Reur sirtel of 12/5/63, my reply of 12,10,63.

On December 16, 1963, MYERS was contacted by SA H. WARREN TOOL, JR. at the County Jail, Pascagoula, Mississippi, at which time he said he had no additional information to furnish concerning JACK RUBY other "han that he furnished to SA JAMES J. FILES on November 26, 1963.

MYERS advised that he was originally confined on bad check charges, but that after his escape from confinement, additional charges of assisting in a jail break had been filed against him. MYERS advised he expects to have the charges against him disposed of by February, 1954, in Circuit Court, and that after he does so, he will contact Agents at Biloxi, Mississippi, as he is interested in "paying his debt to society." He indicated he could obtain information concerning WSTA and narcotics matters.

Awaiting the availability of MYERS and results of cases pending against him at Pascagoula, Mississippi, no further inquiry is presently contemplated.

This photo was made by ROCCO at the Carousel Club, Dalks, Texas, on or about 11/5 or 11/6/63 and reflects various patrons, one of whom appearing in the center foreground was allegedly identified by one source as being LEE HARVEY OSWALD REC & ピリーン ソンノ に

For information of the Bureau and New Orleans, ROCCO advised as a free-lance photographer and in the nature of his business, he travels about the country interviewing various owners and performers of night clubs and other similar places of entertainment. He stated on or about November 5 or 6, 1963, he came to Dallas to do a profile on JACK L. RUBY and in that connection was present/at the Carousel Club on six or seven con-During this time, he took two photographs of secutive nights.

ROCCO said subsequent to the making of these photos, he was in New Orleans, Louisiana, at which time he displayed the photos to one TERRY FRIEDMAN, a photographer with the "Times Picayume," and FRIEDMAN alleged that the white male appearing in the center foreground of the enclosed photograph "looked like OSWALD to him."

While in New Orleans, ROCCO said he also displayed this photo to an individual, name unrecalled, but who operates a flower shop on Canal Street. This person claimed he had known OSWALD when the latter was about 14 or 15 years old and, upon viewing the photograph, stated the person in question appearing in this photo, was not OSWALD. ROCCO volunteered at the time he visited this florist the latter was being interviewed by two FBI Agents, and the conversation above mentioned did not occur until after the interview was terminated and the FBI Agents had left the premises. ROCCO noted he did not personally feel that the person in this photo was identical with OSWALD.

For further information Bureau and New Orleans, four Bureau Agents assigned to the Dallas Office, who had occasion to personally observe LEE HARVEY OSWALD prior to his being shot by RUBY, have stated the person in the photo in their opinion is not identical with OSWALD.



Last Night, December 29, a program titled "Making of the President" was shown on Channel 7 by the American Broadcasting Company. In one of the scenes, the late President Kennedy was addressing a group of clergymen. During Kennedy's speech, the camera focused on a section of the audience and my attention was immediately drawn to a face that resembled that of L-e marvey Oswald. I have tried to dismiss the idea of this strange resemblence, but it has been on my mind since last night.

I know this information will be acted on by you and your staff. I would be interested to know what, if anything, results from this letter.

Your letter of December 30th has been received. and I want to thank you for giving me the benefit of your observations and comments.

Pursuant to the instructions of President Johnson, the FBI conducted a full investigation into the assassination of President Kennedy and the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald, and I can assure you every ramification of this case has been carefully considered. The results of our investigation have been forwarded to the Attorney General and to the Presidential Commission.

I am not able to tell you the contents of this report since the Commission has been charged with the responsibility to make a finding in this matter. Any public dissemination of our report will be decided by the Commission.



The Western Union Building is located at the interection of Main and Central Expressway, which goes south on, the east side of the building. Main Street runs on the north side of the building, and the building is in the same block with the police station, and the address is 2034 Main. There are two doors, which open on the north, or on Main Street.

SA LEO L. ROBERTSON, who is 6 feet, 3 inches tall, walking at a normal rate of speed, took the following set out time to cover these distances:

From the far entrance at the front of the Western Union office, down to the entrance approach to the Main Street ramp, which leads into the basement of the Dallas Police Department, 105 steps, time was 63 seconds.

From the near Western Union door, or the west door of the building entrance, to the middle of the Main Street entrance ramp, 101 steps in 58 seconds.

From the middle of the sidewalk of the Main Street ramp to the place where the shooting occurred, 33 steps in 22 seconds.

SA JAMES C. KENNEDY is 5 feet, 10 inches tall and, walking at a normal rate of speed, covered the distance from the nearest Western Union door, or to the one on the west side of the building, measuring 107 steps in 62 seconds to the middle of the sidewalk on the Main Street ramp. From the middle of the sidewalk of the Main Street ramp to the place where the shooting occurred, he took 37 steps in 22 seconds.

Captain O. A. JONES, of the Dallas Police Department, had the man in the Police Crime Laboratory measure the actual distance from the east end of the Western Union Building to the center of the Main Street ramp and found that it was 356 feet and 6 inches. It is to be noted that there are two doors opening on Main Street from the Western Union Building.

He stated the first door, or the one farthest from the police station, was 10 feet from the east side of the Western Union Building to the center of the first door of this

WILLIAM J. NEWMAN, Dallas Reserve Policeman, residence 10923 Cotillion Drive, Garland, Texas, advised that he was called by Sgt. SULLIVAN of the Police Reserve to report to the Central Police Station as soon as he could get there on Sunday morning, November 24, 1963. He stated he arrived there between 9:00 and 9:15 AM and was told to report to Sgt. PUTNAM of the regular Police Department. Sgt. PUTNAM requested that all of the Reserves, approximately 25 in number, assist them in searching all cars and areas in the basement. This was at approximately 9:20 AM when they began, and at about 10:15 AM Sgt. PUTNAM told him to guard the door underneath the ramp coming in to the basement from the Commerce Street side where the armored truck was parked.

He advised the door he was guarding went into the basement, which was the engine room. He stated that no one came in or out of this door while he was stationed there, and he was there from approximately 10:20 until approximately ten or fifteen minutes after the shooting. He advised that he did not see the shooting. He did not know RUBY. He never knew or heard of any officers working for RUBY. He stated at the time he went into the basement there were probably fifteen or twenty people already there other than policemen and that they were newsmen, photographers and TV cameramen. He did not know any of them. He stated these people were already there and he was not in a position to observe any others coming in to the basement, so that he was unable to say what identification they had to show or if they were challenged to show any form of identification.

He estimated that at the time of the actual shooting there were approximately fifty people in there other than the police officers. He knew of no security measures taken other than what his assignment was but did say that he had heard the armored car was going to be a decoy and that OSWALD would be taken to the County Jail in another car. He did not recall who told him this.

As mentioned previously, he was assigned to guard the door leading to the engine room. This door is on the east side of the ramp and back toward the Commerce Street side of the building. It is to be noted that both the Main Street and Commerce

Street ramps enter into the basement level on a sharp grade. NEWMAN, from where he was stationed, could see the lower part of the Main Street ramp but was not able to see the top of the ramp where the police officers guarding the Main Street ramp were stationed since he was on the level of the basement floor. He stated at approximately one minute before the actual shooting occurred he saw a man coming down the lower part of the Main Street ramp. From his position he was unable to see the upper part, therefore could not say whether an officer stopped and asked this man for any identification.

He stated from the time he saw the man on the lower part of the ramp, the man had to take just a few steps and he was on the basement floor level. He advised that the various members of the news media which were mentioned previously were all on the basement floor level. Therefore, they were in his line of vision and prevented him from getting an unobstructed view of the man. His obstructed view prevented him from seeing where the man disappeared into the crowd. He advised that he did not know JACK RUBY and had not heard any talk concerning him prior to the shooting. He never heard of any connection between RUBY and OSWALD.

Still trying to fit together the loose pieces in the investigation of President Kennedy's assassination, FBI agents have requested and received permission to question Dallas strip club operator Jack Ruby over the week end.

Ruby, in full view of national television viewers, shot and killed Lee Harvey Oswald Nov. 24, two days after the young ex-Marine sniper murdered the President.

Since Ruby is being held in custody of local authorlities, the FBI had to receive the approval of Dallas County Sheriff W. E. Becker and Ruby's attorney, Melvin Belli, of San Francisco, before questioning him.

Mr. Belli, frequently referred to as the "king of torts" because of his success in presenting medical evidence, was in San Francisco yesterday but will be present throughout the interrogation.

Sheriff Becker told the Herald Tribune he did not inquire into the nature of the questioning to be pur-

sued by the FBI but believed it, would cover "the general overall situation." He said the FBI may confer with Ruby tomorrow, Saturday and Sunday.

Other sources said the FBI action was taken in conjunction with a request by the blue-ribbon panel named by President Johnson to investigate the assassination and subsequent slaying of Oswald. The commission earlier this week asked the FBI to turn over materials forming the basis of the agency's investigative report on the assassination. At the time. Chief Justice Earl Warren, commission chairman, reported the panel was also seeking evidence beyond the report.

Washington officials denied that the FBI interrogation is part of a line of inquiry to determine whether Ruby and Oswald had ever known each other, and if a conspiracy existed between them.

"There's been a lot of rumors and speculation about it, but Ruby and Oswald absolutely did not know each other," commented an authoritative spokesman. "We've talked to many, many, many people who knew both and we have never been able to connect the two."

Sheriff Becker said Ruby is "separated from the

other prisoners for his protection—you can understand that."

He aded that Ruby has "adjusted very well" to prison life and has given his jailers no trouble.

Meanwhile, pathologists who performed an autopsy on President Kennedy reported he was shot twice from behind. They said he might have survived the first bullet, which struck him in the upper part of his right shoulder and lodged in his lung. A second bullet hit Texas Gov. John B. Connally, who was riding in the President's car. Gov. Connally, was seriously wounded but has since recovered.

The third bullet pierced the back of the right side of Mr. Kennedy's head, a small fragment of the pellet angling downward and passing through his throat. Damage caused by the shot would cause almost instantaneous death, the pathologists said.

Earlier, the wound in Mr. Kennedy's throat confused investigators and led to speculation that he may have ben shot from the front as well as from the rear. In such a case, more than one assassin had to be involved.

The major facets of this investigation concern such questions as whether there was any connection between Oswald and Ruby, the manner in which Ruby gained entrance to the basement, whether any other person conspired with Ruby to kill Oswald and whether any police officer permitted the killing. We are also attempting to compile as detailed a record as possible of Ruby's movements from 11-21-63 to 11-24-63.

Discrepancies have been found in the statements of various witnesses particularly with regard to the manner in which Ruby gained entrance to the basement. All aspects of the investigation are within Ruby's knowledge; and if he should provide a frank and complete statement, it could materially aid in resolving the issues under investigation.

In a memorandum of 12-11-63, which is attached for ready reference, consideration was given to the desirability of interviewing Ruby, and it was determined that the interview should be conducted if Ruby's defense counsel and the County District Attorney agreed. It was recognized at that time that Melvin Belli, one of Ruby's attorneys, will attempt to get all of the publicity out of this case that he can; however, it is felt that the best interests of the Bureau require we meet the situation head on in order that we will be in a position of having exhausted every possible source of pertinent information. Should we fail to interview Ruby, the President's Commission or others could raise the question as to why no effort was made to obtain information from Ruby which might resolve the issues of the investigation.

#### ACTION

Ruby, defense counsel, and the County District Attorney have agreed to Ruby's interview, and arrangements have been made for Ruby to be interviewed between the evening of 12-20-63 and 12-22-63. Belli has insisted upon being present, and the Agents have been cautioned to the importance of phrasing their questions in such a manner that neither Belli nor Ruby will become aware of information which should be withheld from them.

I was very happy to get three letters from you last week, one after the other. This week, I have not received a single one and it is Wednesday already.

We are still astonished at the turn of events and we are very anxious to know the effect over there of the untimely appearance of our top and only leader, as he took it for granted that he was referred to in a matter of which he had not been accused. What will SERGIO say about the charge made against him to the effect that he knew what was going to happen? In short, we are assailed by hundreds of unanswered conjectures.

On the other hand, you have the fact that our government agreed that OSWALD had gone to the Cuban Embassy in Mexico to ask for a Cuban visa en route to Moscow. Could he have been trying to get a visa or money for services he was going to render? Besides, it is known here that RUBINSTEIN was here a little less than a year ago visiting a Mr. PRANSKI, owner of a shop dealing in touris articles, located on Prado Street between Animas and Trocadero, opposite the Sevilla Biltmore. In short, there is something rotter in Denmark. When you answer me, tell me what comments are being made there about these facts.

Here, some important persons in the government consider t government here definitely established. Also, the worms believe that it is coming to an end, and that there is no help for it. Who are you to believe? God, alone, will have the last say.

The word "Prieta" may mean "the dark one" and "Chino", the Chinese man.

CIVIL RIGHTS

Mr. Carlos Villa, 1450 Coral Way, Miami, Florida, furnished to the FBI on December 21, 1963, a letter which had been forwarded to a friend of his named Jose Antonio Juan. Mr. Juan had received the letter from his son living in Cuba.

In the letter received by Mr. Juan from his son the statement was made, "it is known here that Rubinstein was here a little less than a year ago visiting a Mr. Pranski, owner of a shop dealing in tourist articles, located on Prado Street between Animas and Trocadero, opposite the Sevilla Biltmore." The reference to Rubinstein appears to refer to Jack L. Ruby who is presently in custody, Dallas, Texas, on charges of shooting Lee Harvey Oswald.

For your information this Bureau's investigation concerning Jack L. Ruby has developed no information that Ruby has ever been in Cuba except on one occasion in 1959 when he visited there briefly on a vacation trip. Ruby himself readily admits to this trip but has denied any other trips to Cuba or contacts; with persons there.

It is requested that through available sources of your Agency, you develop any information possible relating to the above-quoted statement in an effort to resolve the allegation that Jack L. Ruby has possibly visited Cuba since 1959 and has connections there.

## NOTE:

The information set forth above was submitted to the Bureau by Dallas with the request that such investigation as may be possible through CIA or otherwise be conducted concerning the person referred to as "Rubinstein" and to further identify Pranski. CIA is not in a position to conduct any effective investigation inside Cuba; however, it is possible that through its exile sources they may be able to come up with something that would be of value in resolving the allegation that possibly Ruby has visited Cuba subsequent to 1959.
