

Memorandum for Mr. Belmont
RE: JACK L. RUBY

2. The prosecution is seeking a death sentence for murder with malice but Ruby is guilty of no offense greater than murder without malice which is not a capital offense.
3. It is necessary for the defense to prove that Oswald assassinated President Kennedy and the defense is entitled to prove Oswald was a dangerous man of bad character and reputation as well as a professed communist.
4. Among other things, Ruby's defense will be that he is not legally responsible for the alleged offense because of mental disease and defect.
5. The facts in possession of the Commission will indubitably prove Ruby's defensive elements and it would violate Ruby's civil rights to withhold the Commission's information from Ruby.

Tonahill makes reference to a newspaper story, which he indicates he does not believe, alleging that Oswald was a Bureau informant. This allegation has previously come to our attention and it is completely false. Oswald was interviewed on three occasions (6/26/62, 8/16/62 and 8/10/63) but no attempt was made to develop him as an informant during any of these interviews.

ACTION:

1. Attached is a letter to Tonahill advising him this is a matter within the discretion of the President's Commission.
2. Attached are letters to Rankin and the Attorney General enclosing a copy of the letter to Tonahill and advising them that Oswald was not a Bureau informant and that we have not conducted investigation for the prosecution or furnished information to local authorities except the results of examinations of physical evidence submitted by the Dallas Police Department.

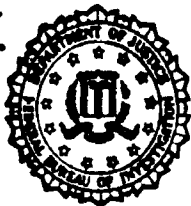

MRS. MARTHA STANTON CHADWELL

Mrs. Martha Stanton Chadwell, 940 East Havens Street, Kokomo, Indiana, on January 9, 1964, advised as follows:

She was watching television on the date of Oswald's shooting and as she recalls, the commentator was a Bob Walker. She advised she does not know Ruby or Oswald and has no information other than that she heard on television. She stated that it was her impression from the attitude of Walker that he may have had prior knowledge of Ruby's presence at the police department in Dallas prior to the shooting but she could furnish no tangible information to substantiate this impression. She advised it was merely an opinion on her part and nothing more.

It was pointed out to Mrs. Chadwell that in her letter to the Honorable Chief Justice, Supreme Court, Washington, D. C., dated December 27, 1963, she had stated she heard Bob Walker ask prior to Oswald being shot, "Is Ruby there yet" and again, "Is Ruby there?" Mrs. Chadwell stated she thought she heard that and so put in her letter. However, at the time she was not positive that those exact words were said and she might have misunderstood them. She then began talking about the two telephones which Bob Walker had on his desk, asking why it was necessary for him to have both a black and a white telephone in front of him.

Mrs. Chadwell has telephonically contacted the Indianapolis Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on several previous occasions.

On April 20, 1950, she telephonically contacted the Indianapolis Office complaining of telephone operators in Kokomo, Indiana listening in on her calls without her authorization. She furnished no specific information that anyone was listening in on her calls and she was referred to the local telephone company and advised she should report any such suspected irregularities to the phone company.

On December 13, 1952, Mrs. Chadwell again telephoned the Indianapolis Office advising that an unknown male voice continued cutting in on her telephone line threatening her because of some dispute she had had at the phone company in Kokomo where she worked until she was forced out. At this time, Mrs. Chadwell seemed very upset and nervous and the jurisdiction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation was explained to her and she was advised to contact the local phone company and if she felt her life to be in danger, she should contact the local police department.

She again telephonically contacted the Indianapolis Office on February 5, 1953, stating she had lost a job because of allegations concerning her supposed Communist activity; that several unnamed individuals at Kokomo were making false statements regarding her; and further that persons unknown to her had listened in on her telephone conversations. She indicated she had previously been employed by the telephone company in Kokomo. She became somewhat hysterical on the phone, breaking down and crying and this, plus her incoherent statement, indicated she was possibly undergoing a mental strain.

On January 10, 1964, Raymond Keller, Chief of Police, Kokomo, Indiana, advised that Mrs. Martha Stanton Chadwell had been known to the Kokomo Police Department for a number of years. She has during this time made numerous complaints to the Police Department concerning interference with her telephone, charging that unidentified individuals were listening to her telephone conversations. Chief Keller advised that Mrs. Chadwell was considered to be mentally unbalanced; however, she was perfectly harmless insofar as he knew.

Assistant Attorney General Herbert J. Miller, Jr., mentioned to Special Agents J. William Hines and Wilbur L. Martindale that he intended to confer today with Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach regarding the furnishing of information to the prosecution and the defense.

It is Miller's recommendation to Katzenbach, and he believes that Lee Rankin of the President's Commission will concur with any recommendation the Department makes, that no information be given out on Oswald.

With regard to Ruby, Miller proposes that Dallas County District Attorney Wade be shown the FBI reports by United States Attorney (USA) Barefoot Sanders and be permitted to thumb through the reports for the purpose of identifying material which would be of value to him. The Department will then determine whether the material will be given to Wade for the prosecution and he probably will be furnished with what he requests. Any confidential information would be removed prior to first showing the material to Wade. (We know of no confidential information.)

Miller proposes to inform Ruby's attorneys that the results of investigation will not be made available to them but they will be furnished with the names and addresses of persons who have given information bearing on Ruby's sanity including allegations of bizarre conduct on Ruby's part. The defense could then interview these persons themselves to develop possible testimony that would have a bearing on Ruby's sanity.

Decisions as to the material to be given Wade would be made by the Department and the Department would also select the names and addresses to be furnished the defense.

AT BOND HEARING JAN. TWENTY, SIXTYFOUR, DALLAS, ALL WITNESSES WERE DEFENSE WITNESSES. ROY SCHAFER, PHD, SCHOOL OF CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY YALE UNIVERSITY, TESTIFIED GAVE PSYCHOLOGICAL TESTS TO RUBY DECEMBER TWENTYNINE, THIRTY, AND THIRTYONE LAST, FOR TOTAL OF NINE AND ONE HALF HOURS. ON BASIS OF TESTS, IT IS HIS OPINION RUBY MAY HAVE PSYCHOMOTOR EPILEPSY, WHICH COULD HAVE BEEN CAUSED BY ENCEPHALITIS OR A BLOW TO THE HEAD, LIKELY NOT RECENT. IN SUMMARY TESTIFIED THIS BRAIN DAMAGE IS GENERALLY DISCLOSED BY TEMPER TANTRUMS, IMPULSIVENESS AND EXPLOSIVENESS, DURATION OF WHICH SEIZURES MIGHT BE FOR VERY MINIMAL PERIOD OR POSSIBLY OF EXTENDED DURATION. THIS TYPE EPILEPSY NOT NECESSARILY CHARACTERIZED BY EITHER PETIT MAL OR GRAND MAL SEIZURES DURING SUCH SEIZURES, PERSON SO AFFLICTED WOULD NOT LIKELY BE AWARE OF HIS ACTIONS. HE STATED IN HIS OPINION, NEUROLOGICAL EXAMINATION INCLUDING ELECTROENCEPHALOGRAPH, EXAMINATION OF SPINAL FLUID, AND HEAD X-RAYS, SHOULD BE CONDUCTED, SPECIFYING HOWEVER, ENCEPHALOGRAPHS WOULD LIKELY, BUT NOT NECESSARILY, SHOW BRAIN DAMAGE. COURT RECESSED FOLLOWING DIRECT AND CROSS EXAMINATION OF DR. SCHAFER.

AT RESUMPTION OF HEARING, TWO PM DATE, DR. WALTER BROMBERG ^{BERG} PSYCHIATRIST ATTACHED TO PINWOOD PSYCHIATRIC HOSPITAL, KATONA, N. Y., TESTIFIED HE EXAMINED RUBY DECEMBER TWENTYONE AND TWENTYTWO LAST, FOR A TOTAL OF ELEVEN HOURS. TESTIFIED IN SUMMARY HIS DIAGNOSIS RUBY WAS EXPERIENCING A PERIOD OF DEPRESSION IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY, JANUARY TWENTY SEVENTS OF NOV.

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TWENTYTWO LAST CONTRIBUTED TO FURTHER DEPRESSION, AGITATION, AND EXCITEMENT, RESULTING IN A CONDITION WHICH HE DESCRIBED AS A MANIC DEPRESSIVE PSYCHOSIS. THIS PSYCHOSIS TRIGGERED OFF A FUGUE STATE, IN RUBY, WHICH HE ^{SAID} IN EFFECT, SEPARATED RUBY-S MIND FROM HIS BODY, AND HIS PHYSICAL ACTIONS BECAME AUTOMATIC OR MECHANICAL. IN HIS OPINION, RUBY WAS IN SUCH A FUGUE STATE WHEN HE KILLED OSWALD, AND AT THAT TIME RUBY DID NOT THEREFORE KNOW RIGHT FROM WRONG. DEFENSE ATTORNEY MELVIN BELLI HANDLED QUESTIONING OF SCHAFER AND BROMBERG.

CHIEF OF POLICE JESSE CURRY, DALLAS, NEXT WITNESS, WAS ASKED BY DEFENSE ATTORNEY JOE TONAHILL, FOLLOWING QUESTIONS IN SUBSTANCE. DID YOU KNOW OSWALD? DID YOU KNOW OSWALD WAS IN DALLAS PRIOR TO NOVEMBER TWENTYSECOND, SIXTYTHREE? DID THE FBI REPORT TO YOU THAT OSWALD WAS IN DALLAS AND WAS A COMMUNIST SYMPATHIZER PRIOR TO NOVEMBER TWENTYTWO, SIXTYTHREE? ARE YOU SATISFIED THE FBI DID NOT KNOW OSWALD WAS IN DALLAS? HOW MANY POLICE OFFICERS KNEW RUBY AND THOUGHT HIGHLY OF HIM? WAS IT BECAUSE OSWALD WAS A COMMUNIST THAT YOU WANTED AN ARMORED CAR TO TRANSPORT HIM TO THE COUNTY JAIL?

PROSECUTION OBJECTIONS TO EACH OF THESE QUESTIONS WERE SUSTAINED. CURRY ^A WAS QUESTIONED AS TO WHO MADE ARRANGEMENTS FOR TRANSFER -OF OSWALD TO COUNTY JAIL, AND REPLIED THAT AS CHIEF OF POLICE, HE HAD ULTIMATE RESPONSIBILITY. CHIEF CURRY DENIED HAD ANNOUNCED TRANSFER OF OSWALD WOULD OCCUR AT TEN AM ON NOVEMBER TWENTYFOUR, BUT STATED HAD SAID TRANSFER WOULD OCCUR AFTER TEN AM.

DR. JOHN P. ~~HOLBROOK~~, M. D., A PSYCHIATRIST, BEVERLY HILLS HOSPITAL AND CLINIC, DALLAS WHO HAD BEEN EMPLOYED BY THE STATE TO EXAMINE RUBY NOVEMBER TWENTYFIVE LAST, WAS NEXT WITNESS. STATE OBJECTED TO ANY TESTIMONY FROM HOLBROOK AS AN EXPERT, AND COURT SUSTAINED OBJECTION. DEFENSE ATTORNEY BELLI HANDLED QUESTIONING. HOLBROOK WAS PERMITTED TO TESTIFY AS LAY WITNESS, TO QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS PROPOUNDED BY HOLBROOK TO RUBY OVER A TWO HOUR PERIOD, BUT PROFESSIONAL OPINIONS OR CONCLUSIONS WERE EXCLUDED. HOLBROOK WAS PERMITTED TO TESTIFY HE THOUGHT RUBY WAS EMOTIONAL AND UNSTABLE AT TIME OF INTERVIEW. SA C. RAY HALL WAS NEXT WITNESS, QUESTIONING HANDLED BY DEFENSE ATTORNEY JOE TONAHILL. COURT SUSTAINED PROSECUTION OBJECTION TO FIRST QUESTION REGARDING WHETHER AGENT CONDUCTED INVESTIGATION INTO ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY, SHOOTING OF GOVERNOR CONNOLLY KILLING OF OFFICER J. D. IN CROSS EXAMINATION, DISTRICT ATTORNEY HENRY WADE ASKED SA HALL IF RUBY HAD NOT RELATED FACTS OF VISIT TO CUBA IN AUGUST, FIFTYNINE, AND OF HAVING CONTACTED INDIVIDUAL IN VICINITY OF HOUSTON TEXAS WHO HAD ALLEGEDLY BEEN ENGAGED IN GUN RUNNING TO CUBA. SA HALL CONFINED ANSWERS TO THOSE APPEARING IN FD THREE ZERO TWO OF RUBY ON DECEMBER TWENTYONE LAST. WADE ASKED IF AGENT HAD EVER SEEN RUBY-S GUN, AND SA HALL ANSWERED HE HAD NOT. DURING COURSE OF SA HALL-S TESTIMONY, IT WAS OBSERVED WADE WAS REFERRING TO SOME DOCUMENTS IN HIS HANDS. TONAHILL ASKED SA HALL , ON REDIRECT EXAMINATION, IF DISTRICT ATTORNEY WADE WAS NOT READING FROM A WRITTEN REPORT FURNISHED BY SA HALL TO DISTRICT ATTORNEY. SA HALL RESPONDED HE DID NOT KNOW WHAT DOCUMENT DISTRICT ATTORNEY WADE WAS REFERRING TO, AND THAT HE HAD NOT FURNISHED ANY DOCUMENT OR REPORT TO DISTRICT ATTORNEY WADE. Both the prosecution and the defense in the forthcoming trial of Jack Ruby for the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald have asked for FBI reports relative to the investigation of Ruby and Oswald. Properly, we have left the decision to the President's Commission, which is studying the assassination of President Kennedy, and to the Department, as to what material should be furnished the prosecution and the defense.

Assistant AG Miller has indicated no material will be given to either the prosecution or the defense relative to the investigation of Oswald. The Department is reviewing the investigative reports relative to Jack Ruby for the purpose of removing any confidential material and thereafter making these reports available to District Attorney Wade in Dallas, through US Attorney Barefoot Sanders. Wade will select material he thinks is pertinent to the ~~defense~~ prosecution and thereafter the Department will pass on whether this material should be made available to him for that purpose.

The Department also contemplates furnishing Ruby's defense counsel with a list of names and addresses of persons who have furnished information bearing on Ruby's mental condition. It appears that Mr. Rankin of the President's Commission is awaiting a Departmental decision before expressing the Commission's views as to what should be furnished the prosecution and the defense.

Necessarily, we have to take the position that it is a decision for the President's Commission and the Department to make as to what information we have developed goes to the prosecution and the defense. However, we have in mind that any material which is to be furnished will be from FBI reports and, consequently, the FBI will be involved in any criticism of the material itself. Bearing in mind that we have interviewed anybody and everybody who had information concerning

the assassination of the President, concerning Oswald, and concerning Ruby, our reports contain a great deal of information that can be classified as rumor and gossip, and character-assassination type of information. Considerable information is from persons who are mentally disturbed. We ran out the information wherever possible to substantiate or disprove it. Nevertheless, in a great many instances the allegation will appear in one report and the investigation to prove or disprove it will appear in a later report.

If the information in these reports is misused, or comes into the hands of unauthorized persons, there is a strong possibility that there will be complaints, both on the part of persons who gave the information and persons against whom allegations were made. For example, we conducted investigation into the background of Ruth Paine and her husband, Michael Paine, in view of the close association between the Paines and the Oswalds, and reports of this investigation were furnished to the Commission. We are sending over today a 354-page report on allegations received concerning persons who made alleged threats, or had knowledge of the assassination of President Kennedy, aside and apart from any association with Oswald or Ruby. We talked to a great many "crackpots" and emotional people who made wild allegations, and the results of the interviews are in these reports.

ACTION:

We do not know whether the courts will abide by any decision the Presidential Commission or the Department makes as to restrictions on furnishing information to the prosecution and defense. In order to alert the Department and the President's Commission, we prepared letters under date of 1/18/64 to Assistant AG Miller of the Department, and to Lee Rankin of the President's Commission, in which we pointed out that if information in these reports is misused, or becomes a matter of public knowledge, it would reflect most unfavorably upon the Department of Justice and the President's Commission.

With regard to the Dallas teletype concerning the testimony of SA Hall 1-20-64 at Ruby's bond hearing, SAC Shanklin was telephonically instructed to immediately submit a supplemental teletype setting forth the specific questions asked of SA Hall while he was on the stand as reflected in their teletype and following each question with a brief succinct summary of Agent Hall's reply.

SAC Shanklin stated that both of the Agents who were subpoenaed for the hearing yesterday were released from their subpoenas at the close of yesterday's hearing. He raised the question as to whether an Agent should be present at the hearing today for the sole purpose of observing the proceedings in order that the Bureau could be advised of pertinent developments with the least possible delay. SAC Shanklin observed that this might attract attention as the Agents have no official reason for being present.

Shanklin was instructed that an Agent should not be present at the hearing but that the office should insure through their established contacts that they are kept advised of developments and that the Bureau is informed of pertinent developments on a current basis.

Memorandum Brennan to Sullivan, 1/16/64, advised that Liaison was following with Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for the 1959 income tax return filed by Jack L. Ruby and the 1958 return filed by Jack Ruby's brother, Earl R. Ruby. The request for these returns was originally made of Inspector Malley of the General Investigative Division by Lee Rankin, Counsel for the President's Commission.

On 1/21/64 Mr. William McCarthy, Assistant Director of Inspection Service, IRS, furnished Liaison Agent the 1958 income tax return on Earl R. and Margie G. Ruby. This return has been furnished to the Civil Rights Section. Mr. McCarthy advised that IRS to date has been unable to locate the 1959 return on Jack Ruby. Mr. McCarthy stated that this latter return has been misfiled and consequently it may take some time before IRS will be able to locate it. He said IRS is, however, continuing in its efforts to locate this return.

In accordance with previous arrangements, Mr. Henry B. Montague, Chief Postal Inspector, made available to Liaison Agent O'Connor on January 21, 1964, the proposed reply of the Post Office (PO) to the President's Commission Looking into the assassination of President Kennedy. As you are aware, the PO and other Government agencies have been requested by the Commission to furnish any pertinent information relating to the assassination.

The PO reply sets forth the investigative efforts by the Postal Inspectors to develop circumstances concerning the use of PO boxes by Oswald, particularly as it pertained to the rifle used in the assassination. Oswald was questioned November 24, 1963, by Dallas Police, Secret Service, and Inspector Harry D. Holmes of the PO concerning rental of PO boxes in the Main Dallas PO as well as the Terminal Annex and in the New Orleans PO. In each instance, Oswald maintained he made his own arrangements for rental and denied knowledge of any use of the alias A. J. Hidell, which was the name used by Oswald in obtaining the rifle used in the assassination. Generally, the interview of Oswald was nonproductive as Oswald was extremely arrogant and noncooperative.

PO Inspectors conducted several interviews of individuals in the Dallas area at the request of the Bureau and Secret Service, which interviews generally shed little light on Oswald's activities prior to and immediately following the assassination.

Each point set out in the PO reply was checked through the files pertaining to the subject as well as Jack Ruby. It was ascertained the pertinent parts of the PO investigations concerning this matter were contained in our investigative reports.

Reference is made to report in the Lee Harvey Oswald case of Special Agent Gerard James Horton dated December 19, 1963, at San Francisco, California, setting forth the allegation of Robert Edmond Gallant, an inmate of the Santa Clara Prison Farm, San Jose, California, that he saw Oswald in Mexico City on July 12, 1963.

On January 7, 1964, Robert Edmond Gallant was afforded a polygraph examination at the Santa Clara County Jail by a Special Agent of our San Francisco Office. In the opinion of the examiner, the emotional responses recorded by the polygraph were not the responses of a normal person telling the truth, but were indicative of an emotionally unstable individual. Gallant was vague and rambling in his speech, made general statements unsupported by specific examples, and manifested the symptoms of paranoia; namely, fixed suspicions and delusions of grandeur. In this respect, Gallant claimed that all political leaders in Mexico were communists, that he was a doctor of electronic engineering, a general in a secret Mexican army, and an associate of a Mexican millionaire.

In view of these observations, the results of the polygraph examination were inconclusive. It was the opinion of the examiner, however, that Gallant's allegation that he saw Oswald in Mexico City in July, 1963, was untrue.

The request of Waggoner Carr, Attorney General of Texas, which he directed to J. Lee Rankin of the President's Commission by letter dated 12/30/63, as well as the request of District Attorney Henry Wade, Dallas County, Texas, for information from Bureau reports relative to the prosecution of Jack Ruby, were discussed in detail today with Mr. Rankin.

Mr. Rankin was advised that the Bureau is ready to furnish to State authorities whatever information the Commission and the Department of Justice agree would be proper under the circumstances. Mr. Rankin was advised that the President's Commission had been furnished a large volume of reports with regard to Oswald being killed by Ruby and that these same reports had been furnished to the Department of Justice. He was told inasmuch as the investigation was conducted at the request of the President and the Department of Justice we would appreciate being advised what information should be made available to the State authorities of Texas.

Mr. Rankin was also advised that in view of the requests of Attorney General Carr and District Attorney Wade, the Bureau is advising them that their requests had been made known to the President's Commission and to the Department of Justice and that the FBI was ready to furnish them whatever information the President's Commission and the Department would release.

Subsequent to the discussion with Mr. Rankin, the Dallas Office so advised District Attorney Wade and the San Antonio Office advised Mr. Stanton Stone, Executive Assistant to Attorney General Waggoner Carr in Carr's absence, that their requests had been made known to the President's Commission and the Department of Justice and that the FBI was ready to furnish to State authorities whatever information the Commission and Department agree would be proper.

JAN 23 1964 Mr. Rankin indicated he was in full agreement with all action proposed by the Bureau and requested that the Department be advised of the need to review this material as expeditiously as possible in order to assist the Commission in making a decision on the information that should be made available to the State

On 1/15/64 inquiry at Calle Canal #101, San Miguel de Allende, Guanajuato, Mexico, revealed that the owner of this residence, according to a Mexican caretaker on the premises, had left San Miguel de Allende on or about 1/12/64 and that BETTY CARTER had stayed at that address for a brief period during the 1963 Christmas holiday season, but had left for the United States, possibly for San Antonio, Texas, at some time between 12/25/63 and 1/1/64.

The Mexican caretaker located an envelope addressed to G. E. BURNHAM (or BURNHAN), Calle Canal #101, San Miguel de Allende, Mexico, and the caretaker stated that this is the name of the occupant of this residence. The caretaker also exhibited an envelope which was postmarked 1/8/64 at San Antonio, Texas, and was addressed to "BETTY and GINO" at the aforementioned San Miguel de Allende address. The caretaker stated that "GINO" is actually the nickname of BURNHAM and that BETTY is thought to be a cousin of BURNHAM, or posed as such when she was visiting at San Miguel de Allende.

It was noted that the letter postmarked 1/8/64 bore the return address of LEE MALONE, 158 De Chantle, Apartment 118, San Antonio, Texas.

The caretaker at the above residence stated that she did not know when BURNHAM would return to San Miguel de Allende but that he was expected within two or three days and was thought to have gone to San Antonio, Texas.

ASAC Clark of Dallas telephonically advised that the hearing concerning the writ to release Ruby on bond for psychiatric examination reconvened at 9:00 a. m. Dallas time today and the first witness was Rabbi L. Silverman who testified that Ruby, on various occasions when he met him, had been emotionally unstable and somewhat incoherent in his conversation.

Four officers of the Dallas Police Department testified concerning the shooting of Oswald in the Dallas Police Department garage. The defense then withdrew the writ which amounted to the hearing being closed. Prior to terminating this session of court, Defense Attorney Belli entered a motion for a change of venue which was refused by the judge at this time. The judge stated the motion would be ruled upon when the trial commenced. Belli then entered a motion for a continuance of the trial from February 3 until February 17. There is to be a conference later today at which time this motion will be ruled upon. Dallas will furnish full details and additional developments later today.
