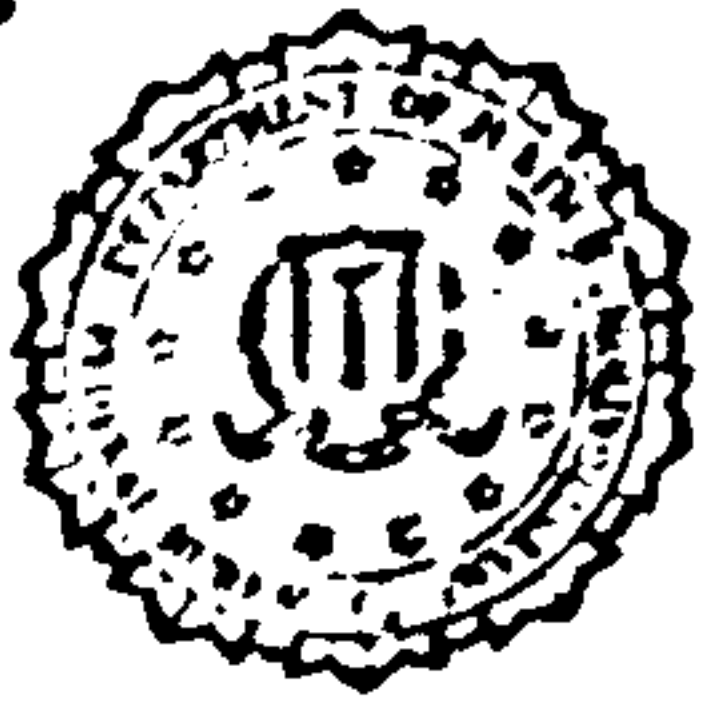

PURPOSE

To advise the Bureau received a President's Commission request which requires interviews with members of the President's Commission and staff, Sol A. Dann of Detroit and Melvin Belli of San Francisco, the latter two, are former Ruby attorneys. The interviews are to relate to the leak of information to news media of Oswald's diary, Ruby's polygraph examination and Ruby's interview with Chief Justice Warren.

BACKGROUND

At the request of the Commission we have conducted extensive investigation concerning the leak of information to news media regarding Oswald's diary, Jack Ruby's polygraph examination and Ruby's interview with Chief Justice Warren. The results of the investigations have been furnished to the President's Commission.

Congressman Gerald R. Ford was the only member of the Commission interviewed as it was alleged he leaked information regarding Oswald's diary. This allegation was completely erroneous. The Commission was advised other members and staff would not be interviewed in the absence of a specific request.

By letter dated September 10, 1964, the Commission requested that members and staff be interviewed; also that Mr. Sol A. Dann and Melvin Belli, former Ruby attorneys, be interviewed.

Consideration was given as to whether these interviews should be conducted by members of Mr. DeLoach's Office since some of the Commission employees are members of Congress. It is felt that in view of the investigative nature of the requests it would be preferable to utilize experienced personnel of WFO.

ACTION

If approved, the attached airtel is to be forwarded to WFO with instructions to interview Commission members and staff, who were present during Ruby's interview and his polygraph examination, and conduct further investigation to fully explore and pin down any such leaks of information pertaining to Oswald's diary, Ruby's interview and polygraph examination within the Commission.

Receiving offices are being instructed this is a limited investigation restricted to Commission members, Commission staff and the two former Ruby attorneys. When personnel of the Commission have been interviewed, WFO has been instructed to advise the Bureau prior to conducting an interview with Chief Justice Warren, for further instructions.

Investigation at President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy on 9/13 and 17/64 was initiated through interview of J. LEE BARKER, General Counsel, and expanded to members of his immediate staff and staff attorneys available. It will be noted that instead of the 31 personnel, in addition to Commission members, originally indicated as employed by the Commission in the list furnished by Bureau, inquiries disclosed a total of 62 personnel aside from Commission members have been involved in work during the pertinent period and, in addition, there are 8 personnel presently assigned by Government Printing Office (GPO) to work regularly at Commission Headquarters under supervision of a GPO printing supervisor.

Investigation thus far has disclosed a complete lack of organization insofar as records are concerned, and a system instituted for handling documents as "TOP SECRET" was discontinued early in the operation of the Commission and subsequent documents have borne classification of "CONFIDENTIAL" on occasion, particularly when they are relating to depositions or testimony. There was found to be no document control whatsoever and no accountability for such documents, classified or not. In addition, there are two Xerox machines located in the basement of the building which are used constantly by any member of the staff or any employee if the need arises for extra copy or copies of any given paper.

It will also be noted that on the list of employees of the Commission now available to WFO, 32 of those out of 62 are no longer employed or living out of Washington, D. C. Effort is being made to locate these persons; however, their exact whereabouts is unknown to the Commission, and WFO may not be able to have them interviewed by the deadline set by referenced Buairtel. Every effort is being made by WFO to complete this investigation in conformance with Eudced.

Enclosed for offices receiving leads to interview persons now or formerly associated with the Presidential Commission are memoranda containing background information re this matter. Also enclosed for all offices, except Dallas and San Francisco, is one copy of reBuairtel containing additional information and Bureau instructions pertaining to this investigation. It is noted Dallas and San Francisco have previously received copy of reairtel.

Investigation at the Commission discloses original typewritten transcript of interview of JACK L. KIDD by Chief Justice WARREN on 6/7/64 at Dallas, Texas, received in office of Chief Counsel of the Commission on 6/17/64 or 6/18/64. This original sent to Ward and Paul, Court Reporters, 317 G Street, N. W., on 6/18/64 for duplication. Ward and Paul returned the original transcript, along with five Xerox copies thereof, to the Commission on 6/18/64.

Inquiry of Mrs. BEVERLY ANN HECKLER, Secretary to General Counsel, discloses following distribution made of these five Xerox copies:

The above distribution was made on 6/18 or 19/64.

It is noted the five Xerox copies prepared
by Ward and Paul bear classification "CONFIDENTIAL" on
top and bottom of each page of the transcript as well
as on the cover to this transcript. The original typed
transcription, prepared by court reporter in Dallas,
bears no classification on any page or on the cover.

Inquiry has also determined additional
Xerox copies of this transcript were made by Commission
employees. These copies apparently made from the
original typed transcript, since none located to date
have classification. These copies were made for purposes
of distributing some to Commission members and for
providing material to GPO representatives. The exact
number of Xerox copies made by Commission employees
is not known; however, Mrs. HECKMAN said she actually
had ten copies of material of this type duplicated.

Mrs. HECKMAN advised JOE H. TONAHILL,
Attorney, Jasper, Texas, directed a letter 6/22/64 to
Mr. BARKER requesting a copy of a transcript of the
Rudy testimony 6/7/64, advising it was for the use
of Dr. JONATHAN WEST in connection with his diagnosis
and recommended treatment for RUBY. By letter 6/27/64,
over BARKER's signature, handled by BURT GRIFFIN,
Staff Attorney, a letter was directed to TONAHILL
enclosing a copy of the transcript requested. Mrs.
HECKMAN does not know whether or not a Ward and Paul
transcripts was Xeroxed or whether a Xerox copy of the
original transcript not bearing a classification was
forwarded to TONAHILL.

An examination of page one of the 2/16/64 edition of the "New York Journal American", in which columnist DOROTHY H. GILGALLAN wrote a story publishing what she reports to be the transcript of the Chief Justice WARREN - JACK L. RUBY interview, disclosed her article is headed:

Confidential
President's Commission
on the
Assassination of President Kennedy

Dallas, Texas
Sunday, June 7, 1964
11:45 A.M. - 2:50 P.M.

A comparison of the heading appearing in the news article with the heading appearing on page two of Xerox copies prepared by Ward and Paul determined the news article is in conformity with the transcript, with the exception of the accidental spacing of the classification.

Page seven of this newspaper carries a reproduction of page 103 of the transcript of this interview. Page 103 consists of the certificate prepared by ELLIOTT LAFORCE, the court reporter who recorded the interview between Chief Justice WARREN and JACK L. RUBY.

This reproduction of page 103 bears the word "CONFIDENTIAL" at the bottom of the page, between lines 24 and 25.

A comparison of page 103, as it appears in the five Xerox copies prepared by Ward and Paul, with the reproduction appearing in the "New York Journal American", disclosed margins on the top, bottom, and left side were reduced in size at the time it was printed in the news article.

It is noted the classification "CONFIDENTIAL" appears some distance above line one, and below line twenty-five, on the Xerox copies made by Ward and Paul. It is further noted this portion of the top and bottom margins appears to have been deleted in the newspaper reproduction; however, as stated above, the newspaper reproduction does bear the "CONFIDENTIAL" classification, which is located between lines 24 and 25.

All five of the Xerox copies prepared by Ward and Paul have been located as result of investigation at the Commission and through contact with persons to whom these copies furnished. None of these copies have the classification stamp above line twenty-five on page 103.

In view of the above, it appears possibility exists KILGALLEN prepared her article after having available for her review a copy of the transcript prepared by Ward and Paul, or a reproduction of such a copy. This is based on the fact the "CONFIDENTIAL" classification appears only on Xerox copies prepared by Ward and Paul.

It is realized the person who made this material available to KILGALLEN could have told her of the classification; however, it is noted the classification appearing in the newspaper reproduction of page 103 is horizontally spaced the same as the Xerox copies made by Ward and Paul, and the vertical spacing and lack of classification on top of pages appear to be the only differences.

The possibility that page 103 of this transcript reproduced in the "New York Journal American" was altered in the printing process should not be overlooked. It is believed the possibility exists the newspaper, through a photographic or some other process, raised the classification stamp appearing on page 103 from its original position to one higher and space considerations and balance were the reason for such change.

A review of the original typewritten transcript, the Xerox copies made by Commission employees, and the Ward and Paul Xerox copies disclosed only copy 3 of 5 of Ward and Paul copies (obtained from office of BERT W. GRIFFIN, Legal Consultant) has name of HARRY CARLSON corrected to HARRY OLSEN on pages 22 and 53. It is noted the article written by KILGALLEN carries name of CARLSON.

REQUEST OF BUREAU

Enclosed for the Bureau is the original transcript and five copies of transcript that were reproduced by Ward and Paul. The FBI Laboratory is requested to conduct the following examinations of this material:

(1) Examine knots tied in binding of copies to determine, if possible, whether any evidence present indicating one of these transcripts has been taken apart.

Examine the "CONFIDENTIAL" classification appearing on pages 103 of each transcript copy to determine if this classification appears to be handstamped or machine stamped, and whether or not the same stamp was used for all copies.

(3) Compare each page 103 classification stamp on transcript copies with that appearing in newspaper reproduction of page 103. Information received Bureau in possession of 8/13/64 issue of "New York Journal American". Appropriate examination should be done to determine if the same stamp was used to classify the Ward and Paul copies as was used in the newspaper reproduction.

(4) Compare the printing on page 103 of Ward and Paul transcripts with each other to determine if any characteristics appear that would make one copy identifiable from another. Thereafter, compare printing of newspaper reproduction of page 103 in effort to isolate copy from which newspaper reproduction made. Also compare with original transcript.

Proceeding on the theory KILGALLAN obtained a transcript from the Commission, specifically one of the Ward and Paul Xerox copies, the Bureau is requested to consider having the following inquiry conducted:

(1) Recontact KILGALLAN in effort to obtain at least one of the copies of the transcript she had made from the copy given to her, and which she claims to have since returned to her source. In event KILGALLAN refuses to furnish such a copy, an effort should be made to review one she has available to determine whether or not the pages are classified.

(2) Recontact officials at the "New York Journal American" and attempt to obtain photograph used to reproduce page 103 of this transcript. If this photograph obtained, it should be forwarded to FBI Laboratory for examination and comparison with material enclosed herewith.

(3) Inquiry should be conducted at the "New York Journal American" to determine if the newspaper has a copy of the transcript used by KILGALLIN in preparing her article, and if so, obtain the copy or review same for information regarding classification appearing thereon.

The Bureau should also consider authorizing Dallas to re-interview Attorney JOE TOMPKINS for the purpose of determining whether or not the copy of the transcript provided him, reflecting interview of JACK L. RUBY by Chief Justice WARREN, bears any type of classification stamp.

For information of Bureau, interviews of Commission personnel being conducted. Leads being set out for interviews of Commission personnel who are not currently in Washington.

Dear Jack:

How are you feeling? I hope you are well. It has been since the end of January-start of February that we have corresponded and, it goes without saying, I think about you a lot and hope that you are bucking up.

Since Melvin Belli was your lawyer in the early part of the year, and he wanted you to turn over all mail to him, I thought it best not to bother him with any questions. He was not anxious for me to ask you any questions at that time, you may recall, Jack. But I thank you very much for the letter you wrote in return.

A lot has happened since our last exchange of letters-- the trial and all. But I am confident that the one trial will not be all there is, and I believe you are in good hands.

Jack, there has been something bothering me for quite some time now and I hope you understand why I bring it up.

You and I talked to each other at Parkland Hospital, the afternoon that President Kennedy was assassinated. You stopped me, as I was hurrying by. We shook hands. You told me you were thinking of closing your places for three nights because of the terrible thing which had happened, and you asked me what I thought about your idea. I said I thought it was a good idea.

I have been told by the FBI and by the Warren Commission that you have told them that you did not talk to me at Parkland Hospital after the President was shot. I can't help wondering, Jack, whether this was something you just can't remember or have you said that for a reason? What would the reason be?

If the idea occurred to you on Sunday to revenge the death of the President, couldn't it have occurred to you on Friday, the day the President was shot? Is it possible that you went to the hospital with the idea of finding the killer of the President? How did you enter the hospital?

I am asking these things because I want to help you, and I want to help because I knew you as a good friend in Dallas. I also want you to know, Jack, that the Jews are not being persecuted. We are all safe and sound.

NOTE:

As a result of a letter dated 9/10/64, immediate investigation was initiated concerning this matter. This is an intensive investigation requiring numerous interviews regarding the various leaks. WFO's investigation to date discloses a complete lack of organization within the Commission concerning handling of records, and there was found to be no document control and no accountability for documents whether classified or not. It has been determined there were 62 people employed by the Commission, the majority of whom have now been interviewed. Copies of Ruby's testimony before Chief Justice Warren has been obtained from the Commission. This was the document which appeared in the "New York Journal American" under the by-line of Dorothy Kilgallen. We are currently endeavoring to obtain any copies of the transcript of Ruby's testimony so that these documents can be compared with the transcripts now in the possession of the Laboratory obtained from the President's Commission. The results of this examination will be furnished to the President's Commission. It is noted that the memoranda enclosed comprise 248 pages. The two memoranda dated 9/21/64, Washington, D. C. captioned "Lee Harvey Oswald" and "Jack L. Ruby - Lee Harvey Oswald" have been reviewed by Mr. Belmont, Mr. Malley and appropriate supervisors. Additional memoranda attached have been reviewed by supervisor only.

The President's Commission on the Assassination of President KENNEDY has heretofore been furnished copies of photographs of certain property of JACK L. RUBY found in the possession of the Dallas, Texas, Police Department and Dallas County District Attorney. The Commission has noted that at the time of his arrest, the back seat of RUBY's car contained partial copies of the "Dallas Morning News" and "Fort Worth Star Telegram" newspapers, issues for November 20, 1963; a partial copy of the "Wall Street Journal", issue of November 18, 1963; an advertisement for "HLH Products"; and several "Life Line" radio transcripts. It is observed that photographs of RUBY property made on June 1 and 2, 1964, above, do not appear to include these items.

The Commission requested investigation to locate and forward, if possible, accurate copies of these papers as they were found in RUBY's car, and advice if all property found in RUBY's car has been located and photographed.

Files of the Dallas FBI Office concerned with this investigation disclose property of RUBY known to have been in the possession of Dallas Police Department was reported to have come from three sources; namely, RUBY's person, his automobile, and his apartment.

Special Agents of the FBI inventoried certain of the RUBY property in possession of Dallas Police Department as follows:

- A. Items said to have been removed from RUBY's person at Dallas City Jail, inventoried November 24, 1963.
- B. Items said to have been removed from RUBY's car by Dallas Police Department, inventoried November 24, 1963.
- C. Items observed by Special Agents in RUBY's car at Dallas Police Auto Pound, inventoried November 25, 1963.
- D. Items observed by Special Agents in RUBY's car at Dallas Police Auto Pound, inventoried November 28, 1963.
- E. Items said to have been removed from RUBY's apartment under search warrant, inventoried November 24, 1963.

By communication September 11, 1964, the Bureau was advised that comparison of items said to have been removed from RUBY's person, A above, were found to be substantially identical with items found at the Property Room, Dallas Police Department, on June 2, 1964. The Bureau was informed that examination of items said to have been removed from RUBY's car by Dallas Police Department, B above, were found to be substantially identical with items observed by Special Agents and photographed at the Dallas Police Department, December 3, 1963, and again observed and photographed in the office of the Dallas County District Attorney on June 1, 1964. It is observed the items specifically mentioned by the Commission were listed among items observed in RUBY's car at the Dallas Police Auto Pound on November 28, 1963, D above. The Bureau was informed of negative results to locate any additional RUBY property in possession of the Dallas Police Department and/or the Dallas County District Attorney.

There follow the results of investigation elsewhere.

Date 7/29/64

EVA GRANT, 3929 Rawlins Street, telephone LA 6-6258, advised she did not go to the apartment previously occupied by JACK L. RUBY on November 24, 1963, but did go a few days later. She obtained some of his clothing and other personal effects.

She said GEORGE SENATOR's property had already been removed for the most part. She is of the opinion SENATOR may have taken some of RUBY's clothing, specifically mentioning RUBY had several hats and suits which she did not find when she went to the apartment. She said she was told by JIM MARTIN, Dallas attorney and friend of SENATOR, that SENATOR had brought a substantial amount of clothing to MARTIN's apartment and wanted \$200 or \$300 for the clothing. She said MARTIN had told her she could come to his apartment and look at the clothing but she had not done so as she considers MARTIN a "wolf" and her brother, SAMUEL RUBY, had declined to go with her. She said a diamond engagement ring which was originally the property of SAM RUBY, but which JACK used in connection with his former engagement to ALICE NICHOLS, is missing.

Mrs. GRANT was asked if she had retrieved any of the property taken by Dallas Police Department from RUBY's person, automobile, or apartment. She said she had not, although she had asked the police for such property. She said she does not know where the property can now be located.

Mrs. GRANT was asked if she has in her possession any papers of RUBY of any nature. She produced two cardboard boxes of assorted papers, stating she does not know where they came from, whether from the Carousel Club, Vegas Club, or RUBY's apartment. She said these papers would be made available for examination and photographing if desired by Agents.

She hastily thumbed through the papers and took out a letter addressed to her which she said was purely personal. She also took from the papers and retained a stub showing RUBY had purchased a \$50 Cashier's Check No. 16750 from Bank of Services and Trusts, Dallas, payable to "Sam Bloom Trustee." She said she does not know what the check was for but was convinced it was for some sort of charity. She noted that SAM BLOOM is a Dallas advertising and public relations man

who was adviser to Judge JOE B. BROWN during RUBY's trial. She also desired to retain an invoice dated September 12, 1963, from the "Dallas Cowboys Football Club" showing RUBY had paid \$12.50 for 25 tickets to football games on "Kid's Day."

Date 7/30/641

Special Agent MANNING C. CLEMENTS examined the contents of two boxes of papers made available by Mrs. EVA GRANT, sister of JACK L. RUBY, on July 27, 1964.

The contents of one box appear to be primarily concerned with operation of Vegas Club. Numerous invoices for merchandise and services were noted, along with bank statements, records of payments for payroll, etc.

Papers in the second box appear to concern the Carousel Club and its predecessor, Sovereign Club. Among the papers are records of receipts and payments, papers concerning taxes, and applications for membership in Sovereign Club.

The various papers were photographed under SA CLEMENTS' supervision.
