Ed Rudy, 141-65 85th Street, Queens, New York, advised that he is 34 years of age, and is regularly employed as a building inspector for New York City. He advised that he is also editor of the "Inspectors Spotlight" which is a publication distributed throughout New York City to city building inspectors. He stated that he is a part time reporter for the Long Island Post, and on occasion submits news items to established reporters for the larger papers in New York City.

He stated that in his position as a reporter for the Long Island Post he writes a column known as "Night People." He advised that he is personally acquainted with a number of individuals connected with show business in New York City, and that he frequents a number of spots in the area of Broadway and 52nd Street, New York City in order to obtain news items. He advised that one of his locations which he frequents is known as the B & G Restaurant, located at 7th Avenue and 51st Street, New York City.

He advised that in connection with the individuals mentioned by him in his communication to Walter Winchell, dated November 25, 1953, concerning Jack Ruby, he obtained this information from over hearing individuals in the B & G Restaurant talk about the assassination of Lee Harvey Oswald, and the fact that Ruby at one time frequented the New York City area. He stated that the information he reported was merely hearsay and that he did not personally know Ruby or Oswald or did he know of any connection between the two. He advised that BohaHawkins, a night counter man at the B & G Restaurant, indicated to him that he might possibly know Ruby. \_ He stated that an entertainer by the name of Danny Davis Ymight possibly know Ruby. He advised that there are a y number of individuals who indicated that the only information they knew concerning Ruby was what they read in the newspaper, and he, Rudy, printed these names as a source of information in that Ruby was considered, "a Broadway character."

He had no information concerning any trips made by RUBY to New York and indicated that his statement concerning "frequent trips" to New York by RUBY was based on speculation. He was unable to furnish the names of any individuals other than the above who might have additional information concerning RUBY or might be acquainted with RUBY.

Robert Hawkins, advised that he had worked for the B&G Restaurant chain for a number of years. He follow that the restaurant located at the above address caters to the show business crowd in the mid 50's. He advised that following the assassination of Lee Harvey Oswald by Ruby, he observed Ruby's photograph in the newspaper and recognized him as possibly an individual who frequented the restaurant during 1953 and 1954.

He advised that he was not personally acquainted with Ruby or Oswald and knew of no connection between the two. He advised that a number of people who frequent the restaurant and who are in show business have mentioned the fact that Ruby looked familiar to them, however, he could not name any particular entertainer other than possibly Danny Davis. He stated that most of the information that he furnished Rudy were rumors and were unsubstantiated.

Mrs.ALLEN/TAYLOR. 234 Crestway Road SAN FWIUNIO telephone OL 5-2327, advised she was previously manager of the Fontainebleau Apartments, 1235 East Mulberrry Street, San Antonio, which were owned by EARLEDACKSON. Mr. JACKSON was originally from New York but now resides at 4420 Larchmont, Dallas, Mrs. TAYLOR said that apparently JACK RUBY was around the Fontainebleau Apartments on three occasions between August, 1962, and February, 1963.

She said that she assumed the manager's job on August 20, 1952, and shortly afterward, she was with Mr. JACKSON near the swimming pool at the period when there was a grand opening for these apartments. He observed across the pool an individual whom he spoke to by saying, "Hello, JACK," and then he told Mrs. TAYLOR that this was JACK RUBY who had clubs in Dallas and told her not to rent to him since he was "a crazy individual."

Mrs. TAYLOR said that the second time she observed RUBY he was apparently wandering around the grounds, admiring the apartments, and she could not place the date when this occurred.

The third time she saw RUBY was in the winter of 1963, perhaps February, when she saw him on the grounds again with a second man. RUBY remarked to her that this was the best kept place in San Antonio, and he introduced the man with him as an individual from New York, a bachelor, who was interested in an apartment. Since the New York man was interested in a one-bedroom apartment and none was then available, Mrs. TAYLOR advised she showed him an apartment occupied by BETTE WILSON, a divorce. She said she believed before the men left Mrs. WILSON's apartment, that Mrs. WILSON had offered them a drink.

Mrs. TAYLOR said that she remembered in conversation with Mr. PUBY that the Red Carpet, a bottle club in San Antonio, was mentioned, but she did not recall in what connection.

Mrs. BETTE WILSON, who has an apartment at the Fontainebleau Apartments, recalled that during the middle of the day about last January or February, 1963, Mrs. TAYLOR, the Manager, asked for permission for two men to observe her apartment. She believed that it was a Saturday or a Sunday. She remembered that one individual said that his name was RUBENSTEIN but that he was called RUBY, and the other man was from New York and was planning to move to San Antonio. She believed that he was going to open a branch of some business. As she recalled, they began talking and BILMEASTON, who had an apartment nearby and who has since moved to California, brought in a bottle of whiskey and they had one drink with the two visitors. She recalled discussing Dallas since she was acquainted with individuals at Dallas, and the conversation revealed that RUBY was a night club owner in Dallas.

Mrs. WILSON said that she was watching television at the time RUBY shot OSWALD, and she subsequently saw RUBI's photograph on television and made the remark to a friend of hers that she had seen this individual before. As she recalled, she shortly thereafter received a telephone call from Mrs. TAYLOR who reminded her that it had been the same JACK RUBY who had been at her apartment in the winter in the company of the New York man. She said she then realized that this was the same individual. Mrs. WILSON added that most of the conversation was in the nature of encouraging the New York man to move to San Antonic and take up residence at the Fontainebleau Apartments, particularly since he was a lachelor. MARK MARQUESS. Golf Professional, Tropicana Country Club, advised on this date that to his knowledge, JACK RUBY, the killer of OSWALD, and never played golf at that course. He stated that it was entirely possible that RUBY could have played golf at that course without his knowledge, but that he felt reasonably certain that if RUBY had played there, it was some time ago. MARQUESS stated that he caused a review of records of that Country Club to be made with respect to RUBY being entered on said records as a player, with negative results.

He advised that he had heard rumors that RUBY had played that golf course but that he had been unable to corroborate or refute same in discussing same with personnel of that course. He further advised that he had been informed that a Las Vegas television newscaster had mentioned RUBY's presence in town at a recent date, but that he had no first hand knowledge of same. He offered the opinion that he doubted very strongly that RUBY could have played the Tropicana Golf Course in the recent past, adding that pictures of RUBY, both on television and in the newspapers, were completely unfamiliar to him.

MARQUESS advised that he was well acquainted with PRESTON FEINBERG, and that while the latter and his wife both maintained golf clubs at the Club, neither had played golf at that course in recent months.

NEURDA A. J'RICCI, Bell Caption Hotel Tropicana, Stated that although he has heard rumors that JACK RUBY, aka Rubenstein, had been in Las Vegas recently and stayed at the hotel be could not recall having seen him. He stated that he had heard that RUBY had played golf at the Tropicana Country Club, but does not know this to be a fact. He feels sure that if RUBY had been in the hotel he, RICCI, would have known it. He recalled that about a year or so ago a JACK RUBY who he believes to be identical . \*\* SEA JACK RUBY, Dallas, Texas, based upon newspaper photographs, did come to Las Vegas and that he had asked RICCI to make reservations for a flight to Chicago. RICCI stated the reason be recalled this was that during the time RICCI was trying to make the reservation, RUBY changed the spelling of his name several times. He recalls RUBY changed the name to RUBIN, RUBEN, and RUBENSTEIN. RICCI did not know in which name RUBY finally got the reservation.

RICCI stated that no record is kept as to who uses the hotel's Rolls Royce. However, it has been in Los Angeles Since Movember 5, 1963 and will remain there where it was taken for repairs until December 6, 1963.

BICCI stated that to his knowledge PRESTOR FRINBERG does not and never has played golf.

NEUADA JOSEPH STEPAN Caddynaster, Tropicana Golf Club, advised on this date that records of his office for the past thirty days, did not reflect a registration for golf in the name of JACK RUBY and/or JACK RUBERSTEIN. He advised that records of his office are maintained for thirty days and then destmyed. He stated that photographs of RUBY, both on television and in the newspapers, were unfamiliar to bim. He advised that when the news of RUBY's killing of OSWALD first appeared on television, he had the impression that at one time RUBY might have played golf at that course, since he is sure that at some time during the past year, a player from Texas, had given him a card from the Carousel Club in Dallas and told him to look him up if he ever got to Dallas. STEFAN advised that he made a search of personal effects at the Club and also at his home with negatives results regarding said card. He stated that he could not recall how long ago it was, but that he must have thrown the card away. He advised that he also, in conjunction with MARK MARQUESS, the golf professional at the course, had a review made of the records of the Registration Desk at the Club with negative results regarding the name of JACK RUBY and/or JACK RUBENSTEIN.

STEFAN stated that to the best of knowledge PRESTON FRINBERG of the Tropicana Hotel has not played golf at that course in at least 8 months.

STEFAN advised that he was positive that PEINBERG had not played golf at that course in the past thirty days, adding that while FEINBERG and his wife maintain clubs in the locker room, FEINBERG has not played since he had a heart attack some time ago. He further described FEINBERG as a movice golfer who took up the game on only two or three occasions before being stricken with a heart attack.

STEFAN advised that he had discussed RUBY with the caddies at the Tropicana Course and none could recall RUBY as ever having played golf at that course.

WILLIAM RICE, Pitboss, Tropicana Motel-Casino, stated that he does not know JACK RUBY and has had no association with him, but might recognize him if shown photograph.

JACK FOMBLE, Assistant Manager, Tropicana Motel, advised that he had checked registrations back to January 1, 1963, and records did not reflect registration of JACK RUBY, aka RUBENSTRIN.

JOHN JOHNSON, Casino Cashier, Hotel Tropicana, advised that JACK RUBY does not have a credit card established.

B. P. SAUMBY, Manager, Golf Club Motel, checked the registration records and advised that he could find no registration for JACK RUBY, aka RUBENSTEIN.

CARPALA MARCA, Bar Manager, Castaways Casino, advised he knew JACK RUBY as JACK RUBENSTEIN, only slightly, but knew mothing about his personal or professional life. He has not seen RUBY since January of 1963.

JUNEYWISDON, Reservations Manager, Castaways Hotel, checked records back to December, 1962, and there was no record that JACK RUBY has ever registered at the Castaways.

The following investigation was conducted by BAs CARL F. FREEMAN and ROWALD L. MALEY, on November 25, 1963:

Mr. JAMES PHINLONG, owner, Phil Long's Casino, Las Vegas, advised that he has never had any information relative to JACK RUBY and to his knowledge has never seen him. LONG stated he is originally from the Fort Worth-Dallas area, but came to Las Vegas in 1947. LONG stated that he gathered from news reports that RUBY had only been in the Dallas area since approximately 1950, which would have made it impossible for him to have known him there, and he has not met him since that time in the Las Vegas area.

RUBY had a night club across the street from the Adolphus and invited SIMMONS on two or three occasions to visit it, but SIMMONS never did. SIMMONS stated he did not know RUBY other than to "say hello".

RUBY was still at his apartment in the morning when GEORGE SENATOR, his roommate, left for work.

RUBY telephoned EVA L. GRANT during the morning, regarding an article in the morning newspaper which was critical of President EENNEDY. RUBY came to her apartment and took the ad from her newspaper. He told her he had been to the post office and observed the post office box which number was on the ad.

About 11 AM, GLADYS CRADDOCK saw RUBY in the Classified Ad section at the Dallas Morning News office, preparing ads.

At about noon, HUGH AINSWORTH SAW RUBY around the Dallas Morning News building.

11/22/63

RUBY's attorney in Dallas, Texas, told HYMAN RUBENSTEIN, in Chicago, Illinois, by telephone that at the exact time when President KENNEDY was assassinated (12:35 PM) RUBY was in the office of a newspaper in Dallas, Texas, "raising hell" with them about an ad which had appeared in the newspaper.

During the early afternoon, ANDREW ARMSTRONG, JR., bartender at the Carousel Club, talked to RUBY on the telephone. RUBY had called him from the office of the Dallas Morning News.

RUBY, at Dallas, Texas, telephoned ALEXANDER P. GRUBER at Los Angeles, California, and talked to him about the assassination of President KENNEDY. This was about 20 minutes after the assassination had occurred.

RUBY appeared at the Carousel Club about 1:30 PM, and told CURTIS LAVERNE CRAFARD that the clubs would be closed that weekend. He then said he was going to his sister's house. RUBY left the club at about 3:30 PM. Before leaving the club, RUBY called the newspapers and placed an ad regarding the closing of the clubs.

During the early afternoon, RUBY placed closed signs on his clubs in Dallas.
