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She advised she has seen officers of the Dallas Police Department in the Carousel Club, but does not recall any of them by name. In all instances, it appeared that they were there on official business in checking the club and they did not appear to get any special favors from RUBY.

RUBY appeared very interested in making the Carousel Club a financial success and it appeared that he was doing well. His interest in making the club a success plus a very intense interest in several dogs he owned, appeared to be his main concerns in life.

She advised that for about the last year or so that she worked at the Carousel Club, GEORGE SENATOR spent quite a bit of time at the Club and was in fact there so much that it appeared to her he might have a financial interest in the place. She knew of no personal association between RUBY and SENATOR away from the Carousel Club.

She explained that after she had the argument with RUBY in about March, 1963, she secured employment as cigarette girl at the Theater 'Club,' which was upstairs over the Theater Lounge. Business there was not going to well so she secured similar employment downstairs at the Theater Lounge propen. She considered herself a flow: Control personal friend of KATHY KAY who had been working at the Carousel Club for a long time and has visited KATHY at the Carousel Club on a number of occasions since March, 1963. She last was in the Carousel Club about two weeks prior to the assassination of President KENNEDY visiting KATHY. On most of the occasions, when she has gone to the Carousel Club to visit KATHY, she also saw JACK RUBY but has talked with him only very briefly because of their previous misunderstanding.

She advised she was not acquainted with LEE HARVEY OSWALD, knew of no association between RUBY and OSWALD and knew of no other individuals as possibly involved in the shootings.

Regarding the shooting of OSWALD by RUBY, she advised that this situation surprised her when it happened as she had never seen RUBY carrying a gun. She advised, however, that the fact that RUBY shot OSWALD was understandable to her because he was a very unpredictable person.

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THE WILLIAM SLOAN, <u>GP54 North Greenview</u>, <u>Chigago</u>, advised that he has known JACK RUBY for about 25 years and explained that both he and RUBY were raised on the west side of Chicago. SLOAN stated that during the time RUBY lived in Chicago, he knew him as JACK RUBENSTEIN. He explained that he, hevever, was more clesely associated with RUBY's brother, EARL/RUBENSTEIN. <u>LLL</u>.

SLOAN stated that in about 1953 or 1954 he anticipated going to Dallas, Texas, to make arrangements to marry a girl then residing in Dallas. He stated that he, during conversation with EARL RUBENSTRIM, mentioned this fact to him and EARL in turn told him that he, EARL, probably would be able to secure employment for SLOAN in Dallas through his brother, JACK, who at the time owned and operated two clubs in Dallas. SLOAN stated that EARL RUBENSTEIN telephoned his brother, JACK, in Dallas and mentioned the fact that SLOAN was going to be in Dallas, and that reportedly JACK RUBY told his brother, EARL, to have SLOAN "look him up," as he could use help that he figured could be trusted.

SLOAN stated that he went to Dallas in 1953 or 1954 and was employed by JACK RUBY at both the Vegas Club and at the Silver Spur, a dance hall also owned by RUBY. SLOAN stated that his employment included taking tickets and generally acting as "a watch dog" regarding employee and customer activities in both the Vegas Club and Silver Spur. SLOAN stated that inasmuch as his plans for marriage fell through, he quit the employ of JACK RUBY after about one month, and returned to Chicago. He stated during the time he was in Dallas he lived with RUBY in RUBY's apartment, which was located in a building next to the Silver Spur on South Irving (ph.) Street in Dallas.

SLOAN stated that he believes JACK RUBY was set up in business in Dallas through money either

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given or loaned to him by his brother; EARL. He advised that RUBY was a type of individual who liked show people and liked to be around show people. SLOAN advised that to the best of his knowledge, no well known talent appeared in either of RUBY's business places during the time he was in Dallas. We recalled that during the time he was in Dallas, a combo known as Cellblock Seven and made up of students from Southern Methodist University were exployed at the Vegas Club.

SLOAN described RUBY as an individual who was more concerned with the trouble of others than of his own. He recalled that on occasion he was in the presence of RUBY when RUBY cried, probably because of some trouble that had come to a friend of his or in another case when a girl had "jilted" RUBY. He stated that RUBY appeared to be the type of individual that was very easily hurt and would usually react toward the individual causing the hurt. He stated that he had no trouble with JACK RUBY, mer has he ever known JACK RUBY to be involved in any fight with anyone.

 SLOAN stated that he considered RUBY as a loyal American, and that his action "toward LEE OSWALD' possibly would have been similar to the action any number of other loyal American may have taken if ... the opportunity had presented itself.

SLOAN stated that he never knew RUBY to be connected with any gambling activities in either Chicago or Dallas. He stated that he knows that RUBY hated "the hoods" in fact he did not allow any roughnecks to frequent either the Vegas Club or the Silver Spur. SLOAN stated that he has never heard any information concerning an alleged rape matter in · · · · · volving JACK RUBY.

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Houston, advised as follows:

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She stated she was formerly an exotic dancer and her stage name was KITTY KEEL.

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She met JACK RUBY only once for about fifteen minutes approximately three years ago. This occurred at the home of LILLIAN MCCARTEL in <u>Houston</u>. RUBY asked her if she wanted to dance at his Carousel Club in Dallas. She stated she was already booked up and could not accept the offer. $I \in \mathcal{L} \cap \mathcal{L}$

She does not know and has never seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD. She knows of no connection between OSWALD and RUBY and she does not know any associates of RUBY.

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BARNEY TAWHITE, <u>Record Printing Company, 2818 Elm</u>, <u>Dallas</u> was advised of the official identity of the Special Agent. He was advised that he did not have to make any statement, that any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law, and that he had the right to consult an attorney prior to making any statement. He then furnished the following information:

He has known JACK RUBY since December of 1962, the first date that he worked for RUBY printing business cards. He was never in any of RUBY's clubs and he knew nothing about RUBY's political convictions, travels, or connections with the Police Department. He stated that RUBY did bring individuals to his shop with him on numerous occasions but could not identify any of these individuals as being LEE HARVEY OSWALD, and he knew of no connection between RUBY and OSWALD.

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S.Altawar it it of the NAXINE JOY/WILLIAMS, aka Nikki/Joye, 1816 Pleasant Run Road-whose name appeared as "NICKI/JOY, telephone CH 7-9876," On a note pad of JACK RUBY's, furnished the following information after being advised that she did not have to make a statement, that any statement she wade could be used against her in a court of law, and that she had the right to consult an attorney before making any statement:

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She stated that she has been working at the Theater Lounge as a stripper under the stage name NIKKI JOYE for approximately 12 years. Her former phone number was CH 7-9876. She explained that her name and phone number were found in RUBY's possession due to the fact that in March or April, 1962, she quit working at the Theater Lounge and RUBY tried to hire her to work for him as a stripper at the Carousel Club. She stated that RUBY called her two or three times a day during this period, but that she never went to work for JACK RUBY. She has visited the Carousel Club approximately two times, the last time being some three or four months previous, which was the last time that she saw JACK RUBY. She stated that she has no ill feelings toward JACK RUBY, but that he is the type of individual that she would not care to associate with,

She stated that she did not know OSWALD; never saw OSWALD at the Carousel Club or with JACK RUBY. She had no conversations with RUBY concerning his travels, organizations that he may have belonged to, or any close connection that he might have with the Dallas Police Department.

Mrs. EVA H. HRLM, Apartment 103, 4828 Alcott, Dallas, Texas, owner Niblock Forest Studio, 1414 Preston Forest Square, furnished the following information:

She has been living at the Continental House Apartments for approximately four years and it is her understanding that JACK RUBY had also lived there at one time.

She said she does not ever recall having seen RUBY, to recognize him, but she recalls a fellow who lived at the apartment who used to swim four or five laps at a time in the pool who wore a black skull cap while swimming. She said a girl friend of hers mentioned to her, after RUBY had shot OSWALD, that he was the individual who swam wile wearing the black skull cap.

Mrs. HELM advised she has never been at any of RUBY's night clubs and as previously stated, had never heard of him prior to his shooting LRE HARVEY OSWALD.

Mrs. HELM advised she does not recall having seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

Her roommates were <u>PATRICIA</u> DE LONG ¹¹/₁/₁ ² OW Mrs. MICHAFT, JOYCE, Detroit, Michigan, ANCY/RITTS, now Mrs. JAMES/LEAKE, Dallas, Texas; FRANWARLICK, now Mrs. JAMES/LEAKE, Dallas, Texas; FRANWARLICK, Now Mrs.

Mrs. RAMSEY advised that she knew JACK RUBY only as another tenant at the Continental House, but who lived in another unit. Her only association with him was "around the swimming pool." She had a guest card to his night clubs as did almost everyone else in the apartments, but she never was in one of RUBY's clubs. She also advised that she had never visited him in his apartment and did not know the identity of any of RUBY's associates. She believed that RUBY lived with a sister, and as to female associates can only recall a very attractive girl, either Spanish or Mexican extraction, whom'he was going to make into an actres." She could furnish no further information concerning this girl, but that she was at the apartment house on several occasions.

Mrs. RAMSEY advised that living next door to RUBY were two <u>Central Airlines pilots</u> who appeared to associate with RUBY on a limited basis. They were AL PIERCE, last known to be at Fort Worth, Texas; and DANAGUNN, last known to be at Amarillo, Texas.

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L. W. "TED" NEWBERRY, 4130 Hawthorne, Dallas, was interviewed concerning a cabin reportedly owned by JACK RUBY at Lake Grapevine, Grapevine, Texas. He related the following.

In about 1954, he, NEWBERRY, was handling a promotion of selling one square inch of uranium land for 25 cents in various concessions and cigar stores in the Dallas area. He said that JACK RUBY had gotten in touch with him and tried to become associated with him in this promotion, but he, NEWBERRY, had declined. At the time, RUBY gave NEWBERRY a pass to his Vegas Club located on Oak Lawn in Dallas. In 1955 or 1956, NEWBERRY, who is a part-time contractor also, conceived the idea of building some simulated log cabins at Grapevine Lake and went to JACK RUBY with the idea.

RUBY, at this time, was living at the apartment located at 4158 Hawthorne, and he would occasionally see RUBY in the neighborhood walking his dog. He talked with RUBY on several such occasions and RUBY thought that the idea of the log cabins would be profitable, so they went into sort of a partnership. The business was known as Northwest Log Cabins, and the name was registered with the Fictitious Names Division of the County Clerk in Dallas.

<u>GIMPLE</u>, were to handle the sale of the cabins and he, NEWBERRY, was to get his cost back from the construction and share in the profits. The first cabin was built on Red Bird Lane at Lake Grapevine in the area known as Placid Peninsula and was located just across the road from the property of Mr. T. A. YATES. The first cabin took approximately nine months to construct. The reason it took so long was because NEWBERRY was involved in an automobile accident and was unable to continuously work at the project.

During the construction, JACK RUBY and MORTON GIMPLE would occasionally come down and help nail the logs up or do other manual labor, which both seemed to enjoy. The cabins cost much more to construct than was anticipated, and the project was 'unsuccessful from a financial standpoint. The cabin was built sometime in 1957 or 1958. At about the same time, RUBY was having difficulties with the Internal Revenue Service in Dallas and was

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being represented by an attorney, STANLEY KAUFMAN. When the partnership dissolved, RUBY and GIMPLE took over the cabin and paid NEWBERRY for his expenses and costs. He does not know but assumes that KAUFMAN took over ownership of the cabin by representing RUBY in his contest with Internal Revenue Service. After the first cabin was built, NEWBERRY continued and built another cabin adjacent to the first one and subsequently built another one at Lake LaVonne.

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To his knowledge, JACK RUBY never lived in the cabin and never gave any parties there or did any entertaining whatsoever. On one occasion, just after the completion of the cabin, NEWBERRY had several guests down on one occasion for a week-end, but JACK RUBY was not among them.

Since the dissolving of their partnership in the log cabin enterprise some four or five years ago, NEWBERRY has seen JACK RUBY on only one occasion, and that was in early November 1963 when they were both stopped by a traffic light in downtown Dallas and shouted greetings at each other.

NEWBERRY was unacquainted with LEE HARVEY OSWALD and had never seen him in JACK RUBY's company. He had no knowledge of any conspiracy on the part of RUBY to shoot OSWALD and stated that he knew of no associates of JACK RUBY who were members of the Dallas Police Department.

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Mrs. WILEY DISMUKES, Route # 1, Box 169E, Grapevine, Texas, was interviewed concerning the cabin reportedly owned by JACK RUBY at Lake Grapevine. She related the following:

Her husband operates Wiley's Shoe Store at 3517 Oak Lawn, Dallas, Texas, which is just across the street from JACK RUBY's Club Vegas. Mr. and Mrs. DISMUKES have been casually acquainted with JACK RUBY for several years, knowing him from his ownership of the Vegas and seeing him in the neighborhood where the shoe store is located.

About four or five years ago, two log cabins were built just down the road from the DISMUKES place at Lake Grapevine, but she was unaware that JACK RUBY was one of the principals in the building of the cabins. To her knowledge, the cabin across from T. A. YATES has been owned by a Dallas attorney, STANLEY KAUFMAN, ever since it was built. She said she had never seen JACK RUBY at the cabin. Sometime after KAUFMAN bought the cabin, he gave a party and invited everyone in the neighborhood, but she and her husband did not attend.

Mrs. DISMUKES stated that she did not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD and knew of no association between RUBY and OSWALD. She had no idea why RUBY shot OSWALD. She had no knowledge of any association between RUBY and members of the Dallas Police Department.

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WILEY DISMUKES, <u>Route # 1</u>, Box 169E, Grapevine, Texas, was interviewed at his shoe store, Wiley's, 3517 Oak Lawn, concerning the cabin owned by RUBY at Lake Grapevine. He related the following:

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He has known JACK RUBY as a neighboring businessman for eight or nine years. He occasionally goes into RUBY's night club at Vegas Club, for a glass of beer, but is not socially acquainted with JACK RUBY. In about 1958 or 1959, JACK RUBY and some of RUBY's associates, names unknown to DISMUKES, put up some cabins a short distance from his (DISMUKES) place at Lake Grapevine. The venture was unsuccessful and, to his knowledge, only two cabins were built. He occasionally saw JACK RUBY during the construction of the first cabin but never knew him to live at Lake Grapevine in the log cabin or at any other place at the lake.

Mr. DISMUKES was not acquainted with LEE HARVEY OSWALD and stated he did not know why RUBY had shot him. He knew of no association between RUBY and members of the Dallas Police Department. He said that he had recently seen JACK RUBY in the neighborhood on Oak Lawn, but their association is casual and his only conversation was wishing one another good morning or good afternoon.

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Dallas, Texas

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The following individuals at Lake Grapevine, Grapevine, Texas, were interviewed by SA ALLEN H. SMITH on December 6, 1963, concerning any knowledge they might have had relative to JACK RUBY owning property in the vicinity of the lake. None of these individuals was acquainted with JACK RUBY and stated that they knew nothing about his owning any cabins or property in the vicinity. They are as follows:

T. A. MATES, <u>Route 1, Box 148, Grapevine Lake</u>, <u>Grapevine, Texas</u>, was interviewed concerning information by JACK H. BROWNE relative to a cabin owned by JACK RUBY at GrapEvine Lake and also concerning information furnished by PRENTISS I. VAUGHN concerning the drilling of a water well on: property of Log Cabin Enterprises. He related the following:

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About four or five years ago, JACK RUBY, in association with TED NEWBERRY and MORTON GIMPLE, built two log cabins near YATES's house at Grapevine Lake. The cabins were built for resale, but apparently they were too high-priced and they were the only ones built. During the building of the first cabin, JACK RUBY would occasionally come out to Grapevine Lake to help with the construction. An airline pilot later drilled a well on the RUBY property, but he could not remember who this individual was. TED NEWBERRY, to his recollection, was the one who had the idea of building the cabins and got JACK RUBY and MORTON GIMPLE to finance the project.

JACK RUBY never lived in the cabin, which was just across the road from YATES's residence. However, during the sales promotion, there was one party given and YATES was invited. He could not recall who the other guests were. The enterprise was not profitable and went out of business and RUBY's attorney, STANLEY KAUFMAN, bought the property or acquired it in some manner unknown to YATES. KAUFMAN still uses the cabin as a week-end or summer retreat.

Mr. YATES stated that LEE HARVEY OSWALD was unknown him and he had never seen him at RUBY's cabin. He has no idea why RUBY shot OSWALD and knew of no connections RUBY might have had with the Dallas Police Department. He said he last saw RUBY about a year ago when RUBY came to Grapevine and asked him if he would board a couple of RUBY's dogs, which he declined to do.

Miss BLUMN advised that she had never worked for JACK RUBY and she had never heard of RUBY until he shot:LEE HARVEY OSWALD. She knew of no connection between RUBY and OSWALD. She could furnish no explanation as to why her name appeared in RUBY's papers.

He continued that he does not attend clubs of this type, therefore, if he had received a card from RUBY, he probably destroyed it.

He stated to his knowledge, he has never met JACK RUEY nor talked to him and has absolutely no information concerning RUEY. He further stated that he has never met LEE HARVEY OSWALD and he has no idea that OSWALD and RUEY were associated in any capacity:

SAM ISAACSON, Assistant Secretary, Dallas Federation of Musicians, Local #147, 1416 East Commerce Street, Dallas, advised that 418½ North St. Paul Street was formerly the location of the office of Local #147. He stated the local moved to its present location during about 1961. He searched all available records and could locate no record for GWYN. or MORRISON. He advised he is familiar by name with the identity of most of the musicians who have played in the Dallas area during the last two or three years and if GWYN. and MORRISON were local musicians he would probably either have a record for them or recall their names. He stated that in all probability they were itinerant musicians who used the union hall's address, 418½ St. Paul Street during their stay in Dallas.

HALL stated that he could not recall the nature of RUBY's case; that he did not do any work for RUBY. He said that at that time he felt as though RUBY were trying to become friendly in order to borrow some money from him. HALL advised that this was his only contact with JACK RUBY and therefore, knows little about the man. He stated that he does not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD and knows of no information which would connect OSWALD with JACK RUBY.

HALL advised that several days prior to the assassination of President KENNEDY, he had interviewed a man named JACK WALSH who lives at 2034 East Merced, West Covina, California. The interview took place at Dallas and at that time WALSH had told him that he knew JACK RUBY.

He stated the P-55 model had been their most popular model and was in production from 1955 through 1960 and was still being produced when Geiss Guit handling the product. HAY made available a complete list of dealers and service agents which may have handled the Minifon. HAY stated all service records kept by Geiss of America were filed by machine number.

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On December 18, 1963, Mr. JESSIE E.A HOSIER, 6919 Santa Fe, Dallas, Texas, was contacted by SA LANSING P. LOGAN in efforts to ascertain why the name "E. DEAN HOSIER" appeared as a member of one of JACK RUBY's clubs in Dallas.

Mr. HOSIER stated that he does not expect his son to return to the states for quite some time and was very doubtful as to any information he may possess concerning either the assassination of President KENNEDY or the shooting of LEE HARVEY OSWALD inassuch as he has been serving with the U. On December 18, 1963, Mrs.-CHARLES W/T HULL, 1005 Tipperary Drive, Dallas, Texas, Telephone Number DA 1-4152, whose name appeared as "Mr. and Mrs. CHARLES (HULL" in the property of JACK RUBY, indicating that they (she and her husband) were members of one of JACK RUBY clubs, was contacted by SA LOGAN at which time she advised that a few years ago, around 1960, exact date she could not recall, that she and her husband received a card from a social club in Dallas, but could not recall the name. She was under the impression that it may have been the Sovereign Club and could also recall that the card indicated that they were invited as guests of the club for one evening. Mrs. HULL further advised that this is a general practice of all social clubs in the Dallas area and was not particularly concerned over this particular invitation.

Mr. HUNT advised that he could not think of any reason why his name would appear in JACK RUBY's personal property and stated that he has had no contact whatsoever with RUBY to the best of his knowledge. HUNT is not acquainted with LEE HARVEY OSWALD and has only heard his name mentioned in connection with the assassination of President KENNEDY. He did not recall making any formal application for membership to be able to go there and drink and did not recall ever meeting JACK RUBY there. He has no recollection of ever having met JACK RUBY.

He was not acquainted with LEE HARVEY OSWALD, knew of mo association between OSWALD and RUBY, or of any other individuals involved with these two men in the shootings.

She did not know OSWALD and knew of no connection between LEE HARVEY OSWALD and RUBY.

KEMNEDY, there appeared in the "Dallas Morning News" a classified ad which requested that someone with \$5,000 invest in a private night club. This ad gave a box number at the "Dallas Morning News." She answered this ad by latter and requested more details regarding the private club. JACK RUBY telephonically contacted her about three or four days later and told her he cwned a night club in Dallas, and that he had a good location for a private club.

She requested RUBY to contact her son, who is an attorney in Dallas, to discuss further details regarding this club. RUBY has not contacted her son, nor has he contacted her further. She has never not RUBY, nor does she know anything regarding RUBY's background. She has never met LEE HARVEY OSWALD, nor does she know of any connection between RUBY and OSWALD.

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Mrs. ANN/WOODRUFF, <u>3636 Hearthstone</u>, telephone CH. 7-6468, <u>Dallas, Texas</u>, was interviewed, in that her name was found in RUBY's automobile.

She advised that about two or three months ago, possibly August or September, she observed an ad in the Dallas Morning News offering a night club for sale. In that a friend of hers, who lives out of Dallas, was interested in purchasing a small night club, she wrote a letter to the newspaper box number requesting additional information regarding this night club and gave her phone sumber. Sometime later, she received a telephone call from a man who identified himself as "Mr. RUBY," who described the night club as a strip club, and she told him that this was not the type of night club her friend would be interested in purchasing.

She related that this is the only time she has ever talked to RUBY and she has never seen RUBY in person. She stated she could furnish absolutely no information concerning RUBY or his activities, and had no knowledge of any association between RUBY and LEE HARVEY OSWALD. She stated she did not know OSWALD.

It would appear that if this note has some significance, it would relate to a flight 985 of American Airlines on October 9, 1963.

On December 14, 1963 and December 17, 1963, Mrs. GERALD BROWN, Reservations Department, American Airlines, advised that American Airlines did not have a flight 985 either arriving in or departing from Dallas in October, 1963.
