Enclosed herewith for all offices receiving copies of this communication is a copy of a letter to the Bureau from the President's Commission dated March 2, 1964, requesting: (1) that we obtain copies of all available records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) pertaining to Ruby's parents, Joseph and Fannie Rubenstein, and (2) that we obtain and furnish to the Commission information available regarding toll calls for the period September 26, 1963, to November 22, 1963, for telephones listed to or available to Ruby and his brothers and sisters and certain specified acquaintances or persons known to have been in contact with Ruby.

Washington Field will upon receipt obtain copies of any records available in INS Headquarters, Washington, D. C., relating to Ruby's parents, Joseph and Fannie Rubenstein. You should also obtain copies and submit any records available relating to Ruby's older brother Hyman and sister Ann who were not born in this country. It is noted that these records were checked by your office on December 3, 1963.

started with the hypothesis that HARVEY LEE OSWALD alone was responsible for the murder, and thereafter as the investigation progressed, authorities either changed or disregarded facts which did not agree with the preconceived solution. BUCHANAM in general asserts that several assassins were involved and bases his theory on the number and direction of the shots, the distance from which they were fired, the nature of the wounds, as well as OSWALD's prior poor record as a marksman.

The article indicates that future issues will contain additional articles on the subject of the assassination although it is not clear whether or not they will be written by BUCHANAN. We will follow this matter and report any additional information of interest.

at the time of her call. EILEEN CURRY was carried for a time there after as a PCI of the Dallas Office, assigned to SA EMMETT J. MURPHY, then assigned to Dallas, now assigned to Los Angeles Office.

EILEEN CURRY disappeared from the Dallas area in mid-1956. She is known to have operated as a prostitute in other areas subsequently but her present whereabouts is unknown to the Dallas Office.

JAMES ECKFORD BREEN is indexed to various files of the Dallas Office but his present whereabouts is not known.

At the outset of the RUBY investigation, a check of records of Federal Bureau of Narcotics, Dallas, disclosed no references to RUBY. Representatives of the agency advised no reports of narcotics activity on the part of RUBY had reached them. On 3/3/64, a re-check of records of that agency disclosed no record of RUBY. Likewise, no record was found of any reports of narcotics activity in the Dallas area on the part of EILEEN CURRY, with aliases, and/or JAMES ECKFORD BREEN.

Since the trial of RUBY for the murder of OSWALD is now in progress in Dallas, no action will be taken UACB to locate CURRY and BREEN for interview. A copy of this communication is directed to Los Angeles in the event the Bureau instructs CURRY and BREEN be located and interviewed concerning their knowledge of RUBY and specifically the inference of narcotics activity on RUBY's part.



FEI Director J. Edgar Hoover today issued a public denial that Lee Earvey Oswald, accused assassin of President John F. Kennedy, and Jack L. Ruby, accused murderer of Cswald, ever served as confidential informants of the FEI.

Mr. Hoover said, "To set the record straight and to refute the misinformation which has been maliciously circulated, I want to state unequivocally that Lee Harvey Oswald and Jack L. Ruby were never FM informants; that they were never employed by this Eureau in any capacity; nor did they ever render any services for—or receive any sums of money from—the FM."

Mr. Leon Hubert, former professor of the Tulane Law School now working with the President's Commission, in a discussion with Mr. Malley 2/14/64 noted that the report of SA Manning C. Clements dated 11/30/63 reported Ruby's address as 4727 Homer. Street, Dallas, Texas, but pointed out that on page 618 Ruby's address was shown as 4749 Homer Street and said this raised the possibility that Ruby may have been maintaining two addresses. The addresses 4727 Homer Street and 4749 Homer Street were accurately used in our report of 11/30/63. The variation in these two addresses is due_to inaccurate information furnished to the Bureau by James M. Cooner of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) who advised on 11/25/63 that Ruby's 1959 tax return showed his residence as 4749 Homer Street. There was no Bureau error involved in the use of this address as furnished by IRS.

ACTION

Mr. Malley will contact Mr. Hubert and advise him of the true facts regarding the variance in addresses of Ruby. specifically point out that there was no Bureau error involved in the use of the address 4749 Homer Street on page 618 of the Bureau's report.

DETAILS

The report of SA Clements on page 618 sets forth an interview with one George Bouhe, 4740 Homer Street. This interview was conducted on the basis of a report to the Dallas Office from James M. Cooner, IRS who on 11/25/63 furnished certain information from the tax files of Ruby and Oswald. Cooner noted that Bouhe, 4740 Homer Street, was listed as a reference for Oswald on an application for employment at a Dallas company in their file and stated that Ruby's 1959 tax return showed his residence as 4749 Homer Street which is approximately across the street from Bouhe's residence,

Bouhe, who was acquainted with Oswald, was interviewed because of the proximity of his address to that of Ruby's as furnished by IRS to determine if he was possibly acquainted with Ruby or knew of any connection between Ruby and Oswald. In the interview, the Agent advised Bouhe that Ruby had been reported to reside at 4749 Homer Street. In recording the interview, the address 4749 was properly set forth to show the basis of the interview and was not intended to designate the actual address of Ruby. When the 1959 tax return of Ruby was subsequently obtained, Ruby's address was clearly shown as 4727 Homer Street. Accordingly, Cooner's original information was incorrect.

In all other instances in the report where Ruby's addresses are reported as obtained from official records, it is accurately recorded as 4727 Homer Street. Numerous documents examined and persons interviewed have confirmed this as Ruby's correct address and investigation has not indicated that Ruby has ever resided at 4749 Homer Street.

Dear Mr. Rankin:

The report of Special Agent Manning C. Clements of November 30, 1963, which was furnished to you, sets forth on page 618 an address for Jack L. Ruby of 4749 Homer Street, Dallas, Texas, in connection with the interview of George Bouhe, 4740 Homer Street.

For your information, the address of 4749 Homer Street was furnished to this Bureau by the Internal Revenue Service on November 25, 1963, in connection with certain information from the tax files of Ruby and Lee Harvey Oswald. It was stated that Ruby's address was taken from his 1959 tax return. In view of its close proximity to the address of Bouhe, who was an acquaintance of Oswald's, Bouhe was interviewed to determine if he also knew Ruby and if there was a possible connection between Ruby and Oswald.

As a basis for the interview Bouhe was advised a that Ruby had formerly resided at 4749 Homer Street which was consistent with the information furnished by the Internal Revenue Service. Bouhe stated that he did not know Ruby and knew of no possible connection between Ruby and Oswald. Ruby actually has never resided at 4749 Homer Street, Dallas, Texas, which is verified by the fact that his correct address of 4727 Homer Street is clearly set forth in Ruby's 1959 tax return, a copy of which has been furnished to the President's Commission.

With regard to your request as to data available from the records of telephone calls made from telephones available to Ruby, the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, Dallas, Texas, has advised that they normally record the date of a long-distance call, time of initiation, duration, and number called. If the call is person-to-person, the name of the person called is also recorded.

In an effort to identify associates of Ruby, we obtained available toll records showing date, duration, and number called of phones available to Ruby for as far back as they were still in existence. Specific times on calls made from these phones were obtained where available for the period November 22, 1963, through November 24, 1963, for the purpose of pinpointing Ruby's movements during this period. The results of these checks have been furnished to you.

In view of the telephone company's advice that the time of initiation of toll calls is possibly available on all of Ruby's toll calls, an effort will be made to obtain this information if specifically requested by the Commission to do so.

Investigation with regard to Ruby's having wired \$25 by Western Union to Karen Bennett on the morning of Rovember 24, 1963, indicated that Bennett told Ruby she needed money to pay her rent. There was no indication that a landlord or any one was pressing her for the money. Ruby's club where she performed was closed over that weekend and he had not paid his entertainers. Ruby stated he wired her the money because he did not want her to come by his apartment to pick it up.

Western Union records were thoroughly checked at Dallas where the money was sent from and at Fort Worth where the money was received thus verifying the fact the money had been actually sent. Karen Bennett resided at that time in a garage apartment in Fort Worth, Texas, at the rear of property reportedly occupied by Weldon L. Thomas who is not known to have been connected with Ruby in any way. Her landlord was not interviewed.

As you are aware, the trial of Ruby for the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald is currently in progress in Dallas and any investigation conducted by the Government regarding Ruby at this time could possibly become the subject of unfavorable accusations or publicity. If investigation regarding above matters is desired, it will be handled at the specific request of the President's Commission.

Lee Rankin, General Counsel of the President's Commission, called today and requested Malley to come to his office in connection with several Leon Hubert, former professor of the Tulane Law School and now working with the President's Commission. Mr. Hubert advised that the reports submitted by the Bureau in the Ruby case consistently mention many times Ruby's home address as 4727 Homer Street, Dallas, Texas. He noted that the report of SA Robert P. Gemberling dated 11/30/63, on page 618, shows Ruby's address as 4749 Homer Street, Mr. Hubert stated that this raised the possibility that Ruby may have been maintaining two residences and that if this were so the President's Commission would very definitely be interested in additional investigation concerning the circumstances of the second residence, who might have been residing with him, and all facts concerning the second residence. Mr. Hubert and Mr. Rankin were immediately advised that the area where Ruby'resided was an apartment area and the possibility existed that a typographical error had been made. They both stated they realized: this possibility but were extremely interested in the remote possibility that Rub? had two residences rather than whether a typographical error had been made. Mr. Rankin was advised this matter would be checked and he would be advised in the immediate future. Danewer & ma Mr. Hubert mentioned that Jack Ruby had sent a telegram on the morning of 11/24/63, the day he shot Oswald, to one of the performers of the Carousel Club who resided in the Fort Worth area and had wired this girl \$25. He discussed the fact that the girl performed under the name of Little Lynn (real name Karen Bennett, who also uses the name of the man she is living with - one Bruce Karlin). She stated her landlady was pressing her for money and that she had to have the money by a certain time in order to pacify her landlady. Mr. Hubert inquired as to whether or not the Bureau had or had not interviewed her landlady. Mr. Rankin was advised this matter would be checked on and he would be advised immediately. ascertaining whether the landlady was or was not interviewed, Mr. Rankin will be EX-108 REC- 17 44-24016 - 1164 advised. Memo to Mr. Belmont from Rosen re: Jack L. Ruby

Mr. Hubert mentioned the fact that the Bureau had checked out the identities of a large number of individuals whose telephone numbers had been called by someone using Ruby's telephone. In this connection Hubert desired to know whether or not it would be possible to obtain further information from the telephone company to show the exact time the telephone call was made and what time it was terminated. He stated that if this type of information was available, the Commission was considering making a time study of all the telephone calls made by Ruby. He advised the significance of this was due to the fact that on 11/22/63, a call was made by Earl Ruby to Eva Grant in Dallas (Earl Ruby resides in Detroit), and that this call lasted for 49 minutes, the call being sometime during the morning of November 22, prior to the assassination of the President.

Concerning the availability of additional data at the telephone company Dallas will check this out and Mr. Rankin will be advised.

With reference to the foregoing requests of Mr. Rankin, a serious question is raised concerning any requests for investigation on the Ruby matter at this time. The hearing relative to a change in venue is in progress now and Judge Brown has indicated an effort will be made to select the jury commencing Monday, February 17, 1964. In view of this, any active investigation by the Bureau could result in publicity that might have an effect on the trial.

ACTION:

Dallas has been requested to obtain the necessary information to answer Mr. Rankin's questions.

Upon receipt of the information from Dallas, results will be made available to Mr. Rankin.

In the event Mr. Rankin requests any immediate investigation concerning matters relating to this case, it will be pointed out to him that the trial is in progress and that any investigation at this time could affect the results of the trial. He will also be advised that if he desires the investigation regardless of the fact that the trial is in progress, this will be handled at the specific request of the President's Commission.

On one such occasion JACK RUBY was accompanied by two prospective customers. On the other occasion he returned with the two customers and brought with him a third individual. MRS. HAYES now believes that the third man could have been LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

Interview with MRS. HAYES is being held in abeyance since the RUBY trial is now in progress, pursuant to Bureau instructions.

In reply to your letter of February 25, 1961, please be advised that the information set forth as background information at pages 155 through 159 of the report of Special Agent Manning C. Clements dated November 30, 1963, was obtained through a search of all lifes in the Dallas Cifice wherein references to Jack L. Ruby appeared. All available information concerning Jack Puby contained in the Dallas files is set forth in the report.

For your information, Ruby was contacted by an Agent of the Dallas Cifice on March 11, 1959, in view of his position as a night club operator who might have knowledge of the criminal element in Dallas. He was advised of the Bureau's jurisdiction in criminal matters, and he expressed a willingness to furnish information along these lines. He was subsequently contacted on eight occasions between March 11, 1959, and Cctober 2, 1959, but he furnished no information whatever and further contacts with him were discontinued. Ruby was never paid any money, and he was never at any time an informant of this Bureau.

At 2:30 p.m., 3-3-64, Jerry O'Leary of the Washington Evening Star, who is very friendly, telephoned and talked to Wick. He said that one of the top officials of The Evening Star is in Paris and reported to officials in Washington that above-captioned is writing scurrilous stories about Lee Harvey Oswald in a Paris newspaper, L' Express. The articles primarily deal with the claim by Buchanan that Oswald was an informant of the FBI.

O'Leary said it is the belief of officials of the Star that this Buchanan is the same man who was fired by the Star in 1948 when he admitted he was a member of the Communist Party in Baltimore. O'Leary asked if he could be confidentially told whether this was the same man so that the Star official in Paris could be so informed.

ACTION TAKEN:

After checking, and reviewing files 100-354341 (which is an investigative file on the subject), it was determined that we are fully aware of subject's presence in Paris where he has resided since October, 1961, and has been employed in the electronics field for Le Materiel Telephonique. He also has written a couple of books and CIA advised that subject describes himself as "a famous American communist journalist." FBI Agents have interviewed subject on several occasions between 1952 and 1957. He has told us he resigned from CP membership prior to August, 1956, because of loss of interest. He has publicly admitted in 1948, after he was fired from the Star in Washington, that he was a member of the CP.

O'Leary was told that the man in Paris currently writing articles about Oswald is the same individual who was fired by the Star in March, 1948.

Reference is made to my memorandum to you dated 3-4-64 in captioned matter pointing out Buchanan had written in the Paris newspaper, L'Express, to the effect Lee Harvey Oswald was an informant of the FBI. Jerry O'Leary of the "Star" had stated Buchanan formerly worked for the "Star" and is now in Paris. The Director stated, "O.K. Also give to O'Leary the release re Oswald and Ruby not being in FBI." While, of course, we will follow meticulously the Director's instructions, it is believed the Director may desire that we give the same release to United Press International and Associated Press representatives here in Washington. In this way, we would achieve a greater dissemination of the release and thus set to rest throughout the Nation the rumor Oswald and Ruby were connected with the FBI.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Director permit us to simultaneously give the same release to United Press International, Associated Press and O'Leary of the 'Star."

The item "Who Killed Kennedy?" on page 29 attacks "the Yankee propagandist machinery which has tried to 'show' that President John F. Kennedy's assassin was Lee Harvey Oswald."

"The U. S. people are asking 'Who Killed Kennedy?' and begin to demand of the L. B. Johnson Administration to reveal everything it knows... L. B. Johnson, then Vice President of the U. S., drove in another car and was not attacked at all... Chief Justice Warren received a multitude of documents and the chief heard many witnesses, but behind closed doors. Among; the witnesses were Oswald's widow, a Soviet citizen, and his mother ... Mark Lane appeared voluntarily before the Warren Commission and stated on March 4 that 8 days before the assassination of President Kennedy a secret night meeting was held in Mack Ruby's cabaret in Dallas, attended by the transit agent J. D. Tippit, Bernard Weisman and a third person 🔙 whose name he could not reveal in public... A great newspaperman and writer, Thomas Buchanan, has dedicated himself to recompile . . and analyze all the declarations and 'official' information in connection with the death of President Kennedy. Buchanan's work is extensive, well-substantiated and convincing; however, its publication was not desired in the U.S.A. and, thus, it had to be published in the French paper 'L'Express,' Paris, on February 20 and 27... Thomas Buchanan finally arrived at the inch conclusion that Kennedy's death was the plot of many persons, in which Oswald played a secondary role; there were two rifles 2 and two assassins: one at the window of the Book Depository and another on the bridge.
