The source of information who furnished the information to [CAPELL] is not set out in FD-302 as [CAPELL] said he received this information from a confidential source who had asked him to keep his name in strict confidence.

[CAPELL] did furnish the name of his source as [GUY RICHARD, Assistant Editor of the NY Journal American newspaper] who in turn had received this information from author [NATHANIEL WEYL ("Red Star Over Cuba")]. [WEYL] is the person described in the "Herald of Freedom" article as "one of the best informed men in the United States on Soviet and Castro intelligence operations".

[CAPELL] said he was furnishing his source to the FBI in confidence and he requested that his source not be contacted by the FBI.

CLEMENTS. A letterhead memorandum is likewise being furnished to Secret Service since Special Agent PATTERSON indicated his office had not as yet received a copy of the anonymous communication from the Sheriff's Office.

The FBI Laboratory is requested to search the handwriting of the attached through the Anonymous Letter file and furnish the results to Dallas and El Paso. The attachment may be retained for possibly future examinations in the Anonymous Letter file.

El Paso Office is requested to examine anonymous correspondence in its file which may be identified with "sub complaints" in effort to identify the writer.

Page 905. Congressman Cramer, (R) Florida, pointed out that "an Associated Press dispatch from Dallas, Tex., reported in the St. Louis Globe-Democrat dated January 21, 1964, carries the story of Jack Ruby's trip to Cuba in 1959 and other related facts as brought out in testimony at the Ruby hearings in Dallas." He included the text of the article with his remarks. The article stated "FBI Agent C. Ray Hall, last witness of the day, testified that Ruby had also told him of going to Cuba to try to sell seeps, using a plane ticket sent to him by a person the State described as 'someone in Cuba.'" (C. Ray Hall is an Agent assigned to the Dallas Office.)

THAT HE HAD RECEIVED INFO THAT OSWALD'S NOTEBOOK WHICH HAD BEEN SEIZED BY THE POLICE HAD AGENT HOSTY OR HASTY'S NAME AND THE TELEPHONE NUMBER OF THE LOCAL FBI OFFICE, AND POSSIBLY A LICENSE NUMBER OF A CAR, AND HE ASKED ALEXANDER IF THAT DIDN'T MEAN OSWALD WAS AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI. ALEXANDER CLAIMS THAT HE TOLD HIM THAT HE DIDN'T KNOW ANYTHING ABOUT HIS BEING AN INFORMANT. WHEN QUESTIONED ABOUT THE NOTEBOOK, ALEXANDER STATES HE SAID, QUOTE IT LOOKS LIKE YOU HAVE THE STORY THERE UNQUOTE. HE DENIES MAKING ANY FURTHER STATEMENTS TO HUDKINS.

IN ADDITION, BOTH WADE AND ALEXANDER WERE INTERVIEWED THIS DATE RE THEIR APPEARANCE BEFORE THE PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION IN WASH., D. C. ON JAN. TWENTYFOUR. MR. WADE ADVISED THAT HE DID APPEAR BEFORE THE COMMISSION ON JAN. TWENTYFOUR AND FURNISHED THE FOLLOWING INFO. ON JANUARY TWENTYTWO AT ABOUT TEN P. M., WAGGONER, DIST. ATTY. FOR THE STATE OF TEXAS, CALLED WADE AND MENTIONED SOMETHING ABOUT AN ARTICLE APPEARING IN A NATIONAL MAGAZINE RE THE POSSIBILITY THAT OSWALD HAD BEEN AN INFORMANT OF THE FBI, CIA OR SOME OTHER GOVERNMENTAL AGENCY AND THAT SUPPOSEDLY WADE AND ALEXANDER HAD BEEN QUOTED IN THIS ARTICLE. CARR ADVISED HIM THAT THE COMMISSION WANTED HIM TO APPEAR. THE REPORTS AT THE USA'S OFFICE AND THAT HE DEFINITELY PREFERRED  
TO HAVE THE REPORTS MADE AVAILABLE TO HIM. HE WAS ADVISED THAT  
THIS WAS A MATTER THAT HAD TO BE DETERMINED BY THE PARTICULAR  
DEPARTMENT, AND HE RECALLS THAT AT THIS TIME SOME MENTION WAS  
MADE OF THE FACT THAT THE COMMISSION HAD STILL NOT RECEIVED ANY

HE SAID THAT ALEXANDER AND AUSA B. W. 1/27/64 Nation article refers to article of Lonnie Hudkins' in 1/1/64 Houston Post, "Oswald Rumored as Informant for U. S." wherein Hudkins indicated he received information on authority of William Alexander, Assistant District Attorney, Dallas, that Agent Hosty's home and office phone and car license numbers in Oswald's possession. Hudkins quotes Henry Wade, Dallas District Attorney, saying, "It may be true but I don't think it will ever be made public as it is." We interviewed Wade and Alexander re remarks attributed them, results set forth in separate memorandum analysing Nation article. Attached teletype reflects data received from Wade and Alexander regarding appearance before President's Commission Washington, D. C., 1/24/64. Wade states told Commission was misquoted by reporter and had no info Oswald was informant FBI or any Government agency. Alexander stated told Commission had no information Oswald being Informant FBI, CIA or other Government agency. He pointed out in Oswald's notebook seized by Police, Agent Hosty's name appeared along with many others also telephone number of Dallas Office and license number of a car. Wade told Commission he overheard reports and some reporter said Oswald was on payroll of Government at \$200 a month.

Wade discussed with Chief Justice Warren undesirability making FBI reports available to defense in Ruby case. Wade said Warren told him he had written letter to Belli, Ruby's attorney, informing him Commission not an investigative agency and requests for reports would have to be taken up with Department; Warren also referred to letter directed to Mr. Hoover stating position of Commission re files. Attached teletype sets data regarding William Alexander, Dallas Assistant District Attorney, raising question regarding Alexander's mental stability.
