In other words, I don't want to quote and say he was or wasn't because I just don't remember. He may have been now. He may have heen there. I just can't think if he was or not that night lie may have been.

Shortly after dark a meeting took place in Ruby's and Senator's apartment in Oak Cliff. George Senator and Attorney Tom Howard were present and having a drink in the apartment when two newsmen and two attorneys arrived. The newsmen were Bill Hunter of the Long Beach (Cal.) Press Telegram, and Jim Koethe of the Dallas Times Herald. Attorney C. A. Droby of Dallas arranged the meeting ior the two newsmen.

Droby insists that he only arranged the meeting. He says he did not accompany the other five men on a tour of the apartment, nor did he hear any of the conversation which went on. But the lives of three who accompanied Senator about the apartment have been taken.

We learned this week that Attorney Jim Martin, close friend of George Senator, was present for the apartment meeting. Martin did not testify before the Warren Commission, but he told this editor he heard the conversations during the visit of the newsmen. He could not remember anything that was said, but he was sure there, was nothing significant. "Certainly there was nothing said that would make Senator lie about.

We asked Martin if he did not feel it was unusual for Sengtor to fall Martin about the killing of Oswald before the announcement was made that Ruby had done the shooting. (vol. 14 page 245) Martin said this editor was wrong, but later said: "You are telling me something I didn't know about."

We asked Martin if he did not feel it was unusual for Senator to forget the meeting while testifying in Washington on April, 22, 1964 since Bill Hunter, who was a newsman present at the meeting, was shot to death across the nation in Long Beach, California that very night, Martin grinned and said:

"Oh, you are are still looking for conspiracy."
We nodded yes and he said: "You will never find it."
We asked: "Never find it, or not there?"
He added soberly: "Not there."

(The string of amazing coincidences continues to grow. Someday a list must be compiled, and fed to a computer to get the fantastic odds for such things happening with such perfect timing and placement to produce the assassination.)

Bill Hunter, a native of Dallas and an award winning newsman in Long Beach, was reading a book after 11 p.m. in the police station called the "Public Safety Building". Two policemen going off duty came into the press room and one shot Hunter through the heart at range officially ruled to be "more than three feet". The policeman range officially ruled to be "more than three feet". The policeman said he dropped his gun, and it fired as he picked it up, but the angle of the bullet caused him to have to change the story to one of quick draw with his fellow officer. The other officer testified that he had his back turned when the shooting took place.

Hunter had written:

Within minutes of Ruby's execution of Oswald before the eyes of millions watching television, at least two Dallas attorneys appeared to talk with him.

peared to talk with nim.

"lie didn't tell us anything," one of the attorneys told the press

after the first brief meeting. "lie just listened. He paid for advice."

Hunter was quoting Tom Howard who died of a heart attack just a few short weeks ago here in Dallas. Howard was acting strangely to his friends two days before his death. He was taken to the hospital by "a friend." No autopsy was performed,

Dallas Times Herald reporter Jim Koethe was killed by a karate chop to the throat just as he emerged from a shower in his apartment in Dallas on September 21, 1964. His murderer was not indicted.

What went on in that meeting? Few are left to tell, and no one in authority to even ask the questions since the Warren Commission has made its final report and closed the investigation. As Oswald said: "I'cople will forget that in a few days, and there would be another President."

SUBJECT: Public disclosure of Warren Commission records

In a memorandum of February 8, 1965, I requested an expression of your views with regard to public disclosure of unpublished documents that were furnished to the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy by the Bureau.

Tollowing a review of your recommendations and the recommendations of the heads of other interested departments and agencies, I submitted a memorandum to McGeorge Bundy, Special Assistant to the President, proposing certain guidelines for determining which of those documents should be made available to the public. By a memorandum of April 19, 1965, Mr. Bundy approved those guidelines and asked me, in coordination with the National Archives, to instruct the appropriate agencies to conduct a review of pertinent documents in accordance with those guidelines and to complete that review by September 1965.

. In order to facilitate this review, the National Archives has prepared a list of the documents which are in the files of the President's Commission which were submitted by, or originated in, the Bureau. This list includes only the documents that were not published by the Commission and those that could readily be determined to have been published only in part.

> It is requested that you arrange for the prompt examination of the listed documents with a view to authorizing the removal of existing restrictions on public availability of as many of those documents as possible.

The guidelines approved by Mr. Bundy, which are set forth in the attachment to this letter, should be applied in making the required determinations.

The document-by-document review that this procedure requires may be undertaken on the basis of file copies of documents which were retained in the files of the Bureau, or, since all records of the President's Commission have been transferred to the National Archives, the Archivist will arrange to give your representative access to the listed documents if that procedure would be more convenient. At the conclusion of your review, a copy of the enclosed list, marked so as to show which documents may be made public and which must remain closed for the time being, is to be sent to Dr. Wayne C. Grover, Archivist of the United States. With respect to items that must be withheld from the public, please indicate the letter or number of the item in the attached guidelines that best describes the Bureau's reason for such withholding..

States receive a reply by August 15, 1965, since a report to the White House must be prepared and submitted by September 1 on the overall status of accessibility to the records of the Commission. In order to avoid any unnecessary delay in this regard, I suggest that you send your reply to the Archivist. If any questions or problems arise in the course of the review, your representative should contact Dr. James B. Rhoads, Assistant Archivist for Civil Archives, whose telephone number is code 13, excension 22442.

I am aware of the difficulties inherent in this undertaking, but the public interest in these documents, and the determination of the White House Office that they be disclosed to the fullest extent consistent with the national security, sound public administration, and the rights of individual privacy, require that this assignment be accomplished with care and dispatch.

GUIDELINES FOR REVIEW OF MATERIALS SUBMITTED TO THE PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION ON THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

- 1. Statutory requirements prohibiting disclosure should be observed.
- 2. Security classifications should be respected, but the agency responsible for the classification should carefully revaluate the contents of each classified document and determine whether the classification can, consistently with the national security, be eliminated or downgraded.
- 3. Unclassified material which has not already been disclosed in another form should be made available to the public on a regular basis unless disclosure--
  - (A) Would be detrimental to the administration and enforcement of the laws and regulations of the United States and its agencies;
  - (B) Might reveal the identity of confidential sources of information and impede or jeopardize future investigations by precluding or limiting the use of the same or similar sources hereafter;
  - yersons, who are the subject, source, or apparent source of the material in question, because it contains gossip and rumor or details of a personal nature having no significant connection with the assessination of the President;

Would reveal material pertinent to the criminal prosecution of Jack Ruby for the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald, prior to the final judicial determination of that case.

Whenever one of the above reasons for nondisclosure may apply, your department should, in determining whether or not to suthorize disclosure, weigh that reason against the overriding policy of the Executive Branch favoring the fullest possible disclosure.

Unless sooner released to the public, classified and unclassified material which is not now made available to the public shall, as a minimum, be reviewed by the agency concerned five years and ten years after the initial examination has been completed. The criteria applied in the initial examination, outlined above, should be applied to determine whether changed circumstances will permit further disclosure. Similar reviews should be undertaken at ten-year intervals until all materials are opened for legitimate research purposes. The Archivist of the United States will arrange for such review at the appropriate time. Whenever possible provision should be made for the automatic declassification of classified material which cannot be declassified at this time.



#### Request of the Attorney General

COMMISSION RECORDS

By letter dated July 8, 1965, the Attorney General requested that a review of pertinent documents now in the possession of National Archives relating to the assassime on of President Kennedy be made for the purpose of a public disclosure of information on file which has not previously been disclosed. The letter made available certain guidelines which had been approved by McGeorge Bundy, Special Assistant to the President, which guidelines were to be used in making this review.

#### Material to be Reviewed

The items listed by National Archives for review comprise 202 pages of items and list more than 2000 items for review. It appears National Archives has listed every report that was submitted to the Warren Commission by the Bureau, as well as all letterhead memoranda, all letters and any other written material that was furnished to the Commission, such as the preliminary report consisting of five volumes which was made available to the Warren Commission.

#### Guidelines for Review

UNREC

i (1) Statutory requirements prohibiting disclosure should be observed.

- (B) Might reveal the identity of confidential sources of information and impede or jeopardize future investigations by precluding or limiting the use of the same or similar sources hereafter;
- (C) Would be a source of embarrassment to innocent persons, who are the subject, source, or apparent source of the material in question, because it contains gossip and rumor or details of a personal nature having no significant connection with the assassination of the President;
- (D) Would reveal material pertinent to the criminal prosecution of Jack Ruby for the murder of Lee Harvey Oswald, prior to the final judicial determination of that case.

Regarding (A) above, there is no problem.

With regard to Items (B), (C) and (D) above, these guidelines will be followed in making the review and the Department will be advised of any situations where because of the application of these guidelines the information cannot be disclosed.

With respect to the Ruby material, a legal decision will have to be rendered by the Department as to whether any of the reports in the Ruby case can be disclosed in view of the pending prosecutive action concerning Ruby.

The guideline indicates that in any instance where the foregoing reasons for non-disclosure might apply, we should in determining whether or not to authorize disclosure weigh that reason against the overriding policy of the Executive Branch favoring the fullest disclosure.

The comment is also made that unless the material has been released to the public, classified and unclassified material not now available to the public shall, as a minimum, be reviewed five and ten years after the initial examination (and each ten years thereafter) has been completed. The criteria applied in the initial examination, as previously outlined, is to be applied in each subsequent review.

All of the above guidelines will be followed to the fullest in making our review.

It is to be noted that many of our reports do contain information received from confidential sources where disclosure of same might possibly affect the Bureau's operations. In addition, many of our reports contain data received from banks, telephone companies and other places of business where disclosure could place such business concerns in a most embarrassing position unless appropriate subpoenaes were issued for this data prior to public disclosure. There is also the possibility that disclosure of some of the information as now contained in our reports could result in lawsuits wherein the claim would be made that character assassination, injury to reputation, or other miscellaneous claims resulted.

The review will be made by the Domestic Intelligence Division, the General Investigative Division and the Laboratory, and there is a possibility that some of the tems may refer to matters handled in the Identification Division and possibly the Administrative Division. Where such applies, these Divisions will handle their own material.

In making this review considerable savings in time can be achieved by having the list furnished by the National Archives checked against the material actually in the possession of Archives in order to make sure that we are reviewing the proper material.

The letter from the Attorney General requested the results of our review be furnished directly to National Archives by August 15, 1965. Due to the circumstances relating to our reports, we do not contemplate furnishing results of our review to National Archives but instead will furnish it to the Attorney General as recommendations and advise the Attorney General that the firm decision as to disclosure rests with the Department.

ACTION: A review of this voluminous material is starting today and will be completed as rapidly as possible.

While writing of your brother's assassination in Dallas, Texas, I have had a sudden recollection of where it was that I met Jack Rubenstein...all along \_his face has been so familiar...but I could never remember where I had seen him.

It was while re-investigating the double murder of my step-father and stepmother in Dallas that I remember telling the story to Sheriff Bill Decker who I had known since I was fifteen years old...he was elevator operator \* in the Dallas County Courthouse where my mother was employed at the time of her murder...her murder was classified as a suicide...and this was not true, as I knew Capt. Will Fritiz, Dallas Philice, could prove.

In the proposal for re-investigation Decker recommended a detective to me and arranged for our meeting in the lobby of the Crimminal Courts Building. saying he did not want his name mentioned. I now know that that man who I remembered being a Jew with "stein" as a part of hisname, was Jack \* Rubystein.

I now claim that Jack Ruby is in danger of his life in the custody of Decker.. \* that Ruby was a deputy of Decker and did odd jobs for him.

At that time I asked Capt, Will Fritz about the man Decker had recommended to me, and Capt. Fritz said he was not a detective and had a very shady reputation ... so I did nothing further.

It is my believe that Johnson's friend, Stanley Marcus, hired Ruby to hire Oswald to kill John Kennedy...and Oswald had help from the Sheriff's department.

Somewhere in my files I may have the name of Jack Rubenstein weritten on a piece of paper by Sheriff Bill Decker and handed to me...it would take much research to turn it up...but I believe that if Capt. Will Frittz were questioned, especially if I could be present and refresh his memory, that he will recall it was Rubenstein that Decker recommende to me, and that \_ Frtiz did not recommend him.

I urge you to ask for the removal of Ruby from Decker's cutody, for if ruby is slain the truth of your brother's death may never be uncovered.

Harry Dutt was interviewed on October 6, 1965 at 1361 Convention Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana at which time he furnished the following information:

HARRY DUTT was interviewed at 1361 Convention Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana and furnished the following information after being advised he did not have to make any statement any statement he did make could be used against him in a court of law, and before he made a statement he could talk to a lawyer or anyone he chooses.

Rouge for approximately two weeks. He advised that on the evening of October 5, 1965 he had been drinking in the bar at the Capitol House Hotel in Baton Rouge and that this time he was accompanied by his nephew CARY HODGES. He stated that he had made a statement regarding JACK RUBY and LEE HARVEY OSWALD but said he was drinking heavily at the time and he does not recall what he said. He stated that he did not know anything about anyone of these individuals except what he had read in the newspaper and that if he had talked about a plan to kill JACK RUBY he could not recall what he said. He advised that he does not know of such a plan. He also stated that he does not know of any plan or plot which might endanger his own life. DUTT stated that he frequently "talks when he is drinking" and cannot always be held responsible while drinking.


He advised that he had met a man named JACK RUBY in Juarez, Mexico about 5 years ago but he does not think, however, this is the same JACK RUBY who lives in Dallas. He stated, however, that he thought he would go to Dallas some time in the future to see JACK RUBY and to "talk to him." When asked how and where he intended to contact RUBY in Dallas he stated that he would "just go to Dallas and ask for him."

He also said that he met LEE HARVEY OSWALD in New Orleans about 5 or 6 years ago, but he does not believe he talked to OSWALD. He stated he just saw OSWALD on the street in New Orleans.

DUTT stated that he has suffered from "neurosis" that he had been confined to mental institutions on several occasions, once in 1945 at the Veterans Hospital, Augusta, Georgia for a mental condition. DUTT stated he had also been treated at the Halifax Hospital, Daytona, Florida on at least 7 occasions between 1955 and 1962 for a mental condition.

He also stated that he had been arrested by the Police Department, Daytona, Florida on several occasions for charges including drunkanidisorderly conduct. He stated that on one occasion he attacked 2 Daytona Policeman with an axe when they tried to arrest him. He stated that the police subdued him and placed him under arrest and at the time they also confiscated his rifle.

He stated that he did not own any firearms at the present time but would like to get a pistol one, that would scare some one if he pointed it at them. He advised that he owned a hunting knife which he frequently carried with him.

DUTT stated that he was in tatal agreement with all the policies of the present administration and that he thought President JOHNSON was a fine president, was doing a good job and was following the policy of President KENNEDY. He further stated that President KENNEDY was the best president we have had.

DUTT stated that his plans for the immediate future were indefinite that he wished to find employment in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

During the course of the interview DUTT appeared nervous and on several occasions became highly excited. During a portion of the interview in which DUTT related an incident regarding attacking of two policeman with an axe he became excited.



Mr. Cary Hodges, 1825 Silver Road, Baton Rouge, Louisiana was interviewed on October 6, 1965 and furnished the following information:

CARY HODGES, 1825 Silver, Route 1, Baton Rouge, Louisiana furnished the following information after being advised the identity of the interviewing agents.

HODGES stated that he is an engineer in Baton Rouge and at the present time his uncle HARRY DUTT was visiting him from Daytona Beach, Florida. HODGES stated that during the evening of October 5, 1965, himself and DUTT were drinking in the Hunt Room of the Capitol House Hotel, Baton Rouge, Louisiana. During the course of the conversation between the two men DUTT stated that he knew JACK RUBY and LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He stated that he had met RUBY some years ago in Juarez, Mexico and had also met OSWALD 5 or 6 years ago in New Orleans.

HODGES further stated that DUTT told him that he intended to go to Dallas, Texas to see JACK RUBY. DUTT said that JACK RUBY should not be alive today as he was to have been shot "according to plan". He would not elaborate on this statement.

"crack pot." He said that DUTT leaves home temporarily without any reason and travels around the country, sometimes for an extended period of time. He further stated that DUTT "hangs out in bars" frequently while on these trips. HODGES also stated that DUTT came to Baton Rouge, Louisiana about two weeks ago and secured part time employment as an "extra" with a movie company presently working in the Baton Rouge area. HODGES stated that DUTT said that he intends to go to Hollywood if he cannot find employment in Baton Rouge. He thinks DUTT probably could make a career out of acting as a result of his experience with a movie company in Baton Rouge.

HODGES stated that he believes his uncle has had "shock treatments" in the past and might have been confined to a mental institution.

# Court to Get. Judge Brown TV Record

The transcription of a New York television program featuring Dist. Judge Joe B. Brown will be sent to the State court of Criminal Appeals as a Jack Ruby appeal move.

Attorney Phil Burieson filed the 28-page document Wednesday.

Burleson said the defense contention is that statements by Judge Brown on the show were inconsistent with testimony during habeas corpus hearing here Sept. 9-10.

On the show, Judge Brown discussed his book and press coverage of the trial.

# Ruby Counsel-Ask Voiding Of Own Plea

AUSTIN (AP) — Attorneys for Jack Ruby said today they have asked a federal appeals court to throw out their cariier appeal aimed at transferring the case from state to federal court.

Austin attorney Sam Houston Clinton Jr. announced the action for the legal staff of Ruby, convicted in Dallas last year of murdering presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald.

Clinton said the attempt to transfer the case to federal court has been abandoned because the motivations for the attempt — allegations that Ruby had not been permitted to have counsel of his choice at a sanity hearing and that State Dist: Judge Joe B. Brown should have been disqualified from presiding over the sanity hearing — have been removed.

Clinton said the state has permitted Ruby to be represented by the attorneys he desires and Brown has been replaced by Dist.

Judge Louis Holland of Montague.

Federal Dist. Judge T. Whitfield Davidson had refused to accept a transfer of Ruby's sanity hearing to his court, and Ruby's attorneys had appealed the order to the Fifth Circuit Court. They asked today that the appeal be dismissed.

The Ruhy case is pending in Texas courts on Ruby's petition for habeas corpus, based on the disqualification of Brown. Appeals of the murder conviction and sandy incuring are avaiting autoeme of the habeas proceeding.

By teletypes on 1/22 and 1/23/64, Bureau listed a number of FBI reports which were to be furnished to USA, NDT, Dallas, after certain deletions had been made. These reports were furnished to the USA on 1/24/64. The purpose was to permit representatives of office of State District Attorney to review the reports in office of USA as aid to prosecution.

The above-mentioned reports were subsequently returned to this office by the USA after they had served their purpose. The reports have been held in Dallas Office since that time. There is no apparent need to retain these copies of the reports further.

In the interest of space, the above-described reports will be destroyed on or before 5/1/66, UACB.




