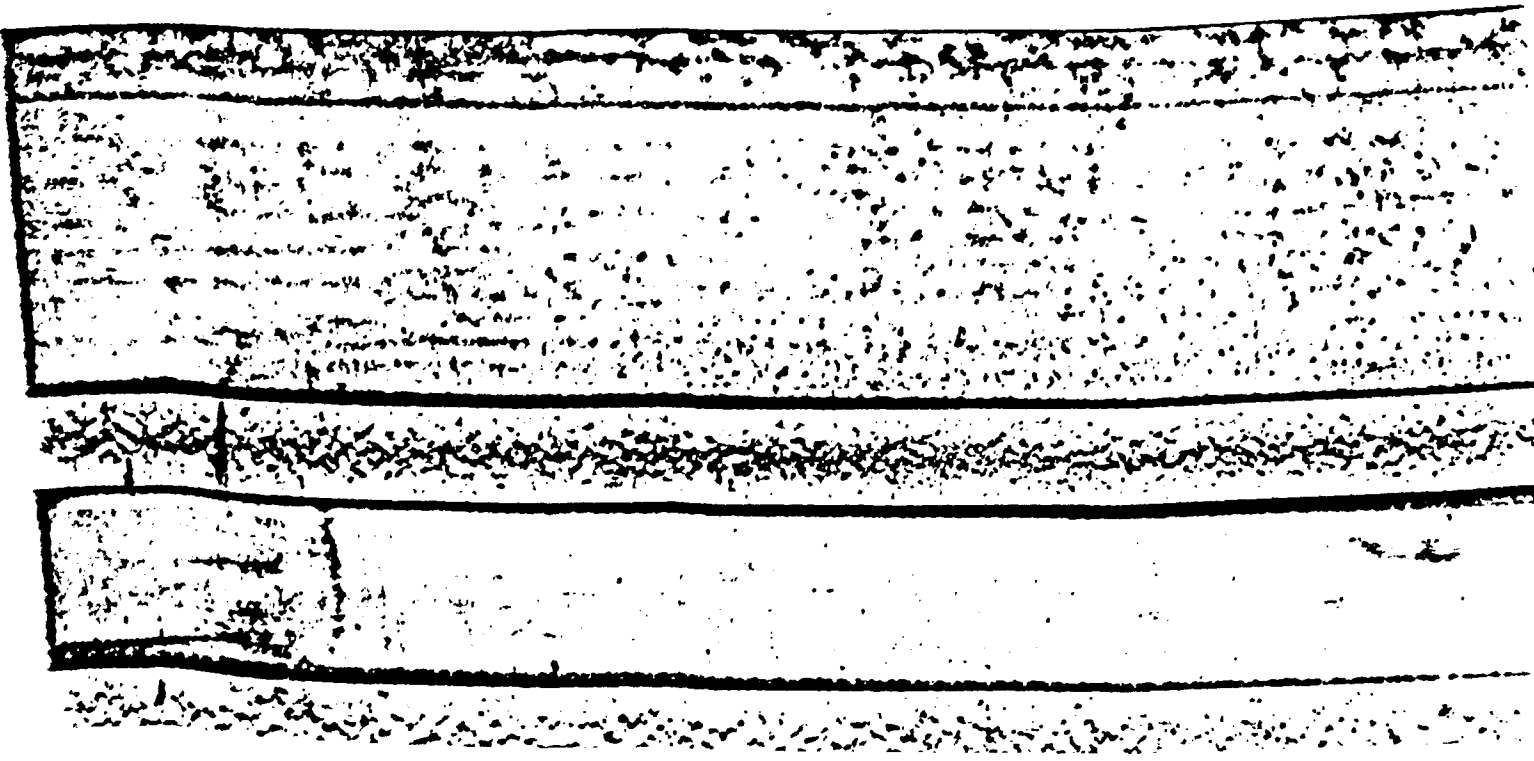

Sheriff J. E. Decker, Dallas County, Texas, has advised that it is a problem to furnish security to Ruby in the County Jail because he cannot be placed in close proximity to other prisoners in view of threats which other prisoners have made and which have been overheard by Ruby.

Sheriff Decker has furnished the names of persons whom Ruby has requested be permitted to visit him as well as the identity of all persons who have been permitted to visit Ruby in the past. During the course of investigation, the nature of Ruby's connection with these people will be determined. Sheriff Decker does not contemplate allowing news media representatives to visit Ruby although Ruby has requested that two news media representatives be admitted to see him.

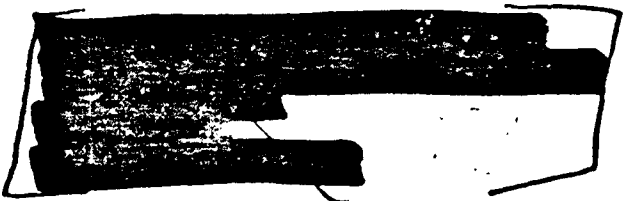

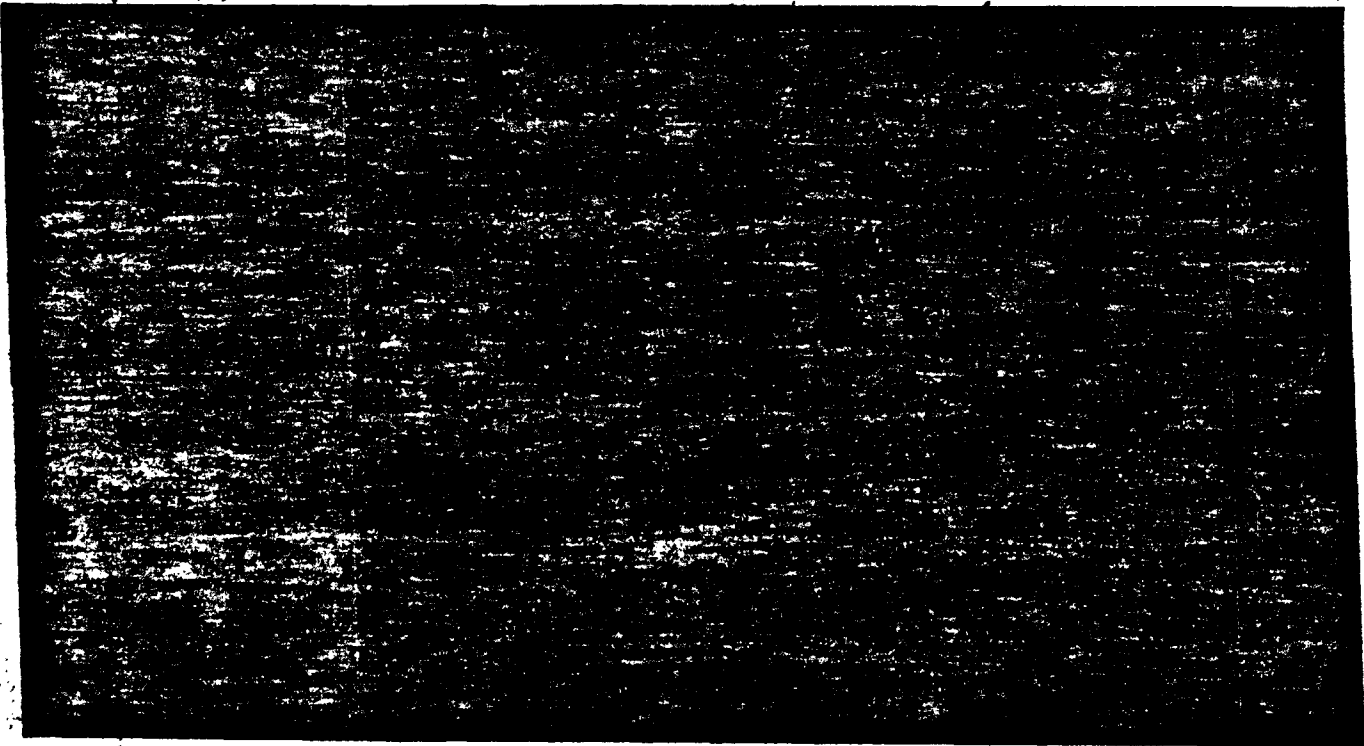

Mr. Lee Rankin called from New York to check in with me on the matter of the Commission. He wanted to work out an arrangement with me which he thought might be satisfactory. He said he understood Mr. Belmont handled the investigation.

I told Mr. Rankin that Mr. Belmont, Mr. Rosen and I handled the preparation of the report and will handle additional leads as they come in.

Mr. Rankin asked how he should handle anything that comes up, things the Commission will want developed further, in regard to the FBI - whether they should be handled directly with me or somebody I would designate.

I replied that I will designate someone. I explained that I sent Mr. Malley down to Dallas to handle all of our angles down there; that he was on the ground there; and that I think he probably would be the man who would be more familiar with things Mr. Rankin should further explore. I stated Mr. Malley is in Dallas at the present time but will be ordered back tomorrow; that he will be available; and that we will be glad to run out any additional matters he may want.

I advised Mr. Rankin of the difficulty about the department's desire to issue certain conclusions; they wanted to issue a statement before the report went to the Commission reaching conclusions Oswald was the assassin, no foreign or subversive aspect involved, and Rubenstein and Oswald had no connection; that I flatly disagreed; they took

Memorandum for Messrs. Tolson, Belmont, Mohr, December 12, 1963  
Conrad, DeLoach, Evans, Rosen, Sullivan

It up with the White House and the President agreed with me that we should reach no conclusion; nevertheless the report does reach two conclusions in substance.

I said I personally believe Oswald was the assassin; that the second aspect as to whether he was the only man gives me great concern; that we have several letters, not in the report because we were not able to prove it, written to him from Cuba referring to the job he was going to do, his good marksmanship, and stating when it was all over he would be brought back to Cuba and presented to the chief; that we do not know if the chief was Castro and cannot make an investigation because we have no intelligence operation in Cuba; that I did not put this in the report because we did not have proof of it and didn't want to put speculation in the report; that this was the reason I urged strongly that we not reach conclusion Oswald was the only man.

As to Rubenstein, I said I did not want a statement about Rubenstein and Oswald; that we have no proof they were ever together. I stated Rubenstein is a shady character from the hoodlum element of Chicago, has a poor background, runs a nightclub in Dallas, and is what would be called a police buff; that the police officers in that precinct have been able to get food and liquor from him at any time they drop in; that while I think there was no connection between him and Oswald, I did not want the report to be 100% sure on that.

Fourth, I stated I did not believe any conclusions concerning Rubenstein should be reached at this time because he has not been tried; that was why I suggested to the Attorney General of Texas - and understood the Chief Justice did too - that his court of special inquiry be held in abeyance until after the Commission makes its findings. I said I thought they would go ahead with the Rubenstein trial in February; that was why I felt our report should name merely the facts we have established.

I further stated there may be some aspects Mr. Rankin will want to have run out further; that there may be letters written to members of the Commission; that we have letters from people who claim to have seen Oswald; that up to the time we submitted the report we had cleared up all these angles except the Cuban thing which I discussed generally and explained that the informer recanted and blew that angle out of the window; that sort of thing may be popping up all the time. I advised Mr. Rankin if he wanted any leads followed out or any implementation of what we have already done we will give him 100% cooperation.

Mr. Rankin stated he knew we would; that he just wanted to establish liaison; that he does not want to bother me until properly

establishing it as a matter I should know. I told him not to hesitate to call me; that I will designate Mr. Malley and he will advise me at once of anything. Mr. Rankin then said he would get in touch with me if he thinks there is anything which should be taken up on that level.

I mentioned to him the actions of the Soviet Embassy, the Communist Party in New York, and John Abt in making available to us their information on Oswald.

I also discussed the operations of the Dallas Police Department in the case which led to the murder of Oswald.

I told Mr. Rankin the Department held the report about five days and then began to look items from the Department on it, items such as the shooting of General Walker, things not known in Dallas; that I kept pressing them to get the report to the Commission; that a debate was going on between the Department and me; that I did not want any conclusion drawn but I thought a conclusion had been made in the letter of transmission to the Commission; that there would have been no purpose in appointing a Presidential Commission except to evaluate the facts; that it was the duty of the FBI to get the facts and let the Commission reach a conclusion.

I told Mr. Rankin we would want to do anything we can here to make his job easier. He said he has always had complete confidence in that and in me.

Mr. Rankin inquired if anything had been done about seeing that the films would be preserved and available for the Commission. I answered that we have them ourselves; that we have films taken by private individuals; that the President was not being covered by a car with television people as they do here in Washington; that there was not a professional photographer where this took place; that the Secret Service car immediately in back had already passed the building, which was at an angle, with the result they couldn't tell where the shots were coming from. I mentioned the comment by former Chief of Secret Service Baughman that he could not understand why the Secret Service men did not open fire with machine guns at the window. I said the Secret Service men did not see where the shots came FROM and would have killed a lot of innocent people if they had done so.

In connection with stories indicating Oswald could not have done this alone, I stated he was a marksman and it wasn't anything he

could not do; that we have tested it on our rifle range and were able to get shots off even faster than he did; that there is no question in my mind about it; that we also found the fingerprints and the bullets so conclusively fired from the gun; that we have all this and we have all the photographs.

Mr. Rankin inquired if we also have the television film run off of the shooting of Oswald, and I told him we have this.

Mr. Rankin said Mr. Malone delivered to him a copy of the report and also offered to help in any way possible; this was very kind of Malone; but he will not deal with Malone in anything unless it is some emergency and he has to handle it locally. I told Mr. Rankin this was all right and if he should need to call upon Malone, Malone would be available.

I also told Mr. Rankin there is a direct wire between the New York Office and here; that he can always place any calls to here over our wire; and that I will arrange for this.

I told Mr. Rankin to let us know if there is anything we can do.

# Ruby Knew Tippit, Killer's Sister Says

By DOM BONAFEDE and  
STUART H. LOORY

WASHINGTON—Jack Ruby, the strip joint proprietor who murdered Lee Harvey Oswald in the Dallas Police Headquarters before a live television audience, knew the dead patrolman J. D. Tippit well.

"Jack called him Buddy," Mrs. Eva Grant, Ruby's sister, said in a telephone interview. "Jack knew him and I knew him. He used to come into both the Vegas Club and the Carousel Club. He was a fine man." Ruby and his sister owned both clubs—the Carousel strip joint downtown and the other, a suburban rock-'n'-roll hall.

Mrs. Grant said the patrolman—a 37-year-old six-footer who weighed 190 pounds and had a pleasant sense of humor—visited the clubs in the line of duty. He made routine checks while patrolling a beat. "We liked him," she said. "This one was a very good cop. He was in and out of our place many times."

One of the still unanswered questions in the assassination of President Kennedy, the killing of Patrolman Tippit and the subsequent slaying of Oswald is why the patrolman stopped Oswald on East 10th st. in suburban Oak Cliff at 1:18 p.m., 48 minutes after Oswald apparently shot the President four miles away.

The surmise is either that Patrolman Tippit picked Oswald out as fitting the description of the suspected assassin broadcast over the Dallas police radio or that he recognized the ex-Marine and Marxist as a suspicious looking character.

Whatever the reason, he stopped Oswald, questioned him from his radio car and then got out of the car, perhaps to ask more questions. Oswald drew his .38 caliber revolver and fired, killing the policeman.

Records at the Oak Cliff police substation show that patrolman Tippit was not patrolling his regular beat the day of the presidential assassination. He had been ordered closer to town to be in a good position to respond to emergency calls in the downtown area.

At Police Headquarters, Capt. Glen King said Tippit had been assigned to the Oak Cliff station ever since it opened in 1958. He was well known in the area.

The dead policeman—a former paratrooper with the 82d Airborne Division and the father of three—had belonged to the force 11 years. His name, Capt. King said, had never come up for promotion as a result of Civil Service examinations but he had received departmental recognition certificates twice. In 1956, he was commended for disarming a drunk who was brandishing a knife. The patrolman suffered a knee injury in the tussel but did not injure the drunk. The following year he was commended for general good police work.

Although Mrs. Grant insisted that the slain patrolman was well known in the clubs, the Dallas police roster also contains the name of G.M. Tippit, a member of the special services squad whose responsibility includes vice and narcotics investigations as well as other criminal work.

King shed some light on the police activities just prior to the President's visit in a telephone interview. He said the department had checked out a number of possible trouble-

makers in the city and had "some of them" (he would not say how many) under surveillance during the visit.

The department had compiled a list of possible agitators before the city desegregated its schools in September, 1961.

ADMINISTRATIVE

This report constitutes results of investigation since receipt of BUTel to all SACs dated 11/29/63 which stated that all information received at Dallas by teletype was being incorporated in reports at Dallas.

Milwaukee teletype to Bureau and Dallas dated December 9, 1963 set out information about a man, possibly subject, who, when in the Air Force, allegedly was close to Colonel ROGERS, who was rumored to have solicited memberships in the Communist Party. As Milwaukee does not know subject's military background, Dallas was informed in the same teletype that leads were being left to the discretion of Dallas.

## Synopsis:

Mrs. RAE RYAN, Madison, Wis., former friend of OWEN HOWARD REIERSON, JR., who was committed for mental observation after celebrating the assassination of President KENNEDY at Madison, Wis., stated that he had no known Dallas connections. Mrs. MARGARITA REYES, Milwaukee, who said she has been receiving treatment at the Milwaukee County Hospital, stated she saw men resembling OSWALD and RUBY in Milwaukee on several occasions over the past year and she associates them with the unsolved murder of ANTHONY J. BIERNAT, Kenosha, Wis., who was killed in January, 1963. Some of her observations have been proved inaccurate. WALTER JAMES CARLSON, JR., Superior, Wis., formerly in U.S. Air Force, recalls enlisted man named RUBY, possibly subject, was in Communications Section, 521 Fighter-Bomber Group at various AFBs in Florida during latter part of World War II and was rumored to be associated with Col. ROGERS, a base commander who allegedly tried to solicit Communist Party memberships from officers. CARLSON said footlockers of men in Communications Section were searched in 1945 by alleged intelligence officers and RUBY protested vigorously.
